OFF TO FIRST 3-0 START SINCE 1981, SAN DIEGO STATE TRAVELS TO NO. 22/21 MICHIGAN

San Diego State, which is off to a 3-0 start for the first time since 1981 and owns the nation's third-longest active winning streak at five games dating back to last season, travels to the Eastern time zone for the second time in three weeks to face No. 22/21 Michigan on Saturday afternoon in Ann Arbor.

The game features two of the 33 remaining undefeated teams (only 27 of which are 3-0) and is one of just seven games this week between unbeaten teams.

Game time is set for noon ET (9 a.m. PT) and the contest will be televised nationally in high definition on the Big Ten Network. A plethora of watch parties have been organized by the Aztec Club to view the game throughout San Diego County. That list of establishments can be found at GoAztecs.com.

San Diego State secured its best start in 30 seasons last Saturday by defeating Washington State, 42-24. The Aztecs trailed 24-14 in the third quarter, but outscored the Cougars 28-0 over the final 24:32 of the game. The victory snapped a 19-game losing streak against Pac-10/12 opponents and a 23-game losing streak against teams from automatic qualifying BCS conferences. The victory also extended SDSU's win streak to five games, the Aztecs' longest since 1995.

For the second week in a row, San Diego State got stronger as the game progressed. The offense scored touchdowns on four of its final six possessions (not including a kneel down to run out the clock) and the defense allowed a mere 62 total yards and forced three turnovers in Washington State's final six possessions of the contest.

Sophomore running back Ronnie Hillman became the third player in San Diego State history to post five consecutive 100-yard games as he rushed 32 times for 191 yards and a careerhigh tying four touchdowns. In 15 career games, Hillman has 2,029 yards rushing and 25 rushing touchdowns. He is second nationally this season in rushing yards per game, first in scoring per game and is second among all active players in career rushing yards per game.

Senior quarterback **Ryan Lindley** won his 18th career game as a starter, going 21-of-37 for 273 yards and two touchdowns. He became the second player in school history to reach 10,000 career passing yards and is one of just three active players nationally to reach the 10K total.

The offensive line, which returns four of five starters from last season, produced another strong game, allowing the Aztecs to rush for 227 yards, for an average 5.2 yards per carry and no sacks in 37 pass attempts. San Diego State has rushed for 200 or more yards in three of its last four games.

Senior cornerback Larry Parker had a career-

high seven tackles, a forced fumble and two interceptions, both in the fourth quarter.

Redshirt freshman linebacker **Jake Fely** recorded seven tackles, one off his career-high set a week earlier at Army, including 2.5 tackles for loss and a quarterback sack.

One week after forcing five fumbles, the Aztec defense forced three fumbles (recovered two), intercepted two passe and recorded six sacks and nine tackles for loss.

Following the victory, the Aztecs made traction in both of the major polls. In the *USA Today* Coaches Poll, San Diego State went from three points (last week) to 14 points this week. That puts SDSU in a tie for 36th place (tied with last year's national champion Auburn). The Aztecs received eight points in the Associated Press poll, good for 37th place. San Diego State has received votes in one or both of the major polls in 10 of the last 12 weeks dating back to 2010.

The teams have met only once before, with then 17th-ranked Michigan claiming a 24-21 victory on Sept. 18, 2004, in Ann Arbor. The game was close throughout, with Michigan building a 17-7 lead late in the first quarter. The Aztecs jumped ahead 21-17 when Matt Dlugolecki found Robert Ortiz for a 14-yard touchdown with 7:57 to play in the second quarter. The Wolverines took the lead for good when Chad Henne connected with Braylon Edwards on a 7-yard TD pass with 10:35 to play in the third quarter.

On its final four possessions, San Diego State twice drove to Michigan's 31-yard line or closer, but was unable to convert on a pair of field goal attempts in the three-point loss.

The Aztecs have a bye week scheduled for Sat., Oct. 1, but will return for their Mountain West Conference opener against 20th-ranked TCU on Sat., Oct. 8. Kickoff at Qualcomm Stadium is scheduled for 7:30 p.m. PT for that contest.

- Of the 21 new coaches in the FBS Division this season, Rocky Long is one of five who own a 3-0 record. Other coaches who are 3-0 in their first year at a school in 2011 are: Robbie Caldwell (Vanderbilt), Brady Hoke (Michigan), Will Muschamp (Florida) and Dennis Shaw (Stanford). Saturday's San Diego State-Michigan game features two of the five undefeated first-year coaches. Collectively, first-year coaches are 32-28 this season. Obviously, the two coaches Saturday are a combined 6-0.
- Saturday's contest will also see two of the top three individual leaders in rushing yards per game. Aztecs' sophomore running back Ronnie Hillman is second nationally in rushing yards per game at 165.67 and leads the nation with eight rushing touchdowns. Michigan junior quarterback Denard Robinson is third in the category at 153.00 yards per game. South Carolina's Marcus Lattimore is the national leader at 178.00 yards per game.
- San Diego State is off to its best start since the 1981 squad opened 4-0. This is the first time in 30 seasons that an Aztec squad has been 3-0.
- San Diego State has won five consecutive games. That is the third-longest active win streak in the nation, trailing only Stanford (11) and Oklahoma (7) (North Carolina and Texas Tech also own five-game winning streaks). This is San Diego State's longest winning streak since claiming six straight from Sept. 28-Nov. 4, 1995.
- San Diego State has won eight consecutive games against teams ranked outside the top 25 at

- game time, regardless of location. The Aztecs last loss to a team outside the national polls on Oct. 9, 2010. It is the longest such winning streak since a 10-game stretch from Oct. 16, 1976-Oct. 1, 1977
- With last week's win, San Diego State is now 12-4 over its last 16 games, the best 16-game stretch since Sept. 10, 1977 to Oct. 21, 1978. Since the beginning of the 2010 campaign, San Diego State's 12 victories rank 18th nationally.
- The Aztecs have scored 21 or more points in 17 consecutive games for the first time since a streak of 19 straight from Nov. 30, 1968 to Oct. 31, 1970. That streak includes the first 17 games SDSU played as a Division IA team.
- The Aztecs have scored 14 or more points in the first quarter in seven consecutive games dating back to last season.
- San Diego State is making its second appearance in the Eastern time zone this season, having defeated Army, 23-20, in a 9 a.m. PT start on Sept. 10. This is the first time in school history that the Aztecs have traveled to the Eastern time zone twice in the same season. The victory over the Black Knights earlier this year snapped an eight-game losing streak in the time zone.

