THE SET-UP

Coming off a pair of disappointing losses, San Diego State (2-3; 0-1 MW) returns home to Qualcomm Stadium for the first of a two-game homestand against Hawai'i (1-3; 0-1 MW) on Saturday afternoon at 5 p.m. PT. Following the game, the annual KGB SkyShow will take place. This marks the ninth consecutive season the fireworks spectacular has taken place following an Aztec game, with the previous eight games averaging a crowd of 51,090. The game will be televised by CBS Sports Network, with radio coverage provided by KOGO 95.7 FM & AM 600.

San Diego State suffered its second consecutive loss, a 52-40 decision at Fresno State last Saturday night. The Aztecs led 14-0 and later rallied from a 13-point deficit to take a 40-36 lead midway through the third quarter. After committing just two turnovers in the last three games combined, the Aztecs were plagued by five turnovers against the Bulldogs, which led to 24 Fresno State points.

Hawai'i suffered its second straight loss, a 47-0 decision at Brigham Young last Friday night. The Warriors are playing their second game in a stretch that has them on the road four times in a five-game period. The lone home contest for UH comes next week against New Mexico.

The Aztecs and Warriors are meeting for the 27th time with San Diego State owning a 15-9-2 series lead. Hawai'i has claimed the last two encounters, both in Honolulu, including a 49-38 decision to end the 2005 campaign. This marks the first appearance by the Warriors in Qualcomm Stadium since 1998, the Aztecs' final season in the Western Athletic Conference. San Diego State won that contest by a 35-13 score.

With a large crowd expected for Saturday's game, fans are encouraged to purchase their tickets early. Tickets are available online at GoAztecs.com, at the SDSU Qualcomm Stadium ticket office or by calling 619-283 SDSU. Tickets start at \$11.

STORYLINES

- San Diego State enters Saturday having dropped two consecutive games and looks to avoid its first three-game losing streak since dropping four straight to end the 2009 campaign. The Aztecs have won their last four games following consecutive losses.
- Saturday marks the annual KGB SkyShow fireworks extravaganza. This marks the ninth consecutive year that the Aztecs will play host to the event in conjunction with a football game, with five of the games ranking among the top nine home crowds in school history. Included among that total is last season's crowd of 57,286 for the Washington State game, the largest regular-season home attendance in school history. Below is a look at the annual SkyShow game attendances.

- In the previous eight SkyShow games, San Diego State has averaged an attendance of 51,090. The Aztecs have posted a 6-2 record in those games and have an average margin of victory in those six games of 25.2 points. The Aztecs have won the last three SkyShow games.
- San Diego State sophomore running back Adam Muema ranks 22nd nationally in rushing yards per game (104.00) and is fourth in the country among sophomores.

OBSCURE NOTES OF THE WEEK

- San Diego State has been at a severe disadvantage in average field position each of the past two weeks. Against San Jose State, San Diego State's average field position was the 18-yard line, while SJSU started on its' own 47-yard line. The 29-yard margin was the worst in San Diego State's 504 games at the Division I level. Last week, SDSU's average field position was the 24-yard line, while Fresno State started on the 36-yard line. The combined average field position of -41 yards the last two weeks is the lowest total in recorded history.
- In Saturday's game at Fresno State, San Diego State led by 14 points and trailed by 13 points. It marked the third time in the Rocky Long era that SDSU has led and trailed by at least 13 points in the same game. SDSU won the other two occurrences - Sept. 17, 2011 vs. Washington State and Oct. 26, 2011 at UNLV. That means three times in Rocky Long's 18 games at San Diego State the team has led and trailed by at least 13 points in the same game. That is something that did not occur for 312 consecutive San Diego State games from Sept. 22, 1979 through Nov. 19, 2005.

PROGRAM TIDBITS

- Entering the games this weekend, San Diego State has compiled the nation's second-highest winning percentage in combined football and men's basketball since the beginning of the 2010-11 academic year. San Diego State is a combined 79-23 (77.5 percent) and trails only Ohio State in the two sports since the beginning of the 2010 football season. See chart below

Combining football, men's basketball and women's basketball records since the beginning of last season, San Diego State owns the seventh-best winning percentage in the country, trailing only Baylor, Stanford, Kentucky, Notre Dame, Brigham Young and Ohio State. - Through 18 games, Rocky Long has a 10-8 record as SDSU's head coach. That is the best 18-game start to a coaching career at San Diego State since Claude Gilbert opened his tenure with a 14-3-1 record in the 1973 and 1974 seasons.
- SDSU opens the 2012 campaign after advancing to bowl games each of the last two seasons (Poinsettia Bowl in 2010 and New Orleans Bowl in 2011). San Diego State has never gone to bowl games in three consecutive years.
- The Aztecs play seven home games in 2012, which ties for the program's highest number since 1976. SDSU concluded a three-game homestand in September, its longest in a decade, against San Jose State.
- Despite serving as an assistant coach at San Diego State for two seasons (2009-10), **Rocky Long** is currently the second-winningest coach in Mountain West history. Long has 72 wins while a member of the league, trailing only TCU's Gary Patterson (77 wins). With TCU no longer in the league, Long needs five victories to tie the record and six to break it. The other nine active coaches in the league entered the season with a combined 75 wins while their teams have been a member of the conference.
- The Aztecs have played 65 student-athletes through five games, with 45 of those seeing action in all five contests. Only 11 seniors saw action in the opening contest at Washington and two of those (quarterback Ryan Katz and wide receiver Brice Butler) were playing in their first game with SDSU. San Diego State started only six seniors against the Huskies and just five seniors against the Army.
- The Aztecs only have five seniors listed as starters on the current depth chart, three on offense (RG **Nike Embernate**, C **Alec Johnson**, QB **Ryan Katz**) and two on defense (CB **Leon McFadden** and CB **Josh Wade**).
- To date, SDSU has had 23 players make their first appearance in a San Diego State game and has had 11 players on the offensive or defensive side of the ball make their first start with the Aztecs.

