Las Vegas Bowl FYI

- Houston is the visiting team and will wear its red uniforms.
- Ticket allotment for each team is 7,500.
- Sam Boyd Stadium has a SPRINTURF playing surface. Seating capacity is 38,500.

Houston Essentials

- Houston (9-3, 5-3 The American) closes out its 2016 season as it faces the Mountain West champion San Diego State (10-3, 6-2 Mountain West) in the 2016 Las Vegas Bowl on Dec. 17, 2016, in Las Vegas. The game kicks off at 2:30 p.m. CT and 12:30 p.m. local Vegas time.
- Houston's all-time record in its 70 years of existence is 426-355-15.
- The Cougars are 11-12-1 in 24 previous bowl trips.
- The Las Vegas Bowl features the No. 3 rushing defense, with Houston allowing an average of only 97.9 rushing yards per game, against the nation's No. 2 rusher in the Aztecs' Donnel Pumphrey who is averaging 155.2 rushing yards per game and is No. 2 on the NCAA career rushing yards chart with 6,290 yards.
- Houston and Alabama are the only two teams to claim double-digit wins over two top-10 teams this season.
- With its win over No. 3 Louisville, Houston has a program-record six straight wins over top-25 opponents, a number that also ranks second nationally among active streaks against ranked opponents behind just Alabama (15). It also marked Houston's fourth straight win over an AP Top 10 team (three of which have come in the last 12 games), also second behind Alabama (7).
- Houston's 22 wins over 2015-16 are fourth nationally behind just Alabama (27), Clemson (26) and Ohio State (23). The 22 wins over the last two seasons already mark the most wins over a two-year span in Houston history.
- Houston is aiming for the first back-to-back seasons with double-digit wins. Winners in 23 of its last 27 games, Houston started 5-0 in back-to-back seasons for the first time in program history.

ABOUT THE 2016 COUGARS

- « Twenty-three full or part-time starters returned in 2016 for Houston. The 2015 leaders in rushing, passing, field goals, kick returns, scoring, total offense, sacks and forced fumbles all returned.
- « The program welcomed an incoming signing class of 24 that is comprised of 17 high school student-athletes, four junior college transfers and three four-year transfers. Eight of the 24 newcomers enrolled in the program in January for spring workouts - QB Kyle Allen, RB Duke Catalon, DB J.J. Dallas, TE Alex Leslie, WR Terry Mark, OL Na'Ty Rodgers, QB Bowman Sells and DB Terrell Williams.
- « Houston's roster sports 42 upperclassmen and 57 underclassmen. Seventeen players redshirted last season.
- « Since 2013, Houston is tied with Baylor for the most wins in the state of Texas among FBS schools with 38. The Cougars are five wins ahead of third-place Texas A&M and six ahead of TCU.
- « The current class of Houston seniors is the most winningest class in Houston football history with 38 wins since starting in 2013.
- « Houston, Alabama and Florida State were the only three teams to defeat a ranked opponent by double digits in the opening weekend of the season. They were also three of five schools nationally to score at least 30 points on a ranked opponent in the opening weekend, joining Georgia (33 vs. North Carolina) and South Dakota State (41 vs. TCU) in accomplishing the feat.
- « Houston started 5-0 in back-to-back seasons for the first time in program history.
- « Over the last two seasons, Houston has 22 wins, the fourth-best total in the nation behind the 27 wins of Alabama, 26 of Clemson and 23 of Ohio State.
- « Houston's 22 wins over the last two seasons is the best two-season total in program history, topping the 21 wins from the 2014-15 seasons.

COACHING CHANGES

- « On Dec. 9, offensive coordinator Major Applewhite was named Houston's head coach after former Houston head coach Tom Herman accepted the same position at the University of Texas. The Houston coaching staff also lost Oscar Giles (defensive line), Corby Meekins (tight ends), Derek Warehime (offensive line) and Jason Washington (special teams coordinator/cornerbacks) that same weekend.
- « With the changes, safeties coach Craig Naivar will oversee the entire secondary and special teams for the Las Vegas Bowl, offensive graduate assistant C.J. Irvin will oversee the offensive line, defensive graduate assistant Roosevelt Maggitt will oversee the defensive line, offensive football analyst James Casey the tight ends and defensive graduate assistant Dan Carrel the linebackers. Offensive graduate assistant Kenny Guiton, defensive football analyst Thomas Dunson and special teams analyst Kyle Robinson have also seen increased roles.

