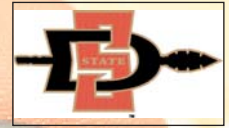

Aztec Basketball Vies For San Diego Surf 'N Slam Title Friday vs. Penn

► **When & Where:** Friday, Dec. 30, 2011, Viejas Arena (12,414), San Diego, Calif., 2 p.m. PT
► **Live Media:** Live audio and video with Chris Ello, as well as live stats, will be available on goaztecs.com.
► **SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns:** Burns (Ohio Wesleyan, 1979) is in the seventh year of her second stint as head coach at San Diego State. She led the Aztecs for eight seasons from 1989 to 1997, before returning in 2005. She has an overall head coaching record of 331-241 in 20 seasons, while she is 250-176 in her 15 campaigns at SDSU.
► **Penn Head Coach Mike McLaughlin:** McLaughlin is in his 17th season as a head coach and third with the Quakers. He boasts a school record of 26-47 and an overall head coaching mark of 433-108.
► **Series History:** The Aztecs will take on their second consecutive first-time opponent this week, when they face Penn. SDSU is 2-1 all-time vs. Ivy League members with the most recent outing coming at the 2006 Surf 'N Slam against Brown.

NEWS & NOTABLES

■ The Aztec women's basketball team will try to claim its third San Diego Surf 'N Slam title in the last four years on Friday, when it plays host to Penn for a 2 p.m. PT tip-off at Viejas Arena.
■ SDSU will be two days removed from a 57-29 win over UNCG in the tournament's opening contest. The Aztecs have come out on top in seven of their last eight Surf 'N Slam games spanning the last four years with the lone exception being in last year's championship contest to eventual national champion Texas A&M.
■ The victory over the Spartans allowed San Diego State to match its longest win streak of the season at three games and gave the head coach Beth Burns her 250th career victory on The Mesa.
■ SDSU is looking to secure its second regular-season tournament title in as many chances in 2011-12, having won the Jack In The Box Rainbow Wahine Classic in Honolulu, Hawaii, Nov. 18-20, with a 2-1 record.

SDSU IN REGULAR SEASON HOME TOURNEYS

■ This year marks the seventh straight season that SDSU has played host to a tournament. Prior to 2005, the last time the Aztecs had a home tournament was in November 2000, when SDSU went 1-1 at the Pacific Bell Classic.

■ SDSU did not play host to a regular-season event in Beth Burns' first stint as head coach from 1989-97.

■ SDSU women's hoops is playing host to its 22nd home tournament in its 36 years of existence. SDSU is 20-2 in the first game of a home tournament and has won the team title 11 times, including each of the first four.

■ SDSU has split games in seven of its previous nine home tournaments. The team won the first game and lost the second in 1998, 1999, 2000, 2006 and 2010, and did the opposite in 2005 and 2007.

FAST FACTS: SURF 'N SLAM TOURNAMENT

■ The previous six editions of the Surf 'N Slam have all featured a four-team field with two games each day separated by an off day.

■ Five different schools from five different conferences have won a tourney championship game in the Surf 'N Slam's six seasons. SDSU is the only repeat winner in 2008 and 2009.

■ UNCG and Penn are playing in their first Surf 'N Slams. The Quakers are the second Ivy League squad to play in the tourney, joining Brown (2006), while the Spartans are the first from the Southern Conference.

■ The Aztecs have an all-time Surf 'N Slam record of 9-4. The team has earned at least a split every season, is making its fifth championship game appearance (2-2 in previous four) and has won the title on two occasions.

■ Including Wednesday's outing, SDSU has won seven of its last eight Surf 'N Slam contests with the lone blemish coming last season to Texas A&M in the championship.

■ Four teams have been ranked in the AP top 25 when playing in the Surf 'N Slam, including No. 7 Texas A&M (2010), No. 4 Texas (2008), No. 11 Georgia (2006) and No. 17 George Washington (2006).

LAST TIME OUT

The San Diego State women's basketball team cruised to an easy 57-29 victory over visiting UNCG on Wednesday in the opening game of the San Diego Surf 'N Slam Classic at Viejas Arena. The win was Beth Burns' 250th in her 15 overall seasons as head coach at SDSU and improved the squad to 7-4 this year. The Spartans, meanwhile, dropped to 2-9 after failing to reach the 30-point barrier for the first time in 2011-12.

San Diego State had three starters tally double-figure points, including sophomore **Kiyana Stamps (Moreno Valley, Calif.)**, who made a career-high four 3-pointers and finished with 16 points to go with five offensive rebounds in only 25 minutes.

Aztec junior **Courtney Clements (Long Beach, Calif.)** recovered from a slow start shooting to register her 11th double-figure scoring outing of the year with 13 points, while classmate **Malia Nahinu (Hayward, Calif.)** was 5-for-8 from the field for 11 points to go with

career highs in rebounds (9), blocks (5) and steals (3). Junior point guard **Chelsea Hopkins (Las Vegas, Nev.)** also had a solid outing with a team season-high 10 rebounds as well as nine assists and three steals.

San Diego State never trailed in the game, jumping ahead 8-0 with points by four different players. UNCG finally got on the scoreboard at the 16:13 mark on a jumper from Janae Stevenson, but the Aztecs responded with a 7-1 run to increase the advantage out to 12. The host went up by as many as 18 points before heading into the break in front 26-11, as the Spartans finally crossed into double-figures with just under two minutes remaining.

