Having Matched Best Start in 23 Seasons, Aztecs Travel to Albuquerque For Showdown Between Conference Unbeatens

Having matched its best 15-game record in 23 seasons, San Diego State (11-4 overall; 1-0 MWC) travels to Albuquerque, N.M., to face New Mexico (14-2; 1-0 MWC) on Saturday in the only Mountain West Conference matchup between league unbeatens this weekend.

The game is scheduled for a 7 p.m. MT start (6 p.m. PT) and the contest will be televised by The Mtn. (San Diego Cox cable channel 320). The contest can be heard on the Aztec radio flagship station AM 600 KOGO.

Despite a roster that features just one senior, the graduation of the MWC's all-time leading scorer Brandon Heath and all-league performer Mohamed Abukar, the Aztecs have matched their best 15-game record since the 1984-85 NCAA team opened the season 12-3. San Diego State has done so with a roster featuring 10 players averaging 12 or more minutes per game (although two starters, freshman Tim Shelton and three-year starter Richie Williams are currently injured).

The Aztecs are coming off a disappointing 62-56 home loss to Northern Colorado. The loss snapped San Diego State's Cox Arena-record winning streak of 13 games and marked the first home defeat for SDSU in 371 days.

San Diego State suffered from frigid shooting, connecting on just 38.3 percent from the field and was outrebounded 36-20 by the Bears. The Aztecs entered the game having outrebounded eight consecutive opponents, the longest streak of the Steve Fisher era.

The Aztecs were led by junior guard Kelvin Davis with 18 points. He came off the bench to connect on 4-of-6 three-point field goals and added three steals. Junior forward Kyle Spain posted his 28th double-figure scoring game with 16 points, while junior forward Lorenzo Wade added 11 points and four assists.

The Aztecs rallied from a nine-point second-half deficit to claim the lead, but the Bears used a 10-0 run over a three-minute stretch beginning with 3:32 to play to take control of the game.

New Mexico is off to an impressive 14-2 start under first-year coach Steve Alford. The Lobos have won 10 straight games at home and seven in a row overall and are currently receiving votes in the top-25 polls. New Mexico is led by senior forward J.R. Giddens, who is averaging 12.9 points and 8.5 rebounds.

New Mexico has not played since last Saturday, when the Lobos posted a 99-92 double-overtime victory at Wyoming.

San Diego State and New Mexico are meeting for the 61st time, with the Lobos owning a 35-25 series advantage. The Aztecs have won the last four meetings, their longest series winning streak since claiming seven straight from 1981 through 1984. After posting a 3-20 record in its first 23 visits to Albuquerque, San Diego State has won on three of its last six visits to The Pit and has come away victorious the last two times (73-66 on Feb. 25, 2006 and 81-74 in overtime on Feb. 20, 2007).

New Mexico is 23-5 in their last 28 home games, with two of the losses during that stretch coming to the Aztecs. The Lobos are also an eye-popping 47-7 at The Pit in their last 54 home contests.

Following the game, San Diego State returns home to Cox Arena for a pair of games next week. On Wednesday, the Aztecs face one of the preseason MWC favorites Utah (10-4; 1-0 MWC) before playing host to Wyoming (6-7; 0-1 MWC) on Saturday.

Storylines and Tidbits

► At 11-4, San Diego State has matched its second-best start in its 38-season Division I history. The last time an Aztec squad opened a season with a better record, was in 1984-85 when SDSU owned an 12-3 record after 15 games. This marks the second consecutive season SDSU has been 11-4 after 15 games, but just the sixth time in the Division I era that an Aztec squad has won at least 11 of its first 15 games.

► As noted on the front page of the release, San Diego State owns the best Mountain West Conference road record in league games since the beginning of the 2005-06 season. In the last two seasons, SDSU is 9-7 in league road games, including consecutive victories at The Pit.

► Early indications are that San Diego State will once again be a solid road team. To date, the Aztecs have already own a 5-3 record in road/neutral games. In addition, SDSU has been very close in two of the three losses, leading California by 14 points (nine in the second half) before falling and battling Saint Mary's closely (game featured 16 lead changes and eight ties) before losing by five points.

► San Diego State ranks 18th in the nation this season in road/neutral wins with five. That is the highest total in the Mountain West Conference.

► Steve Fisher has turned San Diego State not only to a Mountain West Conference contender, but into one of the top program's in the country. Since Dec. 31, 2005, San Diego State has posted a 51-19 record. As of Jan. 8, the Aztecs ranked 20th nationally in victories since Dec. 31, 2005. San Diego State is coming off consecutive seasons with 22 or more wins and advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 2006 and the second round of the NIT in 2007.

► One streak that is sure to get a tough test on Saturday is SDSU's ability to avoid consecutive losses. San Diego State has done an excellent job of avoiding losing streaks, going 29 consecutive games without a two-game losing streak and 82 games without dropping three in a row. The Aztecs have followed their last eight defeats with a victory in the next game and are 21-4 in the contest following their most recent 25 defeats. San Diego State has been victorious in its first home game following its last 13 losses.

► Through Thursday's games, San Diego State ranks 21st nationally in steals per game at 9.73. The Aztecs have 10 or more thefts in six of the last 11 games, including a season-high 19 against Loyola Marymount (Nov. 28). Six players average more than one steal a game for SDSU, led by junior guard Richie Williams at 2.30 spg.

► The Aztecs have posted an impressive 11-4 start and opened league play with a victory last Saturday over TCU despite missing two starters from the lineup. Freshman forward Tim Shelton started the first three games of the season but had season-ending knee surgery on Nov. 20. The latest victim of the injury bug is junior point guard Richie Williams, who suffered a broken left wrist in the victory over Sam Houston State on Dec. 28. He is expected to miss a total of four weeks from the date of the injury. Last season, Aztec players missed a total of 40 games due to injury, illness or suspension. This season, to date, San Diego State players have missed a total of 18 games.