OFFENSIVE QUICK HITS

- San Diego State returns seven starters on offense from last season's 2011 team that scored 387 points, the second-highest total for an Aztec squad in the last 15 seasons.
- Through five games this season, San Diego State is averaging more points (35.4 in 2012, 29.8 in 2011) and nearly the same total offense (425.2 in 2012 and 427.4 in 2011) as last season.
- SDSU has four offensive players appearing on preseason watch lists for the top player at their position in the country - junior tight end **Gavin Escobar** (John Mackey Award Watch List (TE), Rotary Lombardi Award Watch List (lineman)), senior center **Alec Johnson** (Rimington Trophy Watch List (center)), senior running back **Walter Kazee** (Doak Walker Award Watch List (RB)) and sophomore wide receiver **Colin Lockett** (Biletnikoff Award Watch List (WR)).
- San Diego State has scored 165 points in the last four games combined. It is the second-highest four-game output since midway through the 1996 season (a span of 185 games).
- San Diego State's 165 points is the highest scoring output for an Aztec squad through the first five games of a season since 1996 when Ted Tollner's Aztec squad scored 232 points in the first five contests.
- The 49 points against North Dakota two weeks ago matches the highest single-game total for San Diego State since it scored 52 against Portland State on Sept. 22, 2007.
- The Aztecs produced a pair of 100-yard rushers against North Dakota as sophomore **Adam Muema** (124 yards) and senior **Walter Kazee** (105 yards) each reached the century mark. It is the 15th time in school history that two players rushed for 100 or more yards in the same game and the first time since Oct. 17, 1998. SDSU is 14-1 in those occurrences.
- San Diego State has 16 drives this season of 70 or more yards.
- Although San Diego State looks to replace third-round NFL Draft selection Ronnie Hillman, the Aztecs have quality depth at the position. Sophomore **Adam Muema** rushed for 119 yards and two touchdowns against 10th-ranked Boise State in a game last season. This season, Muema is off and running, with 520 yards, six touchdowns and a 6.8 yards-per-rush average through five games. Also in the backfield is senior **Walter Kazee**. A career 1,000-yard rusher, Kazee's season was cut short in 2011 when he suffered a knee injury at Colorado State. In five games this season, Kazee has 362 rushing yards and five rushing touchdowns, and is averaging 5.7 yards per carry.

- The Aztecs have had just four student-athletes start at quarterback since Nov. 18, 2006. During that 70-game stretch, Kevin O'Connell (15 games during the 2006-07 seasons), Drew Westling (1 game; vs. Air Force on Oct. 11, 2008) and Ryan Lindley (49 games during the 2008-09-10-11 seasons). In the season opener, senior Oregon State transfer **Katz** become the fourth SDSU player to start over the 66-game stretch (now 70 games).
- Although **Katz** made his first appearance at San Diego State in the game at Washington, he comes to The Mesa with a wealth of experience. A native of Santa Monica, Calif., Katz started 14 consecutive games for the Beavers, including all 12 of the 2010 campaign. Among his highlights was a 17-for-24, two-touchdown performance in an upset victory over USC during his sophomore campaign.
- Although we are only through five games, senior quarterback **Katz**' quarterback efficiency rating of 154.71 would rank as the fifth-highest single-season figure in school history if the season ended today.
- **Katz** has been very impressive to date. He is 28th nationally in passing efficiency rating, having completed 65-of-108 passes for 957 yards. He has nine touchdowns and just four interceptions, which came on his second pass attempt in the season-opener against Washington and three times last week at Fresno State. He went 91 passes without throwing an interception until last week.
- Last season, due to graduation and injury, the Aztecs' combined receiving corps ended the campaign with four career catches for 39 yards. That has changed significantly in 12 months as SDSU entered the 2012 campaign with a Biletnikoff Award candidate and preseason all-Mountain West selection in junior **Colin Lockett** (11 catches, 172 yards, two touchdowns), who was a former walk-on who had five or more catches six times last season, including three times in his final four games, in junior **Dylan Denso** (49 catches, 634 yards and 3 TDs in 2011) and highly decorated USC transfer senior **Brice Butler** (seven catches, 115 yards and two touchdowns this season). Making his long-awaited collegiate debut in the opener was **Ezell Ruffin**, who already has eight catches for 183 yards this season. And don't forget the tight end, **Gavin Escobar**, who has a team-high 15 catches for 238 yards and two touchdowns this year.
- The offensive line is anchored by two returning starters - senior center **Alec Johnson** and senior right guard **Nik Embernate**. Joining the two seniors on the offensive line is converted tight end, now left guard junior **Bryce Quigley**, junior left guard **Japheth Gordon** and sophomore right tackle **Zach Dilley**. The only new member of the coaching staff, former SDSU offensive lineman **Mike Schmidt**, leads the unit.
- San Diego State has gone 69 games without suffering a shutout (Nov. 18, 2006 at TCU). That is the only time the Aztecs have been shutout in their last 164 games.

DEFENSIVE QUICK HITS

- SDSU returns six starters off a squad that has continually gotten better under the direction of second-year head coach Rocky Long, who is in his fourth season as the defensive coordinator. Statistically one of the nation's worst units less than five years ago, Long has transitioned the San Diego State defense into one of the most feared units on the West Coast. Below is a look at the progress made under Long's direction.

- In the 20 drives prior to the North Dakota game, San Diego State's defense allowed a total of seven points. At one point, the Aztecs went 16 drives (last seven of the Washington game and first nine of the Army game) without allowing an offensive point.
- SDSU is led on defense by Mountain West preseason defensive player of the year, senior cornerback **Leon McFadden**. McFadden is on the preseason watch list for the Bronko Nagurski Trophy (best defensive player) and the Jim Thorpe Award (DB). McFadden, who has been a first-team all-Mountain West selection the past two seasons, is looking to become the school's fourth three-time first-team all-league selection, joining Marshall Faulk, Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila and Kirk Morrison.
- Plenty of other defensive players received preseason attention from at least one publication. Junior Aztec back **Nat Berhe** and sophomore linebacker **Jake Fely** were among the players getting attention. Berhe is the top retuning tackler of the 2011 squad, and has a team-high 37 stops this season.
- **McFadden** has recorded an interception in each of the last three games and eight career picks.
- SDSU has forced a turnover in 11 straight games, including three or more seven times in the last 17 games.
- San Diego State has allowed a total of 709 yards rushing in its last seven games combined (101.3). The Aztec defense has held its opponent to 100 yards or less on the ground in five of the last 11 games.
- In the opener at Washington, the SDSU defense allowed just 14 points (the Huskies had a fumble return for touchdown) and 328 yards of total offense against one of the most potent offensive attacks in the country. In 2011, Washington averaged 33.38 points to rank 25th nationally and 409.85 yards (38th

in the nation).

