Aztec Basketball Opens Conference Play Wednesday At Home Against Air Force

After ending 2008 on a high note, the San Diego State women's basketball team (9-3) opens the 10th season of Mountain West Conference action on Wednesday, as the Aztecs entertain the Air Force Falcons at 6 p.m. PT at Cox Arena.

San Diego State enters Wednesday's league opener on a five-game win streak and holds a perfect 6-0 home record after knocking off fourth-ranked Texas, 60-55, in one of the biggest games in program history last Tuesday. The Aztecs claimed their first-ever San Diego Surf 'N Slam title and posted their first victory over a ranked team in 14 years.

SDSU was rewarded with two votes in this week's Associated Press Top 25 poll, the second time the Scarlet and Black have earned a mention this season. The Aztecs were picked to place second in the Mountain West Conference in 2009, after finishing as runners-up at the league championships last March. San Diego State tied for fifth place in the regular-season MWC standings with a 7-9 record in 2007-08, its best-ever finish.

Air Force, meanwhile, is 4-9 on the year and was picked to finish ninth in the preseason conference poll. The Falcons have dropped the last two meetings with the Aztecs, after winning three of four from 2006-07.

Wednesday's contest is being televised live on CBS College Sports, with former Aztec standout Tammy Blackburn (color analysis) and Jason Knapp (play-by-play) calling the action from Cox Arena. A live audio feed, featuring Chris Ello, as well as live stats, will be available on goaztecs.com.

Aztecs Shock No. 4/4 Texas For Surf 'N Slam Title

(AP) Jené Morris' late surge was too much for No. 4 Texas on Tuesday night.

Morris and San Diego State stunned No. 4 Texas with a 60-55 win in the Surf 'N Slam championship game, handing the Longhorns their first loss of the season.

Morris scored 24 points, including 15 in the second half when San Diego State (9-3) refused to let Texas pull away.

The result was far different from earlier this season when the Aztecs were routed at top-ranked Connecticut 99-55 or when then-No. 25 Iowa State handed San Diego State a 87-71 loss.

Morris almost single-handedly kept San Diego State in the game in the second half when she hit three 3-pointers. But it was late baskets by Jennifer Layton-Bailes and Paris Johnson that put the Aztecs ahead to stay.

Texas (11-1) played a sloppy game as it committed 23 turnovers and never seemed to get into an offensive rhythm.

The Longhorns led from the midway point of the first half until Layton-Bailes scored on a layup for a 53-52 San Diego State lead with 1:51 left.

Johnson followed with another layup with 1:08 remaining. Two free throws by Quenese Davis put the Aztecs ahead 57-52 with 19 seconds remaining.

Carla Cortijo, who led the Longhorns with 13 points, hit a 3-pointer that pulled Texas to within 57-55 with 11.9 seconds left. Johnson then hit a free throw with 10.6

seconds left before Erika Arriaran missed a 3-pointer that would have tied the game. Davis hauled in the rebound and was fouled, making both of her shots at the stripe to secure the 60-55 victory.

Morris tied her career high with eight steals for San Diego State, which won despite shooting 33.9 percent.

Texas had a 10-point lead twice early in the second half but couldn't put away the Aztecs.

Other Texas Game Notes

- SDSU earned the victory despite shooting a season-low 33.9 percent from the field. The Aztecs have twice claimed victories when losing the shooting percentage battle (also vs. UC Riverside).

- SDSU trailed by 10 points, including early in the second half. It is the Aztecs' largest deficit in a victory since also being down by 10 points against TCU in the MWC semifinals a year ago.

- Texas became SDSU's eighth opponent to make fewer than three, three-point field goals in a game this year.

- The Aztecs were called for a season-low 11 personal fouls, resulting in just seven Texas free-throw attempts.

- A season-low eight Aztecs saw action during the game, beating the previous low of nine vs. Prairie View A&M. LaSandra Dixon and Lindsay Leo both missed their first games of the year (coach's decision).

- SDSU has committed fewer than 20 turnovers in each of its last six contests and in seven of its last eight outings. The Aztecs began the year with 20 or more in four straight games.

Aztecs Earn Votes In AP Poll

After a one-week absence, San Diego State once again garnered votes in the Associated Press Top 25 poll, released Monday, Jan. 5.

The Aztecs received two votes this week, after getting the team's first vote in over 10 years on Dec. 22. SDSU is tied for the 33rd-most votes in the AP poll with Xavier.

Prior to this season, the last time San Diego State garnered votes during the regular season was back in March 1997, when it had 15 votes before playing its NCAA tournament game against Oregon.