Stamps, who notched only three first-half points, found her shooting rhythm coming out of the locker room with a pair of triples and two free throws in less than three minutes. Neither side had a field goal for the next four minutes until Nahinu broke through with a jumper at the 13:01 mark. After a brief 3-0 run by the Spartans, Stamps hit another triple to spark a 12-2 run to put the host squad in front by 20 at 49-20. The Aztecs led by as many as 30 points before coming out with the 57-59 victory.

30 AND BELOW

San Diego State held UNCG to just 29 points, including only 11 in the first half.

The 29 points are the fewest by an Aztec foe this season and the fewest overall since SDSU defeated Air Force 79-28 on Jan. 7, 2009.

In that outing, the Falcons had 10 points through the first 20 minutes and ended the game shooting an Aztec opponent record-low 19.0 percent from the field.

SDSU foes have failed to score at least 30 points six times in program history with the record low being a 17-point performance by USD in 1978.

ON THE BOARDS

For the 10th time this year, SDSU did not get outrebounded, posting a +11 margin against UNCG.

The Aztecs are first in the Mountain West in rebounding margin at +7.0 and continue to lead in both offensive rebounds (17.5/g) and offensive rebounding percentage (43.8).

San Diego State has eclipsed the 40-rebound mark eight times in the 11 games, a figure it reached on only eight occasions in 29 outings in 2010-11. The Aztecs have also outrebounded an opponent by double-figures four times, including in each of their last three outings.

Last season, the Aztecs held an advantage on the boards 16 times, accounting for eight of the 12 wins.

HAULING THEM IN

With her 10 boards against the Spartans, junior point guard Chelsea Hopkins became the first Aztec this season to reach double-figures in rebounds in a single outing. The 10 boards are three more than her previous

career game high and marks the first time an Aztec guard has reached double-figures since Quenese Davis had three such games in 2009-10.

A year ago, SDSU had 14 individual performances with 10 or more rebounds with center Paris Johnson (8) and Jessika Bradley (6) accounting for all of them.

BLOCK PARTY OF ONE

Since making the starting line-up for the first time in her career over the last three contests, junior Malia Nahinu continues to produce solid numbers in a variety of categories, including in the blocks column.

Nahinu had compiled 11 rejections over the last three games highlighted by a career best of five vs. both UC Irvine and UNCG. Nahinu now has 19 blocks on the year which is 11 more than any other Aztec and ranks her fourth in the Mountain West at 1.7 per game.

The 6-6 center entered the season with 12 career rejections, including 10 a year ago in limited action in 17 games.

THE DOUBLE-FIGURES KEEP COMING

Despite getting off to a slow start on offense, San Diego State junior Courtney Clements rallied by making three of her four shots in the second half to finish with 13 points in the victory against UNCG.

The 13-point effort kept Clements' streak of double-figure scoring outings at a perfect 11-for-11 thus far in 2011-12. She continues to lead the Mountain West Conference with 17.7 points per contest.

The 6-0 guard has four 20-point outbursts this year, including a high of 25 against then No. 18 DePaul.

NINE IS FINE

Over the last three contests, junior Chelsea Hopkins has compiled 30 assists, including nine vs. Cal Poly and UNCG and a career-high 12 at UC Irvine. The last three efforts came after the 5-8 point guard was shutout in that category in back-to-back contests against Washington State and USD.

Hopkins remains the Mountain West Conference leader in assists with 5.5 per outing. She has 15 helpers more than the second-place player in TCU's Whitney Williams, who has 46 assists despite playing

one more game.

An Aztec has led the league in assists or assists average each of the last three seasons and four of the last five years.

SWEET DECEMBER

With wins in its last three outings, SDSU improved its record during the month of December to 26-8 since 2006.

Four of those losses came to teams either ranked or receiving votes in the national poll in No. 2 UConn, No. 7 Texas A&M, No. 17 George Washington and USC (rv). The other three defeats were to Washington State and USD, vs. Pepperdine in overtime in 2009, and against Quinnipiac in the opening contest of the 2007 Surf 'N Slam.

Of course, it should be noted that SDSU has played 27 of those 34 December contests at home.

WE'RE NOT DONE

For the first time since 2004, the Aztecs' final outing of December will not mark their last regular-season non-conference game of a campaign. SDSU still has two more such matchups left to play next week when it plays host to Longwood on Jan. 4, and when it travels to Cal State Bakersfield on Jan. 7.

This season's 14 non-conference regular-season games are the program's most since the 1990-91 team participated in 15.

OF NOTE

SDSU is undefeated this season when it is:

- Has more as many or more steals (6-0)
- Owns an advantage with five minutes left (5-0)
- Has a better shooting percentage (5-0)
- Has more assists (5-0)
- Is leading at halftime (4-0)
- Has more free-throw attempts (3-0)
- Scores more than 80 points (2-0)

■ SDSU wins its second non-conference tournament title in as many chances this season.

■ SDSU has won eight of its last nine games at the Surf 'N Slam and is 10-4 overall. The Aztecs have won 12 team titles in 22 all-time home regular-season tournaments.

■ SDSU is 1-0 all-time against Penn and 3-1 vs. current members of the Ivy League.

■ SDSU improves to 7-1 against teams it did not face last season.

■ The four-game win streak is the Aztecs' longest this season and matches the squad's long streak of 2010-11.

