Opening Week Winners Meet In Rematch of '98 Las Vegas Bowl

- A pair of teams that were victorious in their season openers meet Saturday in Chapel Hill, N.C., when San Diego State (1-0) plays at North Carolina (1-0).
- It is the second ever meeting between the teams on the football field. The Aztecs outgained the Tar Heels, 295-196, in the 1998 Las Vegas Bowl, but was unable to come away with a victory as UNC claimed a 20-13 win.
- The teams have followed very similar paths since the beginning of the 2013 campaign. Last season after opening 0-3, SDSU became just the sixth team in the last 33 seasons to advance to and win a bowl game. In 2013, UNC opened 1-5, only to close the campaign 6-1 including a victory over Cincinnati in the Belk Bowl.
- Since Sept. 28, 2013, San Diego State owns a 9-2 record, tied for the seventh-best record in the nation during that span (UNC is 7-4 during that range, 47th nationally).
- Through games of Aug. 30, San Diego State was the only team in the country to do the following in its opening game of the season: commit one turnover or less, have five penalties or less, pass for 200 yards, rush for 150 yards, hold its opponent to seven points or less and score a defensive or special team touchdown.
- San Diego State won its season-opener for the first time since 2011 and is looking for just its third 2-0 start to a campaign in the last 20 seasons (SDSU opened with consecutive wins in both 2010 and 2011).
- The Aztecs are 5-1 in their last six road or neutral games dating back to last season. Included in that stretch are victories in three different time zones (Mountain, Pacific and Hawaii).
- This marks just the 13th visit by an Aztec football team to the Eastern time zone in the Division I Era (since 1969). The Aztecs are 2-10 out East, with the lone victories coming at Kent State on Sept. 30, 1972 (14-10) and at Army on Sept. 10, 2011 (23-20).
- San Diego State owns an 8-64 all-time record against teams ranked in either of the major polls at game time, including a 7-61 mark against teams in the AP Too 25 at game time.
- San Diego State and North Carolina own two of the best combined football and men's basketball records of the decade. In fact, since the beginning of the 2010 football season, the Aztecs rank third nationally at 76.8 percent (149-45), while the Tar Heals are ninth at 71.6 percent (141-56).
- San Diego State has advanced to a school-record four consecutive bowl games and is one of only 29 schools nationally to advance to bowl games following the 2010, 2011, 2012 and 2013 Mountain West campaigns. From the state of California, only SDSU and Stanford have played in four consecutive bowl games.
- Rocky Long, the all-time Mountain West leader in coaching victories, enters his fourth season as head coach of the Aztecs and his sixth season in the program. The two-time conference coach of the year has 25 wins in his first three seasons on the Mesa, matching Claude Gilbert for the most coaching wins through the first game of their fourth season.
- Last week, San Diego State had 11 players make their first start (three on offense, eight on defense). The eight first-time starters on defense are the most by either side of the ball by any school in the country.

Bullet Notes - Offense

- Bob Toledo enters his second season as offensive coordinator at San Diego State. He has 39 years of coaching experience, including 18 as a head coach and 16 as an offensive coordinator.
- San Diego State returns six starters on the offensive side of the ball from the 2013 season, including senior quarterback <u>Quinn Kaehler</u>, senior wide receiver <u>Ezell Ruffin</u>, senior left tackle <u>Terry Poole</u> and junior right guard <u>Darrell Greene</u>.
- Three SDSU offensive players made their first career start last Saturday junior tight end Robert Craighead, junior fullback Dakota Gordon and junior right tackle Pearce Slater.
- Last week, the San Diego State's offense continued where it left off last season. The Aztecs posted 38 points, had 399 yards of total offense (averaged 6.0 yards per play) and showed remarkable balance with 205 yards passing and 194 yards rushing. SDSU obtained exactly 11 first downs by way of the pass and 11 first downs via the run. It marked the first time that an SDSU team had at least 11 first downs rushing and passing since Oct. 6, 2012 against Hawai'i.
- San Diego State has scored 87 points in its last two games (43.5 ppg) and 140 points in its last four games (35.0 ppg). The Aztecs have scored 27 or more points in nine of its last 10 games.
- San Diego State scored a touchdown in all four quarters and now has a TD in 10 consecutive quarters dating back to last season.
 That is the second longest active streak in the nation (San Jose State, 11).
- Pumphrey produced his fourth career 100-yard rushing game in the opener against Northern Arizona. San Diego State has won five straight games and is 13-2 the last 15 time an Aztec has rushed for at least 100 yards.
- The Aztecs had one turnover in the opener and have now won 10 straight games when committing one turnover or less. The Aztecs have won six straight games when tied or have a positive turnover margin.
- QB Quinn Kaehler, who was one of two walk-on starters in the nation at the position last season, owns a 9-3 record as a starter. He is scheduled to make his 13th career start on Saturday and has 13 consecutive 200-yard passing games, which is the longest streak by an Aztec player in last 18 seasons and the third longest active streak nationally, trailing only Rakeem Cato (Marshall, 29) and Sean Mannion (Oregon State, 14).
- On the Biletnikoff Award Watch List (most outstanding receiver) WR <u>Ezell Ruffin</u> is coming off a season in which he compiled 1,136 yards receiving, the most by an Aztec non-senior in the 15-year history of the Mountain West. In 2013, his 16.71-yard per catch average ranked fourth nationally among receivers with at least 68 catches. He caught four passes for a team-high 53 receiving yards in the opener. He has caught four or passes in a career-best five consecutive games.
- On the Doak Walker Watch List (nation's top running back), RB <u>Donnel Pumphrey</u> was one of two freshmen in the country last season to rush for 750 yards and record 230 receiving yards. He became the first Aztec freshman to post three consecutive 100-yard rushing games since NFL Hall of Famer Marshall Faulk did it in 1991. Of his 151 career touches entering the season, 32 (21.2 percent) resulted in a gain of at least 10 yards. Last week he matched a career-high with 19 carries for 111 yards and two touchdowns. The Aztecs are 6-1 in his career when he rushes for a TD.
- On the offensive line, three San Diego State student-athletes scheduled to start have at least 12 starts under their belt. At left tackle, <u>Terry Poole</u>, who started 12 games at right tackle a year ago, enters his senior campaign. At right guard, junior Darrell Greene has 13 previous starts, all at RG. He has played in 16 career games. The most experienced lineman of the group is senior center <u>Zach Dilley</u>. Dilley has played in 24 career games and 19 starts (13 at right tackle, five at left guard and one at center).

