San Diego State Aztecs (2-3, 0-0 MWC) vs. Cal State Fullerton Titans (1-5, 0-0 Big West)

► **When & Where:** Sat., Dec. 18, Cox Arena (12,414), San Diego, Calif., 2 p.m. (PST).

► **The Records:** SDSU looks to get back in the win column as it continues its three-game home swing with a Saturday afternoon contest with Cal State Fullerton. The Aztecs are facing their fourth opponent which also appeared on last year's schedule, doing so in back-to-back outings after falling to Washington State last Saturday, 55-50.
Cal State Fullerton has been out of action since Dec. 3, and owns a 1-5 overall record so far in 2004-05. The Titans have played one common opponent with the Aztecs, as both schools fell to Nevada earlier this season.
► **SDSU Head Coach Jim Tomey:** Tomey (Michigan '81) is in his third season at San Diego State after taking over the Aztec helm on April 9, 2002. His career and Aztec head coaching record is 19-41.
► **Cal State Fullerton Head Coach Dr. Maryalyce Jeremiah:** Jeremiah is in her second stint as head coach of the Titans, putting together a record of 122-118 in nine seasons. Her career record is 385-263 in 25 years.
► **Series History:** Series is tied 17-17 (Last: San Diego State def. Cal State Fullerton, 73-50, on Dec. 1, 2003, in Fullerton, Calif.)

SDSU Women's Hoops Begins Busy Holiday Season Saturday Against Cal State Fullerton

The San Diego State women's basketball team hopes to get back in the win column Saturday, as the Aztecs play host to Cal State Fullerton at 2 p.m. at Cox Arena for the second contest of a three-game homestand. SDSU, which took final exams this past week, begins a busy pre-holiday slate with three games in the next five days, including a home meeting with UC Riverside (Dec. 20) and a road contest at Southern Methodist (Dec. 22).

SDSU, which fell in a close battle to Washington State on Saturday, looks for its fifth straight win over Cal State Fullerton, a team that is 1-5 this year and has been out of action since a 68-56 loss to Northern Arizona on Dec. 3.

Short-Handed Aztecs Edged By Washington State, 55-50

With three players out due to injury, a short-handed San Diego State women's basketball team battled for 40 minutes against visiting Washington State, but came up short, falling to the Cougars, 55-50, Saturday at Peterson Gym. With the loss, the Aztecs dropped its first home

game of the season to fall to 2-3 overall, while the Cougars improved to 4-3 in 2004-05.

SDSU freshman **Ashley Cheesman (Orem, Utah)** led all scorers with her first career double-double, tallying a career-high 15 points and 11 rebounds in 36 minutes. Freshman **Kate Eveland (Southlake, Texas)** added nine points and four rebounds, while senior **Lindsey Casey (Odessa, Texas)** finished with a career-high five assists and four steals.

The game proved to be a see-saw battle, as the score was tied six times and the lead changed hands on 10 occasions.

In the first half, Washington State scored first and held the advantage most of the way, until SDSU bounced back from a four-point deficit at 18-14, with a 12-0 run, capped by a three-point play by Cheesman with 1:25 left in the half. The Cougars responded with a 5-0 run of their own, as the Aztecs went into the locker room up by just three at 26-23.

The second half was even closer, as no team led by more than three points until the 2:26 mark, when WSU's Kate Benz made a lay-up to give the Cougars a four-point advantage at 51-47. A lay-up by Aztec **Jessica Huettl (Eau Claire, Wis.)** cut the deficit in half, but Huettl was unable to convert the three-point play, missing the free throw to leave the score at 51-49.

Casey had a chance equalize the game the next trip down the court, but only hit the second of her two free throws as SDSU trailed by just one point, 51-50, with 1:44 left in the contest.

Washington State would then ice the game with a lay-up and two free throws in the final 32 seconds to come out with the 55-50 victory, avenging a 63-56 loss to the Aztecs a year ago in Pullman, Wash.

Other Washington State Notes:

Redshirt freshman **Jordie Smith (Ft. Collins, Colo.)** recorded her first career stats with a point and three rebounds in five minutes ... for the first time this season, the Aztecs did not attempt 20 or more three-pointers in a game ... SDSU only had one player record double-figures in scoring, after having two in each of the team's previous four contests ... Veronica Shaw became the first Aztec or SDSU opponent to foul out of a game this year.

