The Inaugural San Diego SLAM Tips-Off With A San Diego vs. Pac-10 Conference Feel; USD Battles Southern California and San Diego State Plays Host to California

San Diego State (4-2) and the San Diego International Sports Council are proud to host the inaugural San Diego SLAM presented by PerfectWave Technologies. The basketball doubleheader scheduled for Saturday opens with San Diego facing Southern California at 5 p.m. PST, followed by San Diego State playing host to California (4-3) at approximately 7:30 p.m. PST.

The doubleheader will be broadcast by Channel 4 San Diego and will be seen not only in San Diego, but throughout the West Coast (see left column). Channel 4 will begin coverage at 5 p.m. PST and televise both games. The San Diego State game can be heard on XPRS-1090 AM (The Mighty 1090).

The Aztecs are looking to rebound from just their second loss of the season, a 98-69 setback at 16th/21st-ranked (AP/Coaches) Washington on Tuesday night. The loss snapped the Aztecs' four-game winning streak, its longest since a six-game winning streak from Dec. 10, 2002-Jan. 3, 2003.

Washington scored the first eight points of the game and never looked back in improving to 6-1. The loss overshadowed a career-high 14 points for freshman Matt Thomas. The sophomore duo of Marcus Slaughter and Brandon Heath continued their impressive play thus far. Slaughter scored a team-best 21 points and added seven rebounds, while Heath, the reigning Mountain West Conference Player of the Week, added 18 points.

Despite the loss, a 4-2 record matches San Diego State's best mark through six games since the 1984-85 team won its first eight games en route to the NCAA Tournament and finished 23-8.

California, playing just its second road game of the season, is coming off a 63-60 loss to Colorado on Tuesday night. The Golden Bears have victories over UC Riverside, Southern, Brigham Young and Fairleigh Dickinson and losses to Saint Mary's (SDSU's opponent on Tuesday), UNLV and Colorado.

Saturday will be the fourth meeting between San Diego State and California. The Aztecs own a 2-1 series lead, although the teams have not played since Jan. 12, 1942. This is a somewhat rare appearance for a California Pac-10 school to play in San Diego. This will mark the first California Pac-10 school to play SDSU since USC did on Dec. 20, 1999 and just the fifth appearance since Jan. 9, 1989 (UCLA on Dec. 14, 1991, Stanford on Dec. 16, 1997 and USC on Nov. 17, 1997 and Dec. 20, 1999).

San Diego State has a rich tradition of hosting college basketball events. The University has served as the host to the NCAA first and second rounds in 2001 and will once again have the honor of hosting in 2006. SDSU also played host to a two-day four-team tournament on a fairly regular basis from the mid 70s through the early 90s. The last time the Aztecs entertained a field during a regular season event was the 1992 Texaco Star Classic.

16th-Ranked Washington Ends San Diego State's Four-Game Winning Streak, 98-69; Aztec Freshman Matt Thomas Scores Career-High 14 Points

SEATTLE - Nate Robinson scored 24 points and Tre Simmons added 23 points as 16th-ranked Washington snapped San Diego State's four-game winning streak with a 98-69 victory on Dec. 7 at Bank of America Arena.

The Huskies scored the first eight points of the game and never trailed in improving to 6-1.

Washington forced 26 turnovers and enjoyed a 45-31 rebound advantage in claiming its second victory in as many seasons over the Aztecs.

San Diego State, which had shot 50 percent or better from the field in three straight games, was held to 41.9 percent shooting from the field. Meanwhile, the Aztecs, which had limited opponents to 40.1 percent shooting during the winning streak, yielded 50.7 percent shooting to the Huskies.

Washington jumped out to leads of 8-0, 26-8 and 37-12, en route to a 56-34 halftime advantage. The Aztecs were unable to get closer than 22 points in the second half.

Through six games, SDSU set or tied season lows for field goals, three-point field goals and assists and set a season-high for turnovers. Washington set season highs for an Aztec opponent in points scored, field goals, field goal percentage, free throws, rebounds and assists.

San Diego State freshman Matt Thomas had a career-high 14 points and added a team-best three assists in 27 minutes of action. Sophomore forward Marcus Slaughter recorded his fourth 20-point effort of the season and reached double-figures for the sixth straight game, with 21 points. Sophomore guard Brandon Heath added 18 points and four rebounds.