Overall, the Aztecs have appeared in the Associated Press poll 40 times with their last actual ranking coming

in 1995, when the team ended up 22nd following a 24-6 campaign.

All-Tourney Honors

San Diego State had two players earn all-tournament honors following the championship game of the San Diego Surf 'N Slam last Tuesday.

Junior **Jené Morris (San Francisco, Calif.)** garnered MVP honors after scoring a game-high 24 points and adding eight steals in the upset of No. 4 Texas. For the tournament, Morris averaged 18 points and had 12 steals, while shooting over 40 percent from the field. It is the first time she has been named to a regular season all-tournament team in her career.

Sophomore center **Paris Johnson (San Diego, Calif.)** joined Morris on the six-member squad, the second time this season she has been named to an all-tournament team. Johnson averaged 18 points and 10 boards in the two contests, including 27 points, on 11-for-12 shooting, and 13 rebounds against Sacramento State.

Johnson has been tabbed an all-tournament honoree in each of the team's four non-conference events over the past two seasons, including the 2007 Surf 'N Slam.

Morris Claims Second MWC Honor

For the third time in as many weeks, a San Diego State women's basketball player has been recognized by the Mountain West Conference, as junior guard Jené Morris earned league co-player-of-the-week honors, the MWC office announced Monday.



Morris, who also garnered the award back on Dec. 22, shares

this week's edition with Utah's Kalee Whipple.

Morris led the Aztecs to a historic win last Tuesday, recording a game-high 24-points and eight steals in a 60-55 upset of fourth-ranked and previously unbeaten Texas in the finale of the San Diego Surf 'N Slam.

Morris scored 15 of her 24 points, was a perfect 3-for-3 from three-point land and grabbed four offensive rebounds all in the second half. She had seven steals in the first 20 minutes of the game and ended up with eight in all to tie for fourth in league history.

With Morris' award, San Diego State has now earned three Mountain West Conference player-of-the-week honors already this season, the program's most in a single campaign in the 10-year history of the league.

Streaks Are Meant To Be Broken

San Diego State's victory over No. 4 Texas last week was the Aztecs' first over an Associated Press ranked team since knocking off No. 6 Alabama, 79-76, on Dec. 28, 1994, at a tournament at St. John's in Jamiaca, N.Y. The victory snapped a 16-game losing streak against ranked foes, which included two games earlier this season and nine against current MWC foes.

The Aztecs' win over the Longhorns was also significant for a few other reasons including:

- SDSU claimed its first-ever Surf 'N Slam title in the event's four-year history. It marks the first time the Aztecs have won a non-conference tournament since going 2-0 at the Santa Clara Diet Pepsi Shoot-Out in Santa Clara, Calif., in 1993.

- SDSU defeated a Big 12 opponent for the first time

since December 1997.

- SDSU won its final non-conference regular season game for the ninth time in the last 10 years.
- SDSU is 6-0 at home this season, its' best start at home since the 1995-96 team went a perfect 13-0.
- SDSU ended the non-conference regular season with a 9-1 mark against teams it did not face a year ago.
- SDSU is 14-3 during the month of December over the last three seasons, including a perfect 5-0 in 2008-09.

Steals Are All Around

With its 16 steals against the Longhorns, San Diego State has tallied 66 in its last four games (16.5/g). The Aztecs have 10 or more steals in eight contests, after compiling double-figures 22 times in 2007-08.

On the year, SDSU continues to lead the MWC with 11.92 per outing. The Aztecs are ranked 18th nationally in that category entering the week. Individually, Jené Morris is first in the league and fifth nationally with 3.80 per game, while classmate Quenese Davis is second in the MWC and 28th in the nation with 2.92 a contest.

Lucky Eight

For the second time this season, Jené Morris recorded a career-high eight steals in the win over Texas, including seven in the first half alone. The eight tie her total against LMU earlier in the month.

The eight steals are the most by a player in the MWC since 2007 and tie her for fourth in the league's single-game record book. The last time an Aztec had at least eight steals was in 2002, when Veronica Shaw also had eight in a win over Sacramento State.

Forcing Some TOs

Texas had 23 turnovers in last Tuesday's game, the 10th time and fifth consecutive outing that an SDSU opponent has had more than 20 giveaways this season.

The Aztecs leads the Mountain West Conference in turnover margin with a +4.25 mark, averaging only 19.3 turnovers to their opponents' 23.5 per game.

A year ago, San Diego State forced 20 or more opponent turnovers in 25 of 31 games and easily set a league record for best-ever turnover margin of +5.81.

And Away We Go

After posting its best-ever regular-season finish and

most-ever MWC wins, San Diego State is looking to build on its 7-9 league record from 2008.

