- After opening the 2022-23 season with four consecutive victories the No. 17/19
 San Diego State Aztecs lost its semifinal game of the 2022 Maui Jim Maui Invitational and looks to get back to its winning ways on Wednesday, Nov. 23 at the Lahaina Civic Center at Lahaina, Maui, against No. 9/9 Arkansas.
- The Aztecs and Razorbacks are meeting for the third time in the school history, and the first since Arkansas bested SDSU 76-64 on Dec. 3, 1985 in Fayetteville. San Diego State trails in the all-time series, and has yet to defeat Arkansas in its two previous tries, both in the 1980s.
- San Diego State held its spot in the Associated Press Top-25 Poll last week, remaining at No. 17. Now nationally ranked for a third
 consecutive week, the Aztecs are occupying the No. 17 ranking position for the fourth time in program history.
- San Diego State is enjoying its 91st appearance in the AP Top 25 Poll this week (all have occurred since the start of the 2010-11 campaign). Since the start of the '10-11 season, SDSU's 90 weeks in the top 25 are the 18th most nationally.
- SDSU has a 6-5 record in the Maui Invitational and owns a second, third and sixth place finish in its three previous appearances in the
- event.

 San Diego State, which in 2021-22 reached the Mountain West championship game for the fifth time in head coach Brian Dutcher's five
- seasons, looks for its unprecedented 15th Mountain West men's basketball title. Entering the 2022-23 season, San Diego State, the most successful program in conference history, has won eight regular season and six Mountain West tournament titles.

 For the fourth time since the start of the 2010-11 season, San Diego State entered a season ranked in the preseason AP Top 25 Poll.

 The Actors No. 19 ranking in the initial call it the second highest in program history trailing only the 2014 15 processon pall in which it
- The Aztecs No. 19 ranking in the initial poll is the second highest in program history, trailing only the 2014-15 preseason poll in which it was No. 16. Since the start of the 2010-11 and at the conclusion of last week's action, SDSU had appeared in the AP poll for 89 weeks, more than any program in the state of California; ahead of UCLA (68 weeks), Saint Mary's (44 weeks), Southern California (35 weeks) and California (11 weeks).
- San Diego State owns a 80-17 record (82.5 percent) since the start of the 2019-20 campaign. That is the fifth best record in the nation, trailing only Gonzaga (93-8), Baylor (85-14), Houston (88-18) and Kansas (87-18). The 10 winningest programs since 2019-20 are listed in the box below.
- After defeating Ohio State 88-77 in its quarterfinal game on Monday, San Diego State played its second game in as many days on Tuesday
 night but lost to No. 14/12 Arizona, 87-70, at the Lahaina Civic Center in a semifinal game of the 2022 Maui Jim Maui Invitational.
- Senior Darrion Trammell led the Aztecs with a season-best matching 21 points, his third double digit scoring game this year. He was
 6-of-16 from the floor and was successful on 8-of-9 shots from the free throw line, both season-highs. It was his 52nd career double-digit
 scoring game and 24th time he has scored at least 20 points in 59 career games.
- Junior Micah Parrish reached double-digit scoring, 10 points, for the second time this season and the second time in the Maui Invitational. He was 4-of-7 from the field and in games in which he shoots at least 50.0 percent his team has won 19-of-33. Parrish also knocked
 down a pair of shots from the bonus distance. In two games at the Maui Invitational, he is 10-of-15 from the field (66.7 percent), 5-of-10
 from beyond the arc (50.0 percent), nine rebounds, an assist and a steal.

- Senior Nathan Mensah finished nine points on 3-of-3 shooting, had seven rebounds, two steals and a block. He is the fifth Aztec to have a
 perfect shooting night, minimum 3 field goal attempts, grab seven rebounds, have two steals and a blocked shot since the start of the 1996-97
 season, and is the first to do it against a ranked team.
- Brian Dutcher is now in his sixth season as San Diego State's head coach and his 24th season on the Aztec sidelines. In his five-plus seasons
 as head coach, he has led the Aztecs to four conference titles, five Mountain West championship game appearances, a 123-41 overall record,
 and has been named the national coach of the year and twice the Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year.

SAN DIEGO STATE IN THE MAUI INVITATIONAL

In 2022 San Diego State participates in the Maui Invitational for the fourth time.