■ SDSU improves to 5-1 at home this year, matching its win total at Viejas Arena from all of last season.

■ SDSU is now 27-8 during the month of December over the last six years.

PENN TIDBITS

After winning its Surf 'N Slam opener over UNCG, Penn brings a 7-2 record into Friday's championship game, having won each of its last three ... The Quakers have a pair of overtime victories over both St. Francis and Drexel and also have notched wins against Rider, Niagara, Lafayette and Army ... It's long losses are at La Salle and at current No. 3 Notre Dame ... Penn's seven non-conference wins are tie as its fourth-most in program history ... The Quakers, who are making their first trip to the West Coast since 2005, are led by sophomore guard Alyssa Baron, who averages a team-high 18.8 points an outing while also chipping in 21 assists, 19 steals, 15 3-pointers and 11 blocks ... Kara Bonenberger is the only other Penn player to average in double-figure scoring (10.8 ppg.), while Jess Knapp is her team's leading rebounder with a 6.9 per game mark ... The Quakers are under the direction of third-year head coach Mike McLaughlin, who boasted a record of 407-61 in 14 seasons at NCAA Division II Holy Family University prior to taking his current position.

RECEIVING VOTES

SDSU received votes in both national top-25 polls Nov. 21-22 after opening the season with a 3-1 mark, including an upset of then No. 18 DePaul. The Aztecs garnered 13 votes in the Associated Press top-25 poll, while they also received one vote in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll.

The last time San Diego State received votes in either poll was on Nov. 22, 2010, in the AP Top 25. The Aztecs were last listed in both polls in the same week during the 2010-11 preseason.

SDSU was last ranked in the top 25 in 2010, when it finished 20th in the final ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll. It marked the first time the Aztecs had been ranked in the final coaches poll in program history.

BEATING RANKED FOES

San Diego State's win over No. 18/18 DePaul on Nov. 18 is the program's first vs. a ranked foe since 2010, when it knocked off No. 10 West Virginia in the NCAA Second Round.

Overall, the victory against the Blue Demons is the Aztecs' sixth against a top-25 squad over the last four seasons. SDSU wins have come against Texas twice when the Longhorns were ranked No. 4 in 2008, and again when they were the No. 17 team on their home floor in 2010. League foes New Mexico (No. 23 - 2009) and TCU (No. 23 - 2010) have also been upset.

Prior to the win over Texas in December 2008, San Diego State had not beaten a ranked team since Dec. 28, 1994, when it handed No. 6 Alabama a 79-76 loss in a tournament held at St. John's in Jamaica, N.Y.

OTHER SEASON NOTES

■ With its wins over UAPB and No. 18 DePaul, SDSU scored over 80 points in back-to-back outings for the first time since scoring 85 in consecutive wins over Montana State and Loyola Marymont in Dec. 2008.

The team did not surpass the 80-point barrier all of last season and that streak dates back to a 87-52 win over Air Force on March 6, 2010.

■ The Aztecs' 43-point margin of victory over Arkansas-Pine Bluff is SDSU's largest margin of victory since defeating Air Force by 51 in 2009.

■ SDSU's 86 points vs. UAPB are the most in a season-opening game since scoring 101 against McNeese State on Nov. 23, 1990 (101-55 victory). The 86 points are the most in any game since it lit up Air Force for 87 in the 2010 regular-season finale.

■ The Aztecs claimed the tournament title at the Jack In the Box Rainbow Wahine Classic in Honolulu, Nov. 18-20. It is the first time SDSU has won a non-conference event since going 2-0 at its own San Diego Surf 'N Slam in 2009.

■ Courtney Clements and Kiyana Stamps, were named to the six-player all-tournament squad at the Rainbow Wahine Classic. Clements was tabbed the tournament MVP, becoming the first Aztec so honored since 2010.

This is the first time in both Clements and Stamps' Aztec careers that they have been named to an all-tournament team.

■ Clements was named the Mountain West Player of the Week for the first time in her career on Nov. 21, after averaging 21.3 points and shooting .536 (30-for-56) from the field, including a .522 (12-for-23) mark from 3-point range, and .813 (13-for-16) from the free-throw line in the team's opening four outings.

■ Malia Nahinu was named the Mountain West Women's Basketball Player of the Week on Dec. 19, for her performance in the team's victory over UC Irvine.

Nahinu had a career-high 16 points, seven rebounds, five blocked shots and two steals in her first ever start. The honor is the first of her collegiate career.

■ Through 11 games, 10 different Aztecs have scored at least 10 points at least once this season. That is especially notable considering there are 13 players on the active roster and only seven different student-athletes reached the 10-point barrier in 29 outings a year ago.

PRESEASON POINTS

For the fourth straight season, the San Diego State women's basketball team has been picked to finish in the top two in the Mountain West in 2012, earning its

second consecutive second-place selection and third in the last four years in a vote by the league's eight head coaches and select media members.

The preseason poll, which was released Oct. 11, at the conference's annual media day in Denver, Colo., had the Aztecs with 127 total points and seven of the 20 first-place votes.

TCU was tabbed as the preseason favorite with 136 points and 12 first-place votes. Colorado State was selected third behind the Aztecs, earning the final first place vote, and was followed by New Mexico, UNLV, Wyoming, Air Force and newcomer Boise State.

INDIVIDUAL ACCOLADES

For the second campaign in a row, San Diego State swept both the preseason newcomer and freshman of the year awards, which were released at the league's annual media day in October.

