AZTEC HEADLINES

- After a 12-day hiatus, San Diego State kicks off a five-game homestand on Sunday when it squares off against UCLA at Viejas Arena. Opening tip is scheduled for 2 p.m. PT, and a live video stream featuring Chris Ello on play-by-play will be available at www. goaztecs.com.
- The Aztecs will be playing in front of their home crowd for the first time since Nov. 23, when they fell to then-No. 19 South Carolina by an 88-54 count.
- SDSU went 1-1 on its brief two-game road trip following the Thanksgiving holiday, rallying for a 71-67 triumph at UC Santa Barbara to give Stacie Terry her

first victory as a head coach, before suffering a 72-35 defeat at Texas A&M in its last outing on Dec. 3.

- Against the Aggies in College Station, the Aztecs were limited to a season-low .232 shooting percentage and were out-rebounded by 59-31 margin, including a 23-11 spread on the offensive glass.
- SDSU center Cierra Warren is off to a torrid start this season, connecting of 64.8 percent of her field-goal attempts (35-54), which ranks eighth in the nation entering the week. The Aztec senior is averaging 15.8 points per game and has surpassed the 20-point plateau on three occasions.

#AztecWBB Opens Five-Game Homestand Sunday vs. UCLA

San Diego State and UCLA will renew acquaintances on Sunday at Viejas Arena as the Aztecs continue their non-conference schedule following a 12-day break from competition.

The two schools will lock horns for the fourth consecutive season after the series was dormant from 2000-09. The Bruins have captured five straight against SDSU, including a 66-52 decision at Pauley Pavilion in the 2012-13 season-opener, to grab a 22-6 lead in 28 all-time meetings.

The Aztecs have not beaten UCLA since posting a 77-52 victory on the road in December of 1992 and have not won in San Diego since recording a 96-77 triumph in January 1986.

SDSU head coach Stacie Terry was in her third and final year as an assistant with the Bruins the last time UCLA visited "America's Finest City" in November of 2010. That season, the Bruins came away with a 55-48 victory at Viejas Arena.

The Aztecs are 3-7 in their last 10 games against Pac-12 Conference members. SDSU experienced a 65-61 defeat at USC in its last outing against a Pac-12 foe on Nov. 13.

Scouting the Bruins

UCLA has dropped two straight, including an 90-48 setback at No. 4 Notre Dame on Dec. 7. The Bruins have faced one of the more tougher schedules in the nation so far this season, posting a 1-3 record against teams ranked in the AP Top 25. UCLA's lone victory among that group was a 82-76 upset at home of then-No. 10 Oklahoma on Nov. 24.

Against the Sooners, sixth-year senior Atonye Nyingifa notched a double-double with a career-high tying 28 points to go with a personal-best 16 rebounds.

For the season, Nyingifa leads UCLA 18.3 points and 8.4 rebounds per game for the year, while classmate Thea Lemberger (16.1 ppg, 2.9 apg) and sophomore Nirra Fields (15.3 ppg) have also posted double-digit scoring averages.

The Bruins have been bitten by the injury bug as junior forward Kacy Swain and sophomore guard Kori Korver both suffered knee injuries during preseason workouts and will be lost for the 2013-14 campaign,

Through eight games, UCLA is shooting just 37.1 percent from the field, including a 27.7 percent clip from three-point range and 61.1 percent from the charity stripe. Conversely, UCLA is allowing the opposition to connect on 47 percent of its field goal attempts, which ranks 339th out of 343 Division I teams entering the week. In all, the Bruins are allowing 75.4 points per game and are minus-3 in rebounding margin.

Now in the third year of her first head coaching endeavor, Cori Close has racked up a 43-29 record at UCLA, including a 26-8 mark during the 2012-13 campaign. Last year, the Bruins finished with a No. 15 ranking in the final USA Today Coaches poll after advancing to the second round of the NCAA tournament.

Prior to taking over the reins in Westwood, Close was the associate head coach at Florida State for seven seasons from 2004-11, following a nine-year stint as an assistant at her alma mater UC Santa Barbara from 1995-2004.