San Diego State vs. California: The Series

▶ This is the first half of a home-and-home series that is tentatively scheduled to have the Aztecs return to Berkeley next season. San Diego State leads the series 2-1, although the teams have not played since Jan. 12, 1942. In the series, two games have been decided by one point and the third was decided by two points.

▶ San Diego State is 26-71 (26.8 percent) lifetime versus the Pac-10 conference. Steve Fisher is 5-12 (29.4 percent) against the Pac-10, although if you take out his seven meetings with Arizona he is 4-6 against the rest of the league.

▶ The Aztecs have lost four straight games to Pac-10 teams, although to be fair, it is important to note that that streak includes three losses to ranked teams (a 98-69 loss at 16th-ranked Washington on Tuesday, a 92-81 setback to 2004 NCAA Tournament participant Washington on Dec. 27, 2003 at Cox Arena, an 83-71 loss at 5th-ranked Arizona on Dec. 22, 2003 and an 89-81 loss to top-ranked Arizona on Dec. 7, 2002 at Cox Arena). San Diego State's last victory over the league was on Dec. 16, 2000 when the Aztecs defeated Arizona State, 64-62.

▶ For the second consecutive season, San Diego State is playing consecutive games against Pac-10 competition. Last season, the Aztecs traveled to 5th-ranked Arizona (L, 71-83) before facing Washington (L, 81-92) five days later at home. This season, San Diego State played at Washington (Dec. 7), before returning home to face California (Dec. 11) in the second game of the San Diego SLAM.

▶ Only Chris Manker and Travis Hanour have ever crossed paths with the Golden Bears, both while members of Pac-10 schools. As a freshman at Oregon State, Manker made his second career start against Cal, recording a season-high five rebounds and two assists. He did not score while playing 22 minutes in the game. He was injured and did not play when the teams met later that season. Although, Hanour saw action in 20 games as a freshman at Arizona, including two NCAA Tournament games.

▶ Although there is not much history between San Diego State and California, the head coaches at the two programs have met four previous times. While at Michigan, Steve Fisher led team against Ben Braun-coached Eastern Michigan squads four times, with Fisher's Wolverine prevailing all four times. The teams met in Fisher's first four full-seasons as a head coach in Ann Arbor, prevailing 107-83 on Dec. 30, 1989, 78-76 on Dec. 4, 1990, 91-77 on Dec. 12, 1991 and 88-58 on Jan. 2, 1993.

Four-Game Win Streak Most Impressive Since 1984

Although the Aztecs four-game win streak was snapped on Tuesday night, the dominance SDSU displayed during the streak is worth reflecting on.

Although the Aztecs have had longer win streaks, you have to go back 20 years to find a more dominating four-game win streak than what SDSU has put together during the last four games.

San Diego State posted four victories by a combined score of 311-234, or by 77 total points. That makes an average victory total of 19.3 points during the four-game streak.

The last time the Aztecs put together a more dominating four game run was when the 1984-85 NCAA Tournament team outscored its opponents by 81 points in four consecutive games during December, 1984. The four-game streak was part of an 8-0 record that squad posted to begin the 1984-85 season and marks the last time San Diego State got off to a better start than this season's 4-1 record.

During the four-game winning streak, San Diego State put together some impressive numbers:
 ▶ San Diego State has shot 54.2 percent from the field during the four-game stretch, shooting above 50.0 percent from the floor in each of the last three games. That is the longest stretch since posting a 50 percent or better field goal percentage in five straight games from Feb. 22-Mar. 8, 2003. Since that time, SDSU shot 50 percent or better from the floor just twice in the 37 games prior to the beginning of the current three-game streak.
 ▶ The Aztecs have held their opponent to 40.1 percent field goal shooting, Since Steve Fisher's arrival at San Diego State, the Aztecs are 33-6 when their opponent shoots 40 percent or less from the field.
 ▶ A staple of the Aztec program has been strong rebounding. San Diego State has outrebounded four of five opponents this season and has a +8.2 rebound margin during the four-game winning streak.

As you might expect, four-game winning streak typically means good things for the rest of the season. The last two times SDSU has had at least a four-game winning streak in a season they have advanced to postseason play (2001-02 NCAA Tournament, 2002-03 NIT) and every season under Steve Fisher's direction that the Aztecs have a had four-game winning streak, SDSU has gone to finish .500 or better.