SDSU vs. BIG TEN CONFERENCE

- San Diego State owns a 2-12 record against current member of the Big 10 Conference.
- San Diego State has lost its last 10 encounters with Big 10 Conference opponents, dating back to a 48-17 victory over Minnesota on Sept. 25, 1993

(18 years ago next Sunday). During the 10-game losing streak to the league, the Aztecs have played eight of the 10 games on the road and four have come against opponents ranked in the top 20.

- Saturday marks the sixth consecutive time that SDSU has met a Big 10 opponent on the road. The last time San Diego State played host to a Big 10 team was Sept. 9, 2000 (Illinois).
- The Aztecs have been extremely competitive with ranked teams from the Big 10, dropping a 24-21 decision at 17th-ranked Michigan on Sept. 18, 2004, a 16-13 decision at second-ranked Ohio State on Oct. 20, 2001, and a 26-14 game at 20th-ranked Wisconsin on Sept. 5, 1998.

SDSU-MICHIGAN: CONNECTIONS

- Michigan head football coach Brady Hoke was the head coach at San Diego State from Dec. 16, 2008 to Jan. 11, 2011, a span of two seasons and a total of 757 days. He posted a 13-12 record in 25 games at SDSU and 7-9 in Mountain West games. He was the head coach for SDSU's Poinsettia Bowl champion squad last season.
- Wolverine offensive coordinator Al Borges and assistant coaches Dan Ferrigno, Darrell Funk, Jeff Hecklinski and Mark Smith were all on Hoke's staff at SDSU from 2009-10. In addition, Michigan strength and conditioning coach Aaron Wellman (2009-10) and director of operations Bob Lopez (2008-10) served similar roles with the Aztecs.
- Aztec head coach Rocky Long (as defensive coordinator) and assistant coaches LeCharls McDaniel, Brian Sipe and Tony White were all members of Hoke's staff at San Diego State from 2009-10.
- Aztec head coach Rocky Long (1991-95) and assistant coach Osia Lewis (1991-96) coached at Oregon State with Michigan head coach Brady Hoke (1989-94) and assistant coach Dan Ferrigno (1987-95).
- SDSU head coach Rocky Long (1996-97) was on the same coaching staff at UCLA with Michigan offensive coordinator Al Borges (1996-2000).
- SDSU assistant coach LeCharls McDaniel and Michigan offensive coordinator Al Borges both coached at California in 2001. Aztec offensive coordinator Andy Ludwig (2009-10) and Michigan assistant Dan Ferrigno (2006-07, 1996-99, 1980-81) also have coached for the Golden Bears.
- Aztec offensive coordinator Andy Ludwig (1995-96) and Michigan offensive coordinator Al Borges (1993-94) have both coached at Boise State. In addition, Ludwig played at Portland State in 1986, and later was a wide receivers coach for the Vikings, while Borges was the offensive coordinator from 1986-92.
- Aztec assistant coach Tony White was a graduate assistant in football operations at UCLA when Michigan director of operations Bob Lopez was in a similar role with the Bruins in 2007.
- SDSU assistant Osia Lewis (1997-02) and Michigan defensive coordinator Greg Mattison (1976) and assistant Curt Mallory (2005-09) have all coached at Illinois.
- Michigan assistant Jerry Montgomery coached against the Aztecs from 2009-10, when he was the defensive line coach at Wyoming.
- San Diego State men's basketball head coach Steve Fisher was an assistant men's basketball coach at Michigan from 1982-1989, and served as head coach in 1989 until 1997. Fisher led the Wolverines to the 1989 NCAA national championship and two other national championship game appearances in 1992 and 1993. Since taking over at San Diego State, Fisher has guided SDSU to six Mountain West Conference championships and appearances in each of the last two NCAA tournaments. This past season, the Aztecs rose to No. 4 in the Associated Press poll, won a school-record 34 games and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16.
- Aztec men's basketball assistant head coach Brian Dutcher was the associate head coach at Michigan under Fisher from 1989-97.
- SDSU assistant men's basketball coach Mark Fisher is a 2001 Michigan graduate with a bachelor's degree in psychology. He coached boys' basketball at Lincoln High School in Ann Arbor from 1998-

ANN ARBOR, Mich. - Another reigning Big Ten champion as an opponent resulted in another near miss for the San Diego State Aztecs.

With a national television audience watching (ESPN), SDSU and No. 17 Michigan went toe-to-toe for more than three hours before the Wolverines escaped The Big House with a 24-21 win over up and coming San Diego State.

In the process, SDSU appeared to show dramatic gains on offense and special teams and The Dark Side defense showed a new taste for creating turnovers.

Michigan shocked the Aztecs early, scoring on a 54-yard touchdown pass on its first play from scrimmage. Following an interception, the Wolverines looked to be in total control with possession deep in SDSU territory. However, safety Josh Dean flattened UM quarterback Chad Henne on a pass attempt and Antwan Applewhite picked the ball out of the air and returned it 75 yards, setting up a Michael Franklin TD

Following a Michigan field goal, the Aztecs turned the ball over when Lawrence Reid picked up a fumble and returned it five yards for a touchdown.

With SDSU trailing 17-7 and on the ropes, Robert Ortiz turned the game. His 61-yard reception set up a Jeff Webb touchdown and the 109,000 plus in Ann Arbor settled in for nailbiter.

By halftime, SDSU had taken the lead when Matt Dlugolecki found Ortiz for a 14-yard score. That drive was set up by a Kurt Kahui fumble recovery. In all, SDSU forced four turnovers after Michigan entered the game second nationally in turnover margin.

The final lead change of the day took place on the first drive of the second half as the Wolverines drove the field and registered the last score of the day.