A four-year starter at point guard for the Gauchos, Close began her coaching career in a restricted earnings position while working on her master's degree at UCLA in 1993. Close was on the Bruin staff when current Aztec assistant coach Aisha Veasley was a freshman at UCLA during the 1994-95 campaign.

With a Victory...

An SDSU win over UCLA on Sunday will mean:

- The Aztecs pick up their first victory at home under head coach Stacie Terry.
- SDSU defeats the Bruins for the first time since December 1992, when it posted a 77-52 victory in Los Angeles.
- The Aztecs collect their first win over UCLA in San Diego since a 96-77 triumph in January 1986.
- SDSU improves to 69-110 all-time against current members of the Pac-12 Conference.
- The Aztecs raise their record to 32-11 in December games played since the 2006-07 campaign.

Dissecting the Slow Start

The fact that San Diego State sits at 1-5 for the first time since the beginning of the 2005-06 campaign can be at least partially attributed to the following factors:

- ► <u>Turnovers</u> The Aztecs are committing over eight turnovers more per game (23.3-15.2) than their foes this season, compared to last year when they were just one of three teams in the Mountain West to finish with a positive turnover margin (+2.9), along with Fresno State and Colorado State. Opponents have capitalized on SDSU's miscues by maintaining a combined 146-74 advantage in points off turnovers.
- ► Offensive Rebounds The Aztecs are getting outrebounded on the offensive glass by an average margin of 17.0-8.5 during the first six games. As a result, SDSU's foes own a collective 103-43 advantage in second-chance points this year.
- ► Schedule The Aztecs have played one of the toughest schedules in the country so far this year, featuring a pair of games against AP Top 25 foes in No. 19 South Carolina and No. 23 Texas A&M. As of Dec. 8, SDSU's strength of schedule was rated second in the nation, according to Collegiate Basketball News, while realtimerpi.com ranked

the Aztecs' slate sixth-toughest. Entering the weekend, the combined record of SDSU's six previous opponents stands at 31-11.

► <u>Experience</u> - The Aztecs' starting lineup against Texas A&M featured five players who have combined for just 23 starts in an SDSU uniform prior to Dec. 3. With that lack of experience, growing pains are certainly inevitable.

Despite the adversity, three of the Aztecs' five losses have come by a scant 11 points. The youthful SDSU squad has displayed much resiliency during the early part of the season, overcoming a nine-point deficit at UCSB and nearly rallying from a pair of 19-point deficits at Sacramento State and USC. In fact, the Aztecs owned late leads at Sac State and against San Diego, only to cede go-ahead three-pointers by the opposition.

Decembers to Remember

The Aztecs are a combined 31-11 during December since 2006. Six of those losses came to teams either ranked or receiving votes in the national poll, including a defeat to No. 23 Texas A&M earlier this month and a setback to No. 14 Oklahoma State last year in the final of the San Diego Surf 'N Slam. The Aztecs have also come up short in previous years against No. 2 UConn, No. 7 Texas A&M, No. 17 George Washington and USC (rv). The other five defeats were at Washington in 2012, at Washington State and against USD in 2011, vs. Pepperdine in overtime in 2009 and against Quinnipiac in the opener of the 2007 Surf 'N Slam. Of course, it should be noted that SDSU has played 30 of those 41 December contests at home.

The Last Time Out - SDSU at Texas A&M

Playing its second nationally ranked opponent of the season, San Diego State ran into a buzzsaw against No. 23/20 Texas A&M, suffering a 72-35 defeat at the hands of the Aggies in College Station, Texas, on Dec. 3.

The Aztecs got off to a slow start, missing 11 of its first 12 shots to fall into a 17-3 hole by the 11:08 mark of the first half. SDSU fashioned a 9-5 run over the ensuing 4:36. pulling to within 22-12 on a Cierra Warren layup. That would be as close as the Aztecs would get, however, as the Aggies limited the visitors to just one basket over the final 6:40 of the period to take a 31-14 lead into the locker room.