So Far, So Good

Through six games of the 2004-05 season, San Diego State has shown improvement in nearly every statistical trend over the 2003-04 season. Last season, the Aztecs finished 14-16, snapping a two-year postseason run and three consecutive seasons of finishing .500 or better.

It may be early, but field goal percentage, turnovers and close losses, which gave the Aztecs fits in 2003-04 have not only not been a problem for this San Diego State team, but have actually become a couple of strengths.

Making the quick start even more impressive, is the fact that the Aztecs have already missed 10 games due to injuries by two seniors expected to play significant minutes - Chris Walton and Travis Hanour.

Fast Starts on the Montezuma Mesa

As previously mentioned, San Diego State's 4-2 start matches its best start in the last 20 seasons, since the 1984-85 NCAA Tournament team opened play 8-0.

A victory Saturday would give the Aztecs a 5-2 start and would continue to match the best opening to a season since the 1984-85 squad (only four other Aztec teams have opened 5-2 since 1984-85).

Below is a look at recent teams that have gotten off to 3-2 or better start and how they fared in games four, five and the rest of the way.

Slaughter House Rules

Sophomore forward Marcus Slaughter has gotten off to an explosive start this season. An honorable mention all-conference selection as a freshman, Slaughter is averaging team-highs in scoring (20.5 ppg) and rebounding (8.3). As of Thursday, he ranked among the league leaders in scoring (1st), rebounding (6th), steals (6th), field goal percentage (6th) and blocked shots (7th).

Slaughter's fast start this season isn't such a big surprise when you track his growth as a player month-by-month throughout his career (see right box). Nonetheless, November easily represented the best month at San Diego State

Other notes on Slaughter's great jump out of the gate.

► He has produced double-digit scoring games in all six games this season marking the first time in his career the sophomore has scored 10 or more points in as many as three consecutive games. He had eight double-figure scoring games all of last season.

► With 123 total points this season, he is 51.9 percent of the way toward matching his freshman point total of 237 points. Last season he did not reach 123 points for the season until his 18th game of the season.

► He led the Aztecs in scoring just once last season but has already led SDSU in scoring in four of the first six games this season.

► He is shooting more than 10 percent better from the field this season, connecting on 57.4 percent this season as opposed to 47.3 last season. He also has already connected on four three-point field goals after making just eight last season.

► He continues to feel right at home at Cox Arena. In 19 career games at Cox Arena, Slaughter is averaging 11.3 ppg, 7.1 rpg, 52.1 field goal percentage (74-of-142) and 39.1 three-point field goal percentage (9-of-23). This season he has posted 19.5 ppg, 9.0 rpg, 54.8 field goal percentage (23-of-42) in four home games.

Super Manker

Chris Manker could very easily be the biggest surprise in the Mountain West Conference this season. The senior entered this season with career numbers of 206 points and 139 rebounds but has played his way into the starting lineup and ranks among the league leaders (9th in offensive rebounding, 10th in scoring, 10th in field goal percentage, 15th in blocked shots, 15th in three-point field goals made and 18th in rebounding).

► One reason for his success has been his play in the low post. This season, Manker has 24 two-point field goals, seven more than his total for the entire 2003-04 season when he had 17 two-point field goals. He had 34 two-point field goals in 75 career games entering this season.

► His 84 total points are 84.0 percent of the way toward his career-high season total of 100 points set last season as a junior.

► The Aztecs are 9-2 when Manker blocks a shot in a game and SDSU is 6-1 in the seven games in which he has started in his career.

Heath Among League Leaders... In Everything

Sophomore guard Brandon Heath earned Mountain West Conference Player of the Week honors for the period ending December 5.

A native of Los Angeles, Heath averaged team-highs with 23.0 points and 6.0 assists in lopsided victories over San Diego (83-63) and at UC Santa Barbara (73-55).

Heath connected on 16 of his 25 attempts (64.0 percent) from the field and a remarkable 7-of-11 tries from three-point range (63.6 percent).

With a game-high and season-high 26 points against San Diego and 20 points at UC Santa Barbara, Heath now has 11 career games with 20 or more points.

Heath became the sixth different Aztec to win the weekly award since the 2000-01 season. In all, San Diego State players have won the MWC honor 11 times - Aerick Sanders (4), Randy Holcomb (3), Tony Bland, Evan Burns, Al Faux and Brandon Heath.

