AZTECS COMPLETE REGULAR SEASON THIRD IN THE MWC

- ◆ San Diego State ended its regular in third place in the Mountain West Conference standings with a record of 17-13 in league play.
- ◆ With that finish the Aztecs earned the No. 3 seed at this week's Mountain West Tournament.
- ◆ It marks the 12th time in the 14 seasons of the league's existence that SDSU has finished third or higher in the final conference standings.

2014 MOUNTAIN WEST CONFERENCE TOURNAMENT

- ♦ By virtue of its league finish, San Diego State will be the number-three seed at this week's tournament. That championship event gets underway on Wednesday, May 21, at Earl E. Wilson Stadium in Las Vegas, Nev.
- ♦ New Mexico and UNLV tied for the conference regular-season title at 20-10 with UNLV holding the tiebreaker and attaining the tournament's number-one seed. Both the Lobos and Rebels will have byes on the first day of the tourney with the other five teams playing that
- ♦ SDSU's third-place seeding means it will face the winner of the Air Force-San Jose State contest in the second game on opening day of the tourney. That contest is scheduled for Wednesday, May 21, at 3:00 p.m. (PDT).
- ◆ The Aztecs' second game in the tourney is dependent upon its result and the results of Wednesday's third contest between Fresno State and Nevada.
- ◆ For the complete tournament schedule, see page 2 of this release.

RECORD VS. MWC OPPONENTS

- ◆ San Diego State won three Mountain West Conference series, lost two and tied one this season. The Aztecs won their series vs. Air Force (3-0), Fresno State (4-2) and San Jose State (4-2). They lost the series against both New Mexico (1-2) and Nevada (2-4) while finishing even with UNLV (3-3).

HEAD COACH TONY GWYNN

- ◆ Tony Gwynn is in his 12th season as San Diego State's head coach after being named to the position in Sept. 2001. He became just the fourth head coach in SDSU history since baseball was elevated to major sport status in 1936.
- ◆ In 2002, he served as a volunteer coach for the Aztecs under Jim Dietz, who retired at the end of that season.
- ◆ In 2004, Gwynn led his squad to the Mountain West Conference regular-season championship and was named the MWC coach of the year.
- ◆ He has taken SDSU to the NCAA Regionals in 2009 and 2013.
- ◆ A former Aztec who played baseball at San Diego State from 1979 to 1981, Gwynn concluded a 20-year major league career with the San Diego Padres in 2001. With a career batting average of .338, he won eight National League batting titles, five Gold Gloves, and made 15 appearances in the annual All-Star Game.
- ◆ Tony Gwynn was inducted into the National Baseball Hall of Fame on July 29, 2007.
- ◆ His overall record entering the week stands at 358-360 (.499). His mark in conference contests is 179-135 (.570).

ZIER HITS AWAY

- With his hit in the first inning at New Mexico on Sunday May 4, Tim Zier became the all-time hits leader at SDSU.
- ◆ He added three more this past weekend and now has 292 in his Aztec career.
- He had a 10-game hitting streak end in the contest at New Mexico on May 3. It is the second-longest hitting streak by an Aztec in 2014.
- ◆ He has hit safely in seven of the last eight and 17 of the past 19 contests
- On Apr. 27 he had four hits vs. San Jose State. It was his third four-hit game this season and he is one of only three Aztecs (along with Evan Potter and Ty France with one each) to accomplish that feat in 2014.

HAYNAL GOES DEEP

- ◆ Catcher Brad Haynal had a home run in the series finale at Fresno State last weekend (May 17) and now has 12 on the year, a number that ranks second the Mountain West Conference.
- His 12 homers are the most by an SDSU hitter since Nick Romero had the same total during the 2008 campaign.
- ◆ He has hit safely in four of SDSU's last five outings.
- ♦ He finished the conference season as the Mountain West RBI leader with 33 in 30 games.
- ◆ Over SDSU's last nine contests he is hitting .306 (15-for-49).

ALLEN CONSISTENT

- Greg Allen had an 11-game hitting streak come to an end in the series finale at Fresno State last Saturday (May 17).
- During that streak he hit .319 (15-for-47) with a double, two triples, four RBI and eight runs scored.
- ◆ It is the longest hitting streak by an Aztec during the 2014 season.
- ◆ He recorded a triple in back-to-back contests at Fresno State (May 15-16) and leads the team with four on the year.
- ◆ Allen has had 19 multiple-hit games during the 2014 season to rank third on the squad.
- He stole two bases in the series finale vs. Air Force on Apr. 6, the fourth time this season he has had multiple steals in a game.
- ◆ Allen continues to lead the Mountain West in steals with 25.
- He has involved in two fielder's choices from center field, throwing runners out at second and third on force plays from outfield.

