## THE SET-UP

San Diego State (3-3; 1-1 MW) enters the second half of the season on Saturday when it entertains long-time rival Colorado State (1-5; 0-2 MW) at Qualcomm Stadium. Kickoff for the homecoming game is set for 3:30 p.m. PT. The game will be televised by Time Warner Cable SportsNet, with radio coverage provided by KOGO 95.7 FM & AM 600. Tickets, starting at \$8, are available through the normal outlets, including GoAztecs.com, SDSU ticket office at Qualcomm Stadium and Ticketmaster.

Note the 3:30 p.m. PT kickoff time has changed from the original schedule time of 4 p.m. PT, released prior to the beginning of the season. The time change was made to accommodate television.

The Aztecs snapped a brief two-game losing streak with by dominating Hawai'i, 52-14, last Saturday at the Q. SDSU jumped out to a 21-0 lead and outgained the Warriors, 412-173, in the contest. The San Diego State defense forced three turnovers, held Hawai'i to 2-for-11 on third-down situations and limited the Warriors to 12 first downs in the game.

On offense, the Aztecs were balanced, rushing for 194 yards and five touchdowns and passing for 218, while playing turnover-free football for the third time this season. Senior quarterback Ryan Katz rushed for 57 yards and a career-high three touchdowns and was 15-of-29 for 190 yards and two scores through the air.

Colorado State is 1-5 on the season but played Fresno State close for much of the game last week before falling, 28-7. The Rams own a victory this season over Pac-12 member Colorado.

Saturday marks the 32nd all-time meeting between San Diego State and Colorado State as the two teams have met in 20 of the previous 21 seasons (1998 is the exception). The Aztecs have won three straight in the series and six of the last seven encounters between the teams. Four of the last five games in the series have been decided by five points or less.

**STORYLINES**

- San Diego State and Colorado State meet for the 32nd time in school history on Saturday. For the Aztecs, which lead the series 18-13, it is the sixth-most common opponent among active schools. The only teams SDSU has faced more often are Fresno State (52), New Mexico (38), Brigham Young (35), San Jose State (36) and Wyoming (33). The 18 victories are the third-highest against any opponent, trailing only Fresno State (27) and New Mexico (23).
- Despite heavy personnel losses from a year ago, the San Diego State offense is scoring at remarkable rates. The Aztecs rank 25th nationally in scoring offense (38.17) and have posted their highest scoring total through the first six games since 1996, a span of 16 seasons.
- Although the defensive unit has struggled at times this season, the SDSU unit is coming off one of the most impressive performances in recent memory. San Diego State allowed just 173 yards of total offense in the victory over Hawai'i on Saturday and allowed an average of just 2.98 yards per play. That is the lowest per play average allowed by an SDSU squad since Nicholls State (2.71 ypp) on Sept. 4, 2010, the lowest against a FBS opponent since Colorado State (2.97 ypp) on Oct. 16, 2004 and the 33rd lowest average in the Division I era.
- San Diego State's defense ranks 10th nationally in turnovers forced this season with 14. The unit has forced seven turnovers in the last two games.
- Aztec running back Adam Muema ranks 27th nationally in rushing yards per game (99.50) and is fifth in the country among sophomores.
- Saturday marks the annual Homecoming game for San Diego State University. The Aztecs have struggled recently in the annual contest, posting just a 1-8 record in the last nine homecoming games (the victory during that stretch was a 27-25 win over Air Force in 2010). SDSU has not done itself any favors as the Aztecs have played a nationally-ranked opponent on four of those occasions. This marks the 74th Homecoming game for San Diego State, which enters Saturday with a 44-27-2 record.
- A reminder that halftime will be extended five minutes to 25 minutes on Saturday to accommodate Homecoming festivities.

**OBSCURE NOTES OF THE WEEK**

- San Diego State enjoyed a +3 turnover margin in Saturday's victory over Hawai'i. The Aztecs did not turn the ball over, while forcing three Warrior lost fumbles. It marked the 62nd time in the Division I era that SDSU has been +3 or better in the turnover category and the Aztecs have a 56-6 record in those games. San Diego State has won the last five games in which it has been +3 or better in the category, dating back to a Nov. 22, 2008 loss at TCU.
- Against Hawai'i, the Aztecs played turnover free ball for the third time this season and the 49th time in the Division I era. San Diego State is now 38-11 since 1969 when not committing a turnover in the game.
- Head coach Rocky Long and offensive coordinator Andy Ludwig now have eight turnover free games since the pair moved to their current positions prior to the 2011 season. With eight turnover-free games under his watch, Long has been the head coach for the second most turnover-free SDSU games in the Division I era (Ted Tollner - 14). The Aztecs are 7-1 under Long and Ludwig when not committing a turnover.

**PROGRAM TIDBITS**

- Entering the games this weekend, San Diego State has compiled the nation's second-highest winning percentage in combined football and men's basketball since the beginning of the 2010-11 academic year. San Diego State is a combined 80-23 (77.7 percent) and trails only Ohio State in the two sports since the beginning of the 2010 football season. See *chart below*

- The Aztecs have posted a 20-12 record since the beginning of the 2010 season after needing 68 games to claim 20 victories prior to 2010 (SDSU went 20-48 during that stretch from the fourth game of the 2004 season through the end of 2009 campaign). The 20-12 record since the beginning of the 2010 season is tied for the 39th-best mark in the country and is the third-best in the state of California during that time.

- Through 19 games, Rocky Long has an 11-8 record as SDSU's head coach. That is the best 19-game start to a coaching career at San Diego State since Claude Gilbert opened his tenure with a 15-3-1 record in the 1973 and 1974 seasons.
- SDSU opens the 2012 campaign after advancing to bowl games each of the last two seasons (Poinsettia Bowl in 2010 and New Orleans Bowl in 2011). San Diego State has never gone to bowl games in three consecutive years.
- The Aztecs play seven home games in 2012, which ties for the program's highest number since 1976. SDSU concluded a three-game homestand in September, its longest in a decade, against San Jose State.
- Despite serving as an assistant coach at San Diego State for two seasons (2009-10), **Rocky Long** is currently the second-winningest coach in Mountain West history. Long has 73 wins while a member of the league, trailing only TCU's Gary Patterson (77 wins). With TCU no longer in the league, Long needs four victories to tie the record and five to break it. The other nine active coaches in the league entered the season with a combined 75 wins while their teams have been a member of the conference.
- The Aztecs have played 66 student-athletes through six games, with 44 of those seeing action in all six contests. Only 11 seniors saw action in the opening contest at Washington and two of those (quarterback Ryan Katz and wide receiver Brice Butler) were playing in their first game with SDSU. San Diego State has started no more than seven seniors in any game this season and as few as five seniors (vs. Army).
- The Aztecs only have five seniors listed as starters on the current depth chart, three on offense (RG **Nike Embernate**, C **Alec Johnson**, QB **Ryan Katz**) and two on defense (CB **Leon McFadden** and CB **Josh Wade**).
- To date, SDSU has had 23 players make their first appearance in a San Diego State game and has had 12 players on the offensive or defensive side of the ball make their first start with the Aztecs. The 12 first-time starters is tied for the 17th highest-total in the country.