In its nine previous MWC season-openers, the Aztecs are 0-5 on the road and 2-2 at home. The two home wins came against preseason league favorite UNLV in 2005 and versus BYU in 2001. The five losses away from San Diego were at UNLV in 2002 and 2004, at Colorado State in 2006, at Utah in 2007 and at TCU in 2008. This is the first time in the last four years that the Aztecs have opened conference play at home.

San Diego State is 16-16 all time in conference openers, including a 5-4 mark in the Western Collegiate Conference (1976-85), a 2-3 record in the Big West (1985-90) and a 7-2 mark in the Western Athletic Conference (1990-99).

Notes With A 'W'

An SDSU victory over the Air Force will mean:

- ▶SDSU wins its MWC opener for the first time since 2005.
- ▶SDSU claims its fourth-straight MWC regular-season victory.
- ▶SDSU improves its current win streak to six games, the program's longest since 2006.
- ▶SDSU is 7-0 at home in 2008-09, winning its first seven home games in a year for the first time since the 1995-96 team was a perfect 13-0 at Peterson Gym.
- ▶SDSU wins its third straight over Air Force.

Air Force enters Wednesday's game with a 4-9 mark ... The Falcons and Aztecs have yet to play a common opponent this season ... Air Force is 0-4 away from home this season ... Guards Raimee Beck (14.6 ppg.) and Brooke Cultra (14.3 ppg.) are the Falcons' top scorers ... Kim Kreke is Air Force's top rebounder with 10.8 boards a game to rank first in the Mountain West ... The Dish On Q



One of the biggest keys to SDSU's consistent play this season can be attributed to point guard Quenese Davis.

Davis has six or more assists in eight of the 12 contests, including in six of the last eight games. She had a season-best nine assists against Loyola Marymount and continues to lead the league in that category by a healthy margin with 5.92 an outing. Davis enters this week ranked 15th nationally in assists per game.

She now has 383 for her career, which leaves her in third place in the Aztec record book. Only two SDSU players have ever reached the 400 mark, All-American Falisha Wright (448) and Crystal Lee (413).

Paris' Party



Of SDSU's 74 blocks in the 12 outings, 31 have been credited to sophomore Paris Johnson. Johnson had five in the opener with Northwestern State and turned the trick again against Montana State to tie for 10th on the SDSU single-game list. The

five trail her career-best of six vs. TCU in the 2008 MWC tournament.

Johnson now has 85 for her career in just two short seasons. She ranks seventh in school history and needs 10 more to tie for the sixth spot with Brooke Meadows (95). Only five Aztecs have reached the century mark in SDSU history.

In 2008-09, Johnson is first in the league and is 21st nationally in blocked shots. Her 31 blocks are 12 more than any other MWC player.

The 6-4 center led the conference in blocks per game with 1.74 in 2007-08, following in the footsteps of her sister, Desiree, who ranked first in the MWC in both 2005-06 and 2006-07.

Also In The Rankings

Besides the categories already mentioned, SDSU also continues to lead the Mountain West in blocked shots (6.17/g), offensive rebounds (15.17/g) and assists (15.33/g).

Paris Johnson ranks fourth in the league in scoring per game (16.1 ppg.), is second in field-goal percentage (53.3) and is first in offensive rebounds (3.25/g).

Other 2008-09 Notes

- The Aztecs' 50 rebounds against Northwestern State are program's most since 2000, when they also had 50 against Northern Arizona.

- Jerica Williams' 14 boards vs. Northwestern State are the most in Beth Burns' second stint as head coach and most overall since Ashlee Dunlap had 17 at Washington

State on Dec. 22, 2003.

- SDSU rejected a record 15 shots against Northwestern State, the most ever by a Mountain West Conference team in the league's 10-year history. The Aztecs beat the previous mark of 14 held by New Mexico.

- Sophomore center Paris Johnson was selected to the six-player all-tournament squad at the Waikiki Beach Marriott Classic in Honolulu, Hawaii. She averaged 22.7 points and 8.3 rebounds in the three games, shooting 78.9 percent from the field and recording a career-best 31 points vs. the host Wahine.

- SDSU has had two different players reach the 30-point barrier this season in Paris Johnson (31 pts. vs. Hawai'i) and Jené Morris (34 pts. vs. Iowa State). Morris' 34 points are the most by a player in the MWC this season, while Johnson's 31 tie for second.

- With the help of the U.S. Marine Corps, the Aztecs posted a season-high for home attendance with 1,681 fans against UC Riverside. The figure ranks third in the 12-year history of Cox Arena.

- SDSU has had four different starting line-ups this year, after having only three a year ago. Eight different Aztecs have started at least one game in 2008-09.