A Battle Finally Won

The Aztecs won the battle on the boards Saturday for the first time this season, grabbing 41 rebounds to the Cougars' 35. SDSU rebounding margin was a combined -4.8 entering the game, while Washington State had a positive margin of 0.6. A year ago, the Aztecs outrebounded their opponent 10 times after doing so only five times in 27 outings in 2002-03.

SDSU has been steady on the offensive glass this season, reaching double-figures in each of the five contests, including 19 versus the Cougars. Last season, the Aztecs had 10 or more offensive rebounds in a game 12 times with only one of those coming in their final 10 outings.

Cheesman Steps It Up

With three of SDSU's seven returning letterwinners out due to injury, freshman Ashley Cheesman has already begun to step up her game. The highly-touted recruit logged her first career double-double against Washington State, finishing with 15 points, including 13 in the first half, and 11 rebounds. The double-double is the Aztecs' first in a span of 14 games since Ashlee Dunlap had 23 points and 12 rebounds in a win over Air Force on Jan. 31, 2004

Cheesman has led or been tied for the lead in rebounding in all five of the team's games in 2004-05. She also is a perfect 8-for-8 at the foul line.

Depth Is The Key

Seven different Aztecs have been able to reach double-figures in points in at least one game this season. Sophomore Jessica Huettl and junior **Michelle Strawberry (Corona, Calif.)** became the most recent additions with their performances at Nevada. **Michelle Elliott (Pasco, Wash.)**, **Courtney Fritz (Newberg, Ore.)** and Ashley Cheesman have all turned the trick twice,

while Lindsey Casey and Kate Eveland have done so on one occasion.

To further accentuate the SDSU's depth in 2004-05, four different players have led the team in scoring in each of the last four outings. The Aztecs have also had five different players finish with a team game-high in assists.

A Rain Of Threes

While San Diego State attempted just 17 threes versus Washington State, the Aztecs have already exceeded the century mark in that category for the season with 107 in five games or 21.4 per outing.

At this rate, the Aztecs are on pace to attempt 599 in 2004-05, which would easily break the school record of 418 for the second straight year.

More On The Three

Nine different players have attempted threes this year with seven converting on at least one opportunity ... sophomore Courtney Fritz finished the year with 69 threes in 32 career games, ranking fourth in Aztec history ... Sophomore Michelle Elliott is 10th in Aztec history with 40 career threes.

Lindsey Casey is second in blocks per game (1.60) and third in field-goal percentage (.545) ... Ashley Cheesman is third in offensive rebounds (3.40/g).

Notes With A 'W'

An SDSU victory over Cal State Fullerton will mean:

- ▶SDSU is 3-3 to start a year for second consecutive season and the fourth time in the last five years.
- ▶SDSU has won three home games, just one shy of the team's win total at home all of last season when the Aztecs went 4-10.
- ▶The Aztecs earn their first win of the season over a school which they also faced a year ago.
- ▶SDSU has won five straight against CS Fullerton, taking a 18-17 lead in the all-time series.

Cal State Fullerton Tid-Bits

Cal State Fullerton is 1-5 overall with its lone win coming against East Carolina (65-57) ... the Titans lost earlier in the year to Nevada, LMU (twice), Pepperdine and Northern Arizona ... CSUF has been out of action for over two weeks, with its last game coming on Dec. 3 ... Amber Pruitt is the Titans' leading scorer and rebounder with 13.8 points and 6.3 rebounds per game ... Charlee Underwood (9.0 ppg., 6.0 rpg.) and Audrey Talor (7.0 ppg., 22 assists) have started all six contests ... SDSU has won the last four meetings between the two squads by an average margin of 32.5 points.

Then SDSU freshman Courtney Fritz made all
five of her first-half shots, including four, three-
pointers, to finish with a career high 21 points and
become the third different Aztec to break the 20-
point barrier in a game. Fritz's classmate Michelle
Elliott logged her third straight game in double-fig-
ure scoring with 17 points, while Jessica Huettl
added 10 points.