## OFFENSIVE QUICK HITS

- San Diego State returns seven starters on offense from last season's 2011 team that scored 387 points, the second-highest total for an Aztec squad in the last 15 seasons.
- Through six games this season, San Diego State is averaging more points (38.2 in 2012, 29.8 in 2011) and nearly the same total offense (423.0 in 2012 and 427.4 in 2011) as last season.
- SDSU has four offensive players appearing on preseason watch lists for the top player at their position in the country - junior tight end **Gavin Escobar** (John Mackey Award Watch List (TE), Rotary Lombardi Award Watch List (lineman)), senior center **Alec Johnson** (Rimington Trophy Watch List (center)), senior running back **Walter Kazee** (Doak Walker Award Watch List (RB)) and sophomore wide receiver **Colin Lockett** (Biletnikoff Award Watch List (WR)).
- San Diego State has scored 217 points in the last five games combined. It is the highest five-game output since midway through the 1996 season (a span of 189 games).
- SDSU's 229 points is the highest scoring output for an Aztec squad through the first six games of a season since 1996 when Ted Tollner's squad scored 250 points in the first six contests.
- San Diego State's 52 points against Hawai'i last Saturday represented its highest output since posting 52 against Portland State (Sept. 22, 2007) and the most points against a FBS opponent since scoring 52 points against San Jose State on Sept. 24, 2005.
- The Aztecs produced a pair of 100-yard rushers against North Dakota as sophomore **Adam Muema** (124 yards) and senior **Walter Kazee** (105 yards) each reached the century mark. It is the 15th time in school history that two players rushed for 100 or more yards in the same game and the first time since Oct. 17, 1998. SDSU is 14-1 in those occurrences.
- San Diego State has 17 drives this season of 70 or more yards.
- Although San Diego State looks to replace third-round NFL Draft selection Ronnie Hillman, the Aztecs have quality depth at the position. Sophomore **Adam Muema** is off and running, with 597 yards, seven touchdowns and a 6.2 yards-per-rush average through six games. Also in the backfield is senior **Walter Kazee**. A career 1,000-yard rusher, Kazee's season was cut short in 2011 when he suffered a knee

injury at Colorado State. In six games this season, Kazee has 386 rushing yards and five rushing touchdowns, and is averaging 5.7 yards per carry.

- The Aztecs have had just four student-athletes start at quarterback since Nov. 18, 2006. During that 71-game stretch, Kevin O'Connell (15 games during the 2006-07 seasons), Drew Westling (1 game; vs. Air Force on Oct. 11, 2008) and Ryan Lindley (49 games during the 2008-09-10-11 seasons). In the season opener, senior Oregon State transfer **Katz** become the fourth SDSU player to start over the 66-game stretch (now 71 games).
- Although **Katz** made his first appearance at San Diego State in the game at Washington, he comes to The Mesa with a wealth of experience. A native of Santa Monica, Calif., Katz started 14 consecutive games for the Beavers, including all 12 of the 2010 campaign. Among his highlights was a 17-for-24, two-touchdown performance in an upset victory over USC during his sophomore campaign.
- Although we are only through six games, senior quarterback **Katz'** quarterback efficiency rating of 149.38 would rank as the seventh-highest single-season figure in school history if the season ended today.
- **Katz** has been very impressive to date. He is 30th nationally in passing efficiency rating, having completed 80-of-137 passes for 1,147 yards. He has 11 touchdowns and just four interceptions, which came on his second pass attempt in the season-opener against Washington and three times at Fresno State. He went 91 passes without throwing an interception until the game against the Bulldogs and has four interception-free games this season.
- Last season, due to graduation and injury, the Aztecs' combined receiving corps ended the campaign with four career catches for 39 yards. That has changed significantly in 12 months as SDSU entered the 2012 campaign with a Biletnikoff Award candidate and preseason all-Mountain West selection in junior **Colin Lockett** (11 catches, 172 yards, two touchdowns this year), a former walk-on who had five or more catches six times last season, including three times in his final four games, in junior **Dylan Denso** (49 catches, 634 yards and 3 TDs in 2011) and highly decorated USC transfer senior **Brice Butler** (eight catches, 151 yards and three touchdowns this season). Making his long-awaited collegiate debut in the opener was **Ezell Ruffin**, who already has 12 catches for 226 yards this season. And don't forget the tight end, **Gavin Escobar**, who has a team-high 17 catches for 254 yards and two touchdowns this year.
- The offensive line is anchored by two returning starters - senior center **Alec Johnson** and senior right guard **Nik Embernate**. Joining the two seniors on the offensive line is converted tight end, now left guard junior **Bryce Quigley**, junior left guard **Japheth Gordon**, who missed the Hawai'i game with a foot injury, and sophomore right tackle **Zach Dille**. The only new member of the coaching staff, former SDSU offensive lineman **Mike Schmidt**, leads the unit.
- San Diego State has gone 70 games without suffering a shutout (Nov. 18, 2006 at TCU). That is the only time the Aztecs have been shutout in their last 165 games.

**DEFENSIVE QUICK HITS**

- SDSU returns six starters off a squad that has continually gotten better under the direction of second-year head coach Rocky Long, who is in his fourth season as the defensive coordinator. Statistically one of the nation's worst units less than five years ago, Long has transitioned the San Diego State defense into one of the most feared units on the West Coast. Below is a look at the progress made under Long's direction.

- In the 20 drives prior to the North Dakota game, San Diego State's defense allowed a total of seven points. At one point, the Aztecs went 16 drives (last seven of the Washington game and first nine of the Army game) without allowing an offensive point.
- SDSU is led on defense by Mountain West preseason defensive player of the year, senior cornerback **Leon McFadden**. McFadden is on the preseason watch list for the Bronko Nagurski Trophy (best defensive player) and the Jim Thorpe Award (DB). McFadden, who has been a first-team all-Mountain West selection the past two seasons, is looking to become the school's fourth three-time first-team all-league selection, joining Marshall Faulk, Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila and Kirk Morrison.
- Plenty of other defensive players received preseason attention from at least one publication. Junior Aztec back **Nat Berhe** and sophomore linebacker **Jake Fely** were among the players getting attention. Berhe is the top returning tackler of the 2011 squad, and has a team-high 39 stops this season.
- **McFadden** recorded an interception in three straight games (Sept. 15-29) and has eight career picks.
- SDSU has forced a turnover in 12 straight games, including three or more eight times in the last 18 contests.