Bullet Notes - Defense

- San Diego State had eight first-time starters on defense in the season opener. That is the highest total for either side of the ball (offense or defense) by any team in the country.
- San Diego State returns four starters on the defensive side of the ball off the 2013, senior defensive end <u>Dontrell Onuoha</u>, senior middle linebacker <u>Cody Galea</u>, senior linebacker <u>Josh Gavert</u> and senior cornerback <u>J.J. Whittaker</u>. Gavert did not start the opener as he had limited practice time due to injury.
- In addition, senior linebacker Cody Galea, made his first career start at that position (previous 22 starts came at defensive end)
 last Saturday.
- San Diego State allowed just seven points to Northern Arizona on Saturday. It was the fewest points allowed by the Aztecs since SDSU defeated Army, 42-7, on Sept. 8, 2012.
- San Diego State has not allowed more than 401 yards in total offense in seven consecutive games. Since Nov. 9, 2013, SDSU's 342.7 yards allowed per game ranks 26th nationally.
- In the opener, SDSU held Northern Arizona to a 102.83 passing efficiency rating. That is the lowest allowed by the Aztecs since limiting Brigham Young to an 85.22 rating in the 2012 Poinsettia Bowl. It also snapped a 13-game streak in which the Aztecs allowed a passing touchdown.
- Cody Galea is slated to make his 24th consecutive start Saturday, the longest active streak on the team.
- Senior defensive back J.J. Whittaker, who is on the Thorpe Watch List for best defensive back, had three interceptions and 11 passes broken up in the final 10 games of last season. He made a career-high tying six tackles against Northern Arizona.
- Fourth-year SDSU head coach <u>Rocky Long</u> will once again serve as defensive coordinator. This is his sixth season serving as the DC for the Aztecs. Since the beginning of 2009, when Long took over as defensive coordinator, the Aztecs rank 35th nationally and first among MW teams that have been in the league the last five seasons in yards per rush allowed (3.8) and 37th nationally in scrimmage yards per touch (6.5).
- In the last three seasons, SDSU has held its opponent to less than 100 yards rushing 17 times (32.7 percent of the time).

Bullet Notes - Special Teams

- The area in which San Diego State showed the most improvement in the opener was in special teams.
- San Diego State has scored four non-offensive touchdowns in its last four game (three punt returns and one interception return). Since Nov. 23, 2013, only 63 teams in the nation have scored a non-offensive touchdown and the Aztecs have done it four times. That ranks second nationally during that span. Only Saturday's opponent, North Carolina (5), has done it more often. The Aztecs are tied with Florida State, Middle Tennessee, Oklahoma and UCLA for second.
- <u>Lloyd Mills</u> returned a fourth-quarter punt 67 yards for a touchdown in the opening game. The sophomore scored on the fifth collegiate touch of his career (had four previous punt returns and a rush prior to the TD). It gave the Aztecs their third punt return for touchdown in the last four games, the most in the country. In fact, since Nov. 23 of last season only two team sin the country have returned multiple punts for touchdowns San Diego State (3) and North Carolina (2).
- The place-kicking game looked much improved against NAU. Junior transfer <u>Donnie Hageman</u> converted all five of his extra point attempts (something the Aztecs were just 39-of-45 a year ago) and ended a 337-day field goal drought by converting a 48-yard attempt in the second quarter. SDSU did not successfully make a FG in the final nine games of the 2013 campaign. During that period, all 124 other FBS schools made a field goal. The highest total during that period was Arizona State with 20, while Georgia State (became eligible for postseason last weekend) and Purdue only made one. The Aztecs were 0-for-7 during the nine-game drought.

Program Notes

- San Diego State has advanced to four consecutive bowl games. The Aztecs join Stanford as the only football teams in California
 FBS or NFL to advance to the postseason in each of the past four seasons.
- SDSU is one of 29 schools to play in a bowl game each of the last four seasons, which is the longest streak in the Mountain West. San Diego State and Boise State are the only two current Mountain West schools to reach a bowl game in 2010, 2011, 2012 and 2013.
- With bowl game appearances in a school-record four straight seasons, the Aztecs have equaled their total number of bowls played in the 41 prior seasons (1969 through 2009).
- Between 2000-09, SDSU was 38-80 (.322) and owned the nation's 106th-best winning percentage. Since 2010, San Diego State is 35-18 (.660) and owns the nation's 28th-best winning percentage.
- Since the beginning of the 2010 campaign, San Diego State has posted a 35-18 record (.660). The only teams in the state of California with a better record during that span are Stanford (47-8) and USC (36-17).
- With 35 wins in their last 53 games (35-18 since the beginning of the 2010 campaign), the Aztecs have equaled their win total from the previous 108 games (34-74).
- The 34 wins the last four seasons (9 in 2010, 8 in 2011, 9 in 2012 and 8 in 2013) are the most in a 4-year period at San Dlego State since 1974-77 (36 wins).
- Since the beginning of 2010, the Aztecs have won 35 games. That is more than any other team has won while a member of the league (Air Force is second at 25).
- San Diego State defeated Boise State in consecutive seasons (2012 and 2013), becoming the first team to accomplish that since Washington State did it in 2000 and 2001.
- SDSU owns 19 conference championships, but the 2012 Mountain West title was the school's first since claiming the 1998 Western Athletic Conference Pacific Division championship.

