Started his second straight game and went for six points vs. Air Force (2-7-09)... Had three rebounds and one steal in 10 minutes at Utah (2-11-09)... Contributed two points, one rebound and one blocked shot vs. Wyoming (2-14-09)... Had four points, two rebounds and a career-high two assists at New Mexico (2-21-09)... Scored two points and matched his career high with two assists vs. BYU (2-24-09)... Collected a season-high six rebounds and scored eight points at TCU (2-28-09)... Connected on his first three-point attempt in nine games and finished with seven points vs. Colorado State (3-4-09)... Tallied one rebound in three minutes vs. UNLV (3-7-09)... Went two-for-two with four points total and recorded four rebounds versus BYU in the MWC semifinals (3-13-09)... Pulled down three rebounds in 19 minutes and contributed one assist versus Utah in the MWC championship game (3-14-09)... Selected to play in the NJCCA Men's Basketball Coaches Association's third annual National All-Star Game... AWC finished the year with a 26-3 overall record and a 20-2 in conference play... Earned ACCAC Division I player of the week and NJCCA Division I co-player of the week honors after leading the Matadors to a pair of wins with averages of 18.5 points and 7.0 rebounds... Ended his tenure at AWC averaging 12.1 points, while shooting 48.0 percent from the field and 40.2 percent from three-point distance in 27 games.

DAVIS EARNS USBWA'S MOST COURAGEOUS AWARD

Kelvin Davis was selected as the 2009 recipient of the U.S. Basketball Writers Association's "Most Courageous Award" in March of 2009.

Davis was honored at the USBWA's Awards Breakfast in downtown Detroit during the Final Four weekend. In addition, he was the recipient of a \$1,000 check, which he donated to the charity or scholarship fund of his choice.

Davis was diagnosed with Hodgkin's lymphoma in the spring of 2008. However, he was able to overcome the cancer and returned to the Aztecs while still undergoing his chemotherapy and radiation treatments.

Davis' saga began when he felt fatigued while playing. Originally, it was thought he may be coming down with mononucleosis. However, there was a lump developing on Davis' neck. He knew about it, but didn't say anything because he didn't want to jeopardize his spot on the team.

But his condition grew worse and a trip to the doctor revealed Davis had cancer. He underwent a series of 12 chemotherapy treatments over a five-month span. He was still undergoing his treatment when fall practice began and it wasn't unusual to see Davis arrive straight from the doctor's office to the practice gym and spend the last 20 minutes in drills.

Davis joined a prestigious list of past winners, including Jim Valvano, Steve Kerr, Bob Wenzel and Nolan Richardson.
