Aztec Basketball Returns To Vieias Arena Starting Tuesday vs. Pepperdine

The San Diego State women's basketball team (4-3) returns to Viejas Arena for a pair of games versus two Southern California foes this week, beginning Tuesday evening

against Pepperdine (5-4) at 7 p.m. PT. The Aztecs, after playing four straight contests away from home, will have four of their final five non-conference outings of 2009-10 in San Diego.

SDSU got back into the win column on Friday evening, defeating UC Riverside in Riverside, 66-59, to snap a three-game losing skid. The Aztecs overcame a 10-point first-half deficit to notch their sec-

ond victory over the Highlanders in the last two years.

San Diego State, which plays its second of three games this season vs. a West Coast Conference foe, renews its series with Pepperdine. The two sides last played in consecutive campaigns in 2005-06, with each team winning on its home court. The Waves enter the 2009 meeting with a 5-4 overall record this year, including a five-point victory over Purdue.

Tuesday's game at Viejas Arena will feature a live audio and video feed with Chris Ello, as well as live stats, on goaztecs.com.

SDSU Rally To Beat UC Riverside, 66-59

San Diego State overcame an early 10-point deficit and a hot-shooting UC Riverside team for a 66-59 victory over the Highlanders Friday at the Student Recreation Center in Riverside, Calif. Playing their fourth consecutive game away from Viejas Arena, the Aztecs improved to 4-3 on the season, while UCR dropped to 2-5.

SDSU was led by the trio of junior Paris Johnson (San Diego, Calif.) and seniors Quenese Davis (Sacramento, Calif.) and Jené Morris (San Francisco, Calif.), who combined to score 55 of the team's 66 points, including 35 of the 37 second half points.

Johnson logged her 14th career double-double with 17 points and 15 rebounds in 27 minutes. The 15 rebounds matched a career high, which was set March 7, 2009 at UNLV. She made all five of her free-throw attempts.

Davis scored 16 of her game-high 20 points in the second half and dished out a season-high eight assists. Morris, meanwhile, overcame a slow start to finish the game with 18 points, including a pair of three-pointers, and five steals. Both players played all 40 minutes in the backcourt for San Diego State.

The Aztecs struggled out of the gate, getting down by as many as 10 points on a three-pointer by UC Riverside's Amber Cox with 10:14 remaining in the first half. SDSU answered with eight consecutive points, including six by Johnson, to close within two with 7:17 left. San Diego State finally took the lead at 27-26 on a pair of free-throws by junior **Jessika Bradley (Sacramento, Calif.)**, but was outscored, 5-2, over the final 3:56 to head into intermission trailing by a 31-29 margin.

The momentum went back and forth in the second half as the Highlanders answered the Aztecs' runs with three-

pointers and long jumpers. In fact, UCR, a 29.5 threepoint shooting team coming into the game, made 9-of-18 from beyond the three-point arc.

SDSU, however, took the lead for good at 48-47 on a Davis lay-up with 9:38 left in the second half. The lay-up was part of an 11-0 San Diego State run that culminated with a three-pointer by Morris to put the visitors up, 55-47 with 7:23 remaining in the game.

UC Riverside closed to within five points at 64-59 at the 51-second mark, but a steal and a pair of free-throws by Davis sealed the victory for the Aztecs.

Other UC Riverside Notes

- The Aztecs won for the first time in 2009-10 when trailing at the half.
- SDSU's 10-point deficit is its biggest in a victory since also trailing by 10 to No. 4 Texas a year ago.
- UC Riverside's nine three-pointers are the most SDSU has surrendered since allowing 10 to No. 23/25 lowa State on Nov. 30, 2008.
- SDSU committed a season-low 16 turnovers, with only five coming in the second half.

Another 1K Club Member

With her game-high 20 points in the win at UC Riverside, SDSU senior Quenese Davis needs only seven points to become the second Aztec this season and just the 18th in program history to reach the 1,000-career point mark. Davis has 993 points in 98 career outings.

Fellow co-captain Jené Morris already reached the 1,000-point mark in her 67th game in the Red & Black with her first bucket against South Carolina on Nov. 28.

Morris' current scoring total at SDSU stands at 1,027, which ranks 16th in school history.

Junior center Paris Johnson could be the third member of the 1,000-point club this season, as the San Diego native has 885 points in 70 games.

