Aztecs Start Second Half of the Season Saturday at Home Against Hawai'i

- San Diego State opens the second half of the 2014 campaign at home against Hawai'i, the only Mountain West's West Division team without a league loss, on Saturday night at Qualcomm Stadium. The Aztecs (3-3. 2-1 MW) are tied with Fresno State (3-4, 2-1 MW) for second place in the West Division, behind the first-place Rainbow Warriors (2-4, 1-0 MW). Announced kickoff time is set for 7:30 p.m. PT, and the game will be on TV on CBS Sports Network and on radio on The Mighty 1090 and The Max 105.7 FM.
- SDSU is 3-3 in the first half of the 2014 campaign, despite playing four true road games, including two at Power 5 Conference members, and having a rash of key injuries. San Diego State, which is tied with 16 other schools for playing the fewest home games (2) to date, has four home games remaining in the 2014 campaign.
- The Aztecs have won four consecutive home games, which is tied for the 23rd-longest active win streak in FBS, five straight against unranked teams and nine in a row against unranked conference opponents.
- Oddly, this will mark SDSU's only home game from Sept. 28 through Nov. 7, a 41-day period.
- Last Friday, San Diego State never trailed in defeating New Mexico, 24-14, in Albuquerque for a fifth consecutive victory in the series. Sophomore running back Donnel Pumphrey rushed for 246 yards, the 13th-highest single-game total in school history and the seventh-highest total in FBS play this season. As a team, the Aztecs rushed for 397 vards. the eighth-highest total in school history.
- With last Friday's victory, SDSU is 15-3 (.833) over its last 18 Mountain • West games, dating back to Oct. 6, 2012. That is tied for the 12th-highest winning percentage nationally in league games during that time frame.
- Since the beginning of the 2010 campaign, San Diego State has posted a 37-21 record (.638), tied for the 28th-best mark over that time frame.
- <u>Rocky Long</u>, the all-time Mountain West leader in coaching victories, owns 93 career wins. Now in his fourth season with the Aztecs. Long owns a 28-17 record (19-7 in MW games).
- Sophomore running back Donnel Pumphrey ranks among the nation's leaders in several categories, including tied for third in rushing touchdowns (11) and ninth in rushing yards per game (134.5). The Doak Walker candidate has 1,559 career rushing yards to rank 16th on the school's career rushing chart.
- SDSU opponents have failed to accumulate 400 yards of total offense in five of six games this season. For the year, the San Diego State D is allowing 20.2 points per game to rank 27th nationally and 351.8 yards per outing to rank 36th nationally. The unit is also 34th in tackles for loss (6.8) and 44th in sacks per game (2.50).
- Through six games, the Aztecs have had 17 players make their first career start (nine on offense, eight on defense) and 29 players see their first action with SDSU (two are DI transfers). San Diego State currently has three projected starters that are out due to injury - senior linebacker Derek Largent, junior linebacker Jake Fely and senior wide receiver Ezell Ruffin - with another (senior quarterback Quinn Kaehler) expected to start Saturday vs. Hawai'i.
- The Aztecs have advanced to four consecutive bowl games. SDSU joins Stanford as the only football teams in California - FBS or NFL - to advance to the postseason in each of the past four seasons.

Injury Update

San Diego State will play Friday without the services of three student-athletes that the staff would have anticipated starting prior to the season.

- WR Ezell Ruffin <u>The Significance</u>: Last season had the most receiving yards (1,136) by an Aztec non senior in the Mountain West era (since 1999). He is, by far, the most experienced wide receiver on the team. <u>The Injury</u>: Broken collarbone in the third quarter at North Carolina on Sept. 6, and had surgery on Sept. 8. <u>The Prognosis</u>: Expected to miss 4-to-6 weeks.
- LB Jake Fely <u>The Significance</u>: Potential candidate for Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year, is a two-time MW defensive player of the week nominee. He is the only Rocky Long coached player in the last four seasons to record two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries, 10 tackles for loss and 90 total tackles in a single season. <u>The Injury</u>: Had surgery on his neck in August. <u>The Prognosis</u>: Was expected to miss 10-to-12 weeks.
- LB Derek Largent <u>The Significance</u>: Rocky Long has referred to Largent as the biggest, strongest and fastest linebacker SDSU currently has. In 2012, he joined Kirk Morrison and J.J. Whittaker as one of three Aztec defensive players to earn all-conference accolades in his first season in the program. <u>The Injury</u>: Went to the hospital at 4 a.m. PT on Sept. 27 and had his appendix removed later in the day. <u>The Prognosis</u>: Likely out 3-to-4 weeks.

Quinn Kaehler, meanwhile, returned earlier than expected and played the second half of SDSU's win at New Mexico.

QB Quinn Kaehler - <u>The Significance</u>: Started the previous 15 games at QB and led the NCAA last season with six fourth quarter/overtime come-from-behind scoring drives until he missed the game at Fresno State on Oct. 3. He was the only eligible Aztec quarterback to throw a pass in a game prior to that week. <u>The Injury</u>: Suffered an AC joint sprain late in the Sept. 27 victory over UNLV. <u>The Prognosis</u>: Missed one game and was been ruled out for the New Mexico game, but came back to play in the second half.

Bullet Notes - Offense

- <u>Bob Toledo</u> is in his second season as offensive coordinator at San Diego State. He has 39 years of coaching experience, including 18 as a head coach and 16 as an offensive coordinator.
- San Diego State is suffering through some significant injuries on offense. Senior wide receiver <u>Ezell Ruffin</u>, a preseason member of the Biletnikoff Award Watch List, broke his collarbone in the second quarter of SDSU's second game of the season at North Carolina. He had surgery the following Monday (Sept. 8) and is expected to miss 4-to-6 weeks. Saturday's game against Hawai'i will mark the fifth straight game that the Aztecs will be without his services. Senior quarterback <u>Quinn Kaehler</u> is less than 100 percent after suffering an AC joint sprain against UNLV. He missed all of the game at Fresno State (an SDSU loss) and the first half of last Friday's game at New Mexico. Since the injury, he has played two quarters and is 1-for-3 with an interception and 10 passing yards. The completed pass was a short shovel pass against the Lobos.
- Although the Aztecs rank 83rd in total offense per game (388.2), a truer measure of the unit's efficency can be found by looking at total offense produced per play. SDSU averages 7.4 scrimmage yards per offensive play to rank 36th nationally.
- San Diego State has scored 192 points in its last seven games (27.4 ppg) and 245 points in its last nine contests (27.2 ppg). The Aztecs have scored 27 or more points in 11 of their last 15 games.
- After being held without a rushing touchdown against Fresno State, San Diego State rushed for three scores in last Friday's
 game at New Mexico. The Aztecs have now rushed for at least one touchdown in 16 of the last 17 games, and have 18 rushing
 touchdowns in their last seven games and 33 rushing touchdowns in their last 13 contests.
- SDSU ran its streak of games with at least one touchdown to 19 (every game since the beginning of the 2013 season when Bob

Toledo took over as offensive coordinator) and extended its streak of scoring to 96 games (dating back to the 10th game of the 2006 campaign).

- San Diego State is averaging 218.5 rushing yards per game in 2014 to rank 25th in the country. The Aztecs are coming off a 46-carry, 397-yard performance at New Mexico. SDSU is averaging 5.7 yards per carry to rank 15th in the country.
- Sophomore RB <u>Donnel Pumphrey</u> has rushed for 807 yards through his first six games of the season and surpassed 1,000 career yards rushing in San Diego State's game at Oregon State earlier this year. On the Doak Walker Watch List (nation's top running back), Pumphrey reached the career century mark in just his 168th career carry (and fourth start) to become the 35th player in school history to reach 1,000 career rushing yards. On the season, the Las Vegas native ranks in a tie for third in the nation in rushing touchdowns (11), tied for fifth in points per game (12.00) (tied for fourth among non-kickers), ninth in rushing yards per game (134.50), 14th in rushing yards per carry (6.78) and 19th in all-purpose yards per game (145.67).
- San Diego State returns six starters on the offensive side of the ball from the 2013 season, including senior quarterback <u>Quinn</u> <u>Kaehler</u> (inj.), senior wide receiver <u>Ezell Ruffin</u> (inj.), senior left tackle <u>Terry Poole</u> and junior right guard <u>Darrell Greene</u>.
- Three SDSU offensive players made their first career start in the 2014 opener junior tight end <u>Robert Craighead</u>, junior fullback <u>Dakota Gordon</u> and junior right tackle <u>Pearce Slater</u>. Since then, Aztecs to log their first career start have included junior wide receivers <u>Larry Clark</u> and <u>Jemond Hazely</u>, junior center <u>Lenicio Noble</u>, sophomore wide receiver <u>Lloyd Mills</u>, sophomore tight end <u>Daniel Brunskill</u> and true freshman quarterback <u>Nick Bawden</u>. Altogether, 18 different players have started on offense for SDSU.
- On the offensive line, three San Diego State student-athletes scheduled to start have at least 12 starts under their belt. At left tackle, <u>Terry Poole</u>, who started 12 games at right tackle a year ago, is in his senior campaign and now has 18 career starts. At right guard, junior Darrell Greene has 18 career starts, all at RG and has played in 21 career games. The most experienced lineman of the group is senior center <u>Zach Dilley</u>. Dilley has played in 26 career games and 20 starts (13 at right tackle, five at left guard and two at center). Dilley, however, is currently backing up <u>Lenicio Noble</u>.

