SAN DIEGO STATE AZTECS

2016-17 Record: 19-14 (9-9 Mountain West)

PRESEASON NOTES

- San Diego State begins the Brian Dutcher era in 2017-18, as the long-time associate head coach/head coach in waiting takes over for two-time national coach of the year Steve Fisher, who retired in April after 18 seasons at SDSU.
- Dutcher, who has been a part of every San Diego State victory over the last 18 seasons (386) and every win of Fisher's career (570), inherits a roster that features three returning starters in senior guard Trey Kell, junior guard Jeremy Hemsley and senior forward Malik Pope. Kell was an all-Mountain West third-team selection by the coaches and the media in 2016-17, and Hemsley picked up honorable mention accolades from the league's head coaches.
- Kell. Hemsley and Pope enter the new campaian with the top three scoring averages from a year gao. Kell averaged a team-best 13.2 points with Hemsley just a tick behind at 12.9 points an outing. Pope improved his scoring average from 7.3 points as a sophomore in 2015-16 to 11.0 points in '16-17. All three efforts were career bests for the trio.
- The aforementioned threesome also returns with the top three assist averages from 2016-17. Kell led the way with 2.9 assists per game, Hemsley finished at 2.1 and Pope was at 1.5. Similar to their scoring averages, their assist averages were career highs.
- Returning for their junior campaigns are a pair of Division I transfers who sat out 2014-15 and saw their first action with the Aztecs last season in forward Max Hoetzel and guard Montague Gill-Caesar. Both missed time in 2016-17 due to injury, but they each saw time in the starting lineup. Hoetzel started 10 of 29 games, made 52 three-pointers (1.8 3FG/g) and averaged 7.7 points and 3.8 rebounds. Gill-Caesar, meanwhile, started twice in 26 agmes and despite only averaging 3.3 points, he showed flashes of being able to score points in bunches (12 points in 19 minutes vs. Savannah State; 12 points in 12 minutes vs. Wyoming).
- SDSU's top scorer in 2017-18 may be a player who has yet to play one minute for the Aztecs. Junior transfer guard **Devin Watson** is eligible after sitting out last season after playing his first two campaigns at San Francisco. As a sophomore in 2015-16, Watson led the Dons with a career-high 20.3 points (65 3FGM), career-high 4.9 assists and 27 steals, which would rank second to Kell's 45 steals amona returners.
- Redshirt freshman forward Jalen McDaniels, who was a four-star signee in November of 2015, will make his debut in an Aztec uniform this season. The Federal Way, Washington native finished his senior season at Federal Way High (29-0; back-to-back Class 4A state champions) ranked No. 98 on the Rivals 150 list and then received preseason Mountain West Co-Freshman-of-the-Year honors before deciding to redshirt the 2016-17 campaign. Over the last year, he has added muscle to his true freshman listing of 6-9, 190.
- Sharing the frontcourt with Pope, Hoetzel and McDaniels is another returner in redshirt sophomore Nolan Narain. The 6-9, 200pound forward saw limited action (nine games) in '16-17, but is able to stretch the floor like aforementioned trio and has an array of low-post moves.
- New the program are true freshman quards Jordan Schakel and Adam Seiko, and sophomore transfer quard Patrick Fisher. Schakel is a four-star wing, according to ESPN, and led his high school team, Bishop Montgomery, to the CIF State Open Division title as senior. Along the way, he defeated Seiko's top-seeded Sierra Canyon team in the CIF Southern Section Open Division semifinals. Seiko is a three-star guard, according to Rivals and 247 sports. Fisher, meanwhile, will sit out 2017-18 after transferring from Winthrop. ■ SDSU's returning leaders: Scoring - Trey Kell (13.2), Rebounding - Malik Pope (6.1), Assists - Trey Kell (2.9), Blocked Shots - Malik
- Pope (1.0), Steals Trey Kell (1.4), Three-Point Field Goals Jeremy Hemsley and Max Hoetzel (1.8), Minutes Played Trey Kell
- The Aztecs finished last year with a 19-14 record and a 9-9 effort in the Mountain West, SDSU posted its 12th straight season with at least 19 victories despite losing 28 games due to injury, including nine from Pope. In all, San Diego State lost 24 games due to injury from players who started at least one game during the season.