Prior to this year, the last Aztec to reach the 1,000-career point mark was Jamey Cox in 2002-03. SDSU has never had three players reach the 1,000-career point mark in the same season, but has had two accomplish the feat during the same campaign on four occasions, with the most recent being 1993-94, with Falisha Wright and Michelle Suman.

A New Starting Five

For the first time this season, Aztec head coach Beth Burns used a different starting five at UC Riverside, as junior forward Allison Duffy (Lakeside, Calif.) replaced junior guard Coco Davis (Sacramento, Calif.).

It was Duffy's 31st career start, but her first since the 2007-08 season finale vs. New Mexico at the Mountain West Conference tournament. The reserve role, meanwhile, ended Davis' streak of 29 consecutive starts, dat-

ing back to the Montana State contest Dec. 11, 2008.

Seeing Double

With her 17 points and 15 boards against UC Riverside, Aztec junior center Paris Johnson recorded her second double-double of the season and the team's third in 2009-10. Johnson has 14 career double-doubles, ranking third among active MWC players, with nine of those coming her sophomore campaign.

True Charity

San Diego State shot a season-best 88.2 percent at the free-throw line in its win over UC Riverside, making 15-of-17 attempts. Four different Aztecs were perfect at the stripe, including center Paris Johnson, who was 5-for-5, despite entering the contest shooting only 60 percent on the season.

The 88.2 mark is the team's highest percentage since making 92.9 percent (13-for-14) vs. UNLV on Feb. 4, 2009

In 2009-10, the Aztecs are converting 72.9 percent of their free throws to rank fourth in the MWC, a substantial improvement from their 61.2 conversion rate a year ago which was 314th out of the 328 Division I schools.

Back On The Boards

For the fifth time this season, SDSU owned an advantage in the rebounding department, recording a slight +4 mark over UC Riverside on Friday.

On the year, SDSU has a +3.9 rebounding margin, after tallying a -3.3 mark in 2008-09, which was 263rd nationally. The Aztecs only outrebounded their opponent 12 times in 32 games last year and haven't owned a positive season rebounding margin since 1996-97.

Sub-Sixty

UC Riverside became the fifth Aztec opponent to finish with fewer than 60 points in a game in 2009-10, with all four SDSU victories falling into that category.

The Aztecs are a combined 33-4 over the last three seasons when opponents score less than 60 points, including a 16-1 mark in 2008-09.

Steal City

San Diego State's 13 takeaways vs. the Highlanders on Friday are the team's fifth game in 2009-10 in double-figure steals.

Senior Jené Morris had five of those 13 steals, giving her four or more in five contests. For her career, Morris has three or more steals in 43 of 68 outings.

A year ago, the Aztecs had double-figure steals in 21 of 32 games, while Morris was seventh nationally with 3.3 per contest.

Forcing TO's

UC Riverside became SDSU's sixth opponent to log more than 20 turnovers in a single outing in 2009-10. Oklahoma is the only Aztec foe to not reach the 20-turnover mark, recording 19. SDSU opponents are averaging 23.0 giveaways a game, including a season-high 27 by Arizona.

A year ago, Aztec foes had 20 or more turnovers in 21 of 32 contests.

Good On The Road ...

The Aztecs increased their streak of consecutive victories at opponents' arenas to six straight with the win Friday at UC Riverside. That streak dates back to a loss at Wyoming on Feb. 15, 2009.

The last time SDSU won six straight road games (non-neutral sites) was during the 1996-97 campaign when the Aztecs won nine in a row.

Or At Home

The Aztecs will look to extend their home, regular-season win streak to 19 games when the team plays host to Pepperdine on Tuesday. SDSU has not lost on its home court during the regular season since falling to Wyoming back on Feb. 20, 2008.

Overall, the Aztecs have won 19 of their last 20 contests at Viejas Arena, which includes an NCAA first-round victory over DePaul and the second round loss to No. 2 Stanford. SDSU went 15-0 at home in 2008-09, before the Stanford game. It was just the second unbeaten home regular season in program history.

Lucky December

For the first time in four years, SDSU will not play all of its December games in the city of San Diego, as the Aztecs played at UC Riverside last Friday and will travel to LMU (Dec. 21).

The home court advantage has certainly helped. San Diego State is 15-3 during the month of December in the last four years, including a 5-0 mark in 2008-09. Its last loss during the year's final month came against Quinnipiac on Dec. 28, 2007.

SDSU enters Tuesday's game with Pepperdine with a current seven-game December win streak.