Ahjalee Harvey scored seven points and came up with a career-high five steals to lead San Diego State, while Desi Culberson, Deajanae Scurry and Ariell Bostick finished with five points apiece.

The Aztecs shot a season-low 23.2 percent from the floor and were outrebounded by a 59-31 margin, including a 23-11 spread on the offensive glass. In addition, Texas A&M outscored SDSU 36-16 in the paint and maintained a 28-7 advantage in second-chance points.

Karla Gilbert (16 pts., 11 rebs.) and Courtney Williams (10 pts., 12 rebs.) each registered a double-double to lead the Aggies, while Courtney Walker and Chelsea Jennings also scored 10 points apiece in the victory.

Flashback: SDSU at UCLA - 2012 Edition

UCLA received double-digit scoring totals from three players en route to a 66-52 victory over San Diego State in the first women's basketball game in the newly refurbished Pauley Pavilion on Nov. 10, 2012.

Erimma Amarikwa scored 14 points, while Chelsea Hopkins added 10 points, six assists and four steals for the Aztecs, but it wasn't enough as the visitors were unable to contain the three-prong Bruin attack of Markel Walker, Alyssia Brewer and Kari Korver.

Walker tossed in a game-high 15 points; Brewer contributed 12 points and five steals, while Korver finished with 11 points off the bench, including three 3-pointers to help UCLA improve to 22-6 against San Diego State all-time.

Despite connecting on just 18 percent of its field goal attempts (6-31) in the first half, the Aztecs found themselves trailing by just four points at intermission, 24-20, thanks to some nearly equal cold shooting by the Bruins, who finished with a 27-percent clip (7-26) during the first 20 minutes.

Following the break, Korver scored five of UCLA's first nine points in the second half to stretch their lead to 10 points at 33-23.

SDSU quickly countered with a 14-6 surge to close the gap to 39-37, as Hopkins and redshirt freshman Deajanae Scurry tallied four points each in the spurt.

However, UCLA seized control at this juncture, fashioning a 19-4 blitz that put the game out of reach and extended the Bruin lead to 58-41. Kacy Swain scored five points, while Atonye Nyingifa, Jasmine Dixon and Walker had four points each to key the run.

The Aztecs were held to 28 percent shooting for the game and were out-

Scurry scored eight points and added nine rebounds in her SDSU debut, while Malia Nahinu grabbed eight boards of her own and recorded two blocks in the loss.

Warren Tabbed MW Player of the Week

Senior Cierra Warren (Rancho Cucamonga, Calif.) was named the Mountain West Women's Basketball Player of the Week on Dec. 2 for her dominating performance in the Aztecs' 71-67 victory at UC Santa Barbara.

With her award, the SDSU center garnered her first career weekly conference accolade and the first for an Aztec player this season.

Against UCSB last Saturday, Warren scored a teamhigh 21 points on 9-of-10 (.900) shooting from the floor and a 2-for-2 effort at the free-throw line. She also added one assist, one block and a steal to help SDSU notch its first win of the season.

In the second half, Warren tallied 11 straight points, including the first three-point basket of her career, during a 22-9 run that overturned a 42-33 deficit and catapulted SDSU into the lead for good at 55-51. She also secured the game-clinching rebound after the Gauchos missed a potential game-tying three-pointer with nine seconds remaining in the contest.

With her totals, Warren logged her third 20-plus point performance in just five games played this season, as well as the 15th double-digit scoring effort of her career. For the season, she is averaging 15.8 points per game and shooting a robust 64.8 percent from the floor on 35 of 54 field-goal attempts.

#AztecWBB Inks Pair to NLIs

San Diego State head coach Stacie Terry inked her first pair of recruits last week with the signing of Cheyenne Greenhouse (Riverside, Calif.) and Lexy Thorderson (Castle Rock, Colo.) to National Letters of Intent. The two high school seniors are set to join the Aztecs for the 2014-15 season.