ZAVALA SOLID AT THE PLATE

- ◆ Sophomore outfielder Seby Zavala hit safely in all three games at Fresno State last weekend (May 15-17) going 5-for-11 (.455) with two doubles, an RBI and four runs scored.
- ♦ He had the game-winning RBI in the 3-2 win over UNLV on May 11.
- ◆ He had an eight-game hitting streak end on May 4 at New Mexico.
- During that streak he hit .344 (11-for-32) with two doubles, a triple, three RBI and six runs scored.
- ◆ Zavala hit his second career home run during the win over UC Riverside at Tony Gwynn Stadium on Apr. 8.
- ◆ It was his second homer in four games after his four-bagger vs. Air Force the previous Friday (Apr. 4).
- ◆ After starting the first 22 games of the season in left field, Seby Zavala served

- as the starting designated hitter in the series finale at UNLV on Mar. 23. He has been the starter in left since that contest with the exception of the game at Long beach State (May 6) which he did not start.
- ◆ Zavala has recorded four assists from left field including directly throwing out three runners at home plate.

FRANCE CONTINUES STRONG

- ◆ Ty France had a streak of reaching base safely (via hit, walk or hit by pitch) in 27 straight contests come to an end in the game vs. UNLV on May 9.
- ◆ Over SDSU's last five games he has gone 7-for-17 (.412) with a home run, four walks, three RBI and four runs.
- At Long Beach State on May 6 he was hit by pitch three times to tie the Aztec single-game record in that category. The record is also held by current Director of Baseball Operations Landon Burt, who accomplished the feat in 2004.
- ◆ France finished the series at New Mexico on May 4 with a three-hit game that included an RBI and run scored.
- ◆ He had three RBI in the contest vs. UNLV on May 10 for his 11th multiple-RBI effort, second most on the squad.

- ◆ France leads the team in multiple-hit games with 23.
- ◆ In series finale at Nevada on Apr. 13 he recorded four hits including three doubles and played a part in all for of SDSU's runs (scored three, one RBI).
- ◆ It marked the second time this season that he had three doubles in a game.
- France received three intentional walks during the series at UC Irvine (Apr. 17-19) to bring his total to eight this season.

SEYLER STELLAR

- Mark Seyler picked up his team-leading eighth win of the season in the contest vs. UNLV May 10.
- ◆ He tossed 6.1 innings allowing three runs on five hits with three walks and six strikeouts.
- ◆ He has been stellar when pitching at Tony Gwynn Stadium. In seven starts and one relief appearance there he is 7-0 with a 1.46 earned run average.
- ♦ He has walked only 12 and struck out 49 in those eight games.
- ◆ Seyler tied his career high with nine strikeouts in the win over Air Force on Apr. 6.

PALLARES COMES ON

- ◆ Steven Pallares has gone 8-for-22 (.364) hitting safely in five of the most recent six games in which he has appeared.
- Over that span he has a home run, four RBI, seven runs scored and four stolen bases (on four attempts).
- ◆ He has scored at least once in each of his last six contests.
- ◆ He has also drawn four walks and been hit by pitch once for a .440 on-base percentage in those six games.

ADKISON STREAKING

- ◆ Freshman outfielder Tyler Adkison hit safely in all three games at Fresno State last weekend (May 15-17).
- ◆ In those games he went 5-for-11 (.455) with two doubles, a triple, three RBI and three runs scored,
- ◆ The triple was his second of the year with the other coming at UNLV on March 2
- He had his first three-hit game as an Aztec on May 10 vs. UNLV. Among those hits was a double and he also scored a run.
- He had a season-high seven-game hitting streak end on May 3 at New Mexico.
- ♦ He has started in right field in each of the past 17 contests.
- ◆ Adkison has split time this season between starting in right field (28 times) and as the designated hitter (16 times).
- ♦ He has not committed an error in the outfield in 57 chances.

CEDEROTH SAVES

- ◆ Since moving to the SDSU bullpen as the closer, junior Michael Cederoth has made 28 appearances and recorded five wins, 19 saves and a 1.63 ERA
- ♦ His 19 saves ranks third in the nation in NCAA Division I entering the week.
- ◆ Opponents are hitting just .188 against him.
- ♦ He has been involved in 24 of SDSU's 35 wins this season (win or save).