- San Diego State has allowed a total of 770 yards rushing in its last eight games combined (96.3). The Aztec defense has held its opponent to 100 yards or less on the ground in six of the last 12 games.
- In the opener at Washington, the SDSU defense allowed just 14 points (the Huskies had a fumble return for touchdown) and 328 yards of total offense against one of the most potent offensive attacks in the country. In 2011, Washington averaged 33.38 points to rank 25th nationally and 409.85 yards (38th in the nation).
- The Huskies scored 21 points off three drives that accumulated a total of 97 yards of offense.
- The Aztecs held Washington without a point on its final seven possessions of the game. That is something that no team did against the Huskies in 2011.
- Against Army, SDSU held the Black Knights scoreless until there was 5:54 left in the third quarter.
- San Diego State held Army well below its 2011 season averages in rushing yards (282 allowed, 346.50 average in 2011) and total yards (332 allowed, 396.92 average in 2011).
- Against North Dakota, the Leon McFadden intercepted a pass on UND's first offensive play of the game and took it 28 yards for the touchdown. It was the Aztecs' first defensive touchdown since Nov. 13, 2012, at No. 3 TCU and their first interception return for a score since Luke Laologi returned one 55 yards at UNLV on Nov. 28, 2009.
- At Fresno State, both Eric Pinkins and Leon McFadden intercepted a pass for a touchdown. The Aztecs now have two interceptions returned for a touchdown in the past three games. They had gone 28 games in between without returning an interception for a touchdown. McFadden became just the second player in program history with two interception returns for a touchdown in a season (also Tory Nixon in 1984).
- San Diego State allowed just 173 yards of total offense in the victory over Hawai'i on Saturday and allowed an average of just 2.98 yards per play. That is the lowest per play average allowed by an SDSU squad since Nicholls State (2.71 ypp) on Sept. 4, 2010, the lowest against a FBS opponent since Colorado State (2.97 ypp) on Oct. 16, 2004 and the 33rd lowest average in the Division I era.

**SDSU VS. COLORADO STATE**

- Saturday is the 32nd meeting between the schools, with San Diego State owning an 18-13 advantage.
- SDSU has won the last three games in the series and six of the last seven meetings. The Aztecs are looking for a series-tying-fourth consecutive win in the series.
- San Diego State is 9-7 all-time against the Rams at home and have claimed victories at Qualcomm Stadium in two of the last three encounters. The Aztecs won, 24-19, the last time the teams met at the Q, on Nov. 6, 2010.
- The road team has won four of the last five games in the series and is 6-2 in the last eight overall.
- The last two games have been decided by a total of eight points (both SDSU wins) and four of the last five contests have been decided by five points or less.
- San Diego State has committed one turnover or less in six of the last seven games in the series.
- The teams first met on Nov. 4, 1978, a 34-31 Aztec victory at San Diego Stadium. The teams have played every year since with the exception of 1989, 1990 and 1998.
- The Aztec defense has allowed 21 points or less in seven of the last nine meetings with the Rams.
- San Diego State has scored 142 points in the last five games against Colorado State. That is an average of 28.4 ppg.
- SERIES TIDBITS:** This is the first October meeting between the teams since 2009 (each of the last two seasons the teams played in November)... The winning team has overcome a deficit in each of the last five seasons, including SDSU coming back from a 14-point deficit in 2009 at Colorado State... In the last seven meetings, San Diego State has thrown a total of four interceptions (Colorado State has nine during that same span).

At Portland State, Lupfer spent 1995-07 as an outside linebackers coach (1995), special teams coordinator/secondary (1996-98), defensive coordinator/linebackers (1999-06) and interim head coach (2007). Ludwig, meanwhile, was the wide receivers coach there from 1987-88 after playing two seasons at PSU (1985-96). Both Lupfer (1994) and Ludwig (1988) earned their bachelor's degrees at Portland State.
- Colorado State co-defensive coordinator Al Simmons has coached a lot of the same places as some of the Aztec coaches. Simmons was at California (1998-00 - cornerbacks, 2008-10 - defensive backs), along with SDSU offensive coordinator Andy Ludwig (2009-10 - offensive coordinator). Simmons was also at Oregon State (2001-02 - defensive backs), along with Aztec head coach Rocky Long (1991-95 - defensive coordinator) and defensive line coach Osia Lewis (1991-96 - defensive line). Most recently, Simmons was the safeties coach at UTEP (2011), where Lewis was the defensive coordinator from 2008-09.

**LAST MEETING: SDSU VS. COLORADO STATE**

- **San Diego State 18, Colorado State 15 | Nov. 12, 2011 | Hughes Stadium | Fort Collins, Colo.**

**FORT COLLINS, Colo.** – On an evening when wind gusts caused havoc both in the stands and on the field, the San Diego State football team successfully battled the elements to find a way to earn its sixth victory of the season, edging host Colorado State, 18-15. The win was the Aztecs' fourth in a row at Hughes Stadium and made them bowl eligible for the second consecutive campaign.

Despite missing his first two field-goal tries, SDSU senior place-kicker Abelardo Perez came through when it counted, notching his second fourth-quarter game-winner of the season from 37 yards out to break a 18-18 tie with 5:49 remaining.

The San Diego State defense then held strong for the Rams' final two possessions of the game, forcing a punt on the first drive and causing the home squad to turn the ball over on downs after four consecutive pass incompletions to secure the victory.

Colorado State actually had the early lead, scoring a touchdown on a 63-yard scamper by running back Chris Nwoke at the 6:20 mark of the first quarter. Nwoke would finish the game with 232 yards rushing and accounted for 239 of his team's 327 total yards.

The Aztecs did not trail for long, converting a third-and-7 and a fourth-and-1 to eat up nearly six minutes on the clock, culminating in a 4-yard scoring pass from quarterback Ryan Lindley to tight end Alston Umuolo.

SDSU was set to knot the score at seven, but Brian Stahovich bobbled the snap on the extra point. Stahovich, however, recovered in time to evade the CSU defenders and find Chad Young in the end zone for the team's first two-point conversion in two years and a 8-7 advantage.

San Diego State added to its lead with another impressive offensive drive in the second quarter, using 11 consecutive draw plays to go 56 yards and go up by eight points on a 1-yard Walter Kazee plunge.

The Aztecs moved into Colorado State territory on four straight possessions in the second and third quarters, but each time came away empty as Perez missed on field goal tries of 22 and 44 yards.

CSU, meanwhile, took advantage of two SDSU personal foul penalties to start the fourth quarter and tied the game at 15 when backup quarterback Garrett Grayson used his feet to score on a 4-yard touchdown and also tack on the ensuing two-point conversion.

After a short kick-off, San Diego State got down to the Ram 20-yard line with the help of an 18-yard reception by tight end Gavin Escobar and a 17-yard run by Adam Muema to set up the game-winning field goal.

Lindley ended the night with 154 yards through the air, becoming the school's and conference's all-time career passing leader with 11,494 yards.