Junior guard Chelsea Hopkins was chosen as the Mountain West Newcomer of the Year, following in the footsteps of current teammate Courtney Clements and recent graduate Jessika Bradley, who earned the honor both in the preseason and at the end of the year in 2010 and 2011.

SDSU's Chairese Culberson was chosen as the conference's top freshman, after leading Berkeley High School to a runner-up performance at the California state Division I tournament this past March. The 6-0 forward was the top ranked recruit in the Mountain West by *Hoopgurlz*, receiving a rating of 46th overall and seventh at the wing position.

SCURRY TO REDSHIRT

Head coach Beth Burns announced last month that freshman forward **Deajanae Scurry (Los Angeles, Calif.)** will redshirt the upcoming 2011-12 season.

Scurry will continue to practice with the Aztecs, but will not compete in any games in her first year on campus.

NOTING THIS YEAR'S TEAM

- San Diego State returns two starters and six other letterwinners from last year's squad. Only three Aztecs had played more than one season in the Red & Black entering 2011-12.
- Of the 15 student-athletes on this year's roster, seven players did not compete for San Diego State a year ago. Two of the seven were on campus, but junior Chelsea Hopkins sat out after transferring from Duke and red-shirt sophomore Kiyana Stamps missed part of the campaign due to injury and the other half to concentrate on academics. Stamps competed in only two games in 2009-10 after tearing her ACL.
- The Aztecs' roster boasts five true freshmen, including four post players in forwards **Erimma Amarikwa (Vacaville, Calif.)**, **Chairese Culberson (Oakland, Calif.)**, **Khristina Hunter (Fairfield, Calif.)** and **Deajanae Scurry** to go with guard **Ahjalee Harvey (Mountain View, Calif.)**. The last time SDSU had five true freshman on its roster was 2008-09, when the squad also had five.
- Entering this season, five players accounted for 280

of the 338 total career games played (82.8 percent) in an Aztec uniform by the entire SDSU 2011-12 roster.

AZTECS SIGN PAIR TO NLI'S

San Diego State women's basketball head coach Beth Burns announced the signing Nov. 9, of forward **Aleiah Brandon (Corona, Calif.)** and point guard **Tia Levi-Dixon (San Diego, Calif.)** to National Letters of Intent.

The two high school seniors will join the Aztecs in 2012.

10-11 RECRUITING CLASS EARNS PRAISE

San Diego State's 2010-11 recruiting class was rated best in the Mountain West and 18th nationally according to *Espn.com's* *HoopGurlz* rankings, which are based solely on high school prospect signings. The Aztecs are also the only team in a "non-automatic BCS qualifying" conference rated in the top 30.

The 2010-11 recruiting class included three, four-star recruits according to *HoopGurlz*, including forward Chairese Culberson, who was the No. 7 rated wing and 46th overall, forward Deajanae Scurry (No. 31 forward) and point guard Ahjalee Harvey (No. 32 point guard).

Forwards Khristina Hunter and Erimma Amarikwa both received three stars and round out the class.

A year ago, San Diego State's 2010 recruiting class was ranked No. 1 in the Mountain West and 31st nationally, while the Aztecs did not appear in the websites rankings in either 2008 or 2009.

THE WELCOME MAT

Aztec head coach Beth Burns added one new member to her staff over the summer with the hiring of assistant coach Tammi Reiss (pronounced Reese).

Reiss, who works with the Aztec guards, was an assistant coach for the WNBA Utah Starzz from 2001-02, before joining the franchise in its move to San Antonio in 2003.

The Eldred, N.Y., native spent three seasons as an assistant coach at her alma mater, when Virginia advanced to the Elite Eight in 1995 and 1996, made it to the Sweet 16 in 1994 and claimed a pair of ACC regular-season titles in 1994 and 1995.

One of the all-time greats in Virginia basketball history, she played for the Cavaliers from 1988-92, when the team made three consecutive Final Four appearances and earned two ACC regular-season and tournament titles. Reiss garnered both Kodak and USBWA All-America honors as a senior in 1992.

Following her collegiate career, Reiss was chosen by the Utah Starzz in the first round (fifth pick overall) of the inaugural WNBA Draft in 1997.

WOODS PROMOTED

San Diego State head basketball coach Beth Burns announced this past April that Jualeah Woods has been promoted to the position of associate head coach.

Since Woods' arrival in May of 2005, the Aztecs have won a Mountain West Conference regular season and tournament title, and recorded back-to-back NCAA appearances, including a trip to the Sweet Sixteen in 2010. On the court, she helped tutor four-time all-con-

ference center Paris Johnson, who finished her career as the school's all-time leader in blocks and consecutive starts. Woods also mentored 2010 MWC Newcomer of the Year forward Jessika Bradley, who was tabbed a third-team all-league pick as a senior.

AZTECS OVERSEAS

San Diego State currently has five of its recent stand-outs playing professionally overseas. Guard Jené Morris (Girona) and forward Jessika Bradley (Arixil) both compete in Spain, while guard Quenese Davis (PAOK) plays in Greece and center Paris Johnson (Gorzow Wlkp.) is in Poland. Quenese's younger sister, Coco, also recently joined a team in Israel.