It was SDSU's second three-point loss in

ed for 21 fourth-quarter points and held the nation's highest scoring offense to just one touchdown after the break.

The game, however, initially got off to a very inauspicious start for the home team, as the Cougars scored on their first offensive snap on an 80-yard pass play from Marshall Lobbestael to Marquess Wilson.

SDSU countered with two rushing touchdowns from sophomore Ronnie Hillman, which sandwiched a 48-yard WSU field goal, before the first quarter even came to an end.

After combining for 28 points in the first 15 minutes, the Cougars were the only team to find the scoreboard again before the break, reclaiming a 17-14 advantage as the Aztecs committed a pair of turnovers in Washington State territory, including a fumble on the 16-yard line.

WSU took its largest lead of the night at the 12:03 mark of the third quarter when Lobbestael and Wilson hooked up again, this time on a 78-yard catch and run to go up by 10 at 24-14.

The Cougar defense forced the SDSU offense to punt on its very next possession, but a roughing the punter penalty extended the drive. Three plays later, Aztec quarterback Ryan Lindley found tight end Gavin Escobar open on the left sideline for a 25-yard touchdown.

After missing a 39-yard field goal that would have equalized the game, SDSU scored on each of its next two possessions in the fourth quarter on a 1-yard and a 59-yard Hillman run. The Aztecs later tacked on another seven points on Escobar's second TD to secure the 42-24 win.

The San Diego State defense was simply outstanding in the fourth quarter, holding the Cougars to 62 yards of offense and forcing three turnovers, including two on back-to-back interceptions by cornerback Larry Parker.

Other Notes

- San Diego State is 12-4 since the beginning of the 2010 season. That is the best 16-game record for the Aztecs since San Diego State posted a 12-4 mark from Sept. 10, 1977 to Oct. 21, 1978.
- SDSU has scored 14 points or more in the first quarter of a game for the seventh consecutive outing ... The Aztecs have scored 21 or more points in 17 consecutive contests, the program's longest such streak since doing so in 19 straight from Oct. 17, 1977 to Oct. 21, 1978.
- SDSU won for the first time when it trailed in a game entering the fourth quarter since beating New Mexico, 23-20, on Oct. 31, 2009.

Turnovers

■ San Diego State's school-record streak of consecutive games without a turnover came to an end in the second quarter on an interception ... It was the Aztecs' first giveaway of the season and first overall since a fumble in the UNLV contest on Nov. 27, 2010, a span of 213 consecutive offensive plays (no TOs vs. Navy, Cal Poly or Army) ... SDSU also surrendered its first fumble of the season in the second quarter.

PLAYER NOTES

Ronnie Hillman, So., RB

- Hillman scored a rushing touchdown for the sixth consecutive game and the 22nd time in his career in the first quarter ... Has scored a rushing TD in the first quarter in three-straight outings ... Added another rushing score at the end of the first quarter for his fourth-straight outing with multiple rushing TDs, his seventh such game of his career ... Tallied his third rushing TD of the evening in the fourth quarter, his third career outing with three or more TDs ... Came back with his fourth rushing score on a season-best 59-yard effort, tying his career-best for rushing TDs in a game (also vs. New Mexico State in 2010) ... Hillman has 11 rushing touchdowns in his last four games and 12 overall (one receiving) ... Has moved into fourth in SDSU career history in career rushing scores with 25.
- Hillman recorded his ninth, 100-yard rushing game in just his 16th career game at the college level (252nd in school history). He is tied for seventh with Chris Hardy in school history in most 100-yard rushing days (NFL Hall of Famer Marshall Faulk tops the list with 23). Saturday was Hillman's eighth 100-yard rushing effort for more than 150 yards.
- Hillman recorded his fifth straight 100-yard rushing game dating back to last season (152 yards vs. UNLV, 228 yards vs. Navy, 189 yards vs. Cal Poly, 117 yards at Army). The last time an Aztec ran for over 100 yards in five consecutive games was in 1995, when George Jones had eight in a row. The five-game streak is the third longest in school history, trailing only Jones (8) and Marshall Faulk's 10-game streak in 1991-92.
- Hillman had his eighth game of at least 150 rushing yards. The eight 150-yard rushing contests are tied with George Jones (1995-96) for the second most in school history. Only NFL Hall of Famer Marshall Faulk (16, 1991-93) has more 150-yard rushing games.
- Hillman surpassed the 2,000-yard mark in career rushing yards on his 59-yard TD run in the fourth quarter. He is the 12th Aztec to reach that milestone and the first since Lynell Hamilton in 2007.

■ Hillman fumbled for the first time this season in the third quarter. He recovered his own fumble, however, he snapped a streak of 131 consecutive offensive touches without putting the ball on the ground. Previously, Hillman fumbled just twice both in 2010, losing only one of those on his first career carry vs. Nicholls in the season opener.

Ryan Lindley, Sr., QB

- Lindley became just the second player in Aztec history to throw for 10,000 yards in his career. He entered the day with 9,886 yards and reached the milestone mark in the second quarter on an 11-yard pass play to tight end Bryce Quigley ... Lindley ranks second behind only Todd Santos (11,425) in school history in passing yards and is third active player player in the NCAA FBS to reach the 10,000 mark (joins Boise State's Kellen Moore and Houston's Case Keenum).
- Lindley threw a touchdown for the 13th consecutive outing (73rd overall) in the third quarter. He ranks second in the NCAA FBS among active players in that category. He added another in the fourth quarter, giving him 74 career touchdown passes.
- Lindley saw his streak of consecutive pass attempts without an interception come to an end at 112 in the second quarter ... It was Lindley's first interception thrown since the Utah game on Nov. 20, 2010 (span of 5 games).

Larry Parker, Sr., DB

■ Recorded his first two interceptions of his career in the second half ... It is the Aztecs' first interceptions of the season ... It marks the first time an Aztec has had two interceptions in a game since Donny Baker had two versus UTEP on Aug. 31, 2006 ... Parker also forced a fumble and set a career high with seven tackles.