Bullet Notes - Defense

- San Diego State had eight first-time starters on defense in the season opener. That is the highest total for either side of the ball (offense or defense) by any team in the country.
- SDSU has allowed just 121 points through six games this season (20.2 ppg, 27th nationally and first in the Mountain West). That is the second-fewest points allowed through six games for an Aztec squad in the last 11 seasons (allowed 104 points in 2010). Last season through six games, SDSU had allowed 196 points.
- San Diego State has not allowed more than 401 yards in total offense in 10 of the last 11 games. Since Nov. 9, 2013, SDSU's 350.5 yards allowed per game ranks 26th nationally.
- The Aztecs have intercepted an opponent's pass in seven consecutive games. That is the longest streak for SDSU since an eightgame stretch with at least one pick in 2010.
- San Diego State is allowing 130.8 rushing yards a game this season to rank 41st nationally. The Aztecs are allowing only 3.5 yards per rush which is the 38th-best total nationally.
- SDSU has 41 tackles for loss and 15 sacks through six games this season. Remarkably, the Aztecs have had 18 different players
 record a tackle for loss and 10 different players record a sack in 2014.
- San Diego State allowed just seven points to Northern Arizona in the season opener. It was the fewest points allowed by the
 Aztecs since they defeated Army, 42-7, on Sept. 8, 2012.
- In the opener, SDSU held Northern Arizona to a 102.83 passing efficiency rating. That is the lowest allowed by the Aztecs since limiting Brigham Young to an 85.22 rating in the 2012 Poinsettia Bowl. It also snapped a 13-game streak in which San Diego State allowed a passing touchdown. Recently, the Aztecs have held opponents under a 100 passing efficiency rating in back-to-back games (85.76 at Fresno State, 90.10 at New Mexico) for the first time since 2011 Nov. 5 (66.96 vs. New Mexico) and Nov. 12 (51.67 at Colorado State).
- <u>Cody Galea</u> is slated to make his 30th consecutive start Saturday, the longest active streak on the team.
- Josh Gavert is slated to play in his 46th straight game on Saturday, the longest active streak on the team.
- Senior defensive back <u>J.J. Whittaker</u>, who is on the Thorpe Watch List for best defensive back, had three interceptions and 11 passes broken up in the final 10 games of last season. He is fourth on the squad this season with 33 stops, and had a career-high 11 tackles at Oregon State and intercepted is first pass of the season Oct. 3 at Fresno State.
- Fourth-year SDSU head coach <u>Rocky Long</u> is once again serving as defensive coordinator. This is his sixth season as the DC for the Aztecs. Since the beginning of 2009, when Long took over as defensive coordinator, the Aztecs rank 33rd nationally and first among MW teams that have been in the league the last five seasons in yards per rush allowed (3.8) and 36th nationally in scrimmage yards per touch (6.5).
- In the last three-plus seasons (since 2011), SDSU has held its opponent to less than 100 yards rushing 18 times.
- SDSU returns four starters on the defensive side of the ball from 2013 in senior defensive end <u>Dontrell Onuoha</u>, senior middle linebacker <u>Cody Galea</u>, senior linebacker <u>Josh Gavert</u> and senior cornerback <u>J.J. Whittaker</u>. Gavert didn't start the first three games due to injury, but started for <u>Derek Largent</u> after Largent's emergency appendectomy on Sept. 26 and started again the past two road contests.
- In addition, senior linebacker <u>Cody Galea</u> made his first six career starts at that position (previous 24 starts came at defensive end) this season.
- As previously mentioned, eight defensive players made their first career start in the 2014 opener junior defensive end <u>Jon</u> <u>Sanchez</u>, sophomore defensive tackle <u>Alex Barrett</u>, sophomore cornerback <u>Damontae Kazee</u>, sophomore Aztec (safety) <u>Na'im</u> <u>McGee</u>, sophomore linebacker <u>Calvin Munson</u>, sophomore linebacker <u>Micah Seau</u>, sophomore Warrior (safey) <u>Malik Smith</u> and

redshirt freshman Warrior (safety) Trey Lomax. Altogether, 14 different players have started at defense for SDSU.

- The area in which San Diego State showed the most improvement this season has been in special teams.
- Below is a look comparing the 2013 special-team rankings with those from this season.

 According to ESPN's Team Efficiencies, San Diego State has the 22nd-ranked special teams in the nation and second best in the Mountain West.

The Aztecs ended the 2013 campaign by missing their final eight field goal attempts, but in 2014, behind junior Donny Hageman, SDSU is 8-for-9 on FGA in 2014 (San Diego State's opponents are 3-for-7). Hageman has made his last seven attempts.

- San Diego State has scored four non-offensive touchdowns in its last nine game (three punt returns and one interception return). Since Nov. 23, 2013, only 98 teams in the nation have scored a non-offensive touchdown and the Aztecs have done it four times. That ranks 16th nationally during that span.
- Lloyd Mills returned a fourth-quarter punt 67 yards for a touchdown in the opening game. The sophomore scored on the fifth collegiate touch of his career (had four previous punt returns and a rush prior to the TD). It gave the Aztecs their third punt return for touchdown over the previous four games (now that is three punt returns for touchdowns in nine games). In fact, since Nov. 23 of last season only seven teams in the country have returned multiple punts for touchdowns San Diego State (3), Utah (3), Auburn (2), Middle Tennessee (2), Nebraska (2), North Carolina (2) and Utah State (2).
- The place-kicking game looked much improved through the first half of the year. Junior transfer <u>Donny Hageman</u> converted all 17 of his extra-point attempts (something the Aztecs were just 39-of-45 a year ago) and is 8-for-9 in field goal attempts (SDSU was 8-for-16 last season). He has made three field goals from more than 40 yards out. He ended a 337-day field goal drought for SDSU by converting a 48-yard attempt in the second quarter against NAU. SDSU did not successfully make a FG in the final nine games of the 2013 campaign. During that period, all 124 other FBS schools made a field goal. The highest total during that period was Arizona State with 20, while Purdue only made one. The Aztecs were 0-for-7 during the nine-game drought.

Program Notes

- San Diego State has advanced to four consecutive bowl games. The Aztecs join Stanford as the only football teams in California
 FBS or NFL to advance to the postseason in each of the past four seasons.
- SDSU is one of 29 schools to play in a bowl game each of the last four seasons, which is the longest streak in the Mountain West. San Diego State and Boise State are the only two current Mountain West schools to reach a bowl game in 2010, 2011, 2012 and 2013.
- With bowl game appearances in a school-record four straight seasons, the Aztecs have equaled their total number of bowls
 played in the 41 prior seasons (1969 through 2009).
- Between 2000-09, SDSU was 38-80 (.322) and owned the nation's 106th-best winning percentage. Since 2010, San Diego State is 37-21 (.638) and owns the nation's 28th-best winning percentage.
- Since the beginning of the 2010 campaign, San Diego State has posted a 37-21 record (.638). The only teams in the state of California with a better record during that span are Stanford (50-10) and USC (39-19).
- With 37 wins in their last 58 games (37-21 since the beginning of the 2010 campaign), the Aztecs have equaled their win total
 from the previous 111 games (37-74).
- The 34 wins over the previous four seasons (9 in 2010, 8 in 2011, 9 in 2012 and 8 in 2013) are the most in a 4-year period at San Diego State since 1974-77 (36 wins).
- Since the beginning of 2010, the Aztecs have won 37 games. That is more than any current member of the Mountain West during that time (Boise State (35) is second, Air Force (28) is third).
- San Diego State defeated Boise State in consecutive seasons (2012 and 2013), becoming the first team to accomplish that since Washington State did it in 2000 and 2001.
- SDSU owns 19 conference championships, but the 2012 Mountain West title was the school's first since claiming the 1998 Western Athletic Conference Pacific Division championship.

The Series: Hawai'i

- Saturday is the 29th meeting between the schools with SDSU owning a 17-9-2 advantage. The Aztecs have won the two most
 recent games in the series, 52-14 in 2012 and 28-21 (overtime) in 2013..
- San Diego State owns an 8-3 advantage against Hawai'i in San Diego. The Aztecs won the last six meetings played between the teams at Qualcomm Stadium, and have not dropped a game to the Rainbow Warriors in San Diego since Oct. 15, 1988.
- The Aztecs have won 11 of the last 13 outings in the series, dating back to 1990.
- SDSU met Hawai'i 19 straight years from 1980-1998 when the Aztecs were still in the WAC. In WAC play, the Aztecs owned a

- The Aztecs have rushed for at least 100 yards in each of the last 12 meetings with seven 200-yard rushing games during that span.
- In the 23 meetings in the Division I era, the average game time temperature is 74.5 degrees.

for SDSU and improving its all-time overtime record to 6-2 and 2-1 in 2013.

Hawai'i got on the scoreboard late in the first quarter when it recovered a fumble on a rugby punt and losefa punched it in from five yards one play later.

San Diego State answered early in the second quarter when Quinn Kaehler took advantage of a free play and Warrior penalty, and found a streaking Colin Lockett, who blew by the UH defenders for a 56-yard score.

On the ensuing drive, Hawai'i responded with a 5-play, 65-yard drive with Schroeder connecting on a 31-yard pass to Harold Moleni.

Down, 14-7, at halftime, the Aztecs put together an 8-play, 78-yard drive on their first opening possession, gaining all 78 yards on the ground and taking advantage of a roughing the kicker by a Warrior player on fourth down. Donnel Pumphrey officially tied it at 14-14 on a 30-yard touchdown run down the left side of the field.

UH took its third lead of the game to start the fourth quarter, going 86 yards on 16 plays and taking up 7:17 of clock time before Schroeder found Iosefa for an 8-yard touchdown on a dump pass on 3rd and 6.

After trading punts, SDSU used its 8-play, 82-yard drive to force overtime.

Muema finished with 163 yards and a touchdown on 24 attempts (6.8 avg.), his fourth straight 100-yard rushing game, fifth of the season and 13th of his career.

Pumphrey added 61 yards on 10 rushes (6.1 avg.).

Lockett picked up his second 100-yard receiving game and fifth of his career with four catches for 106 yards and the touchdown, while Ezell Ruffin just missed a 100-yard game with four receptions for 99 yards.

Quinn Kaehler threw for 265 yards and a touchdown.

Josh Gavert led the San Diego State defense with a career-high 11 tackles and an interception. Iosefa led Hawai'i with 150 rushing yards, a touchdown and a school-record 37 attempts.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. – Donnel Pumphrey rushed for a career-high 246 yards and two touchdowns and Chase Price added 141 yards and a score to lead San Diego State to a 24-14 win at New Mexico on Oct. 10.

Pumphrey and Price helped the Aztecs rush for 397 yards, the eighth most in single-game history (third most in SDSU's Division I history), and lead San Diego State to the win in Rocky Long's first game as head coach at his alma mater.

Long, the all-time winningest coach in the Mountain West, who coached at New Mexico from 1998-08 and graduated from UNM in 1974, has now been on the winning sideline in each of the last 13 times the two teams have played (2001-08 as head coach with the Lobos, 2009-10 as defensive coordinator with the Aztecs and 2011, 2013-14 as the head coach at SDSU).

Pumphrey got his 246 yards on 20 attempts (12.3 avg.) with 93 of them coming on a touchdown run in the third quarter. It was the true sophomore's fourth 100-yard game of the season (in six contests) and seventh of his career. The 246 yards were the 13th most in a game in school history.