► At 11-4, San Diego State has clinched its eighth consecutive season with at least 10 victories. Now that doesn't sound like a major accomplishment, but it serves as a great reminder of where the program was prior to Fisher's arrival. In the 15 seasons between 1985-86 and 1999-2000, the Aztecs failed to win more than 10 games in a season six times. By comparison, SDSU is more than halfway toward reaching the 20-win plateau for the third consecutive season, which equals the number of 20-win campaigns in the 37 seasons prior to the 2005-06 campaign.

Player Tidbits

► Junior forward **Lorenzo Wade** has averaged 17.3 points over his last three games, including a career high 23 against Sam Houston State (12-28-07)... He has scored in double figures in nine of his last 10 games and led the Aztecs in scoring in four of the last seven games... He is shooting 50.7 percent (66-of-130) from inside the arc and has converted 28 of his last 40 free throw attempts (70.0 percent)... He has four games with three or more steals... Wade has 563 career points as an Aztec and 701 in his college career.

► Junior forward **Kyle Spain** has three career 20-point scoring games, including two this season... Posted a team-high 20 points (two short of his career high) at 19th-ranked Arizona (12-22-07)... Has 34 rebounds in his last five games (6.8 rpg)... Made a three-point field goal in a career-best seven consecutive games... In his last five games, he is 19-of-24 (79.2 percent) from the free throw line... "Only" had nine points and nine rebounds in the win over Sam Houston State (12-28-07), although he did have a three-point play late in regulation and connected on a trey with 46 seconds left in overtime to give SDSU the lead... Earned MWC Player of the Week honors earlier this year and has won the award twice in his career.

▶ Freshman forward **Billy White** earned MWC Player of the Week honors a week ago after providing SDSU with the shot that forced overtime (:00.2) and game-winning shot (0:11 in OT) against Sam Houston State... He is just the sixth player in league history to earn the honor as a freshman, joining Evan Burns (SDSU), Andrew Bogut (Utah), Kyle Spain (SDSU), Brandon Ewing (Wyo.) and Trent Plaisted (BYU)... He has shot 60 percent or better from the field in four of his last five games... Pulled down six or more rebounds in four of his last five games... Reached double figures in three of his last six games... Went 60 consecutive minutes without a turnover prior to the TCU game.

▶ Freshman guard **D.J. Gay** is expected to make his 12th career start Saturday and his third in a row... One of five players to see action in all 15 games this season... Broke out of an 0-for-12 slump from three-point range by making 4-of-7 attempts against Sam Houston State (12-28-07)... The four treys are a career high as is his 12 points against the Bearkats... Had a career-high five assists against Northern Colorado (1-9-08)... Five games with four or more assists... 13 assists and four turnovers in his last 87 minutes... One turnover or less in 11 of his 15 games this season.

▶ Junior center **Ryan Amoroso** has eight or more rebounds in three of his last six games... He has yet to foul out of a game this season and has collected four fouls in a game just once this season... Has 37 points in his last four games, 17 more than the total of the four previous games combined (20).

▶ Junior guard **Kelvin Davis** is shooting an impressive 60.7 percent from inside the arc (34-of-56)... He is making threes at a 45.9 percent clip (28-of-61)... Made a trey in three straight games and has connected on five of his last eight attempts from three-point range... Has a steal in 11 of his last 12 games (22 total)... 10 double-figure scoring games this season... Has nine steals in the last three games.

▶ Junior forward **Jon Pastorek** has made nine of his last 15 field goal attempts (60.0 percent)... Made seven consecutive free throws... Has seven assists and three turnovers in his last five games (76 minutes)... Has five offensive rebounds in the last five games and has 14 offensive rebounds (fourth most)... Played in 11 straight games (10 or more minutes in 10 of those games)... Three turnovers in the last 76 minutes on the court.

▶ Junior guard **Richie Williams** is expected to be out until at least Feb. 1 with a broken left wrist... Suffered the injury in the final moments of regulation against Sam Houston State... Played in 76 career games and made 68 starts... Has a steal in seven consecutive games (17)... Recorded three or more steals in five games... Attempted 34 free throws on the season (second most on the team).

SDSU, which owned the 11th-longest homecourt winning streak in the nation, was outrebounded for the first time in eight games by a 16-board margin, but was still in position to win the game with under two minutes to play.

Twice, early in the second half, the Bears held a nine-point advantage, but the Aztecs rallied to take a 50-48 lead on a layup by Lorenzo Wade with 3:32 remaining.

Northern Colorado, however, responded with a 10-0 run capped by a Jefferson Mason three-point play and two free throws by Jabril Banks, which gave the Bears an eight-point cushion with 26 seconds left in regulation.

The Northern Colorado run was put to a halt after a three-point field goal by Kyle Spain cut the lead to five with 18 seconds remaining, but the Aztecs would come up short despite a free throw by Spain and a tip-in by D.J. Gay in the final seven seconds.

Kelvin Davis scored a game-high 18 points for SDSU with Spain adding 16, including 10 in the first half. Wade ended the game with 11 points and Gay posted a career-high five assists in his second-straight starting assignment.

Devon Beitzel led the Bears with 15 points to help lead Northern Colorado to their first road victory of the season.

Noting the Northern Colorado Game

► The loss snapped SDSU's 13-game home winning streak, the 11th-longest nationally. It was the Aztecs' first loss at Cox Arena in 371 days.

► **Kyle Spain** (16 points) recorded his second-straight double-figure scoring effort and his 11th of the season... It was his sixth game of the season in which he made multiple three-point baskets.

► **Kelvin Davis** (18 points) reached double digits in scoring for the second game in a row and for the 10th time of 2007-08... Davis led the team in scoring for the third time this year... He connected on multiple three-point field goals for the first time since hitting three vs. Navy on Dec. 17.

► **Lorenzo Wade** (11 points) posted his third-straight game with 10 or more points... He has reached double figures 13 times this season.

► **D.J. Gay** set a new career high with five assists. The five assists were also a game-high.