The Series: North Carolina

- This marks just the second football meeting between North Carolina and San Diego State. The Tar Heels won the previous encounter, 20-13, on Dec. 19, 1998, at Sam Boyd Stadium in the Las Vegas Bowl.
- This is a single-game contract and their is no future games cheduled between the teams.
- San Diego State owns a 3-6 record against the current configuration of the Atlantic Coast Conference. The Aztecs are 2-0 against
 Florida State, 1-5 against Miami (Fla.) and 0-1 vs. North Carolina.
- This will mark just the second time since the Aztecs went to Division I (prior to the 1969 campaign) that SDSU will face a team that called the ACC home at game time. The only time SDSU has met a team from the league at the time of the game was North Carolina in the 1998 Las Vegas Bowl. The previous meetings with Florida State and Miami (Fla.) occured while they were indepentents.
- The Aztecs will play their 527th game as a Division I team on Saturday, but it will mark the first time the Aztecs have played a contest in the Tar Heel State. The previous meeting with UNC represents the only encounter with a team from the state.

Last Meeting: North Carolina

With San Diego State driving in the closing moments of the game, North Carolina's Keith Newman intercepted a pass at the Tar Heel 2-yard line to secure a 20-13 UNC victory in the 1998 Las Vegas Bowl.

On a very windy day in Las Vegas (estimated at more than 40 miles per hour), offense was a premium as the teams combined for just 489 yards of total offense and three touchdowns. North Carolina settled for eight total first downs and completed just four passes on the day.

The Aztecs got on the board first when Lonny Mitchell picked up a fumble from Jonas Lewis and raced 60 yards to give the Aztecs an early 7-0 lead.

North Carolina, which opened the game with the wind, used great field position to start a pair of first quarter drives at the Aztecs 20 and 24-yard lines, to converted two field goals and pull within one point.

On the final play of the first quarter, Ronald Curry converted a third down and seven, rushing for 48 yards and a Tar Heel touchdown. The conversion failed, giving North Carolina a 12-7 lead.

On the next possession, Quinton Savage blocked an Aztec punt which was recovered by J.P. Bomar. Following a two-point conversion, UNC led 20-7.

The Aztecs got a 32-yard second quarter field goal and a 38-yard fourth quarter field goal from Nate Tandberg to pull within 20-12.

Following a North Carolina turnover, the Aztecs drove to the North Carolina 11-yard line, after an 11-yard completion from Brian Russell to Damon Gourdine. After an incompletion, Russell's pass was deflected and picked off with 59 seconds remaining. That marked the only SDSU turnover of the contest.

- Both SDSU head coach Rocky Long and UNC associate head coach Vic Koenning were previously the defensive coordinator at Wyoming. Long was there from 1981-85 and Koenning was there for the 2000-02 seasons.
- SDSU offensive coordinator Bob Toledo was the head coach at Tulane from 2007-11 and UNC co-defensive coordinator/linebackers coach Ron West was the offensive line coach at Tulane from 1997-98.
- SDSU defensive back Christian Cumberlander is a native of West Point, Ga., while 12 UNC players reside from the state of Georaia.
- UNC linebacker Jeff Schoettmer hails from Dallas Texas, and San Diego State wide receiver Kameron Kelly is from the Dallas suburb of Murphy, Texas.
- SDSU fullback Sal Jeppi is from Baltimore, Md., while UNC offensive lineman Jared Cohen is from the nearby suburb of Owings Mills, Md.

Two Teams, Many Similarities

As previously mentioned, San Diego State and North Carolina have had some similarities in how their seasons have come together since the beginning of last season. Below is a closer look at the difficult start to the 2013 campaign and the turnaround that auickly followed.

In addition, both San Diego State and North Carolina have been extremely opportunistic of late. San Diego State has scored four non-offensive touchdowns in its last four games, including three punt returns for scores during that time frame. SDSU is second in non-offensive scores and first in punt return touchdowns in that time frame. Trending with the Aztecs is North Carolina, which has five non-offensive touchdowns (to rank first nationally) and two punt returns for scores (to rank second) since late last season. Welcome to the ETZ

- This marks just the 13th visit by an Aztec football team to the Eastern time zone in the Division I Era (since 1969). The Aztecs are 2-10 out East, with the lone victories coming at Kent State on Sept. 30, 1972 (14-10) and at Army on Sept. 10, 2011 (23-20).
- When the Aztecs won at Army in 2011, it marked the first win for the program in the Eastern time zone since 1972. On the day of that victory, 14,224 days had passed since SDSU's last victory in the time zone. The No. 1 song in the country that day (Sept. 30, 1972) was "Baby Don't Get Hooked On Me" by Mac Davis and the No. 1 album was Chicago V. Later in the month, 14-year-old Michael Jackson had his first No. 1 single, "Ben".
- San Diego State's last game in the time zone came last season ago when the Aztecs dropped a 42-7 decision at No. 3/2 Ohio State.

Playing The Elite

- San Diego State owns an 8-64 all-time record against teams ranked in either of the major polls at game time, including a 7-61 mark against teams in the AP Top 25 at game time.
- From Sept. 13, 1997 through Sept. 18, 2010, the Aztecs dropped 26 straight games to nationally-ranked opponents (25 if you include the Associated Press poll exclusively). Recently, that trend has improved with the Aztecs going 2-6 in their last eight games against top 25 teams. Both of those victories have come with Rocky Long on the sidelines.
- The Aztecs won their most recent contest against a nationally-ranked team, winning at No. 19/14 Boise State, 21-19, on Nov. 3, 2012. That is the highest ranked opponent San Diego State has ever defeated on the road.
- The highest ranked team SDSU has ever defeated was No. 12 (AP) Iowa State on Oct. 10, 1981. The Aztecs defeated the Cyclones, 52-31, that day in San Diego.