Price rumbled for 141 yards on 17 carries (8.3 avg.) for his first 100-yard game of his career. He became the 74th player in school history to rush for at least 100 yards in a game.

It was the 18th time in school history that San Diego State had multiple 100-yard rushers, where the Aztecs are 17-1 in those occasions.

SDSU wasted no time on its opening drive, taking it 70 yards on 14 plays over 6:29 before Donny Hageman nailed a 25-yard field goal. It was the seventh straight make for Hageman, who improved to 8-for-9 on the year on field goal tries. True freshman Nick Bawden, making his second career start, got San Diego State out of a jam with a 15-yard run on a third and 12 and later connected on a 43-yard strike to Eric Judge on a

3rd and 15, the longest pass of his short career. Bawden would go onto become just the second Aztec true freshman to start at quarterback in a SDSU victory.

The score would remain 3-0 until early in the second quarter when Pumphrey took San Diego State's first play 49 yards for the score with 11:37 left in the half.

New Mexico answered Pumphrey's rushing touchdown with a quick 5-play, 75-yard drive over 1:17, culminating with a 45yard pass from Lamar Jordan to Carlos Wiggins with 10:20 to play.

The Wiggins' grab would be the final score of the first half as the Aztecs held onto a 10-7 lead.

After forcing a punt to start the second half, SDSU took another 10-point lead when Price scored on a 27-yard touchdown run. The drive, which went 56 yards in just three plays over 0:36, was led by quarterback Quinn Kaehler, who entered the game in the beginning of the third quarter.

The Lobos responded with a 13-play, 75-yard drive over 6:29, ending with a 1-yard run by Teriyon Gipson to bring the game back to three points at 17-14.

San Diego State, however, would seal the game when Pumphrey took the second play of the drive 93 yards for the score. The 93-yard rush was the second longest in the Aztecs' Division I era (since 1999) and the third-longest rushing play in program history.

SDSU was unable to put the game out of reach as it committed four turnovers in the fourth quarter, including three straight plays and four times in six snaps. UNM, however, never got into San Diego State's side of the field en route to its fifth consecutive loss to the Aztecs.

SDSU won its 10th consecutive game in the Mountain time zone, the longest active streak in the nation, and won for the 15th time in the past 18 contests.

San Diego State finished the game with a 245-yard advantage in rushing (397-152), its fifth-largest advantage in the Division I era. New Mexico came into the weekend ranked fourth in the nation at 322.40 yards per game.

Josh Gavert led the Aztec defense with 11 tackles, including 0.5 tackles for loss, and his first interception of the season (third of career). Calvin Munson added eight stops and 1.0 TFL, while J.J. Whittaker and Na'im McGee came up with six tackles apiece.

Rocky Long, 4th Season As Head Coach and 6th At San Diego State

- Rocky Long is in his fourth season as San Diego State's head coach, his sixth season with the Aztecs and his 15th season as a head coach.
- Long, a two-time Mountain West Coach of the Year, is the all-time winningest coach in league history. He owns 90 career Mountain West wins (93 total), 12 more than TCU's Gary Patterson in second place. Amazingly, Long's 90 career MW wins are 37 more than the next active coach, Air Force's Troy Calhoun (53).
- Long has guided San Diego State to three bowl games in his first three seasons. His three bowl appearances while leading SDSU is tied with Don Coryell for the most in school history.
- Long is one of 20 coaches in the country to guide his current team to a bowl game in each of his first three seasons.
- With bowl game appearances in a school-record four straight seasons, the Aztecs have equaled their total number of bowls
 played in the 41 prior seasons (1969 through 2009).
- Between 2000-09, SDSU was 38-80 (.322) and owned the nation's 106th-best winning percentage. Since 2010, San Diego State is 37-21 (.640) and owns the nation's 28th-best winning percentage.
- Since the beginning of the 2010 campaign, San Diego State has posted a 37-21 record (.640). The only teams in the state of California with a better record during that span are Stanford (50-10) and USC (39-19).
- With 37 wins in their last 58 games (37-21 since the beginning of the 2010 campaign), the Aztecs have equaled their win total
 from the previous 111 games (37-74).
- Long's 28 wins in through his sixth game of his fourth seasons as the head coach at SDSU are the second most in school history. Below is a look at the most victories recorded at this point through four seasons.

largest discrepancy since a 278-yard edge at Wyoming on Nov. 24, 2012 (400-122).

- San Diego State is now 24-0 in its Division I era when owning at least a 196-yard advantage in rushing (65-4 when owning a 134-yard edge).
- The discrepancy is even more impressive considering that the Lobos came into the game ranked fourth in the nation in rushing at 322.40 yards per game.
- The Aztecs and UNM combined for 549 rushing yards, the ninth-highest total in SDSU's Division I history.
- San Diego State averaged 8.63 yards per rushing attempt, which was its second-best rush average in the Division I era, trailing
 only a 9.36 average vs. San Jose State on Oct. 21, 1995.
- The Aztecs rushed for three touchdowns in the game and now have seven rushing TDs over their last three outings.
- SDSU has won seven straight contests when rushing for at least three scores.
- San Diego State now has at least one rushing touchdown in 16 of its last 17 games.
- The Aztecs now have 18 rushing touchdowns over their last seven games (since Dec. 21, 2013), which is tied for 20th in the
 nation over that span.
- SDSU has outrushed its opponents in seven consecutive games and is now 20-10 in the Rocky Long era when outrushing its foe.
- San Diego State has 41 rushing touchdowns since Sept. 28, 2013, which ranks in a tie for 13th in the country over that span, and 33 scores since Oct. 26, 2013 (also tied for 13th).
- The Aztecs have a 100-yard rusher in 12 of their past 16 games and have a total of 14, 100-yard efforts during that span.
- SDSU had multiple 100-yard rushers for the 18th time in school history and is now 17-1 when it has two players gain at least 100 yards.
- San Diego State is 3-1 this year and 23-7 in the Rocky Long era when it has at least one 100-yard rusher.
- The Aztecs have 130 rushing touchdowns since the beginning of the 2010 season (58 games), which ranks in a tie for 21st in the nation over that span. SDSU had just 134 (113th nationally) rushing scores over their previous 11 years (1999-2009) in the Mountain West.
- This season San Diego State ranks second in the Mountain West and 15th in the nation in yards per carry (5.72), third (MW) and 25th (FBS) in rushing yards per game (218.50), and tied for third (MW) and tied for 36th (FBS) in rushing touchdowns (13).

Passing Notes:

- The Aztecs won despite having only three first downs passing, their fewest amount in a win since throwing for just two first downs against Colorado State on Dec. 2, 2006.
- SDSU won the game with just five completions, the program's fewest since Oct. 6, 1984 in a 21-0 at Wyoming.
- The five completions were tied for the third fewest in its' Division I era .
- San Diego State and New Mexico combined for just 184 passing yards, which are tied for the 13th fewest in an Aztec game in their Division I era.
- Over the last 46 games, the SDSU has 69 passing touchdowns and just 42 interceptions.
- San Diego State has 34 interceptions over its last 33 games.

Scoring Offense:

- The Aztecs have played in consecutive games in which fewer than 40 points have been scored by both teams for the first time since Oct. 13-20, 2007 (SDSU lost both of those games, but is 1-1 in those situations this year).
- San Diego State owned a 207-yard advantage in total offense (470-263), marking the 73rd time in its Division I era when it had at least a 200-yard advantage in total yards. The Aztecs are 68-5 when owning at least a 200-yard advantage.
- SDSU is averaging 425.5 yards per game since Sept. 28, 2013 (16 games), which ranks 50th in the country over that time frame.
- San Diego State has gone 96 games without suffering a shutout (Nov. 18, 2006, at TCU), which is the third-longest streak among current Mountain West schools (Air Force at 264 and Boise State at 217). That is the only time the Aztecs have been shut out in its last 190 games.
- The Aztecs improved to 2-1 on the year and 17-8 in the Rocky Long era when scoring first.
- SDSU also improved to 2-0 (2014) and 16-3 (Rocky Long era) when leading after the first quarter, 3-1 (2014) and 16-3 (Rocky Long era) when leading at halftime and 3-1 (2014) and 21-4 (Rocky Long era) when leading after three quarters.
- San Diego State is now 3-1 (2014) and 27-8 (Rocky Long era) when scoring just 20 or more points, 2-1 (2014) and 19-7 (Rocky Long era) when posting 400-plus yards of total offense, 2-0 (2014) and 13-2 (Rocky Long era) when converting at least 50 percent of its third-down attempts, 2-1 (2014) and 21-5 (Rocky Long era) when starting with a field position of 30 or better, and 3-1 (2014) and 27-8 (Rocky Long era) when at least 50 percent of its plays are rushing attempts.
- What a difference a year makes. Through six games in 2013, SDSU was 3-3 with a scoring margin of -36 (SDSU 160, Opponents 196). This season, San Diego State is 3-3 with a scoring margin of +22 (SDSU 143, Opponents 121). That is an improvement of 58 points in scoring margin.

Defensive Breakdown

Rushing Notes:

The Aztecs held New Mexico to just 152 rushing yards, the Lobos' fewest since gaining 137 at Colorado State on Nov. 24, 2012.

- It was their lowest output in a home game since running for 94 yards against Sam Houston State on Sept. 24, 2011.
- UNM came into the game ranked fourth in the nation in rushing at 322.40 yards per game.
- On the season, SDSU opponents are averaging just 3.50 yards per carry, which ranks fourth in the MW and 38th in the nation.
 San Diago Carto is also dilate in the parties in which defense (120.82).
- San Diego State is also 41st in the nation in rushing defense (130.83).
- The Aztecs have allowed 2,058 yards rushing on 615 carries (3.35 avg.) over their last 17 games (since Sept. 21, 2013).
- Over that stretch, the SDSU defense ranks ninth in rush average (3.35) and 13th in rushing yards per game (121.06).
- San Diego State has allowed a total of 4,313 rushing yards over its last 34 games (126.85).