A CLASS OF ITS OWN

- « With the first full year of recruiting under their belts, former head coach Tom Herman and his staff signed what is being praised as not only the top signing class in Houston history, but the top class ever among all group of five programs.
- « The group ranked No. 30 by ESPN included defensive tackle Ed Oliver who is the highest ranked player ever to sign with a group of five program. Oliver was ranked the No. 2 defensive tackle nationally by ESPN and the No. 4 player regardless of position in the nation by ESPN.
- « The class includes three players in the ESPN 300 - Oliver, receiver Courtney Lark and quarterback D'Eriq King - and six players ranked in the top 10 nationally at their positions - quarterback Kyle Allen (No. 1 quarterback in 2014), running back Duke Catalon (No. 10 running back in 2014), offensive lineman Keenan Murphy (No. 5 center), Oliver (No. 2 defensive tackle), offensive lineman Na'Ty Rodgers (No. 4 junior college offensive tackle) and defensive back Terrell Williams (No. 9 junior college safety).
- « The class of 24 signees consists of 19 players from the state of Texas and one each from Arizona, Louisiana, Maryland, Oklahoma and Canada. Of the 17 high school players in the class, 16 hail from the state of Texas with one from neighboring Louisiana. The class covers seven position groups with six defensive backs, four offensive linemen, four receivers, three quarterbacks, three defensive linemen, two running backs and one tight end.
- « Eighteen from the class have seen action this season including 12 true freshman - Oliver, who has started at defensive tackle, Rodgers, who has started at right tackle, Catalon, Williams, Mulbah Car, Keith Corbin, Aymiel Fleming, Alex Fontana, Braylon Jones, D'Eriq King, Courtney Lark, Alex Leslie, Terry Mark, Javian Smith, Ka'Darian Smith, Marquez Stevenson and Collin Wilder.

DEGREES IN HAND

- « Seven Houston student-athletes entered the season having already earned an undergraduate degree. Chris Johnson (Baylor), D’Juan Hines, Cameron Malveaux, Tyler McCloskey, Steven Taylor, Davonte Thomas and Brandon Wilson all completed degree requirements prior to this season.
- « Six additional Cougars will completed their degree requirements this December: Tyus Bowser, Zorrell Ezell, Mac Long, Hunter McCoy, Byron Simpson and B.J. Singleton.

TIES WITH SAN DIEGO STATE

- « Houston offensive coordinator Major Applewhite was in the same quarterbacks room at Texas in 1999 as San Diego State Assistant Athletics Director of Strength & Conditioning Adam Hall who transferred from Texas to San Diego State after one season in Austin.
- « The two would reunite in Austin as Hall served as an offensive graduate assistant in 2010 and a recruiting coordinator in 2011 for Texas while Applewhite was a member of the Longhorns’ staff.
- « Houston has two players on its roster from California in Chauntez Jackson (Inglewood, Calif.) and Ralph Harvey Jr. (Los Angeles). San Diego State has nine Texans on its roster including defensive lineman Sergio Phillips, a teammate of UH’s Howard Wilson at DeSoto HS, and quarterback Ryan Agnew, a teammate of UH’s Ty Cummings at Southlake Carroll HS.

POSTSEASON HONORS

- « Houston was second in The American with seven first team and second team honorees as it received eight postseason all-conference honors in total and added Ed Oliver as Rookie of the Year.
- « Oliver was one of two players in the league to earn unanimous honors on the first team and was joined there by linebacker Steven Taylor and cornerback Howard Wilson.
- « Houston placed four players on the league’s second team as linebacker Tyus Bowser, quarterback Greg Ward Jr., safety Garrett Davis and cornerback Brandon Wilson were all named to the team. Wide receiver Linell Bonner received honorable mention honors from the league.

WON’T BACK DOWN

- « Houston VP for Athletics Hunter Yurachek announced in 2015 a commitment to non-conference scheduling with a goal of two power 6 opponents and two non-power 6 opponents each year following 2016 to avoid scheduling FCS opponents.
- « Houston’s 2016 non-conference schedule is the last to feature an FCS opponent in Lamar and its 2017 non-conference schedule is set with trips to Arizona and UTSA while hosting Texas Tech and Rice.
- « UH has just one spot to fill in 2018 with the second end of home-and-home series with Arizona, Rice and Texas Tech filling three of the four spots. Houston wraps up its series with Oklahoma when they visit the Sooners in 2019. UH also has future series with Kansas (2019-2020), Texas Tech (2021-2022) and UTSA (2022-2024) on the docket along with a return trip to Vanderbilt on Oct. 2, 2021.

- « Houston has scored in 211 straight games dating back to Sept. 30, 2000.
- « Fifteen of Houston's 68 scoring drives this season have lasted less than two minutes with three lasting less than one minute, the quickest just six seconds with a one-play, 13-yard drive on the first offensive play vs. Louisville.
- « Houston has 11 scoring drives of four plays or less including three two-play drives and one one-play drive.
- « With a balanced attack, Houston is one of just eight schools nationally to average over 157 yards per game rushing (157.2) and over 300 yards passing per game (301.9).
- « The Cougars are one of 16 teams nationally with at least 28 rushing touchdowns and 24 passing touchdowns.
- « Houston is 17th nationally with 214 plays of 10+ yards.
- « The versatility of the offense is evident as seven different players have rushing touchdowns this season for Houston while eight different players have receiving touchdowns and two different players have passing touchdowns.
- « Against Louisville, Houston scored 16 points above the Cardinals' defensive scoring average and scored the most on UL since the Cardinals gave up 42 points to No. 5 Clemson.
- « Houston totaled 624 yards against Memphis and has over 600 yards of total offense in five games over the last two years. Houston now has 75 games with 600+ yards in program history.

