Aztec Women's Basketball Faces Critical Road Test At Utah On Sunday

With the regular season quickly winding down, the San Diego State women's basketball team (15-9) heads to Salt Lake City for a critical match-up with Utah, beginning at 2 p.m. MST/1 p.m. PT at the Huntsman Center. The Aztecs will be playing their third consecutive nationally-televised game, as this Sunday's meeting will be shown live on The Mtn. with Ann Schatz (play-by-play) and Andrea Lloyd (color) calling the action.

SDSU is coming off its biggest win of the season, knocking off No. 23/25 TCU in resounding fashion, 84-61, Tuesday at Viejas Arena. The victory ended the team's three-game losing skid and is its first in four chances over a top 25 foe in 2009-10.

The Aztecs remain tied for third place with Wyoming in the MWC standings with a 7-5 record and only four games left to play. The Lady Frogs are a half game up on BYU for the league lead, as both teams have three losses.

Utah, meanwhile, is only a half game in back of the Aztecs at 6-5 and has won three of its last four and five of its last seven to also bring a 15-9 record into Sunday's contest. The Utes held UNLV to just 35 points on Wednesday for a 51-35 victory in Las Vegas.

The second game this season between the 2009 MWC regular-season co-champions will feature a live audio call with Chris Eilo, as well as live stats on goaztecs.com.

Aztecs Upsets No. 23/25 TCU, 84-61

The San Diego State women's basketball team got back into the win column in a big way, upsetting 23rd-ranked and first-place TCU, 84-61, at Viejas Arena. The Aztecs' 23-point margin of victory was their largest in the 15 all-time meetings between the two sides and helped them improve to 15-9 overall and 7-5 in the Mountain West Conference. TCU, meanwhile, dropped to 19-6 overall and 9-3 in league action.

SDSU, playing its fourth game against a top 25 foe this year, scored a season-high 84 points with four of five starters reaching double-figures. Senior **Jené Morris (San Francisco, Calif.)** notched 16 of her game-high 23 points in the first half and also added four steals, five assists and five rebounds. Classmate **Quenese Davis (Sacramento, Calif.)** recorded her third consecutive double-double with a career-best 13 rebounds, 14 points, seven assists and three steals.

Junior **Paris Johnson (San Diego, Calif.)** fell one board short of a double-double with her 19 points and nine rebounds, while junior **Coco Davis (Sacramento, Calif.)** added a career-best 12 points to go with three steals in 35 minutes of play. Sophomore **Kalena Tutt (Long Beach, Calif.)** had a career night for SDSU scoring eight points, hauling in five rebounds and blocking a pair of shots.

The Aztecs trailed only once the entire night on the opening bucket of the game at 2-0. A lay-up by Quenese

Davis knotted the score at 2-2 less than a minute later and began a 7-0 run to put the host up by five. That lead grew to double-figure on consecutive lay-ups by Tutt and Morris at 17-6, before jumping out to as many as 19 points at the 9:59 mark.

The league's top offensive team, TCU cut its deficit in a hurry, converting three straight 3-pointers in just over a minute and to back to within 10. After its lead dipped all the way to eight at the 7:15 mark, SDSU finished the half by outscoring the Lady Frogs 18-8 to run the score up to 49-31.

Out of the break, TCU never go to within single digits again, trailing by as many as 26 points before the Aztecs went on to claim a dominating 84-61 win.

Other TCU Notes

- ▶ SDSU had four players score in double-figure points in the same game for the seventh time this season.
- ▶ SDSU's 84 points are its most ever against TCU and mark only the second time the Aztecs reached the 70-point mark vs. the Lady Frogs.
- ▶ The win is SDSU's first in conference play when an opponent scores more than 50 points.
- ▶ SDSU reached the 20-assist mark for the sixth time this season and the fourth occasion in MWC play.
- ▶ SDSU attempted more free throws than its opponent for just the third time in the 12 MWC games. The Aztecs improved to 11-1 when making more free throws than their opponent and is 10-1 when attempting more.
- ▶ The Aztecs owned a double-figure margin on the boards for the eighth time this season.
- ▶ SDSU reached double-figures in steals for the 12th time this year.

The Rout Is On

San Diego State notched its ninth win of 19 or more points on Tuesday with its' 23-point margin over TCU.

Six of the Aztecs' seven conference victories in 2010 have been by more than 15 points with five being by more than 20 points. In 2008-09, SDSU only had six victories by more than 20 points in 32 total outings.

On Tuesday, SDSU also matched its season-high by scoring 49 points in the first half vs. the Lady Frogs. The Aztecs also had 49 points in the first 20 minutes in a 70-41 win against UNLV back on Jan. 13.

The 49 points are the team's most in a half since scoring 50 in the second half of a 91-79 loss at Wichita State on Nov. 19, 2005, and are the most in the first 20 minutes of a game since the Aztecs posted 50 in a 91-45 victory over Utah Valley State on Feb. 10, 2005.

SDSU vs. The Top 25

The Aztecs' win over No. 23/25 TCU on Tuesday is their first vs. an Associated Press top 25 team this season and their third in the last two years.

SDSU last beat a top 25 team on Jan. 21, 2009, when the Aztecs defeated No. 23 New Mexico, 57-52, in Albuquerque. That win was less than a month after the team's 60-55 upset of No. 4 Texas, the school's first vs. a top 25 squad since downing No. 6 Alabama in December of 1994.

In 2009-10, San Diego State has played four games against ranked foes in then No. 5/6 Notre Dame, No. 17/20 Oklahoma and TCU, which was ranked 22nd in the first meeting. SDSU has also played nine other con-

tests vs. opponents receiving votes in either national preseason or regular season poll at least some point this season with Arizona, Auburn, BYU, New Mexico (twice), South Carolina, Wake Forest and Wyoming (twice).

84 For Us

SDSU erupted for a season-high 84 points on Tuesday evening against TCU, the first time the team has reached the 80-point barrier this season. The Aztecs' previous best for points in a game was 79 vs. both No. 5/6 Notre Dame and USD.

A year ago, the team scored more than 80 points on three occasions with a high of 85 in back-to-back outings vs. Montana State and Loyola Marymount.

Overall, SDSU has won its last 47 games when scoring 80 or more points with the last defeat coming in 1992 against Fresno State (L, 84-86).

The Aztecs' 84 points Tuesday is their second-highest total ever in an MWC game, trailing an 86-point effort vs. Colorado State in 2008. It is just the fourth time SDSU has reached the 80-point barrier in 160 all-time MWC contests.

Three-Peat

Aztec senior point guard Quenese Davis recorded her third consecutive double-double and fourth of the season against TCU. Davis scored 14 points and added a career-high 13 rebounds vs. the Lady Frogs after posting 10 points and 10 assists at UNLV and 10 points and 11 boards at Wyoming.

The last SDSU player to record double-doubles in three consecutive outings was Paris Johnson a year ago, when the center posted four in a row also during the MWC season from Jan. 21-31.

Davis now has eight career double-doubles to rank second on the current Aztec roster behind Johnson (15). As a team, SDSU has combined for nine double-doubles in 2009-10.

Morris MWC's Scoring Leader

Aztec senior Jené Morris continues to rank first in the Mountain West Conference in scoring with 18.1 points per league outing.

Morris, who averages 15.8 points per game overall to rank third, has reached the 20-point mark in five MWC games and six times overall in 2009-10. She has scored in double-figures in 11 of 12 league outings and has ended up with more than 15 in nine MWC contests.

The first-team all-MWC pick as year ago has 20 career 20-point scoring outings, while teammate Quenese Davis has 11, including five this year.

An SDSU player has never led the MWC in league-only scoring, as Morris was fifth in both 2008 and 2009, and Jamey Cox was third in 2000.

Block-A-Thon

San Diego State recorded a season-high 11 blocked shots in the win over TCU on Tuesday. It was the third time this year that the Aztecs have recorded double-figures in that category (Arizona, UNLV) and have nine or more five times.