Passing Notes:

- The Aztecs had an interception in their seventh consecutive game, which is the longest stretch since having one in eight straight games from Sept. 8-Nov. 13, 2010
- SDSU held its opponent to under 150 yards passing for the second straight game (143 at Fresno State, 111 vs. New Mexico).
- The last time San Diego State held an opponent to under 150 yards passing in back-to-back games was Nov. 5, 2011 (88 vs. New Mexico) and Nov. 12, 2011 (52 at Colorado State).
- The last time the Aztecs accomplished the feat in three straight games was Dec. 23, 2010-Sept. 10, 2011 (147 vs. Navy in 2010 Poinsettia Bowl, 147 vs. Cal Poly in 2011 opener and 43 at Army).
- SDSU held its opponent to a 50 percent or worse completion percentage for the second straight game (50 pct. at Fresno State, 45.83 pct. at New Mexico) for the first time since Nov. 5, 2011 (50 pct. vs. New Mexico) and Nov. 12, 2011 (40.91 pct. at Colorado State).
- The last time it has happened in three straight games was a four-game stretch in 2011 (Sept. 3-24, 2011).
- Keeping with the same theme, San Diego State has now held its opponents to below a 100 passing efficiency rating in back-toback games (85.76 at Fresno State, 90.10 at New Mexico) for the first time since those same two games in 2011 - Nov. 5 (66.96 vs. New Mexico) and Nov. 12 (51.67 at Colorado State).
- The last time the Aztecs held their opponent to below a 100 passing efficiency in three straight games was 2005 (Sept. 24-Oct. 8).
- SDSU improved to 1-1 this year and 10-2 in the Rocky Long era when it held its opponent to 150 or less passing yards.
- Since Mountain West competition started for the San Diego State (Sept. 27, last three games), San Diego State's passing defense
 ranks 26th in pass efficiency defense (108.2) and 37th in passing yards per game (200.00).

<u>#PumphitUp</u>



Now in his sophomore season, Donnel Pumphrey has established himself as one of the top running backs in the nation.

Through six games, the Doak Walker Award candidate has rushed for 807 yards with a 6.8 yards per carry average and 11 rushing touchdowns. In addition, he is third on the team with 11 catches for 67 yards. He has four 100-yard rushing games and a 200-yard rushing game

this season.

<u>Pumphrey ranks among the national leaders this season in rushing touchdowns</u> (T-3rd), rushing yards per game (9th) and rushing yards per carry (14th) He leads the Mountain West in all three categories.

Last Friday at New Mexico, Pumphrey took over the game, rushing for a career high 246 yards on 20 carries with two touchdowns. Despite SDSU starting a true freshman at quarterback and with little threat of the pass (SDSU completed five passes for 73 yards on the evening), the sophomore put on a remarkable show, posting the 13th biggest rushing game in school history and the seventh by an FBS player this season.

Earlier this year, he posted one of the best games of his career, with a career-high 22 carries, a career-high tying 167 rushing yards and a career-high four touchdowns against his hometown team, UNLV.

In the game against Oregon State, Pumphrey passed 1,000 rushing yards for his career on just his 168th career carry in his 16th career game (just fourth career start). His current totals are: 1,559 rushing yards and 19 rushing touchdowns in his career and a 6.4 yards per carry average.

Pumphrey rushed for 752 yards and compiled 234 yards receiving as a freshman in 2013. He found the end zone 10 times (eight rushing, two receiving) and averaged more than six yards a rush. He compiled three 100-yard rushing efforts and saw action in all 13 games for the Aztecs.

He is one of just 12 players in San Diego State history to record three consecutive 100-yard rushing games, joining Jim Allison, Marshall Faulk, Michael Franklin, George Jones, Ronnie Hillman, Jonas Lewis, Adam Muema, Larry Ned, Wayne Pittman, David Turner and T.C. Wright.

He is the first Aztec freshman with three consecutive 100-yard rushing games since Pro Football League Hall of Famer Marshall Faulk in 1991.

Pumphrey ranked among the top college true freshman running backs in the country last season.

He was one of just two freshmen in the country (19 players overall) to rush for at least 750 yards and record 230 yards

Ruffin Climbing Charts



After exploding on the season a year ago, Ezell Ruffin entered his senior campaign on the preseason Biletnikoff Award Watch List. Against North Carolina, he caught two passes for 64 yards before exiting the game with a broken collarbone. He had surgery on Sept. 8 and is expected to miss 4-to-6 weeks. The staff is hopefull that he will be able to return for the Nov. 1 game at Nevada.

A native of Long Beach, Calif., Ruffin entered his junior season (in 2013) with 17 career receptions. Last season, he led the team with 68 catches for 1,136 yards and three touchdowns. He produced three consecutive 100-yard receiving games, and had four 100-yard games in 2013 and five career games in which he has hit the century plateau.

His play down the stretch last season made noise nationally and he a had a strong debut this season, catching four passes for a team-high 53 yards. All four of his catches resulted in a San Diego State first down.

- Ruffin has been on quite a run since the middle of last season. All notes below are through games of Sept. 13.
- In the last nine games, Ruffin has 44 receptions for 776 yards and two touchdowns. Since Oct. 26, 2013, Ruffin is 48th in the nation in receiving yards per game (86.2) and is 43rd in receptions (44).
- In the last 10 games, Ruffin has 50 catches for 884 yards and three touchdowns. Since Oct. 10, 2013, Ruffin is 47th in the nation in yards per game (88.4) and 51st in receptions (50).
- In his last 12 games, Ruffin has 62 receptions for 991 yards. Since Sept. 28, Ruffin is 50th in the nation in receiving yards per game (87.9) and 39th in receptions (62).
- His 68 catches in 2013 are 45 more than all of his 2012 season.
- Ruffin has at least a catch in his last 16 games and has multiple receptions in 15 straight games since the start of the 2013 campaian.
- In his career, Ruffin has 91 catches for 1,572 yards. Ruffin cleared the 1,000-yard plateau in receiving yardage on the first offensive play from scrimmage against New Mexico (Nov. 2, 2013), when he caught a 75-vard touchdown pass. Ruffin's complete bio can be found on pages 55-57 of the notes.

Quinn Kaehler Enters Second Season As Starting QB



A year ago at this time, Quinn Kaehler had worked his way to second on the depth chart, a walk-on firmly behind a returning starter at the quarterback position. But the Pleasant Hill, Calif., native entered the Ohio State game (the second of the 2013 season) on the fourth series and started the final 11 contests of the season.

Kaehler shook off the rust from off-season surgery to complete 72-of-124 passes (58.1 percent) this year for 871 yards and two touchdowns. He has a quarterback rating of 111.10. He suffered an injury late in the game against UNLY, did not play at Fresno State and played only the second half last Friday at New Mexico, attempting only three passes (one completion for 10 yards).

He had a 14-game streak of consecutive games with at least 200 yards passing broken at Oregon State. It was the third longestactive streak in the nation, behind Marshall's Rakeem Cato (31) and Oregon State's Sean Mannion (15).

He ended his junior campaign by going 232-of-389 (59.6 percent) for 3,007 yards with 19 touchdowns and nine interceptions. His quarterback rating was a very respectable 136.06.

Among the national leaders in 2013, Kaehler ranked 29th in passing yards per game (250.6), 32nd in pass completions per game (19.33), 36th in passing yards per completion (12.96), 46th in total offense per game (241.5) and 49th in passing touchdowns (19).

Notes on Kaehler's season in 2013:

- He became the ninth Aztec to throw for 3,000 yards in a season and the first since Ryan Lindley in 2011, despite not starting the first two games.
- His 59.6 percent completion rate was the second highest for an Aztec starter since Kevin O'Connell completed 62.1 percent of his passes in 2005.
- He had thrown for more than 200 yards in 14 straight games, the longest streak for an Aztec player in more than 18 seasons
 and the third-longest active streak in the nation before the streak was snapped Sept. 20 at Oregon State.
- He is 9-5 as a starter in his career. That is a 64.3 winning percentage and he is 5-3 as a starter away from home.
- Kaehler completed more than 60 percent of his passes in seven of the 14 games he played and has just 10 interceptions in his last 391 pass attempts. In three of those attempts, the ball hit the receiver first.
- Below is a look at some more impressive numbers from his first career start against Oregon State last year.
- 30 points for the team were the most in a San Diego State quarterback debut since Sept. 5, 1997, when Kevin McKechnie led SDSU to a 45-31 win over Navy.
- 16 completions were the most in a San Diego State quarterback debut since Oct. 11, 2008, when Drew Westling completed 18
 passes against Air Force.
- 251 yards were the most in a San Diego State quarterback debut since Aug. 30, 2008, when Ryan Lindley threw for 352 against Cal Poly.
- 158.74 passing efficiency was the highest in a San Diego State quarterback debut since Sept. 5, 1997, when Kevin McKechnie recorded a 291.82 rating.
- 64.0 percent completion rate was the highest in a San Diego State quarterback debut since Sept. 5, 1997, when Kevin McKechnie recorded an 80.0 rate.

Donnel Pumphrey Names Mountain West Offensive Player of the Week (Oct. 13)

San Diego State football's Donnel Pumphrey (Las Vegas, Nev./Canyon Springs High) has been named the Mountain West Player of the Week, the league announced Monday. It is the second career award for the sophomore and second in three weeks.

Pumphrey rushed for a career-high 246 yards and two touchdowns on 20 attempts, averaging 12.3 yards per carry, as the Aztecs defeated New Mexico, 24-14, Friday in Albuquerque, N.M.

The 246 yards were the 13th most in program history and the seventh most in the nation this year. He became the 19th player in school history to rush for at least 200 yards (40th occasion overall). It was also his fourth 100-yard rushing game of the season (in six contests) and seventh of his career (in 19 games), the latter which is tied for 13th all-time at SDSU.

It was Pumphrey's fifth career game with multiple rushing touchdowns and sixth overall with multiple touchdowns (also has one with one rushing, one receiving).

Including in the 246 yards was career-long 93-yard touchdown, which is tied for the second-longest rush in the Division I era and tied for the third longest in program history. Pumphrey, who added a 7-yard reception, helped San Diego State improve to 6-1 over his career when he rushes for at least 100 yards and 8-3 when he records at least one rushing touchdowns.

On the season, Pumphrey has 807 rushing yards and 11 touchdowns on 119 attempts (6.8 avg.). He ranks in a tie for third in the nation in rushing touchdowns (11), tied for fifth in points per game (12.00) (tied for fourth among non-kickers), ninth in rushing yards per game (134.50), 14th in rushing yards per carry (6.78) and 19th in all-purpose yards per game (145.67).