Notes With A 'W'

An SDSU victory over the Pepperdine will mean:

- ►SDSU has won 19 straight home regular-season games, dating back to Feb. 20, 2008, when the Aztecs fell to Wyoming.
- ►SDSU has won its last eight games, spanning three seasons, during the month of December.
- ►SDSU is 3-3 vs. teams it did not play a year ago and improves to 2-0 this season against WCC squads. The Aztecs have won three-straight overall vs. WCC schools.
- ►SDSU improves to 13-6 all-time against the Waves

and has won the seven meetings in San Diego.

Pepperdine Tid-Bits

Pepperdine enters Tuesday's game with a 5-4 overall record, having most recently lost at No. 13 Arizona State on Saturday, 62-52 ... The Waves, under head coach Julie Rousseau, have notable wins over Purdue, Providence and Utah State, after opening the campaign with victories over NAU and San Jose State ... One of SDSU's losses came at home vs. UC Riverside, while another was at No. 2 Stanford ... Pepperdine, which was 16-13 last season, has been led by senior Miranda Ayim, who is averaging 15.6 points and 7.1 rebounds a game to go with a team-best 24 steals and 10 blocks ... Guard Jazmine Jackson is also averaging in double-figure points with 12.1 an outing, while sophomore Lauren Bell has a team-best 33 assists.

Seven More To Go

With her 293rd victory as a head coach at UC Riverside last Friday, Aztec Beth Burns needs seven more wins to meet the 300-victory plateau for her career.

Burns is already SDSU's all-time winningest head coach with 212 of her career victories coming on Montezuma Mesa. She is in her 18th season overall as a head coach with all but six of those campaigns not with the Aztecs.

Aztecs Achieve No. 23/24 National Ranking

The San Diego State women's basketball team achieved its first top-25 national ranking in 14 years, as the Aztecs were rated No. 23 in the Associated Press Top 25 poll on Nov. 23. SDSU, which garnered 112 points, last appeared in the AP top 25 in March of 1995, when the team ended up 22nd following a 24-6 campaign. Overall, it is SDSU's 41st all-time appearance in the Associated Press Top 25.

The Aztecs received votes in the AP poll six times a year ago, a first since March of 1997, when it had 15 votes before playing its NCAA tournament game against Oregon.

In 2009-10, SDSU received votes in the Associated Press and ESPN/USA Today Coaches polls in both the preseason and first regular-season editions.

On Dec. 1, the Aztecs were also rated No. 24 in the coaches poll, getting 74 points.

Last week, however, SDSU dropped out of the top 25

Other 2009-10 Highlights So Far

- SDSU senior point guard Quenese Davis recorded her 500th career assist in the team's season-opening win over UC Irvine. She is now first in Aztec history and third in the MWC record book in career assists with 535.
- · Aztec junior center Paris Johnson has five blocks in each of the team's last three season-openers, including five versus the Anteaters in 2009-10.
- SDSU junior Jessika Bradley opened her Aztec career with 10 rebounds in her first three games. She is one of two SDSU players to have a double-double this season.
- Jené Morris was one of six players named to the alltournament team for the Island Division at the 2009 Paradise Jam in St. Thomas. Morris averaged 17 points in the three games, bolstered by a 32-point effort against No. 5/6 Notre Dame, which was the most points in a single game by any player at the tournament and by any player in the MWC in 2009-10.

Preseason Points

For the first time in the league's 11-year history, San

Diego State was picked to SDSU In The MWC Poll win the Mountain West Conference title in 2010 in a vote by the nine head coaches and select media members released Oct. 7. at the conference's annua media dav in Denver. Colo.

points than second place TCU, which received the three other first-place votes. Utah was picked third, followed by New Mexico, Wyoming, Brigham Young, UNLV, Colorado State and Air Force.

San Diego State had never finished higher than fifth place in the league before tying for the regular-season crown with a 13-3 mark in 2008-09.

More Preseason Team Tid-Bits

In addition to being picked No. 1 in the league, San Diego State has also started to earn a share of the national spotlight.

As a team, the Aztecs were tabbed No. 22 by two national preseason publications, Lindy's College Basketball and Sporting News College Basketball Magazine.

This week, ESPN.com and writer Graham Hays lists SDSU No. 3 among "mid-majors" and earlier this season, picked the Aztecs as one of the "teams to watch as 2009-10 unfolds". Hays also tabbed SDSU's 2010 MWC opener at New Mexico, as the No. 2 game to watch in the nation in the month of January.

