Forced his first career fumble and added a seasonbest three tackles in the win over Washington State ... One solo stop in the loss at Michigan ... Made his first start of the season and second of his career against TCU, tallying two tackles and a pass breakup ... Started again at Air Force, making a season-high four stops ... Also logged starts vs. Wyoming (two tackles), vs. New Mexico (one tackle), at CSU (one tackle) and vs. Boise State (one tackle) ... Had two tackles, including a TFL, and his first career interception at UNLV ... Made one stop vs. Fresno State.

2010: Appeared in all 13 contests, logging one start ... Had 33 tackles on the year and contributed five pass breakups, which were third most on the team ... Played his first career game against Nicholls, posting two solo tackles and a pass breakup as a reserve ... Had another PBU in the win over New Mexico State ...