SDSU has tallied at least five blocked shots in each of its last six contests rank first in the Mountain West Conference with 5.5 a game. The team also easily leads the MWC in league-only outings with 6.5 a contest and

boasts two of the top three individual leaders in juniors Paris Johnson and Jessika Bradley.

Johnson and Bradley each had six in a game earlier this season to tie for sixth in the Aztec record book.

Shooting Gallery

SDSU has shot at least 40 percent from the field in 18 of its 24 games in 2009-10, topping the 45 mark 10 times, including on Tuesday vs. TCU. The Aztecs are 9-2 when making at least 45 percent and are 5-0 when converting at least 50 percent.

The Aztecs are second in the MWC in shooting percentage at 43.8 and are 35th nationally.

SDSU Still No. 1 In MWC Scoring Defense

San Diego State is 6-0 in league action this season when limiting an opponent to fewer than 50 points in a game and is 1-5 when it doesn't.

Overall, the Aztecs have limited 13 of its 24 opponents to under 60 points in a game this season. Seven SDSU foes have scored 50 or fewer points and three haven't reached the 40-point barrier.

On the year, the Aztecs rank fourth in the MWC and 46th nationally in scoring defense at 57.5 points an outing and are first in league contests, giving up a meager 55.5 points.

All-Time MWC Career Steals Leader

Despite only playing three seasons in the Mountain West Conference, Aztec senior Jené Morris is on pace to become the league's all-time leader in career steals. Morris enters this Sunday's outing with 260 thefts to her credit, which rank second in conference history. With her four takeaways against TCU, she grabbed the No. 2 spot from Lady Frog Adrienne Ross (258 steals), and needs only **four** to beat record-holder, UNLV's Sequoia Holmes, who had 263 over a four-year span.

Aztec senior Quenese Davis' 624 career assists rank third league history, while her 253 steals are fourth. Junior Paris Johnson is second all-time with 191 blocks.

115 And Counting

Aztec senior Quenese Davis played in her 115th career contest Tuesday to tie for sixth in program history with another standout guard, Falisha Wright.

Davis has competed in all of the team's outings since coming to the Mesa in 2006, starting 114 of them, including 112 in a row. She is on track to play at minimum 120 career games, which would tie her for fourth-most in

school history with all-time leading scorer Judy Porter.

Davis appeared in her 100th career game vs. Long Beach State in December and is the first Aztec to reach the century mark since Kate Eveland in 2008. She needs six more starts in the next six games to reach the school record of 118 for consecutive starts held by Michelle Suman (1991-95).

Three More Til 1,300

With 23 against TCU, SDSU guard Jené Morris now has 1,297 career points in the Red & Black. Morris needs just **three more points** to become only the seventh player in Aztec history to record 1,300 points. She would be the first to accomplish the feat since Falisha Wright and Michelle Suman both did so as seniors in 1995.

The San Francisco native is currently 18th in MWC history in career scoring, despite playing only three seasons and is third among active players behind Utah's Kalee Whipple (1,805) and UNM's Amy Beggin (1,359).

Notes With A 'W'

An SDSU victory over Utah will mean:

► The Aztecs win in Salt Lake City for the first time since Jan. 12, 1995, a span of 13 games.

► SDSU's eight MWC victories are its second-most in the league's 11 years.

► SDSU improves to 14-29 all-time against the Utes. The Aztecs have claimed back-to-back wins over Utah for the first time since 1995 and have come out ahead in three of the last four meetings.

Utah Tid-Bits

Utah has a 15-9 overall record and a 6-5 mark in league action with three wins in its last four games ... The Utes are 10-3 at home with all three of those losses coming against MWC opponents ... The Utes have been led by forward Kalee Whipple, who averages a conference-best 17.3 points a game to go with 49 three-pointers ... Conference preseason freshman of the year Taryn Wicijowski averages a team-high 6.7 rebounds an outing and shoots 55.9 percent from the field, while guard Janita Badon has recorded 116 assists and 52 steals ... Utah leads the league in scoring defense (56.3), field-goal pct. defense (35.5) and rebounding margin (+4.6)..

to only three points at 45-42 with 5:51 remaining. The Utes, however, went scoreless the rest of the way as the Aztecs went on a 6-0 run to earn the win.

► Jené Morris posted a game-high 22 points, including 14 of the team's 29 total first-half points. She also added five steals and three triples to go with three assists in 39 minutes. She was the only Aztec in double-figure points, as Quenese Davis had nine and four assists.

► The nine-point margin of victory is SDSU's smallest in a MWC game this season ... Utah attempted an Aztec opponent season-low 36 field goals in the losing effort ... SDSU went to the free throw line a season-low four times, while Utah was called for just seven fouls, the fewest by any Aztec opponent this season.

Aztecs In The National Polls

San Diego State returned to the *ESPN/USA Today* Coaches Top 25 poll for the first time since Jan. 12, getting two votes in the Feb. 2 edition.

It was the seventh time the Aztecs have received votes or been ranked in the coaches poll, including on the preseason ballot, in 2009-10. Overall, SDSU has been mentioned in both polls five times this year.

The Aztecs achieved its first top-25 national ranking in 14 years on Nov. 23, when they were rated No. 23 in the Associated Press Top 25 poll. SDSU, which garnered 112 points, last appeared in the AP top 25 in March of 1995, when the team ended up 22nd following a 24-6 campaign. Overall, it is SDSU's 41st all-time appearance in the AP Top 25.

The Aztecs received votes in the AP poll six times a year ago, a first since March of 1997, when it had 15 votes before playing its NCAA tournament game against Oregon.

On Nov. 24, the team also rated No. 24 in the coaches poll, getting 74 points.

Three Of A Kind

Three San Diego State players have reached the 1,000-career point mark this season with the latest being junior center Paris Johnson, who met the milestone on Jan. 23 in the first half of the team's game at BYU.

Earlier this season, senior Jené Morris became the first current Aztec to record her 1,000th career point in her 67th game in the Red & Black with her first bucket against South Carolina on Nov. 28. Fellow co-captain Quenese Davis followed suit two games later vs. Pepperdine, reaching the milestone on a second-half jumper in her 99th career outing.

Prior to this year, the last Aztec to reach the 1,000-career point mark was Jamey Cox in 2002-03. SDSU has never had three players reach the 1,000-career point mark in the same season, but has had two accom-

plish the feat during the same campaign on four occasions.

In program history, which dates back to the 1976-77 campaign, only 19 SDSU players have recorded 1,000 career points.

Injury Bug Bites

Unfortunately for the Aztecs, the injury bug has bitten early and often for this year's team. Before the season started, the team lost sophomore **Gabrielle Clark (Los Angeles, Calif.)** to an ACL injury. Just two games into the campaign, true freshman **Kiyana Stamps (Moreno Valley, Calif.)** also went down with an ACL injury. Both Clark and Stamps will miss the remainder of the 2009-10 season.

Other 2009-10 Highlights So Far

- ♦ Aztec all-time career leader Quenese Davis recorded her 500th career assist in the team's opener at UC Irvine and reached the 600-plateau vs. New Mexico on Feb. 6.
- ♦ Aztec junior center Paris Johnson has five blocks in each of the team's last three season-openers, including five versus the Anteaters in 2009-10.

- ♦ Jené Morris was one of six players named to the all-tournament team for the Island Division at the 2009 Paradise Jam in St. Thomas. Morris averaged 17 points in the three games, bolstered by a 32-point effort against No. 5/6 Notre Dame, which was the most points in a single game by any player at the tournament and by any player in the MWC in 2009-10.

- ♦ SDSU played its first overtime game in three years on Dec. 8, against Pepperdine.

- ♦ SDSU made 60 percent (33-for-55) of its field-goal attempts in a win at LMU. That percentage is the team's best since making 68.1 percent vs. Illinois State on Nov. 24, 2000.