**SAN DIEGO** -- Ryan Katz rushed for three touchdowns and passed for another two as San Diego State avoided a three-game losing streak with a 52-14 victory over Hawai'i at Qualcomm Stadium.



Katz rushed for 57 yards, including scoring runs of 27, 34 and nine yards to become the first Aztec quarterback with three rushing touchdowns in a game since Kevin O'Connell had three at Colorado State on Oct. 6, 2007.

Katz added 190 yards through the air with two touchdown passes - a 36-yard strike to Brice Butler and a 31-yard completion to Adam Muema - to finish with 247 yards of total offense.

Muema added a 1-yard touchdown run and ended the night with 77 yards on 20 carries, while Chase Price got in the end zone for the first time of his career with a 2-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter. The SDSU defense limited the Warriors to 173 total yards of offense and forced three turnovers.

The game was played before 50,586 fans, which was the 13th-largest home game in program history. The San Diego State offense put up some fireworks prior to the annual SkyShow game, as its 52 points were its most since also scoring 52 against Portland State on Sept. 22, 2007.

## AZTEC OFFENSE

■ **SCORING:** Through six games, San Diego State ranks 25th in scoring offense (38.17) and 49th in total offense (423.00)... Despite losing five starters off last season's team that accounted for 144 career starts, including NFL Draft picks Ryan Lindley and Ronnie Hillman, San Diego State is averaging more points this season than last (see note below)... San Diego State has scored 217 points in its last five games, its highest five-game total since midway through the 1996 season (a span of 189 games)... SDSU has 229 points through the first six games of the season, the highest output to open a campaign since the 1996 squad had 250 points through six games... The Aztecs scored 52 points against Hawai'i last Saturday, its highest output since posting 52 against Portland State (Sept. 22, 2007)... It was the most points against a FBS opponent since scoring 52 points against San Jose State on Sept. 24, 2005... The Aztecs have scored 30 or more points in nine of the last 10 games dating back to last season... San Diego State has 400 or more yards of total offense in 10 of its last 14 games dating back to last season... The Aztecs have committed two turnovers or less in 31 of their last 40 games... SDSU did not have a turnover in three of its last five games and has played turnover-free football in five of its last eight contests... The Aztecs have one turnover or less in 10 of the last 14 games... SDSU already has 17 drives of 70 or more yards this season... San Diego State is 23-for-30 (76.7 percent) in converting third- or fourth-down situations of three yards or less this season... The Aztecs are 6-for-6 this season on converting third down and one.

■ **OFFENSIVE RUSHING:** The Aztecs rank 18th nationally in rushing offense (227.17), 27th in rushing yards per carry (5.05), 14th in rushing touchdowns (17)... San Diego State has rushed for 970 yards in the last four games (242.50 rypg) and has rushed for 179 yards or more in all five games this season... San Diego State's rushing total through six games is 1,363 yards, that is the highest six-game total since the 1998 campaign (Sept. 12-Oct. 24, 1998) when the Aztecs rushed for a total of 1,367 yards against USC, Arizona, Tulsa, Hawai'i, New Mexico and Utah... Since the beginning of the 2010 season (last 32 games), the Aztecs have 74 rushing touchdowns... SDSU has at least one rushing touchdown in 14 consecutive games (dating back to the Oct. 8, 2011 contest against TCU) and has 16 rushing touchdowns in the last six games... That is the longest stretch of consecutive games with a rushing touchdown since a 19-game stretch from Nov. 25, 1989 through Oct. 12, 1991... Earlier this season against North Dakota, for the 15th time in school history, San Diego State had two players rush for 100 or more yards... Adam Muema and Walter Kazee each reached the century figure marking the first time that had happened since Oct. 17, 1998, when Jonas Lewis and Larry Ned did it... The Aztecs are 14-1 when multiple backs rush for 100 yards... San Diego State running backs carried 20 times in the contest against Washington and did not have a carry that resulted in negative yardage.

■ **OFFENSIVE PASSING:** The Aztecs rank 96th nationally in passing offense (195.83) and 36th in pass efficiency (145.09)... San Diego State had just one interception in its first five games this season and went three straight contests without throwing a pick... Ryan Katz threw 91 consecutive passes without throwing an interception, a streak that was snapped in the first quarter of the game at Fresno State... That was the first time the Aztecs have gone three consecutive games without an interception in the same season since the 2005 season... Against North Dakota, Ryan Katz produced the seventh-highest single-game passing efficiency rating in school history at 228.58... That marked two consecutive weeks in which SDSU has had a passing efficiency rating above 168... That is the first time that has occurred since the final two games of the 2010 campaign... Two of the three-highest passing efficiency games of the Rocky Long-Andy Ludwig era have come in the past five weeks... During the last 21 games, San Diego State has 40 touchdowns through the air with 11 interceptions... The Aztecs have just four interceptions in the past eight games combined.

## MUEMA MAKING HIS IMPACT FELT

- Sophomore Adam Muema is making his presence felt in his second season on the field. A native of Covina, Calif., Muema burst onto the scene last season when he rushed for 119 yards and two touchdowns against 10th-ranked Boise State.

- San Diego State running back Walter Kazez has enjoyed a stellar start to his senior campaign. After suffering a season-ending knee injury in the ninth game last season, Kazez has proven that he is fully recovered by rushing for 386 yards on just 68 carries through the first six games. He has five rushing touchdowns this season and is averaging 5.7 yards per rush.
- After posting a team-high 86 yards rushing in the opener at Washington, Kazez logged 51 yards on just seven carries against Army. He also rushed for two touchdowns against the Black Knights. He followed that up with his third career 100-yard rushing effort, with 105 yards and two touchdowns in the victory over North Dakota. Against San Jose State, Kazez rushed for 90 yards and one touchdown on 17 carries.
- Kazez has a rushing touchdown in three of his last five games and five rushing touchdowns in the last five outings.
- Kazez has nine rushing touchdowns in his last eight games. He has those nine TDs in his last 90 carries.
- Kazez has rushed for at least an average of 5.3 yards in five of six games this season.
- He has three of his five highest rushing total games and has posted two of his three highest per average rushing games this season (see below).

**KATZ ESTABLISHING HIMSELF AS ONE OF THE TOP QBs IN WEST**

- Senior transfer Ryan Katz is making the most of his one season on The Mesa. After transferring from Oregon State prior to the 2012 spring semester, Katz was named the starter following the first week of fall camp.
- A dual-threat quarterback. he has made the most of his opportunities in the first six games.
- San Diego State has its highest point total through six games since the 1996 campaign. Senior quarterback Billy Blanton was in his third season as a starter during that season.
- Katz posted a career-high three-touchdown performance in which he was 11-of-18 for 241 yards with no interceptions against North Dakota. He recorded a passing efficiency rating of 228.58, which is the seventh highest in school history.
- Earlier this month at Fresno State, Katz rushed for a career-high and a team-high 89 yards.
- Katz was responsible for a career-high five touchdowns in the victory over Hawai'i last week. Katz rushed for three scores and 57 yards on 10 carries and added a 15-for-29, 190-yard, two-touchdown performance through he air.
- His 11 touchdown passes this season have been thrown to seven different receivers. He has a pass completion to 12 different receivers through the first six games of this season.
- He had a streak of 91 consecutive pass attempts without an interception earlier this season and went three straight games without throwing a pick.
- Katz enters this week's game ranked 30th in passing efficiency in the nation and fourth in the Mountain West at 149.38. If the season ended today that would be the seventh-highest passer rating in school history.
- Katz has three 200-yard passing games in his last five outings.