- Another factor in SDSU's final record was its performance in games decided by eight points or less. The Aztecs were 2-11 in those games after being really good in the close ones. Prior to 2016-17, San Diego State was 50-22 in its previous 72 games that were decided by six points or less or in overtime.
- Between the injuries and the inability to win the close games in 2016-17, KenPom rated San Diego State as the ninth unluckiest team in the nation. Of the bottom nine, only one other school had a winning record.
- SDSU once again was one of the top defensive teams in the nation. A year after ranking in the top 10 in field-goal percentage defense (1st), scoring defense (3rd) and blocked shots per game (10th), the Aztecs completed 2016-17 ranked in the top 25 in all three of those categories (8th in field-goal percentage defense (.388), 15th in scoring defense (62.5), 24th in blocked shots per game (5.0)).
- Among its peers in the Mountain West, San Diego State finished first in <u>conference games only</u> in points allowed (63.2), field-goal percentage defense (.385) and blocked shots (4.8). The Scarlet and Black also finished in second in steals (6.8). In all games, San Diego State finished first in scoring defense (62.5) and field-goal percentage defense (.388).
- San Diego State enters the new year having won at least 20 games and advanced to the postseason in 11 of the last 12 years (seven NCAAs, four NITs). In the last 12 seasons, the Aztecs have averaged 25.4 victories.
- The Aztecs have won Mountain West regular-season crown (outright or shared) five times in the last seven years.
- San Diego State has been one of the elite programs in the nation since the start of the 2010-11 season, posting a cumulative record of 188-60. SDSU's .758 winning percentage is the 10th-best nationally over the last seven years (complete list is on page 1).
- The Aztecs will feature a 2017-18 active roster that will have a total of 455 games (250 starts) under their collective belt, which is more than the program's 2014 NCAA Sweet 16 squad. The 2013-14 team boasted 450 career Division I outings at the start of that campaign.
- San Diego State is set to return 63.4 percent of its scoring, 54.6 percent of its rebounding, 60.0 percent of its assists, 34.1 percent of its blocked shots, 49.3 percent of its steals, and 73.8 percent of its three-point field goals from last season.

PLAYER PERSONNEL

- San Diego State returns three starters in senior guard **Trey Kell**, junior guard **Jeremy Hemsley** and senior forward **Malik Pope**, and head coach **Brian Dutcher** will have his options to fill out the rest of the rotation. Junior guard **Montaque Gill-Caesar** (13 starts at Missouri in 2014-15 and 2 at SDSU) and forward **Max Hoetzel** (10 starts at SDSU) both started at times for the Aztecs last season, junior transfer guard **Devin Watson** (47 starts at San Francisco) has started 77.0 percent of his games played at the Division I level, and redshirt freshman forward **Jalen McDaniels** (four-star signee in November of 2015) showed in practice last year the type of versatility that the program has taken advantage of over the last 18 seasons.
- Others on the roster include two players who saw limited action last year in redshirt sophomore forward Nolan Narain and walk-on classmate Emmanuel Wilson, and three newcomers, two of which can play this season in true freshman guards Jordan Schakel and Adam Seiko. The third is a Division I transfer from Winthrop, Patrick Fisher, who will sit out this year.
- Kell is coming off a career year as he recorded personal bests in scoring (13.2), rebounding (4.9), assists (2.9), blocked shots (14) and steals (45). Despite struggling with his perimeter shot in terms of field-goal percentage compared to his sophomore campaign (.405 to .375), Kell got to the free-throw line more than ever as a junior. The San Diego native shot a team-best 76.6 percent among those with at least 50 free-throw attempts. His raw free throw numbers: 111 for 145 (both career highs). Last season, he led the Aztecs with 24 double-digit scoring games, including a team-high-tying five 20-point efforts. His final campaign should be even better if his upward trajectory continues as it has his entire career.
- Hemsley is back for his third season on The Mesa and it comes after another productive effort, one in which he averaged the second-most points (12.9) and assists (2.1) on the team (both career highs). The junior was SDSU's top three-point shooter (minimum 100 attempts), knocking triples down at a career-high 37.3-percent clip (56 for 150). Hemsley reached double figures in scoring 21 times and shared team-high honors with Kell for most 20-point games (5) and the number of times he led the team in scoring (12). With Devin Watson in the mix, Hemsley's all-around numbers should improve with another all-conference-type guard on the floor.
- Pope dealt with injuries last season that caused him to miss nine games, but when he was on the floor (24 games, 21 starts), he may have been the best all-around player in the Mountain West. In the final 14 games, all of which he started, Pope averaged team-high figures in scoring (13.1) and rebounding (7.1), and averaged 1.7 assists while shooting 46.0 percent and 46.9 percent from three-point range. In that span, he scored in double figures 11 times, had three double-doubles and pulled down at least seven rebounds nine times. In the MW Championship alone (three games in three days), he averaged 17.7 points (.474 FG, .667 3FG, .813 FT), 9.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists, 1.0 blocked shots and 1.0 steals. Pope is healthy and has made significant strides in the weight room over the summer, both of which should provide numbers that look similar, if not better, than his performance at the 2017 Mountain West Championship.