- ♦ Seniors Quenese Davis and Jené Morris have both been named MWC players of the week once this season. Davis did so on Dec. 28, after scoring a career-high 26 points in a win over LMU. Two weeks later, Morris earned her sixth career honor on Jan. 11, following a pair of 20-point scoring performances to open conference play.

- ♦ San Diego State had three players earn all-tournament honors following the championship game of the San Diego Surf 'N Slam. Senior Quenese Davis garnered her first-ever career MVP honors after leading the tournament field in scoring with 24 points against Wake Forest and 16 vs. Auburn. Jené Morris and Paris Johnson were also tabbed for the second straight year.

- ♦ The Aztecs boast victories this season over a member of the Pac-10 (first time since 2003), the ACC (first win ever) and the SEC (first since 1994).

- ♦ SDSU won for the first time in the 11-year league history when opening an MWC campaign on the road. The Aztecs were 0-5 in that category prior to their victory over New Mexico on Jan. 6.

- ♦ The Aztecs won their first three conference games of a season for the first time since the 1997 team opened Western Athletic Conference play 7-0.

- ♦ Aztec Beth Burns reached a milestone mark in her 18-year head coaching career on Jan. 13, recording her 300th career win with the team's 70-41 victory over UNLV. Burns is already SDSU's all-time winningest head coach with 223 of those 304 victories coming in her

13 campaigns on the Mesa.

• The Aztecs saw their eight-game Mountain West Conference regular-season win streak, which dated back to a 64-61 loss at Wyoming on Feb. 15, 2009, come to an end at TCU on Jan. 16. The eight-game streak was double the Aztecs' previous long in conference history (four games on three occasions).

• SDSU's seven-game midseason win streak was the team's longest since the 1996-97 squad claimed 11 in a row.

• SDSU won eight straight road games, the team's longest streak since the 1996-97 team won nine in a row, before falling at TCU on Jan. 16.

• Junior Paris Johnson is the fourth Aztec to log 1,000 points, 500 rebounds and 100 blocks. She joins previous standouts Michelle Suman (1991-95), Judy Porter (1980-83), Chana Perry (1988-89) and Jessica Haynes (1986-88).

• SDSU has overcome at least a four-point deficit in six of its 15 victories in 2009-10. The Aztecs have trailed at one point in all but one victory this year, that being the USD contest when they led from the opening tip.

• San Diego State's streak of consecutive Mountain West Conference victories at home came to a halt at 14 games against New Mexico. The streak was the Aztecs' longest in conference history and dated back to a 55-44 loss to Wyoming on Feb. 20, 2008. Still, SDSU has claimed 25 of its last 28 on its home court the last two seasons.

• The Aztecs have held opponents to three or fewer three-pointers in a game 15 times this year. SDSU ranks first in the MWC in three-point field-goal percentage defense at 28.0 (84-for-300) and are ranked 27th nationally in that category.

Preseason Points

For the first time in the league's 11-year history, San Diego State was picked to win the Mountain West Conference title in 2010 in a vote by the nine head coaches and select media members released Oct. 7, at the conference's annual media day in Denver, Colo. The Aztecs received 25 of the 28 first-place votes and 240 points overall. SDSU had nearly 25 more points than second place TCU, which received the three other first-place votes. Utah was picked third, followed by New Mexico, Wyoming, Brigham Young, UNLV, Colorado State and Air Force.

San Diego State had never finished higher than fifth place in the league before tying for the regular-season crown with a 13-3 mark in 2008-09.

More Preseason Team Tid-Bits

In addition to being picked No. 1 in the league, San Diego State has also started to earn a share of the national spotlight.

As a team, the Aztecs were tabbed No. 22 by two national preseason publications, *Lindy's College Basketball* and *Sporting News College Basketball*

Magazine.

A few weeks ago, *ESPN.com* and writer Graham Hays listed SDSU No. 3 among "mid-majors" and earlier this season, picked the Aztecs as one of the "teams to watch as 2009-10 unfolds". Hays also tabbed SDSU's 2010 MWC opener at New Mexico, as the No. 2 game to watch in the nation in the month of January.

Another *ESPN.com* writer, Charlie Crème, chose SDSU No. 23 among his 64 teams to watch in 2009-10.

Jené Morris Up For National Player of the Year

Entering her third and final season at San Diego State, senior Jené Morris is already one of the most heavily-decorated players in program history and will be looking to add more to her trophy case in 2009-10.

Back in July, the 5-9 guard was one of only 25 players named to the preseason "Wade Watch" list for the State Farm Wade Trophy Division I Player of the Year award by the WBCA. The Wade Trophy is now in its 33rd year and is considered to be the "Heisman of Women's Basketball.

Morris is also up for the other college player of the year honor, the John R. Wooden Award, which has been given out annually since 2004. She is one of only 31 to make this year's list and is also a preseason candidate for the Wooden Award All-America team.

She is just the second player in Mountain West Conference history to be named to either watch list, joining Utah's Kim Smith, who was nominated for the Wade Trophy three times and the Wooden Award on two occasions.

Morris was also selected to the annual Naismith Trophy Watch List as one of only 50 women's college basketball players. The Naismith Trophy has been given out annually since 1983.

More On Morris

Aztec senior Jené Morris was named the Mountain West Conference's Preseason Player of the Year in a vote of the league's coaches and select media members. She is the first SDSU player so honored and also was tabbed to the five-member preseason all-conference for the second year in a row.

Last season, Morris, a 2008-09 honorable mention State Farm Coaches' All-American, averaged a team-best 16.1 points per game, scoring 20 or more points eight times and eclipsing the 30-point barrier on three occasions, including 35 points vs. DePaul in the Aztecs' first round NCAA tournament game.

Morris led the league in steals in both overall (3.33/g) and conference-only (2.94/g) outings, ranking seventh nationally and becoming the first Aztec to record 100 steals in a season since Falisha Wright in 1993-94. Morris had three or more steals in 20 of her 30 games, including a league-high eight on two occasions, which are the most by an Aztec since 2002.

Her other honors included being named the 2009 MWC Defensive Player of the Year, first-team all-MWC, MWC all-defensive team, MWC Championship all-tournament team and four-time MWC player of the week.

Morris' other 2009-10 preseason honors include being named a third-team All-American by the *Sporting News* and being tabbed one of 30 candidates for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award.

Awards Aplenty

Jené Morris isn't the only Aztec to have already earned honors this season.

Junior Paris Johnson, a two-year returning starter at center, was named to the MWC preseason all-conference team for the second year in a row.

Johnson's former club teammate, Jessika Bradley, also garnered the program's first-ever Mountain West Conference preseason top newcomer award.

Bradley redshirted a year ago, after spending two seasons at nationally-ranked Baylor. She played in 65 contests for the Bears and averaged 4.8 points, 4.5 rebounds and 1.1 blocks per game as a sophomore.

ESPN.com's Graham Hayes singled out the Johnson-Bradley duo as one of the country's best.

The Arena Formerly Known As Cox Arena

The home of the Aztecs underwent a change this past summer, as the facility is now named the Viejas Arena at Aztec Bowl, after being Cox Arena at Aztec Bowl since its inception in 1997.

The change over happened this past July and is part of a 10-year deal. The arena also sports a brand new 26-foot-high-by-15-feet-wide, four-LED video scoreboard.

Pair Sign National Letters Of Intent

San Diego State women's basketball head coach Beth Burns announced the signing Nov. 11, of 6-3 forward Jasmine Porter (Layton, Utah) and 5-10 combo guard Melissa Sweat (Bakersfield, Calif.) to National Letters of Intent.

Clements, Nahinu Join The Aztecs

San Diego State head coach Beth Burns announced this past May the addition of guard Courtney Clements and center Malia Nahinu to the Aztec basketball roster.