Heath is the first Aztec winner of the honor since Aerick Sanders claimed the honor on Jan. 5, 2004, following wins over Portland and Iowa State.

In just 36 career games, he has amassed 515 career points, most among all active SDSU players. He also ranks 10th on the school's three-point field goal chart with 62.

He is currently ranked among the Mountain West Conference leaders in seven statistical categories, including steals (2nd), three-point field goals made (3rd), assists (3rd) and scoring (4th).

Aztecs Look to Continue Cox Arena Magic

Cox Arena has become quite a home court advantage for the Aztecs during Steve Fisher's rebuilding project at San Diego State. The Aztecs, now in their eighth season at the 12,414-seat on-campus venue, have recorded at least 11 home victories in each of the past four seasons. It is just the second time in school history that SDSU has won 11 home games in four straight seasons (1981-82 through 1984-85).

The numbers have even been better during the last three seasons, with SDSU posting a 37-14 record (72.5 percent). The Aztecs have been particularly hard on non-conference foes, winning 28 of their last 34 (82.4 percent) non-league games. During that span, two of the six losses have come at the hands of nationally-ranked opposition, making SDSU 27-4 against non-ranked non-conference foes since Dec. 9, 2000 (also subtract a non-conference win over 21st-ranked Fresno State during that time).

Postseason Play, Guaranteed

Given Steve Fisher's track record, San Diego State's prospects of returning to the postseason for a third time in four seasons appears to be good. In his 12 full seasons, Steve Fisher has returned at least three starters off a squad he coached the previous season eight times. He has guided all eight of those teams to postseason play, including six of those squads to the NCAA Tournament. Those eight teams have combined to post a 20-5 record in postseason play, including two appearances in the NCAA Tournament championship game (1991 and 1992) and a championship in the NIT (1996).

Some additional notes on Steve Fisher's success when returning at least three starters off a team he has coached.

- ▶ Is 8-for-8 in leading his team to the postseason. Six times he has guided a team to the NCAA Tournament.
- ▶ Has won at least one postseason game in six of those eight seasons and at least two games in five of those eight seasons.
- ▶ Averaged 22.6 wins in those eight seasons. In six of the eight years his teams have won at least 21 games.

Preseason Magazines Gives Aztecs Little Love

Most of the preseason magazines have picked the Aztecs to finish in the lower half of the Mountain West Conference standings and the MWC poll was no exception, picking the Aztecs to finish seventh; however, a pretty strong case can be made that San Diego State will have a successful 2004-05 season.

- ▶ San Diego State returns four starters and nine letterwinners (includes Travis Hanour who sat out last season due to injuries) from the 2003-04 season. The Aztecs return eight of their top nine scorers from last season.
- ▶ Steve Fisher is 8-for-8 in his career in taking teams to the postseason when returning at least three starters off a team he coached the previous season. Included in those eight postseason trips are six NCAA Tournament berths and an average total of 22.6 wins. The last time a Steve Fisher-coached team returned four starters was 2001-02, when Fisher guided the Aztecs to their first NCAA Tournament appearance since 1985. Twice in his career, Fisher has returned at least three starters and at least nine letterwinners off a team he coached, both seasons he has led his team to the NCAA Tournament, posting a collective 56-14 record.
- ▶ San Diego State returns 77.0 percent of points, 74.2 percent of field goals, 99.4 percent of three-point field goals, 78.0 percent of free throws, 68.6 percent of rebounds, 91.3 percent of assists, 54.9 percent of blocked shots, 85.8 percent of steals and 81.9 percent of minutes from the 2003-04 season.
- ▶ The 2004-05 SDSU roster has played 538 games and made 161 starts. Nine players on the Aztec roster have played in at least 30 college games and five players have made at least 18 college starts. Last season, the Aztec roster (not counting Travis Hanour's total because he missed the season due to injury) entered the campaign with a total of 407 games and 72 starts. In 2002-03 when San Diego State advanced to the second round of the postseason NIT, the Aztecs entered the campaign with 413 games and 152 starts of experience. In 2001-02 when the Aztecs claimed the Mountain West Conference championship and advanced to the NCAA Tournament, San Diego State entered the season with 370 games and 194 starts.
- ▶ San Diego State was not that far away last season from making their third consecutive postseason appearance. Although the Aztecs finished 14-16 overall, they lost three games when they led with 59 seconds left, lost six games that were a one possession game with 25 seconds or less remaining and lost seven games when they led with 13:48 or less remaining in regulation. Part of that can be explained by the fact that SDSU had just one scholarship senior (Aerick Sanders).
- ▶ San Diego State returns three players that earned all-Mountain West Conference recognition last season. Senior guard Wesley Stokes, sophomore guard Brandon Heath and sophomore forward Marcus Slaughter are back for SDSU this sea-