Greenhouse signs with SDSU out of Canyon Springs High School, where she captured CIF Division 1A co-player of the year honors as a junior last season after leading the Cougars to the Southern Section championship and a berth in the semifinals of the CIF regional tournament.

A 5-11 guard, Greenhouse averaged 18.4 points, 5.5 rebounds, 2.4 assists and 2.1 steals during the 2012-13 campaign, earning first-team all-state CIF Division 1A recognition while landing a spot on Max-Preps all-state first team.

"Cheyenne is going to be very important to us because she has can play multiple positions," Terry said. She will add tremendous athleticism to our program with her great leaping ability. Cheyenne is also a very intelligent player and her basketball IQ is off the charts."

Greenhouse makes her signing official as a threestar recruit, according to ESPN HoopGurlz. A threetime all-Inland Valley League selection for head coach Gail Hale at Canyon Springs, Greenhouse also brings three years of club experience with her to The Mesa, having played for Cal Swish in 2011, followed by a two-year stint with the West Coast Premier program. She intends to study biology or pre-medicine at San Diego State.

Thorderson, meanwhile, garnered first-team all-Continental Leagues accolades as a junior last year at Rock Canyon High School after averaging a teambest 16.1 points to go along with 5.7 rebounds, 2.6 assists and 1.3 steals. Under the tutelage of head

coach Robbie Ballard, the 6-0 guard/forward received Colorado 5A honorable mention all-state distinction on two occasions in 2011 and 2013.

In a game against eventual state champion Regis Jesuit last February, Thorderson scored 32 points to earn player of the game honors by MaxPreps. Earlier in the season, she also gained recognition as the Denver Post's female student-athlete of the week.

"Lexy's addition will enable us to extend our offense because she is deadly from three-point range," Terry said. "Her ability to knock down that jumper will also help open up the game for our post players."

Thorderson, who also competed at the USA Basketball U16 national team trials in 2011, has a basketball pedigree in her family. Her father Eric Thorderson played collegiately at Wayne State (Mich.) from 1980-85, while two of her sisters, Ali and Abby, earned varsity letters at Weber State. She is undecided on a major at San Diego State, but is considering a career in physical therapy and physical education.

Noting the Newcomers

Of the 12 student-athletes on the current roster, five players will be wearing an Aztec uniform for the first time this season. Cierra Warren practiced with the squad last year but did not compete after transferring from Louisville, while Deidra Smith utilized her redshirt campaign as well, following her transfer from Boston College. In addition, sophomore Deajanae Scurry missed the latter half of the 2012-13 campaign to concentrate on academics.

With San Diego State losing nearly 67 percent of its

scoring offense from a year ago, three true freshmen look to gain significant experience this season. Guard Ariell Bostick (Oakland, Calif.) led Bishop O'Dowd High School to a pair of CIF titles, while forward Alyssa Lawrence (New Rochelle, N.Y.) was an all-league and all-section honoree during her prep career. Not to be outdone, Chloe Johnson (Phoenix, Ariz.), who was named the Mountain West preseason freshman of the year, brings strong credentials with her to The Mesa after earning all-state honors for prep powerhouse St. Mary's High, which finished with a No. 1 national ranking in 2011-12.

Meet the New Staff

The talent at Viejas Arena is not just limited to the playing court as head coach Stacie Terry has assembled a prolific staff in her first season on The Mesa. Assistant coaches Jesse Clark, Aisha Veasley and Ciara Carl bring a vast array of experience with them to "America's Finest City", while Mike Bynum returns for his fourth season as the Aztecs' director of player development.

A native of Tacoma, Wash., Clark spent seven years as an assistant at Saint Mary's College, where he helped the Gaels to four straight WNIT berths, including a quarterfinal appearance in 2012-13. He also had stints at Stanford, San Francisco, CSU Bakersfield and Pacific Union.

Veasley, who enjoyed a successful playing career at UCLA, returns to her Southern California roots after two productive stops as an assistant at Tulsa and Colorado. While at CU, Veasley played a pivotal role as the team's recruiting coordinator, helping to land three top-40 classes.