2008-09 Rewind

The San Diego State women's basketball team made a remarkable run in 2008-09, highlighted by its first NCAA appearance in 12 seasons, its first postseason victory in 14 years, a share of the regular-season league title and a return to the national spotlight.

Below are a few of last year's accomplishments:

- Posted the program's first 20-win season in 12 years, finishing with a 24-8 overall record and a 13-3 mark in Mountain West Conference play.
Earned an at-large bid to the 2009 NCAA tournament, defeating DePaul in the first round for the program's first NCAA victory in 14 years (1994).

Won a share of its first-ever Mountain West Conference regular season title. The Aztecs' previous best finish in the 10-year history of the MWC was tied for fifth in 2007-08.

Tallied its first win over an AP ranked team in 14 years by defeating then No. 4 and unbeaten Texas, 60-55, to win the San Diego Surf 'N Slam tournament title.

Earned votes in the Associated Press Top 25 poll six times, a program first since 1997. SDSU ended with five votes in the final ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll.

Advanced to its second consecutive MWC championship game, after failing to even win a game in the event's first eight seasons.

Posted an unbeaten home regular season for just the second time in school history, going 14-0. The record jumped to 15-0 with the NCAA victory over DePaul, before ending against No. 2 Stanford.

Again in 2009-10, all regular season Aztec home contests, with the exception of the televised games, will also feature a live video feed to go along with the audio call from Viejas Arena on www.goaztecs.com.

SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns



The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa in April 8, 2005, and enters the fifth season of her second stint with the Aztecs.

The 2008-09 campaign was the culmination of many years of hard work by Burns and her staff, as San Diego State posted its first 20-win campaign in 12 years, finishing 24-8 overall and 13-3 in conference action.

San Diego State has improved by at least six wins every year after her first season back, when the team went 3-24 overall and 0-16 in league play.

In her first stint as head coach from 1989-97, Burns took the SDSU basketball program full circle, going from 7-23 her first year to 23-7 in her final campaign. During her eight seasons, she compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history.

A three-time WAC coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02). She has a 18-year overall head coaching record of 304-218, while her school record stands at 223-153 over 13 seasons. The game with USD was Burns' 500th as a head coach, while she reached the 300-win plateau vs. UNLV on Jan. 13, 2010.

IRVINE, Calif. - The San Diego State women's basketball team used a 12-0 second-half run to come out victorious, 64-42, over host UC Irvine in the first game of the 2009-10 season at the Bren Events Center. With the win, the Aztecs claimed their third-straight season-opener to move to 1-0, while the Anteaters dropped to 0-1 following the two schools' first meeting in six years.

SDSU had three players finish in double-figure points, including leading scorer junior Paris Johnson, who notched 11 of her game-high 18 points in the first half. Senior Jené Morris finished with 13 points and junior Allison Duffy contributed 11 points off the bench.

Aztec senior co-captain Quenese Davis had six of the team's 13 assists including the 500th of her career, which came at the 16:18 mark of the first half on a three-pointer by Morris. Johnson had five blocks and eight boards, Morris contributed four steals and forward Jessika Bradley logged a team-high 10 rebounds in her official Aztec debut.

San Diego State got off to a bit of a slow start, as UC Irvine scored the first basket of the game, before the Aztecs' first field-goal at the 17:26 mark by Johnson. The team then reeled off two more baskets to lead by five points, but the Anteaters, using a small line-up, tied the score at seven apiece and were within single digits for a majority of the first half, as SDSU led by only 10 at the half, 32-22.

Coming out the break, the two sides continued to trade baskets, until a three-point play by Allison Duffy at the 17:43 mark sparked an 8-0 run for a more comfortable 18-point advantage at 42-24, heading into the first media timeout. The Aztecs extended their scoring spurt to 12 unanswered on a layup and a pair of free throws, until UC Irvine finally broke through with a three-pointer and another basket to trail by 17 at 46-29.

The SDSU lead rose once again to 22 points with 5:37 left in the contest and never got lower than 16 points, before capturing the 22-point win at 64-42.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team jumped out to a 10-point lead early in the first half and never looked back, limiting visiting University of San Diego to only 19 points through the first 25 minutes of the game and going on to claim a 79-52 victory Tuesday evening at Viejas Arena. With the win, the Aztecs (2-0) won their first two games of a season for the third straight year, while the Toreros fell to 1-1 overall.

San Diego State had four players finish in double-figure points, as senior Jené Morris and junior Jessika Bradley both scored 14, and juniors Jerica Williams, who was a perfect 3-for-3 from beyond the arc, and Allison Duffy contributed 13 points apiece. Bradley added 10 rebounds for her first double-double in an Aztec uniform and junior guard Coco Davis had six of the team's 20 assists on the night.

SDSU senior point guard Quenese Davis recorded five assists and, along with Morris, had four steals on the night to lead the defensive effort.

The Aztecs never trailed, scoring the first point on a free throw by Coco Davis and logging the first field goal on a Morris triple. The Toreros countered with a jumper by Nya Mason and a bucket by Morgan Henderson, but the home team scored four lay-ups in the paint for an eight-point lead at 12-4.

A Quenese Davis jumper at the 13-minute mark sparked a 7-0 run to put the host up by 13 and would move all the way out to 26 at the half, as San Diego State headed into the locker room on a 15-2 run to make the score 45-19.

The Toreros' offense continued to struggle out of the break, as it failed to score a point until the 14:43 mark with the Aztecs now up by 34 points. The SDSU lead stayed in the upper 20's to low 30's most of the rest of the way until the final buzzer sounded for the team's 79-52 win.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team limited visiting Arizona to only 19 points in each half, as the Aztecs claimed a hard-fought 57-38 victory at the first-ever JHG Jam at Viejas Arena. With the win, SDSU improved to a perfect 3-0 and won its 18th straight regular-season contest on its home floor, while the Wildcats fell to 2-1 following the first meeting between the two sides in 11 years.

The Aztecs were led by junior center Paris Johnson, who logged her 13th career double-double with 18 points and a season-best 10 rebounds to go with four blocked shots and three steals in only 25 minutes of action. Classmate Jessica Bradley matched Johnson's rebounding effort with 10 of her own for her third-straight game in double-figures and also had three blocked shots.

Senior guard Jené Morris was the only other SDSU player in double-figure points with 12, bolstered by a pair of three-pointers. Morris and junior Allison Duffy each recorded four of the team's 14 steals on the night, and junior Coco Davis posted seven points and a game-high seven assists.

The contest proved to be a physical battle from the outset, as both teams guarded each other closely up the floor and contested most every shot. There were four tie scores in the first half, before San Diego State could put some distance between themselves and the Wildcats in the final two minutes until the break. Leading by only two points 21-19, Johnson hit a lay-up in the paint, Morris converted a three-pointer and Bradley made the first of two free throws to send the host into the locker room up 27-19.

The Aztecs used that momentum coming out of the break, going on a 13-2 run in the first five minutes to move out to a 40-23 lead with 14:51 remaining. That advantage grew to as many as 23 points at 50-27 on an Allison Duffy jumper. The SDSU lead dipped below 20 points in the final three minutes, but never fell further than 17, before claiming the 57-38 victory.

THOMAS, UVI - The San Diego State women's basketball team cut a 21-point, first-half deficit all the way down to two with less than 30 seconds remaining, but was unable to pull off the Thanksgiving Day upset, dropping its first game of the season to No. 5/6 Notre Dame, 84-79, in day one action of the 2009 Paradise Jam in St. Thomas, U.S. Virgin Islands. With the loss, the Aztecs fell to 3-1 on the year, while the Irish improved to 4-0.

The senior guard tandem of Jené Morris and Quenese Davis carried the team offensively, as the Aztec front court was saddled with foul trouble most of the day. Morris notched her fifth career 30-point scoring outing, recording 26 of her game-high 32 points in the second half. Morris also tallied all four of the team's three-pointers, came away with six steals and added five rebounds.