- SDSU had three players score 20 points or more in the same game vs. Montana State. The last time the Aztecs accomplished that feat was in 1992 vs. Colorado State.

- San Diego State scored 85 points in consecutive 85-70 wins over LMU and Montana State. The last time the Aztecs scored at least 85 points in consecutive games was in 1999, when SDSU defeated San Jose State, 89-51, on Jan. 28, and Fresno State, 89-68, on Jan. 30.

- The Aztecs have won their last 45 games when scoring 80 or more points with the last defeat coming in 1992 against Fresno State (L, 84-86).

- Jené Morris was named the Mountain West Conference Basketball Player of the Week on Dec. 22. Morris helped the Aztecs erase a five-point halftime deficit by scoring a game-high 26 points vs. LMU.

- Paris Johnson was named league player of the week on Dec. 29, following her 27-point, 13-rebound performance against Sacramento State. It is the sophomore's second career weekly honor.

- Jené Morris and Paris Johnson are the first Aztecs to win more than one MWC weekly honor in their careers since the league's inception. Overall, only eight Aztecs have been named MWC player of the week.

- On the year, the Aztecs have already combined for six double-doubles after posting seven in 2007-08. Paris Johnson leads the way with five this year, trailing only UNLV's Shamela Hampton (7) for the league lead.

- The Aztecs have six or more blocked shots in seven of their 12 contests, leading to a perfect 7-0 record.

Preseason Points

The San Diego State women's basketball team, which advanced to last season's league championship game, was picked to finish second in the Mountain West Conference in 2009 in a vote by the MWC's nine head coaches and select media members released Oct. 14, at the conference's annual media day in Las Vegas, Nev.

The Aztecs earned six of the 26 first-place votes and garnered 184 points overall, trailing first place Utah, who had 16 first-place votes, by 22 points. The second-place projection is four spots higher than SDSU's previous best placing in the preseason poll when the team was selected sixth in both 1999-2000 and 2003-04.

Behind SDSU in the preseason poll is TCU (161 pts.) and New Mexico (148 pts.), who each garnered a pair of first-place votes. BYU, Wyoming, UNLV, Colorado State and Air Force rounded out the nine-team poll.

In addition, two Aztecs, Jené Morris and Paris Johnson were selected to the five-player preseason all-Mountain West Conference team.

Aztecs Sign Two Guards TO NLI's

Head coach Beth Burns announced the signing of two, 5-9 guards, **Ashley Duffy (Lakeside, Calif.)** and **Kiyana Stamps (Moreno Valley, Calif.)**, to National Letters of Intent. The pair will join the Aztecs in 2009.

2007-08 Rewind

The San Diego State women's basketball team posted its best season in over a decade in 2007-08, compiling an 18-13 record and advancing to the championship game of the Mountain West Conference tournament.

Below are a few of last year's team accomplishments:

- ♦ Posted the program's first winning season and most victories since 1996-97.

- ♦ Advanced to its first MWC championship game and became the highest seed to do so in conference tournament history.

- ♦ Logged its first-ever MWC championship victories and its first conference tournament wins since 1997.

- ♦ Recorded the program's most-ever MWC wins (7) and highest-ever MWC regular-season finish (1-5th).

- ♦ Beat BYU for the first time since 2001, won in Las Vegas for the first time since 1997, won at Colorado State for the first time since 2000 and defeated TCU for the first time since it joined the MWC in 2006.

Tournament Town

San Diego State University and Cox Arena at Aztec Bowl will play host to the 2009 NCAA Women's Basketball First & Second Rounds, March 21 & 23.

SDSU was one of eight additional venues selected last February for 2009 by the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Committee, which voted to expand from eight to 16 first- and second-round sites.

This year's event in San Diego will feature four schools vying to advance to the NCAA regionals.

Cox Arena has served as the host site for three other NCAA championship events, including the 2001 and 2006 Men's Basketball First & Second Rounds and the 2001 Women's Volleyball Final Four, since the facility opened in the fall of 1997.

SDSU has played host to NCAA women's basketball games three times previously in Peterson Gym in 1984, 1994 and most recently in 1995.

The Aztecs will have a record seven regular-season games televised either live or shown via tape delay in 2008-09. SDSU's game with UConn was shown on a

play at home against Air Force on CBS College Sports. SDSU has three more conference outings live on The Mtn., followed by the contest at BYU, which will be rebroadcast on the The Mtn. at 7 p.m. PT on Feb. 26.

SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns



The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa in April 8, 2005.

In just four short years, she already has the program headed in the right direction, as the Aztecs' posted their best season in over a decade in 2007-08, going 18-13 overall and advancing to their first-ever MWC championship game.