MUNO RETURNS

- Junior first baseman Ryan Muno has hit safely in four of SDSU's last five contests with two doubles, six RBI and four runs scored.
- ◆ He made his return to the SDSU lineup during the series at Nevada on Apr. 11 after missing SDSU's previous 22 contests due to continuing symptoms from a concussion suffered in the game at St. Mary's on March 2.
- ◆ In the Apr. 18 game at UC Irvine he had a single, but was also hit on the knee by a pitch that forced him to leave the contest and subsequently miss another two games before returning on Friday, Apr. 25.
- ◆ On Sunday, Apr. 27, he made his first start in the field (first base) since his return after having served as the DH in seven contests. He has started at first base in each of the past 12 contests.
- Went 3-for-7 over the final two games of the UNLV series (May 10-11) with two doubles, three RBI and two runs scored.
- ◆ He has not committed an error in the field in 180 chances since the season opener at San Jose State on Feb. 14.

POTTER DOUBLES UP

- On Tuesday, Mar. 25, against Santa Clara, shortstop Evan Potter set an Aztec record with four doubles in the game, becoming the first SDSU player to accomplish that feat.
- Prior to that contest he had hit three doubles through the Aztecs first 23 contests.
- ◆ Potter had a sacrifice bunt last on May 2 at New Mexico, the 31st of his career and he is now tied for the SDSU record of 31 with Steve Dietz (1990-93).

ALLEN RECEIVES ACADEMIC HONORS

- ◆ Center fielder Greg Allen has been voted to the 2014 Capital One Academic All-District 8 Men's Baseball Team as announced by the College Sports Information Directors of America.
- The San Diego, Calif., native (Hilltop HS) is majoring in business management at SDSU and holds a gpa of 3.52.
- He was recently honored for the second consecutive year by being named an Arthur Ashe Jr. Sports Scholar Athlete for 2013 by Diverse Issues in Higher Education, one of 12 collegiate baseball players nationwide (all divisions) to receive the honor.
- ◆ Allen is also a two-time Mountain West Scholar-Athlete honoree and member of the Mountain West All-Academic Team.

HOME COOKIN'

- ◆ San Diego State's final home record of 24-5 this season is the program's best since the NCAA instituted the 56-game regular-season contest limit in 1991.
- ◆ Its previous best home mark over the past 24 seasons was 24-7 during the 2002 campaign.
- ◆ It marks the fewest home losses since the 1984 season when the team finished 38-5 at home (66-23 overall).
- ◆ The Aztecs' best all-time home record came in 1983 when it went 40-4 in games at Charlie Smith Field when there was no limit on the number of games a team could play.
- ◆ SDSU finished 62-15 that season.

STEALING AWAY

- ◆ San Diego State has been successful on 71.4 percent of its stolen base attempts this season (70-of-98).
- ◆ Opponents have a 45.8 percent (22-of-48) success rate.
- Senior Brad Haynal has thrown out 25of-46 runners trying to steal on him. He has also picked off two runners.
- ◆ Freshman CJ Saylor has caught one of two attempted stolen bases.

HOWSER TROPHY SEMIFINALIST

- San Diego State right-hander Michael Cederoth has been named as one of 35 semifinalists for the 2014 Dick Howser Trophy, presented by Easton Foundations.
- The award, given to the top player in collegiate baseball, is based on two rounds of national voting.
- ◆ In 28 appearances out of the bullpen since starting the season opener at San Jose State, Cederoth has compiled a record of 5-0 along with 19 saves and a 2.08 earned run average.
- ◆ He has recorded 53 strikeouts over 46.2 innings pitched and opponents are hitting .188 against him.
- ◆ Former Aztec pitcher Stephen Strasburg was the winner of the Howser Trophy during the 2009 campaign.

STOPPER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

- ◆ Cederoth is also on the watch list for the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA) Stopper of the Year Award, presented annually to the top relief pitcher in NCAA Division I baseball.
- He follows in the footsteps of former Aztec hurler Addison Reed, who was named the NCBWA Stopper of the Year in 2009.
- Cederoth is a junior from San Diego who attended Steele Canyon High School.

SENIOR DAY

- ◆ Sunday, May 11, was designated as Senior Day for the SDSU baseball team.
- ◆ The Aztecs honored four players who were making their final career appearances at Tony Gwynn Stadium.
- ◆ That quartet included shortstop Evan Potter and second baseman Tim Zier along with pitchers Justin Hepner and TJ Kendzora.

DERBY EARNS NATIONAL HONOR

- ◆ Sophomore right-hander Bubba Derby was named a Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week by *Collegiate Baseball* magazine for his performance in the contest against Air Force on April 4.
- ◆ In that contest Derby struck out a careerhigh 15 batters while allowing one run and scattering three hits with one walk over 8.1 innings in the 5-1 win over the Falcons. His strikeout total was most by an Aztec pitcher since Stephen Strasburg had 17 in a contest during the 2009 season.