**ESCOBAR MAKING CASE AS NATION'S TOP TIGHT END**

- Tight end Gavin Escobar has opened his junior year with impressive numbers, justifying his preseason selection on the John Mackey Award (top tight end) and Rotary Lombardi (top lineman) Watch Lists.
- Through six games, Escobar leads the team in receptions (17), receiving yards (254) and is one off the team lead in receiving touchdowns (two).
- He posted his third career 100-yard receiving game against North Dakota, catching five passes for 117 yards and a touchdown.
- Escobar now has a reception in 13 straight games and has 100 yards or more receiving in three of his last 10 games.
- In his last 11 games, Escobar has 43 catches for 693 yards and four touchdowns.
- He is three catches shy of 100 receptions for his career and needs four catches to move into the SDSU top-25 career reception chart.

**AZTEC DEFENSE**

- **OVERALL:** San Diego State ranks 80th nationally in scoring defense (28.83) and 61st in total defense (389.17)... SDSU ranks 10th nationally in turnovers gained (14)... The Aztecs allowed just 173 yards of total offense in the victory against Hawai'i last week... It was the fewest yards allowed in a game since New Mexico had 162 yards last season... San Diego State allowed just 2.98 yards per offensive play, the lowest average since Nicholls State (2.71 ypp) on Sept. 4, 2010, the lowest against a FBS opponent since Colorado State (2.97 ypp) on Oct. 16, 2004 and the 33rd lowest average in the Division I era... Prior to the game against North Dakota, the Aztecs had allowed seven points in the last 20 opponent drives... SDSU went 16 drives (the last seven of the Washington game and the first nine of the Army game) without allowing a point... The San Diego State defense got stronger as the game progressed at Washington... After allowing two touchdowns on the first two Husky possessions, the Aztecs did not allow a point on the final seven UW drives... In no game last season did UW go seven consecutive possessions without a point... Of Washington's 328 yards of total offense, 97 came on its first two possessions... The Huskies' 21 points (including a fumble return for a touchdown) came on a total of 97 yards

of offense... San Jose State's first 17 points came on 24 yards of total offense... San Diego State has returned three interceptions for touchdowns this season, that ranks third nationally behind Fresno State (4) and Oregon (4).

- **RUSH DEFENSE:** San Diego State is 27th nationally in rushing yards per game (115.17), 29th in average yards allowed per rush (3.39) and 35th in fewest rushing touchdowns allowed (6)... The Aztecs held Washington to 3.4 yards per rush, Army to 4.5 yards per rush, North Dakota to 2.0 yards per rush, San Jose State to 3.3 yards per rush, Fresno State to 4.0 yards per rush and Hawai'i to 2.0 yards per rush... Opponents are averaging 3.4 yards per carry through the first six games this season... San Diego State has 43 tackles for loss this season from 19 different players... At 7.17 tackles for loss per game, the Aztecs rank 27th nationally in the category... Three of SDSU's last four opponents have failed to rush for 100 yards and the Aztecs have held an opponent to under 100 yards rushing in five of the last eight games.
- **PASS DEFENSE:** San Diego State is 101st nationally in pass defense (274.00) and 106th in pass efficiency defense (147.62)... The Aztecs intercepted two of Army's nine pass attempts and picked off a pass against North Dakota, San Jose State and a pair passes at Fresno State... With six interceptions this season, the Aztecs rank 39th nationally in the category... The Black Knights' passing efficiency of 35.56 was the lowest for an San Diego State opponent since Nov. 29, 1986 against Brigham Young... The Aztecs had three sacks and three PBU in the season-opening game against Washington... Leon McFadden has an interception in three of his last four games and returned an interception for a touchdown against North Dakota, the program's first defensive touchdown since Nov. 13, 2010, at No. 3 TCU, and the first interception return for a score since Nov. 28, 2009 at UNLV... McFadden has returned two picks for scores this season... He is one of just three players in the country to have accomplished that.

### McFADDEN CONTINUES SUCCESS AT CORNERBACK

- Senior cornerback Leon McFadden is on the Bronko Nagurski Trophy Watch List (Best Defensive Player) and the Jim Thorpe Award Watch List (Best Defensive Back).
- McFadden was also named the Mountain West Preseason Defensive Player of the Year, the first Aztec to earn that honor (offense, defense or special teams).
- He is looking to become the fifth player in school history to earn first-team all-conference honors in three consecutive years.
- He is also looking to lead the league in passes defended (PBU + INT) for the third straight year.
- Has played in every single game at SDSU since arriving in 2009 as a true freshmen.
- Ranks fifth in school history with 33 pass breakups and sixth with 186 interception yards.
- Is just the second Aztec with two interceptions returned for a touchdown in a season (also Tory Nixon in 1986).
- His two career interceptions for a touchdown trail only Ricky Parker's three from 1993-96.
- Is second in the Mountain West and is tied for 21st in the nation with 1.50 passes defended per game (9 total).
- Is tied for second in the Mountain West and tied for 20th in the country with 0.50 interceptions per game (3 total).
- Had a career-high eight tackles in the opener at Washington.
- Returned an interception 28 yards for a touchdown against North Dakota in its first pass attempt.
- Had an interception, tied a career high with three PBUs and a tackle against San Jose State.
- Returned an interception 96 yards for a touchdown at Fresno State. It was tied for the sixth longest in program history and the longest since 1986. It was his third interception in three games and eighth of his career. Also had five tackles and a PBU.
- Forced his first career fumble vs. Hawai'i.