Pumphrey & Alesi Named Mountain West Offensive Player of the Week (Sept. 29)

San Diego State football players Donnel Pumphrey (Las Vegas, Nev./Canyon Springs High) and Joel Alesi (El Cajon, Calif./Christian High) were each named Mountain West Players of the Week, the league announced Sept. 29. Pumphrey was chosen as the MW Offensive Player of the Week, while Alesi was picked as the MW Special Teams Player of the Week.

The duo helped the Aztecs down UNLV, 34-17, in the conference opener for both teams. It is the first career weekly league award for Pumphrey and the second for Alesi.

A true sophomore, Pumphrey set career highs with 22 rushing attempts and four touchdowns, while equaling a then career best with 167 yards, averaging 7.6 yards per carry. He had 107 yards and all four of his touchdowns in the first half as SDSU raced out to a 28-10 lead. It was his third 100-yard game of the season (in four contests).

The four rushing touchdowns (and four overall scores) were the most by an Aztec player since Adam Muema had four at Wyoming on Nov. 24, 2012 and tied for the fifth most in a game in school history. Pumphrey's four rushing touchdowns also were tied for the fifth most in a game in Mountain West history and the third most in a game in FBS play this season.

Alesi, meanwhile, punted five times for 191 yards for a 38.2 average. Three of his five punts landed inside the 20-yard line and only one was returned. Two of the five punts pinned the Rebels inside the 6 (3-yard line and 5-yard line), two were fair caught and none of the five went for a touchback.

Looking Back at 2013 Highlights

- San Diego State capped an 8-win campaign with a 49-24 victory over Buffalo in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl.
- San Diego State finished with a 6-2 conference record and sole possession of second place in the West Division of the Mountain West.
- The Aztecs played eight games that were decided by seven points or less. That figure tied with UCF and Georgia for the most games in the FBS in 2013. SDSU is an impressive 6-2 in those contests and has won its last four contests decided by seven points or less.

- San Diego State tied an FBS record by playing in four overtime games in a single season. The Aztecs posted a 3-1 record in those contests.
- SDSU rallied from a fourth quarter deficit to win five times last season. That was the highest total in FBS in 2013, one ahead of Auburn, Troy and UCF.
- San Diego State rallied from a 14-point or greater deficit to win three games in 2013. That is the highest total in FBS play in 2013, one ahead of Duke, Northern Illinois, SMU and UNLV.
- The Aztecs have won their last nine games played in the Mountain time zone (including last Friday at New Mexico), which is the longest active win streak in the time zone.
- SDSU won four road games in 2013 to tie for the eighth-highest win total in the country.
- San Diego State became the first team since 2010 and just the 19th team since 1980 to overcome an 0-3 start to reach a bowl game. The Aztecs became just the sixth team in the last 33 seasons, to win a bowl game after opening a campaign 0-3.

A Remarkable Season

In a number of different ways, the 2013 San Diego State team put together one of the most remarkable seasons not only in school history, but in the nation. From losing its first three games of the season, to rallying from fourth quarter deficits a national-best five times to win games to playing in an FBS record four overtime games, the 2013 San Diego State football team will go down as one of the most remarkable squads in the program history.

Here are a few of the many amazing things the group accomplished.

STARTING 0-3

Starting with three consecutive losses, which has typically been fatal for teams looking to advance to postseason play. Of the 488 teams that opened play 0-3 since 1980, only 19 advanced to bowl play (including 2013 SDSU) and only 31 have posted a winning record (including 2013 SDSU). Below are a few more tidbits.

Of those 488 teams, only 19 (including 2013 San Diego State) have won at least seven games, only seven have won eight contests and no team since 1980 that opened 0-3 went onto win at least nine games. Below is the most wins by a team that opened 0-3 during the past 34 seasons:

FOUR OVERTIME GAMES

San Diego State played in overtime games in two of its final four, three times in its final seven games, four in its final nine and five of its last 19 games (entering 2014). Among the notables concerning the extra frame:

- San Diego State tied the FBS record for most overtime games in a season (4). The Aztecs share the record with 2004 Northwestern, 2008 Buffalo and 2012 Louisiana-Monroe. Oddly, all four teams, including the 2013 San Diego State team, have posted a 3-1 overtime record in the four extra session games.
- 2013 marked the second time in school history that the Aztecs have played in consecutive overtime games. During the 1998 campaign, San Diego State played back-to-back overtime contests with wins at New Mexico (36-33) on Oct. 17 and against Utah (21-20) on Oct. 24.
- SDSU has now played in five overtime games over its last 22 games after playing in four over its previous 183 contests.

SEVEN POINTS OR LESS

San Diego State played in eight games decided by seven points or less in 2013. That figure tied for the FBS high last season with Georgia and UCF. Below is a look at the teams that played the most games decided by seven points or less this season, with their record in those games.

In 2013, the Aztecs played in seven consecutive games decided by seven points or less. That is the longest such stretch by any team in the country this season. SDSU was a remarkable 6-1 in those games during this stretch. That winning percentage of 85.7 percent ties the 2006 Maryland team for the best winning percentage during a streak of at least seven straight games decided by seven points or less since 1980.

COMEBACKS

This season, San Diego State has proven that no deficit is too large to overcome. Five times the Aztecs have used a fourth-quarter rally to win a game and three times SDSU has overcome at least a 14-point deficit to claim victory.

- How common is that? Glad you asked.
- San Diego State led the country with five fourth quarter comebacks in 2013. In fact, only Auburn, Troy and UCF had as many as four comebacks in the final quarter.
- The Aztecs led the country by overcoming a deficit of at least 14 points in three of its 2013 wins. Only Duke, Northern Illinois, SMU and UNLV rallied from a two touchdown deficit twice last season.
- SDSU posted a fourth-quarter rally to win each of its past three regular-season victories: at San José State (trailed by 11, won 34-30), at Hawai'i (trailed by seven, won 28-21 in overtime), Boise State (trailed by seven, won 34-31).
- Following the San José State game when San Diego State rallied from an 11-point deficit in the fourth quarter to win, the Aztecs improved to 5-174-2 (.033) when trailing by 11 or more in the fourth quarter.
- Since Oct. 20, 2012, SDSU has rallied from a double-digit fourth quarter deficit to win three times (the two times above and at Nevada last season). Since that date, in all of FBS, there have only been 28 occurrences of a team rallying from 11 points or more in the fourth quarter to win (as of Nov. 9). San Diego State leads the nation with three such comebacks, while Arizona State and Nebraska each have two.

SDSU Names Team Captains for 2014 Season

San Diego State head football coach Rocky Long has announced that seniors Sam Meredith, Terry Poole, Ezell Ruffin and J.J. Whittaker have been named captains for the upcoming 2014 season. The quartet was selected in a vote by their teammates on Aug. 22.

Meredith, a defensive end from La Mesa, Calif., had 16 tackles, two tackles for loss, two fumble recoveries, a sack, a pass breakup and a blocked kick last year, while batting injuries throughout the season. Meredith, who started six times and played in eight of the team's 13 games, was an honorable-mention all-Mountain West pick and the team's defensive player of the year in 2012 as a true sophomore. Over his career, Meredith has 56 tackles, 8.5 TFL, three fumble recoveries, two sacks and two PBUs across 33 games and 19 starts. He is a preseason second-team selection by *Athlon Sports*.

Poole, an offensive tackle from Monterey, Calif., started all 12 games he appeared in last year as a junior, his first as an Aztec. He became one of just two SDSU players to be named to both the 2013 all-Mountain West team (honorable mention) and to the MW Fall All-Academic Team. Poole, who will move to left tackle after playing right tackle last year, allowed just two sacks in 492 dropbacks (0.4 percent) in 2013. He has already racked up the preseason accolades, including first-team recognition from *Sporting News*, and second-team honors from *Athlon Sports*, *Lindy's Sports* and *Phil Steele's College Football Preview* magazine.

Ruffin, a wide receiver from Long Beach, Calif., led San Diego State last year with 68 catches and 1,136 yards to go along with three touchdowns. The 1,136 yards were the most by an Aztec nonsenior in the history of the MW (since 1999) and are the 10th most among in the nation among the returning FBS players. Ruffin went onto be named a MW honorable-mention selection and the team's co-offensive player of the year. Ruffin, who has 85 career receptions, 1,455 yards and three touchdowns, is on the 2014 Biletnikoff Award Watch List (top collegiate wide receiver), and has been named a preseason all-MW second-team pick by *Lindy's Sports* and *Phil Steele*, and a third-team honoree by *Athlon Sports*.

Whittaker, a cornerback from Oceanside, Calif., racked up 32 tackles (24 solos), 11 pass breakups, three interceptions, a forced fumble and two tackles for loss in his first 13 career starts and appearances. An honorable-mention all-MW selection, he ranked fifth in the league with 1.08 passes defended (PBUs + INTs) per game (14 total). Whittaker was named the MW Defensive Player of the Week on Nov. 25, 2013 after recording two interceptions against Boise State on Nov. 23, including one for a touchdown. He also had five PBUs against Nevada on Oct. 4, which was tied for the second most in a game in the country last year and the second most in a game in program history. Whittaker, who is on the Jim Thorpe Award Watch List (best defensive back), has been named a preseason all-conference selection by the MW media, and is a first-team pick by *Athlon Sports, Lindy's Sports, Phil Steele* and *Sporting News*.

Aztecs Picked Second in Mountain West Division

The San Diego State football team has been picked to finish second in the West Division of the Mountain West in the 2014 preseason poll, the league announced Tuesday in Las Vegas. The poll is voted on by media representatives who cover the conference.

The second-place prediction matches the Aztecs' highest in the 16-year history of the league (also in 2013), although this is the second year of the two divisions in the MW. SDSU was picked to finish third in 1999 and 2004, and averaged a predicted finish of 6.5 from 2005-12.

San Diego State matched its prediction last year, taking second in the West with a 6-2 MW mark. In 2012, the Aztecs were picked fifth, but went onto finish in a three-way tie for first with Boise State and Fresno State en route to its 19th conference championship. SDSU has ended up at or better than its projected finish in five straight seasons and eight times over the past nine years.

San Diego State garnered 172 points, just two shy of two-time defending champion Fresno State's 174. Both the Aztecs and the Bulldogs picked up 15 first-place votes apiece, while Nevada had the other three and had 130 points for third in the West Division. UNLV (95), San José State (87) and Hawai'i (35) rounded out the West.