- The Huskies scored 21 points off three drives that accumulated a total of 97 yards of offense.
- The Aztecs held Washington without a point on its final seven possessions of the game. That is something that no team did against the Huskies in 2011.
- Against Army, SDSU held the Black Knights scoreless until there was 5:54 left in the third quarter.
- San Diego State held Army well below its 2011 season averages in rushing yards (282 allowed, 346.50 average in 2011) and total yards (332 allowed, 396.92 average in 2011).
- Against North Dakota, the Leon McFadden intercepted a pass on UND's first offensive play of the game and took it 28 yards for the touchdown. It was the Aztecs' first defensive touchdown since Nov. 13, 2012, at No. 3 TCU and their first interception return for a score since Luke Laolagi returned one 55 yards at UNLV on Nov. 28, 2009.
- At Fresno State, both Eric Pinkins and Leon McFadden intercepted a pass for a touchdown. The Aztecs now have two interceptions returned for a touchdown in the past three games. They had gone 28 games in between without returning an interception for a touchdown. McFadden became just the second player in program history with two interception returns for a touchdown in a season (also Tory Nixon in 1984).

SDSU VS. HAWAI'I

- Saturday is the 27th meeting between the schools with SDSU owning a 15-9-2 advantage. The Warriors won the last two meetings and the only two encounters that have taken place since the Aztecs left the Western Athletic Conference prior to the 1999 season. Hawai'i claimed a 41-40 decision in 2002 and a 49-38 victory in 2005 with both games taking place in Aloha Stadium.
- San Diego State owns a 7-3 series lead in games played in San Diego, including a 6-2 record at Qualcomm/Jack Murphy/San Diego Stadium. The Aztecs have won five straight home games in the series dating back to a 32-30 loss to Hawai'i on Oct. 15, 1988. Those five wins have been by a total margin of 115 points (23.0 ppg).
- The Aztecs had won the previous nine contests before the 2002 setback and currently have won nine of the last 11 outings. SDSU has won six of the last eight meetings in Honolulu and are 8-5-2 all-time in the Aloha State.
- SDSU met Hawai'i 19 straight years from 1980-1998 when the Aztecs were still in the WAC. In WAC play, the Aztecs owned a 12-5-2 record and was 6-2 in San Diego during their WAC years.
- Since 1990, the Aztecs are 9-2 against the Warriors and have outscored them by a 454-248 (41.3-22.5) margin.

SDSU VS. HAWAI'I: CONNECTIONS

- Warrior head coach Norm Chow, offensive coordinator Tommy Lee and Aztec offensive coordinator Andy Ludwig all served on the coaching staff at the University of Utah, although not at the same time. Chow was the 2001 offensive coordinator and tight ends coach, while Ludwig followed as the offensive coordinator from 2005-08. Ludwig also served as the defensive graduate assistant in 1992. Lee was the quarterbacks coach from 1995-97 and the offensive coordinator from 1998-2000. Warrior defensive line coach Lewis Powell also served at Utah as a graduate assistant from 2009-10. Powell as well as Warrior tight ends coach Phillip Rauscher both were administrative assistants in 2011. Warrior running backs coach Keith Uperesa was the offensive line and tight ends coach at Utah in 2004.
- Warrior offensive coordinator Tommy Lee (1984-85: offensive coordinator) and Aztec offensive coordinator Andy Ludwig (1987-88: receivers) both coached at Portland State.
- Warrior defensive coordinator Thom Kaumeyer was the San Diego State defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach from 2002-06. He was the defensive coordinator at SDSU in the previous two games against Hawai'i in 2002 and 2005.
- Aztec offensive coordinator Andy Ludwig and Warrior running backs coach Keith Uperesa both were a part of the Idaho State coaching staff. Ludwig was the quarterbacks and receivers coach from 1989-91 and Uperesa served as the assistant head coach and offensive coordinator from 1999-2000.

SDSU VS. HAWAI'I - Last Meeting

Hawai'i 49, San Diego State 38 | Dec. 3, 2005 | Aloha Stadium | Honolulu, Hawaii

HONOLULU - Hawai'i used a 21-point outburst in the final minutes of the first half to defeat visiting San Diego State, 49-38, in both teams' season finales. The game featured a combined 1,100 yards of total offense between the two schools.

After a 7-7 first quarter, the Aztecs built a 14-point lead on a two-yard touchdown toss from Kevin O'Connell to Jeff Webb and a 14-yard O'Connell TD run to make it 21-7.

The Warriors answered back in a flurry, notching three touchdowns in the final 2:50 of the first half, including two scores in 13 seconds, to take a 28-21 lead at the break. Hawai'i's last two TDs came with the help of two SDSU turnovers, including an interception at the Hawai'i goal line and a fumble at its own 17 with under a minute remaining.

The Warriors padded their advantage by outscoring the Aztecs 14-3 in the third quarter. SDSU had two TDs in the fourth quarter, but couldn't get any closer, eventually falling, 49-38.

O'Connell finished with career numbers in the passing game, completing 33 of his 51 attempts for 421 yards to become the first Aztec signal caller to throw for over 400 yards since 2002.

LAST TIME OUT: FRESNO STATE 52, SAN DIEGO STATE 40

■ Sept. 29, 2012 | Bulldog Stadium | Fresno, Calif.

SAN DIEGO -- Derek Carr threw for a career-high 536 yards and five touchdowns to lead Fresno State over San Diego State in the Mountain West opener for both teams at Bulldog Stadium.

It was a back and forth game as the Aztecs led by as many as 14 in the first quarter and trailed by as many as 13 in the second quarter. SDSU took its final lead at 40-36 early in the second half when Leon McFadden returned an interception 96 yards for a touchdown. It was his third straight game with an interception and second interception return for a touchdown in three contests.

Carr, however, hit Isaiah Burse with a 31-yard touchdown pass and, following a 27-yard field goal by Quentin Breshears, tossed a 5-yard TD to Rashad Evans to give the Bulldogs a win in their first-ever Mountain West game.

Ryan Katz passed for 160 yards and two touchdowns for San Diego State and led all rushers with 89 yards on 13 carries, including a career-long 67-yard run.

Adam Muema rushed for 64 yards and scored two touchdowns, while Brice Butler (8 yards) and D.J. Shields (5 yards) each caught a touchdown pass.

Eric Pinkins scored on a 32-yard interception return for a touchdown, giving the Aztecs three in the past three contests after not having one the previous 28 games.