- Watson becomes eligible this season after sitting out last year after his transfer from San Francisco. The rising junior guard was one of the top scorers in the country in 2015-16 as a sophomore when he averaged 20.3 points in the City by the Bay. The 2016 all-West Coast Conference first-team selection ranked third in the WCC and 27th nationally in scoring average. Scoring was not everything he did while at USF as he averaged 4.9 assists and had a team-best 27 steals. He had some of his best performances in the biggest games, posting a career-high 33 points and seven assists vs. Gonzaga, a team that reached the 2016 NCAA Sweet 16, and equaled his career-high point total in what would be his final game at USF vs. Pepperdine at the WCC Championship. Watson, who scored in double figures in 29 of 30 games in 2015-16, figures to play a major role on this year's squad as both a point and shooting quard.
- Hoetzel entered his first season at SDSU known for his shooting, and he did not disappoint. He made 52 treys in only 29 games to rank second on the team behind Hemsley. The forward was not at 100 percent strength at any point of the season (knee) and managed to make 34.7 percent from behind the three-point arc. In Mountain West action, he shot a team-best 36.9 percent from three (minimum 40 attempts). But as fans saw Hoetzel knock down shots from the perimeter, they also saw him rebound the ball. Hoetzel only averaged 3.8 rebounds, but he had a knack for rebounding, especially on the offensive side, grabbing 31 offensive boards, which was the fifth most on the team while only playing 19.2 minutes. Now in his second year of eligibility at SDSU, he appears ready to improve upon his 7.7 scoring average and take on more responsibility on both ends of the floor.
- Gill-Caesar is back for Year No. 2 with San Diego State after an uneven sophomore season that saw him average 12.3 minutes in 26 games (2 starts). He scored in double figures four times and had a knack for catching fire quickly as evidence by his 12-points-in-19-minutes performance vs. Savannah State and his 12-points-in-12-minutes effort vs. Wyoming. Toward the end of the year, multiple nagging injuries took their toll, only allowing him to play in five of the final 12 games. Prior to coming to SDSU, Gill-Caesar enjoyed success at Missouri, where he spent his true freshman campaign. He averaged 11.5 points through the Tigers' non-conference schedule before a back injury sidelined him for the first three games of the SEC schedule. When he returned, he struggled to regain his rhythm and ultimately finished with averages of 9.1 points, which was the highest freshman scoring average at Missouri since the 2006-07 season, and 3.0 rebounds. With a season at San Diego State under his belt, look for more consistency from Gill-Caesar.
- McDaniels, like Watson, will put on an SDSU uniform for the first time after redshirting his true freshman year. Standing at 6-9, McDaniels can put the ball on the floor and shoot from behind the three-point arc. His versatility was on display during practices last year and the fact that he arrived on campus from a winning high school program, Federal Way High in Washington, and came with four stars from three recruiting services, the coaching staff is excited to get him on the hardwood. Look for the 2016-17 preseason Mountain West Co-Freshman of the Year to be in the playing rotation.
- Narain begins his redshirt sophomore season a much better player after two years in the program. Despite playing in nine games last year, Narain has made major strides on the floor and in the weight room, and was always ready to play in '16-17. Last season at Utah State with SDSU's starting center out with an injury, Narain logged five points (2-3 FG, 1-1 3FG) in 12 minutes in what would be a key road victory. The former four-star player and top-70 recruit can shoot from anywhere on the perimeter and score in the low post. The forward will compete for minutes and brings a unique skill set to the team. Wilson, meanwhile, played in four games, but his importance occurred on the practice floor as part of the scout team.
- Schakel and Seiko add depth to what is already a talented group of guards. Schakel is a sharpshooter from a California state championship team (Bishop Montgomery) and Seiko is a guard with good size who played on one of the best high school teams in the country, Sierra Canyon. The Southern California duo's winning pedigree will add to the winning culture the program is known for nationally.