Carl also has ties to the area, having graduated from Point Loma Nazarene and coaching with San Diego club teams. Most recently, she served an assistant at Metro State in Denver, Colo., following a two-year run at Division II power Cal Poly Pomona.

Aztecs Garner MW Preseason Honors

San Diego State received three preseason Mountain West individual honors on Oct. 15, as forward Erimma Amarikwa was named to the all-conference team, center Cierra Warren was selected newcomer of the year, while guard Chloe Johnson was tabbed the MW preseason freshman of the year.

As a team, the Aztecs were picked to finish third in the MW preseason poll, which was conducted in a combined panel of the league's 11 head coaches and select conference media members. SDSU collected 196 points and picked up two first-place votes, trailing second-place Wyoming, which received 212 points and four first-place votes, while preseason favorite Fresno State garnered 238 points and 17 first-place votes.

Basketball Performance Center On the Docket

San Diego State Director of Athletics Jim Sterk announced on Nov. 12 that a proposed 23,500-square-foot basketball performance center is under design, with a plan to break ground on the project in late spring 2014.

The \$14.5 million facility, which will be located just south of the Fowler Athletics Center and east of the football practice fields, will include two full-length courts, eight baskets, locker rooms, film rooms, team lounges, athletic training room and coaches locker rooms to help support the Aztec men's and women's championship basketball programs.

Although a majority of the funds have been pledged, fundraising continues for the project which is tentatively scheduled to be completed in 2015.

"This is an exciting day to be able to announce this project is moving forward," Sterk said. "It is a project that will greatly benefit our already successful men's and women's basketball programs. It is also an important day because we are going public with our drive to raise funds for the project and hope that the community that has enjoyed San Diego State basketball will get behind this project."

"The basketball performance center is more than just a building, it is our classroom," SDSU women's basketball head coach Stacie Terry said. "The facility will provide an opportunity for our student-athletes to enhance their individual games, which will in turn benefit our program. It also keeps San Diego State competing at the highest level not only in basketball, but in recruiting as well."

What's New in the Mountain West

With the addition of newcomers San José State and Utah State, the Mountain West will have a different look for the third year in a row. Following the departures of Brigham Young and Utah in 2011, the league added Boise State, while Fresno State and Nevada joined the circuit last year after the defection of TCU. The latest realignment means the Aztecs will now have 18 league games this season instead of 16, with the Scarlet and Black facing Wyoming (home) and Nevada (road) just once, while completing a home-and-home slate with the rest of the conference.

The Mountain West Championship, scheduled for March 10-15, 2014, has also been revamped to include three games with the six lowest-seeded teams during the first round. In addition, the four surviving squads from the quarterfinals will have two days to prepare for the semifinal round

Two For The Show

Former SDSU All-Americans Courtney Clements and Chelsea Hopkins both earned roster spots with the WNBA this past season after completing their illustrious careers for the Scarlet and Black following the 2012-13 campaign. Clements joined the Atlanta Dream as a free-agent rookie last May, while Hopkins was signed by the San Antonio Silver Stars in September.

Clements appeared in 30 games for Atlanta in 2013, becoming the first former Aztec to compete for a WNBA title after the Dream advanced to finals against the eventual champion Minnesota Lynx. The Long Beach native totaled 59 points (2.2/gm) on the year to go with 26 rebounds, eight assists and five steals. Against the Seattle Storm on July 14, Clements recorded a season-best 12 points before logging season highs of five rebounds and 29 minutes played vs. San Antonio on Sept. 15.

Hopkins, meanwhile, averaged 14.3 minutes in three games during a late-season tour of duty with the Silver Stars, finishing with six points, six rebounds and five assists.

STACIE TERRY

Head Coach First Season Texas-Arlington (1999)

tacie Terry was named the eighth head coach in the history of the San Diego State women's basketball program on May 15, 2013. A native of San Diego, Terry gained a wealth of experience as an assistant coach at the Division I level over the past 14 years, including the last five under head coach Nikki Caldwell, who transformed UCLA into a powerhouse before restoring LSU to national prominence.