THE WORD ON WARD

- « Houston quarterback Greg Ward Jr. entered 2016 after claiming the 2015 Earl Campbell Award, presented annually to the top player from the state of Texas. Ward became the first Houston quarterback to rush for 1,000 yards in a season, finishing 2015 with 1,108 rushing yards and 21 touchdowns to go along with 2,828 passing yards with 17 touchdowns. Ward ranked ninth nationally in completion percentage, completing 232-of-345 passes on the year, while throwing just six interceptions, seventh-best nationally among quarterbacks with at least 300 attempts.
- « Ward is the only quarterback nationally averaging over 300 yards passing per game (302.5) and over 45 yards rushing per game (47.1).
- « He ranks third nationally with 13 games with a passing and rushing touchdowns over the last two seasons, trailing just Louisville's Lamar Jackson and Texas Tech's Patrick Mahomes with 15 each.
- « He won his 27th game as Houston's starting quarterback with the win over Louisville, the second-most wins in Houston history. Ward trails just Case Keenum who had 37 wins in his career.
- « Ward leads Houston with a .844 (27-5) career winning percentage as a starting QB. Gary Mullins is second in school history with a .833 (25-5) percentage. They are the only QBs in UH history with 10+ starts and a winning percentage over .800.
- « None of Houston's opponents have been able to fully lock down both elements of Ward's game the last two seasons. He has at least 200 passing yards or 100 rushing yards in every full game he has played during the last two years, missing at least a full quarter in three games with injury.
- « Despite missing Houston's game vs. Lamar, Ward ranks fourth nationally with an average of 349.6 yards of total offense per game and 11th nationally with an average of 302.5 passing yards per game. Both numbers lead The American.
- « Showing his accuracy, Ward ranks eighth nationally in completion percentage, completing 294-of-435 attempts, or 67.6 percent of his passes. He also ranks fourth in completions per game (26.7).
- « In the win over UConn, Ward threw for a career-high 389 yards and three touchdowns as he connected on 84.2 percent of his passes (32-of-38). He also ran for a game-best 65 yards and two touchdowns on 12 attempts.
- « Ward is currently second on the Houston career rushing TDs chart with 38, one away from the UH record.
- « With four passing TDs at Memphis, Ward now has 52 career passing TDs and is fifth on the UH career list.
- « The Cincinnati win was his second career game with multiple passing and rushing touchdowns in the same game.

« Memphis marked Ward's 16th career game, and his seventh this season, with multiple passing TDs, while it marked his 25th with over 200 yards passing.

« The game at Memphis also marked Ward's eighth career game with at least 300 yards passing, and his fifth this season, a number that is second in The American. Ward's 487 yards were a career high and the most by any quarterback in The American this season.

« He now has 10,851 yards of total offense in his career, ranking third on the Houston career chart.

« He became the 15th player in Houston history with over 2,000 career yards rushing vs. UConn and now has 2,372 yards, ranking 10th on the Houston career rushing yards chart. He needs 95 yards to move into ninth.

« The win over Cincinnati was Greg Ward's fifth comeback victory in the second half during his career. It was his first second-half comeback victory since leading Houston to a 34-31 win at Louisville on Sept. 12, 2015.

« He became just the third player in the last 14 games to throw for over 300 yards against Oklahoma as ended the day with 321 yards against the Big 12's top passing defense from 2015 as Oklahoma gave up just 202.8 yards per game through the air

« Ward was accurate on third down vs. OU, completing 10-12 passes for 158 yards. All 10 completions resulted in first downs.

« The Tyler, Texas, native has been responsible for a touchdown, either passing or rushing, in 30 of his last 33 games.

« Ward is fifth on Houston's career passing yards list with 8,476 yards and needs 218 yards to move into fourth.

« With 1,108 yards in 2015, he broke the UH single-season record for rushing yards by a quarterback of 656 set by Lionel Wilson in 1981. His effort marked the 25th 1,000-yard rushing season in Houston history.

« The UH single-season rushing by a QB record was one of 14 Houston or The American Athletic Conference records Ward broke last season while tying three others including the Houston single-season rushing touchdowns record with his 21 scores.

« Ward and Clemson's Deshaun Watson were the only two players in the nation to rush for at least 1,000 yards and pass for at least 2,000 yards last season.

« The electrifying Ward was eighth nationally with 16 rushes of at least 20 yards and nine rushes of at least 30 yards in 2015. The 16 rushing attempts of 20+ yards led all FBS quarterbacks and all players in The American, regardless of position.

« Ward ranked in the top 25 in five of the NCAA's final recognized stat categories: completion percentage (ninth), points responsible for (12th), points responsible for per game (15th), rushing TDs (fifth) and scoring (25th). He finished seventh nationally in scoring among non-kickers with 126 points.

« With his four rushing TDs vs. SMU, Ward broke the Houston QB rushing touchdowns records for a game and a season, snapping the previous record of nine from Case Keenum in 2007.

« Ward collected his third straight game with at least three rushing touchdowns with three rushing TDs at Tulane, the third-longest such streak on the FBS level over the last 10 seasons. Ward had multiple rushing touchdowns in six games last season.

« With 21 rushing touchdowns on the year, Ward set the UH single-season touchdown record, regardless of position, breaking the previous record of 15 set by running back Jackie Battle in 2006.