- Is SDSU's returning leader in scoring (13.2), assists (2.9), steals (45), free-throw percentage (.766) and minutes played (31.8).
- Had 24 double-figure scoring efforts, including five 20-point performances, last year.
- Grabbed at least seven rebounds in eight of his final 12 games in 2016-17 and had multiple assists in 12 of his final 14 games, including eight games with at least three assists.
- Led the team in scoring 12 times (tied team high), in rebounding five times and in assists a teamhigh 19 times last year.



Malik Pope

*** MW Player of the Year, All-MW, All-Region Candidate *** Senior, Forward, 6-10, 220, Sacramento, Calif. (Laguna Creek HS)

- 2016-17: 11.0 ppg, 6.1 rpg, 1.5 apg
- Is SDSU's leading returner in rebounding (6.1) and blocked shots (23), and third-leading returner in scoring average (11.0).
- In the final 14 games of last year, he averaged team-high figures in scoring (13.1) and rebounding (7.1), and averaged 1.7 assists while shooting 46.0 percent and 46.9 percent from three-point range.
- In three 2017 MW Championship games, he averaged 17.7 points (.474 FG, .667 3FG, .813 FT), 9.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists, 1.0 blocked shots and 1.0 steals.
- Reached double-figures in scoring 13 times last season and had a team-best three double-doubles despite missing nine games due to injury.
- Led SDSU in scoring seven times, rebounding a team-high 12 times and assists four times in '16-17.

BRIAN DUTCHER

Head Coach

1st Season • 19th Season Overall at SDSU • Minnesota, 1982

Brian Dutcher, a long-time San Diego State men's basketball assistant coach, is entering his first season as head coach following Steve Fisher's retirement announcement on April 11, 2017. Dutcher, who was on Montezuma Mesa for all of Fisher's 18 seasons, held the title of associate head coach/head coach in waiting the previous six years and is the program's 15th head coach.

Over the course of his time at San Diego State, Dutcher helped the Aztecs reach the postseason 13 times, including eight trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 10 Mountain West titles and record 12 seasons of at least 20 victories.

Since 2008-09, Dutcher and SDSU twice advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 (2011, 2014) and NIT semifinal round (2009, 2016), won at least 25 games seven times and captured seven MW championships (five regular season, two tournament).

Dutcher arrived at SDSU shortly after Fisher was hired on March 26, 1999. In his first year in "America's Finest City," the Aztecs won only five games, but improved upon their win total from the season before. After that, San Diego State posted a 14-14 record in 2000-01, before winning the 2002 MW Championship, earning an NCAA tournament bid and finishing with a 21-12 record. The 2002-03 campaign saw SDSU receive an NIT invitation, which culminated in the program's first Division I postseason victory.

After helping attract the first McDonald's All-American to the 2002-03 squad, Dutcher assisted in securing the signatures of future starters and all-league performers Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter. The duo started their first two seasons on The Mesa, leading to the 2005-06 season that produced the school's first Mountain West regular-season and tournament title sweep.

The Aztecs advanced to the NCAA tournament and ultimately won a then-school-record 24 games. That appearance led to a string of 10 consecutive postseason berths.

From the 2006-07 campaign through 2008-09, San Diego State registered 20 or more wins and went to three straight NITs. In 2009, the Aztecs advanced to the NIT semifinals and broke the previous school record with 26 victories.

The run to the NIT semifinals was a springboard to the most successful run in SDSU basketball history. Led by future NBA first-round draft pick and NBA champion Kawhi Leonard, the 2009-10 Aztecs won the MW Championship, advanced to the NCAA tournament and fell four points shy of moving on to the second round before finishing with a 25-9 record.