San Diego State vs. New Mexico: The Series

► San Diego State and New Mexico are meeting for the 61st time, with the Lobos holding a 35-25 series lead.

► San Diego State has won four straight in the series and eight of the last 13 meetings. Prior to that, New Mexico had claimed the previous 10 games in the series.

► San Diego State is 6-23 lifetime against New Mexico in Albuquerque. The Aztecs have posted victories in 1982, 1983, 1984, 2002, 2006 and 2007. San Diego State is 3-3 in its last six visits to The Pit after losing the previous 19 encounters in Albuquerque. SDSU has won in consecutive visits to The Pit for the first time since claiming three straight victories in 1982, 1983 and 1984.

► San Diego State owns a 18-10 advantage in games played in "America's Finest City" and have won five of the last six home meetings with the Lobos.

► The average margin of victory between the Aztecs and Lobos has rarely been close in recent years. The average margin of victory in the last 13 games between the teams is 10.0 points. The Aztecs are 8-5 during that stretch which featured seven games decided by 10 points or fewer.

► SDSU owned the series in the early years, building a 13-5 advantage from 1976 to the first meeting of the 1986 season. Before the Aztec series sweep in 2001-02, the Lobos had won 25-of-29 meetings, including 18-of-19 prior to 2002. Recently, San Diego State has won eight of the last 13 games.

► Series Trends: The team with a higher field goal percentage has won 15 of the last 17 games in the series... The team with fewer turnovers is 9-6-2 in the last 17 games... The Aztecs have outrebounded New Mexico in six of the last 10 meetings.

points to open the game. The Aztecs, however, rallied with a 17-5 run to take its first lead of the contest at the 11:35 mark.

As the half came to a close, New Mexico went on a 7-0 scoring spurt to enjoy its largest lead of nine points only to have the Aztecs score nine unanswered points in the final two minutes to go into halftime even at 33.

In the second session, SDSU was not able to pull away from the Lobos as its largest lead was six points four minutes into the half. New Mexico stayed within striking distance and took a one-point lead with 37 seconds left. On the ensuing possession, Kyle Spain was fouled and made one-of-two free throws to tie the game. After a timeout and 0.2 seconds remaining, Aaron Johnson missed a game-winning, uncontested layup to force overtime.

In OT, the Lobos took a 74-72 lead, but the Aztecs responded by scoring nine unanswered points to escape with the victory.

Joining Heath in double figures was Jerome Habel, who posted his first double-double with 18 points and 12 boards and Lorenzo Wade with 16.

LAST MEETING IN SAN DIEGO

San Diego State 73, New Mexico 68 | Jan. 17, 2007 | Cox Arena at Aztec Bowl

SAN DIEGO - Lorenzo Wade recorded his first career double-double and was one of five Aztecs to score in double figures as San Diego State defeated New Mexico, 73-68, in a Mountain West Conference game at Cox Arena.

Wade, a sophomore forward out of Las Vegas, scored all of his 13 points in the second half and filled up the stat sheet with 12 rebounds, four assists, three steals and two blocks in helping SDSU even its league record at 2-2.

The first half was an offensive struggle for the Aztecs as they shot only 35.3 percent from the field and their leading scorer, Brandon Heath, was held to only four points. But with Wade's eight first-half rebounds, Mohamed Abukar's eight points off the bench and great defensive pressure on the Lobos' top scorer in J.R. Giddens, San Diego State went into the locker room up 28-24.

Coming out of the break, SDSU had a difficult time shaking New Mexico. On multiple occasions the Aztecs enjoyed five-point leads only to have the Lobos cut into the advantage every time. It was not until the 7:50 mark that UNM broke through and took a 53-52 lead.

SDSU, however, regained the lead on a Wade three-pointer, but was taken back by the Lobos on a Giddens shot from beyond arc.

Trailing by one with 6:06 remaining, the Aztecs went on a 14-4 run to go ahead by nine and would never allow New Mexico to get within four points the rest of the way.

Heath finished the game with a team-high 16 points with Abukar chipping in 14. Meanwhile, Jerome Habel added 11 points and Richie Williams had 12 points and a game-high seven assists.

San Diego State Cliff Notes

Having lost the all-time leading scorer in school history (Brandon Heath - 2,189 points) and possibly the single-most successful player in school history (Mohamed Abukar (compiled a 39-15 record, 72.2 percent)), not many people expected much from San Diego State in 2007-08.

Yet the Aztecs have used a deep bench and used full-court defensive pressure to jump out to an 11-4 record. The Aztecs have four players averaging in double figures (one injured) and seven players averaging 7.5 points or more (two injured). Eight Aztec players are currently averaging 23.2 minutes or more per contest (two injured).

This edition of the SDSU squad has had more success than what most people would have expected. With a roster made up of one senior, six juniors, two sophomores and four freshmen, the Aztecs have posted five road/neutral victories to date.

The Aztecs are led by junior forwards Lorenzo Wade and Kyle Spain.

Wade, 6-6, who played on Louisville's 2005 NCAA Final Four team, is averaging 14.5 points, 3.3 rebounds and 2.7 assists per game. He is shooting 47.4 percent from the field and an impressive 36.6 percent from three-point range. An athletic left-handed player who is one of the top defensive players on the West Coast, he is averaging a team-high 30.1 minutes per game.

Spain, 6-5, is in his third season with the Aztecs, averaging 13.5 points and 5.8 rebounds. The junior has played the last six games after missing two of the previous three due to an ankle injury. Spain looked like himself vs. Navy as he recorded 14 points, nine rebounds and three steals and then followed it with 20 points and eight rebounds at Arizona. The Newark, Calif., native had a phenomenal freshman season when SDSU won the MWC regular season and postseason championships en route to the NCAA Tournament. Spain connected on 51.7 percent from three-point range in 2005-06 and made 25 starts before struggling through an injury-plagued sophomore campaign. This season, Spain has returned to the phenom freshman form. He has attempted a team-high 67 free throws this season, and is shooting 77.6 percent from the charity stripe.