### LONG HAS BEST DEBUT SEASON IN PROGRAM HISTORY

- Rocky Long, the school's 18th head coach, became the first San Diego State coach to lead the team to a bowl game in his inaugural season.
- Long is 11-8 in his first 19 games at San Diego State. He has produced the best 19-game coaching record since Claude Gilbert opened his tenure with a 15-3-1 record. Long's win total through 19 games is two higher than his predecessor, Brady Hoke (9-10).
- Rocky Long posted an 8-5 record in his first season as head coach of the Aztecs. That is the highest victory total in a SDSU head coaching debut season since Denny Stolz finished 8-4 in his first year in 1986.
- With eight first-year wins, Rocky Long had one more coaching victory in his inaugural season than the previous two San Diego State coaches combined (Brady Hoke went 4-8 in 2009 and Chuck Long was 3-9 in 2006).
- Last season marked the third time in Rocky Long's head coaching career that his team won at least eight games (also 2007 and 2003). His squads have won six or more games in eight of his last nine seasons as a head coach.
- Last year, Long helped guide the Aztecs to their first 3-0 start in 30 years, ended the program's 19-game losing streak to Pac-10/12 foes, snapped SDSU's 23-game losing streak to automatic qualifying BCS teams and gave the program its first win in the Eastern time zone since 1972, all in the opening month of the season.
- San Diego State finished the 2011 season above .500 for only the second time in the last 13 seasons.
- The Aztecs won eight games in a campaign for just the second time in the last 15 seasons.
- Long has 73 victories while coaching teams in the Mountain West. That is the second-highest total in the history of the conference.

## SDSU FOOTBALL ACCEPTS INVITE TO JOIN THE BIG EAST

■ The BIG EAST Conference announced in December 2011 that San Diego State University has accepted an invitation to join the league in the sport of football beginning with the 2013-14 academic year.

SDSU joins Boise State, Houston, Southern Methodist and Central Florida as the newest members of the league. The aforementioned five will join a football league that also consists of Cincinnati, Connecticut, Louisville, Rutgers and South Florida.

"I am extremely excited about our prospects for joining the BIG EAST in football," San Diego State University President Dr. Elliot Hirshman said. "This new conference affiliation will provide extraordinary opportunities for our student-athletes, our coaches and staff, our alumni and supporters and the entire University."

"This is a very important day in the history of the San Diego State athletic department," SDSU Athletic Director Jim Sterk said. "This affiliation with the BIG EAST Conference allows us to compete at the highest level in college football. This will give the athletic department and University attention on a national stage that we have not had before."

The BIG EAST is one of six conferences with an automatic berth to one of five Bowl Championship Series (BCS) games. The BCS includes the Rose Bowl Game, Tostitos Fiesta Bowl, Allstate Sugar Bowl, Discover Orange Bowl and the Allstate BCS National Championship Game.

In addition to the BCS automatic berth, the BIG EAST has tie-ins to the Champs Sports Bowl (Orlando, Fla.), Belk Bowl (Charlotte, N.C.), New Era Pinstripe Bowl (Bronx, N.Y.), BBVA Compass Bowl (Birmingham, Ala.), AutoZone Liberty Bowl (Memphis, Tenn.) and Beef 'O' Brady's Bowl St. Petersburg (St. Petersburg, Fla.).

The move to the BIG EAST provides San Diego State's football program with national television exposure through ABC, ESPN, BIG EAST Network, SportsNet New York (SNY) and the BIG EAST/IMG Sports National Radio Network.

San Diego State, which led the Mountain West in average home attendance this season (39,865), has a storied football tradition having won 18 conference championships and participated in nine bowl games, including last season's Poinsettia Bowl, which resulted in a 35-14 victory over Navy. A year after posting a 9-4 record, the Aztecs finished the 2011 season with an 8-4 mark and recently accepted an invitation to the R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl where they will face Louisiana-Lafayette on Dec. 17. The back-to-back bowl appearances mark the first time San Diego State has accomplished that feat in its Division I history.

Individually, SDSU has produced 144 NFL draft picks, including 52 top-100 selections, and 104 All-Americans, including 19 first-teamers. In 2011 alone, San Diego State had the nation's third-leading rusher and had seven all-conference first-team picks, two second-teamers and one honorable mention choice.

## RYAN KATZ NAMED MOUNTAIN WEST CO-OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

■ San Diego State football player Ryan Katz has been named the Mountain West Co-Offensive Player of the Week, the league announced today. It is the first weekly honor for the senior and Oregon State transfer.

Katz accounted for five touchdowns and 247 yards of total offense to lead the Aztecs to a 52-14 victory over Hawaii on Saturday night. On the ground, the Santa Monica, Calif., native carried 10 times for 57 yards and a career-high three touchdowns, including scoring runs of 27, 34 and nine yards. Katz became the first SDSU quarterback with three rushing touchdowns since Kevin O'Connell had three at Colorado State on Oct. 6, 2007.

Katz added 190 yards through the air with two touchdown passes, his 10th and 11th of the season and 29th and 30th of his career. He has now thrown for multiple touchdown passes in four consecutive games and 11 times in his career.

On the season, Katz is 80-for-137 for 1,147 yards and 11 touchdowns, while throwing just four interceptions. His 149.38 passing efficiency is ranked 30th in the nation. Katz is also third on the team with 268 rushing yards and three touchdowns.

New Mexico's Kasey Carrier shared the award with Katz.

## NAT BERHE EARNS MOUNTAIN WEST DEFENSIVE POW HONORS (SEPT. 8)

■ San Diego State junior football player Nat Berhe has been named the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Week, for his efforts in the Aztecs' victory over Army on Sept. 8. It is the second career weekly honor for the Colton, Calif., native.

■ Berhe, a defensive back, had a career-high 14 tackles, including 10 solo stops, to lead SDSU to a 42-7 victory over Army on Saturday. He also had one tackle for a loss and a pass breakup while anchoring a defense that forced three turnovers and limited the Black Knights to just 50 yards passing.

■ Berhe and the San Diego State defense held Army without an offensive score for its first nine possessions of the game before a Black Knight scored with 5:54 left to play in the third quarter. The touchdown snapped the Aztecs' streak of not allowing an offensive score at 16 possessions (also last seven at Washington), which was a total of 86:41 of clock time.

■ Berhe's 14 tackles were the second most in a game in the MW this season and tied for 16th nationally, while his 10 solo stops lead the conference and tie for the third-best performance among all FBS players.

■ In five games this year, Berhe leads SDSU with 37 tackles, including 25 solo stops, 2.0 TFL, two pass breakups and a fumble recovery.

## FIVE AZTECS ON WATCH LISTS

■ San Diego State has placed five student-athletes on preseason national award watch lists in 2012. Junior tight end Gavin Escobar, senior center Alec Johnson, senior running back Walter Kazee, junior Colin Lockett and senior Leon McFadden are on the initial short list for their positions' top honors.

Escobar (Rancho Santa Margarita, Calif.) is one of 33 players on the John Mackey Award Watch List (most outstanding tight end) and one of 145 on the Rotary Lombardi Award Watch List (top lineman). Last season, the Rancho Santa Margarita, Calif., native reeled in 51 catches for 780 yards and seven touchdowns. His 51 receptions and 780 receiving yards were the second most by a tight end in school history. Escobar averaged 60.00 receiving yards per game, which were the third most in the country among tight ends. He ended up earning all-Mountain West honors for the second consecutive season (first team in 2011, second team in 2010). Escobar is on the preseason all-conference team for this year. This season, Escobar leads the Aztecs with 17 catches and 254 receiving yards.