The NCAA experience from the 2009-10 squad proved fruitful in 2010-11 when it returned all five starters, including Leonard, and a freshman named Jamaal Franklin, who would turn out to be a future MW Player of the Year and NBA draft selection. With Dutcher on staff, SDSU won its first 20 games of the year, shared the MW regular-season title and captured the MW tournament crown. The Aztecs moved on to the NCAA tournament as a No. 2 seed and won the program's first Division I NCAA tournament game. San Diego State, which was ranked as high as No. 4 and received first-place votes at one point in the season, advanced to the Sweet 16 and fell to the eventual national champion, finishing with a school-record 34 wins, a mark that still stands today. The Aztecs' also found themselves in the final top-25 polls, ranking sixth in the AP and 11th in the USA Today Coaches Poll.

Five months after SDSÜ's record-setting 2010-11 campaign, the University elevated Dutcher from associate head coach to associate head coach/head coach in waiting.

In his first season with his new title, Dutcher and the Aztecs advanced to the 2011-12 NCAA tournament as an at-large team and recorded 26 wins. The next season, SDSU was again an at-large selection to the 2013 NCAA tournament, moved on to the round of 32 for the second time in three years and finished with 23 victories.

Another NCAA Sweet 16 run was in the cards in Dutcher's third season as the head coach in waiting. The Aztecs opened the season by winning 21 of their first 22 games, including 20 in a row at one point, and were led by seniors Xavier Thames, who would become an NBA draft pick, and Josh Davis. SDSU won the program's second outright Mountain West regular-season title and later swept through two games in Spokane, Washington, to secure its second Sweet 16 appearance in four seasons. San Diego State compiled 31 wins and finished the season ranked 13th in the AP and 12th in the Coaches after rising to as high as fifth nationally in both polls.

The 2014-15 campaign saw the Aztecs spend their fifth straight season in the top 25. In the process of winning 27 games, San Diego State grabbed its second straight MW regular-season crown and earned an atlarge invitation to the NCAA tournament where they defeated St. John's in the round of 64. One season later, the Aztecs found themselves in the NIT after winning the MW by three games with a 16-2 record. Nevertheless, San Diego State won three games and qualified for the NIT national semifinals, eventually logging 28 victories.

More recently, San Diego State completed the 2016-17 slate with a 19-14 record despite experiencing a rash of injuries. The 2016 Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic champions will enter 2017-18 as one of 12 teams to have won at least 19 games in 12 consecutive seasons.

Before Dutcher arrived at San Diego State, he served as assistant coach and later associate head coach at Michigan under Fisher. He spent 10 seasons on the Wolverine staff, establishing himself as one of the nation's top assistant coaches. His first year in Ann Arbor was 1989 and resulted in a national title for Michigan as he assisted then-interim head coach Fisher on the bench.

The Bloomington, Minn., native led UM's recruiting efforts in 1990-91 when the Wolverines inked Juwan Howard, Ray Jackson, Jimmy King, Jalen Rose and Chris Webber. The "Fab Five" is considered perhaps the best recruiting class in NCAA history. Dutcher helped lead that group to nearly 100 wins, two berths in the NCAA championship game and a regional final over a four-year period. He was also on the Michigan staff for an NIT championship (1997).

Dutcher's recruiting prowess, however, was demonstrated by more than just the "Fab Five" haul. Michigan had the nation's top-ranked recruiting class in 1993-94 and in 1994-95, with a group that included Maurice Taylor and Jerod Ward. The accomplishment marked the first time that a university had the nation's top class in consecutive years, according to recruiting analyst Bob Gibbons.

Dutcher was born Oct. 30, 1959, in Alpena, Mich. He attended Jefferson High School in Bloomington, Minn., and went on to earn a bachelor's degree in physical education from Minnesota in 1982. While an undergraduate, he worked for his father, then-Gopher head coach Jim Dutcher. He then spent one season in the prep ranks at Apple Valley (Minn.) High School before becoming a graduate assistant at Illinois, where he earned his master's degree in physical education and athletic administration.

While in Champaign, Dutcher helped Lou Henson lead the Illini to a Big Ten championship, two appearances in the Sweet 16 and one regional final.

Dutcher's first full-time coaching job came at South Dakota State, where he spent three seasons helping turn around the Division II program before departing in 1988 for Michigan.

His final season in Ann Arbor ended with the Wolverines claiming the first-ever Big Ten Tournament championship.