Junior point guard Richie Williams, who had played himself back into the starting lineup after missing the first three games of the season serving a team suspension, will be out until at least Feb. 1 with a broken left wrist. Williams had started four of the last five games before suffering the injury vs. Sam Houston State and reached double figures in three straight games for the first time in his career before being held to seven vs. Navy. The 5-10 guard had 16 points against Western Michigan, 13 vs. UC Riverside and 11 against Saint Mary's. He currently leads the team in assists with 37 in 10 games (3.7 apg).

In a year of big impact newcomers, no player has had a bigger impact than 6-8 center Ryan Amoroso. Amoroso, who played for two seasons at Marquette, is averaging 9.0 points, 5.7 rebounds, but his real impact is on the defensive end where his 257-pound frame has given SDSU a wide body in the paint.

Another newcomer who has found his way into the starting lineup is freshman Billy White. White, who may rival Wade for athleticism, is averaging 8.5 points and 5.7 rebounds having played in every game and making 12 starts. The freshman is 53-of-89 from the field for an amazing 59.6 field goal percentage. He also has a team-high 26 steals and 10 dunks this season.

Junior forward Kelvin Davis, who played in the 2005 NCAA Tournament while at UTEP, has needed little time to adjust after sitting out a year. Davis is averaging 11.5 points (third on the team) and 3.2 rebounds, while shooting 53.0 percent from the field and 45.9 percent from three-point range.

Freshman point guard D.J. Gay started the first eight games of the season (11 total) and will start at point guard with Williams nursing a wrist injury. Through 15 games, he has 35 assists and just 18 turnovers to go along with a 4.4 scoring average. Known as a great shooter, Gay has connected on 15 treys to date.

With the season-ending knee injury to Tim Shelton, Jon Pastorek and Jer'Vaughn Johnson have both seen increased playing time. Pastorek has played in 12 games, making his first career start vs. Navy, and is averaging 2.4 points and 2.1 rebounds. He had a career-best four assists against Saint Mary's and followed it with 10 points (3-3 FG, 4-4 FT) and two rebounds against the Midshipmen. Johnson, meanwhile, has played in 11 games, averaging 1.2 points and 1.2 rebounds.

San Diego State has been a handful for opponents this season. Aztec opponents are shooting 44.2 percent from the field, 34.6 percent from three-point range and are averaging 18.0 turnovers to date.

White Named MWC Player of the Week

San Diego State freshman forward Billy White has been named Mountain West Conference men's basketball co-player of the week, the league announced Monday, Dec. 31. The award is White's first of his career and shares the honor with UNLV's Wink Adams.

In SDSU's only game of the week, White helped the Aztecs beat Sam Houston State, 79-78, in overtime at Cox Arena. The Bearcats visited Montezuma Mesa as the No. 28-ranked RPI team, one of nine unbeaten teams in the country at 10-0 and had the eighth-longest active win streak in the country.

In what was a close game throughout with no team enjoying a lead larger than six points, White had 12 points on 6-of-10 shooting and six rebounds, including four on the offensive end. The freshman came up big in the clutch as he scored 10 of his 12 points and grabbed all six of his rebounds after halftime.

With the Aztecs down by two, the Las Vegas, Nev., native forced overtime when he followed Richie Williams' miss with an offensive put-back with 0:00.2 remaining in regulation. Later in the extra session, White provided the game-winning bucket when he rebounded a D.J. Gay miss and followed it with a basket with 11 seconds remaining in overtime.

With his two huge field goals, White became the first SDSU freshman since the beginning of the 1996-97 season to hit a game-winning shot and the first Aztec to make a shot to force overtime and make a game-winner in the same game.

White joins Kyle Spain as the only two Aztecs to win conference player of the week honors this season. White is also the first Aztec freshman since Spain to earn weekly league and is the first freshman this season to win the award in the MWC.

Fast Starts on The Mesa

At 11-4, San Diego State is off to its second-best start to a Division I season. The 1984-85 team opened 12-3 en route to a 23-8 record and a trip to the NCAA Tournament. This year's squad matches the 2006-07, 2002-03, 1996-97 and 1971-72 teams to start a season at 11-4.

A victory on Saturday would:

► Mark just the third time in the Division I era that San Diego State has won at least 12 of its first 16 games and would match the best start to a Division I season (the 1984-85 and 1971-72 teams won 12 of their first 15 contests).

Owning the Boards

In their game vs. Navy, the Aztecs were monsters on the boards as they collected 39 while limiting the Mids to just 21 total rebounds. SDSU's plus-18 margin was a season-best and was the fifth-best in Cox Arena history. Navy's five offensive rebounds also tied Fresno State for the lowest by an opponent this season.

At Arizona, SDSU outrebounded the Wildcats as it won the rebounding battle, 36-35, and had 18 offensive boards.

The Aztecs have outrebounded their opponent 11 times this season, including eight of the last nine games.

Robbery Suspects

The Aztecs have been making the art of stealing a regular thing this season. In 14 of 15 games this year, SDSU has

recorded at least seven steals, including 15 at San Diego and a season-high 19 at Loyola Marymount. Of the 270 turnovers San Diego State has forced, 54.1 percent or 146 total thefts have come via the steal. As of Thursday, the Aztecs 17th in total steals and 21st nationally in steals per game (9.7).

Steady Force

Prior to making his first start at LMU as an Aztec, Kelvin Davis had been a steady force off the bench for the Aztecs this season. The transfer from the College of Southern Idaho had scored in double figures in each of the previous five games, including a career-high 17 points at California. In those five games, Davis posted a field goal and three-point field goal percentage of at least 50 percent and connected on at least two three-pointers in each of those contests.

As a starter, Davis struggled with his shot in his first two starting assignments, but contributed with his rebounding as he averaged 4.5 boards a game, including a career-best six at LMU. Against UC Riverside, Davis regained his shooting stroke and led the team with 16 points on a then career-high six field goals.

