

Aztecs To Compete in 2004 MWC Women's Soccer Championship

*The San Diego State Aztecs will compete in the 2004 Mountain West Conference Women's Soccer Championship hosted by Brigham Young University this week at South Stadium in Provo, Utah.

*San Diego State and BYU tied for second-place in the conference with 3-1-2 records. The Cougars (7-9-4 overall) will get the second seed after earning the tie break advantage due to goal differential in conference matches.

*The Aztecs will play sixth-seeded New Mexico (5-11, 1-5 MWC) at 4:30 p.m. (MST) in one quarterfinal match on Wednesday. In other games on Wednesday, No. 2 Brigham Young (7-9-4, 3-1-2 MWC) will host seventh-seeded Air Force (3-12-2, 0-5-1 MWC) at 7 p.m. (MST) and No. 4 Utah (11-5-2, 3-2-1 MWC) will meet fifth-seeded Wyoming (9-6-4, 3-3-0 MWC) at 2 p.m. (MST).

Last Weekend With The Aztecs

*The UNLV women's soccer team defeated San Diego State, 3-0, before a SDSU women's soccer Sports Deck record crowd of 571 spectators on Saturday afternoon.

*SDSU outshot the Rebels, 8-1, in the first half and 13-5 for the match. UNLV managed only four shots on goal in the game, with three of shots finding the back of the net.

*Sophomore Jen Klunder led the Aztecs with four shots (two on goal). Senior Noelle Jouglet, junior Amanda Swiader and freshman Casey Davidson contributed two shots apiece.

*Senior goalkeeper Sophia Perez played 88:50 and made one save, while freshman Melissa Deckers saw 1:10 of action and did not face a shot.

Aztecs Earn MWC, National Accolades

*SDSU received numerous awards during the 2004 season. Four different athletes were named Mountain West Conference Player of the Week in three consecutive weeks, with two players - senior Noelle Jouglet and sophomore Jen Klunder - earning national recognition.

*On Oct. 11, senior goalkeeper Sophia Perez was named the Mountain West Conference Co-Defensive Player of the Week after back-to-back shutouts at BYU and Utah.

*The following week, Klunder was selected to the Soccer Buzz National Elite team of the week after earning MWC Offensive Player of the Week honors for her consecutive game-winning goals against Wyoming and New Mexico.

*Jouglet (defensive) garnered *Soccer America* Team of the Week accolades, in addition to being named MWC Defensive Player of the Week, for her strong play in a defensive backfield which went 595+ minutes without allowing a goal, a SDSU record.

*On Oct. 25, senior forward Courtney Burns earned Mountain West Conference Co-Offensive Player of the Week honors, scoring both goals in a 2-0 shutout of Air Force.

*SDSU's four player of the week honors is tied for second in the conference, trailing only UNLV (six), the MWC regular season champions.

Defense Wins Championships

*Offense wins games, but defense wins championships. That's a good sign for SDSU. Through 18 games, the Aztecs have given up just 17 goals. It is the fewest amount of goals allowed in the first 18 games for a SDSU team since the 1998 squad gave up 13 goals to start its historic campaign. The 1998 Aztecs went on to finish the season with a 19-3-1 record and advanced to the third round of the NCAA tournament.

*The SDSU defense, which has shutout the opposition nine times in 2004, has had two impressive streaks without allowing a goal. The Aztecs went 595:44 without giving up a goal from Oct. 3-30 (a period of 5+ games and also a SDSU record) and 288:38 from Sept. 13-19 (a stretch of 2+ games).

*The 2004 defense has been led by the play of senior Noelle Jouglet, junior Amanda Swiader and senior Alexis Solovij, a 2003 all-MWC first team selection, who joined the backfield on the Utah trip and played a big part in the record scoreless streak.

In Sophia We Trust

*In 17 starts this season, senior goalkeeper Sophia Perez has made 76 saves (fourth in the MWC), while recording a 85.2 save percentage in 1,625+ minutes of action.

*Perez is 6-5-5 with nine shutouts (MWC leader) and a 0.72 goals against average (third in MWC). The Aztec single-season record for goals against average is 0.61 set by Katherine Judkins in 1998. *Perez ranks fourth in the MWC in GAA, however, the top-two athletes have played 355 and 335 minutes, respectively, while Perez has seen more

than 1,625 minutes of action. We Know Overtime

*The six overtime games played this season are the most by an Aztec team in the program's 16year history.

