NCAA Tournament-Bound

◆For the second time in three years, the San Diego State softball program, which captured the 2003 Mountain West Conference regular-season title and advanced to this year's final of the MWC tournament, received an at-large bid to the NCAA Championships.

◆The fifth-seeded Aztecs (38-19) look for an appearance in the 2003 Women's College World Series as they open regional action against fourth-seeded and No. 21 Louisiana-Lafayette (43-8) at Region Six, hosted by Cal State Fullerton on Thursday at 9 a.m. (PDT).

◆Aztec games will be webcast live over the internet at goaztecs.com.

◆SDSU head coach Kathy Van Wyk returns to her alma mater for Regionals, where she was named the 1982 National Player of the Year while pitching for the Titans.

◆San Diego State is 1-0 this year against teams in Region Six (SDSU def. Oregon, 1-0, on Feb. 15).

◆The Aztecs are 12-12 in 2003 against teams in this year's NCAA tournament.

◆Some notable wins this year against teams in the tourney include a 2-0 win over Stanford (No. 2, Region 8), a 2-1 win against Michigan (No. 3, Region 7) and a 2-1 win over Michigan State (No. 3, Region 2).

Mountain West Tournament in Review

◆San Diego State went 2-2 at the 2003 MWC tournament, held May 8-10 at SDSU Field.

◆After enduring a three-game schedule last Saturday in which the top-seeded Aztecs played Brigham Young twice before advancing to the championship game of the tournament, San Diego State lost to No. 2 Colorado State, 3-1.

◆Earlier in the day, SDSU lost to BYU, 2-1, before defeating the Cougars, 3-1, in an elimination game.

◆The Aztecs opened the tournament with a 14-inning battle against New Mexico that ended with a 4-3 SDSU victory.

◆Freshman pitcher Celena Velasquez, junior second baseman Joann Figueroa and junior first baseman Jacque Vaca were named to the Mountain West Conference all-tournament team.

San Diego State Repeats as MWC Champs

◆For the second year in a row, the San Diego State softball team captured the Mountain West Conference regular-season title, as it defeated Colorado State,

◆The SDSU hurlers broke a team record for single-season strikeouts in the second game against Centenary College on April 13 with 271 (record previously set in 2001 with 266).

◆SDSU's .971 fielding percentage ranks among the top 20 in the nation (T16th).

◆The Aztecs are 5-11 on the road in 2003.

◆The Aztecs are 5-5 in their last 10 games and 15-5 in their last 20 contests.