Quenese Davis, meanwhile, kept SDSU in the game in the first 20 minutes of play, making six of her 10 shots for 15 of her 25 points, which matched a career-best. The senior co-captain was a rebound off of a double-double with a team game-high nine and tied for the lead in assists with five in playing all 40 minutes.

Besides Morris and Davis, junior forward Jessica Bradley also scored 12 points to go with eight rebounds, three assists, three steals and two blocks.

The game turned out to be the tale of two halves, as the Aztecs fell behind early, missing six of their first seven shots to trail by eight. Notre Dame, meanwhile, couldn't miss, going up by 10 points at 16-6 and then more than doubling that lead in a matter of just over three minutes, capped by a three-point play by Erica Solomon at 30-9. The deficit hung at around 20 until the 5:49 mark, when SDSU went on a 13-8 run to head into the locker room down by 15 at 44-29.

The Aztecs continued to chip away at the Irish lead coming out of the break, but didn't get to within single-digits until there was just under six minutes left to play on a Bradley lay-up at 69-60. Notre Dame edged their advantage back up to 13 and then 11, before Morris found her touch from outside, nailing three triples on SDSU's next five trips up the floor, including her final one from well beyond the top of the arc to get to within four at 79-75.

San Diego State was within a single basket following two Quenese Davis free throws with 29 seconds remaining, but the Irish made three of their four shots from the charity stripe to preserve the 84-79 victory.

The score would be tied for the 17th and final occasion at 46 all with 4:59 left in the game. From there, the Gamecocks scored six unanswered points, before the Aztecs chopped their deficit all the way down to a single point with 19 seconds remaining on a three-pointer by Jerica Williams.

On the ensuing in-bound play, however, SDSU was unable to get a steal and South Carolina's Valerie Nainima found La'Keisha Sutton for an easy lay-up on to push the lead back out to three points. Davis missed a desperation and potential tying 3-pointer at the buzzer, as the Aztecs fell, 58-55.

RIVERSIDE, Calif. - San Diego State overcame an early 10-point deficit and a hot-shooting UC Riverside team for a 66-59 victory over the Highlanders at the Student Recreation Center in Riverside, Calif. Playing their fourth consecutive game away from Viejas Arena, the Aztecs improved to 4-3 on the season, while UCR dropped to 2-5.

SDSU was led by the trio of junior Paris Johnson and seniors Quenese Davis and Jené Morris, who combined to score 55 of the team's 66 points, including 35 of the 37 second half points.

Johnson logged her 14th career double-double with 17 points and 15 rebounds in 27 minutes. The 15 rebounds matched a career high, which was set March 7, 2009 at UNLV. She made all five of her free-throw attempts.

Both players played all 40 minutes in the backcourt for San Diego State.

The Aztecs struggled out of the gate, getting down by as many as 10 points on a three-pointer by UC Riverside's Amber Cox with 10:14 remaining in the first half. SDSU answered with eight consecutive points, including six by Johnson, to close within two with 7:17 left. San Diego State finally took the lead at 27-26 on a pair of free-throws by junior Jessica Bradley, but was outscored, 5-2, over the final 3:56 to head into intermission trailing by a 31-29 margin.

The momentum went back and forth in the second half as the Highlanders answered the Aztecs' runs with three-pointers and long jumpers. In fact, UCR, a 29.5 three-point shooting team coming into the game, made 9-of-18 from beyond the three-point arc.

SDSU, however, took the lead for good at 48-47 on a Davis lay-up with 9:38 left in the second half. The lay-up was part of an 11-0 San Diego State run that culminated with a three-pointer by Morris to put the visitors up, 55-47 with 7:23 remaining in the game.

UC Riverside closed to within five points at 64-59 at the 51-second mark, but a steal and a pair of free-throws by Davis sealed the victory for the Aztecs.

SAN DIEGO - Pepperdine's Jazmine Jackson hit the winning lay-up with less than a second left in overtime to hand the San Diego State women's basketball team a 62-61 loss at Viejas Arena. The Aztecs, playing their first overtime outing since 2006, dropped to 4-4 on the year, while the Waves improved to 6-4 overall.

San Diego State trailed for most of the game, as the visitors got off to a 4-0 lead to start and were up by nine at halftime, 34-25. The Waves' advantage grew to as many as 11 points on their first bucket coming out of the locker room.

Facing a double-figure deficit for the second game in a row, the Aztecs finally began to pick up steam, using an 8-0 run to get to within one point at the 10:45 mark and eventually took the lead following two straight lay-ups in the paint at 48-47.

Pepperdine took back the lead on its very next basket and the game was tied for the fifth time at 52-52 with just over three and a half minutes left. Neither side was able to convert until the final minute, when Jené Morris hit a falling jumper along the baseline and was fouled with 48 seconds remaining. Morris, however, missed the ensuing free throw, which would have put SDSU up by three points, as Wave Katie Menton sent the game into overtime on a basket with 20 seconds left and the score tied at 54-54.

San Diego State fell behind by four points with 2:16 remaining in the five-minute overtime period, but rallied back to take the lead at 61-60 on a Paris Johnson lay-up and Morris' only three-pointer of the game. Pepperdine missed a jumper on its next trip up the floor, which was rebounded by Johnson, but Morris couldn't hold on to a long outlet pass at the other end and the Waves retook possession with 25 seconds remaining.

Coming out of a timeout, Jackson waited until the clock went under seven seconds and drove from the top of the key, ran around a crowd of Aztec defenders and managed to drive in for the winning lay-up on the right side of the basket to secure the 62-61 victory.

The SDSU junior duo of Johnson and Allison Duffy each finished the night with 17 points on a combined 16-for-30 shooting performance from the floor. Morris posted 13 points, five assists and three steals, while fellow senior Quenese Davis had seven assists and scored 10 points to become the second Aztec this season, and the 18th overall, to reach the 1,000-career point mark.

San Diego State ended the game outshooting the Waves from the field (42.6-37.7), but Pepperdine owned a +9 advantage on the glass, bolstered by 20-14 advantage in offensive rebounds. The Aztecs also made just 1-of-6 attempts at the charity stripe, including an 0-for-2 mark in overtime.

With the win, the Aztecs defeated the Lions for the second year in a row, improving to 6-4 on the season, while the home team dropped to 6-6 in 2009-10.

Davis notched her fourth 20-point scoring outing of the season and second in as many games, finishing with a career-high 26 points, including 17 in the first half, on 10-for-13 shooting. She was one of four Aztecs in double-figure points, as Jené Morris tallied 16 points all in the second half, Jessika Bradley had 14 points and Paris Johnson contributed 10 on 5-for-5 shooting.

Davis also had four steals, five assists and tied for the team lead with Bradley in rebounds with eight apiece. Morris, meanwhile, finished with a game-high seven assists and ended the night 8-for-11 shooting from the floor.

The host Lions got off to the quick start, going up by four points at 4-0, before building a nine-point advantage on a three-pointer at the 12:48 mark at 15-6. The Aztecs closed the gap in a hurry, as a Davis triple started a 9-2 run to get to within a pair at 17-15 and then later at 19-17.

Coming out of a media timeout, guard Kim Spinardi hit a 3-pointer from the top of the key for SDSU's first lead of the night at 20-19. A Bradley lay-up followed, but LMU knotted the game at 22 points apiece.

From there the Aztec defense took over, limiting the Lions to only four points in the final 5:58. Davis was just as dominating on the offensive side, as the senior scored 17 of the team's 26 first-half points to give her squad a 10-point halftime edge, 36-26.

The LMU drought continued coming out of the break with the home team only hitting one field goal within the first 7:18 as San Diego State built an 18-point lead at 49-31. The Aztecs would push their advantage out to as many as 23 on six occasions, before coming away with the 75-54 victory.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team rallied from a nine-point deficit for the second time in as many games, edging visiting Wake Forest, 63-62, on at Viejas Arena. With the victory, the Aztecs, improved to 7-4 overall, while the Demon Deacons dropped to 8-4 on the year. SDSU will take on Auburn, which defeated Valparaiso 51-50, in the championship game of the fifth annual San Diego Surf 'N Slam Classic on Wednesday.