« He ranked fourth nationally in 2015 in percentage of rush plays that gained five or more yards among ball carriers with 150 or more carries (51.4 percent).

« His 21 rushing TDs in 2015 ranked second nationally among all returners behind just the 22 from LSU's Leonard Fournette.

« He was third among all returners with 126 points and sixth among all returners with a completion percentage of 67.2 percent.

ON THE RECEIVING END

« Houston is spreading the ball around this season as it has had at least seven players with a reception in nine games with nine receivers in two different games. Seventeen different players have a reception with five with at least 29 - Linell Bonner (93), Chance Allen (56), Steven Dunbar (51), Duke Catalon (40) and D'Eriq King (29).

« With Bonner (1,076 yards), Allen (815) and Dunbar (669), Houston is one of six programs nationally (Toledo, Washington State, Texas Tech, Tulsa, Miami), with three players with at least 650 receiving yards.

« Houston has three players in The American's top 11 for receptions of 10+ yards as Bonner is third with 48, Allen is eighth with 34 and Dunbar is 11th with 32.

« Bonner leads the way as he is the 19th player in UH history with a 1,000-yard receiving season with 93 receptions for 1,076 yards and three TDs. His 93 receptions rank 10th in a season at UH and he needs just seven more to become the seventh player in program history to hit triple digits in receptions.

« He is fourth nationally with an average of 8.5 receptions per game with 34 receptions over the last three games.

« He saved his best for last with a career-high 17 receptions for a career-best 235 yards including a career-long 55-yard reception for a touchdown at Memphis. The 235 yards are the eighth most in a game in UH history.

- « Bonner recorded his first career 100-yard receiving game with 119 yards from eight receptions at Cincinnati. Six of his eight receptions at Cincinnati were at least 10 yards. He added his second with 12 receptions for 159 yards vs. UConn, pulling in a one-handed four-yard TD reception that ended up at No. 1 SportsCenter's Top 10 plays.
- « He ranks seventh in The American with four 100-yard receiving games this season after 117 yards at Navy and has two games this season with 97 yards - Tulsa and Tulane.
- « With Bonner recording his second 100-yard game of the season, Houston has had at least one receiver with multiple 100-yard receiving games in a season every year since 1997.
- « Seven different players pulled in receptions against Oklahoma, led by Steven Dunbar who tied a career high with seven receptions en route to his second career 100-yard game with 125 yards on the day.
- « Dunbar nearly had a second 100-yard game with five receptions for 97 yards and a touchdown against UConn.
- « He did manage to eclipse the century mark at Navy, finishing with nine receptions for 112 yards including a 32-yard touchdown. He had three receptions for 58 yards on Houston's first drive alone.
- « At Texas State, King became the first player in Houston history, and the first in the NCAA since 2010, to pull in a TD reception (48 yards), throw for a TD (15 yards to Dunbar) and return a kick for a TD (99 yards) in the same game.
- « Chance Allen set a career high with eight receptions for 73 yards and two touchdowns at Memphis.
- « Allen tied a career high with his second career 100-yard receiving game, pulling in 105 yards off four receptions including a 50-yard touchdown pass from Bonner against Louisville.
- « The tight end returned in 2015 led by Tyler McCloskey. He pulled in his second career touchdown reception against Oklahoma on a two-yard scoring reception to close out the third quarter scoring against the Sooners. He has three additional TDs, a three-yard catch vs. UConn, a two-yard catch at SMU and a 29-yard score at Memphis, part of a career-high seven receptions.
- « Backup tight end Romello Brooker pulled in his first career touchdown, a six-yard grab, vs. UCF.

THE LINE ON THE LINE

- « Houston lost a combined 83 starts from five senior offensive linemen and the loss of sophomore Colton Freeman, due to career-ending injuries in the spring, but returned a combined 26 starts from five returners.
- « UH was 10th in the nation in scoring (40.4) last year, despite having four freshmen who racked up more than 2,100 combined offensive snaps. In 14 games, the line saw 11 different starting combos with 11 linemen receiving starts.
- « Junior college transfer Na'Ty Rodgers, ranked the No. 7 overall junior college player by ESPN, earned his first career start at right tackle against Oklahoma while Josh Jones picked up his first career start at left tackle. Senior right guard Mac Long rounded out a trio of first-time starters on the line against Oklahoma. Junior college transfer Alex Fontana earned his first career start, coming at left guard, against Lamar.
- « This season has already seen seven different starting combinations with nine linemen receiving starts.
- « Left tackle Josh Jones is the only Houston offensive lineman that has been able to start every game this season.