Versus Saint Mary's, Davis returned to his familiar role coming off the bench and exploded for a team-high 19 points on a personal-best eight field goals. He also added five rebounds, two steals and one assist in 25 minutes. In the game against Northern Colorado, Davis was a spark off the bench again as he finished with a game-high 18 points. For the season, he ranks third on the team in scoring and seventh in minutes played.

Obviously Davis' offensive numbers are better when he comes off the bench, but his averages as a starter is nothing to look down upon especially since his rebounding improves when earning the starting nod.

Triple Threat

San Diego State has four players averaging double figures and three more boasting an average of at least 7.5 points per game so it comes as no surprise that the Aztecs have had at least three players score in double figures in 14 of 15 games this year. Against Navy, SDSU had five players in double figures for the second time this year and for the third time in which at least six scored 10 points or more.

A Victory Almost Guaranteed

Kyle Spain has scored in double figures in 11 of the 13 games he has played this season and the Aztecs have won eight of them. History says that when Spain scores at least 10 points, the Aztecs are almost guaranteed a win. As a freshman, San Diego State was 11-2 when the junior scored in double figures and 5-0 last season. For his career, Spain and the Aztecs boast a outstanding record of 24-5 when he reaches double digits in the scoring column.

Shutting Down the Bigs

San Diego State has faced three big men this season that have received national attention in Cal's DeVon Hardin, Western Michigan's Joe Reitz and Saint Mary's Omar Samhan and have had decent success against both. In the game against the Golden Bears, the Aztecs used a fierce double team to limit Hardin, an NBA prospect, to five points on 1-of-5 shooting. Against WMU, San Diego State held the two-time all-MAC selection to two points on 0-of-8 from the field. Lastly, the Aztecs limited Samhan to just 10 points and three rebounds. Going into the contest, Hardin was averaging 10.5 points, while Reitz was averaging a team-best 14.4 points. Samhan had numbers of 14.5 points and 8.5 rebounds going into the game vs. SDSU.

Winning By Double Digits

The Aztecs' season-opening four wins, before its five-point win at USD, were all by double-digit margins. It was the first time since the 2002-03 season SDSU had accomplished such a feat. During their NIT season in 2002-03, the Aztecs won at Houston (71-61) and defeated Florida Atlantic (91-75), IPFW (74-58) and Loyola Marymount (79-69) at home. In fact, prior to its game at Houston, SDSU beat Hawai'i at home by 11 (60-49) making the win over the Lions its fifth in a row by at least 10 points. Before losing to Saint Mary's, the Aztecs had another run of their own as they had won three in a row by double figures.

Contributions from the New Guys

Five of the top eight players when looking at minutes played and points scored are newcomers. Those five include Ryan Amoroso, Kelvin Davis, D.J. Gay, Tim Shelton and Billy White. Their contributions have certainly been felt early on. Between the five of them, they put up a triple double vs. Portland and at Fresno State. The quintet is responsible for 51.1 percent of the team's points, 50.6 percent of rebounds and 42.2 percent of assists.

74 is the Magic Number

Reaching the 74-point plateau seems to bring good fortune for the Aztecs as they have done so 41 times since the beginning of 2005-06, including six times this year. In those 41 games, San Diego State has a record of 38-3. The 24 times SDSU didn't hit the 74-point mark the past two seasons, it wound up losing 14 of them. Coincidentally, 12 of the 24 occurrences have happened away from Cox Arena. Of the nine times San Diego State didn't reach the magic number this year and won, three were at home. The only time it happened away from Cox Arena and won was this year's opener vs. Liberty and at San Diego.

Freshmen in Starting Lineup

With junior point guard Richie Williams serving a team suspension earlier this year, true freshman D.J. Gay earned the starting nod in the season-opening game against Liberty. Tim Shelton, another true freshman, also found himself in the starting five as well vs. the Flames. Gay and Shelton became just the 10th and 11th freshmen to start a season opener under Steve Fisher. Only four times before had a freshman started a season opener under Fisher at SDSU and that oddly was Williams in 2005 at Alaska Fairbanks. Gay and Shelton joined elite company as only Juwan Howard, Jalen Rose, Chris Webber, Jerod Ward, Albert White, Bradley Jackson, Steve Sir, Brandon Heath and Williams have received the starting nod from Fisher as freshman to open a sea-

son.

Locking Down

San Diego State has used a stifling defense for the better part of 40 minutes in each game this year. Dating back to last season, the Aztecs have held 27 of their last 31 opponents to 74 points or less and have held 19 of their last 30 opponents to less than 45 percent from the field.

Just this year alone, the Aztecs have held 12 of 15 opponents to 74 points or fewer and seven to under 42.2 percent shooting. SDSU opponents are also averaging 18.0 turnovers a game.

As you might imagine, holding opponents to less than 40 percent from the floor has been a good sign for the Aztecs. San Diego State is 57-9 in the Steve Fisher era when the opponent is held below that field goal percentage.

Making it Rain

The Aztecs have made at least six three-pointers in nine of 15 games this year. This season's squad became the first team in Steve Fisher's tenure to knock down at least six three-pointers in the first six games of a season after it made a season-best 11 at California. SDSU made it seven straight games until it only connected on four vs. Western Michigan.

White's House Party

Billy White, making his first appearance at Cox Arena on Nov. 17 vs. UCSD, found himself in the starting lineup and did not disappoint. The Las Vegas native connected on his first nine shots before missing with under six minutes left in the game and went on to put back his missed attempt. For the game, White was a 10 of 11 from the field for a game- and career-high 20 points, had a game-high tying nine rebounds, a game- and career-best three blocked shots and one steal in a team-best 29 minutes.

White became the first Aztec to make at least 10 field goals in a game this season. His three blocks are also a 2007 team best. The freshman's 20-point performance was the first by an Aztec freshman since the 2004-05 season when Matt Thomas scored 20 vs. Air Force on Feb. 28, 2005. White's nine rebounds were also the most by an SDSU freshman since Kyle Spain grabbed 12 in the championship game of the MWC tournament vs. Wyoming on March 11, 2006.