- ◆ Several Aztecs rank among the top 10 in the overall Mountain West statistics in various categories.
- ◆ Ty France's .364 batting average is third in the league this week.
- ◆ He is also second in runs scored (48) and on-base percentage (.467). He is fifth in doubles (18) and seventh in RBI (40) while standing fifth in hits (72) and sixth in slugging percentage (.530).
- ◆ Tim Zier's .330 average ranks ninth in the league and he is also seventh in hits (71), eighth in runs scored (39) and tied for sixth in doubles with 14.
- ◆ Greg Allen leads the league with 25 stolen bases.
- ◆ Brad Haynal is second in the conference with 12 home runs, third in RBI with 46 and fourth in slugging percentage at .533. His six sacrifice flies lead the league.
- ◆ Pitcher Mark Seyler is tied for second with eight wins while Bubba Derby is tied for fourth with seven wins.

- ◆ As a team, San Diego State is third in team batting average (.284), third in earned run average (3.81) and first in fielding percentage (.972).

MW PLAYER OF THE WEEK I

- ◆ Junior catcher Brad Haynal earned the Mountain West Conference's Player of the Week award on Feb. 17 for his performance in the season-opening series at San Jose State.
- ◆ He hit for an average of .364 with four hits including a double and home run,

- three runs scored and six RBI.
- ◆ In the series opener, a 6-4 loss to the Spartans, he was 1-for-3 with one run scored and one RBI. In Saturday's 5-3 win, Haynal went 1-for-3 with one run scored, two RBI and a double.
- ◆ Haynal then went 2-for-5 with one run scored, three RBI and a home run in the 13-8 weekend finale victory.

MW PLAYER OF THE WEEK II

- ◆ Sophomore third baseman Ty France was named the Mountain West Player of the Week for games played during the period March 3-9.
- ◆ Over SDSU's four games last week he hit .500 (7-for-14) with a double, home run, six RBI and four runs scored.

MW PLAYER OF THE WEEK III

- ◆ Right fielder Spencer Thornton was named the Mountain West Player of the Week for games play March 10-16.
- ◆ Over four contests that week he hit .533 (8-for-15) with a double, triple, home run, eight RBI and seven runs scored.
- ◆ In the win over Purdue on March 15, he singled and scored SDSU's opening run in the fourth inning. In the next inning, his bases-loaded triple to right broke a 2-2 tie and gave SDSU a 5-2 lead. He added a third hit (single) later in the contest. He scored twice in the game.
- ♦ On March 16 vs. Purdue he had a single, double and home run, driving in a career-high five runs. The home run was the first of his SDSU career.

MW PLAYER OF THE WEEK IV

- ◆ Sophomore outfielder Seby Zavala has earned Mountain West Baseball Player of the Week honors for games played from March 24-30, 2014. He helped San Diego State to a 4-1 week, including series wins against Santa Clara and Fresno State.
- For the week Zavala (West Covina. Calif.; Bishop Amat HS) hit for an average of .412 with seven hits including a double, three runs scored and two RBI over the five-game stretch. His slugging percentage for the week was .471 while he got on base at a .476 clip.

SEYLER HONORED

- ◆ College Sports Madness named sophomore right-hander the Madness Mountain West Baseball Player of the Week on March 31.
- ◆ In the series finale against Fresno State on Mar. 30, Seyler tossed 7.2 innings of shutout ball in the Aztecs' 1-0 win.
- ◆ He scattered three hits and a walk with eight strikeouts, one shy of his career high.

MW PITCHER OF THE WEEK I

- ◆ Sophomore right-hander Mark Seyler made it an Aztec sweep of the conference weekly awards when he was named the Mountain West Pitcher of the Week on March 10.
- ◆ He tossed eight innings of shutout ball in SDSU's 3-0 win over Nevada in San Diego on Mar. 9.
- He allowed only three hits and struck out five as only two Nevada base runners reached as far as second base.
- ♦ In the process Seyler improved to 3-1 and lowered his season ERA to 2.28.

MW PITCHER OF THE WEEK II

- Junior right-hander Michael Cederoth was named the Mountain West Pitcher of the Week for games played during the period of April 14-20.
- ◆ That week Cederoth recorded three saves including a pair against No. 21 UC Irvine on the road.
- ♦ Over his five innings pitched he surrendered four hits, all singles. He allowed only one run, walked three and struck out nine batters with a 1.80 earned run average. Opponents hit just .222 against him for the week.
- ◆ Cederoth's three saves on the week plus one this past Tuesday vs. Cal State Northridge bring his season total to 16, a mark which ties him for first in the nation entering the weekend. It is also the third-highest total ever in a season for an Aztec reliever.