Justin Hutson Associate Head Coach 10th Season at SDSU CSU Bakersfield '94

Justin Hutson enters his fifth season of his second stint at San Diego State after returning to campus following a two-year stay at UNLV where he was the associate head coach. This year is his 10th overall at SDSU (2006-11, 2013-present), but his first as the Aztecs' associate head coach after being elevated in May 2017.

Upon returning to San Diego State, the Aztecs won the Mountain West regular-season title in 2014 and advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA tournament before finishing with a No. 13/12 national ranking.

In the last three seasons, which have produced a pair of additional MW regular-season titles, the Aztecs appeared in the third round of the 2015 NCAA tournament and went to the semifinals of the 2016 NIT. Since his return, San Diego State has averaged 26.3 victories.

SDSU's defensive numbers also improved to an elite level when he decided to rejoin the Aztec coaching staff. As the defensive coordinator, San Diego State has finished in the top 15 nationally in both scoring defense and field-goal percentage defense all four seasons. San Diego State finished second in scoring defense in 2014 and 2015, third in 2016 and 15th last year. As far as field-goal percentage defense, the Aztecs were eighth in 2014, seventh in 2015, first in 2016, and eighth in 2017.

In his two years at UNLV, Hutson helped the Rebels to a pair of 25win seasons and two NCAA appearances. He played a key role in helping bring in a highly regarded incoming class in 2012-13, which included the 2013 No. 1 overall NBA Draft selection, Anthony Bennett, a player Hutson recruited.

During his first stint at San Diego State, Hutson helped elevate the Aztecs to the national program it has become. In five seasons, SDSU won three MW titles and earned postseason berths in each of those campaigns, including 2010-11.

That year, San Diego State opened 20-0, won the MW regular-season and tournament titles, and advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA tournament before finishing with a school-record 34 victories. SDSU ended the year ranked No. 6/11 nationally.

In both of his stints, Hutson has played a pivotal part in San Diego State's recruiting efforts as the team's recruiting coordinator. He was the point person in recruiting future All-Americans and NBA Draft picks Kawhi Leonard, Jamaal Franklin and Xavier Thames, while also helping land D.J. Gay, who left SDSU as the school's all-time leader in career wins, and Chase Tapley, who was a four-year starter. More recently, Hutson led the charge in the Aztecs inking Malik Pope and Jeremy Hemsley, who both are returning starters.

In a poll of Division I coaches conducted by ESPN's Jeff Goodman in the summer of 2013, Hutson was considered the eighth-best recruiting assistant nationally and the best on the West Coast. More recently, ESPN's Adam Finkelstein listed Hutson as a top up-and-coming recruiter (May 2014), while Miles Simon placed him on his west region ultimate coaching staff (May 2014).

Before arriving at SDSU in July 2006, Hutson served as an assistant coach at Cal Poly.

The Mustangs went 10-19 in 2005-06, doubling their previous season's win total. He was responsible for recruiting the 2006 Big West Freshman of the Year and landing two on the Big West all-freshmen team, along with bringing two first-team all-Big West selections and the defensive player of the year to San Luis Obispo in 2006-07.

Prior to his stint at Cal Poly, Hutson served as the head varsity coach at Bakersfield High where he led the Drillers to a CIF Central Section title and four appearances in the playoffs in four seasons. His 2004 team was ranked as high as No. 22 in the nation and fourth in California, while his 2003 squad finished the season with a 25-5 record and won the section title. Prior to the high school ranks, he was an assistant coach at CSU Bakersfield for two seasons (1999-00).

As a collegiate player, Hutson enjoyed a storied career, winning two NCAA Division II titles at CSUB. In the 1993 championship season, the Roadrunners were undefeated with a 33-0 record and followed that up with a 27-6 record in 1994.



David Velasquez Assistant Coach 16th Season at SDSU San Diego State '07

Dave Velasquez enters his 16th season at San Diego State and fifth as an assistant coach. Prior to his appointment as an assistant coach, he spent six seasons as the program's director of player development.

Velasquez's responsibilities include recruiting, on-court coaching, skill development and academics.

As an assistant, Velasquez is heavily involved in player development. In his previous role, he spent countless hours with former and current Aztecs analyzing their performance in games and in practice on video. Currently, he applies those sessions on the practice floor.