AZTEC OFFENSE

■ **SCORING:** Through the first five games, San Diego State ranks 39th in scoring offense (35.40) and 49th in total offense (425.20)... Despite losing five starters off last season's team that accounted for 144 career starts, including NFL Draft picks Ryan Lindley and Ronnie Hillman, San Diego State is averaging more points this season than last (see note below)... San Diego State has scored 165 points in its last four games, its second-highest four-game total since midway through the 1996 season (a span of 185 games)... SDSU has 177 points through the first five games of the season, the highest output to open a campaign since the 1996 squad had 232 points through five games... The Aztecs scored 49 points against North Dakota, matching their highest total since scoring 52 against Portland State on Sept. 22, 2007... The Aztecs have scored 30 or more points in eight of the last nine games dating back to last season... San Diego State has 400 or more yards of total offense in nine of its last 13 games dating back to last season... The Aztecs have committed two turnovers or less in 30 of their last 39 games... SDSU did not have a turnover in two of its last four games and has played turnover-free football in four of its last seven contests... The Aztecs have one turnover or less in nine of the last 13 games... SDSU already has 16 drives of 70 or more yards this season... San Diego State is 20-for-26 (76.9 percent) in converting third- or fourth-down situations of three yards or less this season.

■ **OFFENSIVE RUSHING:** The Aztecs rank 16th nationally in rushing offense (233.80), 18th in rushing yards per carry (5.34), 21st in rushing touchdowns (12)... San Diego State has rushed for 970 yards in the last four games (242.50 rypg) and has rushed for 179 yards or more in all five games this season... San Diego State's rushing total through five games is 1,169 yards, that is the highest five-game total since the 1998 campaign (Oct. 3-Oct. 29, 1998) when the Aztecs rushed for a total of 1,120 yards against Tulsa, Hawai'i, New Mexico, Utah and Brigham Young... Since the beginning of the 2010 season (last 31 games), the Aztecs have 69 rushing touchdowns... SDSU has at least one rushing touchdown in 13 consecutive games (dating back to the Oct. 8, 2011 contest against TCU) and has 11 rushing touchdowns in the last five games... That is the longest stretch of consecutive games with a rushing touchdown since a 19-game stretch from Nov. 25, 1989 through Oct. 12, 1991... Earlier this season against North Dakota, for the 15th time in school history, San Diego State had two players rush for 100 or more yards... Adam Muema and Walter Kazee each reached the century figure marking the first time that had happened since Oct. 17, 1998, when Jonas Lewis and Larry Ned did it... The Aztecs are 14-1 when multiple backs rush for 100 yards... San Diego State running backs carried 20 times in the contest against Washington and did not have a carry that resulted in negative yardage.

■ **OFFENSIVE PASSING:** The Aztecs rank 101st nationally in passing offense (191.40) and 30th in pass efficiency (150.57)... San Diego State had just one interception in its first four games this season and went three straight contests without throwing a pick... Ryan Katz threw 91 consecutive passes without throwing an interception, a streak that was snapped in the first quarter of the game at Fresno State... That was the first time the Aztecs have gone three consecutive games without an interception in the same season since the 2005 season... Against North Dakota, Ryan Katz produced the seventh-highest single-game passing efficiency rating in school history at 228.58... That marked two consecutive weeks in which SDSU has had a passing efficiency rating above 168... That is the first time that has occurred since the final two games of the 2010 campaign... Two of the three highest passing efficiency games of the Rocky Long-Andy Ludwig era have come in the past four weeks... During the last 20 games, San Diego State has 38 touchdowns through the air with 11 interceptions... The Aztecs have four interceptions in the past seven games combined.

MUEMA MAKING HIS IMPACT FELT

- Sophomore Adam Muema is making his presence felt in his second season on the field. A native of Covina, Calif., Muema burst onto the scene last season when he rushed for 119 yards and two touchdowns against 10th-ranked Boise State.
- Muema ranks 22nd nationally in rushing yards per game and is fourth among all FBS sophomores.
- Muema posted consecutive 100-yard rushing games earlier this season with a 13-carry, 124-yard and one-touchdown effort vs. North Dakota. He averaged 9.5 yards per rush in that contest.
- He followed that up with a career-high 202-yard effort on 25 carries and a touchdown against San Jose State. He averaged 8.1 yards per rush against the Spartans.
- Muema has three career 100-yard rushing games.
- Dating back to last season, Muema has a rushing touchdown in six consecutive games. He has nine rushing touchdowns in his last nine games.
- He already has 267 more yards rushing this season (520), than he did in six games last season (253).

KAZEE CLIMBING CHARTS

- San Diego State running back Walter Kazez has enjoyed a stellar start to his senior campaign. After suffering a season-ending knee injury in the ninth game last season, Kazez has proven that he is fully recovered by rushing for 362 yards on just 64 carries through the first five games. He has five rushing touchdowns this season and is averaging 5.7 yards per rush.
- After posting a team-high 86 yards rushing in the opener at Washington, Kazez logged 51 yards on just seven carries against Army. He also rushed for two touchdowns against the Black Knights. He followed that up with his third career 100-yard rushing effort, with 105 yards and two touchdowns in the victory over North Dakota. Against San Jose State, Kazez rushed for 90 yards and one touchdown on 17 carries.
- Kazez has a rushing touchdown in three of his last four games and five rushing touchdowns in the last four outings.
- Kazez now has nine rushing touchdowns in his last seven games. He has those nine TDs in his last 86 carries.
- Kazez has rushed for at least an average of 5.3 yards in four of five games this season.
- He has three of his five highest rushing total games and has posted two of his three highest per average rushing games this season (see below).

KATZ ESTABLISHING HIMSELF AS ONE OF THE TOP QBs IN WEST

- Senior transfer Ryan Katz is making the most of his one season on The Mesa. After transferring from Oregon State prior to the 2012 spring semester, Katz was named the starter following the first week of fall camp.
- A dual-threat quarterback, he has made the most of his opportunities in the first five games.
- Earlier this season, he guided San Diego State to consecutive games with at least 42 points for the first time since 1996. Senior Billy Blanton was in his third season as a starter the last time that occurred.
- Katz posted a career-high three-touchdown performance in which he was 11-of-18 for 241 yards with no interceptions against North Dakota. He recorded a passing efficiency rating of 228.58, which is the seventh-highest in school history.
- Last week at Fresno State, Katz rushed for a career-high 89 yards.
- His nine touchdown passes this season have been thrown to six different receivers. He has a pass completion to 12 different receivers through the first four games of this season.
- He had a streak of 91 consecutive pass attempts without an interception earlier this season and went three straight games without throwing a pick.
- Katz enters this week's game ranked 28th in passing efficiency in the nation and third in the Mountain West Conference at 154.71. If the season ended today that would be the fifth-highest passer rating in school history, and highest since Billy Blanton's school-record of 169.6 set in 1996.
- Katz has three 200-yard passing games in his last four outings.