White's 10-11 shooting exhibition ranks in a tie for fifth place on San Diego State's individual game records list for best field-goal percentage in a game (min. 6 FGM) during Steve Fisher's tenure.

Shelton Out

Freshman forward Tim Shelton will miss the rest of the 2007-08 season after undergoing surgery to his left knee on Tuesday, Nov. 20. The Fresno, Calif., native started the first three games of the season, missed the UCSD game due to swelling in his knee, but returned for the game at San Diego in a reserve role. In four games, Shelton was averaging 10.0 points on 55.2 percent shooting and 4.8 rebounds.

Ziegenfuss Passes

On Saturday, Dec. 1, longtime Aztec basketball coach George Ziegenfuss passed away in San Diego. He was 90 years old. Ziegenfuss coached on Montezuma Mesa for 21 seasons and guided the Aztecs to the Division II quarterfinals twice and to the second round. Prior to moving into Division II, Ziegenfuss took SDSU to the NAIA tournament on two occasions, going as far as the third round. During his tenure, he posted a record of 316-229 (114-73 CCAA) and finished in first or second place in the California Collegiate Athletic Association 11 times.

Increasing the Margin

In its three wins at the World Vision Classic, the Aztecs increased their margin of victory in each game. Against Liberty, SDSU won by 12 and then followed it with a 14-point victory over Portland. In the finale, the Aztecs dominated Fresno State and defeated the Bulldogs by 17. The feat marked the first time since the 1984-85 season that the Aztecs have increased their margin of victory in three consecutive non-conference wins. In '84-85, SDSU beat Long Beach State on the road by two, 62-60, and followed it with neutral-site wins over McNeese State by six (91-85) and Southwest Louisiana by 13 (86-73).

Aztecs Win World Vision Classic

The Aztecs won their sixth in-season event victory of the Division I era last weekend in Fresno Calif., with three wins in three days. San Diego State claimed tournament titles in the 1977 Cabrillo Classic (San Diego, Calif), 1981 Cabrillo Classic (San Diego, Calif.), 1984 UNLV Roundup (Las Vegas, Nev.), the 1987 Holiday Bowl Classic (San Diego, Calif.), the 2006 Shamrock Invitational and this season's World Vision Classic.

Aztecs Picked to Finish in Tie for Fourth

San Diego State has been picked to finish in a tie for fourth place in the Mountain West Conference's 2007-08 pre-season men's basketball media poll released Oct. 17, at the league's media day held at The Mtn. studios in Littleton, Colo.

The Aztecs, 2007 NIT participants, earned 128 points along with New Mexico (two first-place votes) and also received one first-place vote. Brigham Young was picked to win the league with 181 points and 15 first-place votes, followed by UNLV (146 pts; 2 first-place votes) and Utah (142; 2).

After SDSU and New Mexico in sixth place was Wyoming (120), with TCU (7th, 58), Air Force (8th, 54) and Colorado State (9th, 33) rounding out the poll.

San Diego State junior forward Ryan Amoroso was the lone Aztec to garner individual accolades as he was voted

as the league's top newcomer. Amoroso, a transfer from Marquette who sat out last season, becomes the second SDSU player in the last three years to earn that distinction. Recently departed senior Mohamed Abukar earned the same recognition heading into the 2005-06 campaign.

Not So Newcomers

Even though they are classified as "newcomers," Ryan Amoroso and Kelvin Davis are anything but that. The pair make up for 33 percent of the team's newcomers, but it is their experience prior to arriving on Montezuma Mesa that would dispute their classification.

Amoroso played in 57 games, while making eight starts in his two-year stint at Marquette. During his time there, the Golden Eagles went 39-23 and advanced to the 2005 National Invitation Tournament and the 2006 NCAA Tournament. Davis, meanwhile, played in 24 games his freshman season at UTEP and was a part of a Miner team that 27-8 and earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament. And although he redshirted the following season, Davis was a part of a UTEP squad that ended the season at 21-10 and advanced to the second round of the NIT.

When compared to last year's five newcomers, only Lorenzo Wade had prior Division I college experience. Wade saw action in 35 games at Louisville as a freshman and helped lead the Cardinals to a 33-5 record and a spot in the NCAA Final Four.

Experience Counts

With only one senior on the roster some may think the Aztecs are young. Although there is some truth to that, the players San Diego State has returning are definitely battle-tested. The seven returners, along with the additions of Ryan Amoroso and Kelvin Davis, have all been a part of winning teams that have won at least 20 games and squads that have advanced to postseason play. Of the nine to advance to the postseason, seven have been to an NCAA Tournament and eight have been on teams to win at least one game in the postseason. Last year, SDSU only had eight players who had tasted the postseason and were part of 20-win ballclubs. Of the eight, only Lorenzo Wade experienced winning a postseason game.



Steve Fisher

17th-Full Season • 9th Season at SDSU • Illinois State, 1967

Steve Fisher has guided the Aztec basketball program to unparalleled heights. In eight seasons, he has taken a program that regularly missed out on the conference postseason tournament, to one which has become of the best programs on the West Coast and has the Aztecs knocking on the door of the elite teams in the country.

The best news for SDSU fans is that Fisher signed a new five-year contract prior to the start of the 2006-07 season that will keep him in San Diego for the foreseeable future.

When Fisher arrived on the scene in March of 1999, he found a basketball program that wasn't good enough to be called average. The Aztecs had suffered through 13 losing seasons in 14 years. Members of the school's last NCAA team were in the early stages of middle age. The expectations were set. The Aztecs were expected to lose. The year before Fisher's arrival on campus, San Diego State won just four games.

Now those days are a distant memory. Fisher guided San Diego State to the NCAA Tournament in 2002, the postseason NIT in 2003, the 2006 NCAA Tournament and the NIT last season. In addition, the Aztecs have a solid core returning and an exciting incoming class, both freshmen and newcomers, that will keep SDSU competitive this season and seasons ahead.