OTHER NOTES

- Aztec tight end Alston Umuolo logged his first receptions of the year in the first quarter (first overall since the second game of 2010).
- Sophomore Rene Siluano recovered his first career fumble in the second quarter ... Sophomore Marcus Andrews forced another fumble later in the second quarter (first career) ... Junior line-backer Rob Andrews recovered his first career fumble in the fourth quarter ... SDSU has forced nine fumbles this season and eight in the last two games alone ... The Aztecs have recovered six fumbles in 2011.
- Senior punter Brian Stahovich posted his fifth kick of 50 or more yards out of 14 attempts this season with a 54-yard effort in the first half.
- Junior Leon McFadden logged a career-long and team season-long punt return of 26 yards in the first half ... On the defensive side, McFadden had two pass breakups for the second consecutive game.

OFF TO A 3-0 START

Notes on San Diego State's 3-0 start.

- San Diego State is 3-0 for the first time since 1981 (30 seasons). Prior to this season, the Aztecs had only posted four 2-0 starts since 1981, and failed to win the third game in all four previous occasions.
- San Diego State is one of just 33 teams that remains undefeated in 2011. Of those 33, only 27 own a 3-0 record after last weekend.
- Rocky Long is one of only five first-year coaches that is perfect through the first three weeks of the season. The others are Robbie Caldwell

■ In 43 seasons at the Division I level (including this season), San Diego State has opened 3-0 eight times (1969, 1970, 1972, 1975, 1976, 1977, 1981 and). In the seven previous seasons with a 3-0 start, the Aztecs have gone a cumulative record of 64-13. That breaks down to an average of 9.1 wins and 1.9 losses

DISCIPLINE IS JOB ONE

Through three games in the 2011 season, one could make a case that San Diego State has been the most disciplined team in the country to date. Through three games, the Aztecs have only two turnovers, allowed one sack and rank in the top 20 nationally in fewest penalties and fewest penalty yardage. SDSU is currently fifth in the country in turnover margin (+2.0 per game).

After an absence in the first two national polls, the Aztecs received votes in the USA Today/Coaches Poll last week and made an appearance in the also receiving votes category of both polls on Sunday. This week, the Aztecs received 14 points to rank 36h in the USA Today/Coaches poll.

This is the second straight week and the 10th time in the last 12 polls that the Aztecs have received votes in at least one of the two major polls. San Diego State found itself knocking on the door

of the top 25 last year. In 2010, SDSU received votes in one or both of the polls in each of the last eight weeks. The Aztecs ended the season ranked 28th in both the Associated Press and USA Today/Coaches polls.

The last week the Aztecs were nationally ranked in the Associated Press poll was Nov. 7, 1995, when they were listed at No. 25 with a 7-2 record after having won six consecutive games.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

■ <u>SCORING</u>: San Diego State ranks 27th in scoring (38.00) and 42nd in the country in total offense (428.00)... San Diego State has scored more points in its first three games this season (114) than it did in last season's first three games (112)... In fact, it is the highest three-game scoring output to open a season since 1996 (128 points)... San Diego State's streak of games with at least 34 or more points was broken at five at Army (that had not happened since a five-game stretch during the 1996 campaign)... Nonetheless, SDSU has 34 or more points in six of its last seven games and has averaged 38.0 points per game during this span... The Aztecs have scored 21 or more points in 17 consecutive games for the first time since a streak of 19 straight from Nov. 30, 1968 to Oct. 31, 1970... That streak includes the first 17 games SDSU played as a Division IA team... The Aztecs have committed two turnovers or less in 20 of their last 24 games and went a Division I era record three straight games without a turnover (prior to the game against Washington State)... tallying 52 points against Portland State in the third game of the 2007 season (Sept. 22, 2007)... The 49 points against Cal Poly were the second most ever in a season-opener and the most since scoring 56 points against Navy on Sept. 3, 1994 (Ted Tollner's coaching debut at San Diego State)... San Diego State has scored 14 or more points in the first quarter of seven consecutive games... San Diego State's 21 points in the fourth quarter against Washington State were its highest output since scoring 21 fourth-quarter points at Wyoming, Nov. 30, 2010.

- OFFENSIVE RUSHING: San Diego State ranks 24th nationally in rushing offense (220.67) and 14th in rushing yards per carry (5.61)... Sophomore Ronnie Hillman is second nationally in rushing yards per game (165.67), trailing only South Carolina's Marcus Lattimore (178.00)... Since the beginning of the 2010 season (last 16 games), the Aztecs have 37 rushing touchdowns... That is as many as the Aztecs had in the 35 games prior to 2010 (includes every game from the 2008 and 2009 seasons)... The Aztecs have rushed for 200 or more yards in four of the last five games and in eight of their last 16 contests... In the last five games, SDSU has 1,191 rushing yards and 13 rushing touchdowns.
- OFFENSIVE PASSING: San Diego State ranks 78th nationally in passing offense (207.33) and 49th in pass efficiency (141.37)... The Aztecs have 32 passing touchdowns in their last 13 games, including 17 in the last six contests... San Diego State had six different players catch a pass in the season-opening victory against Cal Poly and three different players caught a touchdown pass at Army... San Diego State has thrown just one interception in its last 136 pass attempts (Ryan Lindley has thrown 135 of those passes)... The Aztecs have thrown 13 touchdowns through the air with just one interception over the last five games... SDSU has posted a passing efficiency of more than 100 in 13 consecutive games, the longest stretch since a 24-game stretch from Sept. 16, 1995 through Sept. 20, 1997.
- <u>TURNOVERS</u>: San Diego State's school record streak of consecutive games without a turnover came to an end in the second quarter against Washington State on an interception... It was the Aztecs' first giveaway of the season and first overall since a fumble in the UNLV contest on Nov. 27, 2010, a span of 213 consecutive offensive plays (no TOs vs. Navy, Cal Poly or Army)... SDSU also surrendered its first fumble of the season in the second quarter... SDSU is tied for fifth in the country in turnover margin (+2.00)... San Diego State is also tied for 10th in turnovers lost (2), tied for 13th in interceptions lost (1) and tied for 15th in fumbles lost (1).