- With its 87-70 loss to Arizona on Tuesday, the Aztecs have a 6-5 overall record and in its previous three trips to Maui have second, third and sixth place finishes.
- In 2003, the team went 2-1, defeated Ohio State 83-61 in the quarterfinal, then lost to Dayton 76-71 before winning the tournament's third-place game 75-67 over host Chaminade.
- The 2014 edition also saw No. 15 SDSU post a 2-1 record. The team opened with a double-overtime victory against Brigham Young, 92-87, and followed that up with a 74-57 win against Pittsburgh. In the championship game, the No. 3 Arizona Wildcats got the better of the Scarlet and Black 61-59
- The last time the Aztecs competed in the Maui Invitational was in 2018, opening against No. 1 Duke, which resulted in a 90-64 loss. The team bounced back against Xavier with a 79-74 victory, but Iowa State handed SDSU another lopsided loss, 87-57.
- Three current Aztecs Aguek Arop, Nathan Mensah and Adam Seiko, were on the squad which competed in 2018 and are the largest number
 of players who are on the same team to have competed twice in the Maui Invitational.

ELITE LEADERS

Through his first five seasons, head coach Brian Dutcher has led the Aztecs to 123 wins, the most by any SDSU coach in the 101 seasons of basketball on The Mesa.

Since the start of the 2017-18 season only two first time head coaches who were hired that year, have amassed at least 100 victories:

1. Brian Dutcher, San Diego State (123)

2. Bob Richey, Furman (114)

STREAKS ON THE LINE FOR THE AZTECS ON WEDNESDAY

When the Aztecs play at Arkansas on Wednesday here are the streaks that are on the line for SDSU:

- 34-game win streak when shooting 50 percent or better.
- 22-game win streak when scoring between 80-89 points.
- 10-game win streak when outrebounding its opponent.
- 8-game win streak when limiting opponents to between 60-69 points

SERIES HISTORY VS. ARKANSAS

- Today's game against Arkansas marks third meeting between these programs, and the first since Dec. 3, 1985.
- Both previous matchups were played in Fayetteville and each resulted in an Arkansas victory (seethe box on the column on the left).
- The game will mark the first time the programs have met while both were nationally ranked.
- All-time series meetings against Arkansas can be found in the column on the left.
- Jaedon LeDee is the only current Aztec to have played against Arkansas. His stats against the Razorbacks are below:

SAN DIEGO STATE VS. THE SEC

- San Diego State is 3-9 vs. current members of the SEC and won its last match-up against an opponent from the conference (vs. Georgia, 75-68, on Nov. 24, 2017 in the semifinal of the Wooden Legacy tournament in Fullerton, Calif.).
- San Diego State is 1-2 against SEC schools since the start of the 1999-00 season.
- On a neutral court, since the start of the 1985-86 campaign, SDSU is 2-1 vs. SEC competition having defeated Florida 63-62 at the UNLY Rebel Roundup on Dec. 21, 1985, lost to No. 15/14 Tennessee in the first round of the NCAA tournament, 62-59 on March 3, 2010 and the aforementioned win over Georgia in the 2017 Wooden Legacy.
- Overall San Diego State has won 25.0 percent (3-9) of its games against the current SEC teams (H: 1-4, A: 0-4, N: 2-1).

ROAD (AND NEUTRAL) WARRIORS

With San Diego State playing its second, third and fourth of 14 regular season road/neutral contest at the Maui Jim Maui Invitational here are some road and neutral site facts about SDSU:

- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 94-57 (.623) record in road games is the eighth best in the nation.
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 150-86 (.636) record in road/neutral games is the eighth best in the nation.
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 72-43 (.626) in road games against the Mountain West, which leads the conference.

DUTCHER KEEPS THE BALL ROLLING...AND ROLLING

Brian Dutcher has on The Mesa in now his 24th season, 18 of them as the top man on San Diego State Hall of Fame Head Coach Steve Fisher's bench. In that time, he's experienced 508 victories, 14 Mountain West titles and helped the Aztecs to 15 postseason tournaments, including 10 NCAA appearances and a pair of Sweet 16 berths (2011, 2014).

- Since his ascension to the top job, prior to the 2017-18 season, he has captured four Mountain West crowns and guided his team to the championship game in the league tournament each of his five years.
- In his inaugural campaign, in 2017-18, he was the only first-year Division I head coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament.
- He is the only head coach in program history to win at least 21 games in each of his first five seasons.
- His 119 wins in his first five seasons are a program record for victories in a coach's first five campaigns.
- His 123 wins to date are the most of any head coach who started at his current institution at the start of the 2017-18 season.