PITCHER OF THE WEEK III

- San Diego State junior right-hander Michael Cederoth has been named the Mountain West Pitcher of the Week for games played from May 5-11.
- ◆ It marked the second such honor of the season for Cederoth (San Diego, Calif./ Steele Canyon HS), who made three appearances out of the bullpen last week recording a win and pair of saves.
- ◆ Over his 6.2 innings pitched for the week, Cederoth had a 0.00 earned run average with six strikeouts and opponents hit just .053 against him.
- ◆ The saves were his 18th and 19th of the season as he is within one of the SDSU single-season record of 20 set by Addison Reed during the 2009 campaign.

STAFF ADDITIONS

- The Aztec baseball program has added a pair of new coaches and a new Director of Baseball Operations for the 2014 season.
- ◆ Taking over as the pitching coach is John Pawlowski, most recently the head coach at Auburn. A former Major League pitcher with the Chicago White Sox, he was also head coach at College of Charleston as well as an assistant at both Clemson and Arizona State.
- ◆ Joe Oliveira takes over as the team's volunteer assistant coach. A three-time all-conference selection as a catcher at University of the Pacific, he played in the Baltimore Orioles organization for three seasons before beginning his coaching career during the summer of 2013 at Battle creek in the Northwoods League.
- ◆ Former Aztec outfielder Landon Burt steps into the role of Director of Baseball Operations for the 2014 season. Burt was an all-Mountain West Conference honoree in 2004 when he batted .321 with six home runs and 30 stolen bases and was drafted by the Minnesota Twins that year.

PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE

- ◆ Junior second baseman Tim Zier and center fielder Greg Allen were tabbed to the Preseason all-Mountain West team in a vote of the league's coaches.
- ◆ Zier is the team's leading returning hitter (.341, 14 2B, 41 RBI, 18 SB).
- ◆ Allen led the Aztecs in runs scored (51), walks (36) and stolen bases (25) while hitting .2999 as a sophomore last season.

AZTECS LEAGUE CO-FAVORITES

- San Diego State is the co-favorite along with New Mexico to finish first in the regular-season Mountain West Conference baseball standings.
- ◆ In a vote of the seven MWC head coaches, the Aztecs received three first-place votes and 43 as did the Lobos. The remaining first-place vote went to ULNV, which was picked third.

AZTEC NOTES

- ◆ San Diego State's overall .972 fielding percentage is the third-best in program history (since 1936). The Aztecs have finished with a fielding mark of .970 or higher in only three previous seasons.
- ◆ Freshman left Brett Seeburger (2-0) recorded his second win of the season in the game vs. Fresno State on May 17 when he went 3.1 innings in relief allowing two runs on three hits with two walks and four strikeouts.
- RHP Cody Thompson has a record of 4-1 with a 1.07 earned run average in games at Tony Gwynn Stadium this season (seven appearances, two starts).
- ◆ Danny Sheehan was pressed into service at shortstop when Evan Potter was hit by pitch in the second inning of last Saturday's contest vs. UNLV and had to leave the game. Sheehan went 1-for-3 in the contest with an RBI and run scored.
- ◆ Freshman Marcus Reyes made his first career start as an Aztec on Tuesday, May 6, at Long Beach State. He tossed five innings allowing two runs on seven hits with no walks and two strikeouts.
- ◆ San Diego State went 10-2 this season in mid-week (Tuesday and Wednesday)
- ◆ The Aztecs have been involved in 17 one-run games and are 14-3 in those contests. They own the top record in one-run contests among all Division I teams who have been involved in at least 15 such games.
- ◆ The two triples (Greg Allen and Seby Zavala) vs. Cal State Northridge on Tuesday (Apr. 22) marked the first time the Aztecs had recorded two three-baggers in a game since Apr. 25, 2010, when Blair Moore and Josh Chasse tripled vs. Wagner at Tony Gwynn Stadium.
- ◆ San Diego State is one of seven teams in the nation with two players who have started over 100 consecutive games together (Greg Allen-163 games and Tim Zier-155 games). In addition, Evan Potter has now started 106 consecutive contests for the Aztecs.
- ◆ The 3-0 win over Nevada (Mar. 9) and 12-0 victory at Cal State Northridge (Mar. 11) marked the first time that SDSU has tossed back-to-back shutouts since 2008 when it blanked Harvard (Mar. 26) and Houston (Mar. 28) at home.