AZTEC O-LINE IMPRESSIVE, AGAIN

With four returning starters on the offensive line, it should come as no surprise that San Diego State continued the fine play up front last Saturday. The Aztec starting offensive line consists of three seniors (LT Tommie Draheim, LG Emilio Rivera and RT Kurtis Gunther) and two juniors (C Alec Johnson and RG Nik Embernate).

- San Diego State has allowed one sack in the last 144 pass attempts dating back to the fourth quarter of the Utah game on Nov. 20, 2010.
- After allowing a mere nine sacks a year ago, San Diego State is one of 11 teams nationally who have allowed one sack or fewer this season.
- San Diego State is a perfect 5-for-5 this season in converting third down and 1.
- In the season-opening game against Cal Poly, the Aztec offensive line received high marks, helping SDSU rush for 289 yards on 49 carries (5.90 yards per carry), while allowing no sacks and giving up just two negative plays (for a total of four lost yards) in 77 offensive snaps).
- Against Army, San Diego State rushed for 146 yards on just 25 carries for an average of 5.84 yards per rush, with two touchdowns. Ronnie Hillman rushed for 117 yards, marking the fourth consecutive game that he had broken the century mark.
- Versus Washington State, San Diego State rushed for 227 yards and four touchdowns on 44 carries. The Aztecs also had 37 pass attempts without a sack in the contest.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- OVERALL: San Diego State ranks 48th nationally in scoring defense (21.67) and 80th in total defense (383.00)... On Saturday, the San Diego State defense held Washington State to 62 total yards and forced three turnovers on the Cougars final six possessions... Of Washington State's 419 yards of offense, 158 came on two plays, meaning the Cougars had 261 yards on their other 68 offensive plays (3.84 per play)... The defense was on the field for 84 plays and 42:11 at Army... The Aztec defense secured the victory, holding Army on downs after the Black Knights had first and 10 on the Aztec 29 on their final drive of the game... The Aztec defense improved as the game against Cal Poly progressed, yielding just 10 yards of offense in the third quarter and a mere 105 yards after halftime... San Diego State limited the Mustangs to six straight 3-and-outs at one point in the game, nine 3-and-outs for the contest and held Cal Poly to four yards or less on 10 of their 15 drives... Of Cal Poly's 284 yards of offense, 101 came on two plays... That means Cal Poly had 183 yards on their other 58 plays from scrimmage (3.16 per play).
- RUSH DEFENSE: San Diego State is 98th nationally in rushing yards per game (197.00) after playing option-oriented teams, which is misleading due to playing option teams in the first two weeks of the season... That may be the most misleading stat in the country, as the Aztecs have defended 151 rushes, the fourth most rushing plays in the country... SDSU's average yards allowed per rush is 3.91, the 65th-best total nationally... SDSU did not allow a rushing touchdown against the Cougars, despite defending 28 carries... Washington State's longest rush of the day went for 11 yards... After having his streak snapped at eight consecutive games with a tackle for loss at Army, senior linebacker Miles Burris responded with a sack against the Cougars... After forcing five fumbles against the Black Knights, SDSU forced two fumbles against Washington State and has now forced eight fumbles on the season... The Aztecs have recovered six fumbles this season, the third highest total in the country.
- PASS DEFENSE: San Diego State is 36th nationally in pass defense (186.00) and 72nd in pass efficency rating (129.77)... After not surrendering a passing touchdown in the first two games, SDSU allowed three strikes through the air against Washington State... The Aztecs have 13 pass break ups in 63 opponent pass attempts this season ... SDSU gave up only 43 yards passing at Army, the team's fewest allowed since North Carolina threw for only 33 yards in the 1998 Las Vegas Bowl.

MILES MARKS

Aztec senior linebacker Miles Burris, a Butkus, Lombardi and Nagurski Award candidate, tied for the team led the team in tackles with six against Cal Poly and has 16 stops this season. Of those 16, three were behind the line of scrimmage for a loss of 16 yards, including two sacks. Burris has recorded at least a half tackle for loss in nine of the last 10 outings and 14 of the last 16 contests. The Granite Bay, Calif., native has two or more tackles for loss in seven career games and has pushed his career total to 30.5 in that category, including 13.0 sacks. Burris also enters the Michigan outing with a streak of 29 consecutive games with at least one tackle, dating back to the 2008 contest with Utah.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

■ SPECIAL TEAMS: Aztec punter Brian Stahovich ranks 22nd nationally in punting average at 43.25... Of his 16 punts, he landed seven inside the 20-yard line, 13 of his 16 boots have not been returned and he boasts five 50-yard kicks... Senior place-kicker Abelardo Perez has four touchbacks on kickoffs, giving him 32 in 16 career outings as an Aztec... Perez made his first field goal of the season count against Army when he booted a 42-yard gamewinner... Colin Lockett had a 94-yard kick return for a touchdown against Cal Poly, the school's first return for a TD since 2008... The 94-yard return is the school's longest since 1997 and eighth-longest in school history... He is currently 35th nationally in average kickoff return, while Leon McFadden is 27th nationally in punt return average.

HILLMAN, PARKER NAMED MW FOOTBALL PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

San Diego State football players Ronnie Hillman and Larry Parker have been named Mountain West Players of the Week for their performances in this past weekend's victory over Washington State, the conference office announced Monday. This week marks the first time in Parker's career that he has been honored by the league, while this is the first honor this year for Hillman, but the fourth overall of his career.

Hillman, who shared the offensive award with Boise State's Kellen Moore, recorded 191 rushing yards on a career-high 32 carries and notched four touchdowns Saturday against Washington State. Hillman's rushing total was the best by a MW player this year and ranks as the seventh-highest total nationally through the first three weeks of the season. His four touchdowns tied his previous career game high and are tied for fifth in SDSU history. The La Habra, Calif., native recorded his fifth straight 100-yard rushing game dating back to the last season. It also marked his eighth career game of at least 150 yards rushing.