SDSU received 15 first-place votes after earning just seven total over the previous 15 preseason polls. The only other time San Diego State received multiple first-place votes in the poll was in the MW inaugural season of 1999 when it had four first-place votes. The Aztecs had one first-place vote apiece in 2001, 2012 and 2013.

Boise State paced the Mountain Division with 183 points, including 20 first-place votes. Utah State came in second with 176 and 12 first-place votes and Colorado State was third with 135 and the other first-place vote. Wyoming (90), New Mexico (56) and Air Force (53) were picked fourth, fifth and sixth, respectively, in the Mountain Division.

SDSU is the only school to play road games against the predicted winners of each division (Boise State and Fresno State). Additionally, San Diego State plays at Nevada, the team picked right behind the Aztecs in the preseason poll.

FSSD to Host Football Show with Rocky Long this Year

San Diego State football head coach Rocky Long and FOX Sports San Diego have announced a coaches show for the upcoming 2014 season. Aztec Football with Rocky Long will air each Thursday following live programming on FOX Sports San Diego, beginning Aug. 21.

The weekly show will give unprecedented access to the SDSU program and Long, the Mountain West's all-time leader in victories and two-time MW Coach of the Year. Aztec Football with Rocky Long, which will be hosted by Kris Budden and will feature San Diego State quarterback Kevin O'Connell as the analyst, will consist of player and coach features, behind the scenes footage, X's and O's with Long, a preview of the upcoming game, a recap of the last game and much more.

Aztecs Rising

Over the past several seasons, San Diego State has established itself as one of the premier athletic programs in the country.

- Since 2010, SDSU has had nine different programs finish an NCAA championship in the top 25 Men's Basketball, Women's Basketball, Men's Golf, Women's Soccer, Softball, Women's Indoor and Outdoor Track and Field (three times).
- Since 2010, SDSU has had six teams finish in the top 10 at the NCAA championship Men's Basketball (twice), Women's Basketball, Men's Golf, Women's Soccer, Women's Outdoor Track and Field.
- In each of the last three years, SDSU has enjoyed its best point-total in the Learfield Sports Director's Cup, including the 2013-14 season.
- In 2013, SDSU's average home football attendance increased by 2,300 fans. It marked the third time in the last four years that SDSU's increase in average home attendance ranked among the national leaders (6th in 2010, 9th in 2011, 30th in 2013).
- SDSU is one of 11 schools nationally to play in the last five NCAA men's basketball tournaments. No other California or Mountain West school can make that claim.
- Over the last seasons, a total of 13 SDSU coaches have received conference coach of the year honors.
- SDSU set a school record with a department average of 980 in the Academic Progress Report (APR) released in May 2014 by
 the NCAA. Among those programs that scored record multi-year APR figures were football, men's basketball and baseball.

2014-15 Update

- Cross Country The Aztecs have had four solid races to start out the season. SDSU opened with a third-place finish at the Mark Covert Classic in Brea, Calif., on Aug. 30, a fourth-place showing at the UC Riverside Invitational on Sept. 13, a second-place finish at the 70th Annual Aztec Invitational on Sept. 20, despite running only six of its 12 runners, and a 10th-place finish out of 21 teams at the Stanford Invite on Sept. 27. Elaine Ribeiro has been SDSU's top finisher in all three races she competed in.
- Women's Soccer (11-2-1; 6-0 Mountain West) The Aztecs, who are defending Mountain West regular-season and postseasonchampions, entered the 2014 season with a No. 24 national ranking and were once again picked to capture the league crown in the MW preseason coaches poll. SDSU is 11-2-1 on the season, including a 3-0 victory over No. 10 Michigan, and has seven straight wins. Kelsey Booth leads San Diego State in scoring with 19 points on six goals and seven assists.
- Men's Soccer (6-6; 0-3 Pac-12) The Aztecs kicked off the 2014 season with six straight home matches. San Diego State lost its opener, 1-0, to Cal State Bakersfield, but won five straight games, including wins over No. 25 Clemson and No. 19 Denver. SDSU lost to No. 2 UCLA, 1-0, in is Pac-12 opener, and was swept on the road last week at Stanford and California. David Olsen leads SDSU in scoring with six goals, while Forrayah Bass has three goals and four assists.
- Volleyball (7-8; 3-2 Mountain West) The Aztecs were picked fourth in the MW preseason poll. The season has been a series of streaks as SDSU lost its first three at the Chevron Wahine Rainbown Invitational in Honolulu, won three straight at the SDSU/USD Challenge, lost three straight (vs. USD, vs. Clemson and Alabama at Alabama), won two straight, including a 3-1 victory over Fresno State in its conference opener, before falling at Wyoming and Colorado State two weekends ago, and bouncing back with home wins over New Mexico and Air Force last weekend.

Under the direction of fourth-year head coach Rocky Long, San Diego State has made a dramatic turnaround.

- SDSU is one of 29 schools nationally to appear in bowl games each of the last four seasons. San Diego State is one of only two California schools to appear in four consecutive bowl games (Stanford) and is one of only two current Mountain West schools to appear in bowl games in 2010, 2011, 2012 and 2013 (Boise State).
- With a bowl game in a school-record four straight years, the Aztecs have equaled their total number of bowls played in the previous 41 seasons from 1969-2009.
- Long's impact has been felt almost immediately, first as the defensive coordinator in 2009-10 and then as the head coach since 2011. SDSU went without a winning season for the 10 straight years from 2000-09 when it won 32.2 percent of its games and owned one of the nation's worst records. Below is a look at the dramatic turnaround.

- San Diego State owns a 37-21 record over the past four-plus seasons. Prior to the 2010 campaign, it took the Aztecs 111 games to compile 36 wins (37-74).
- The 34 victories from 2010-13 is the highest win-total over a four-year span since the Aztecs went 36-7-1 from 1974-77.

SDSU is 1 of 5 schools to play in 4 straight bowl games and earn an NCAA men's basketball berth in each of the last 5 years.



SDSU is 1 of 5 schools to win a bowl game and advance to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA men's hoops tournament in 2013-14.

ROCKY LONG

Has 14-plus years of head coaching experience and has spent 17-plus seasons as a defensive coordinator.

AT SAN DIEGO STATE:

- Became San Diego State's 18th head football coach on Jan. 12, 2011.
- Was the defensive coordinator at SDSU from 2009-10.
- In 2012, led the Aztecs to a share of the Mountain West title at 7-1. It was San Diego State's 19th conference title, first Mountain West championship and first league title since 1998. The Aztecs were picked fifth in the preseason poll.
- In his first year in 2009, helped SDSU improve defensive marks in points allowed, first downs, first downs, rushing, total defense, thirddown conversion percentage, fourth-down conversion percentage, sacks, interceptions and red-zone conversion percentage, among other categories.

AT NEW MEXICO

- Compiled a school-record 65 victories and led the Lobos to five bowl game appearances in his final seven seasons. His teams were bowl eligible in seven of his last eight campaigns.
- In his final nine seasons in Albuquerque, Long's defensive units ranked among the top 30 in fewest yards allowed six times and among the top 40 against the rush every year. In both 2001 and 2003, New Mexico's defense ranked fifth nationally in fewest rushing yards allowed per game.
- While at New Mexico, he coached 13 players selected in the NFL Draft, 10 players who earned All-America honors and had a MWC-high 34 first-team all-conference selections since 2003.

OTHER COACHING EXPERIENCE

- Prior to accepting the head coaching position at New Mexico, Long served as defensive coordinator for 12 seasons at three different schools. He was the defensive coordinator for two years under Bob Toledo at UCLA in 1996-97, for five seasons at Oregon State from 1991-95, and for five campaigns at Wyoming from 1981-85.
- Also served as an assistant coach at TCÚ, with the CFL's British Columbia team and started his career at New Mexico has a graduate assistant coach in 1972.

PLAYING EXPERIENCE:

- Originally a defensive back, Long became a three-year starter at quarterback for the Lobos from 1969-71. He earned team most valuable player honors and was the Western Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year as a senior.
- Long played professionally in the CFL with British Columbia in 1972-73 and 1975-76. He also competed in the World Football League with the Detroit Wheels in 1974.
- Attended Alta Loma High School in Alta Loma, Calif.

PERSONAL:

Both of Long's daughters are head coaches at the university level. Roxanne was hired in July of 2012 as the head women's basketball coach at Rogers State University (NAIA) in Claremore, Okla., after four years in the same position at Texas Lutheran (NCAA Division III). Hannah, meanwhile, is the head volleyball coach at Southwestern University, an NCAA Division III school in Georgetown, Texas. She is a four-time conference coach of the year, having compiled a 306-79 (.795) record in 10 years, including a pair of regional finals appearances in 2008 and 2009.

SAN DIEGO - Donnel Pumphrey ran for 111 yards and two touchdowns in San Diego State's 38-7 victory over Northern Arizona in its 2014 opener on Aug. 30 at Qualcomm Stadium.

Quinn Kaehler passed for 205 yards and a touchdown, completing 18 of 29 attempts, for the Aztecs, who scored the first 24 points of the game.

After punting on its opening drive, SDSU forced the Lumberjacks into a 3-and-out and got the ball back with 11:58 left in the first. Pumphrey completed San Diego State's 9-play, 63-yard drive with a 1-yard touchdown run to but the home team on the board.

After NAU punted again on its next possession, the Aztecs mounted a 7-play, 88-yard drive to go up, 14-0. The drive was highlighted by four straight first down plays - a 14-yard pass from Kaehler to Eric Judge, a 15-yard strike from Kaehler to Ezell Ruffin, a 33-yard reverse handoff to Lloyd Mills and a 21-yard scamper by Chase Price. Price finished off the drive with a 1-yard touchdown run on 3rd and goal.

Northern Arizona tried to answer after getting all the way to the SDSU 30, thanks to a 50-yard catch and run by Alex Holmes from Kyren Poe on a 2nd and 15. San Diego State stood tall, however, and forced the Lumberjacks into a 45-yard field goal attempt. On the try, Alex Barrett reached up and swatted the kick down to keep NAU off the scoreboard.

On the ensuing possession, the Aztecs got into field goal range of their own, thanks in part to a Northern Arizona pass interference call and a 33-yard run by Pumphrey. Donny Hageman than split the upright from 48 yards to put SDSU up, 17-0. It was the first field goal make by San Diego State since Sept. 28, 2013 vs. New Mexico State.