Another ESPN.com writer, Charlie Crème, chose SDSU No. 23 among his 64 teams to watch in 2009-10.

Jené Morris Up For National Player of the Year

Entering her third and final season at San Diego State. senior Jené Morris is already one of the most heavilydecorated players in program history and will be looking to add more to her trophy case in 2009-10.

Back in July, the 5-9 guard was one of only 25 players named to the preseason "Wade Watch" list for the State Farm Wade Trophy Division I Player of the Year award by the WBCA. The Wade Trophy is now in its 33rd year and is considered to be the "Heisman of Women's Basketball.

Morris is also up for the other college player of the year honor, the John R. Wooden Award, which has been given out annually since 2004. She is one of only 31 student-athletes to make this year's list and is also a preseason candidate for the Wooden Award All-America

She is just the second player in Mountain West Conference history to be named to either watch list, joining Utah's Kim Smith, who was nominated for the Wade Trophy three times and the Wooden Award on two occa-

Morris was also selected to the annual Naismith Trophy Watch List as one of only 50 women's college basketball players. The Naismith Trophy has been given out annually since 1983 to the women's player of the

More On Morris

Aztec senior Jené Morris was named the Mountain West Conference's Preseason Player of the Year in a vote of the league's coaches and select media members. She is the first SDSU player so honored and also was tabbed to the five-member preseason all-conference for the second year in a row.

Last season, Morris, a 2008-09 honorable mention State Farm Coaches' All-American, averaged a teambest 16.1 points per game, scoring 20 or more points eight times and eclipsing the 30-point barrier on three occasions, including a 35-point performance vs. DePaul in the Aztecs' first round NCAA tournament game.

Morris led the league in steals in both overall (3.33/g) and conference-only (2.94/g) outings, ranking seventh nationally and becoming the first Aztec to record 100 steals in a season since Falisha Wright in 1993-94. Morris had three or more steals in 20 of her 30 games, including a league-high eight on two occasions, which are the most by an Aztec since 2002.

Her other honors included being named the 2009 MWC Defensive Player of the Year, first-team all-MWC, MWC all-defensive team, MWC Championship all-tournament team and four-time MWC player of the week.

Morris' other 2009-10 preseason honors include being named a third-team All-American by the Sporting News and being tabbed one of 30 candidates for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award.

Awards Aplenty

Jené Morris isn't the only Aztec to have already earned honors this season.

Junior Paris Johnson, a two-year returning starter at center, was named to the MWC preseason all-conference team for the second year in a row. Johnson has been singled out as a possible national "breakout star" by ESPN.com's Charlie Creme, after earning first-team all-league honors as a sophomore when she led the Aztecs in rebounding (8.3/g), blocked shots (94) and field-goal percentage (53.1).

Bradley, also garnered the program's first-ever Mountain West Conference preseason top newcomer award

Bradley redshirted a year ago, after spending two seasons at nationally-ranked Baylor. She played in 65 contests for the Bears and averaged 4.8 points, 4.5 rebounds and 1.1 blocks per game as a sophomore, posting a pair of double-doubles, including a 10-point, 10-rebound performance vs. then No. 10 Oklahoma.

ESPN.com's Graham Hayes singled out the Johnson-Bradley frontcourt duo as one of the country's best.

Other Things To Watch For In 2009-10

With the build up of what could be the most successful season in Aztec women's basketball history, here are a few things interesting things to look at in 2009-10:

• Three Aztecs are on pace to easily reach the 1,000-career point mark this season. Senior Jené Morris did so in the team's sixth game of the year vs. South Carolina and currently boasts 1,027 points at SDSU. Classmate Quenese Davis, who has 993 points, and junior Paris Johnson, who has 885 points, are up next.

SDSU has only had 16 players in its history reach the 1,000-point barrier entering this season with the last being Jamey Cox in 2002-03. Three Aztecs have never reached the 1,000-point mark in the same campaign.

- SDSU has won 10 straight home MWC contests dating back to 2008, after going a perfect 8-0 in 2009. The Aztecs have won 18 straight home regular-season games and are 37-12 on their home court in the last three years.
- The Aztecs have 24 Mountain West Conference wins in the last three seasons after having only 19 in the league's first seven years.
- Aztec head coach Beth Burns needs seven more victories to reach the 300-win milestone in her career.
- With her school-record 94 blocked shots in 2008-09, SDSU junior Paris Johnson had more blocks than four teams in the MWC and more than 159 of 328 NCAA Division I schools. Johnson is second in Aztec career history in blocked shots with 161.
- SDSU will have a pair of sisters on the floor this season with Coco and Quenese Davis and Allison and Ashley Duffy. Paris Johnson's sister Desiree also played for the Aztecs from 2005-07.