ESCOBAR MAKING CASE AS NATION'S TOP TIGHT END

- Tight end Gavin Escobar has opened his junior year with impressive numbers, justifying his preseason selection on the John Mackey Award (top tight end) and Rotary Lombardi (top lineman) Watch Lists.
- Through five games, Escobar leads the team in receptions (15), receiving yards (238) and is tied for the team lead in receiving touchdowns (two).
- He posted his third career 100-yard receiving game against North Dakota, catching five passes for 117 yards and a touchdown.
- Escobar now has a reception in 12 straight games and has 100 yards or more receiving in three of his last nine games.
- In his last 10 games, Escobar has 41 catches for 677 yards and four touchdowns.
- He is five catches shy of 100 receptions for his career and needs six catches to move into the SDSU top-25 career reception chart.

AZTEC DEFENSE

- OVERALL:** San Diego State ranks 91st nationally in scoring defense (31.80) and 84th in total defense (434.20)... Prior to the game against North Dakota, the Aztecs had allowed seven points in the last 20 opponent drives... SDSU went 16 drives (the last seven of the Washington game and the first nine of the Army game) without allowing a point... The San Diego State defense got stronger as the game progressed at Washington... After allowing two touchdowns on the first two Husky possessions, the Aztecs did not allow a point on the final seven UW drives... In no game last season did UW go seven consecutive possessions without a point... Of Washington's 328 yards of total offense, 97 came on its first two possessions... The Huskies' 21 points (including a fumble return for a touchdown) came on a total of 97 yards of offense... San Jose State's first 17 points came on 24 yards of total offense... San Diego State has returned three interceptions for touchdowns this season, that ranks second nationally behind Fresno State (4) and tied with Oregon and Purdue.
- RUSH DEFENSE:** San Diego State is 43rd nationally in rushing yards per game (127.80)... The Aztecs held Washington to 3.4 yards per rush, Army to 4.5 yards per rush, North Dakota to 2.0 yards per rush, San Jose State to 3.3 yards per rush and Fresno State to 4.0 yards per rush... Opponents are averaging 3.7 yards per carry through the first five games this season... The Aztecs have allowed only five rushing touchdowns this season, that is the 38th-lowest total in the country... San Diego State has 35 tackles for loss this season from 16 different players... At 7.00 tackles for loss per game, the Aztecs rank 28th nationally in the category.
- PASS DEFENSE:** San Diego State is 109th nationally in pass defense (306.40) and 111th in pass efficiency defense (154.90)... The Aztecs intercepted two of Army's nine pass attempts and picked off a pass against North Dakota, San Jose State and a pair passes at Fresno State... With six interceptions this season, the Aztecs rank 26th nationally in the category... The Black Knights' passing efficiency of

35.56 was the lowest for an San Diego State opponent since Nov. 29, 1986 against Brigham Young... The Aztecs had three sacks and three PBU in the season-opening game against Washington... Leon McFadden has an interception in three straight games and returned an interception for a touchdown against North Dakota, the program's first defensive touchdown since Nov. 13, 2010, at No. 3 TCU, and the first interception return for a score since Nov. 28, 2009 at UNLV... McFadden has returned two picks for scores this season... He is one of just two players in the country to have accomplished that.

McFADDEN CONTINUES SUCCESS AT CORNERBACK

- Senior cornerback Leon McFadden is on the Bronko Nagurski Trophy Watch List (Best Defensive Player) and the Jim Thorpe Award Watch List (Best Defensive Back).
- McFadden was also named the Mountain West Preseason Defensive Player of the Year, the first Aztec to earn that honor (offense, defense or special teams).
- He is looking to become the fifth player in school history to earn first-team all-conference honors in three consecutive years.
- He is also looking to lead the league in passes defended (PBU + INT) for the third straight year.
- Has played in every single game at SDSU since arriving in 2009 as a true freshmen.
- Ranks fifth in school history with 33 pass breakups and sixth with 186 interception yards.
- Is just the second Aztec with two interceptions returned for a touchdown in a season (also Tory Nixon in 1986).
- His two career interceptions for a touchdown trail only Ricky Parker's three from 1993-96.
- Leads the Mountain West and is tied for 13th in the nation with 1.80 passes defended per game (9 total).
- Is tied for second in the Mountain West and tied for 15th in the country with 0.60 interceptions per game (3 total).
- Had a career-high eight tackles in the opener at Washington.
- Returned an interception 28 yards for a touchdown against North Dakota in its first pass attempt.
- Had an interception, tied a career high with three PBUs and a tackle against San Jose State.
- Returned an interception 96 yards for a touchdown at Fresno State. It was tied for the sixth longest in program history and the longest since 1986. It was his third interception in three games and eighth of his career. Also had five tackles and a PBU.

LONG HAS BEST DEBUT SEASON IN PROGRAM HISTORY

- Rocky Long, the school's 18th head coach, became the first San Diego State coach to lead the team to a bowl game in his inaugural season.
- Long is 10-8 in his first 18 games at San Diego State. He has produced the best 18-game coaching record since Claude Gilbert opened his tenure with a 14-3-1 record. Long's win total through 18 games is two higher than his predecessor, Brady Hoke (8-10).
- Rocky Long posted an 8-5 record in his first season as head coach of the Aztecs. That is the highest victory total in a SDSU head coaching debut season since Denny Stolz finished 8-4 in his first year in 1986.
- With eight first-year wins, Rocky Long had one more coaching victory in his inaugural season than the previous two San Diego State coaches combined (Brady Hoke went 4-8 in 2009 and Chuck Long was 3-9 in 2006).
- Last season marked the third time in Rocky Long's head coaching career that his team won at least eight games (also 2007 and 2003). His squads have won six or more games in eight of his last nine seasons as a head coach.
- Last year, Long helped guide the Aztecs to their first 3-0 start in 30 years, ended the program's 19-game losing streak to Pac-10/12 foes, snapped SDSU's 23-game losing streak to automatic qualifying BCS teams and gave the program its first win in the Eastern time zone since 1972, all in the opening month of the season.
- San Diego State finished the 2011 season above .500 for only the second time in the last 13 seasons.
- The Aztecs won eight games in a campaign for just the second time in the last 15 seasons.
- Long has 72 victories while coaching teams in the Mountain West. That is the second-highest total in the history of the conference.