On March 26, 1999, San Diego State announced its arrival on the basketball scene in the form of a news conference to introduce its new coach, Steve Fisher. Fresh from a stint with the Sacramento Kings and with three appearances in the Final Four and a national championship in his pocket, he rolled up his sleeves and went to work. And work was needed. It looked to be a daunting challenge and yet the man with one of the highest winning percentages in NCAA Tournament history had no reservations.

No head-coaching career, at any level, started quicker than that of Steve Fisher. Six games into his head-coaching

career he was undefeated and sporting a national championship ring. And the success didn't stop with the national title.

Fisher's eight-plus seasons at Michigan produced a 184-82 (.692) record, nine postseason tournament berths and three trips to the NCAA championship game, including the magical run to the 1989 national title.

Under Fisher, the Wolverines also claimed an NIT championship, won at least 20 games four times and finished among the top three in the powerful Big Ten Conference five times. In 1995, Michigan set a league record by holding opponents to just 39.4 percent shooting from the floor.

Fisher and Co., raised the bar even higher in the postseason. His seven NCAA Tournament teams at Michigan combined for a 20-6 record, ranking him fourth among active coaches and ninth in NCAA history with a winning percentage of .769 in the national bracket. Only 13 coaches have taken more teams to the Final Four, including just five that are still active. He is one of three coaches to take three squads to the Final Four in the first five years of a head-coaching career, and one of just six coaches to lead a team to the championship of the NIT as well as the NCAA.

His accomplishments may be even greater at San Diego State. In 2001-02 he led the Aztecs to the postseason for the first time since 1985 and for just the fourth time ever. The 21 wins were second most for the school as a Division I program and the most since 1985. The fact that those numbers came after just three seasons signifies what is one of the great recent turnarounds in college basketball.

He followed that up with a third consecutive season with a .500 or better record in 2002-03 and led SDSU back to the postseason for the second consecutive season for only the second time in the school's Division I history. In addition, SDSU claimed its first Division I postseason victory with a win in the NIT.



FRESNO, Calif. - San Diego State defeated Liberty, 62-50, in the opening game of the World Vision Classic.

SDSU shot 46.7 percent from the field and held Liberty to 34.0 percent shooting. The Aztecs out-rebounded Liberty, 32-28, thanks to a game-high seven rebounds from Billy White.

Kyle Spain led the Aztecs with 14 points, while White had 13 points and Lorenzo Wade had 12.

The game was close early as Liberty led 10-9 with 8:55 left in the first half following a layup by Rell Porter. SDSU then scored six straight points to take a 15-10 lead following a dunk by White with 5:59 until halftime.

San Diego State outscored Liberty 8-2 in the final two minutes to lead 27-19 at halftime. To open the second half, the Aztecs went on a 16-3 run to lead 43-22 with 12:50 left in the game. Ryan Amoroso, playing in his first game as an Aztec, contributed nine points and five rebounds in a starting role.

San Diego State maintained the double digit lead the rest of the game.

With freshmen D.J. Gay and Tim Shelton earning the starting nod, the duo became the 10th and 11th freshmen to start a season-opening game under Steve Fisher and the fifth and sixth under Fisher while at SDSU.

The win improves the Aztecs' record in season-opening games to 7-2 under Fisher and SDSU has now won three consecutive season openers for the first time since doing it in 1999-00, '00-01 and '01-02.

Portland shot 41 percent from the floor, but shot 21.1 percent (4-19) from long range.

The win marks the first time SDSU has won its first two games of a season since the 1994-95 and 1995-96 seasons.

FRESNO, Calif. - San Diego State used a swarming defense and had six players score in double figures as the Aztecs defeated Fresno State in the championship game of the World Vision Classic.

Ryan Amoroso scored a team- and Aztec career-high 19 points and was followed by Lorenzo Wade's second straight game with 18 points.

Kelvin Davis had his best game at SDSU with 15 points on 6 of 8 shooting from the field in a reserve role, while Kyle Spain added 12. True freshmen Tim Shelton and D.J. Gay rounded out the double-figure scorers with 11 and 10 points, respectively. Shelton also had a game- and career-high eight rebounds.

The Aztecs' six double-figure scorers marked the first time they accomplished the feat since the 2006-07 season when they did it against Campbell.

San Diego State shot 55 percent and hit on nine of 15 three-pointers while limiting the Bulldogs to 47 percent from the floor.

SDSU led from the opening tip and jumped out to a 25-8 lead nine minutes into the game. The Bulldogs went on a run to come within 10 at 27-17 with 8:14 to play in half.

San Diego State then extended its lead to 38-21 and led 48-33 at halftime. Fresno State got no closer than 12 points in the second half.

With the win, the Aztecs snapped a 12-game losing streak to Fresno State in Fresno and delivered the Bulldogs' worst defeat in the history of their five-year old arena, Save Mart Center. It was also Fresno State's largest margin of defeat in a regular-season home game since Dec. 3, 1994.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State traveled west to Jenny Craig Pavilion and handed San Diego a 69-64 defeat for the Aztecs' second win on the USD campus since 1975.

SDSU used hot shooting, especially from behind the arc, and a stifling pressure defense to down the Toreros for the second consecutive season and the sixth time in the last seven meetings.

Despite shooting 66.7 percent from the field, the Aztecs only held a four-point lead, 38-34, at halftime thanks to USD's Brandon Johnson's 16 first-half points.

Coming out of intermission, San Diego came out on fire, while SDSU struggled to get itself going. Five minutes into the half, the Aztecs' four-point lead turned into a four-point deficit, but San Diego State stayed close for the next few minutes before going on a 13-4 run to go ahead by nine with four minutes left in the game.

The Aztecs stretched their lead to 10 with 1:26 remaining in regulation before a combination of SDSU missed free throws and USD buckets cut the Aztecs' lead to four with 30 seconds left. Kyle Spain, however, put the game out of reach with his free throw and SDSU emerged with the win.

San Diego State, which had four players score in double figures, was led by Lorenzo Wade's 14 points and six assists. Spain added 11, while Ryan Amoroso and Kelvin Davis each had 10.