FIRST YEAR FACES IN NEW PLACES

- « Sophomore Duke Catalon joined the program this fall after transferring from Texas. The former four-star recruit redshirted in his lone season at UT and was the No. 10 running back nationally out of Houston's Eisenhower High School.
- « Catalon had a game-best 88 yards in the Houston-Oklahoma season opener on 22 carries. He also added four receptions for 29 yards including a 15-yard pass for Houston's first touchdown of the day.
- « With Catalon held out of Houston's week two game against Lamar, the duo of redshirt-freshman Kevin Justice and true freshman Mulbah Car took the rushing game reigns, with Justice rushing for 111 yards and Car 109.
- « Six players have at least 100 rushing yards, led by 518 from Ward and 510 from Catalon, while seven have rushing TDs.
- « Walk-on Dillon Birden, who shifted from cornerback to running back the week of the Cincinnati game, received his first career start against UConn, finishing with 27 yards and one touchdown on nine carries.
- « Birden received a second start at Navy and became the first UH player since 2014 to have rushing and receiving scores in the same game, finishing with 51 rushing yards and one touchdown and 22 receiving yards and one score.
- « Birden posted three rushing touchdowns, part of a career-best 82 rushing yards vs. Tulsa.
- « After missing three games (concussion), Catalon returned at SMU with 17 carries (54 yards) and four receptions (66 yards).
- « Against UCF, Catalon had a game-best 82 rushing yards, including one TD, and seven receptions for 40 yards.
- « Catalon pulled in a career-high nine receptions for 68 yards and two touchdowns, one coming off a deflection vs. Louisville while adding 39 yards and a score on the ground.
- « Catalon leads all running backs in The American with 40 receptions.

THIRD WARD DEFENSE

« The Houston defense enters the Las Vegas Bowl with the No. 3 rushing defense in the nation, allowing just an average of 97.9 yards per game. Houston also ranks 14th in total defense (325 yards per game), 11th in first down defense (200) and 27th in scoring defense (22.6 points per game). UH leads The American in rushing defense and is second in the three other categories.

« Houston is third nationally with five defensive touchdowns, trailing just Alabama (10) and Ohio State (7).

« The Cougars are 13th nationally and lead The American with 37 sacks on the season. Houston has three players in the top of The American in sacks with Steven Taylor third, Tyus Bowser fourth and Ed Oliver tenth.

« Navy snapped Houston’s seven-game streak of not allowing an opponent to rush for over 100 yards when it ran for 306 yards. Prior to the streak, the Midshipmen were the last team to rush for over 100 yards. During the streak, Houston held Temple, Florida State, Oklahoma, Lamar, Cincinnati, Texas State and UConn to a combined 324 rushing yards. Houston held seven opponents below the century mark this season.

« Houston has forced a three-and-out on 39.4 percent of its drives, ranking seventh nationally, and is fourth nationally with an average of 5.42 three-and-outs forced per game.

« The Cougars set a program record when they allowed Lamar just 73 total offensive yards, besting a 47-year old record of 74 yards set by the 1969 Houston team against Mississippi State.

« The Houston defense held Oklahoma to 23 points in its season opener, just the third time in the last 14 games the Sooners have been held to under 30 points.

« Oklahoma, who is averaging 550.8 yards per game, had 393 total yards against the Houston defense including just 70 on the ground. OU is averaging 228.1 yards per rushing this season.

« Houston held Cincinnati to its lowest output of total offense at home (307 yards) since Dec. 4, 2010, against Pittsburgh. The 30 total rushing yards on 25 attempts were the Bearcats fewest since rushing for 15 yards on 32 attempts in their 2010 season opener at Fresno State.

« Against UCF, the Houston defense held the Knights to only 29 total yards in the second half, including minus 55 yards rushing, after allowing 166 total yards and 95 rushing yards in the first half.

« Houston held Tulane to 151.6 yards below its rushing average with its lowest rushing output of the year (100 yards).

« Houston held Louisville to 39.6 points below its scoring average, 169 yards below its rushing average, 102 yards below its passing average and 271 yards below its total offense average while totaling 11 sacks. Louisville’s 312 yards of total offense was its lowest of the season, with the next closest at 469 yards vs. Duke.

« Louisville’s 10 points were its lowest since scoring only seven vs. North Carolina on Oct. 8, 2011.

« Defensive coordinator Todd Orlando is the only coordinator in the nation to place two players in the top 20 for tackles for loss in both 2014 and 2015 with Zach Vigil (11th) and Nick Vigil (18th) accomplishing the feat at Utah State in 2014 and Elandon Roberts (13th) and Steven Taylor (16th) doing so in 2015.

« The 2015 Cougar defense led The American and was eighth nationally in allowing opponents just an average of 108.9 yards rushing per game. The Cougars ranked 20th nationally in scoring defense, allowing just 20.7 points per game.

« In its win over Florida State, the Houston defense held FSU star running back Dalvin Cook to just 33 yards on 18 carries, an average of 1.8 yards per attempt. Entering the game, Cook had averaged 150.7 yards per game and 7.9 yards per carry.

« Last season’s win over Vanderbilt was the first shutout of an SEC team by a non-conference opponent since Sept. 5, 2004 when Louisville defeated Kentucky 28-0.

TURNOVER U

« Since the start of the 2013 season, no program has taken the ball away from opposing offenses more than Houston with 126 turnovers forced in that time with 18 in 2016, 35 in 2015, 30 in 2014 and 43 in 2013.

« In his first year with Houston, defensive coordinator Todd Orlando continued the turnover theme as his defenses had 95 turnovers from 2013-15. Orlando’s Utah State defense ranked eighth nationally with 59 turnovers forced over 2013-14 and tied Houston in 2014 with 30 turnovers forced and 19 interceptions.

« Orlando ranked third nationally among defensive coordinators with an average of 2.26 takeaways per game over 2013-15.