SDSU was led offensively by the senior guard tandem of Quenese Davis and Jené Morris. Davis extended her streak of consecutive 20-point scoring outings to three, notching 24 points on 9-of-12 shooting. The starting point guard has five games with over 20 points this season and also tallied eight rebounds against the Demon Deacons.

Morris, meanwhile, finished with 18 points, and had three steals in playing all 40 minutes. Aztec junior Jessika Bradley tallied eight rebounds and a career-best four blocked shots, all of which came in the second half.

Wake Forest hit each of its first three shots and raced out to the early 8-0 lead. The Aztecs countered with a Davis three-pointer and jumper to get back to within three before eventually knotting the score at 10 apiece. The Demon Deacons came out of the tie with a field goal less than 30 seconds later and maintained the lead the entire first half, going up by as many as nine at 32-23, before the Aztecs got back to within six at the break, 36-30.

SDSU's first lead of the night didn't come until the 16:09 mark of the second half when Morris hit a lay-up for the one-point advantage at 39-28. The two sides traded leads two more times with the Aztecs looking to gain control with a seven-point lead with just 2:34 left to play.

Wake Forest went on a 6-2 run to get to within three and had a chance to tie it when Brooke Thomas was fouled on a 3-point attempt with six seconds left. Thomas, however, made just two of three free throws and SDSU was able to inbound the ball and run out the clock to preserve the 63-62 win.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team shot 52.1 percent from the field and had four players score in double-figures to claim its second consecutive Surf 'N Slam title with a 66-55 victory over Auburn at Viejas Arena. With the win, SDSU improved to 8-4 overall, while the Tigers dropped to 9-4 on the year following the two schools' first-ever meeting.

Four of the Aztecs' five starters finished in double-figure scoring, led by junior Paris Johnson, who was one rebound short of a double-double with a game-high 18 points and nine rebounds. Senior Quenese Davis was named the tournament MVP with her 16 points, six rebounds, four steals and five assists in 38 minutes.

SDSU junior Jessika Bradley tallied 12 points, seven rebounds and three blocked shots, while classmate Coco Davis added a season-best 10 points, including both of the team's 3-pointers. Senior Jené Morris, who had 18 points vs. Wake Forest, joined Johnson and Quenese Davis on the six-player all-tournament squad.

After having to rally from nine-point deficits in each of their last two outings, the Aztecs kept it close the entire first half, falling behind by as many as four points on nine occasions, but retaking the lead at the 2:49 mark at 27-26 on a Bradley jumper. That basket kick started a 6-2 run which put the host up 31-28 heading into the locker room.

SDSU continued that momentum after the break, pushing out to a double-figure lead less than four minutes into the second half and eventually went up by as many as 15 points at 44-29. Auburn, however, fought back with a scoring run of its own, getting to within six points three times, including as late as the 8:09 mark.

Back-to-back baskets in the paint pushed the Aztecs back in front by double-figures and the team outscored Auburn 6-2 in the final 1:33 to pull out the 66-55 victory.

ALBUQUERQUE - The San Diego State women's basketball team outscored host New Mexico 36-19 in the second half to cruise to a 61-39 victory in both schools' 2010 Mountain West Conference opener at The Pit in Albuquerque, N.M. With the victory, the Aztecs have won two straight on UNM's home court and have claimed three in a row vs. the Lobos for the first time since 1995, moving to 9-4 on the year. SDSU made the first bucket of the game, but the Lobos responded for the first of three ties, including at 10-10 at the 10:53 mark. The Aztecs broke out of that tie with their first 3-pointer of the night by Davis and extended their lead out to five points on a Johnson lay-up.

UNM used a 6-0 run to gain its final advantage in the first half at 16-15. The Lobos, however, would only tally four more points the rest of the way, as SDSU took a 25-20 lead heading into the locker room.

New Mexico managed to get back to within a single possession after the break, scoring the first three points to close the gap to 25-23. SDSU moved back out to an eight-point lead on back-to-back jumpers by Johnson and a basket by Davis. The Aztec lead would grow to 10 points at 35-25, before dropping back to seven points on a Lobo three-pointer.

After that, Morris and Davis took over, combining to score the game's next 13 points which was a part of a 17-0 run, as SDSU went up by 22 and won by the same margin at the buzzer, 61-39.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team claimed its 11th consecutive home conference victory with a 65-50 win over visiting Wyoming Saturday afternoon at Viejas Arena. The Aztecs have now won each of their last seven regular-season conference games and have come out on top in six straight overall this season, moving to 10-4 and 2-0 in MWC action. The Cowgirls, who were the last league school to defeat SDSU on its home floor in 2008, dropped to 10-4 overall and 1-1 in conference play.

San Diego State got solid outings from each of its five starters, as senior Jené Morris notched her second consecutive 20-point scoring effort with a game-high 22 points, including a 4-for-9 performance from beyond the arc, and five assists. Two Aztecs notched double-doubles with junior Paris Johnson finishing with 13 points and 10 rebounds and senior Quenese Davis posting 11 points and a season-best 10 boards.

SDSU junior Jessika Bradley fell one rebound short of becoming the third Aztec in double-figures with nine boards and eight points, while classmate Coco Davis added five points and five assists.

Both sides started the game red hot from beyond the arc, as the two teams combined for six 3-pointers in the first nine made field-goals. There were also 10 lead changes within the first seven minutes of play until three consecutive Morris baskets started a 14-0 SDSU run to put the host ahead 29-16 at the 7:44 mark.

Wyoming would get its deficit down to single digits four times before the break, but Morris' fourth triple of the first half put the Aztecs up 39-27 heading into the locker room.

Outrebounded 23-7 in the first half, the Cowgirls got three boards within the first two minutes and came to within eight on a pair of free throws and later, trailed by seven on an Emma Langford triple at 41-34.

The seven points would be as close as the visitors would get, however, as four different Aztecs contributed at least one basket in a five-minute span to put them ahead by 16 points and later posted their largest lead of the afternoon at 17 at 61-44 with 7:20 left. Wyoming made a late run, getting to within 11, but SDSU went on to win by 15 points, 65-50.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team outscored UNLV 27-2 in the final seven minutes of the first half to easily give head coach Beth Burns her 300th career victory, as the Aztecs ran away with a 70-41 decision over the visiting Lady Rebels Wednesday at Viejas Arena. With the win, SDSU improved to a perfect 3-0 in conference play and won its seventh in a row overall, moving to 11-4 on the season. UNLV, meanwhile, dropped its seventh consecutive meeting with the Aztecs and stayed winless in the MWC (0-3), falling to 7-10 this year.

SDSU junior Jené Morris recorded a game-high 18 points, six assists and four steals in just 27 minutes of action. The game was close for the first three minutes before the Aztecs came out of a 4-4 tie with 11 unanswered points to go up 15-4 at the 13:01 mark of the first half. UNLV then went on a run of its own, scoring seven in a row to get back to within four points at 15-11 and again at 17-13.

Quenese Davis, however, hit a 3-pointer 15 seconds later and the Lady Rebels made only one more field goal in the final nine minutes of the first half, as SDSU went into the locker room up by 32 points at 49-17.

UNLV came out of the break outscoring the Aztecs 10-4 to get to within 26 points at 53-27, but SDSU increased its lead back up to 30 points on a Duffy lay-up with 14:37 left in the game and went on to win by 29, 70-41.