*SDSU is 1-0-5 in overtime games this year and have never lost an overtime game in the MWC, going 4-0-4 since 1999.

The Future is Now

*Through 18 games, 28 players have made appearances in Aztec games; 11 freshmen, seven

juniors, six seniors and four sophomores. Three freshmen have seen action in all 18 games; Kelly Carter (four starts), Tiphanie Elliott (five), and Ashley Young (12). Freshman Lisa Nielsen started four of the 16 games she has played in 2004 and is third on the team in shots with 20.

Home Sweet Home

*The Aztecs are 5-3 at the SDSU Sports Deck in 2004, with their only losses coming to 2003 tournament participants Navy and then No. 3 Washington, and 2004 MWC regular season champion UNLV.

*SDSU has also won four of its last six home matches.

*In the six years the Aztecs have called the SDSU Sports Deck home, they have earned a 30-18-1 record.

*The Aztecs are 12-4 all-time in home MWC matches and 12-11-1 in non-conference games. *On Oct. 30 against UNLV 571 fans attended the match, a SDSU women's soccer Sports Deck record.

*SDSU opponents have a combined record of 162-153-34. The Aztecs have played three teams that have been nationally-ranked in 2004 - Washington, San Diego and Arizona State. SDSU has also met eight teams, six times on the road, that made the 2003 NCAA Tournament, posting a 1-4-3 record.

Final Stretch for Six Seniors

*Six Aztec seniors - Courtney Burns, Noelle Jouglet, Jessica Korpela, Shannon McBride, Sophia Perez and Gina Salinas - will compete in their final Mountain West Conference Championship on Wednesday.

*Courtney Burns is in her second season at SDSU after transferring from UC Riverside following her sophomore campaign. A Grand Terrace, Calif. native, Burns is currently tied for the teamlead with three goals and has received the starting nod in nine of the Aztecs' 18 matches. On Oct. 25, Burns earned Mountain West Conference Co-Offensive Player of the Week honors, scoring

both goals in a 2-0 shutout of Air Force.

*Noelle Jouglet, a 2004 co-captain and La Mesa, Calif. native, emerged as a team leader in 2004 and played a pivotal part in defensive backfield that at one time went 595+ minutes without allowing a goal, a SDSU record. Jouglet earned an assist on Jen Klunder's game-winning goal against Wyoming on Oct. 15. On Oct. 21 after being named Mountain West Conference Defensive Player of the Week, Jouglet earned national accolades when she was selected to the *Soccer America* Team of the Week.

*Jessica Korpela, a Highlands Ranch, Colo. native and 2002 transfer from San Jose State, has started 17 of 18 games in 2004, picking up a goal in a 3-2 win over Cal State Northridge on Sept. 24. Last season, Korpela finished tied for fourth on the team in scoring with four points on one goal and two assists. In two seasons at San Diego State, Korpela has contributed two goals and four assists.

*Shannon McBride is in her second season as an Aztec after transferring from Southwest Missouri State. McBride has started 13 of the 16 games she has played in 2004, taking 10 shots. McBride, who started all 37 games she played in at Southwest Missouri State, has started 28 of 34 games in two seasons as an Aztec.

*Sophia Perez, a 2002 transfer from Mesa College and Bonita, Calif. native, has put together one of the most impressive seasons by a goalkeeper in the program's 16-year history. In 17 starts this season, Perez is 6-6-5 with nine shutouts and an 0.72 goals against average. On Oct. 11, Perez was named the Mountain West Conference Co-Defensive Player of the Week after back-to-back shutouts at BYU and Utah.

*Gina Salinas, one of the Aztec co-captains in 2004, has been one of the most consistent performers in recent memory. Salinas has started all 18 games for San Diego State this year, tallying one goal in the second game of the season against Oregon. In four seasons, Salinas has started 60 games and has played in 75 matches. A Yorba Linda native, Salinas has nine points off three goals and three assists in her career.

*San Diego State first-year head coach Dr. Michael Giuliano knows how to win. The fourtime adidas Coach of the Year ('99, '01-'03), NAIA Coach of the Year ('99, '01-'03) and far west region coach of the year ('94, '96, '99, '03) guided Westmont College to four NAIA championships ('99, '01-'03), six final four appearances and nine national tournament appearances in his 11 years at the College.

*Giuliano ranks third all-time in NAIA coaching victories (194) and winning percentage (.803).

*Giuliano, also coached three NAIA Players of the Year and 30 All-Americans.