TOP-25 FACTS

- San Diego State opened the 2022-23 season ranked No. 19 in the Associated Press Top 25 Poll. It is the fourth time that SDSU has been
 included in the AP's preseason poll; all coming during the Dutcher/Fisher era, and is the second highest ranking for the program in the
 initial poll of a year.
- The previous three occasions when San Diego State was ranked in the preseason poll by the AP voters was prior to the 2010-11 season
 when the Aztecs were initially No. 25; prior to the 2012-13 campaign, when SDSU was No. 20; and the most recent appearance before
 this year, was 2014-15 when the Scarlet and Black was No. 16, the program's highest ranking in the preseason poll.
- How important is the preseason ranking or what does it portend? The three previous Aztec teams which were ranked in the preseason AP
 poll, finished a combined 84-23, including a 44-3 mark in Viejas Arena. Each squad made at least the round of 32 in the NCAA tournament
 with the 2010-11 team reaching the Sweet 16 and finishing the season with a 34-3 record.
- San Diego State's longest consecutive streak of weeks ranked in the AP Top-25 is 22 straight (Dec. 2, 2013 to Dec. 15, 2014).
- Entering this season, the Aztecs had appeared in the AP Poll for 88 weeks, and all have come since the start of the 2010-11 campaign.
- As of the Monday, Nov. 21 poll, San Diego State's 91 appearances since the start of the 2010-11 campaign, are the most of any school in California. (See box in the left column)
- Prior to this season's ranking, the last time the Aztecs appeared in the AP poll was March 15, 2021, the final poll of the 2020-21 season, and the Aztecs were ranked No. 16.
- Since the start of the 2019-20 season San Diego State has appeared in the USA Today Coaches Poll 21 times, including this year's preseason ranking of No. 20 and last week's move into the No. 19 spot.



Brian Dutcher enters his sixth season as San Diego State head men's basketball coach, building on the previous five years in which he led the Aztecs to five title games in Mountain West tournament, its conference-record 11th, 12th, 13th & 14th Mountain West crowns, and to a bid to the NCAA tournament three times. He is the only coach in the 101-year history of San Diego State men's basketball to win at least 20 games in each of his first five seasons. His 119 victories in five seasons (119-40) are the most for any Division I head coach whose first year guiding his current program was 2017-18 and the accompanying win percentage, 74.8 percent, is the highest for any head basketball coach in San Diego State history.

Dutcher has been recognized twice, following the 2019-20 and 2020-21 seasons, with Mountain West Coach of the Year honors and was the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Division I District 17 Coach of the Year in both those years as well. In addition, Dutcher earned USA Today National Coach of the Year and United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) District IX Coach of the Year distinction following the 2019-20 campaign and was one of five finalists for the 2020 Werner Ladder Naismith Men's College Coach of the Year Award.

His teams have faced top-25 ranked opponents on 15 occasions and posted a 9-6 record (60.0 percent) and includes wins over Gonzaga, UCLA and Arizona State as well as Nevada (four times) and Colorado State (twice). Since the start of the 2018-19 season, his Aztecs are 4-2 against Pac-12 opponents and 8-4 in multi-team events in season. Since the start of the 2017-18 season, SDSU has the 14th best home win percentage in the nation (88.3 percent), and in the last three years, San Diego State has posted a 91.1-win percentage (41-4) in Viejas Arena, the ninth best in the nation.

The team's success on the court is reflected in the honors his players have earned under his tutelage. In 2020 Malachi Flynn was a consensus All-American, the third Aztecs to earn that honor and the following season Matt Mitchell was recognized by the Associated Press with the All-American moniker.

San Diego State put a player on the USBWA's All-District IX first team in 2020 (Flynn) and 2021 (Mitchell). The NABC has bestowed its All-District 17 honors seven times to an Aztec in the last five years. In 2019, Jalen McDaniels earned first team designation. Flynn, Yanni Wetzell were first team and Mitchell was second team in 2020. In 2021, Mitchell and Jordan Schakel earned first team and second team honors, respectively and in 2022 Matt Bradley was a second team performer.

Within the Mountain West, Flynn was named the 2020 Mountain West Male Athlete of the Year, Player of the Year, Defensive Player of the Year, Newcomer of the Year and a member of the All-Defensive Team. In the same season, KJ Feagin was named to the all-defensive team and one year prior, Jeremy Hemsley was included on the league's all-defensive team. In 2021, Mitchell earned Mountain West Player of the Year, first team All-Mountain West and inclusion on the all-defensive team along with Nathan Mensah. In 2022, Mensah was the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year and a member of the all-defensive team. Bradley was the Newcomer of the Year. Chad Baker-Mazara was named the Sixth Man of the Year and Lamont Butler garnered all-defensive team honors.

His players have earned 14 all-Mountain West designations and 15 player of the week honors. Two Aztecs, Trey Kell in 2018 and Mitchell in 2021, were named Mountain West tournament MVP among 10 SDSU players who have been included on the league's all-tournament team. In his five seasons, his charges have garnered 14 league all-academic team distinctions with Flynn being named to the 2020 NABC Honors Court.