Parker, who shared the defensive award with Wyoming's Josh Biezuns, was instrumental in forcing three turnovers, including two fourth-quarter interceptions. The picks were the first of his career and came on consecutive drives in the fourth quarter with less than six minutes remaining. His first interception was on a fourth-down play with the Cougars driving at the SDSU 45-yard line. Parker ended WSU's following offensive possession by intercepting a pass at the Aztec's 48-yard line and brought it back 32 yards to set up the team's final touchdown drive.

The San Diego native is the first Aztec to log two interceptions in a single game in five years and also added five solo stops leading to a career-high seven tackles. With his seven tackles, Parker tied for a team lead for most tackles in the WSU game.

This is the second consecutive week that two Aztecs have been tabbed as MW players of the week with seniors Jerome Long (defense) and Brian Stahovich (special teams) both selected following the win at Army.

FOUR AZTECS ON WATCH LISTS

■ San Diego State has already placed four student-athletes on preseason national award watch lists in 2011. Senior linebacker Miles Burris, senior quarterback Ryan Lindley, senior place-kicker Abelardo Perez and sophomore running back Ronnie Hillman are on the initial short list for their positions' top honors.

Burris (Granite Bay, Calif.) is one of 51 players on the Butkus Award Watch List (top linebacker), one of 125 on the Rotary Lombardi Award Watch List (top lineman) and one of 87 on the Bronko Nagurski Trophy Watch List (top defensive player). The last Aztec to be on all three of the same preseason watch lists was another linebacker in Kirk Morrison in both 2003 and 2004.

Burris is coming off a breakout 2010 campaign in which he led San Diego State in tackles (80), tackles for a loss (20) and sacks (9.5). He was also the Mountain West's sack and tackles-for-a-loss leader and was named a MWC first-team selection.

Lindley (Alpine, Calif.) is one of 38 players on the Davey O'Brien Award Watch List (top quarterback), one of 66 players on the Maxwell Award Watch List (most outstanding player) and one of 31 players on the Manning Award Watch List (top quarterback).

Lindley returns for his fourth year as SDSU's starter and has already amassed 9,537 career passing yards and 67 touchdowns in 36 contests. Last year, Lindley threw for 3,830 yards and 28 TDs to lead the Mountain West in passing (294.6 ypg.) and total offense (292.2 ypg.). Lindley was a second-team all-conference selection as a junior and enters 2011 within striking distance of the school's all-time career passing record currently held by Todd Santos (11,425).

Hillman (La Habra, Calif.) is one of 40 players on the Walter Camp Award Watch List (player of the year), one of 51 players on the Doak Walker Award Watch List (top running back) and one of 66 players on the Maxwell Award Watch List (most outstanding player).

Hillman rushed for 1,532 yards and 17 touchdowns a year ago en route to earning freshman All-America and conference freshman-of-the-year honors. He ran for more than 150 yards six times in 2010, including a career high of 228 yards at No. 25 Missouri and then again vs. Navy in the Poinsettia Bowl. Hillman led the Mountain West in rushing and ranked first among all freshmen (10th overall) nationally in that category.

Perez (Tijuana, Mexico) is one of 30 players on the Lou Groza Award Watch List (top place-kicker). He was a second-team all-Mountain West selection in 2010, posting a league-best 28 touchbacks and converting 17 of 22 field-goal attempts, including his final eight. He also led the league in field goals per game (1.42) and in scoring (8.3 ppg.).

SDSU TABBED TO FINISH FOURTH IN THE MOUNTAIN WEST

■ For the first time in seven seasons, the San Diego State football team is picked to finish in the upper division of the Mountain West, coming in fourth place with 160 points in the 2011 preseason poll, which is voted on by media representatives who cover the conference.

Released at the league's annual media day in Las Vegas, the MW preseason poll has the Aztecs picked for fourth place, their highest projected finish since being pegged for third in 2004. Last season, San Diego State was projected to come in sixth place, but ended up in a tie for third after posting a 9-4 overall record and a 5-3 mark in Mountain West play. It marked the fifth time in the last six seasons that SDSU has finished at or higher than its projected finish.

Two-time all-Mountain West Conference punter, including a first-team selection as a junior in 2010 after leading the league and ranking eighth nationally in punting (45.40)... Had a career-long 89-yard punt at Wyoming on Oct. 30, 2010, which was a school record, the longest in the FBS in 2010 and the second longest in MWC history... Has 46 career kicks of 50 or more yards and has landed 52 inside the 20-yard line... An additional 56 punts have been fair caught... Is third all-time at SDSU in punting yards (8,579) and fourth in punting average (42.68)... Is 22nd in the nation this year in punting with a 43.25 average... Seven of his 16 punts this year have been inside the 20 and six have been fair caught... Only three of the 16 have been returned... If you take away the times he has had to punt inside opponents' territory, Stahovich is averaging 44.79 yards per punt this season (14 punts for 627 yards) ... MWC Special Teams Player of the Week (Sept. 12, 2011).

MW newcomer Boise State was picked to win the league title in 2011, capturing 28 of the 31 first-place votes and earning 236 points overall. The Broncos were followed by TCU, Air Force, San Diego State, Colorado State, Wyoming, UNLV and New Mexico.

FOUR AZTECS NAMED TO PRESEASON ALL-MOUNTAIN WEST TEAM

■ San Diego State senior linebacker Miles Burris, sophomore running back Ronnie Hillman, junior cornerback Leon McFadden and senior punter Brian Stahovich were all named to the preseason all-conference team. This marked just the second time in league history that the Aztecs placed a student-athlete on the all-conference offensive, defensive and special teams and is the program's most preseason all-league picks since 2004, when it also had four honorees.

McFadden was tabbed a first-team all-league selection in 2010, when he led the MW in passes defended per game (1.08). He ranked third on the team in tackles with a career-high 55 with seven of those stops behind the line of scrimmage. The Inglewood, Calif., native also had a pair of interceptions, started every contest and returned punts.

Stahovich (Solana Beach, Calif.), a first-team all-conference selection a year a go, led the Mountain West and ranked eighth nationally in punting as a junior with a 45.4 yard average. He is a two-time nominee for the Ray Guy Award (top punter) and has 41 career punts of 50 yards or more, including a school-record 89-yard punt last season in the victory at Wyoming.