« Orlando, Brent Venables (Clemson), Bud Foster (Virginia Tech) and Gary Patterson (TCU) are the only defensive coaches nationally to rank in the top 15 for turnovers per game, defensive third down percentage and tackles for loss last season.

« UH has forced multiple turnovers in 43 of its last 59 games.

- « Houston once again established itself in the turnover battle in 2015 as it ranked second nationally with a +21 turnover margin and 10th nationally with just 14 turnovers lost.
- « Houston was opportunistic, turning its 35 turnovers into 128 points including four defensive touchdowns.
- « Cameron Malveaux and Howard Wilson each came up with fumble recoveries against Oklahoma as the Cougars turned the Sooners' two turnovers into seven points.
- « Against Lamar, cornerback Dillon Birden came up with Houston's lone turnover, ripping the ball out of a Cardinals' receivers hands and retaining possession as he hit the turf.
- « Houston upped the ante against Cincinnati as it recorded three turnovers, all fourth quarter interceptions, to help Houston overcome a 16-12 fourth-quarter deficit en route to a 40-16 win. The Houston offense followed Howard Wilson's first interception of the night with an 11-play, 60-yard touchdown drive before Steven Taylor and Wilson ended the next two Cincinnati drives with back-to-back pick-sixes. After Taylor returned a Bearcat interception 74 yards for a touchdown, Wilson returned one on the very next play 28 yards for his first career defensive touchdown.
- « Garrett Davis and Emeke Egbule teamed up for one of Houston's biggest turnovers this season when Davis hit Tulsa quarterback Dane Evans for a fumble-forcing sack that Egbule scooped up and returned 24 yards for the winning touchdown with 1:21 left in Houston's 38-31 win.
- « Houston established a new season high with four turnovers vs. UCF with interceptions from Brandon Wilson and Howard Wilson and fumble recoveries from Davis and Taylor.
- « UH recovered three fumbles against Louisville - one on special teams from Dillon Birden and two on defense with Howard Wilson and Malveaux.
- « The Cougars have been opportunistic when creating turnovers, turning their 18 turnovers into 87 points this season, including 28 points directly from the interception returns from Taylor and Howard Wilson at Cincinnati and fumble recoveries from Egbule vs. Tulsa and Winchester vs. Tulane.

UP FRONT

- « Known for occupying blockers and knocking offensive linemen into the backfield in 2015, the defensive line group has quickly established itself as a group that likes to create chaos in the opposition's backfield.
- « The group has been bolstered by the addition of true freshman Ed Oliver, ranked the No. 2 defensive tackle in the nation by ESPN in the 2016 signing class. Oliver did not wait long to make his impression felt for Houston, earning his first career start against Oklahoma and leading all defensive linemen in the game with seven tackles including two sacks.
- « Oliver is fourth nationally among all defensive linemen with 43 tackles on the year, a number that leads all freshmen defensive linemen nationally. His 61 tackles are 16th nationally among defensive linemen.
- « He ranks ninth nationally with 19.5 tackles for loss.
- « Oliver also leads all defensive linemen nationally with nine pass breakups. The number also leads all non-defensive backs in The American and is fourth in the league regardless of position.
- « Despite missing the fourth quarter against Louisville, the true freshman totaled six tackles, three tackles for loss, two sacks, three pass breakups and one forced fumble.
- « With a non-stop motor, Oliver had 11 tackles including 1.5 tackles for loss at Navy.
- « A team captain in 2016, Cameron Malveaux enjoyed a breakout year in 2015 under the new coaching staff, finishing the season with 33 tackles, 8.5 tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks in an increased on-field presence.
- « The group was bolstered with the emergence of junior Nick Thurman and sophomore Jerard Carter in 2015. Thurman took over Carter's starting role in the final four games and had 15 of his 24 tackles in that span.
- « Singleton has started 25 games at defensive tackle for the Cougars and was named to The American's second team in 2015.
- « With a three-man front not always showing up on a defensive stat sheet, the Houston defensive staff charts the groups impact with two other stats - twofers (occupying multiple blockers to allow another defender to make a play) and knockbacks (knocking offensive linemen into the backfield to disrupt the play). Oliver leads the group with 28 twofers and 21 knockbacks followed by Carter with 18 twofers and six knockbacks. Malveaux rounds out the top three with five twofers and six knockbacks.

TAKE FLIGHT WITH CAUTION

- « Howard Wilson picked off his fourth career pass in Houston's win over Texas State last season before suffering a season-ending injury in the same game. A medical redshirt was granted on his behalf to restore his sophomore season.
- « Howard Wilson claimed his first career fumble recovery against Oklahoma and his second against Louisville.

« He upped his turnover game against Cincinnati with a career-best two interceptions, one of which he returned 28 yards for a Houston touchdown while collecting eight tackles. Wilson nearly added a third interception and a second pick-six, eventually dropping a bobbled pass on a jumped out route.

« Wilson added his fifth interception of the year, and the eighth of his career, with an interception vs. UCF.

« He is second in The American and ninth nationally with five interceptions.

« With nine pass breakups, Wilson leads Houston and is fourth in The American in the category.