Strength Of Schedule

The Aztecs have already had two games against ranked foes in then No. 5/6 Notre Dame and No. 17/20 Oklahoma. SDSU also played two other contests versus foes receiving votes in either national preseason poll with Arizona and South Carolina. Other future Aztec opponents to have been receiving votes so far this season include Auburn, TCU, Wake Forest, Wyoming.

TV Time

The Aztecs will have a record seven regular-season televised games. SDSU's game with Arizona on Saturday was carried live on The Mtn., while six of its' MWC regular-season games on TV, including three straight in mid-February. In all, the Aztecs will have five

games on The Mtn. and two on CBS College Sports.

The Arena Formerly Known As Cox Arena

The home of the Aztecs underwent a change this past summer, as the facility is now named the Viejas Arena at Aztec Bowl, after being Cox Arena at Aztec Bowl since its inception in 1997.

The change over happened this past July and is part of a 10-year deal. The arena also sports a brand new 26-feet-high-by-15-feet-wide, four-LED video scoreboard. The new center-hung unit features the latest Daktronics LED video technology, which provides SDSU fans the ability to see live and recorded video images from any seat in the arena.

Pair Sign National Letters Of Intent

San Diego State women's basketball head coach Beth Burns announced the signing Nov. 11, of 6-3 forward Jasmine Porter (Layton, Utah) and 5-10 combo guard Melissa Sweat (Bakersfield, Calif.) to National Letters of Intent. The pair, who are each ranked among the top 100 recruits in the nation, will join the Aztecs in 2010.

Clements. Nahinu Join The Aztecs

San Diego State head coach Beth Burns announced this past May the addition of guard Courtney Clements and center Malia Nahinu to the Aztec basketball roster. The pair of sophomores transferred after playing one season at Arizona and will have three years of eligibility remaining at SDSU starting with the 2010-11 campaign.

2008-09 Rewind

The San Diego State women's basketball team made a remarkable run in 2008-09, highlighted by its first NCAA appearance in 12 seasons, its first postseason victory in 14 years, a share of the regular-season league title and a return to the national spotlight.

Below are a few of the accomplishments of last year's team:

- Posted the program's first 20-win season in 12 years, finishing with a 24-8 overall record and a 13-3 mark in Mountain West Conference play.
- Earned an at-large bid to the 2009 NCAA tournament, defeating DePaul in the first round for the program's first NCAA victory in 14 years (1994).
- Won a share of its first-ever Mountain West Conference regular season title. The Aztecs' previous best finish in the 10-year history of the MWC was tied for fifth in 2007-08.
- Tallied its first win over an AP ranked team in 14 years by defeating then No. 4 and unbeaten Texas, 60-55, to win the San Diego Surf 'N Slam tournament title.
- Earned votes in the Associated Press Top 25 poll six times, a program first since 1997. SDSU ended with five votes in the final *ESPN/USA Today* Coaches poll.
- Advanced to its second consecutive MWC championship game, after failing to even win a game in the event's first eight seasons.
- Posted an unbeaten home regular season for just the second time in school history, going 14-0. The record jumped to 15-0 with the NCAA victory over DePaul, before ending against No. 2 Stanford.

Last Year's Numbers

The Aztecs' success also translated into big numbers in the stat columns. Here are some of the 2008-09 team's statistical highlights:

- SDSU led the MWC in assists (15.16/g), steals (11.25/g), blocks (6.09/g) and turnover margin (+4.38), while ranking second in field-goal percentage (.422) and offensive rebounds (13.66/g). The Aztecs' 195 blocks were easily a conference record, beating the old mark of 166 by New Mexico.
- SDSU ended the year ranked sixth nationally in blocks per game, 15th in steals and 19th in turnover margin.
- The Aztecs had 10 or more steals in 21 of 32 games, had five blocked shots in 22 of 32 games, shot above 40 percent in 19 outings and eclipsed the 20-assist barrier in seven contests.
- SDSU set school season records for most threepointers (155; prev. 140 in 2004-05) and most blocks (195; prev. 162 in 1988-89).