The Aztecs forced 25 Torero turnovers, 15 of which were SDSU steals and shot 60 percent from both the field and behind the arc.

Davis led all Aztecs with a career-high five three-point field goals and a personal-best 17 points.

ANAHEIM, Calif. - San Diego State was unable to overcome an 8-for-18 performance from the free-throw line as it fell to Saint Mary's, 69-64, at the 14th annual John R. Wooden Classic.

The Aztecs had four players score in double figures, enjoyed a five-point halftime lead, outbounced the Gaels and were even in turnovers. However, SDSU could not hit free throws down the stretch, which enabled SMC to pull away in the final minutes.

In the first half, the game was close with the Gaels owning a five-point advantage in the early going until SDSU went on a 17-4 run over the course of nearly 11 minutes. By the time SMC's Tron Smith earned his way to the free-throw line with 2:57 to go in the half, the Aztecs were up by eight points.

Smith spurred a late Saint Mary's 7-4 run with his four consecutive free throws cutting SDSU's lead to five, 29-24, at halftime. Smith finished the game shooting 10-of-14 from the line, en route to a game-high 20 points, in a reserve role.

At the beginning of the second half, the Aztecs increased their lead to eight on a pair of jumpers by Lorenzo Wade and Richie Williams and a free throw by Williams. Unfortunately for SDSU, SMC responded by going on an 11-0 run to go up 37-34.

San Diego State was unfazed and fought back to make the game close as neither team led by more than three points and the score was tied on five different occasions.

Despite taking a five-point lead on a layup by Smith, SDSU trimmed the deficit to one with 3:22 left. From that point on, however, the Aztecs went 0-for-5 from the line to let the game slip away.

Kelvin Davis led SDSU in scoring for the second straight game with 19 points. Wade and Williams finished with 11 points, while Billy White added 10.

TUCSON, Ariz. - San Diego State owned an advantage on the boards, made three times as many free throws, but could not overcome a cold shooting performance en route to a 74-58 defeat at the hands of 19th-ranked Arizona at the Fiesta Bowl Classic before 14,608 fans at the McKale Center.

Kyle Spain led all scorers with 20 points behind the strength of seven field goals and a 5-of-6 performance from the free-throw line. The junior also had a team-high tying eight rebounds and a team-season best six offensive boards.

Frontline classmate, Ryan Amoroso, was the other Aztec to reach double figures as he scored 11 points (4-6 FT). Amoroso also collected eight rebounds, while freshman forward Billy White grabbed seven for a second straight game.

SDSU, which trailed by as many as 12 in the first half, cut the lead to six at halftime thanks to an 8-2 run by the Aztecs to close the first period.

Within the first five-plus minutes, SDSU cut the Arizona to four points on two different occasions before the Wildcats went on a 14-8 run with just over eight minutes to play to put the game away.

SDSU's leading scorer and junior forward Lorenzo Wade, finished with just seven points after getting into foul trouble early in the game. In the first half, Wade played just three minutes and finished the contest having played 18 minutes.

Arizona had four players in double figures and were led by Jordan Hill's 15 points and 10 rebounds. Freshman Jerryd Bayless shared team-high honors in scoring with 15 points as well.


Wade had a career-high 23 points and added four steals, four assists and three rebounds.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State held TCU to 13 first-half points and had four players score in double figures as the Aztecs defeated the Horned Frogs, 64-57, in the Mountain West Conference opener at Cox Arena.

The game started with each team trading baskets and was tied at five after a jumper by TCU's Kevin Langford. Following the basket, San Diego State used a suffocating defense to hold the Frogs without a point for 9 minutes, 51 seconds, until Langford hit one of two free throws. TCU's field goal drought, however, lasted 14:30 until Ryan Wall came off the bench to make a three-point basket.

At the end of the half, the Aztecs found themselves ahead, 32-13, with 20 of their points coming inside the paint. The Frogs' 13 points in the first half were the fewest allowed by an SDSU squad since it joined the MWC prior to the 1999-00 season.

The second half was just the opposite of the first after TCU opened the period with six straight points to cut the SDSU lead to 13. But the Aztecs countered by stretching their lead to 20 nearly six minutes into the half.

Later with under 10 minutes to play, San Diego State missed four straight field goals, while TCU went on a 13-2 run fueled by three treys by Horned Frog Henry Salter to trim the Aztec lead to eight with 4:33 to play.

Down the stretch as TCU was mounting a comeback, San Diego State went 13-for-14 from the free-throw line in the final 4:11 to keep the Frogs at bay.

Lorenzo Wade led the Aztecs with team highs of 18 points and eight rebounds, while Ryan Amoroso and Kelvin Davis had 12 and Kyle Spain scored 11.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State had its 13-game homecourt winning streak snapped and lost for the first time in 371 days as the Aztecs fell in their final non-conference game of the season, 62-56, to Northern Colorado.

SDSU, which owned the 11th-longest homecourt winning streak in the nation, was out rebounded for the first time in eight games by a 16-board margin, but was still in position to win the game with under two minutes to play.

Twice, early in the second half, the Bears held a nine-point advantage, but the Aztecs rallied to take a 50-48 lead on a layup by Lorenzo Wade with 3:32 remaining.

Northern Colorado, however, responded with a 10-0 run capped by a Jefferson Mason three-point play and two free throws by Jabril Banks, which gave the Bears an eight-point cushion with 26 seconds left in regulation.

The Northern Colorado run was put to a halt after a three-point field goal by Kyle Spain cut the lead to five with 18 seconds remaining, but the Aztecs would come up short despite a free throw by Spain and a tip-in by D.J. Gay in the final seven seconds.

Kelvin Davis scored a game-high 18 points for SDSU with Spain adding 16, including 10 in the first half. Wade ended the game with 11 points and Gay posted a career-high five assists in his second-straight starting assignment.

Devon Beitzel led the Bears with 15 points to help lead Northern Colorado to their first road victory of the season.
