Aztecs Open Up 2005 Season Against Titans, Lumberjacks

• San Diego State opens up its 2005 season on the road for the second consecutive year with a match at CS Fullerton at 7 p.m. Friday. The Aztecs then host Northern Arizona at noon Sunday on the SDSU Sports Deck, their lone home match in the first seven games of the season.

A Glance at the Titans

• CS Fullerton is coming off a successful 2004 season after finishing as co-champions of the Big West Conference with an 11-8-1 overall record and a 7-1-1 mark in league play. The Titans, which return 10 starters and 17 letterwinners, are also ranked No. 15 in the preseason west region poll by *SoccerBuzz*. CS Fullerton welcomes back senior Kellie Cox, the 2004 Big West Midfielder of the Year and the 2004 Big West Goalkeeper of the Year junior Karen Bardsley (7-3-1, 0.71 GAA, five shutouts). Other returning first-team all-Big West selections include senior Kandace Wilson (10 goals, one assist) and 2004 Olympian (Mexico) senior defender Marlene Sandoval.

SDSU vs. CS Fullerton

• The Aztecs and Titans are meeting for the ninth time overall with SDSU holding an impressive 6-2 series advantage.

►With eight previous meetings, CS Fullerton represents the Aztecs' fourth-most common opponent among non-Mountain West Conference schools, trailing only UC Irvine (13 meetings), UC Santa Barbara (9) and San Diego (9).

►The .750 career winning percentage against the Titans is SDSU's second-highest among teams it has played at least eight times (Air Force, .888, 8-1).

►The Aztecs are 3-1 all-time in Fullerton, Calif., but fell to the Titans, 4-0, in their last meeting there on Sept. 27, 2002.

►SDSU has won four of five games against CS Fullerton.

►In the eight meetings, the Aztecs have outscored the Titans, 24-15.

►SDSU is 30-10-4 (.727) all-time against current Big West Conference opponents.

Aztecs in Season Openers

• Heading into the 2005 campaign the Aztecs own a 9-7 (.563) record in season-opening games, including wins in five of the last seven seasons.

►On two occasions, CS Fullerton has been SDSU's season-opening opponent with the Aztecs winning both matches (5-0 in 1993 and 4-2 in 1998).

A Glance at the Lumberjacks

• Northern Arizona heads into the 2005 season looking to improve on its 2004 campaign, where it finished 5-11-2 overall and sixth in the Big Sky Conference with a 2-4 record. The Lumberjacks return nine starters, however, from a squad which recorded a school-record six shutouts in 2004, including first-team all-Big Sky goalkeeper senior Andrea Berra. Sophomore Dani Davis led Northern Arizona with five goals and 10 points last season and senior Stefanie

Smith has seen action in 45 games in her career. Cee Cee Odorfer, the 2004 Arizona Gatorade Player of the Year, will join the Lumberjacks in 2005 after sitting out last season recovering from a knee injury.

SDSU vs. Northern Arizona

• This will be the first meeting between the Aztecs and the Lumberjacks. Against common opponents last season, SDSU finished 3-1, while Northern Arizona was 0-3.

►The Aztecs are 6-1 (.857) all-time against current Big Sky Conference opponents.

Aztecs in Home Season-Openers

• SDSU has been successful in its season-opening home matches, earning a 10-5-1 (.656) record, and outscoring its opponents, 35-16 (2.2-1.0).

►Among the 10 season-opening home victories, six have been Aztec shutouts.

►SDSU owns a 3-2 record in season-opening home games at the SDSU Sports Deck.

2004 Aztec Women's Soccer Outlook - The Renaissance Continues

• Sometimes a problem can be a good thing. With 12 returning letterwinners and 18 newcomers to the 2005 San Diego State women's soccer team, the Aztec coaching staff faces a major obstacle in the upcoming 2005 season - how to find enough playing time for all of the talented players?

Coming off the program's most successful season since 1999, which culminated in a shootout loss in the Mountain West Conference championship match, SDSU looks poised to make a run for an NCAA tournament berth in 2005.

The Aztecs return MWC Defensive Player of the Year Alexis Solovij and two-time all-conference selection Amanda Swiader, and bring in their most talented recruiting class in recent memory to The Mesa.

If the end of last year was any indication, the freshmen may settle in just fine. SDSU went 5-1-3 over its final nine games last season, despite carrying 14 newcomers on the roster. After struggling offensively most of the year and not scoring a single goal, the freshmen found their niche when it counted most - in the MWC tournament.

Three different freshmen scored four of the team's five tournament goals, including Tiphannie Elliott's tournament-leading two tallies.

Forwards

After scoring only 17 goals in the 2004 season, the lowest total in the program's 16-year history, the coaching staff addressed the problem in the offseason by bringing in a list of highly touted prep stars.

Erika Sutton, rated as one of the top 50 recruits by SoccerBuzz, should make an immediate impact. Sutton is currently in the pool for the national team. Sutton is currently in the pool for the national team and has previously trained with the U.S. under-19 national team.

Sutton's club teammate with the Colorado Rush, Jen Mello, should also compete for a starting spot. Giuliano rated her as the most tactical forward of the

incoming recruits.

Junior Jennifer Klunder, the team's leading scorer a year ago, will look to improve on her impressive resume of timely goals. Each of Klunder's four career goals have been game-winners.