More Awards

The awards were aplenty for this past year's Aztec squad, as several individuals were singled out for their achievement.

Guard Jené Morris' was named an honorable mention State Farm Coaches' All-American, becoming just the third SDSU player so honored and the program's first since Falisha Wright in 1994. Morris was also tabbed the 2009 MWC Defensive Player of the Year and was selected first-team all-conference, MWC all-defensive team, MWC championship all-tournament team and four-time MWC player of the week.

Morris and center Paris Johnson became the first Aztecs to ever be named first-team all-Mountain West Conference in the league's 10-year history. Johnson also was a four-time league player of the week, WBCA honorable mention national player of the month and earned a nod on two non-conference all-tournament teams.

Johnson and Morris were joined on the MWC all-defensive squad by guard Quenese Davis, who was a second-team all-league choice and one-time player of the week.

Head coach Beth Burns was also acknowledged for the team's performance by being voted MWC coach of the year, the fourth time she has won such an award in her career.

Ticket To Thrive

San Diego State University was one of 18 institutions or conferences that were selected by the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) to receive a women's basketball grant as part of the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Grant Program, which is in its second year.

The 2009-10 NCAA grant program dedicated approximately \$750,000 nationally to increase awareness, exposure and attendance of women's basketball. San Diego State doubled the grant money it received from the first year of the program and is one of only three schools or conferences to receive a grant for the second straight season.

The San Diego State Department of Athletics' Ticket to Thrive program is in its second year of a five-year

community outreach program created with the goal of increasing attendance at Aztec women's basketball games. The program's main objective is to establish a connection between members of the community and the San Diego State women's basketball program and is being partially funded by an NCAA grant.

SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns



The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa in April 8, 2005, and enters the fifth season of her second stint with the Aztecs.

The 2008-09 campaign was the culmination of many years of hard

work by Burns and her staff, as San Diego State posted its first 20-win campaign in 12 years, finishing 24-8 overall and 13-3 in conference action. The Aztecs won a share of their first-ever Mountain West regular season title, advanced to the MWC tournament championship game for the second consecutive year and garnered SDSU's first NCAA bid since 1997. For her efforts, Burns was named the league's coach of the year.

San Diego State has improved by at least six wins every year after her first season back, when the team went 3-24 overall and 0-16 in league play.

In her first stint as head coach from 1989-97, Burns took the SDSU women's basketball program full circle, going from 7-23 her first year to 23-7 in her final campaign. During her eight seasons, she compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular-season titles.

A three-time WAC coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02). She has a 18-year overall head coaching record of 293-212, while her school record stands at 212-147 over 13 seasons.

The game with USD was Burns' 500th as a head coach, while she needs just seven more victories to get to the 300-win plateau.

San Diego State 64, UC Irvine 42

IRVINE, Calif. - The San Diego State women's basketball team used a 12-0 second-half run to come out victorious, 64-42, over host UC Irvine in the first game of the 2009-10 season at the Bren Events Center. With the win, the Aztecs claimed their third-straight season-opener to move to 1-0, while the Anteaters dropped to 0-1 following the two schools' first meeting in six years.

SDSU had three players finish in double-figure points, including leading scorer junior Paris Johnson, who notched 11 of her game-high 18 points in the first half. Senior Jené Morris finished with 13 points and junior Allison Duffy contributed 11 points off the bench.

Aztec senior co-captain Quenese Davis had six of the team's 13 assists including the 500th of her career, which came at the 16:18 mark of the first half on a three-pointer by Morris. Johnson had five blocks and eight boards, Morris contributed four steals and forward Jessika Bradley logged a team-high 10 rebounds in her official Aztec debut.

San Diego State got off to a bit of a slow start, as UC Irvine scored the first basket of the game, before the Aztecs' first field-goal at the 17:26 mark by Johnson. The team then reeled off two more baskets to lead by five points, but the Anteaters, using a small line-up, tied the score at seven apiece and were within single digits for a majority of the first half, as SDSU led by only 10 at the half, 32-22.

Coming out the break, the two sides continued to trade baskets, until a three-point play by Allison Duffy at the 17:43 mark sparked an 8-0 run for a more comfortable 18-point advantage at 42-24, heading into the first media timeout. The Aztecs extended their scoring spurt to 12 unanswered on a layup and a pair of free throws, until UC Irvine finally broke through with a three-pointer and another basket to trail by 17 at 46-29.