Burns helped the Aztecs to a 7-9 mark in MWC play in 2008, to finish in a tie for fifth with Brigham Young. The Aztecs' seven league wins and fifth-place showing is their best-ever in the history of the MWC.

In her first stint as head coach from 1989-97, Burns took the SDSU women's basketball program full circle, going from 7-23 her first year to 23-7 in her final campaign. During her eight seasons, she compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular-season titles.

A three-time WAC coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02). She has a 17-year overall head coaching record of 274-204, while her mark school record stands at 193-139 over 12 seasons.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team won its season-opener for the second consecutive year, defeating visiting Northwestern State, 67-47, at Cox Arena. With the victory, the Aztecs improved to 1-0 on the year, while the Lady Demons dropped to 0-1 following the two schools' first-ever meeting.

SDSU had four players finish in double-figure scoring and combined for 15 blocked shots, the most ever by a Mountain West Conference team in the league's 10-year history.

Aztec sophomore center Paris Johnson posted her fourth career double-double with a game-high 14 points and 12 rebounds to go with five blocked shots, which tie for 10th in the SDSU single-game record book. Sophomore Jerica Williams, playing in her first game in the Red & Black, posted nine points and 14 rebounds, 11 of which came in the first half. Williams' 14 boards are the most by an Aztec since December 2003.

Junior guard Quenese Davis added 13 points and eight assists. Sophomore Coco Davis had 11 points and senior Jennifer Layton-Bailes, playing in her first game since 2007, tallied 10 points and three blocks.

San Diego State never trailed in the game, going up by four points on three occasions, including at 12-8 with just over minutes left in the first half. The Aztecs increased that lead to six on a layup by Layton-Bailes, but the two sides failed to record a point over the next four minutes. Lady Demon Britany Kinlaw broke the stalemate with a jumper to put her team down by just four points at 14-10. Two Johnson free throws sparked an 8-0 SDSU run and the home team went into the locker room up by 13 at 28-15.

Northwestern State got to within 10 on three occasions coming out of the break, but the Aztecs matched the Lady Demons bucket for bucket, pulling away with a 20-point advantage at 49-29. SDSU never looked back, coasting to an eventual 20-point, 67-47, victory.

The Aztecs forced 30 Lady Demon turnovers and had 50 rebounds, the team's most in a single outing since 2000.

LONG BEACH, Calif. - The San Diego State women's basketball team had a 15-point first-half lead, but had to rally to survive a strong Long Beach State run, coming away with a 67-59 victory at the Pyramid in Long Beach, Calif. The Aztecs start the season 2-0 for the second year in row, while the 49ers dropped to 0-1 in the teams' first meeting since 1997.

Sophomore Jerica Williams had a career-best 23 points with 16 in the second half and three of the team's four triples. Sophomore center Paris Johnson had 14 points and 12 boards for the second outing in a row, posting her fifth career double-double to go with four blocked shots. Over the next seven minutes, SDSU held LBSU without a field goal, building an 18-3 lead, before the 49ers could finally break the string at the 9:52 mark. That 15-point advantage at 18-3 was the Aztecs' largest of the game, but LBSU was able to shave six points off that deficit and went into the break down by just nine, 31-22.

San Diego State pushed its lead back into double-figures on a Lindsay Leo jumper to open the second half at 33-22. The rest of the way was a battle, however, as the 49ers drew to within four at the 11:17 mark and the score 46-42.

Another three-pointer by Williams increased the SDSU advantage to seven and the visitor's were up by 10 at 60-50 and again at 67-57. The Aztecs finished out the game by making five of six free throws in the final 1:33 to come away with the 67-59 win.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team overcame a nine-point, second-half deficit, but was unable to complete the comeback, falling 63-60 to the University of San Diego at the Jenny Craig Pavilion. With the loss, the Aztecs dropped to 2-2 on the year, while the Toreros improved to 3-2 after their fourth-straight win in the series on their home floor.

Junior guard Jené Morris scored 11 of her team-best 14 points in the second half and also contributed three steals. Classmate Quenese Davis added 12 points, three assists and three steals, while her sister Coco Davis scored in double-figures for the second time this season with 10 points and tallied a career-best five steals, all of which came in the first half.

The Aztecs got in foul trouble early in the game as both Morris and starting center Paris Johnson got two quick fouls apiece and played just 10 and two minutes each in the first half. Even without Morris and Johnson, the SDSU hung tough, trailing by just five points on two occasions, including at 28-23 with 2:52 left until the break.

The Aztecs got a spark off the bench from true freshman Kalena Tutt, as the center scored the first five points of her career to keep the team close. A Quenese Davis three-pointer cut the Torero lead to just two at 28-26, and then Coco Davis followed that effort up with a jumper and two straight steals and three-point plays to put SDSU ahead by four points, 34-30, heading in to the locker room.