A year ago, Morris was in both Poland and Israel after playing for the Indiana Fever, who made her the first-ever Aztec to be selected in the WNBA Draft (first round/11th pick overall) in 2010. Davis, the Aztecs' all-time career assists leader, competed professionally in Austria and was named the *Eurobasket.com* All-Austrian AWBL Guard of the Year with the Flying Foxes.

THE NEW LEAGUE LOOK

For the first time since TCU joined the conference in 2005, the Mountain West will have a new look this season.

Gone are BYU and Utah, who claimed the league regular-season and tournament titles a year ago, while Boise State is the newcomer after participating in the Western Athletic Conference.

The Aztecs will now have just 14 league games instead of 16, meaning the MW regular-season slate will start a week later in January and finish up three days earlier in late February. San Diego State will have additional days to prepare for the Mountain West Championships, which will be one day shorter and feature four quarterfinal games on Wednesday, before the semifinals on Friday and the finale on Saturday.

AZTECS ON TV

The Aztecs will have at least 10 of its contests televised in 2011-12, with seven regular-season outings slated for The Mtn. and two contests scheduled to be shown on CBS College Sports Network. In addition, three of The Mtn. games will also be broadcast locally on Channel 4 San Diego and the opening contests of the 2012 Mountain West Conference Championships in Las Vegas next March will be carried on The Mtn.

LISTEN/WATCH LIVE

For the 11th straight year, Aztec women's basketball fans will have an opportunity to listen to live play-by-play of nearly every regular season game (home and away) over the internet at www.goaztecs.com.

SDSU alum Chris Ello will have the play-by-play duties both at home and on the road for the fifth straight season.

Again in 2011-12, all regular season Aztec home contests, with the exception of certain televised games, will also feature a live video feed to go along with the audio call from Viejas Arena on www.goaztecs.com.

BURNS TABBED WBCA SECRETARY

This past July, San Diego State head coach Beth Burns was appointed as the secretary of the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) Board of Directors' Executive Committee. Burns previously served as a Division I at-large representative on the organization's 23-member board the last two years.

SDSU HEAD COACH BETH BURNS

The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa in April 8, 2005, and enters the seventh season of her second stint with the Aztecs.

Most recently, Burns has taken the program to new heights, including a trip to the 2010 NCAA Sweet Sixteen, back-to-back NCAA tournament appearances (2009, 2010) and both a conference regular-season (2009) and tournament title (2010).

The Aztecs advanced to three straight Mountain West Conference championship games from 2008-10, after not winning one tournament game in the league's first eight years of existence. SDSU has scored five wins over top-25 foes, including two vs. teams in the top 10 in No. 4 Texas and No. 10 West Virginia.

Including 2010-11, SDSU has recorded at least 12 victories in five consecutive seasons with Burns at the helm, highlighted by back-to-back campaigns with at least 23 victories.

In her first stint as Aztec head coach from 1989-97, Burns took the SDSU women's basketball program full circle, going from 7-23 her first year to 23-7 in her final campaign. During her eight seasons, she compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular season titles.

A four-time conference coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02). She has a 20-year overall head coaching record of 331-241, while her school record stands at 250-176 over 14 seasons.

Last fall, Burns signed a five-year contract extension to stay as SDSU's head coach through the 2014-15 campaign.

SAN DIEGO - For the fourth time in the last five years, the San Diego State women's basketball team started the season off on the right foot, defeating visiting Arkansas-Pine Bluff 86-43 at Viejas Arena. With the victory, the Aztecs moved to 1-0 overall, while the Golden Lions dropped to 0-2, following the first-ever meeting between the two sides.

SDSU had three players finish with double-figure points, including leading scorer Courtney Clements, who notched 21 points on 7-for-13 shooting for her third career 20-point outing as an Aztec. Redshirt sophomore Kiyana Stamps added 17 points in her first contest since 2009, while junior co-captain Gabrielle Clark contributed a career-high 12 points by making four of her seven attempts.

Forward Chairese Culberson hauled in a team-high nine rebounds and point guard Ahjalee Harvey tallied seven assists in their collegiate debuts. Sophomore Melissa Sweat led the defensive effort with four of the Aztecs' 14 steals on the night.

San Diego State never trailed in the game, going up by 13 points at the 12:29 mark of the first half. The Lady Lions used a pair of triples from Markita Quarles and a jumper from Jenise Gentry to cut their deficit down to only seven at 18-11, but the Aztecs then went on a 14-1 run to build a 20-point advantage before settling for a 41-24 lead at the break.

Coming out of the locker room, the UAPB offense continued to struggle as it did not record a field goal until six and a half minutes into the second half on a 3-pointer by Lakendra Marsh at 52-28. The Aztecs would eventually lead by as many as 43 and outscored the visitors 45-19 in the final 20 minutes to secure the 86-43 season-opening win.

SDSU shot over 41 percent from the field, made nine 3-pointers and posted a phenomenal 91.3 free-throw percentage (21-for-23). On the flip side, UAPB shot just 22.2 percent for the game, converting only five second-half field goals.

HONOLULU - The San Diego State women's basketball team went on a 10-0 run with just over five minutes remaining in the game to turn a two-point contest into a 12-point advantage and went on to claim a 82-74 upset victory over 18th-ranked DePaul in the first game of the Jack In The Box Rainbow Wahine Classic. The win was the Aztecs' sixth over a top-25 team in the last four seasons and improved them to 2-0 overall in 2011-12, while the Blue Demons dropped to 2-1.