2014 Long Era

Looking Back 2013 Season Highlights

- San Diego State capped an 8-win campaign with a 49-24 victory over Buffalo in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl.
- San Diego State finished with a 6-2 conference record and sole possession of second place in the West Division of the Mountain

 West
- The Aztecs played eight games that were decided by seven points or less. That figure tied with UCF and Georgia for the most games in the FBS in 2013. SDSU is an impressive 6-2 in those contests and has won its last four contests decided by seven points or less.
- San Diego State tied an FBS record by playing in four overtime games in a single season. The Aztecs posted a 3-1 record in those contests.
- SDSU rallied from a fourth quarter deficit to win five times last season. That was the highest total in FBS in 2013, one ahead of Auburn, Troy and UCF.
- San Diego State rallied from a 14-point or greater deficit to win three games this season. That is the highest total in FBS play this season, one ahead of Duke, Northern Illinois, SMU and UNLY.
- The Aztecs have won thier last eight games played in the Mountain time zone. That is the longest active win streak in the time zone.
- SDSU won four road games in 2013 to tie for the eighth-highest win total in the country.
- San Diego State became the first team since 2010 and just the 19th team since 1980 to overcome an 0-3 start to reach a bowl game. The Aztecs became just the sixth team in the last 33 seasons, to win a bowl game after opening a campaign 0-3.

Rocky Long

- Rocky Long is in his fourth season as San Diego State's head coach, his sixth season with the Aztecs and his 14th season as a head coach.
- Long, a two-time Mountain West Coach of the Year, is the all-time winningest coach in league history. He owns 88 career Mountain West wins, 11 more than TCU's Gary Patterson in second place. Amazingly, Long's 88 career wins are 38 more than the next active coach, Air Force's Troy Calhoun (50).
- Long has guided San Diego State to three bowl games in his first three seasons. His three bowl appearances while leading SDSU
 is tied with Don Coryell for the most in school history.
- Long is one of 20 coaches in the country to guide his current team to a bowl game in each of his first three seasons.
- Long's 26 wins in through his first game of his fourth seasons as the head coach at SDSU are tied for the most in school history.

After a remarkable freshman campaign, sophomore Donnel Pumphrey picked up where he left off in the 2013 season opener. Against Northern Arizona, Pumphrey tied a career-high with 19 carries and recorded his fourth 100-yard rushing game of his career with 111 yards, while adding two touchdowns.

That gives the Doak Walker Award candidate 863 yards for his career, a 6.0 yard per carry average and 10 rushing touchdowns.

A native of Las Vegas, Pumphrey rushed for 752 yards and compiled 234 yards receiving as a freshman in 2013. He found the end zone 10 times (eight rushing, two receiving) and averaged more than six yards a rush. He compiled three 100-yard rushing efforts and saw action in all 13 games for the Aztecs.

He is one of just 12 players in San Diego State history to record three consecutive 100-yard rushing games, joining Jim Allison, Marshall Faulk, Michael Franklin, George Jones, Ronnie Hillman, Jonas Lewis, Adam Muema, Larry Ned, Wayne Pittman, David Turner and T.C. Wright.

He is the first Aztec freshman with three consecutive 100-yard rushing games since Pro Football League Hall of Famer Marshall Faulk in 1991.

Pumphrey ranked among the top college true freshman running backs in the country last season.

- He was one of just two freshmen in the country (19 players overall) to rush for at least 750 yards and record 230 yards receiving. He is the only Aztec ever to accomplish that as a freshman.
- Pumphrey, who started just one game, ranked sixth among true freshmen nationally in rushing yards (752).

Ruffin Climbing Career Charts

After exploding on the season a year ago, Ezell Ruffin enters his senior campaign on the preseason Biletnikoff Award Watch List.

A native of Long Beach, Calif., Ruffin entered his junior season (in 2013) with 17 career receptions. Last season, he led the team with 68 catches for 1,136 yards and three touchdowns. He produced three consecutive 100-yard receiving games, and had four 100-yard games in 2013 and five career games in which he has hit the century plateau.

His play down the stretch last season made noise nationally and he a had a strong debut last week, catching four passes for a team-high 53 yards. All four of his catches resulted in a San Diego State first down.

Ruffin has been on quite a run since the middle of last season.

- In the last eight games, Ruffin has 42 receptions for 712 yards and two touchdowns. Since Oct. 26, 2013, Ruffin is 29th in the nation in receiving yards per game (89.0) and is 15th in receptions (42).
- In the last nine games, Ruffin has 48 catches for 820 yards and three touchdowns. Since Oct. 10, 2013, Ruffin is 26th in the nation in yards per game (91.1) and 23rd in receptions (48).
- In his last 11 games, Ruffin has 60 receptions for 991 yards. Since Sept. 28, Ruffin is 23rd in the nation in receiving yards per game (90.1) and 19th in receptions (60).
- His 68 catches in 2013 are 45 more than all of his 2012 season.
- Ruffin has at least a catch in his last 15 games and has multiple receptions in 14 straight games since the start of the 2013
- In his career, Ruffin has 89 catches for 1,508 yards. Ruffin cleared the 1,000-yard plateau in receiving yardage on the first offensive play from scrimmage against New Mexico (Nov. 2, 2013), when he caught a 75-yard touchdown pass. Ruffin's complete bio can be found on pages 42-43 of the notes.

Quinn Kaehler Enters Second Season As Starting QB

A year ago at this time, Quinn Kaehler had worked his way to second on the depth chart, the walk on firmnly behind a returning starter at the quartreback position. But the Pleasant Hill, Calif. native entered the Ohio State game (the second of the 2013 season) on the fourth series and started the final 11 contests of the

Kaehler shook off the rust from off-season surgery to complete 18-of-29 passes (62.1 percent), for 205 yards and a touchdown. His quarterback rating was 125.93

He extended his streak of consecutive games with at least 200 yards passing to 13, the third longestactive streak in the nation, behind Marshall's Rakeem Cato (29) and Oregon State's Sean Mannion (14).