Out of the break, USD rode the hot shooting of forward Kiva Herman, who finished the game 9-for-11 from the field, to not only erase the deficit, but also go up by as many as nine points at 51-42 with 7:55 remaining.

The SDSU offense, which managed just six points in the first 11:45 of the second half, finally woke up as a Jennifer Layton-Bailes' jumper kick started a 14-4 run that put the Aztecs back ahead 56-55 with just over three minutes left.

USD retook the lead on two free throws and was up by four points with 32 seconds left on a lay-up by Dominique Conners. SDSU countered on its next trip down the court when sophomore guard Jerica Williams banked in a three-pointer from the left angle to get to within just one 61-60. The Aztecs stole the ensuing in-bound pass, but Morris was unable to hold on, as two more USD free throws closed out the 63-60 victory.

The Aztecs had a season-best 13 steals, but could not overcome a -10 margin on the boards and a 13-for-21 performance at the stripe.

HONOLULU - Sophomore center Paris Johnson had a career-high 31 points to help the San Diego State women's basketball team defeat Hawai'i, 71-48, in the first day of the Waikiki Marriott Beach Classic at the Stan Sheriff Center in Honolulu, Hawaii. With the win, the Aztecs ended a two-game losing skid to move to 3-2 on the year, while the Rainbow Wahines dropped to 0-4 after the two schools' first meeting since 1999.

Johnson made her first five shots and ended up with a career-high 31 points on 15-for-19 shooting, beating her previous best of 27 points last year against Indiana State. Johnson is the first Aztec to reach the 30-point barrier this season, while her 15 field goals tie for ninth in the SDSU single-game record book. The 6-4 center also led SDSU with seven rebounds and a pair of blocked shots.

Senior forward Jennifer Layton-Bailes, who made her first start since January 2007, added a season-best 13 points and Quenese Davis had nine points and six assists.

The Aztecs got off to a quick start, going inside to Johnson, who hit each of her first four shots from the field for eight points by the first media timeout to put SDSU ahead, 11-5. Johnson also made her fifth-straight field-goal attempt, but the Rainbow Wahine used almost 60 percent shooting from the field to draw even at 18-18 with just over 10 minutes left in the half.

San Diego State came out of the 18-18 tie with a 6-0 run and held Hawai'i to just five points the rest of the way, heading into the locker room up by 15 points, 38-22.

HONOLULU - The San Diego State women's basketball team had three, 13-point leads early in the game, but had to hold off several charges by Prairie View A&M to earn the 58-53 victory in the second day of the Waikiki Marriott Beach Classic at the Stan Sheriff Center in Honolulu, Hawaii. With the win, the Aztecs improved to 4-2, while the Lady Panthers dropped to 1-5.

Sophomore center Paris Johnson, who had a career-high 31 points on Friday, came back for the second day in a row with 23 points on 9-for-15 shooting and also tallied eight rebounds and three blocked shots. The Aztecs continued their momentum coming out of the break with another 13-point lead at 38-25. After the initial offensive burst of the second half, the SDSU offense stalled and the Lady Panthers crept all the way back to within just three points following a 10-0 run at 38-35 at the 13:16 mark. Prairie View A&M tied the score at 41 points, but Jerica Williams tallied her second three-pointer in the half and the Aztecs were once again in the lead at 44-41.

The game continued to be a battle with the Lady Panthers down by just one at 52-51 with 4:57 remaining. HONOLULU - Playing its fourth game of the week and third in the last three days, the San Diego State women's basketball team made 10 three-pointers, but could not hold off a hot shooting Iowa State team, as the Aztecs fell to the No. 25/22 Cyclones, 87-71, in the final day of the Waikiki Marriott Beach Classic at the Stan Sheriff Center in Honolulu, Hawaii. With the loss, the Aztecs dropped to 4-3, while the Cyclones improved to 5-1.

Aztec junior guard Jené Morris had a season-best 34 points, one off her career high of 35. Morris was 5-for-10 from beyond the arc and 12-for-24 overall and also had four assists, three steals and four rebounds.

Sophomore center Paris Johnson recorded her third double-double of the season with 14 points and 10 rebounds and tied a career-best with three steals. For the tournament, Johnson averaged 22.7 points and 8.3 boards an outing.

Junior guard Quenese Davis was the third Aztec in double-figures with 13 points, including three triples. She had seven assists to only one turnover and ended up with 19 helpers over the three-game stay in Hawaii.

The first three field goals of the game were all three pointers, as the Aztecs hit two and ISU knocked down one.