The Aztecs had four players score in double-figures, led by junior Courtney Clements, who eclipsed the 20-point mark for the second consecutive outing with 25, including 13 in the first half. Sophomore Kiyana Stamps continued to give the Aztecs an offensive punch off the bench with 17 points for the second game in a row. Sophomore Melissa Sweat and freshman Chairese Culberson both chipped in career highs with 14 and 10 points respectively.

Sweat was a perfect 3-for-3 from beyond the arc and Culberson hauled in nine boards to fall just one rebound short of a double-double. Clements tied a career high with eight rebounds, junior Chelsea Hopkins had seven assists and senior Kalena Tutt added three steals.

After the game was tied three times in the first four minutes, the Aztecs utilized a three-point play from Sweat to spark a 12-0 run at 18-6. DePaul eventually caught up with the help of three triples to knot the contest at 27 points apiece. The Blue Demons took the lead on the pair of free throws, but the Aztecs managed to even the score heading into the locker room at 33-33.

The two sides traded free throws coming out of the break, before SDSU's Culberson made a jumper and hit a pair at the line to give the team a lead they would never end up relinquishing. The Aztecs had two nine-point advantages, but saw that cut down to only a pair with 5:50 remaining in the game.

From there, San Diego State started a 10-0 run with baskets by four different players to go up by 12 and go on to secure an eight-point upset victory 82-74.

The Aztecs attempted just one free throw in the first half, but tried 29 in the second half to go 24-for-30 (80.0 percent) at the stripe. SDSU owned a 47-38 advantage on the boards and hit six 3-pointers, which was two more than a DePaul squad that had a combined 25 in its opening two contests this season.

HONOLULU - Portland's Natalie Day hit the game-winning free throws with just 2.4 seconds remaining as the San Diego State women's basketball team suffered its first loss of the season 59-58 in the final game of the Jack In The Box Rainbow Wahine Classic. SDSU dropped to 3-1 on the year, while the Pilots, improved to 3-2 in 2011-12.

Against Portland, the Aztecs trailed by as many as nine points with 12:27 remaining in the game and were down by seven with just 4:30 left. SDSU, however, got two free throws, a three-pointer and a three-point play by senior Kalena Tutt to tie the contest at 52 apiece with 3:30 remaining.

San Diego State was behind by three at the 1:43 mark, but took the lead on a lay-up from Kiyana Stamps and a leaning jumper from Chelsea Hopkins at 58-57 with only eight seconds remaining. Portland did not take a timeout and quickly got the ball up the court, missing on its first shot, but Day got the rebound and was fouled. Day then made both free throws to secure the 59-58 victory as the Aztecs' full-court baseball pass was intercepted to end the game.

Despite the loss, SDSU got another standout offensive performance from junior Courtney Clements, who surpassed the 20-point mark for the third time in four outings this season. Clements was 5-for-6 from beyond the arc and 8-for-13 from the field to end up with 21 of the team's 58 points. She was the only Aztec in double-figures as Stamps had eight points and Tutt contributed seven to go with her SDSU-best seven rebounds.

The match-up was tied twice within the first three minutes before Portland notched three consecutive lay-ups over a span of just over a minute to take a six-point lead at 10-4. San Diego State responded with three baskets by Clements, including a lay-up, a jumper and a 3-pointer out of the left corner to put the team up by one at 11-10.

After three lead changes and another tie, the Aztec offense went scoreless for nearly five and a half minutes as the Pilots built a 21-14 lead. A Hopkins basket ended the draught and SDSU ended up catching up by the break at 27-27.

Coming out of the locker room, San Diego State fell behind by three points on three occasions within the first four minutes and that deficit grew to nine at 45-36 on a 3-pointer and a last-second lay-up by Pilot Cassandra Brown. A basket by Sajoyia Griffin at the 11:35 mark started a brief 4-0 run as the Aztecs were within five points three times before being behind by eight heading into the final five minutes of the contest.

SDSU shot just 36.2 percent from the field, while committing 17 turnovers. Portland shot just slightly better and made 18-of-23 free throws, while owning just a slight plus-one advantage on the boards.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team had three players notch career highs in scoring to stay perfect at home with a 63-51 victory over visiting Washington at Viejas Arena. The Aztecs, who are receiving votes in both national top-25 polls, improved to 4-1 overall, while the Huskies dropped to 3-2 on the year following the first-ever meeting between the two sides.

Four of the five SDSU starters scored in double-figures including three with career-high point totals. Freshman Chairese Culberson notched a team-high 14 points, including her first career 3-pointer, to go with four of the team's 13 steals. Senior Kalena Tutt had a career-high 13 points and six rebounds, while junior Chelsea Hopkins posted career bests in both points (12) and rebounds (7) and also recorded five assists and three steals in 27 minutes of action. San Diego State trailed just twice, giving up the opening basket to UW's Regina Rogers and falling behind by one point on a lay-up at the 17:32 mark of the first half at 4-3. The Aztecs took the lead on a pair of Tutt free throws and had a two possession advantage until going on a 13-5 run to jump ahead by double figures for the first time at 26-16. Following a timeout, the Huskies trimmed their deficit to eight three times, including at the break with the score 32-24.

Coming out of the locker room, the two sides traded baskets before Tutt sparked a 6-0 Aztec run with a jumper and a basket following a UW turnover to give her team a 14-point advantage at 40-26. The San Diego State lead would grow out to as many as 16 points at the 8:17 mark until Washington made a final push in the final four minutes on four lay-ups in the paint from Rogers to close to within eight at 57-49.