SDSU FOOTBALL ACCEPTS INVITE TO JOIN THE BIG EAST

■ The BIG EAST Conference announced in December 2011 that San Diego State University has accepted an invitation to join the league in the sport of football beginning with the 2013-14 academic year.

SDSU joins Boise State, Houston, Southern Methodist and Central Florida as the newest members of the league. The aforementioned five will join a football league that also consists of Cincinnati, Connecticut, Louisville, Rutgers and South Florida.

"I am extremely excited about our prospects for joining the BIG EAST in football," San Diego State University President Dr. Elliot Hirshman said. "This new conference affiliation will provide extraordinary opportunities for our student-athletes, our coaches and staff, our alumni and supporters and the entire University."

"This is a very important day in the history of the San Diego State athletic department," SDSU Athletic Director Jim Sterk said. "This affiliation with the BIG EAST Conference allows us to compete at the highest level in college football. This will give the athletic department and University attention on a national stage that we have not had before."

The BIG EAST is one of six conferences with an automatic berth to one of five Bowl Championship Series (BCS) games. The BCS includes the Rose Bowl Game, Tostitos Fiesta Bowl, Allstate Sugar Bowl, Discover Orange Bowl and the Allstate BCS National Championship Game.

In addition to the BCS automatic berth, the BIG EAST has tie-ins to the Champs Sports Bowl (Orlando, Fla.), Belk Bowl (Charlotte, N.C.), New Era Pinstripe Bowl (Bronx, N.Y.), BBVA Compass Bowl (Birmingham, Ala.), AutoZone Liberty Bowl (Memphis, Tenn.) and Beef 'O' Brady's Bowl St. Petersburg (St. Petersburg, Fla.).

The move to the BIG EAST provides San Diego State's football program with national television exposure through ABC, ESPN, BIG EAST Network, SportsNet New York (SNY) and the BIG EAST/IMG Sports National Radio Network.

San Diego State, which led the Mountain West in average home attendance this season (39,865), has a storied football tradition having won 18 conference championships and participated in nine bowl games, including last season's Poinsettia Bowl, which resulted in a 35-14 victory over Navy. A year after posting a 9-4 record, the Aztecs finished the 2011 season with an 8-4 mark and recently accepted an invitation to the R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl where they will face Louisiana-Lafayette on Dec. 17. The back-to-back bowl appearances mark the first time San Diego State has accomplished that feat in its Division I history.

Individually, SDSU has produced 144 NFL draft picks, including 52 top-100 selections, and 104 All-Americans, including 19 first-teamers. In 2011 alone, San Diego State had the nation's third-leading rusher and had seven all-conference first-team picks, two second-teamers and one honorable mention choice.

NAT BERHE EARNS MOUNTAIN WEST DEFENSIVE POW HONORS

■ San Diego State junior football player Nat Berhe has been named the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Week, for his efforts in the Aztecs' victory over Army on Sept. 8. It is the second career weekly honor for the Colton, Calif., native.

■ Berhe, a defensive back, had a career-high 14 tackles, including 10 solo stops, to lead SDSU to a 42-7 victory over Army on Saturday. He also had one tackle for a loss and a pass breakup while anchoring a defense that forced three turnovers and limited the Black Knights to just 50 yards passing.

■ Berhe and the San Diego State defense held Army without an offensive score for its first nine possessions of the game before a Black Knight scored with 5:54 left to play in the third quarter. The touchdown snapped the Aztecs' streak of not allowing an offensive score at 16 possessions (also last seven at Washington), which was a total of 86:41 of clock time.

■ Berhe's 14 tackles were the second most in a game in the MW this season and tied for 16th nationally, while his 10 solo stops lead the conference and tie for the third-best performance among all FBS players.

■ In five games this year, Berhe leads SDSU with 37 tackles, including 25 solo stops, 2.0 TFL, two pass breakups and a fumble recovery.

FIVE AZTECS ON WATCH LISTS

■ San Diego State has placed five student-athletes on preseason national award watch lists in 2012. Junior tight end Gavin Escobar, senior center Alec Johnson, senior running back Walter Kazez, junior Colin Lockett and senior Leon McFadden are on the initial short list for their positions' top honors.

Escobar (Rancho Santa Margarita, Calif.) is one of 33 players on the John Mackey Award Watch List (most outstanding tight end) and one of 145 on the Rotary Lombardi Award Watch List (top lineman). Last season, the Rancho Santa Margarita, Calif., native reeled in 51 catches for 780 yards and seven touchdowns. His 51 receptions and 780 receiving yards were the second most by a tight end in school history. Escobar averaged 60.00 receiving yards per game, which were the third most in the country among tight ends. He ended up earning all-Mountain West honors for the second consecutive season (first team in 2011, second team in 2010). Escobar is on the preseason all-conference team for this year. This season, Escobar leads the Aztecs with 15 catches and 238 receiving yards.

Johnson (Denver, Colo.) is one of 51 players on the Rimington Trophy Award Watch List (best center). Johnson, one of SDSU's two returning starters on the offensive line, enters the 2012 campaign having made 29 career starts and is slated to start at center for the second consecutive year. Last season, Johnson never missed a game despite breaking his snapping hand (right) in the Aztecs' season opener. The MW academic all-conference honoree also helped SDSU rush for nearly 2,400 yards as well as finish among the nation's leaders in fewest sacks allowed (T-7th, 0.85 per game) and in fewest tackles for a loss allowed (15th, 4.46 per game).

Kazez (San Bernardino, Calif.) is one of 52 candidates on the Doak Walker Award Watch List (top running back). Last year, Kazez rushed for 339 yards and four touchdowns on 74 carries (4.6 yards per rush) before a knee injury in the ninth game sidelined him for the rest of the season. Kazez also caught eight passes for 89 yards. For his career, Kazez has 1,392 rushing yards and 14 touchdowns on 278 rushes (4.8 yards per carry). Additionally, Kazez has 195 yards receiving on 21 catches. This year, Kazez has 362 yards on just 64 carries (5.7 yards per carry) to go along with a career-high five rushing touchdowns.