Sophomores Casey Davidson and Elliott are expected to see significant time up front as well, while seniors Ashley Cooper, who tied for the team lead with three assists a year ago, and Lisette Martinez, SDSU's all-time active scoring leader, will add veteran leadership to a young front line.

Midfielders

The midfielders will be led by Nebraska transfer Ashley Tenn and sophomore Jessica Girdner.

Tenn played in 21 of 22 games for the NCAA participant Huskers in 2003, tallying one goal with six starts. One of the better shooters in the spring for the Aztecs, Tenn should control the central midfield in her first season on The Mesa.

Girdner came on strong at the end of the season in 2004 and figures to play a significant role in a much-improved offensive team.

Piz, a redshirt freshman in 2004, will look to make a contribution if she can stay healthy after an impressive spring.

Carrie Blankenbuhler and Mariko Strickland highlight the incoming freshmen midfielders. Blankenbuhler helped lead the Colorado Rush to three consecutive state cups and her Chatfield High School team to a 2004 state championship from her defensive midfield position.

Considered one of the top players to come out of Hawaii this year, Strickland brings a wealth of experience at the regional level to SDSU. She was a five-year member of the ODP state team and was a three-year member of the Regional IV squad.

Defenders

Defense wins championships and once again, defense will be the strength of the 2005 squad. Despite losing first-team all-MWC defender Noelle Jouglet to graduation, SDSU returns reigning MWC Defensive Player of the Year Solovij and two-time all-MWC selection Swiader. The senior captains will lead an Aztec defense that should be its deepest in many years.

Solovij also earned MWC all-tournament team honors and was named to her second consecutive all-MWC team.

Swiader joined Solovij on the MWC all-tournament team for her outstanding defensive play and earned second-team all-MWC accolades.

Millie Allen, ranked in the top 100 incoming recruits according to *SoccerBuzz*, should provide an immediate impact in 2005. Allen was a member of the U.S. U-16 2002 national team and a two-time Colorado state ODP pick. She also captained the Colorado Rush team, where she was a teammate of Sutton and Blankenbuhler.

Senior Erica Lopez, sophomore Kelly Carter, and freshman DaCosta-Muniz could also battle for a starting spot.

Lopez is a veteran starter of 40 career games and Carter is coming off an impressive spring. DaCosta-Muniz, who will also see playing time at forward, could be the wild card of the group because of her tremendous speed.

Goalkeepers

It will be tough to replace Sophia Perez, the 2004 MWC tournament Most Valuable Player and a first-team all-MWC selection between the pipes, but that doesn't mean a newcomer won't step up to the chal-

lenge.

There will be six goalkeepers fighting for the starting position without a clear-cut favorite heading into training camp.

Senior Gricelda Alvarez (92:36) and sophomore Melissa Deckers (4:34) played sparingly in 2004, but sophomore Sami Beveridge had an outstanding spring, giving her a chance to see time in 2005.

There are also three decorated standout athletes coming into camp with the ability to play right away.

Christi Yount comes to The Mesa having experienced winning on many levels in the past. In 2002, Yount led the Slammers to a national club championship and earned the "Golden Glove Award," given to the top goalkeeper at the national tournament.

Jillian Foss could be the steal of the recruiting class, as coaches have raved her technique and work-rate.

Cat Burson, a transfer from UC Santa Barbara, was arguably the best goalkeeper for the Gauchos in 2004. In 599:24 of play, Burson made 27 saves with a 0.60 goals against average. She appeared in seven games, registering three shutouts.

The Schedule

- The coaching staff certainly didn't make things easy for the squad with a schedule that will feature several nationally prominent teams early. Out of its 20 games, SDSU will play six opponents who advanced to the 2004 NCAA soccer tournament.

The SDSU non-conference schedule includes early trips to Seattle, Wash., for games against Portland (Sept. 2) and Washington (Sept. 4), and Lincoln, Neb., for a meeting with Nebraska (Sept. 6) in successive games. The Pilots and Huskies each advanced to the quarterfinal round of the NAAs a year ago, while the Cornhuskers made it to the third round. The three schools finished the 2004 campaign with a combined record of 51-18-1.

The Aztecs will play host to seven non-conference home matches, including CS Northridge (Sept. 19), NCAA participant San Diego (Sept. 28) and Hawai'i (Oct. 1).

The Aztecs open conference play with four road games versus Wyoming (Oct. 7), Air Force (Oct. 9), New Mexico (Oct. 14) and, the newest member of the MWC, TCU on Oct. 16.

SDSU ends its MWC regular season schedule with its toughest three conference games of the season. The Aztecs play host to Utah (Oct. 20) and Brigham Young (Oct. 22) before traveling to UNLV on Oct. 29 for their conference finale. The Utes and Rebels made last year's NCAA field of 64, while the Cougars have won the MWC tournament on four different occasions.

The MWC championships will be played at Peter Johann Memorial Field in Las Vegas, Nev., on the campus of UNLV in early November. The MWC championship game is set for Nov. 5, with the winner receiving the conference's automatic bid to the NCAA tournament.

SDSU Predicted to Tie for Second in MWC Preseason Poll

- Head soccer coaches from the MWC have predicted the 2005 Aztecs to finish tied for second in the league, the team's highest preseason ranking in the conference's seven-year history. Utah was selected to win the MWC regular season championship with 49 points and was followed by SDSU (39) and BYU (39), UNLV (31), TCU (21) and Wyoming (18). New Mexico and Air Force rounded out the voting with 16 and 11 points, respectively.