Sophomore Kiyana Stamps restored the SDSU lead into double figures just 21 seconds later and both Clements and Hopkins hit a pair of free throws each to close out the 63-51 victory.

LOS ANGELES - The San Diego State women's basketball team rallied from a 16-point deficit to take a three-point second-half lead, but wasn't able to come out with a victory, as the Aztecs fell 78-71 to host UCLA at the John Wooden Center. With the loss, SDSU dropped to 4-2, while the Bruins improved to 4-2 after defeating the visitors for the second year in a row.

Aztec junior Courtney Clements led the team in scoring with 19 points, but made just seven of her 24 field-goal attempts. Sophomore Melissa Sweat matched her career high with 14 points, highlighted by 12 in the second half, while freshman Erimma Amarikwa and junior Chelsea Hopkins both finished with eight points apiece. Hopkins had six of the team's nine assists and she, along with Clements and senior Kalena Tutt all added six rebounds.

The Aztecs got off to a quick start with a 6-0 lead on baskets from three different players, but the Bruins finally got on the board at the 17:35 mark and took their first lead of the night at 9-8. UCLA then utilized some hot shooting and got a number of second-chance buckets, putting together what would later amount to be a 22-0 run to go up by 16 points with the score at 24-8.

San Diego State, however, would battle back, as a jumper from junior Malia Nahinu ended a near seven-minute. Clements then notched 10 of SDSU's next 12 points and received help from three of the squad's freshmen, who contributed a basket apiece to cut the deficit all the way to just four points at 35-31. The Bruins converted on a 3-point play in the final eight seconds by Rhema Gardner to extend the lead back out to 38-31 heading into the locker room.

Coming out of the break, the Aztecs quickly made a dent in their deficit, getting a bucket from Clements and two lay-ups from Hopkins in under a minute. SDSU successfully completed the come back on a 3-point play from Amarikwa to take its first lead since the first half at 40-39 with 17:48 remaining.

The two sides were tied twice and traded advantages three times before UCLA outscored the Aztecs 15-4 to push it once again to a double-figure Bruin lead at 59-49. The home squad reached the double bonus by the 9:45 mark and made good on four of six free throws while adding a wide-open triple from Thea Lemberger to open the gap to 14 points on two occasions.

The Aztecs cut that deficit in half with under 30 seconds remaining before ultimately falling by that same seven-point margin, 78-71.

PULLMAN, Wash. - The Aztec women's basketball team cut a 23-point deficit down to just 11 points, but was never able to overcome a poor shooting performance as the Aztecs dropped their third game of the season 65-50 to host Washington State at Beasley Coliseum. With the loss, SDSU fell to 4-3, while the Cougars avenged last year's Aztec victory to improve to 5-4 overall.

After trailing by 19 at the break, SDSU came out strong from the locker room, putting together a 9-2 run, including Clements' first five points of the game to trim the deficit to 12. SDSU also trailed by 12 with 13:05 remaining, but missed four shots on one possession alone and Washington State took advantage with an 11-0 run, including its first three triples of the night for its largest lead at 51-28.

A three-point play from Culberson sparked the Aztecs' final charge of the game as they shaved 12 points off that deficit to get to within only 11 with just under five minutes to play at 57-46. After each side hit a 3-pointer, San Diego State managed only one more point the rest of the way and ultimately ended up falling by 15 points, 65-50.

SAN DIEGO - The SDSU women's basketball team were limited to just 17 second-half points, including only two in the first 12 minutes after the break, as the Aztecs dropped a 56-45 decision to visiting San Diego at Viejas Arena. With the loss, SDSU saw their overall record move to 4-4 on the year, while the Toreros broke a two-game losing streak in the series to improve to 6-2 in 2011-12.

Two players accounted for 23 of San Diego State's season-low 45 points on the night. Junior Courtney Clements scored in double-figures for the eighth time in as many outings this year, notching 13, but was limited to only a pair after the break. Classmate Chelsea Hopkins played only 15 minutes due to foul trouble and still ended up with 10 points on 4-for-6 shooting. Freshman Chairese Culberson matched her season-best with nine boards to go with three blocks, while senior Kalena Tutt recorded seven rebounds and three blocks of her own.

Both sides notched scoring runs coming out of the gate, as the Toreros went up by five points at 7-2 only to have the Aztecs answer with a 15-2 swing to give the home team its largest lead of the night at 17-9 with 8:20 remaining in the first half. USD converted on a pair of free throws and then hit three buckets in a row to tie the game at 17 points apiece.

The score was tied at 19 and 21 and also at the break, as San Diego State erased a five-point deficit with under a minute and a half remaining to go into the locker room all square at 28 points apiece.

USD scored the first point of the second half on a free throw, but the Aztecs bounced back ahead on a jumper from Clements at the 17:52 mark at 30-29. SDSU then went scoreless over nearly a 10-minute span, missing its next 13 shots. Luckily for the home team, the Toreros also had their own streak of cold shooting, as San Diego State finally broke the drought on a triple from sophomore Melissa Sweat to put them down by only five with 8:02 left to play.

The Aztecs cut it to as little as a two-point margin at 39-37 and trailed by just three with 4:55 remaining, but never got any closer as San Diego went to the free-throw line 14 more times, hitting 10 of them to secure the 56-45 victory.