He ended his junior campaign Kaehler is 232-of-389 (59.6 percent), for 3,007 yards with 19 touchdowns and nine interceptions. His quarterback rating was a very respectable 136.06.

Among the national leaders in 2013, Kaehler ranked 29th in passing yards per game (250.6), 32nd in pass completions per game (19.33), 36th in passing yards per completion (12.96), 46th in total offense per game (241.5) and 49th in passing touchdowns (19).

Notes on Kaehler's season:

- He became the ninth Aztec to throw for 3,000 yards in a season and the first since Ryan Lindley in 2011, despite not starting the first two games.
- His 59.6 percent completion rate was the second highest for an Aztec starter since Kevin O'Connell completed 62.1 percent of his passes in 2005.
- He has thrown for more than 200 yards in 13 straight games, the longest streak for an Aztec player in more than 18 seasons and the third-longest active streak
- He is 9-3 as a starter in his career. That is a 75.0 winning percentage and he is 5-1 as a starter away from home.
- Kaehler completed more than 60 percent of his passes in seven of the 13 games he played and has just seven interceptions in his last 352 pass attempts. In three of those attempts, the ball hit the receiver first.
 - Below is a look at some more impressive numbers from his first career start against Oregon State.
- 30 points for the team were the most in a San Diego State quarterback debut since Sept. 5, 1997, when Kevin McKechnie led SDSU to a 45-31 win over Navy.
- 16 completions were the most in a San Diego State quarterback debut since Oct. 11, 2008, when Drew Westling completed 18

A Remarkable Season

In a number of different ways, the 2013 San Diego State team put together one of the most remarkable seasons not only in school history, but in the nation. From losing its first three games of the season, to rallying from fourth quarter deficits a national-best five times to win games to playing in an FBS record four overtime games, the 2013 San Diego State football team will go down as one of the most remarkable squads in the program history.

Here are a few of the many amazing things the group accomplished.

STARTING 0-3

Starting with three consecutive losses, which has typically been fatal for teams looking to advance to postseason play. Of the 488 teams that opened play 0-3 since 1980, only 19 advanced to bowl play (including 2013 SDSU) and only 31 have posted a winning record (including 2013 SDSU). Below are a few more tidbits.

• Of those 488 teams, only 19 (including 2013 San Diego State) have won at least seven games, only seven have won eight contests and no team since 1980 that opened 0-3 went onto win at least nine games. Below is the most wins by a team that opened 0-3 during the past 34 seasons:

FOUR OVERTIME GAMES

San Diego State played in overtime games in two of its last four, three times in its last seven games, four in its last nine and five of its last 19 games.

Among the notables concerning the extra frame:

- San Diego State tied the FBS record for most overtime games in a season (4). The Aztecs share the record with 2004 Northwestern, 2008 Buffalo and 2012 Louisiana-Monroe. Oddly, all four teams, including the 2013 San Diego State team, have posted a 3-1 overtime record in the four extra session games.
- 2013 marked the second time in school history that the Aztecs have played in consecutive overtime games. During the 1998 campaign, San Diego State played back-to-back overtime contests with wins at New Mexico (36-33) on Oct. 17 and against Utah (21-20) on Oct. 24.
- SDSU has played in five overtime games over its last 19 after playing in four over its previous 183 contests.

SEVEN POINTS OR LESS

In 2013, the Aztecs played in seven consecutive games decided by seven points or less. That is the longest such stretch by any team in the country this season. SDSU was a remarkable 6-1 in those games during this stretch. That winning percentage of 85.7 percent ties the 2006 Maryland team for the best winning percentage during a streak of at least seven straight games decided by seven points or less since 1980.

COMEBACKS

This season, San Diego State has proven that no deficit is too large to overcome. Five times the Aztecs have used a fourth-quarter rally to win a game and three times SDSU has overcome at least a 14-point deficit to claim victory.

How common is that? Glad you asked.

- San Diego State led the country with five fourth quarter comebacks in 2013. In fact, only Auburn, Troy and UCF had as many as four comebacks in the final quarter.
- The Aztecs led the country by overcoming a deficit of at least 14 points in three of its 2013 wins. Only Duke, Northern Illinois, SMU and UNLY rallied from a two touchdown deficit twice last season.
- SDSU posted a fourth-quarter rally to win each of its past three regular-season victories: at San José State (trailed by 11, won 34-30), at Hawai'i (trailed by seven, won 28-21 in overtime), Boise State (trailed by seven, won 34-31).
- Following the San José State game when San Diego State rallied from an 11-point deficit in the fourth quarter to win, the Aztecs
 improved to 5-174-2 (.033) when trailing by 11 or more in the fourth quarter.
- Since Oct. 20, 2012, SDSU has rallied from a double-digit fourth quarter deficit to win three times (the two times above and at Nevada last season). Since that date, in all of FBS, there have only been 28 occurrences of a team rallying from 11 points or more in the fourth quarter to win (as of Nov. 9). San Diego State leads the nation with three such comebacks, while Arizona State and Nebraska each have two.

At Home In The Mountains

San Diego State has won nine straight games in the Mountain time zone, which is the longest active streak in the nation. The Aztecs' current win streak started during the 2010 campaign with victories at New Mexico and Wyoming, continued in 2011 with wins at Air Force and Colorado State, was extended in 2012 with wins at No. 19/14 Boise State and Wyoming and is active following victories at New Mexico State, Air Force and vs. Buffalo in 2013.

SDSU Names Team Captains for 2014 Season

San Diego State head football coach Rocky Long has announced that seniors Sam Meredith, Terry Poole, Ezell Ruffin and J.J. Whittaker have been named captains for the upcoming 2014 season. The quartet was selected in a vote by their teammates on Aua. 22.