SDSU ANNOUNCES TEAM CAPTAINS

■ Aztec head coach Rocky Long announced last week that seniors J.J. Autele (Waipahu, Hawaii), Miles Burris and Ryan Lindley have been named football team captains for the upcoming 2011 season. The three were selected in a vote by their teammates.

Autele has played in 28 games in his three seasons as an Aztec. Last season, he played in all 13 contests and was tied for fifth on the team in sacks. Burris has started 25 of his 37 career appearances, and is coming off a year in which he led the Mountain West in sacks and tackles-for-a-loss. Lindley, who enters his fourth year as SDSU's starting quarterback, has already amassed 9,537 career passing yards and 67 touchdowns in 36 games.

FAULK INDUCTED INTO PRO FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME

■ Former San Diego State running back Marshall Faulk was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame on Aug. 6 in Canton, Ohio, along with Deion Sanders, Shannon Sharpe, Richard Dent, Ed Sabol, Les Richter and Chris Hanburger.

A three-time All-American (1991-93), Faulk holds the SDSU record for most 300-, 200-, and 100-yard rushing performances by a player and the record for the most 200-yard rushing efforts in a single season. He led the nation in rushing as a freshman in 1991 with 1,429 yards and in 1992 as sophomore with 1,630 yards. Faulk finished in the top nine of the Heisman Trophy balloting in all three of his seasons, including second in 1992 and fourth in 1993. In his time as an Aztec, he rushed for 4,589 yards and 57 touchdowns.

San Diego State's all-time career leading rusher was the second overall pick by the Indianapolis Colts in the 1994 NFL Draft. A seven-time NFL Pro Bowl selection, he rushed for 1,000 yards in seven of his first eight seasons. Faulk was named NFL Most Valuable Player in 2000, after setting a single-season record for touchdowns (26) that included a league-leading 18 rushing scores. He also won the world championship with the St. Louis Rams in Super Bowl XXXIV on Jan. 30, 2000



ROCKY LONG

Was one of four NCAA players who visited U.S. servicemen in Vietnam in the summer of 1971, spending two weeks visiting different U.S. bases

Bobby Knight paid Long a home visit and recruited the two-sport athlete to play basketball at Army

Left New Mexico as the all-time leading rusher (2,071 yards) and threw just 23 interceptions in 30 career games

COACHING HIGHLIGHTS

- ▶ Has the second-most all-time victories in the Mountain West with 65, including three this season
- ▶ Was named the Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year in 2002
- ▶ Has 11 years of head coaching experience and has spent 14 seasons as a defensive coordinator

AT SAN DIEGO STATE:

- ▶ Became San Diego State's 18th head football coach on Jan. 12, 2011.
- ▶ Was the defensive coordinator at SDSU from 2009-10.
- ▶ Built a defense that last season ranked in the top 40 and allowed 20 points or less six times as the Aztecs posted a winning record for the first time in 12 years, claimed nine victories for the first time since 1977 and captured a bowl victory for the first time since 1969.
- ▶ In his first year in 2009, helped SDSU improve defensive marks in points allowed, first downs, first downs, rushing, total defense, third-down conversion percentage, fourth-down conversion percentage, sacks, interceptions and red-zone conversion percentage, among other categories.

AT NEW MEXICO

- ▶ Compiled a school-record 65 victories and led the Lobos to five bowl game appearances in his final seven seasons. His teams were bowl eligible in seven of his last eight campaigns.
- ▶ In his final nine seasons in Albuquerque, Long's defensive units ranked among the top 30 in fewest yards allowed six times and among the top 40 against the rush every year. In both 2001 and 2003, New Mexico's defense ranked fifth nationally in fewest rushing yards allowed per game.
- ▶ While at New Mexico, he coached 13 players selected in the NFL Draft, 10 players who earned All-America honors and had a MWC-high 34 first-team all-conference selections since 2003.

OTHER COACHING EXPERIENCE

- ▶ Prior to accepting the head coaching position at New Mexico, Long served as defensive coordinator for 12 seasons at three different schools. He was the defensive coordinator for two years under Bob Toledo at UCLA in 1996-97, for five seasons at Oregon State from 1991-95, and for five campaigns at Wyoming from 1981-85
- ▶ Also served as an assistant coach at TCU, with the CFL's British Columbia team and started his career at New Mexico has a graduate assistant coach in 1972.

PLAYING EXPERIENCE:

- ▶ Originally a defensive back, Long became a three-year starter at quarterback for the Lobos from 1969-71. He earned team most valuable player honors and was the Western Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year as a senior.
- ▶ Long played professionally in the CFL with British Columbia in 1972-73 and 1975-76. He also competed in the World Football League with the Detroit Wheels in 1974.
- ▶ Attended Alta Loma High School in Alta Loma, Calif.

PERSONAL:

Long and his wife, Debby, have two daughters, Roxanne and Hannah. Both of Long's daughters are head coaches at NCAA schools. Roxanne is the head women's basketball coach at Texas Lutheran, an NCAA Division III school in the American Southwest Conference. Hannah is the head volleyball coach at Southwestern University, an NCAA Division III school in the Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference. Last seson, her team went 32-7 and advanced to the second round of the NCAA tournament.

GAME 1

Sept. 3 • Qualcomm Stadium (34,384)

vs. Cal Poly

SAN DIEGO – The San Diego State football team put on an impressive performance on both sides of the ball, downing Cal Poly, 49-21. With the win before 34,384 fans at Qualcomm Stadium, SDSU claimed its season opener in consecutive years for the first time since 2003-04.

SDSU wasted no time kicking off the 2011 season, marching 81 yards on just six plays to take an early 7-0 lead on a Ronnie Hillman 2-yard run. After a punt, San Diego State scored a TD on three consecutive drives to open up a 28-14 lead at the half.

Quarterback Ryan Lindley found Gavin Escobar for a 3-yard touchdown pass in the first quarter, and Dylan Denso on touchdown passes of 3 and 33 yards in the second quarter to account for the Aztecs' other first-half scores, while Cal Poly countered with a 3-yard run by Mark Rodgers and a 17-yard rushing score by Jake Romanelli.