IRVINE, Calif. - San Diego State received a career game from junior center Malia Nahinu and three Aztecs scored in double figures to lead SDSU to a 76-57 victory over UC Irvine at Bren Events Center. The win lifts San Diego State's record to 5-4, while the Anteaters fall to 4-6.

Nahinu, who earned her first career start, finished with a career-high 16 points, a personal-record seven rebounds and a personal-best five blocked shots. The Aztecs found their rhythm offensively midway through the first half and opened up a 10-point lead as they went on an 8-2 run. The aforementioned run was a part of an overall 14-4 spurt, which gave San Diego State its largest lead of the game, 14 points, with 7:32 left in the half.

The Aztecs carried their double-figure lead deep into the first half until UC Irvine's Cheyenne Cathey knocked down a three to trim SDSU's lead to nine points. Cathey's bucket was the beginning of an 8-0 spurt to end the half as San Diego State went into the locker room with a 34-30 lead.

SDSU started the second half as hot as the Anteaters ended the first and used a 14-3 run along with a stifling defense to extend its lead to 48-33 before the first media timeout. During the run, the Aztecs received five points apiece from Stamps and Clements and four from Kalena Tutt.

The scoring spree from Stamps and Clements was just a glimpse of what was to come later in the half. Stamps went on to score all of her 15 points in the second half, including nine off three-pointers. Clements, meanwhile, scored 13 of her 17 points in the final 20 minutes. SAN DIEGO - San Diego State junior Chelsea Hopkins came up with a critical steal with just three seconds left in the game to preserve a 79-78 come-from-behind victory over visiting Cal Poly at Viejas Arena. The Aztecs rallied from an eight-point second-half deficit to improve to 6-4 on the season, while the Mustangs dropped their second consecutive one-point decision to fall to 3-9 on the year.

After trailing by eight with 11:05 remaining in the game, San Diego State got to within three on five occasions before reeling off eight-straight points to take the lead at 74-70 on two lay-ups apiece by Hopkins and freshman forward Kristina Hunter. The Aztecs had a six-point advantage with 2:05 left to play, however, the Mustangs cut it down to only one point at 79-78 on a jumper from Jonae Ervin. Hopkins missed a pair of lay-ups on the team's next possession, but got it back on the other end of the floor by stealing the ball away from Ervin to force a turnover and secure the loose ball before she was fouled.

The junior missed both of her free-throw opportunities which would have made it a three-point game, but Aztec Courtney Clements secured the rebound on the final shot and ran out the remaining two seconds to preserve the 79-78 victory.

San Diego State came out in the end despite a monster effort by Cal Poly red-shirt senior Kristina Santiago, who went 16-for-23 from the field and 11-for-14 from the line to score 44 points, while also adding eight boards and four steals before fouling out with 59 seconds left and her team trailing by only two.

Clements led the SDSU offensive effort with her fourth 20-point scoring outing of the year, hitting nine of her 15 shots, including three from beyond the arc, for 24 points to go with eight rebounds. Stamps matched her career high with 17 points, while Hunter posted her first contest in double-figures with 12 on 5-for-7 shooting. Stamps also had a four steals and Hopkins tallied nine assists.

The first half featured seven tie scores and eight lead changes with Cal Poly jumping out by as many as five points at 28-23 with 7:38 left until the break. San Diego State caught up before the end of the half, jumping ahead by as many as three points before heading into the locker room trailing by one at 41-40.

After the game was tied at 48 in the second half, the Mustangs scored seven in a row and ended up putting together an 12-4 run capped by a 3-pointer from Ariana Delgado at 60-52 for the largest lead by either team on the afternoon.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team cruised to an easy 57-29 victory over visiting UNCG in the opening game of the San Diego Surf 'N Slam Classic at Viejas Arena. The win was Beth Burns' 250th in her 15 overall seasons as head coach at SDSU and improved the squad to 7-4 this year. The Spartans, meanwhile, dropped to 2-9 after failing to reach the 30-point barrier for the first time in 2011-12.

San Diego State had three starters tally double-figure points, including sophomore Kiyana Stamps, who made a career-high four 3-pointers and finished with 16 points to go with five offensive rebounds in only 25 minutes.

Aztec junior Courtney Clements recovered from a slow start shooting to register her 11th double-figure scoring outing of the year with 13 points, while classmate Malia Nahinu was 5-for-8 from the field for 11 points to go with career highs in rebounds (9), blocks (5) and steals (3). Junior point guard Chelsea Hopkins also had a solid outing with a team season-high 10 rebounds as well as nine assists and three steals.

San Diego State never trailed in the game, jumping ahead 8-0 with points by four different players. UNCG finally got on the scoreboard at the 16:13 mark on a jumper from Janae Stevenson, but the Aztecs responded with a 7-1 run to increase the advantage out to 12. The host went up by as many as 18 points before heading into the break in front 26-11, as the Spartans finally crossed into double-figures with just under two minutes remaining.

Stamps, who notched only three first-half points, found her shooting rhythm coming out of the locker room with a pair of triples and two free throws in less than three minutes. Neither side had a field goal for the next four minutes until Nahinu broke through with a jumper at the 13:01 mark. After a brief 3-0 run by the Spartans, Stamps hit another triple to spark a 12-2 run to put the host squad in front by 20 at 49-20. The Aztecs led by as many as 30 points before coming out with the 57-59 victory.