Lockett (Diamond Bar, Calif.) is one of 48 athletes on the Biletnikoff Award Watch List (most outstanding wide receiver). Lockett led SDSU in receiving last year with 970 yards and his 74.6 receiving yards per game ranked fourth in the conference. Lockett also tallied 678 yards on special teams in 2010, including a 94-yard kickoff return touchdown in the season opener against Cal Poly. He's also on the 2012 preseason all-conference team. Lockett has 11 catches this season for 172 yards and two touchdowns. He also has 19 kickoff returns for 458 yards (24.1 average per kickoff return), including a career-long 96-yard return for a touchdown vs. Army.

McFadden (Inglewood, Calif.) is one of 84 players on the Bronco Nagurski Trophy Award Watch List (best defensive player) and one of 35 on the Jim Thorpe Award Watch List (best defensive back). McFadden, who became the first San Diego State player to be named a preseason player of the year (offense, defense or special teams) in July, is looking to become the fifth Aztec in program history to earn first-team all-conference honors in three consecutive years. Last year, McFadden led the league in passes defended (17), while recording 46 tackles (35 solo), two interceptions and a sack. This year, McFadden has recorded 24 tackles, six pass breakups, three interceptions and two interceptions returned for a score.

SDSU TABBED TO FINISH FIFTH BY LEAGUE MEDIA

■ The San Diego State football team is picked to finish fifth in the Mountain West preseason poll, which was released on July 24. The Aztecs had 173 points in the 2012 preseason poll, which is voted on by media representatives who cover the conference.

The fifth-place projection is SDSU's second highest in the last eight years. Last season, San Diego State was selected fourth and finished fourth. It marked the sixth time in the last seven years that the Aztecs finished at or higher than their projected finish. SDSU also picked up one of the 30 first-place votes, a first in its 14-year history of the MW.

Boise State was picked to win the league with 296 points, including 27 first-place votes. Only 74 points separated the second-place team (Nevada, 244 points) and the sixth-place team (Air Force, 170 points). Fresno State was third with 231 points and two first-place votes, while Wyoming (213 points) and SDSU (173 points) rounded out the top five at fourth and fifth, respectively.

MCFADDEN NAMED MW PRESEASON DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

■ San Diego State defensive back Leon McFadden has been selected as the Mountain West Preseason Defensive Player of the Year, the league announced in July. McFadden was joined on the preseason all-conference team by tight end Gavin Escobar and wide receiver Colin Lockett.

McFadden became the first San Diego State player to be named a preseason player of the year (offense, defense or special teams). McFadden, who is looking to become the fifth Aztec in program history to earn first-team all-conference honors in three consecutive years, is on the preseason watch list for the Nagurski Award (top defensive player) and the Thorpe Award (top defensive back). He's also the third player in the last 11 years (also Kirk Morrison and Lynell Hamilton) to be named to the preseason all-conference team for a second time. The Inglewood, Calif., native led the league in passes defended (17) last year, while recording 46 tackles (35 solo), two interceptions and a sack.

Escobar, who is on the preseason watch list for the Lombardi Award (top lineman) and the Mackey Award (top tight end), had 51 catches a year ago for 780 yards and seven touchdowns. His 60.00 receiving yards per game in 2011 were the third most in the nation among tight ends. The Rancho Santa Margarita, Calif., native was an honorable mention All-American last year by Sports Illustrated after earning freshman All-America accolades by Sporting News in 2010.

A member of the Biletnikoff Award Watch List (most outstanding wide receiver), Lockett led SDSU in receiving last year with 970 yards. Lockett, who also had 58 catches and eight touchdowns, averaged 74.6 receiving yards per game, which ranked fourth in the conference. Lockett also tallied 678 yards on special teams in 2011, including a 94-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in the season-opener against Cal Poly.

SDSU ANNOUNCES TEAM CAPTAINS

■ San Diego State head coach Rocky Long announced that seniors Leon McFadden, Walter Kazee and Dominique Sandifer have been named football team captains for the upcoming 2012 season. This year, the special teams captain will be selected on a week-by-week basis.

McFadden, a senior defensive back from Inglewood, Calif., has played in 42 games in his three-plus seasons as an Aztec. McFadden had a solid season last year recording 46 tackles in 13 contests, had two interceptions and averaged almost six yards per carry on punt returns. McFadden ranked No. 1 in the Mountain West for the second consecutive year and 12th nationally in passes defended with 17, including six more breakups than any other player in the league. He enters 2012 as the preseason Mountain West defensive player of the year.

Kazee, a senior running back from San Bernardino, Calif., has tallied 1,392 total yards in his 35-game career at SDSU. Kazee had one of his best seasons last year in becoming SDSU's second-leading rusher with 339 yards on 74 carries and four scores. He was also effective in the passing game as he tallied eight catches for 89 yards (11.1 ypc).

Sandifer, a senior wide receiver from Gardena, Calif., is a two-year letterwinner who had his 2011 season derailed by injury. Prior to his setback, he played in 23 straight games from 2009-2010 in 2010 and was part of the 2010 Poinsettia Bowl team. He is one of two senior wide receivers, but the only one to have worn a SDSU uniform. In his first two seasons, he tallied 561 yards, averaging 11.5 yards per reception.

- In his final nine seasons in Albuquerque, Long's defensive units ranked among the top 30 in fewest yards allowed six times and among the top 40 against the rush every year. In both 2001 and 2003, New Mexico's defense ranked fifth nationally in fewest rushing yards allowed per game.
- While at New Mexico, he coached 13 players selected in the NFL Draft, 10 players who earned All-America honors and had a MWC-high 34 first-team all-conference selections since 2003.

OTHER COACHING EXPERIENCE

- Prior to accepting the head coaching position at New Mexico, Long served as defensive coordinator for 12 seasons at three different schools. He was the defensive coordinator for two years under Bob Toledo at UCLA in 1996-97, for five seasons at Oregon State from 1991-95, and for five campaigns at Wyoming from 1981-85.

Hannah, meanwhile, is the head women's basketball coach at Texas Lutheran, an NCAA Division III school in the American Southwest Conference. Hannah is the head volleyball coach at Southwestern University, an NCAA Division III school Georgetown, Texas. She is a four-time conference coach of the year and this past season led the Pirates to the NCAA regional semifinals and a 30-4 overall record.

SEATTLE -- San Diego State was unable to overcome an early deficit and three turnovers in a 21-12 loss at Washington in the 2012 season opener for both teams.

