2007 SEASON RECAP

The San Diego State women's soccer team returned to its winning ways in 2007 under firstyear head coach Mike Friesen. Despite returning only four starters and playing a tough schedule featuring six teams that made the NCAA tournament in 2006, the young Aztec squad finished with a 9-8-3 record, surpassing its win total from the previous season.

The Scarlet and Black also exceeded expectations in the Mountain West Conference by posting a 4-2-1 mark to claim second place in the regular season standings after being projected to finish fourth. SDSU's four MWC victories were the most it had achieved since the 2000 campaign.

The Aztecs kicked off the season by hosting the San Diego State Soccer Tournament at the SDSU Sports Deck. In the opener, the Scarlet and Black jumped out to a quick lead when freshman Katie Tribbey netted her first collegiate goal just 24 seconds into the game, but Toledo responded with a score of its own and the Aztecs were forced to settle for a 1-1 tie after two overtime periods. Two days later, an injuryridden San Diego State squad, which was missing three starters, fell to visiting Florida Atlantic, 1-0.

SDSU then made its way to the Cornhusker State for match-ups against Creighton and Nebraska, and began the weekend with a convincing 2-0 victory over the Bluejays. Senior Jackie Ragudos scored both goals as the Aztecs outshot the home team, 9-3. With its first victory under its belt, the Scarlet and Black, paced by freshman goalkeeper Aubree Southwick's 10 saves, battled Big 12 foe Nebraska to a scoreless tie in double overtime.

After a solid weekend in the Midwest, the Aztecs returned home with a new-found confidence that carried over to a 1-0 victory over Cal Poly. Sophomore defender Millie Allen converted a second-half penalty shot for her first career

Aubree Southwick goal. SDSU was unable to make it two in a row, however, falling to No. 14 California, 2-0. Southwick, who had recorded three consecutive shutout games, finally had her impressive 429 minute scoreless streak broken in the loss.

With its record knotted at 2-2-2, the Scarlet and Black embarked on a four-game road swing and started things off with a 1-0 triumph at San Jose State. Ragudos lifted the Aztecs to the victory with her third goal of the season. Traveling down the coast to UC Santa Barbara, SDSU was unable to continue its momentum in a 2-1 loss to the Gauchos. Senior Jessica Girdner notched her first goal of the season to tie the game at the 65:58 mark, but UCSB was able to score the game-winner in overtime.

After dropping its next match at Arizona State, the Scarlet and Black rebounded with a 1-0 upset over the University of Arizona, which was ranked 15th in the West Region. SDSU's defense was dominant, allowing the Wildcats to get just six shots off, while Allen netted her second goal of the season to get the Aztecs back in the win column.


The road warriors finally returned home, only to face one of its toughest opponents of the season in UCLA, the nation's No. 2-ranked team. The Bruins, who had made four consecutive trips to the NCAA College Cup, overpowered the Aztecs, 5-1, with Ragudos scoring SDSU's lone goal.

San Diego State was able to take the loss in stride and responded by routing Cal State Bakersfield, 3-0, two days later. Freshmen Ashley Omphroy and Brooke Holliday, and junior Alicia Piz each recorded their first goals of the 2007 campaign. The Aztecs held a 16-3 advantage in shots attempted en route to their highest scoring output of the season.

The momentum carried into conference play as Ragudos and Heather Vandevanter each found the back of the net in SDSU's 2-0 win at Air Force. Southwick anchored the defensive effort with seven saves, earning her seventh shutout of the season. The Aztecs were unable to extend their two-game winning streak, however, falling 1-0 at UNLV to close out the weekend.

San Diego State then made its way back to "America's Finest City" with a week to prepare for No. 19 Brigham Young. In the first live television event in the history of the SDSU Sports Deck, the Aztecs didn't disappoint, upsetting the Cougars, 2-0. The Scarlet and Black dented the scoreboard early in the match with both Ragudos and Girdner tallying a goal in the first 11 minutes of action. SDSU wrapped up the home stand with a 1-0 victory over Wyoming to improve to 3-1 in conference play.

With their match moved to BYU's home field in Provo, Utah, due to the wildfires in San Diego, the Aztecs battled New Mexico to a scoreless tie in double overtime. Continuing its



stay in the Beehive State, the Scarlet and Black headed to Salt Lake City for a showdown with Utah. The Utes were able to get on the scoreboard first, but SDSU evened the match in the 80th minute when it added an extra attacker and forced an own goal. The home team was able to recover, however, netting the final score of the game for the 2-1 victory.

On Senior Day at the Sports Deck, SDSU closed out the regular season with a 1-0 overtime win over TCU. Freshman Lauren Marquez scored the game-winner with her first collegiate goal in the 98th minute of play. Southwick once again had a stellar game with seven saves, increasing her shutout total to 10, which ranks third on the single-season charts and is tied for fourth among the career leaders at San Diego

The Aztecs earned the No. 2 seed in the Mountain West Conference tournament, but were unable to get past host and eventual champion BYU in the semifinals, ending their season with a 2-0 loss to the Cougars.

Four SDSU players earned all-MWC honors, led by Southwick, who was tabbed the league's defensive player of the year and freshman of the year. The Danville, Calif., native continued to rack up the postseason awards when she was selected to the Soccer Buzz freshman All-America second team.

Joining Southwick on the all-MWC first team was Ragudos, while Allen and Girdner both earned second team recognition. The Aztecs also had a stellar year in the classroom with nine players being named to the MWC allacademic team.

In just her first season on The Mesa, Southwick compiled a single-season record 106 saves and is just 27 stops shy of breaking into the top five saves leaders in school history. Ragudos, meanwhile, led the Aztec offense with 17 points and seven goals.