The SDSU lead rose once again to 22 points with 5:37 left in the contest and never got lower than 16 points, before capturing the 22-point win at 64-42.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team jumped out to a 10-point lead early in the first half and never looked back, limiting visiting University of San Diego to only 19 points through the first 25 minutes of the game and going on to claim a 79-52 victory Tuesday evening at Viejas Arena. With the win, the Aztecs (2-0) won their first two games of a season for the third straight year, while the Toreros fell to 1-1 overall.

San Diego State had four players finish in double-figure points, as senior Jené Morris and junior Jessika Bradley both scored 14, and juniors Jerica Williams, who was a perfect 3-for-3 from beyond the arc, and Allison Duffy contributed 13 points apiece. Bradley added 10 rebounds for her first double-double in an Aztec uniform and junior guard Coco Davis had six of the team's 20 assists on the night.

SDSU senior point guard Quenese Davis recorded five assists and, along with Morris, had four steals on the night to lead the defensive effort.

The Aztecs never trailed, scoring the first point on a free throw by Coco Davis and logging the first field goal on a Morris triple. The Toreros countered with a jumper by Nya Mason and a bucket by Morgan Henderson, but the home team-scored four lay-ups in the paint for an eight-point lead at 12-4.

A Quenese Davis jumper at the 13-minute mark sparked a 7-0 run to put the host up by 13 and would move all the way out to 26 at the half, as San Diego State headed into the locker room on a 15-2 run to make the score 45-19.

The Toreros' offense continued to struggle out of the break, as it failed to score a point until the 14:43 mark with the Aztecs now up by 34 points. The SDSU lead stayed in the upper 20's to low 30's most of the rest of the way until the final buzzer sounded for the team's 79-52 win.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team limited visiting Arizona to only 19 points in each half, as the Aztecs claimed a hard-fought 57-38 victory at the first-ever JHG Jam at Viejas Arena. With the win, SDSU improved to a perfect 3-0 and won its 18th straight regular-season contest on its home floor, while the Wildcats fell to 2-1 following the first meeting between the two sides in 11 years.

The Aztecs were led by junior center Paris Johnson, who logged her 13th career double-double with 18 points and a season-best 10 rebounds to go with four blocked shots and three steals in only 25 minutes of action. Classmate Jessika Bradley matched Johnson's rebounding effort with 10 of her own for her third-straight game in double-figures and also had three blocked shots.

Senior guard Jené Morris was the only other SDSU player in double-figure points with 12, bolstered by a pair of three-pointers. Morris and junior Allison Duffy each recorded four of the team's 14 steals on the night, and junior Coco Davis posted seven points and a game-high seven assists.

The contest proved to be a physical battle from the outset, as both teams guarded each other closely up the floor and contested most every shot. There were four tie scores in the first half, before San Diego State could put some distance between themselves and the Wildcats in the final two minutes until the break. Leading by only two points 21-19, Johnson hit a lay-up in the paint, Morris converted a three-pointer and Bradley made the first of two free throws to send the host into the locker room up 27-19.

The Aztecs used that momentum coming out of the break, going on a 13-2 run in the first five minutes to move out to a 40-23 lead with 14:51 remaining. That advantage grew to as many as 23 points at 50-27 on an Allison Duffy jumper. The SDSU lead dipped below 20 points in the final three minutes, but never fell further than 17, before claiming the 57-38 victory.

ST. THOMAS, UVI - The San Diego State women's basketball team cut a 21-point, first-half deficit all the way down to two with less than 30 seconds remaining, but was unable to pull off the Thanksgiving Day upset, dropping its first game of the season to No. 5/6 Notre Dame, 84-79, in day one action of the 2009 Paradise Jam in St. Thomas, U.S. Virgin Islands. With the loss, the Aztecs fell to 3-1 on the year, while the Irish improved to 4-0.

The senior guard tandem of Jené Morris and Quenese Davis carried the team offensively, as the Aztec front court was saddled with foul trouble most of the day. Morris notched her fifth career 30-point scoring outing, recording 26 of her game-high 32 points in the second half. Morris also tallied all four of the team's three-pointers, came away with six steals and added five rebounds.

Quenese Davis, meanwhile, kept SDSU in the game in the first 20 minutes of play, making six of her 10 shots for 15 of her 25 points, which matched a careerbest. The senior co-captain was a rebound off of a double-double with a team game-high nine and tied for the lead in assists with five in playing all 40 minutes.