SDSU took its first four-point advantage of the first half at 10-6 on a Johnson lay-up. The Aztecs were also up by four on four other occasions with the last one coming at 20-16. Iowa State came back to tie the score at 20 apiece and took its first lead of the game on a three-pointer by Heather Ezell at 23-22. The Cyclones added two more triples in a row and were up by seven at 29-22 with 6:48 left in the half.

ISU added to their lead with a jumper from the foul line to go up by nine at 31-22. A Johnson free throw finally broke the streak at the 5:33 mark, but Cyclones again answered with their fourth straight three-pointer to go up by 11 points.

Quenese Davis responded with her own set of three pointers and the Aztecs trailed by seven at 36-29. The Iowa State lead was 43-35 heading into the locker room with the help of a 50 percent mark from beyond the arc (6-for-12).

The Cyclones continued their hot shooting in the second half, scoring the first 10 points, including two more three-pointers, until Morris ended the drought with a triple from the left baseline with 16:55 left.

SDSU put together its own scoring run of nine unanswered to cut the lead to single-digits at 53-44. The rest of the contest was a battle on both sides of the ball as cut the deficit down to 75-65 with 3:11 left. ISU, however, made all 10 of its free throws in the final 2:10 to claim the 87-71 victory.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State's Jené Morris hit the game-winning basket at the buzzer to help the Aztec basketball team defeat the visiting UC Riverside Highlanders, 54-52, Thursday evening at Cox Arena in front of a crowd of 1,681 fans. The Aztecs trailed by as many as eight points in the first half and failed to score for over five and a half minutes mid-way through the second half, but outscored the Highlanders 9-3 in the final 2:43 to pull out the win. With the victory, SDSU improved to 5-3 on the season, while UCR dropped to 2-4 overall.

Morris hit her first four three-point field goals of the evening and finished 5-for-6 from beyond the arc for a team-best 19 points to go with three steals and three assists. Morris was the only Aztec in double-figure scoring as senior Jennifer Layton-Bailes had nine points on 4-for-6 shooting. Junior point guard Quenese Davis led the team in rebounding (7) and assists (7) in 37 minutes of action.

SDSU opened the game with a 3-0 lead on a Morris three-pointer, but the Highlanders quickly matched her effort with a triple of their own to tie the score at 3-3. UCR took the lead on a free-throw at the 18:21 mark and held the advantage until a 7-0 Aztec run put the home team in front 12-10. A Kemie Nekele three-pointer restored order in the visitor's favor and UC Riverside led by a game-high eight points at the half, 29-21, behind a 54.5 shooting percentage.

The Aztecs, meanwhile, shot just 29 percent from the field in the first half, but came out of the locker room with two Morris three-pointers in the first minute and a half to get to within four at 31-27. The Highlanders led by six points at 39-33 and by five at 41-26, but a Davis three-pointer and a jumper inside from Paris Johnson helped SDSU even the score at 41 points.

Following the game's sixth tie score at 45-45, neither side could get its offense going as the teams went without a point for the next three minutes when the Highlanders made back-to-back buckets in the paint to once again lead by four, 49-45.

Morris' final three-pointer of the game broke the Aztecs' scoring drought at 49-48, and Layton-Bailes converted a long distance two-pointer from straightaway for a one-point lead at 50-49. UCR was not done, however, erasing a three-point Aztec advantage and knotting the game at 52-52 with just 21 seconds remaining.

Coming out of a timeout, Morris hit the winning basket from the right elbow just before the buzzer sounded for the 54-52 victory.

SAN DIEGO - Three Aztec basketball players reached the 20-point barrier to help the team remain perfect at home, as San Diego State downed the visiting Montana State Bobcats, 85-70, Thursday evening at Cox Arena. With the win, the Aztecs improved to 6-3 on the year, while the Bobcats fell to 4-4 overall.

Aztec sophomore center Paris Johnson had the best all-around game of her career, posting a game-high 22 points to go with 13 rebounds, six assists, five blocks and three steals in 35 minutes for her fourth double-double of the season. Johnson's six assists were a career-best, while her 13 rebounds and three steals matched a career-high.

Johnson was helped offensively by Quenese Davis' 20 points and Jennifer Layton-Bailes' 20 points, which matched her career-best. Davis also had six assists and junior Jené Morris and sophomore Jerica Williams each had four of the team's season-high 16 steals.

SDSU never trailed in the game, coming out of the gate on a 9-0 run off back-to-back baskets by Johnson, a jumper by Davis and a three-pointer from Layton-Bailes. The Bobcats scored their first points of the game at the 16:34 mark on a three-point field goal by Nubia Garcia. San Diego State's lead grew to double-figures on a Layton-Bailes jumper at 15-5, but MSU put up a scoring run of its own, tallying nine straight to get back to within one.