Hageman later looked to make it four straight scores for the Aztecs, but his 46-yard attempt went wide left, giving the ball back to the Lumberjacks.

After being forced to punt once again, NAU's fourth out of its five possessions (the other was the blocked drive, completing all five of his passes for 75 yards, ending with a 2-yard toss to a wide open Robert Craighead and giving San Diego State a 24-0 advantage at the half.

Northern Arizona finally got on the scoreboard with 6:36 left in the third quarter as Jahn rumbled in from 1-yard out, capping a 9-play, 74-yard drive.

The Lumberjacks appeared to gain the momentum after the touchdown after they forced the Aztecs into a 3-and-out, and getting all the way to the SDSU 38. Kyren Poe's pass on a 3rd and 5, however, was picked off by Calvin Munson and returned 64 yards to the NAU 1.

Pumphrey didn't waste any time as he scored on the very first play, putting San Diego State back up by 24 at 31-7.

Northern Arizona got the ball back, but was forced into its third 3-and-out of the game. The Aztecs' Lloyd Mills then took the punt 67 yards to seal the win for the home team. It was SDSU's third punt return for a touchdown in four games.

San Diego State improved to 47-40-5 all-time in season-opening games, including a 19-6-1 mark in its Division I era (since 1969) when the opener is at home.

The 31-point margin of victory was the Aztecs' largest since beating Hawai'i by 38 (52-14) on Oct. 6, 2012.

Kaehler extended his streak of 200-yard passing games to 13, the longest streak by a SDSU quarterback since at least 1996

Price added 45 yards on the ground and also caught two balls for 22 yards, while Judge (5 receptions, 51 yards) and Ruffin (4 receptions, 53 yards) combined for nine catches and 104 yards. Malik Smith led the San Diego State defense with seven tackles and three pass breakups in his first career

start, while Trey Lomax and J.J.Whittaker contributed six stops apiece.

The seven points allowed were the fewest against the Aztecs since a 42-7 win over Army on Sept. 8, 2012.

at No. 21/23 North Carolina

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. - San Diego State held a pair of double-digit second-half leads at No. 21/23 North Car-olina, but couldn't hold on in a 31-27 loss on Sept. 6.

Quinn Kaehler threw for a career-high 341 yards and a touchdown, and Donnel Pumphrey recorded his second straight 100-yard rushing game with 100 yards and two touchdowns on 17 attempts, but the Tar Heels scored on four straight possessions over the final two quarters and stopped the Aztecs' last drive.

Down, 31-27, with four minutes left, Kaehler used a 12-play, 72-yard drive to get SDSU all the way down to the UNC 3-yard line. His 1st and goal attempt from the 3, however, was intercepted by a diving Tim Scott in the corner of the end zone to end the game in favor of North Carolina.

After the Tar Heels took Kaehler's first interception back 100 yards for a score early in the second quarter, San Diego State bounced back with a quick three-play 75-yard drive, highlighted by a 19-yard gain by Pumphrey and a 56-yard touchdown strike from Kaehler to Eric Judge.

The Aztecs got the ball back on the Tar Heels' next drive as Alex Barrett deflected Mitch Trubisky's pass attempt on the third play of the drive into the hands of Jon Sanchez, who returned it six yards to the UNC 41. Five players later, Pumphrey punched it in from 12 yards to put SDSU up, 14-7, at halftime.

At the half, San Diego State had piled up 244 yards to North Carolina's 108, while dominating the time of possession by almost nine minutes (19:16 to 10:44).

After Thomas Moore missed a field goal, the Aztecs stretched their lead to 14 at 21-7 when Pumphrey's 3-yard TD run completed a 7-play, 76-yard drive.

The Tar Heels responded with a long 14-play, 65-yard drive over 4:26 with a 11-yard touchdown pass from Marquise Williams to Quinshad David to get within seven points at 21-14 with 4:40 remaining in the third quarter.

Donny Hageman made it 24-14 with a 49-yard field goal early in the fourth quarter in a drive that ate up 5:44 of clock time.

UNC, however, took hardly any time at all to answer as Williams connected on a 91-yard pass to Mack Hollins and make it a one-possession game once again at 24-21.

Kaehler got SDSU into scoring position on the team's ensuing drive, thanks to a 27-yard pass to Robert Craighead and a 24-yard strike to Dakota Gordon, but had to settle for a 40-yard field goal by Hageman.

North Carolina used a 8-play, 80-yard drive, culminating in a 2-yard rushing TD by Elijah Hood, to take just its second lead of the game with 8:01 left in the fourth quarter.

It appeared the Tar Heels were going to put the game out of reach as Brian Walker intercepted Kaehler on the SDSU 40 and returned it 26 yards to the 14-yard line. The San Diego State defense, however, stood tall and kept UNC to a 23-yard field goal and slim 4-point lead (31-27).

The Aztecs got all the way to the 3-yard line where Scott made the diving interception and sealed the win for North Carolina.

SDSU outgained the Tar Heels, 509-394 for the game, including a 341-263 advantage in the air. San Diego State also held an edge in rushing yards (168-131), time of possession (37:26-22:34) and first downs (23-20), but its three interceptions led to a touchdown, field goal and kneel down.

Clase Price complimented Pumprey's 100 yards with 71 on 16 carries. Judge had three catches for a career-high 94 yards and a touchdown, while Larry Clark and Gordon each had three receptions for 42 yards.

Trey Lomax had a career- and game-high 10 tackles to pace the Aztec defense, while J.J. Whittaker and Na'im McGee added career-high marks of seven tackles apiece. Despite the loss, SDSU had a second half lead vs. a top-25 non-conference opponent on the road for the

first time since Sept. 18, 2004 at No. 17/17 Michigan.

CORVALLIS, Ore. - Sean Mannion threw for 275 yards as Oregon State scored the final 28 points of the

game in a 28-7 win over San Diego State on Sept. 20. The Aztecs were outgained, 372-215, over the game and were behind on time of possession by almost 11 minutes (35:27-24:33). Additonally, the Beavers held a 25-11 advantage in first downs and ran 18 more plays (67-49).

Donnel Pumphrey led SDSU once again with 89 rushing yards on 17 carries (5.2 avg.) and the team's lone touchdown.

San Diego State jumped out to a 7-0 lead on its opening 8-play, 75-yard drive. The Aztecs began the game with a 36-yard rush by Lloyd Mills to get all thew ay to the OSU 34-yard line. After an incomplete pass on a flea flicker, Pumphrey went to work with four straight carries for 27 yards. Quarterback Quinn Kaehler found Mills on a 5-yard completion to set up a 1st and goal on the 2, before Pumphrey finished the drive and give SDSU its lone lead of the game.

After forcing Oregon State to punt, San Diego State got the ball back but had to punt after going 3 and out. On Joel Alesi's punt, however, the Beavers' Victor Bolden fumbled the return and Pierre Romain pounced on it to give the Aztecs the ball back on OSU's 38.

SDSŬ, however, would give it right back after Kaehler took a sack and, and after a timeout, was picked off by Steven Nelson.

Oregon State then put together a 12-play, 70-yard drive, ending with a 12-yard TD run by Terron Ward, to tie it up at 7-7.

Each team exchanged punts until San Diego State used a 19-yard pass from Kaehler to Mills and a 15yard run by Pumphrey to get to the Beaver 33-yard line. The Aztecs, however, drew two delay of game penalties and Kaehler was sacked for a loss of nine yards to get out of field goal range.

OSU responded with a 8-play, 88-yard drive to close the half with another Ward touchdown, this time from two yards out, to take a 14-7 lead.

Oregon State scored on each of its first two possessions in the second half (making it three straight overall), first a 5-yard TD run by Storm Woods and then a 2-yard scamper by Woods, to put the game out of reach.

SDSU, which allowed multiple rushing touchdowns for the first time in eight contests, had gone 14 straight games wihtout suffering consecutive defeats before Sept. 20.

Kaehler was 14-for-26 for 106 vards and two interceptions in the loss for San Diego State. Kaehler, who dropped to 9-5 all-time as the team's starting quarterback, had his streak of 14 consecutive games with 200 yards passing snapped. The streak was the longest by an Aztec since at least 1996 and the third-longest active streak in the nation.

Making his first career start in place of injured Biletnikoff Award candidate Ezell Ruffin, Mills had career highs of three receptions, 35 receiving yards and 36 rushing yards, while adding two punt returns for 22 yards.

Trey Lomax, who came into the weekend ranked in a tie for fourth nationally among freshmen with 8.0 tackles per game, had a career-high 11 stops for SDSU, while J.J. Whittaker also set a career high with 11 tackles (eight solo).

The San Diego State defense forced two fumbles (Cody Galea and Sam Meredith) and recovered their first (Pierre Romain) of the season. Malik Smith also added his first career interception.

Mannion's 275 passing yards gave him 11,339 for his career, pulling him in front of Derek Anderson atop the Oregon State career list. He was 24-for-31 for the 275 yards and no touchdowns with one interception.

Woods rushed for 52 yards on 11 carries (4.7 avg.) for the Beavers and Ward had 50 yards on 15 attempts (3.3 avg.), and each running back scored two touchdowns apiece.

Hunter Jarmon had five receptions for 76 yards, while Ward added five catches for 35 yards. OSU improved to 3-0 for the fifth time since 1999.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State began its quest for a 20th conference title with a 34-17 victory over UNLV Saturday night at Qualcomm Stadium.

Donnel Pumphrey rushed for a career-high tying 167 yards, including 107 yards in the first half, and a career-best four rushing touchdowns as the Aztecs won their 14th game in their last 16 league outing

Pumphrey, who also set a career high with 22 attempts, averaging 7.6 yards per carry, posted his third 100-yard rushing game in four contests on the year as SDSU posted its largest margin of victory (17 points) in a MW game since a 19-point win over Air Force on Nov. 10, 2012.

It was the Rebels who got on the scoreboard first as they got into good field position after forcing San Diego State to a 3-and-out on its opening possession. Aztecs' Joel Alesi punted it 44 yards to Jay Mitchell at the UNLV 39, who returned it 48 yards to set up 1st and 10 on the 13. The SDSU defense, however, stood tall and held the Rebels to a 22-yard field goal by Jonathan Leiva.

San Diego State wasted no time answering as Pumphrey took the first play of the team's second drive 71 yards to the end zone to put the Aztecs on top, 7-3.