Besides Morris and Davis, junior forward Jessika Bradley also scored 12 points to go with eight rebounds, three assists, three steals and two blocks.

The game turned out to be the tale of two halves, as the Aztecs fell behind early, missing six of their first seven shots to trail by eight. Notre Dame, meanwhile, couldn't miss, going up by 10 points at 16-6 and then more than doubling that lead in a matter of just over three minutes, capped by a three-point play by Erica Solomon at 30-9. The deficit hung at around 20 until the 5:49 mark, when SDSU went on a 13-8 run to head into the locker room down by 15 at 44-29.

The Aztecs continued to chip away at the Irish lead coming out of the break, but didn't get to within single-digits until there was just under six minutes left to play on a Bradley lay-up at 69-60. Notre Dame edged their advantage back up to 13 and then 11, before Morris found her touch from outside, nailing three triples on SDSU's next five trips up the floor, including her final one from well beyond the top of the arc to get to within four at 79-75.

San Diego State was within a single basket following two Quenese Davis free throws with 29 seconds remaining, but the Irish made three of their four shots from the charity stripe to preserve the 84-79 victory.

After a Morris lay-up to get to win eight, Oklahoma continued to execute on offense and defense, scoring nine unanswered points and keeping SDSU to only three points in the final 10 minutes of the first half to head into the locker room up by 32 at 47-15.

Out of the break, the Sooners scored the first basket, but Johnson tallied the game's next six points on her own and another Morris lay-up shrunk the deficit to 26 at 49-23. The 26 points would be as close as the Aztecs got in the second half, as Oklahoma eventually came away with the 87-48 win.

SDSU quickly responded, using a three-pointer by Duffy to counter with a 7-0 run of its own to once again tie the game at 34.

The score would be tied for the 17th and final occasion at 46 all with 4:59 left in the game. From there, the Gamecocks scored six unanswered points, before the Aztecs chopped their deficit all the way down to a single point with 19 seconds remaining on a three-pointer by Jerica Williams.

On the ensuing in-bound play, however, SDSU was unable to get a steal and South Carolina's Valerie Nainima found La'Keisha Sutton for an easy lay-up on to push the lead back out to three points. Davis missed a desperation and potential tying 3-pointer at the buzzer, as the Aztecs fell, 58-55.

RIVERSIDE, Calif. - San Diego State overcame an early 10-point deficit and a hot-shooting UC Riverside team for a 66-59 victory over the Highlanders at the Student Recreation Center in Riverside, Calif. Playing their fourth consecutive game away from Viejas Arena, the Aztecs improved to 4-3 on the season, while UCR dropped to 2-5.

SDSU was led by the trio of junior Paris Johnson and seniors Quenese Davis and Jené Morris, who combined to score 55 of the team's 66 points, including 35 of the 37 second half points.

Johnson logged her 14th career double-double with 17 points and 15 rebounds in 27 minutes. The 15 rebounds matched a career high, which was set March 7, 2009 at UNLV. She made all five of her free-throw attempts.

Davis scored 16 of her game-high 20 points in the second half and dished out a season-high eight assists. Morris, meanwhile, overcame a slow start to finish the game with 18 points, including a pair of three-pointers, and five steals. Both players played all 40 minutes in the backcourt for San Diego State.

The Aztecs struggled out of the gate, getting down by as many as 10 points on a three-pointer by UC Riverside's Amber Cox with 10:14 remaining in the first half. SDSU answered with eight consecutive points, including six by Johnson, to close within two with 7:17 left. San Diego State finally took the lead at 27-26 on a pair of free-throws by junior Jessika Bradley, but was outscored, 5-2, over the final 3:56 to head into intermission trailing by a 31-29 margin.

The momentum went back and forth in the second half as the Highlanders answered the Aztecs' runs with three-pointers and long jumpers. In fact, UCR, a 29.5 three-point shooting team coming into the game, made 9-of-18 from beyond the three-point arc.

SDSU, however, took the lead for good at 48-47 on a Davis lay-up with 9:38 left in the second half. The lay-up was part of an 11-0 San Diego State run that culminated with a three-pointer by Morris to put the visitors up, 55-47 with 7:23 remaining in the game.

UC Riverside closed to within five points at 64-59 at the 51-second mark, but a steal and a pair of free-throws by Davis sealed the victory for the Aztecs.