Velasquez also plays a huge role in the performance of Aztecs in the classroom. The Bay Area native works directly with San Diego State's academic advisors, tutors and mentors to ensure standards are met

What may go unnoticed is his relationship with players. As a former SDSU men's basketball student-athlete and recruit host, Velasquez understands all of the virtues that an Aztec basketball player possesses, which allows him to relate to the entire roster.

In his first season as an assistant, Velasquez helped ink a consensus top-15 recruiting class, while helping the Aztecs enjoy one of their finest seasons ever, which culminated in 31 wins, a Mountain West regular-season title and an NCAA Sweet 16 berth. He was also key in the development of Xavier Thames, who was a 2014 All-American, Mountain West Player of the Year and NBA draft pick.

In 2014-15, he coached SDSU to 27 victories, a second straight MW regular-season crown and an appearance in the third round of the NCAA tournament. Velasquez was also key in the Aztecs inking two four-star players for 2015-16, which resulted in 28 wins, another MW title and an appearance in the semifinals of the NIT. Last season, Velasquez helped secure another four-star player and three Division I transfers, while bringing in a three- and a four-star player for the 2017-18 campaign.

As San Diego State's director of player development, Velasquez assisted the basketball coaching staff with video breakdown, film exchange, travel, community service and handled many of the day-to-day office duties.

Prior to working as the director of player development, Velasquez was a student manager for the 2002-03 season before serving as head manager from 2003-07.

In 2002-03, San Diego State earned a berth to postseason NIT, where the Aztecs picked up their first Division I postseason tournament victory en route to an appearance in the second round.

Then in 2005-06, San Diego State won the Mountain West with a 13-3 league record before winning the MW tournament. As a result, the Aztecs advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the second time under head coach Steve Fisher and won a then school-record 24 games

Fisher awarded Velasquez a scholarship in December 2006 and was added to the active roster in January 2007.

As an official playing member of the team, Velasquez played in four games and recorded a steal. He was a member of a team that finished with a 22-11 record and advanced to the second round of the postseason NIT.

In Velasquez's five seasons as manager, the Aztecs went to the postseason three times and won 22 or more games twice.

Following his graduation from San Diego State in May 2007, Velasquez was hired at the University of the Pacific later that month. As the Tigers' graduate manager, he assisted with UOP's camps, created highlight tapes and coordinated film exchange before returning to his alma mater.

Since his return, SDSU has recorded nine more 20-win seasons and reached the postseason in nine of the last 10 years. More recently, Velasquez has helped the Aztecs earn an NCAA tournament berth in six of the last eight years, win the first six NCAA tournament games in program history and reach at least the second round of the Big Dance in four of the last seven seasons, including two Sweet 16 appearances.



Tim SheltonAssistant Coach
11th Season at SDSU
San Diego State '11

Tim Shelton continues his stint at San Diego State as a first-year assistant coach after being added to Brian Dutcher's coaching staff in May 2017.

In his role as an assistant coach, Shelton will be involved with recruiting, on-court coaching, player development and monitoring the Aztecs' academic efforts.

A native of Fresno, Shelton spent the last four seasons as SDSU's director of player development. In his role, he assisted with video breakdown, film exchange, travel and community service efforts. During his time, he helped the Aztecs to three postseason appearances, including a berth in the 2014 NCAA Sweet 16, and three Mountain West titles. San Diego State also won 105 games (26.3 wins per year) in those four years.

Prior to his position on the Aztecs' support staff, Shelton played for San Diego State from 2007-08 to 2011-12. In those five seasons, Shelton played in 109 games and played a key role in SDSU reaching the postseason in each of those years, including three consecutive NCAA appearances to close out his career. He was also a member of the 2010-11 squad that reached the NCAA Sweet 16, won the Mountain West regular-season and tournament titles, and finished 34-3. In addition to the pair of MW titles won in 2011, Shelton was a part of Mountain West championship teams in 2010 (tournament) and 2012 (regular season).

In his final playing season (2011-12), Shelton began work toward his master's degree and guided the Aztecs to 26 victories, which at the time was tied for the second-highest total in school history, all while earning Mountain West all-defensive team accolades. The next season, Shelton completed his master's degree coursework as a graduate manager and San Diego State advanced to the NCAA Round of 32 en route to 23 wins.

Over the course of his entire 10-year Aztec career, Shelton has helped the program to 259 wins (25.9 wins per year), seven Mountain West championships and nine postseason appearances (six NCAA).