« Jeremy Winchester is tied for 10th in The American with eight pass breakups.

« Brandon Wilson now has 30 career starts and was the team's second-leading returner with 58 tackles in 2015. He led all returners with eight pass breakups last season while also picking off a pass and recovering a fumble, returning both for touchdowns. Wilson also saw time at running back in two games last year, finishing the season with 188 rushing yards and two TDs on 37 attempts.

« Playing in the nickelback role, Brandon Wilson got his season started off on the right foot with a career-high 10 tackles, including one for a loss, and one PBU vs. Oklahoma and was named the Walter Camp National Defensive Player of the Week.

« At safety, junior Khalil Williams and sophomore Garrett Davis have both stepped into the starting lineup with junior college transfer Terrell Williams, who earned his first career start at Cincinnati, and true freshman Collin Wilder providing depth.

« Davis is fourth on the team, and second among defensive backs in The American, with seven tackles for loss including the fumble-inducing sack that helped seal Houston's win over Tulsa. He also leads all Houston defensive backs with 61 tackles.

« Khalil Williams had a career-high 10 stops at Navy after totaling 16 tackles in the season's first five games.

LOOK AT THE LINEBACKERS

« Steven Taylor has taken over the emotional leader duties for the Houston defense from current New England Patriot Elandon Roberts and leads Houston with 72 tackles to go along with 8.5 sacks.

« He is 11th nationally among all active players with 25.5 career sacks.

« Taylor has moved into fifth on the Houston career sacks chart with 25.5 and is half sack away from fourth. He has also moved to fifth on the career tackles for loss chart with 49 and is one away from fourth.

« With no sacks at Texas State, Taylor ended a five-game sack streak including multiple sacks in each of the first three games this season.

« He is eighth in The American with 11 tackles for loss and fourth with the 77 yards lost by the opposition.

« Taylor was named the Walter Camp National Defensive Player of the Week after a season-best 14 tackles and 2.5 sacks with one forced fumble against Louisville.

« He picked off his fourth career pass against Cincinnati and returned it 74 yards for his first career defensive touchdown.

« Taylor owns 11 career games with double-digit stops and is the team's returning leading tackler from 2015 with 92 stops on the year. He also led Houston on the year with 10 sacks and was second on the team with 18.5 tackles for loss.

« Taylor led The American with his 10 sacks last season and was second in The American, behind Roberts, in TFLs.

« Bowser made the move from defensive end, where he earned three starts in his first two years, to outside linebacker in 2015 and finished the year with 5.5 sacks, fourth-best among all returning players in The American.

« After missing five games with a broken orbital bone, Bowser returned in a big way against Tulane with a career-high 11 tackles, 3.5 of which for a loss including three sacks. He also had two quarterback hurries on the day.

« Despite missing five games, Bowser is fourth in The American 7.5 sacks. He is third on the Houston team with 10.5 tackles for loss.

« After one sack vs. Louisville, Bowser now has 20.5 on his career, 10th in Houston history, a half sack from seventh.

« Matthew Adams is second on the team with 70 tackles. He opened the year with his third career forced fumble while totaling nine tackles against Oklahoma.

« Adams also had a career-high 12 stops against Navy to tie D'Juan Hines for the game best and currently leads Houston with 49 stops on the year.

« The 12 stops against Navy was also a career best for Hines who now has 41 stops on the year with six starts on the year.

« Emeke Egbule has stepped in with five starts this season and has one of five Houston defensive touchdowns after scooping and scoring the game-winning touchdown against Tulsa on a 24-yard fumble return.

« Ty Cummings holds the starting role as the team's kicker after taking over starting placekicking duties last season vs. SMU in addition to his already held kickoff role.

« In the first half alone against Oklahoma, Cummings became the ninth kicker in Houston history with at least four field goals in a game with his career-high four including a career-long 47-yard kick on the final play of the first half to give the Cougars the lead for good. Cummings also connected on all three extra point attempts to remain perfect on his career in kicking.

« He ranks second in The American with an average of 62.8 yards per kickoff and owns 36 touchbacks, also second in The American with 72 attempts.

« Cummings is sixth in The American with 99 points on the year - 54 extra points and 15 field goals.

THE PUNT-AH

« After losing two-year starting punter Logan Piper, Houston turned to down under for its newest punter. Dane Roy, a 27-year old true freshman from Bunyip, Australia, joined the Houston program this fall after a career as an ice-cream salesman.

« Roy picked up the art of punting at ProKick Australia.

« An Australian rules football player for Richmond Central, he won the longest kick competition at the AFL grand final in Melbourne, Australia, after booting a torpedo 73 meters, which equates to 79 yards. Roy, who stands 6-7, also has a personal-best hang time of 5.4 seconds.

« In his debut against Oklahoma, Roy had four punts for 176 yards, an average of 44.0 yards per punt. He followed with one punt for 50 yards against Lamar before dropping four of his six punts inside Cincinnati's 20-yard line.

« He's placed 19 of his 55 punts inside his opponent's 20-yard line and his high-hanging punts have helped Houston to rank third nationally in punt return defense, allowing just 1.8 yards per return.