After the two teams exchanged punts, UNLV drove 88 yards on seven plays, ending with a 44-yard touch-down pass from Blake Decker to Devonte Boyd. It would be the Rebels' final lead of the game (10-7), however, as SDSU scored 24 unanswered points to break open a close contest, including three straight touchdowns by Pumphrey.

Pumphrey, a Las Vegas, Nev., native, scored on runs from one yard, three yards and one yard, the latter coming with 11 seconds left in the half. San Diego State had started with the ball with just 0:43 left on its own 15. Quarterback Quinn Kaehler got the Aztecs down the field in a hurry, though, with a 24-yard completion to Larry Clark, a 15-yard pass to Mikah Holder two plays later and a 45-yard strike to Lloyd Mills two plays after that down to the 1-yard line. After calling a timeout, Pumphrey attempted to throw his first touchdown pas, but his attempt to Daniel Brunskill fell to the turf. On the very next play, Pumphrey pounded it across the end zone to put SDSU up, 28-10, at intermission. Neither team scored in the third quarter, but UNLV did threaten on its opening possession. The Rebels got

to its own 47 after a 15-yard pass from Decker to Anthony Williams. After a 3-yard sack by Alex Barrett that pushed UNLV back to the 44, Decker was picked off by Calvin Munson at the San Diego State 22.

The Rebels got the ball back later in the quarter, but Leiva's 43-yard field goal attempted hit the right goal post, keeping the score at 28-10 after three quarters.

The Azters put together a long 13-play, 67-yard drive to get to the UNLV 7-yard line. Donny Hageman then nailed a 24-yard field goal to put SDSU up by 21 at 31-10, its largest lead of the game. The Rebels answered with a 7-play, 80-yard march, ending with a Decker 2-yard plunge.

San Diego State, however, once again grounded up clock time, using 5:29 on 66 yards over 11 plays before Hageman made a 31-yard field goal for the final points of the game. Kaehler completed 16 of 27 passing attempts for 209 yards, his 15th 200-yard game over the past 16 contests, while Clark set career highs of four receptions and 71 yards. Barrett had two of the Aztecs' six sacks on the night, the program's most since recording six at Wyoming on Nov. 24, 2012, while Josh Gavert tied his career high with 11 tackles in his first start of the year.

SDSU went without a turnover for the first time since Nov. 2, 2013 vs. New Mexico and picked off two passes for the first time since Nov. 23, 2013 at Boise State.

San Diego State finished with a .500 or better September (2-2) for the first time since 2011.

GAME 5 Oct. 3 + Bulldoa Stadium (33,928) at Fresno State

FRESNO, Calif. - San Diego State held Fresno State to 315 yards of total offense, forced two turnovers and had nine tackles for loss, but it was not enough as the Bulldogs pulled away late for a 24-13 victory at Bulldog Stadium in Fresno, Calif.

FS forced three Aztec turnovers, converting them into 14 points in its 1,000th game in program history. Fresno State got on the scoreboard first when Kody Kroening converted a 37-yard field goal with 8:18 left in the first quarter. The Bulldogs got 40 of their 43 yards on the 8-play drive on the ground, including 27 by Marteze Waller and 13 from quarterback Brian Burrell.

FS got the ball right back when Kyrie Wilson forced SDSU true freshman Nick Bawden to fumble the ball after a 7-yard gain. Fresno State then put together a 10-play, 67-yard drive over 4:19, ending with a Brandon Cornette 1-yard touchdown run on 4th and goal. The key play of the drive was a 49-yard pass from Burrell to Josh Harper on a 3rd and 12 from its own 31-yard line.

San Diego State finally got on the scoreboard just 1:16 into the second quarter when Donny Hageman split the uprights on a 24-yard field goal attempt. The Aztecs grounded and pounded their way to the field goal, gaining all 60 of their yards on the ground on the 11-play drive that ate up 4:15 of clock time. Running back Donnel Pumphrey had 33 of the 60 yards on the drive, while fullback Dakota Gordon had the other 27.

The SDSU defense settled down and forced the Bulldogs to two straight 3 and outs, but gave the ball back to FS after a punt. With 3:24 left in the half, Burrell drove FS to the San Diego State 21 to set up a field goal attempt with just five second remaining. Kroening's 38-yard attempt, however, was blocked by Sam Meredith, the second of his career.

After both teams traded punts to start the second half, Fresno State's Burrell was stripped by Calvin Munson and Trey Lomax scooped up the loose ball and returned it 10 yards to the Bulldog 24. The Áztecs, however, were only able to cash in on a field goal and Hageman's 36-yarder closed the gap to 10-6. FS responded with a 11-play, 81-yard drive over 5:23, thanks in part to three SDSU penalties (two on

fourth down, one on third down), concluding with Josh Quezada's 2-yard touchdown run. It appeared San Diego State would get out of trouble early in the drive, but Daniel Brunskill was whistled for roughing the kicker on 4th and 8. Aztec head coach Rocky Long challenged the play and, even though replays showed Brunskill's fingers deflecting the ball, which went just 23 yards, the call on the field stood, resulting in a first down and SDSU losing a timeout.

San Diego State answerd with a 14-play, 79-yard drive over 7:27, culminating with a 5-yard touchdown pass from Bawden to Adam Roberts. It was the first of his career by Bawden, who was 4-for-6 for 45 yards on the drive after going 3-for-11 for 18 yards on his previous nine drives. The touchdown brought the Aztecs back to within four at 17-13.

SDSU got the ball right back after forcing another 3 and out. San Diego State got into Fresno State territory, but Bawden was picked off Donavon Lewis on the fifth play of the drive.

The Aztecs then forced the Bulldags to punt and would get one more chance to try to take their first lead of the game. Bawden, however, was picked off once again at the SDSU 12 and returned five yards. Waller later scored on a 5-yard rush to give FS the 24-13 lead.

San Diego State got the ball back and got into Fresno State territory again, but Bawden was sacked and Lenicio Noble drew a false start penalty to set up a 4th and 16 on its own 44. Bawden's pass to Larry Clark

was incomplete, giving the ball back to the Bulldogs, who ran out the dock and seal the win. Pumphrey rushed for 94 yards on a career-high 24 attempts, while Gordon added a career-high 42 yards on six carries.

Bawden, who became just the second Aztec to ever start a game at quarterback as a true freshman and the first to do it without having ever attempting a pass, finished 9-for-24 for 84 yards, a touchdown and two interceptions. He added 36 yards on the ground on eight rushed (4.5 avg.).

Clark had three of the team's nine catches for 30 yards.

Munson posted a career-high 12 tackles (previous best was six) with a career-high 3.0 tackles for loss, a sack and his first career forced fumble. Josh Gavert added seven tackles, while J.J. Whittaker recorded his first interception of the season and fourth of his career.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. - Donnel Pumphrey rushed for a career-high 246 yards and two touchdowns and Chase Price added 141 yards and a score to lead San Diego State to a 24-14 win at New Mexico on Oct. 10. Pumphrey and Price helped the Aztecs rush for 397 yards, the eighth most in single-game history (third

most in SDSU's Division I history), and lead San Diego State to the win in Rocky Long's first game as head coach at his alma mater.

Long, the all-time winningest coach in the Mountain West, who coached at New Mexico from 1998-08 and graduated from UNM in 1974, has now been on the winning sideline in each of the last 13 times the two teams have played (2001-08 as head coach with the Lobos, 2009-10 as defensive coordinator with the Aztecs and 2011, 2013-14 as the head coach at SDSU).

Pumphrey got his 246 yards on 20 attempts (12.3 avg.) with 93 of them coming on a touchdown run in the third quarter. It was the true sophomore's fourth 100-yard game of the season (in six contests) and seventh of his career. The 246 yards were the 13th most in a game in school history.

Price rumbled for 141 yards on 17 carries (8.3 avg.) for his first 100-yard game of his career. He became the 74th player in school history to rush for at least 100 yards in a game.

It was the 18th time in school history that San Diego State had multiple 100-yard rushers, where the Aztecs are 17-1 in those occasions.

SDSU wasted no time on its opening drive, taking it 70 yards on 14 plays over 6:29 before Donny Hageman nailed a 25-yard field goal. It was the seventh straight make for Hageman, who improved to 8-for-9 on the year on field goal tries. True freshman Nick Bawden, making his second career start, got San Diego State out of a jam with a 15-yard run on a third and 12 and later connected on a 43-yard strike to Eric Judge on a 3rd and 15, the longest pass of his short career. Bawden would go onto become just the second Aztec true freshman

to start at quarterback in a SDSU victory. The score would remain 3-0 until early in the second quarter when Pumphrey took San Diego State's first play 49 yards for the score with 11:37 left in the half.

New Mexico answered Pumphrey's rushing touchdown with a quick 5-play, 75-yard drive over 1:17, culminating with a 45-yard pass from Lamar Jordan to Carlos Wiggins with 10:20 to play. The Wiggins' grab would be the final score of the first half as the Aztecs held onto a 10-7 lead.

After forcing a punt to start the second half, SDSU took another 10-point lead when Price scored on a 27yard touchdown run. The drive, which went 56 yards in just three plays over 0:36, was led by quarterback Quinn Kaehler, who entered the game in the beginning of the third quarter. The Lobos responded with a 13-play, 75-yard drive over 6:29, ending with a 1-yard run by Teriyon Gipson to bring the game back to three points at 17-14. San Diego State, however, would seal the game when Pumphrey took the second play of the drive 93

yards for the score. The 93-yard rush was the second longest in the Aztecs' Division I era (since 1999) and the third-longest rushing play in program history.

SDSU was unable to put the game out of reach as it committed four turnovers in the fourth quarter, including three straight plays and four times in six snaps. UNM, however, never got into San Diego State's side of the field en route to its fifth consecutive loss to the Aztecs.

SDSU won its 10th consecutive game in the Mountain time zone, the longest active streak in the nation, and won for the 15th time in the past 18 contests.

San Diego State finished the game with a 245-yard advantage in rushing (397-152), its fifth-largest advantage in the Division I era. New Mexico came into the weekend ranked fourth in the nation at 322.40 yards per game. Josh Gavert led the Aztec defense with 11 tackles, including 0.5 tackles for loss, and his first interception

of the season (third of career). Calvin Munson added eight stops and 1.0 TFL, while J.J. Whittaker and Na'im McGee came up with six tackles apiece.