The Aztecs opened the game by hitting their first
four shots, taking a 10-0 lead on a pair of three-
pointers by Fritz and Elliott and field goals by Elliott
and junior Candace Mattson. Cal State Fullerton
would finally get on the board with a three-pointer
by coming out of a timeout, but the SDSU defense
continued to stonewall of the Titans, going on a 15-
0 run to move ahead 25-3.

The Aztecs built a 30-point lead at 38-8, before
Cal State Fullerton finally broke into double-figures
at 38-10 with 4:16 remaining in the first half. SDSU
recorded just seven more points in the final min-
utes and headed into the locker room up, 45-17.

The Titans put up a bigger fight in the second
half, cutting the Aztec lead to as few as 17 points
at 52-35, before a Fritz three-pointer sparked a 10-
0 run to restore order at 62-35 with under 10 min-
utes remaining. SDSU would get its lead back to
29 points at 65-36 and 67-38, eventually winning,
73-50.

Cal State Fullerton was led by Amber Pruitt, who
had 17 points, 15 of which came in the sec-
ond half.

Fritz, Jackson To Miss Rest Of Season Due To Injury

San Diego State women's basketball players Courtney Fritz and Erin Jackson (Sparks, Nev.) will miss the remainder of the 2004-05 season due to injury, Aztec head coach Jim Tomey announced Friday, Dec. 10. In addition, sophomore guard/forward Michelle Elliott is expected to be out the next two to three weeks with an injury to her right knee.

Both in their sophomore campaigns, Fritz tore her anterior cruciate ligament in her right knee in the second half of the Aztecs' game at Nevada on Dec. 7, while Jackson will have ankle reconstruction surgery to repair a subluxing peroneal tendon in her left ankle, which she suffered during warm-ups prior to the team's contest versus Northern Colorado on Dec. 4.

Elliott is expected to miss the next two to three weeks with a contusion and a non-displaced lateral tibial plateau fracture in her right knee. A third team all-conference pick a year ago, she suffered the injury in the team's win over Cal State Stanislaus on Nov. 30.

With the injuries, SDSU is down to just nine eligible players on its 2004-05 roster. Of the nine, five are in their first seasons playing at the NCAA Division I level.

Other 2004-05 SDSU Highlights So Far

►The Aztecs' 80 points against Cal State Stanislaus are the team's most in 61 contests since scoring 83 in a win over Air Force on Feb. 21, 2002.

►SDSU had 16 steals in its victory over Cal State Stanislaus, the Aztecs most in a game since tallying 17 on two occasions during the 2002-03 season.

►SDSU trailed Cal State Stanislaus by 11 points, its biggest deficit in a victory since beating Air Force, 73-55, on Feb. 1, 2003. In that game, the Aztecs fell behind 14-2 to the Falcons at the 15:01 mark of the first half, but later went on to lead by as many as 23 points.

►SDSU went 13-for-15 from the free-throw line (86.7 percent) against Northern Colorado, the team's best performance since making 88.9 (8-for-9) percent from the stripe on Nov. 25, 2000, versus Tennessee-Chattanooga.

SDSU has been picked to finish seventh in the Mountain West Conference in a preseason poll released Oct. 24, at the league's basketball media day in Denver, Colo. The Aztecs have been picked seventh four times and selected sixth on two occasions since the

Aztecs Sign Three To National Letters Of Intent

San Diego State women's basketball head coach Jim Tomey announced the signings Nov. 15, of three high school seniors, including two San Diego-area natives, to national letters of intent. Guard **Lasandra Dixon (Azusa, Calif./Azusa HS)**, center **Audrey Green (San Marcos, Calif./San Marcos HS)** and point guard **Tamika Lipford (Oceanside, Calif./The Bishop's School)** will join the Aztecs in the fall of 2005.

"We tried really hard to improve our team speed, size and physical strength with this year's signees," said Tomey about his third recruiting class at SDSU. "Tamika and Lasandra are quick, explosive guards, who have the ability to push the basketball up the floor and defend 94 feet. Audrey brings a nice package of skills and is someone who we know down the road will be a real force for us in the middle."

Green and Lipford are the first players from the San Diego-area to sign with the Aztecs since Tomey took over as head coach in time for the 2002-03 campaign. The duo also will be the first local players on the SDSU roster since Sophia Sledge (Santee, Calif./Santana HS), who finished out her career in 2001-02.