son. This marks the first time in school history that three all-league performers return from an Aztec team. In fact, in the Mountain West Conference era, San Diego State has never returned two all-MWC performers the following season (2000-01 (0); 2001-02 (0); 2002-03 (1) Tony Bland; 2003-04 (0); 2004-05 (3) Brandon Heath, Marcus Slaughter, Wesley Stokes).

► San Diego State has two of the best underclassmen not only in the league, but also in the country in Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter. The duo was two of only four freshmen to earn all-league recognition last season. Heath and Slaughter combined to score 650 points and pull down 284 rebounds in their inaugural season.

► Another example of the stability of the Aztec program can be found by the number of players that have signed with San Diego State out of the prep ranks. Of San Diego State's 16-player roster, three are Division I transfers (Travis Hanour, Chris Manker and Wesley Stokes), two junior college players (Mohamed Camara and walk-on Jared Ines) and 11 players who signed with SDSU directly out of high school. Of the five newcomers, four signed with the Aztecs out of high school.

Aztecs Enjoy Exhibition Success, Again

Despite substituting at liberty and a few nagging injuries, San Diego State ran its exhibition win streak to eight games with victories over Cal State San Bernardino (82-70) and Point Loma Nazarene (87-67). During those two games, the Aztecs were able to reverse a couple of the trends that proved to be fatal during last season. On the positive side, SDSU shot 48.0 percent from the field, 39.5 percent from three-point range and attempted 55 free throws. However, the Aztecs struggled from the free throw line (61.8 percent) and held a surprisingly small advantage in rebound margin (+4.0).

Individual tidbits from the two exhibition games:

► San Diego State's three returning starters from last season did not disappoint in the exhibition campaign. Sophomore forward Marcus Slaughter averaged 22.5 points and 7.0 rebounds while playing a total of just 50 minutes. Senior forward Chris Walton showed off his improved long-range shooting skills by connecting on 4-of-5 attempts from behind the line en route to average 16.0 points and 4.5 rebounds in 44 total minutes. Sophomore guard Brandon Heath, who has taken over the role of point guard for large stretches of time, averaged 9.0 points, 2.5 rebounds, but more impressively dished out 13 assists with a mere three turnovers in 49 minutes of action.

► The Aztecs got strong shooting from the field from their two leading scorers - sophomore Marcus Slaughter and senior Chris Walton. The two each cleared 62.5 percent field goal shooting and combined to connect on 28-of-41 attempts (68.3 percent) and an even more impressive 10-of-12 three-point field goal attempts (83.3 percent). The other 11 players on the team combined to connect on 32-of-84 attempts (38.1 percent) and were just 5-of-26 (19.2 percent from beyond the arc).

► San Diego State showed good ball handling skills, dishing out 41 assists with 26 turnovers in the two games. In fact, the Aztecs had almost as many steals (22) as turnovers (26).

► Senior center Chris Manker missed the second exhibition game due to a strained tendon in his left foot, but his performance in the first exhibition game should not be overlooked. Manker had eight points, five rebounds and four blocked shots in 20 minutes of action. A native of West Des Moines, Iowa, Manker also produced the best hockey plus/minus number of the contest, with a +20 rating.

► A trio of newcomers made noise during the two exhibition games. Junior center Mohamed Camara scored 16 points, and added nine rebounds and three blocked shots in 33 minutes of action. The projected starter at center made six of his nine attempts from the field. Freshman point guard Matt Thomas played 43 minutes of action and logged 14 points and four assists, while fellow freshman Tyler Smith had three points and three assists in 29 minutes.

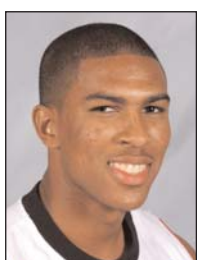