The 2021-22 campaign featured a 23-9 record and SDSU's second straight appearance in the NCAA tournament and its second consecutive single-digit seed, No. 8. Six of its nine losses were by 6 points or less and after Dec. 8, 2021, five of the team's six defeats were by six points or less. Twice during that stretch, the Aztecs defeated nationally ranked Colorado State.

The team's No. 2 ranking in KenPom's adjusted defensive efficiency was the best for a Dutcher coached team and matched the program's best rating since the start of the 2006-07 season (the team was No. 2 following the 2010-11 campaign). Among its national rankings, SDSU was No. 2 in scoring defense, No. 4 in field goal percentage defense, No. 25 in 3-point field goal percentage defense and No. 32 in blocks per game.

The defensive success was in part due to Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year Nathan Mensah. The Acrra, Ghana native averaged 2.2 blocks per game to lead the Mountain West, totaled a career-high 71 blocks for the season, and was No. 5 in offensive rebounds, No. 7 in total rebounds and No. 13 in defensive boards.

Offensively, the team was led by first year player Matt Bradley, who transfered into the program in the summer of 2021. The Mountain West Newcomer of the Year and first-team all-league designee, led the team in virtually every offensive statistical category, including points (542), field goals (186), 3-pointers (57) and free throws (113).

In 2020-21, he guided San Diego State to the Mountain West regular-season and tournament crowns and earned a No. 6-seed in the NCAA tournament. The Aztecs went 23-5 and finished the regular season ranked No. 7 in field goal percentage defense (.387), No. 8 in scoring defense (60.6), No. 12 in scoring margin (+13.5), No. 14 in total steals (233), and No. 16 in turnover margin (+3.9) nationally. Among the Mountain West teams, San Diego State led the league in turnovers forced (15.15), steals per game (8.19), assist-to-turnover ratio (1.25:1), three-point field goal percentage (.381), field goal percentage defense, scoring defense, scoring margin, turnover margin and total steals. The team posted a 14-game win streak, which is the fourth longest in school history and is the third of at least nine games under Dutcher.

The 2019-20 squad ripped off a program-record 26-straight wins to open the season and peaked, for eight weeks, at a No. 4 ranking in both national polls, before finishing the regular season at No. 6. The Aztecs went 30-2, including 17-1 in Mountain West play.

In program history, his team's 30 wins in 2019-20 are the third most in a season and its two defeats are the fewest. SDSU's 17 wins in conference play are the most in program history, and its one loss is the fewest in the Aztecs' Division I era and equals the fewest since 1926-27, when it moved from junior college competition to the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). San Diego State opened the 2019-20 league slate with a 15-game

winning streak, which set a new Mountain West record.

Led by junior guard and consensus second-team All-American Malachi Flynn, the team won the Continental Tires Las Vegas Invitational with a blowout victory over Creighton and a 16-point comeback win against lowa in the championship game. A month later, three days after Utah defeated then No. 6 Kentucky, the Aztecs handed the Utes a 28-point drubbing in the Basketball Hall of Fame Classic.

With the expected return for the postseason of forward Nathan Mensah, who had been sidelined for the final 19 games of the year, San Diego State was poised for a deep run in the NCAA Tournament. The Aztecs were projected to be either a No. 1 or No. 2 seed and some felt were a Final Four team, but the corona virus pandemic put an end to the postseason and fans were left to wonder what could have been.

In 2017-18, his first season as head coach, he was the only Division I coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament after going 22-10 in the regular season, including winning the 2018 Mountain West Tournament championship.

Over the course of his 23 years at San Diego State, Dutcher has helped the Aztecs reach the postseason 16 times, including 11 trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 14 Mountain West titles and record 17 seasons of at least 20 victories.

Since 2008-09, SDSU has twice advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 (2011, 2014) and NIT semifinal (2009, 2016), won at least 25 games eight times and captured 11 MW championships (seven regular season, four tournament).

In his first year on The Mesa (1999-00) the Aztecs won only five games, but improved upon their win total from the season before. After that, San Diego State posted a 14-14 record in 2000-01, before winning the 2002 MW Championship, earning an NCAA tournament bid, and finishing with a 21-12 record. The 2002-03 campaign saw SDSU receive an NIT invitation, which culminated in the program's first Division I postseason victory.

After helping attract the program's first McDonald's All-American to the 2002-03 squad, Dutcher assisted in securing the signatures of future starters and all-league performers Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter. The duo started their first two seasons on The Mesa, leading to the 2005-06 campaign that produced the school's first MW regular-season and tournament title sweep. The Aztecs advanced to the NCAA tournament and ultimately won a then-school-record 24 games. That appearance led to a string of 10 consecutive postseason berths.
