Postgame Football Notes — San Diego State vs. rv/No. 24 Boise State

October 6, 2018 Albertsons Stadium | Boise, Idaho

Big Notes

- Rocky Long is the only active coach in the country who has defeated Boise State in Boise twice. The only coaches to do it once are Bob Davie (New Mexico), Gary Patterson (TCU), Troy Calhoun (Air Force) and Bronco Mendenhall (Virginia).
- Since 2000, Boise State is 109-8 at home. The Aztecs are 2-1 during that stretch while the rest of the country is 6-108.
- San Diego State handed Boise State just its second loss in its last 15 home games (Virginia).
- San Diego State snapped Boise State's eight-game home conference win streak.
- San Diego State held Boise State to 229 total yards. That is its lowest output since gaining 206 yards against 13th-ranked Michigan State on Aug. 31, 2012. It is its lowest offensive output in a home game since Oct. 24, 1998 vs. Utah State (203 yards).
- The 13 points are the fewest scored by the Broncos in a home game since Sept. 20, 2012, when Boise State scored seven points in a 7-6 win against Brigham Young. The last time they were held to 13 or fewer points, regardless of location, was on Dec. 27, 2016 against Baylor (31-12).
- Boise State's passing efficiency rating of 70.34 was its fifth lowest since 1996, lowest since Sept. 3, 2005 (at No. 13 Georgia) and lowest in a home game since Oct. 25, 1997 (Louisiana Tech).
- SDSU held Boise State to just 72 yards in the first half, the Broncos' fewest in any half since recording 52 in the second half at New Mexico on Oct. 7, 2016, fewest in a first half since recording 49 at San Diego State on Nov. 23, 2013 and fewest in the first half at home since at least 2012.
- The Aztecs improved to 15-3 over their last 18 road games since Oct. 10, 2015. SDSU entered the day with tied for the third most road wins (14) over that period.

Team Notes

- SDSU has won 16 of its last 20 games (16-4), 22 of its last 28 games (22-6) and 35 of its last 42 games (35-7).
- San Diego State intercepted Boise State in the first quarter, the Broncos' first interception thrown of the season. BSU's four games without an interception to start a season was its longest streak in its FBS history (since 1996).
- The Aztecs recorded three interceptions in a game, their most since recording three against Washington State on Sept. 10, 2016.
- \bullet SDSU won its 10^{th} straight game when recording at least three interceptions in a game.
- BSU was 1-for-3 on fourth down against SDSU today. Of the last 32 fourth-down chances against the Aztec defense dating back to 2016, opponents have converted just six times (18.8 pct.).
- SDSU outrushed its opponent for the fifth straight game (all games this season).
- San Diego State won its 20th straight game when forcing three or more turnovers in a game (31-5 in Rocky Long era).
- SDSU won its 25th straight game when committing less turnovers than its opponent (31-6 in Rocky Long era).

Trends

- SDSU started with the ball for the 76th time in the last 89 games.
- The Aztecs have now gone 148 games without suffering a shutout (Nov. 18, 2006 at TCU), which is the second-longest streak among current Mountain West schools (Boise State at 269).
- SDSU held its opponent scoreless on its opening drive for the 35th time over the last 43 games and for the 36th time since 2015 (46 games).
- San Diego State improved to 3-1 on the season and 50-14 in the Rocky Long era when scoring first.
- The Aztecs won their 12th straight game when leading at the half, and improved to 3-0 this year and 48-9 in the Rocky Long era when leading at the half.
- SDSU improved to 2-0 on the season and 58-11 in the Rocky Long era when leading after three quarters.
- San Diego State improved to 3-0 on the season and 20-9 in the Rocky Long era in games decided by seven or less points.
- The Aztecs won their 33rd consecutive game when holding their opponent to 24 or less points (56-4 in the Rocky Long era) and 27th straight game when holding their opponent to 17 or less points (42-1 in the Rocky Long era).

Series Notes

- San Diego State improved to 3-3 all-time against Boise State.
- The Aztecs are now 2-1 against the Broncos in Boise.

Player Notes

* Chase Jasmin, So., RB (26 att., 78 yds., 1 TD | 2 rec., 4 yds.)

- Rushed for 78 yards and a touchdown on 26 attempts.
- Led the team in rushing for the second straight game.
- Recorded his second touchdown of the season and fourth of his career.

* Jordan Byrd, TR-Fr., RB (3 att., 76 yds., 1 TD)

- Rushed for 76 yards and a touchdown on three attempts.
- Recorded his first career touchdown on his fourth career attempt.
- The 72-yard run was the longest of the season for the Aztecs.
- He entered the game with one career rushing attempt.

* Ryan Agnew, Jr., QB (8-for-15, 113 yds., 0 TD, 0 INT)

- Was 8-for-15 for 113 yards.
- Improved to 3-0 as the starting quarterback.

* John Baron II, Sr., K (2-2 FG | 1-1 PAT)

- Made both of his field goal attempts and his lone extra-point try.
- Had multiple field goals in a game for the fourth straight game and 15th time of his career.
- Is now 10-for-11 (.909) in field goal attempts on the season and 43-for49 (.878) for his career.
- Also was perfect in kickoffs, booting five kicks for 325 yards (65.0 avg.) with four touchbacks.

* Darren Hall, RS-Fr., CB (9 tackles, 1 INT, 1 SCK, 1 FF)

- Led the team in tackles for the first time of his career with nine.
- The nine tackles were a career high.
- Recorded his second interception of the season and his career in the first quarter.
- Was his second interception over his previous two defensive snaps (five Aztec snaps overall).

• Also recorded his first career sack and forced fumble.

* Tariq Thompson, So, WAR (4 tackles (4 solo), 1 INT)

- Had four tackles and an interception.
- Recorded his first interception of the season and sixth of his career.

* Ronley Lakalaka, Sr., LB (2 tackles, 1 INT)

- Had two tackles and an interception.
- Recorded his first interception of the season and third of his career (first since Nov. 5, 2016 vs. Hawai'i).

Other Notes

- CB Ron Smith started for the 24th consecutive game, the longest streak on the team (offense/defense).
- AZ Parker Baldwin played in his 46th straight game, the longest streak on the team.
- SDSU's captains today were QB Ryan Agnew, K John Baron II, DT Noble Hall and WR Fred Trevillion.
- Brandon Heicklen had a career-long 58-yard punt.
- Damon Moore recorded his first career sack.
- Today's temperature was 57 degrees.
- Today's attendance was 36,679, the fourth most in Albertsons Stadium history.