Johnson (Denver, Colo.) is one of 51 players on the Rimington Trophy Award Watch List (best center). Johnson, one of SDSU's two returning starters on the offensive line, entered the 2012 campaign having made 29 career starts and is slated to start at center for the second consecutive year. Last season, Johnson never missed a game despite breaking his snapping hand (right) in the Aztecs' season opener. The MW academic all-conference honoree also helped SDSU rush for nearly 2,400 yards as well as finish among the nation's leaders in fewest sacks allowed (T-7th, 0.85 per game) and in fewest tackles for a loss allowed (15th, 4.46 per game).

Kazee (San Bernardino, Calif.) is one of 52 candidates on the Doak Walker Award Watch List (top running back). Last year, Kazee rushed for 339 yards and four touchdowns on 74 carries (4.6 yards per rush) before a knee injury in the ninth game sidelined him for the rest of the season. Kazee also caught eight



passes for 89 yards. For his career, Kazee has 1,416 rushing yards and 14 touchdowns on 295 rushes (4.8 yards per carry). Additionally, Kazee has 205 yards receiving on 23 catches. This year, Kazee has 386 yards on just 68 carries (5.7 yards per carry) to go along with a career-high five rushing touchdowns.

Lockett (Diamond Bar, Calif.) is one of 48 athletes on the Biletnikoff Award Watch List (most outstanding wide receiver). Lockett led SDSU in receiving last year with 970 yards and his 74.6 receiving yards per game ranked fourth in the conference. Lockett also tallied 678 yards on special teams in 2010, including a 94-yard kickoff return touchdown in the season opener against Cal Poly. He's also on the 2012 preseason all-conference team. Lockett has 11 catches this season for 172 yards and two touchdowns. He also has 19 kickoff returns for 458 yards (24.1 average per kickoff return), including a career-long 96-yard return for a touchdown vs. Army.

McFadden (Inglewood, Calif.) is one of 84 players on the Bronco Nagurski Trophy Award Watch List (best defensive player) and one of 35 on the Jim Thorpe Award Watch List (best defensive back). McFadden, who became the first San Diego State player to be named a preseason player of the year (offense, defense or special teams) in July, is looking to become the fifth Aztec in program history to earn first-team all-conference honors in three consecutive years. Last year, McFadden led the league in passes defended (17), while recording 46 tackles (35 solo), two interceptions and a sack. This year, McFadden has recorded 30 tackles, six pass breakups, three interceptions and two interceptions returned for a score, a forced fumble.

## SDSU TABBED TO FINISH FIFTH BY LEAGUE MEDIA

- The San Diego State football team is picked to finish fifth in the Mountain West preseason poll, which was released on July 24. The Aztecs had 173 points in the 2012 preseason poll, which is voted on by media representatives who cover the conference.

The fifth-place projection is SDSU's second highest in the last eight years. Last season, San Diego State was selected fourth and finished fourth. It marked the sixth time in the last seven years that the Aztecs finished at or higher than their projected finish. SDSU also picked up one of the 30 first-place votes, a first in its 14-year history of the MW.

Boise State was picked to win the league with 296 points, including 27 first-place votes. Only 74 points separated the second-place team (Nevada, 244 points) and the sixth-place team (Air Force, 170 points). Fresno State was third with 231 points and two first-place votes, while Wyoming (213 points) and SDSU (173 points) rounded out the top five at fourth and fifth, respectively.

## MCFADDEN NAMED MW PRESEASON DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

- San Diego State defensive back Leon McFadden has been selected as the Mountain West Preseason Defensive Player of the Year, the league announced in July. McFadden was joined on the preseason all-conference team by tight end Gavin Escobar and wide receiver Colin Lockett.

McFadden became the first San Diego State player to be named a preseason player of the year (offense, defense or special teams). McFadden, who is looking to become the fifth Aztec in program history to earn first-team all-conference honors in three consecutive years, is on the preseason watch list for the Nagurski Award (top defensive player) and the Thorpe Award (top defensive back). He's also the third player in the last 11 years (also Kirk Morrison and Lynell Hamilton) to be named to the preseason all-conference team for a second time. The Inglewood, Calif., native led the league in passes defended (17) last year, while recording 46 tackles (35 solo), two interceptions and a sack.

Escobar, who is on the preseason watch list for the Lombardi Award (top lineman) and the Mackey Award (top tight end), had 51 catches a year ago for 780 yards and seven touchdowns. His 60.00 receiving yards per game in 2011 were the third most in the nation among tight ends. The Rancho Santa Margarita, Calif., native was an honorable mention All-American last year by Sports Illustrated after earning freshman All-America accolades by Sporting News in 2010.

A member of the Biletnikoff Award Watch List (most outstanding wide receiver), Lockett led SDSU in receiving last year with 970 yards. Lockett, who also had 58 catches and eight touchdowns, averaged 74.6 receiving yards per game, which ranked fourth in the conference. Lockett also tallied 678 yards on special teams in 2011, including a 94-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in the season-opener against Cal Poly.

## SDSU ANNOUNCES TEAM CAPTAINS

- San Diego State head coach Rocky Long announced that seniors Leon McFadden, Walter Kazee and Dominique Sandifer have been named football team captains for the upcoming 2012 season. This year, the special teams captain will be selected on a week-by-week basis.

McFadden, a senior defensive back from Inglewood, Calif., has played in 44 games in his three-plus seasons as an Aztec. McFadden had a solid season last year recording 46 tackles in 13 contests, had two interceptions and averaged almost six yards per carry on punt returns. McFadden ranked No. 1 in the Mountain West for the second consecutive year and 12th nationally in passes defended with 17, including six more breakups than any other player in the league. He enters 2012 as the preseason Mountain West defensive player of the year.

Kazee, a senior running back from San Bernardino, Calif., has tallied 1,416 total yards in his 36-game career at SDSU. Kazee had one of his best seasons last year in becoming SDSU's second-leading rusher with 339 yards on 74 carries and four scores. He was also effective in the passing game as he tallied eight catches for 89 yards (11.1 ypc).

Sandifer, a senior wide receiver from Gardena, Calif., is a two-year letterwinner who had his 2011 season derailed by injury. Prior to his setback, he played in 23 straight games from 2009-2010 in 2010 and was part of the 2010 Poinsettia Bowl team. He is one of two senior wide receivers, but the only one to have worn a SDSU uniform. In his first two seasons, he tallied 561 yards, averaging 11.5 yards per reception.

- In his first year in 2009, helped SDSU improve defensive marks in points allowed, first downs, first downs, rushing, total defense, third-down conversion percentage, fourth-down conversion percentage, sacks, interceptions and red-zone conversion percentage, among other categories.