Meredith, a defensive end from La Mesa, Calif., had 16 tackles, two tackles for loss, two fumble recoveries, a sack, a pass breakup and a blocked kick last year, while batting injuries throughout the season. Meredith, who started six times and played in eight of the team's 13 games, was an honorable-mention all-Mountain West pick and the team's defensive player of the year in 2012 as a true sophomore. Over his career, Meredith has 56 tackles, 8.5 TFL, three fumble recoveries, two sacks and two PBUs across 33 games and 19 starts. He is a preseason second-team selection by *Athlon Sport*s.

Poole, an offensive tackle from Monterey, Calif., started all 12 games he appeared in last year as a junior, his first as an Aztec. He became one of just two SDSU players to be named to both the 2013 all-Mountain West team (honorable mention) and to the MW Fall All-Academic Team. Poole, who will move to left tackle after playing right tackle last year, allowed just two sacks in 492 dropbacks (0.4 percent) in 2013. He has already racked up the preseason accolades, including first-team recognition from Sporting News, and second-team honors from Athlon Sports, Lindy's Sports and Phil Steele's College Football Preview magazine.

Ruffin, a wide receiver from Long Beach, Calif., led San Diego State last year with 68 catches and 1,136 yards to go along with three touchdowns. The 1,136 yards were the most by an Aztec non-senior in the history of the MW (since 1999) and are the 10th most among in the nation among the returning FBS players. Ruffin went onto be named a MW honorable-mention selection and the team's co-offensive player of the year. Ruffin, who has 85 career receptions, 1,455 yards and three touchdowns, is on the 2014 Biletnikoff Award Watch List (top collegiate wide receiver), and has been named a preseason all-MW second-team pick by Lindy's Sports and Phil Steele, and a third-team honoree by Athlon Sports.

Whittaker, a cornerback from Oceanside, Calif., racked up 32 tackles (24 solos), 11 pass breakups, three interceptions, a forced

fumble and two tackles for loss in his first 13 career starts and appearances. An honorable-mention all-MW selection, he ranked fifth in the league with 1.08 passes defended (PBUs + INTs) per game (14 total). Whittaker was named the MW Defensive Player of the Week on Nov. 25, 2013 after recording two interceptions against Boise State on Nov. 23, including one for a touchdown. He also had five PBUs against Nevada on Oct. 4, which was tied for the second most in a game in the country last year and the second most in a game in program history. Whittaker, who is on the Jim Thorpe Award Watch List (best defensive back), has been named a preseason all-conference selection by the MW media, and is a first-team pick by Athlon Sports, Lindy's Sports, Phil Steele and Sporting News.

Offense Rolls in SDSU Fan Fest Scrimmage

The San Diego State offense erupted for 17 points in the first quarter, helping the Black squad cruise to a 34-0 victory over the Red team (defense) in the Aztecs' annual Fan Fest scrimmage Saturday at Qualcomm Stadium.

Quarterbacks Quinn Kaehler and Nick Bawden combined for 314 yards on 24-of-38 passing with three touchdowns and no interceptions, while receivers Paul Pitts III, Jemond Hazely and Lloyd Mills posted a collective 11 receptions for 136 yards and two scores on the day.

After the Red team forced consecutive three-and-outs, the Black squad needed just three plays to drive 75 yards as Kaehler found Eric Judge on a 32-yard touchdown strike with 4:27 elapsed in the first quarter. The pass was set up by two running plays; Lucky Radley's 9-yard scamper and a 34-yard burst up the middle by Dakota Gordon.

Bawden directed the next series, completing 5-of-6 passes to move the offense into scoring position. The true freshman signal-caller found tight end David Wells on consecutive plays for 14 and 19 yards, respectively, before hooking up with running back Paul Sierra on an 18-yard screen. Two short completions to Pitts and Hazely left the Black squad seven yards short of pay dirt. However, Seamus McMorrow salvaged the drive with a 24-yard field goal.

The offense wasted little time on Kaehler's next possession as the SDSU senior found receiver Lloyd Mills wide open on a 40-yard touchdown pass following a 4-yard run by Chase Price and a 21-yard completion to senior Ezell Ruffin. The drive netted 65 yards and consumed just 1:22 on the clock.

Early in the second quarter, Bawden marched the offense 65 yards in 2:26 on six plays, punctuated by a 30-yard toss to Hazely, who made a juggling catch off a deflection in the back of the end zone. Bawden kept the drive alive with a 26-yard completion to receiver Garrett Kale, while tight end Daniel Brunskill added a 9-yard catch.

The Black squad tacked on 10 points in the third quarter as junior transfer Donald Hageman drilled a 51-yard field goal, while William Walker scored on 1-yard touchdown plunge to cap a 10-play, 57-yard drive led by quarterback Christian Chapman.

Kaehler finished the day completing 10-of-18 passes for 159 yards and two touchdowns, while Bawden was 14-for-20 and one score. Pitts caught five passes for 43 yards to lead the receiving corps, while Hazely totaled four receptions for 47 yards.

Conversely, the Red team compiled eight sacks on the day, including two by Jay Henderson, while Calvin Munson and Fred Melifonwu each had two tackles for loss. The defensive effort also featured an interception by Fred Trevillion, who picked off Drew Anderson on the last play of the afternoon.

Aztecs Picked Second in Mountain West Division

The San Diego State football team has been picked to finish second in the West Division of the Mountain West in the 2014 preseason poll, the league announced Tuesday in Las Vegas. The poll is voted on by media representatives who cover the conference.

The second-place prediction matches the Aztecs' highest in the 16-year history of the league (also in 2013), although this is the second year of the two divisions in the MW. SDSU was picked to finish third in 1999 and 2004, and averaged a predicted finish of 6.5 from 2005-12.

San Diego State matched its prediction last year, taking second in the West with a 6-2 MW mark. In 2012, the Aztecs were picked fifth, but went onto finish in a three-way tie for first with Boise State and Fresno State en route to its 19th conference championship. SDSU has ended up at or better than its projected finish in five straight seasons and eight times over the past nine years.