Williams, who along with Layton-Bailes hit her first four shots of the game, stopped the Bobcat run with the first of three straight three-pointers over a span of just a little over a minute and a half to go back up by nine. The Aztecs continued to make plays, increasing their advantage to as many as 24 points, before heading into the locker room up 21 at 48-27, their highest first-half scoring output of the season.

Coming out of the break, Montana State began to get hot offensively, cutting the Aztec lead down to just 12 points on two occasions behind nearly 60 percent shooting from the field. The Bobcats never got any closer, though, as the Aztecs pushed their lead to 18 with 6:44 left and went on to win by 15 points, 85-70, to improve to 3-0 at home this season.

SDSU had a season-best 24 assists and its 85 points were also a season-high after scoring 71 against both Hawai'i and No. 25 Iowa State last month.

SAN DIEGO - Behind sophomore Paris Johnson's 27 points and 13 rebounds, the San Diego State women's basketball team cruised to a 75-47 victory Sunday afternoon over Sacramento State (2-10) in the first game of the San Diego Surf 'N Slam at Cox Arena. With the victory, the Aztecs improved to 8-3 on the season and advanced to the tournament finale.

Johnson made 11 of her 12 shots from the field for her fourth 20-point scoring effort of the season. She also matched a career high with 13 rebounds for her fifth double-double of 2008-09, and had three steals in only 29 minutes of action.

Aztec guards Jené Morris and Quenese Davis both scored in double-figures with 12 and 10 points respectively, while adding four steals apiece. Davis contributed a game-high five assists and senior Jennifer Layton-Bailes tallied eight points and five boards.

San Diego State led the entire contest, opening with a quick 5-0 advantage on a Davis free throw and back-to-back baskets by Layton-Bailes. The Hornets didn't get on the board until the 15:54 mark and the Aztecs quickly moved their lead into double-figures at 13-3.

SDSU was up by 12 points at the 11:40 mark, but Sacramento State cut its deficit down to eight on three occasions, before the Aztecs reeled off five straight points to go up by 13 at 26-13.

The Hornets made it interesting, closing to within six points, before San Diego State went into the break on an 8-0 run for the 37-23 advantage.

The Aztecs continued to find the basket coming out of the locker room, outscoring the visitors 16-2 within the first six and a half minutes to go up by 28 points. SDSU would eventually lead by as many as 37 points with 7:14 left before securing the 75-47 win.

The Aztecs shot above 50 percent from the field for the second consecutive outing to garner their fourth straight win. SDSU, which is a perfect 4-0 in the month of December, forced 29 Hornet turnovers and posted 16 steals.

SAN DIEGO (AP) - Jene Morris' late surge was too much for No. 4 Texas on Tuesday night.

Morris and San Diego State stunned No. 4 Texas with a 60-55 win on Tuesday night in the Surf 'N Slam championship game, handing the Longhorns their first loss of the season.

Morris scored 24 points, including 15 in the second half when San Diego State (9-3) refused to let Texas pull away.

"This is as good as it gets," San Diego State coach Beth Burns said. "How many people get an opportunity to play the great teams?"

The result was far different from earlier this season when the Aztecs were routed at top-ranked Connecticut 99-55 or when then-No. 25 Iowa State handed San Diego State a 87-71 loss.

"The difference was we came into this game thinking we could beat them," Morris said. "We had confidence that we didn't have against those other teams."

Morris almost single-handedly kept San Diego State in the game in the second half when she hit three 3-pointers. But it was late baskets by Jennifer Layton-Bailes and Paris Johnson that put the Aztecs ahead to stay.

Texas (11-1) played a sloppy game as it committed 23 turnovers and never seemed to get into an offensive rhythm.

The Longhorns led from the midway point of the first half until Layton-Bailes scored on a layup for a 53-52 San Diego State lead with 1:51 left.

Johnson followed with another layup with 1:08 remaining. Two free throws by Quenese Davis put the Aztecs ahead 57-52 with 19 seconds remaining.

Carla Cortijo, who led the Longhorns with 13 points, hit a 3-pointer that pulled Texas to within 57-55 with 11.9 seconds left. Johnson then hit a free throw with 10.6 seconds left before Erika Arriaran missed a 3-pointer that would have tied the game. Davis hauled in the rebound and was fouled, making both of her shots at the stripe to secure the 60-55 victory.

Morris tied her career high with eight steals for San Diego State, which won despite shooting 33.9 percent.

Texas had a 10-point lead twice early in the second half but couldn't put away the Aztecs.