Despite not mounting much of an offensive attack in the third, the SDSU defense came up big after the break, keeping the Mustangs to just 10 total yards of offense. Lindley threw his fourth touchdown of the game and in the process broke Todd Santos' school record for career touchdowns with his 71st on an 18-yard pass to Colin Lockett.

Hillman scampered for a 27-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter to put San Diego State up 42-14. Following a 2-yard rushing touchdown by Cal Poly's Andre Broadous, Lockett responded with a 94-yard kickoff return for the final score of the game. Lockett's kickoff return was the longest by an Aztec since 1997, and the eighth-longest return in school history.

Besides outgaining the Mustangs, 492-284, SDSU had 10 more first downs (22-12) than Cal Poly, outrushed the visitors, 289-137, and had 203 passing yards to the Mustangs' 147. Additionally, San Diego State had the ball 36:08 compared to just 23:52 for Cal Poly.

Hillman led the Aztec offensive attack with 189 yards on 28 carries and two scores. It was his seventh 100-yard game of his career, all which have eclipsed the 150-yard barrier.

Lindley passed for 203 yards and four touchdowns, while Denso (66 yards, 2 TD) and Escobar (36 yards, TD) each caught four passes. Lockett, meanwhile, had three catches for 82 yards and a touchdown.

Sept. 10 ◆ *Michie Stadium* (26,778)

at Army

WEST POINT, N.Y. – On a weekend when emotions ran high as the nation commemorated the Sept. 11 tragedy, San Diego State survived its' first-ever trip to the state of New York by edging a determined Army squad, 23-20, in front of 26,778 fans at Michie Stadium. With the victory, the Aztecs started a campaign at 2-0 in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1976-77.

The game got off to a very good start for the visitors, as quarterback Ryan Lindley found wideout Colin Lockett on the second offensive play for a 68-yard touchdown strike only 33 seconds into the contest.

Army, meanwhile, fumbled on each of its first two possessions with the Aztecs taking advantage of the second one with a 16-yard scoring run from running back Ronnie Hillman to jump ahead 14-0.

The Black Knights cut their deficit in half on the first of three rushing touchdowns on the day by quarterback Trent Steelman and headed into the break tied, as the SDSU offense went scoreless in the second quarter.

The Aztecs finally got back on the board on their final drive of the third quarter, as Hillman caught a 24-yard pass and rushed four times for 45 yards, including a 20-yard scoring effort, to put them ahead, 20-14.

The advantage would have been seven, however, SDSU place-kicker Abelardo Perez missed the extra point. Army had a chance to take the lead for the first time to start the fourth quarter, but it returned the favor by also missing an extra point following a TD, as the game was once again knotted.

Starting from their own 20-yard line, the Aztecs drove 55 yards to set up what would turn out to be a game-winning 42-yard Perez field goal.

Army tried to answer with an incredible 17-play drive that ate up nearly eight and a half minutes on the clock and got it all the way down to the SDSU 25-yard line. Over the next four plays, however, the Black Knights moved backwards after they were flagged for a 5-yard penalty, gave up a 6-yard sack and threw two incomplete passes, including one on fourth down, giving the ball back and securing the Aztecs' 23-20 victory.

Overall, Army held a huge advantage in total offense (446-292) and time of possession (42:11-17:49), but had three drives ended by fumbles and two more turned over on downs. On the flip side, SDSU did not commit a turnover for the third outing in a row (longest streak in the program's division I history) and was called for only three penalties for 10 total yards.

Hillman logged his fourth consecutive 100-yard rushing effort with 117 yards, while Lockett posted his first 100-yard receiving outing with five catches for 113 yards. Defensively, SDSU was led by Jerome Long, who had a career-high 10 tackles and a sack, and junior linebacker Rob Andrews, who posted a career-best nine stops and a forced fumble.

Sept. 17 ◆ Qualcomm Stadium (57,286)

vs. Washington State

SAN DIEGO – As they say, streaks are meant to be broken and that's just what the Aztec football team did with its come-from-behind 42-24 victory over Washington State.

Not only did a San Diego State win give the program its' first 3-0 start in 30 years, but it was also the team's first victory over a current Pac-12 foe in 16 seasons and was the first win against a team from an automatic BCS qualifying conference in 12 years.

In front of the largest home crowd to ever see a regular-season contest (57,286), the Aztecs erupted for 21 fourth-quarter points and held the nation's highest scoring offense to just one touchdown after the break.

The game, however, initially got off to a very inauspicious start for the home team, as the Cougars scored on their first offensive snap on an 80-yard pass play from Marshall Lobbestael to Marquess Wilson.

SDSU countered with two rushing touchdowns from sophomore Ronnie Hillman, which sandwiched a 48-yard WSU field goal, before the first quarter even came to an end.

After combining for 28 points in the first 15 minutes, the Cougars were the only team to find the scoreboard again before the break, reclaiming a 17-14 advantage as the Aztecs committed a pair of turnovers in Washington State territory, including a fumble on the 16-yard line.

WSU took its largest lead of the night at the 12:03 mark of the third quarter when Lobbestael and Wilson hooked up again, this time on a 78-yard catch and run to go up by 10 at 24-14.

The Cougar defense forced the SDSU offense to punt on its very next possession, but a roughing the punter penalty extended the drive. Three plays later, Aztec quarterback Ryan Lindley found tight end Gavin Escobar open on the left sideline for a 25-yard touchdown.

After missing a 39-yard field goal that would have equalized the game, SDSU scored on each of its next two possessions in the fourth quarter on a 1-yard and a 59-yard Hillman run. The Aztecs later tacked on another seven points on Escobar's second TD to secure the 42-24 win.

The San Diego State defense was simply outstanding in the fourth quarter, holding the Cougars to 62 yards of offense and forcing three turnovers, including two on back-to-back interceptions by cornerback Larry Parker.

Hillman, meanwhile, tallied his fifth-straight 100-yard rushing game with 191 yards on a career-best 32 carries, while matching his career high with the four scores.