San Diego State garnered 172 points, just two shy of two-time defending champion Fresno State's 174. Both the Aztecs and the Bulldogs picked up 15 first-place votes apiece, while Nevada had the other three and had 130 points for third in the West Division. UNLV (95), San José State (87) and Hawai'i (35) rounded out the West.

SDSU received 15 first-place votes after earning just seven total over the previous 15 preseason polls. The only other time San Diego State received multiple first-place votes in the poll was in the MW inaugural season of 1999 when it had four first-place votes. The Aztecs had one first-place vote apiece in 2001, 2012 and 2013.

Boise State paced the Mountain Division with 183 points, including 20 first-place votes. Utah State came in second with 176 and 12 first-place votes and Colorado State was third with 135 and the other first-place vote. Wyoming (90), New Mexico (56) and Air Force (53) were picked fourth, fifth and sixth, respectively, in the Mountain Division.

SDSU is the only school to play road games against the predicted winners of each division (Boise State and Fresno State). Additionally, San Diego State plays at Nevada, the team picked right behind the Aztecs in the preseason poll.

Aztecs Rising

Over the past several seasons, San Diego State has established itself as one of the premier athletic programs in the country.

- Since 2010, SDSU has had nine different programs finish an NCAA championship in the top 25 Men's Basketball, Women's Basketball, Men's Golf, Women's Soccer, Softball, Women's Indoor and Outdoor Track and Field (three times).
- Since 2010, SDSU has had six teams finish in the top 10 at the NCAA championship Men's Basketball (twice), Women's Basketball, Men's Golf, Women's Soccer, Women's Outdoor Track and Field.
- In each of the last three years, SDSU has enjoyed its best point-total in the Learfield Sports Director's Cup, including the 2013-14 season
- In 2013, SDSU's average home football attendance increased by 2,300 fans. It marked the third time in the last four years that SDSU's increase in average home attendance ranked among the national leaders (6th in 2010, 9th in 2011, 30th in 2013).
- SDSU is one of 11 schools nationally to play in the last five NCAA men's basketball tournaments. No other California or Mountain West school can make that claim.
- Over the last seasons, a total of 13 SDSU coaches have received conference coach of the year honors.
- SDSU set a school record with a department average of 980 in the Academic Progress Report (APR) released in May 2014 by the NCAA. Among those programs that scored record multi-year APR figures were football, men's basketball and baseball.

2014-15 Update

- Cross Country The Aztecs opened with a third-place finish at the Mark Covert Classic in Brea, Calif., on Aug. 30. Elaine Ribeiro (sixth), Grace Hanshaw (ninth) and Lily Seynaeve (10th) all finished among the top 10. SDSU plays host to the 70th annual Aztec Invitational at a new venue, Tecolote Shores on Mission Bay, Sept. 20.
- Women's Soccer (2-1-1; 0-0 Mountain West) The Aztecs, who are defending Mountain West regular-season and postseason champions, enter the 2014 season with a No. 24 national ranking and were once again picked to capture the league crown in the MW preseason coaches poll. SDSU lost to Michigan State, 3-1, in its season opener on Aug. 22, before shutting out UC Davis, 2-0, two days later. Last weekend, San Diego State tied UC Riverside, 1-1, and then shut out No. 10 Michigan, 3-0.
- Men's Soccer (1-1; 0-0 Pac-12) The Aztecs kick off the 2014 season with six straight home matches. San Diego State lost its opener, 1-0, to Cal State Bakersfield, but rebounded for a 1-0 win over Buffalo. SDSU, which was picked to finish fifth in the preseason Pac-12 coaches poll, boasts the nation's 37th-ranked recruiting class, according to College Soccer News.
- Volleyball (0-3; 0-0 Mountain West) The Aztecs, who opened their season Aug. 29 at the Chevron Rainbow Wahine Invitational in Honolulu, were picked fourth in the MW preseason poll. SDSU lost all three matches for the weekend in Honolulu. Also in the mix are five redshirts along with five freshmen who comprise what has been ranked as the nation's No. 25 recruiting class by PrepVolleyball.com.

Under the direction of fourth-year head coach Rocky Long, San Diego State has made a dramatic turnaround.

- SDSU is one of 29 schools nationally to appear in bowl games each of the last four seasons. San Diego State is one of only two California schools to appear in four consecutive bowl games (Stanford) and is one of only two current Mountain West schools to appear in bowl games in 2010, 2011, 2012 and 2013 (Boise State).
- With a bowl game in a school-record four straight years, the Aztecs have equaled their total number of bowls played in the previous 41 seasons from 1969-2009.
- Long's impact has been felt almost immediately, first as the defensive coordinator in 2009-10 and then as the head coach since 2011. SDSU went without a winning season for the 10 straight years from 2000-09 when it won 32.2 percent of its games and owned one of the nation's worst records. Below is a look at the dramatic turnaround.

- San Diego State owns a 35-18 record over the past four seasons. Prior to the 2010 campaign, it took the Aztecs 105 games to compile 35 wins. San Diego State was 35-70 in the 105 games from Sept. 22, 2001 to the conclusion of the 2009 campaign.
- The 34 victories from 2010-13 is the highest win-total over a four-year span since the Aztecs went 36-7-1 from 1974-77.

SDSU is 1 of 5 schools to play in 4 straight bowl games and earn an NCAA men's basketball berth in each of the last 5 years.

- Has the most all-time victories in the Mountain West with 88.
- Was named the Mountain West Coach of the Year in 2002 and again in 2012.
- Has 13-plus years of head coaching experience and has spent 16-plus seasons as a defensive coordinator.

AT SAN DIEGO STATE:

- Became San Diego State's 18th head football coach on Jan. 12, 2011.
- Was the defensive coordinator at SDSU from 2009-10.
- In 2012, led the Aztecs to a share of the Mountain West title at 7-1. It was San Diego State's 19th conference title, first Mountain West championship and first league title since 1998. The Aztecs were picked fifth in the preseason poll.
- In his first year in 2009, helped SDSU improve defensive marks in points allowed, first downs, first downs, rushing, total defense, third-down conversion percentage, fourth-down conversion percentage, sacks, interceptions and red-zone conversion percentage, among other categories.