WORTH, Texas - The No. 22 ranked TCU Lady Frogs outscored the visiting San Diego State women's basketball team 42-31 in the second half to hand the Aztecs their first conference loss of the season, 80-63, Saturday afternoon at Daniel-Meyer Coliseum. SDSU saw its longest win streak since the 1996-97 campaign come to an end at seven games, falling to 11-5 overall and 3-1 in conference action. The Lady Frogs, meanwhile, won their 16th consecutive home game to improve to 13-4 and 3-1 in MWC play.

SDSU junior Allison Duffy came off the bench to score a team-best 16 points, including 12 in the second half, on 5-for-11 shooting. Junior Paris Johnson added 12 points and a team-best eight rebounds, while senior Jené Morris also had 12 points, before fouling out with 2:12 left in the game.

Both Morris and senior Quenese Davis had three steals apiece and Coco Davis had a team-best four assists and seven points.

TCU started the afternoon with the hot hand from the field, going up early by making nine of its first 14 shots to lead by 10 points at 23-13. The Aztecs cut their deficit in half with a long-range triple from Quenese Davis and a Bradley lay-up at 23-18. The Lady Frog advantage jumped back up to nine on two occasions, but SDSU continued to keep it close, heading into the locker room trailing by six at 38-32, despite committing 13 first-half turnovers.

The Lady Frogs scored the first five points of the second half to increase their lead back into double-figures and went to as many as 16 on three occasions before getting to 20 at the 10:03 mark. San Diego State got the deficit down to as few as 13 points, however, couldn't overcome a 12-for-38 shooting performance in the second half.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team kept visiting Utah scoreless for the final 5:50 of the game to earn a 51-42 victory Wednesday evening at Viejas Arena. The Aztecs, who won their 13th consecutive home conference outing, moved to 12-5 overall and 4-1 in MWC play, while the Utes, who have yet to score 50 points in four league contests this season, dropped to 10-7 and 1-3.

San Diego State senior Jené Morris notched her third 20-point scoring outing in the team's five league games thus far in 2010, posting 22 points, including 14 of the team's 29 total first-half points. Morris also added five steals and three triples to go with three assists in 39 minutes. She was the only Aztec in double-figure points, as Quenese Davis had nine points and a team-best four assists and Allison Duffy added seven points and six rebounds.

The Aztecs led the entire first half, building an 11-point lead at 23-12 with 8:31 left. Utah answered with a 4-0 run and trailed by only four heading into the locker room at 29-25.

Coming out of the break, Utah got two quick buckets to tie the score at 29 points apiece and took their first advantage of the night at 33-32 with 16:41 left to play. SDSU retook the lead on a Morris 3-pointer, but the game was tied again at 39. Out of the tie, the Aztecs notched back-to-back 3-pointers by Davis and Duffy to jump ahead by six points at 45-39.

After a 3-pointer by Kalee Whipple put the Utes behind by 45-42 with 5:51 remaining, Utah failed to score another point the rest of the way. The Utes had four turnovers and missed all five field goal tries and four free-throw attempts. During that same span, San Diego State scored three buckets in the paint to win by nine points, 51-42.

PROVO, Utah - The San Diego State women's basketball team cut a 14-point first-half deficit down to only two points at the half, but the visiting Aztecs were never able to gain the lead, falling to Brigham Young, 73-63, Saturday afternoon at the Marriott Center. With the loss, SDSU dropped to 12-6 overall and 4-2 in league action, while the Cougars improved to 13-4 and 4-1 in MWC play.

San Diego State had four players finish in double-figure scoring, including senior Jené Morris, who had a game-high 17 points and the team's only 3-pointers of the afternoon. Fellow senior Quenese Davis had 13 points and seven assists, while Allison Duffy and Paris Johnson, who recorded her 1,000th career point in the first half, both added 10 apiece.

Aztec junior Jessika Bradley pulled down seven of the team's 27 total rebounds and also had a pair of blocked shots. Morris and Davis finished with three of SDSU's 11 total steals on the afternoon.

BYU made three of the first four baskets of the game, including a 3-pointer to start, for the quick five-point lead at 7-2. SDSU cut it to a three-point deficit, but a hot Cougar offense made seven of its first 10 shots for a nine-point advantage and eventually went up by double-figures at 20-9.

The Aztecs later trailed by as many 14 heading into the second media timeout, before getting back-to-back Duffy lay-ups to trail by 10 at 24-14. The visitors continued their scoring run to nine unanswered and after a BYU jumper, ended up outscoring the Cougars 12-4 to come all the way back to within just four points at 28-24. SDSU had a chance to head into the locker room at least tied or ahead with a made basket, but Coco Davis' 3-pointer with seconds left failed to go in as the Aztecs still were down by only a pair at 33-31.

BYU came out of the halftime break by bumping the lead back up to nine points right away, as the Aztecs missed their first four shots before two lay-ups by Bradley and Duffy broke the drought to come back to three at 40-37.

San Diego State was within one on two occasions, but another BYU run meant it led by nine with 11:44 remaining in the game. Down the stretch, the Aztecs trailed by as few as five points with over a minute left, but the Cougars made seven of their eight free throws to claim the 73-63 win.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team broke open a four-point game with a 21-3 run midway through the second half to pull away from visiting Colorado State, 59-38, at Viejas Arena. The Aztecs (13-6) won their 14th consecutive Mountain West Conference home game and moved to 5-2 in conference play.

SDSU forced 35 Ram (11-9, 3-4 MWC) turnovers, the most against an Aztec team since Air Force had 38 miscues in San Diego on March 8, 2008 (54 games), and held CSU to just 27.3 percent shooting (12-for-44). San Diego State also had a season-high 16 steals.

Senior Jené Morris led all scorers with 19 points, including 12 in the second half. Morris also added four rebounds and three steals in 27 minutes. Senior Quenese Davis had a good all-around game with eight points, seven rebounds, five assists and two steals, while juniors Jessika Bradley (three blocks, career-high four steals) and Paris Johnson each had eight points and a game-high seven rebounds.

San Diego State led for most of the first half and by as much as seven at 15-8 when Bradley drained a jumper with 9:11 left. Colorado State went on 8-0 run, however, to take the 16-15 lead with 4:05 remaining on a pair of Chatilla van Grinsven free-throws. The Aztecs answered with a 7-0 run to head into intermission with a 22-16 lead.

In the second half, a lay-up by Kim Mestdagh brought the Rams to within four at 29-25 with 14:01 remaining. SDSU responded with the 21-3 run, with 10 of the 21 points coming from Morris, to take a commanding 50-28 lead with 4:35 left. CSU never got closer than 18 as San Diego State won its fifth straight in the series.

USAF ACADEMY, Colo. - The San Diego State women's basketball team used its advantage inside to outscore host Air Force 48-14 in the paint, finishing the first round of league action with a 68-48 victory at Clune Arena. With the win, the Aztecs kept pace atop the Mountain West Conference standings, moving to 6-2 in league play and 14-6 overall, while the Falcons dropped to 0-8 and 3-18 in 2009-10.

Nine of the 10 Aztecs to see action scored at least two points, with the lone exception being junior guard Coco Davis, who notched a career and team season-high 10 assists on the night to go with six rebounds. Davis' 10 helpers were one more than her previous career best of nine last year in a win over Wyoming, and marks the first time an SDSU player has reached double-figures since her sister, Quenese Davis, had 10 assists vs. TCU on Feb. 28, 2009.

Junior Paris Johnson had her best offensive performance in MWC action, scoring 17 points and hauling in a team-high eight rebounds. Her front court teammate, Jessika Bradley, was the only other Aztec in double-figure points with 13, as the pair combined to make 13 of their 20 shot attempts.

Quenese Davis, who tallied a career-high three blocked shots, and classmate senior Jené Morris each had nine points apiece.

The Falcons scored the first basket of the game on a 3-pointer by Desiree Wilson, but the Aztecs countered with five consecutive field goals in the paint to go up by seven at 10-3. The SDSU lead would get into double-figures following back-to-back fastbreak lay-ups off of steals by Quenese Davis and Ashley Duffy and grew to as many as 18 points with 3:33 left in the half.