The Aztecs threw an interception on their first drive and punted on a three and out on their second, and the Huskies took advantage with touchdowns on both possessions.

UW, which took over on the SDSU 35 after the interception, got in the end zone on a two-yard run by Bishop Sankey.

Quarterback Keith Price drove Washington 62 yards on the team's next drive, culminating in a 8-yard pass to Kasen Williams.

After the slow start, the San Diego State defense stood tall the rest of the way, limiting the Huskies to 231 yards and no points on their final seven drives.

The Aztecs got on the scoreboard on the first play of the second quarter when quarterback Ryan Katz found a wide-open Tim Vizzi on the left side, who ran 47 yards for the touchdown. SDSU, however, failed on the 2-point conversion.

Early in the third quarter, UW safety Will Shamburger returned a fumble 44 yards to give the home team the 21-6 advantage.

Adam Muema completed an 11-play, 71-yard drive in the fourth when he pounded it in on a 4th and 1. But once again, San Diego State was unable to convert the 2-point conversion and trailing, 21-12.

After forcing Washington to punt, the Aztecs tried to mount another scoring drive. They went 76 yards, highlighted by a 26-yard run by Walter Kazee and a 32-yard pass from Katz to Colin Lockett. SDSU got to the Huskies' 8-yard line on third down, but missed on consecutive pass attempts, giving the ball back to UW.

Washington ran most of the 4:44 left on the clock and San Diego State's last-ditch effort fell short in the 21-12 setback. It was the Aztecs' first season-opening loss since 2009.

Kazee, who missed the end of last year with a knee injury, ran for a game-high 86 yards on nine carries, his highest total since the first game of the 2009 season and the first game of his career.

Katz added a career-high 77 yards on the ground and passed for another 128. Lockett led all Aztecs with four catches and 48 yards in the loss.

SDSU had multiple turnovers for only the second time in its last nine games, dating back to last year. San Diego State finished the 2011 season with just one turnover over its final three games.

SAN DIEGO (AP) --Ryan Katz threw for 241 yards and three touchdowns as San Diego State outlasted North Dakota 49-41 on Saturday night.

Adam Muema rushed for 124 yards and Walter Kazee added 105 for the Aztecs (2-1).

Marcus Hendrickson connected on 27 of 50 passes for 434 yards and four TDs for North Dakota (2-1). Three TDs went to Greg Hardin, who had eight receptions for 142 yards.

Hendrickson's 15-yard scoring pass in to Tyrhe Ivery brought North Dakota within 49-41 with 6:17 remaining. UND got the ball back with 1:52 left, but came up a half-yard short on a fourth down pass play at its 38-yard line, and San Diego State ran out the clock.

Katz completed 8 of 11 passes for 195 yards in the first half, throwing TD strikes to Brice Butler (44 yards), Colin Lockett (37 yards) and Gavin Escobar (20 yards) as the Aztecs built a 35-20 halftime lead.

Escobar finished with five receptions for 117 yards.

The temperature at kickoff was 97 degrees, the hottest for a San Diego State home game since Sept. 8, 1984, when it was 93 for a contest against UCLA.

Behind quarterback David Fales, the Spartans rallied with a 5-play, 65-yard drive that culminated with a 14-yard pass to Chandler Jones with just 50 seconds left.

It was the final dagger for the Aztecs, who couldn't mount one more comeback.

Fales finished the game 21-for-31 for 260 yards and four touchdowns to give SJSU its third straight win in the series.

* **Total offense:** San Diego State - 484 yards; San Jose State - 367 yards. This marks a rare loss when San Diego State has this wide of an advantage in total offense. The Aztecs drop to 125-11-1 in the Division I era when owning a 117-yard or greater advantage in total offense.

* SDSU had won eight consecutive September home games prior to tonight, which was the second-longest September home winning streak in the Division I era. The team's last loss (before tonight) in a September home game was a 52-23 setback to 24th-ranked Cincinnati on Sept. 29, 2007.

* Through 17 games, Rocky Long is now 10-7 as San Diego State's head coach. That is still the best 17-game start to an Aztec coaching career since Claude Gilbert opened his tenure with a 14-2-1 record in the 1973 and 1974 seasons.

* San Diego State had a fumble on a punt return in the first quarter. It was the team's first turnover since the third quarter of the opening game at Washington. SDSU went 160 minutes, 10 seconds (160:10) of game time without a turnover until the Tim Vizzi fumble.

* San Diego State later fumbled on offense. The Aztecs had gone 164 offensive plays without a turnover prior to the Walter Kazez fumble.

* SDSU allowed a kickoff return for a touchdown. It was the first allowed by San Diego State since Oct. 28, 2000 vs. Colorado State.

* The Aztecs gained over 200 yards rushing for the eighth time in 12 games.

TRENDS

* SDSU has now scored a touchdown in 68 consecutive games.

* San Diego State dropped to 7-1 in the Rocky Long era when leading after three quarters.

SERIES NOTES

* San Diego State drops to 15-19-2 all-time against San Jose State, including a 9-6-1 mark at home.

* The Aztecs have lost three straight against the Spartans after winning the previous seven meetings.

PLAYER NOTES

Adam Muema, So., RB (25 att., 202 yds., 1 TD)

FRESNO, Calif. -- Derek Carr threw for a career-high 536 yards and five touchdowns to lead Fresno State over San Diego State in the Mountain West opener for both teams at Bulldog Stadium.

It was a back and forth game as the Aztecs led by as many as 14 in the first quarter and trailed by as many as 13 in the second quarter. SDSU took its final lead at 40-36 early in the second half when Leon McFadden returned an interception 96 yards for a touchdown. It was his third straight game with an interception and second interception return for a touchdown in three contests.

Carr, however, hit Isaiah Burse with a 31-yard touchdown pass and, following a 27-yard field goal by Quentin Breshears, tossed a 5-yard TD to Rashad Evans to give the Bulldogs a win in their first-ever Mountain West game.

Ryan Katz passed for 160 yards and two touchdowns for San Diego State and led all rushers with 89 yards on 13 carries, including a career-long 67-yard run.

Adam Muema rushed for 64 yards and scored two touchdowns, while Brice Butler (8 yards) and D.J. Shields (5 yards) each caught a touchdown pass.

Eric Pinkins scored on a 32-yard interception return for a touchdown, giving the Aztecs three in the past three contests after not having one the previous 28 games.