During Terry's two seasons at LSU, the Lady Tigers compiled a 45-23 overall record and earned two NCAA tournament bids, including a Sweet 16 appearance during the 2012-13 campaign. This past season, the Lady Tigers also posted six victories against ranked opponents and finished with their second-highest scoring average (69.0) in the last seven years. Under Terry's guidance, forward LaShondra Barrett garnered first-team all-Southeastern Conference accolades and received honorable mention All-America distinction in 2012 before becoming a first-round draft choice of the WNBA's Washington Mystics.

"I am honored and humbled to be the next head coach at San Diego State University," Terry said. "I want to thank Jim (Sterk) and his staff for this amazing opportunity. This is such a special place for me. Not only is this my dream job, but it is home. SDSU is a first class university that has all the resources in place to be successful. I am so eager to get started and confident that we can continue the winning tradition that Aztec supporters have become accustomed to both on and off the court."

Prior to her arrival at LSU, Terry served as an assistant under Caldwell at UCLA from 2008-11, helping the Bruins gain national acclaim with a pair of NCAA tournament appearances. During Terry's tenure, UCLA posted 72 overall victories, as the 2010-11 squad finished with a 28-5 record, setting a school record for fewest losses in a single season to go with a No. 7 national ranking. In addition, the Bruins signed the fourth-ranked recruiting class that season, according to ESPN HoopGurlz, while Terry helped mentor first-team all-Pac-10 performers in Doreena Campbell, Darxia Morris and Jasmine Dixon, a 2012 honorable mention AP All-America selection, as well as all-conference freshman honorees Atonye Nyingifa and Markel Walker.

Terry spent the 2007-08 campaign at Southern Mississippi, as the Golden Eagles posted a 21-14 record and earned a postseason berth in the Women's National Invitation Tournament (WNIT). While at Southern Miss, Terry spearheaded the development and coordination of the Lady Eagle recruiting campaign. Her responsibilities also included working with the perimeter players, scouting opponents and film breakdown, as well as coordinating all of the team's community service events.

Terry also coached for three seasons from 2004-07 as an assistant under Hall of Fame head coach Theresa Grentz at Illinois, where the Fighting Illini had three straight recruiting classes ranked among the top 25 in

the nation, according to Blue Star Basketball, and made three consecutive trips to the WNIT. Her primary duties included defensive instruction and working with the perimeter players.

In addition, Terry coached at Dayton during the 2003-04 season following a three-year stint at Louisville from 2000-03. With the Cardinals, Terry's responsibilities encompassed recruiting, scouting, player development, summer camps and serving as a liaison for the program's community service outreach. Louisville captured the Conference USA regular-season title and earned a trip to the NCAA tournament in 2001 before making a WNIT appearance in 2002. She also assisted in signing the nation's 21st-ranked recruiting class in 2002-03, according to All-Star Girls Report. Terry recruited and coached all-Conference USA honoree Lori Nero, a draft choice of the WNBA's Houston Comets, as well as Sara Nord, who finished her collegiate career as the Cardinals' all-time assist leader and ranks among the top 15 scorers in school history.

Terry enjoyed a successful collegiate playing careerat Texas-Arlington, winning four varsity letters from 1994-98 under head coach Mike Dean. She earned first-team all-Southland Conference honors after leading the Mavericks in scoring with 17.4 points per game as a senior in 1997-98. Terry scored 1,169 points during her career at UTA and still ranks among the school's top 10 in three-point field goals made (third), assists (sixth), steals (seventh) and free-throw percentage (10th). She is just one of 17 players in Maverick history to surpass the 1,000-point plateau, while her .335 career three-point field-goal percentage is also a school and Southland Conference career record.

Terry played one season of professional basketball in Warsaw, Poland, averaging 12.0 points and 6.0 assists with the Polonia Phoenix, before returning to Texas-Arlington to begin her coaching career as a graduate assistant in 1999.

Terry, who graduated from El Capitan High, stills holds the Vaqueros' career scoring record and was inducted into the school's athletic hall of fame in 2008.