The visitor's advantage was only 13 heading into the locker room at 36-23, and Air Force continued to chip away out of the break, getting to within 10 at 40-30 at the 16:42 mark. That would be as close as the Falcons would get, however, as the Aztecs utilized a 12-2 run over a near five-minute period to go up by 23 points before closing out the 68-48 victory.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team saw its conference home win streak come to an end at 14 games, as the visiting New Mexico Lobos earned a 65-58 victory in front of 2,069 fans at Viejas Arena. The loss was the Aztecs' first at home in league play since the 2008 campaign and also ended a seven-game home win streak overall. SDSU, which split the regular-season series with UNM, fell to 14-7 and dropped into a three-way tie in the Mountain West Conference standings at 6-3 with BYU and the Lobos, who improved to 14-7 in 2009-10.

Aztec senior Jené Morris posted a game-high 21 points with four of the team's six 3-pointers. It was Morris' second 20-point scoring game against the Lobos this year, fifth of the season and 19th overall in the Red & Black. Fellow co-captain Quenese Davis was the only other SDSU player in double-figure points, scoring 10, while posting a team game-high five assists and five steals.

Junior Allison Duffy contributed nine points, but the Aztec front court duo of juniors Paris Johnson and Jessika Bradley were limited to only a combined 13 points and four rebounds.

The lead changed hands six times in the opening seven minutes of the game. A Davis lay-up put SDSU in front by one at 12-11 and kicked started a 6-0 run that gave the host its largest lead of the afternoon at 16-11. UNM closed the gap back to a single point on back-to-back lay-ups off in-bound passes by Georonika Jackson, but the Aztecs managed to stay ahead the remainder of the half, entering the locker room with a four-point advantage at 30-26.

A quick 3-pointer out of the break by Lobo Jessica Kielpinski brought their deficit down to only one and the score was tied at 36 and 43, before New Mexico took the lead on the second of two free throws with 12:07 remaining.

SDSU would later draw even on three more occasions, but was never able to move ahead, as the Lobos used a 6-0 run to go up 59-53 with 2:07 left and hit four of their six free-throw attempts down the stretch to secure the 65-58 victory.

SDSU dropped back-to-back games for the first time since November, falling to 14-8 overall and 6-4 in league action, while the Cowgirls improved to 15-7 and 6-4 in MWC play.

Aztec senior Quenese Davis matched her career high with 11 rebounds to go with 10 points for her second double-double of the season, while also adding a team-best five assists and three steals in 40 minutes of action. Classmate Jené Morris was limited to 12 points on 4-for-18 shooting, but matched her career best with seven rebounds and posted three assists, two steals and two blocks.

SDSU junior Paris Johnson logged six of the team's nine total rejections on the night for a season best and also tallied nine points and seven rebounds. Junior forward Allison Duffy was the third Aztec in double-figure points with 10, including a pair of 3-pointers.

The Aztecs missed their first five shots of the game until their first basket by Johnson made it 7-2 and was followed by a fastbreak lay-up by Davis to get them back to within three at 7-4. The gap remained three points, but then rose to seven on two occasions at the 9:18 and 5:27 mark.

SDSU answered back, nailing three consecutive 3-pointers, including a pair by Morris, to keep the visitors to within a pair with a minute left in the half. Following a timeout, Wyoming's Jade Kennedy hit an open triple and after an Aztec miss at the other end, Kennedy struck again from beyond the arc to turn a two-point Aztec deficit into eight points at 30-22 heading into the locker room.

San Diego State scored the opening bucket of the second half, but the Cowgirls got the next two to build their largest lead of the night to that point at 34-24. The deficit was still 10 points at 38-28, until a triple from the top of the arc with one second left on the shot clock by Hillary Carlson gave Wyoming an 11-point advantage and kick started a 6-0 run to move the score out to 44-30.

The Aztecs trailed by as many as 17 with 4:53 to go, but came as close as nine at 54-45 at the 1:45 mark. Wyoming, however, hit nine of 10 free throws to secure the 63-51 victory.

LAS VEGAS - The San Diego State women's basketball team cut a 10-point second-half deficit down to just two with under a minute remaining, but UNLV made 25 of its 41 free-throw attempts, including six in the final minute, to claim a 66-59 victory at Cox Pavilion. With the loss, San Diego State, which had an early 16-point lead, dropped its third in a row to fall to 14-9 overall and 6-5 in league play, while UNLV improved to 12-13 and 5-6 in conference action.

SDSU junior Paris Johnson had a season-high 19 points on 9-of-12 shooting to go with nine rebounds, while senior Jené Morris posted 17 points and four assists. Senior Quenese Davis tallied her second consecutive double-double with a season-best 10 assists and 10 points. Junior Jessika Bradley had nine boards, but was held scoreless after attempting only two shots.

The Aztecs opened the game with great energy on both ends of the court, racing out to a 10-0 lead, as UNLV missed its first six shots from the field before finally getting on the scoreboard with a free-throw at the 15:20 mark. The Lady Rebels didn't make a field goal until almost six minutes into the game and SDSU's advantage grew to 16 with the score 23-7 on a Johnson lay-up.

UNLV got right back in the game by capitalizing on the Aztecs' 16 first-half turnovers and cold shooting, coming all the way back to take the lead on the second of two free throws by Jamie Smith at 26-25 with under a minute remaining. Quenese Davis countered by making two free throws herself to give the Aztecs a 27-26 edge at the break.

SDSU finally broke through with its first field goal since the 7:54 mark of the first half on a Johnson lay-up three minutes into the second half. The two sides traded leads until UNLV used an 8-0 run to build its largest lead of the afternoon at four points and then went up by six at 50-44 and later 10 points at 56-46.

The Aztecs cut the double-figure deficit down to six points at 56-50 and later were down by just four with 53 seconds remaining on a Coco Davis 3-pointer from the right angle. The Lady Rebels made a free throw, but Quenese Davis banked in a difficult leaning jumper off the glass and was fouled to draw SDSU to within two at 61-59.

That would be as close as the visitors would get, as UNLV made five of its final six shots at the charity stripe to preserve the 66-59 victory.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team got back into the win column in a big way, upsetting 23rd-ranked and first-place TCU, 84-61, at Viejas Arena. The Aztecs' 23-point margin of victory was their largest in the 15 all-time meetings between the two sides and helped them improve to 15-9 overall and 7-5 in the Mountain West Conference. TCU, meanwhile, dropped to 19-6 overall and 9-3 in league action.

SDSU, playing its fourth game against a top 25 foe this year, scored a season-high 84 points with four of five starters reaching double-figures. Senior Jené Morris notched 16 of her game-high 23 points in the first half and also added four steals, five assists and five rebounds. Classmate Quenese Davis recorded her third consecutive double-double with a career-best 13 rebounds, 14 points, seven assists and three steals.

Junior Paris Johnson fell one board short of a double-double with her 19 points and nine rebounds, while junior Coco Davis added a career-best 12 points to go with three steals in 35 minutes of play. Sophomore Kalena Tutt had a career night for SDSU scoring eight points, hauling in five rebounds and blocking a pair of shots.

The Aztecs trailed only once the entire night on the opening bucket of the game at 2-0. A lay-up by Quenese Davis knotted the score at 2-2 less than a minute later and began a 7-0 run to put the host up by five. That lead grew to double-figure on consecutive lay-ups by Tutt and Morris at 17-6, before jumping out to as many as 19 points at the 9:59 mark.

The league's top offensive team, TCU cut its deficit in a hurry, converting three straight 3-pointers in just over a minute and to back to within 10. After its lead dipped all the way to eight at the 7:15 mark, SDSU finished the half by outscoring the Lady Frogs 18-8 to run the score up to 49-31.

Out of the break, TCU never got to within single digits again, trailing by as many as 26 points before the Aztecs went on to claim a dominating 84-61 win.