## AT NEW MEXICO

- Compiled a school-record 65 victories and led the Lobos to five bowl game appearances in his final seven seasons. His teams were bowl eligible in seven of his last eight campaigns.
- In his final nine seasons in Albuquerque, Long's defensive units ranked among the top 30 in fewest yards allowed six times and among the top 40 against the rush every year. In both 2001 and 2003, New Mexico's defense ranked fifth nationally in fewest rushing yards allowed per game.
- While at New Mexico, he coached 13 players selected in the NFL Draft, 10 players who earned All-America honors and had a MWC-high 34 first-team all-conference selections since 2003.

## OTHER COACHING EXPERIENCE

- Prior to accepting the head coaching position at New Mexico, Long served as defensive coordinator for 12 seasons at three different schools. He was the defensive coordinator for two years under Bob Toledo at UCLA in 1996-97, for five seasons at Oregon State from 1991-95, and for five campaigns at Wyoming from 1981-85.
- Also served as an assistant coach at TCU, with the CFL's British Columbia team and started his career at New Mexico has a graduate assistant coach in 1972.

## PLAYING EXPERIENCE:

- Originally a defensive back, Long became a three-year starter at quarterback for the Lobos from 1969-71. He earned team most valuable player honors and was the Western Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year as a senior.
- Long played professionally in the CFL with British Columbia in 1972-73 and 1975-76. He also competed in the World Football League with the Detroit Wheels in 1974.
- Attended Alta Loma High School in Alta Loma, Calif.

## PERSONAL:

- Long and his wife, Debby, have two daughters, Roxanne and Hannah. Both of Long's daughters are head coaches at NCAA schools. Roxanne was hired this July as the head women's basketball coach at Rogers State University (NAIA) in Claremore, Okla., after four years in the same position at Texas Lutheran (NCAA Division III). Hannah, meanwhile, is the head women's basketball coach at Texas Lutheran, an NCAA Division III school in the American Southwest Conference. Hannah is the head volleyball coach at Southwestern University, an NCAA Division III school Georgetown, Texas. She is a four-time conference coach of the year and this past season led the Pirates to the NCAA regional semifinals and a 30-4 overall record.

**SEATTLE** -- San Diego State was unable to overcome an early deficit and three turnovers in a 21-12 loss at Washington in the 2012 season opener for both teams.

The Aztecs threw an interception on their first drive and punted on a three and out on their second, and the Huskies took advantage with touchdowns on both possessions.

UW, which took over on the SDSU 35 after the interception, got in the end zone on a two-yard run by Bishop Sankey.

Quarterback Keith Price drove Washington 62 yards on the team's next drive, culminating in a 8-yard pass to Kasen Williams.

After the slow start, the San Diego State defense stood tall the rest of the way, limiting the Huskies to 231 yards and no points on their final seven drives.

The Aztecs got on the scoreboard on the first play of the second quarter when quarterback Ryan Katz found a wide-open Tim Vizzi on the left side, who ran 47 yards for the touchdown. SDSU, however, failed on the 2-point conversion.

Early in the third quarter, UW safety Will Shamburger returned a fumble 44 yards to give the home team the 21-6 advantage.

Adam Muema completed an 11-play, 71-yard drive in the fourth when he pounded it in on a 4th and 1. But once again, San Diego State was unable to convert the 2-point conversion and trailing, 21-12.

After forcing Washington to punt, the Aztecs tried to mount another scoring drive. They went 76 yards, highlighted by a 26-yard run by Walter Kazee and a 32-yard pass from Katz to Colin Lockett. SDSU got to the Huskies' 8-yard line on third down, but missed on consecutive pass attempts, giving the ball back to UW.

Washington ran most of the 4:44 left on the clock and San Diego State's last-ditch effort fell short in the 21-12 setback. It was the Aztecs' first season-opening loss since 2009.

Kazee, who missed the end of last year with a knee injury, ran for a game-high 86 yards on nine carries, his highest total since the first game of the 2009 season and the first game of his career.

Katz added a career-high 77 yards on the ground and passed for another 128. Lockett led all Aztecs with four catches and 48 yards in the loss.

SDSU had multiple turnovers for only the second time in its last nine games, dating back to last year. San Diego State finished the 2011 season with just one turnover over its final three games.

Hendrickson's 15-yard scoring pass in to Tyrhe Ivery brought North Dakota within 49-41 with 6:17 remaining. UND got the ball back with 1:52 left, but came up a half-yard short on a fourth down pass play at its 38-yard line, and San Diego State ran out the clock.

Katz completed 8 of 11 passes for 195 yards in the first half, throwing TD strikes to Brice Butler (44 yards), Colin Lockett (37 yards) and Gavin Escobar (20 yards) as the Aztecs built a 35-20 halftime lead.

Escobar finished with five receptions for 117 yards.

The temperature at kickoff was 97 degrees, the hottest for a San Diego State home game since Sept. 8, 1984, when it was 93 for a contest against UCLA.

**SAN DIEGO** -- Adam Muema rushed for a career-high 202 yards, but San Diego State was outscored, 21-10, in the final quarter of a 38-34 loss to San Jose State at Qualcomm Stadium. The crazy final quarter featured one tie and four lead changes.

Muema got his 202 yards on a career-high 25 carries and scored on a 83-yard touchdown run. Muema became the 18th Aztec in program history with a 200-yard rushing game.

Walter Kazez added 90 yards and a touchdown on the ground, while Ryan Katz threw for 213 yards and two scores. Gavin Escobar led SDSU with five catches and a touchdown for 46 yards, while Colin Lockett had three receptions for 73 yards, including a 40-yard TD catch with just 2:24 remaining to put San Diego State up, 34-31.

Behind quarterback David Fales, the Spartans rallied with a 5-play, 65-yard drive that culminated with a 14-yard pass to Chandler Jones with just 50 seconds left.

It was the final dagger for the Aztecs, who couldn't mount one more comeback.

Fales finished the game 21-for-31 for 260 yards and four touchdowns to give SJSU its third straight win in the series.

**SAN DIEGO** -- Ryan Katz rushed for three touchdowns and passed for another two as San Diego State avoided a three-game losing streak with a 52-14 victory over Hawai'i at Qualcomm Stadium.

Katz rushed for 57 yards, including scoring runs of 27, 34 and nine yards to become the first Aztec quarterback with three rushing touchdowns in a game since Kevin O'Connell had three at Colorado State on Oct. 6, 2007.

Katz added 190 yards through the air with two touchdown passes - a 36-yard strike to Brice Butler and a 31-yard completion to Adam Muema - to finish with 247 yards of total offense.

Muema added a 1-yard touchdown run and ended the night with 77 yards on 20 carries, while Chase Price got in the end zone for the first time of his career with a 2-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter.

The SDSU defense limited the Warriors to 173 total yards of offense and forced three turnovers.

The game was played before 50,586 fans, which was the 13th-largest home game in program history. The San Diego State offense put up some fireworks prior to the annual SkyShow game, as its 52 points were its most since also scoring 52 against Portland State on Sept. 22, 2007.