AT NEW MEXICO

- Compiled a school-record 65 victories and led the Lobos to five bowl game appearances in his final seven seasons. His teams were bowl eligible in seven of his last eight campaigns.
- In his final nine seasons in Albuquerque, Long's defensive units ranked among the top 30 in fewest yards allowed six times and among the top 40 against the rush every year. In both 2001 and 2003, New Mexico's defense ranked fifth nationally in fewest rushing yards allowed per game.
- While at New Mexico, he coached 13 players selected in the NFL Draft, 10 players who earned All-America honors and had a MWC-high 34 first-team all-conference selections since 2003.

OTHER COACHING EXPERIENCE

- Prior to accepting the head coaching position at New Mexico, Long served as defensive coordinator for 12 seasons at three different schools. He was the defensive coordinator for two years under Bob Toledo at UCLA in 1996-97, for five seasons at Oregon State from 1991-95, and for five campaigns at Wyoming from 1981-85.
- Also served as an assistant coach at TCÚ, with the CFL's British Columbia team and started his career at New Mexico has a graduate assistant coach in 1972.

PLAYING EXPERIENCE:

- Originally a defensive back, Long became a three-year starter at quarterback for the Lobos from 1969-71. He earned team most valuable player honors and was the Western Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year as a senior.
- Long played professionally in the CFL with British Columbia in 1972-73 and 1975-76. He also competed in the World Football League with the Detroit Wheels in 1974.
- Attended Alta Loma High School in Alta Loma, Calif.

PERSONAL:

Both of Long's daughters are head coaches at the university level. Roxanne was hired in July of 2012 as the head women's basketball coach at Rogers State University (NAIA) in Claremore, Okla., after four years in the same position at Texas Lutheran (NCAA Division III). Hannah, meanwhile, is the head volleyball coach at Southwestern University, an NCAA Division III school in Georgetown, Texas. She is a four-time conference coach of the year, having compiled a 306-79 (.795) record in 10 years, including a pair of regional finals appearances in 2008 and 2009.

vs. Northern Arizona

SAN DIEGO - Donnel Pumphrey ran for 111 yards and two touchdowns in San Diego State's 38-7 victory over Northern Arizona in its 2014 opener Saturday night at Qualcomm Stadium.

Quinn Kaehler passed for 205 yards and a touchdown, completing 18 of 29 attempts, for the Aztecs, who

scored the first 24 points of the game.

After punting on its opening drive, SDSU forced the Lumberjacks into a 3-and-out and got the ball back with 11:58 left in the first. Pumphrey completed San Diego State's 9-play, 63-yard drive with a 1-yard touchdown run to but the home team on the board.

After NAU punted again on its next possession, the Aztecs mounted a 7-play, 88-yard drive to go up, 14-0. The drive was highlighted by four straight first down plays - a 14-yard pass from Kaehler to Eric Judge, a 15-yard strike from Kaehler to Ezell Ruffin, a 33-yard reverse handoff to Lloyd Mills and a 21-yard scamper by Chase Price. Price finished off the drive with a 1-yard touchdown run on 3rd and goal.

Northern Arizona tried to answer after getting all the way to the SDSU 30, thanks to a 50-yard catch and

run by Alex Holmes from Kyren Poe on a 2nd and 15. San Diego State stood tall, however, and forced the Lumberjacks into a 45-yard field goal attempt. On the try, Alex Barrett reached up and swatted the kick down to keep NAU off the scoreboard.

On the ensuing possession, the Aztecs got into field goal range of their own, thanks in part to a Northern Arizona pass interference call and a 33-yard run by Pumphrey. Donny Hageman than split the upright from 48 yards to put SDSU up, 17-0. It was the first field goal make by San Diego State since Sept. 28, 2013 vs.

Hageman later looked to make it four straight scores for the Aztecs, but his 46-yard attempt went wide left, giving the ball back to the Lumberjacks.

After being forced to punt once again, NAU's fourth out of its five possessions (the other was the blocked field goal), SDSU got the ball back with 1:42 left in the second quarter. Kaehler was perfect on the ensuing drive, completing all five of his passes for 75 yards, ending with a 2-yard toss to a wide open Robert Craighead and giving San Diego State a 24-0 advantage at the half.

Northern Arizona finally got on the scoreboard with 6:36 left in the third quarter as Jahn rumbled in from 1-yard out, capping a 9-play, 74-yard drive.

The Lumberjacks appeared to gain the momentum after the touchdown after they forced the Aztecs into a 3-and-out, and getting all the way to the SDSU 38. Kyren Poe's pass on a 3rd and 5, however, was picked off by Calvin Munson and returned 64 yards to the NAU 1.

Pumphrey didn't waste any time as he scored on the very first play, putting San Diego State back up by 24 at 31-7.

Northern Arizona got the ball back, but was forced into its third 3-and-out of the game. The Aztecs' Lloyd Mills then took the punt 67 yards to seal the win for the home team. It was SDSU's third punt return for a touchdown in four games.

San Diego State improved to 47-40-5 all-time in season-opening games, including a 19-6-1 mark in its Division I era (since 1969) when the opener is at home.

The 31-point margin of victory was the Aztecs' largest since beating Hawai'i by 38 (52-14) on Oct. 6, 2012.

Kaehler extended his streak of 200-yard passing games to 13, the longest streak by a SDSU quarterback

Price added 45 yards on the ground and also caught two balls for 22 yards, while Judge (5 receptions, 51

yards) and Ruffin (4 receptions, 53 yards) combined for nine catches and 104 yards.

Malik Smith led the San Diego State defense with seven tackles and three pass breakups in his first career start, while Trey Lomax and J.J. Whittaker contributed six stops apiece.

The seven points allowed were the fewest against the Aztecs since a 42-7 win over Army on Sept. 8, 2012.