RETURNS DEPARTMENT

« Houston returned The American's most dangerous kick returners in Brandon Wilson and it shows. Houston is now fifth in the league with an average of 20.4 yards per return despite not a single deep kick from Tulane resulting in three returns of squib kicks for a loss of six yards.

« Against Oklahoma, Wilson scored his eighth career touchdown in the sixth different fashion when he returned a missed Oklahoma field goal 109.99 yards from the back of his own end zone for a Houston touchdown. Wilson also has touchdowns via rushing (2), kick returns (2), fumble return, interception return and a blocked field goal return.

« He added his fourth career kick return of at least 50 yards against Cincinnati when he returned a Bearcats' kick 56 yards.

« He is one of 35 players nationally with two returns of at least 50 yards this season.

« Wilson's kick return average of 23.6 yards per return is sixth in The American.

« Even with Wilson out at Texas State, the Houston kicking game did not fall off as true freshman D'Eriq King returned two kicks for 130 yards including a 99-yard touchdown return.

« Wilson led the league in 2015 with two kickoff return touchdowns while ranking fourth with an average return of 26.6 yards.

« Wilson knotted Houston up with Louisville at 17 in the third quarter of UH's win with a 100-yard kickoff return for a touchdown. The return was Wilson's second career special teams TD as he returned a blocked field goal for a touchdown vs. UTSA in 2013.

« Wilson became just the second player in Houston history to return multiple kickoffs for touchdowns in a season and a career, joining Tyron Carrier who had four in the 2009 season and seven in his career, with a kick return for a score at UConn.

« He is only the ninth player in Houston history to eclipse the 1,000-yard mark in career kick return yards and currently sits ninth with 1,012 career yards.

HOUSTON IN BOWL GAMES

- Houston is playing in its 25th bowl game.
- The Cougars' bowl record in its previous 24 contests is 11-12-1.
- In Houston's last bowl game, the Cougars ran away with the biggest bowl win in program history, claiming a 38-24 win over No. 9 Florida State in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. Houston jumped out to a 7-0 lead on a Greg Ward Jr. first-quarter rushing touchdown and never trailed the heavily-favored Seminoles. UH had a 21-3 lead before FSU cut the lead to 24-17 early in the fourth quarter. Ward answered with a 17-yard touchdown pass to a wide open Chance Allen. The Houston defense came up huge, forcing five turnovers and holding heralded FSU running back Dalvin Cook to just 33 yards.
- Prior to that, it recorded the largest comeback ever in a bowl game that didn't go to overtime as it defeated Pitt, 35-34, in the 2015 Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl. After falling behind 34-13 with 6:14 left in the game, Greg Ward Jr. threw three touchdown passes in the final 3:41 including a 25-yard pass to Deontay Greenberry with 59 seconds remaining. The two connected on the following two-point conversion for Houston's 10th bowl win.
- This trip marks Houston's first to the Las Vegas Bowl. It's Houston's fourth bowl trip west of Texas and its first since the 2005 Hawaii Bowl. The Cougars also played in the 1988 Aloha Bowl and made their initial bowl trip to Phoenix for the 1952 Salad Bowl.
- Houston has also played bowls in Atlanta, Ga., Birmingham, Ala., Phoenix, Ariz., Orlando, Fla., East Rutherford, N.J., Honolulu, Hawaii, Memphis, Tenn. and Fort Worth, Texas.
- The Las Vegas Bowl is the third meeting between Houston and San Diego State with the Cougars claiming a 14-9 win on Oct. 6, 1973 in San Diego and a 49-14 win on Oct. 14, 1972 in Houston's Astrodome.
- Houston is 1-2 in bowl games against current members of the Mountain West Conference. The Cougars fell to Hawaii in three overtimes, 54-48, in the 2003 Hawaii Bowl before splitting the 2008 and 2009 Armed Forces Bowl with Air Force. After defeating the Falcons 34-28 in 2008, Houston fell in the 2009 rematch, 47-20.
- Houston and San Diego State have no common opponents this season.
- Houston is 19-5 against current Mountain West members. UH has played nine of the league's 12 teams: Air Force (1-2), Colorado State (3-1), Hawaii (0-1), New Mexico (2-0), San Diego State (2-0), San Jose State (1-0), UNLV (3-0), Utah State (1-0) and Wyoming (6-1). The last time Houston faced a Mountain West program was in 2014, a 47-14 home win over UNLV.
- Houston has faced two current Mountain West members in a bowl game with a record of 1-2. The Cougars topped Air Force 34-28 in the 2008 Armed Forces Bowl before falling in a rematch in the same bowl a year later, 47-20. Houston fell to Hawaii, 56-48, in three overtimes at the 2003 Hawaii Bowl.
- San Diego State is 7-6 against current teams in The American. The Aztecs have played five of the league's 12 teams: Cincinnati (1-1), Houston (0-2), Navy (3-1), Tulsa (2-2), and USF (1-0). The last time SDSU faced an American opponent was on Dec. 24, 2015, a 42-7 win over Cincinnati in the 2015 Hawaii Bowl.
- San Diego State is in its seventh straight bowl and its 12th overall. The Aztecs are 4-7 in their 11 previous bowl appearances with a 42-7 win over Cincinnati in the aforementioned 2015 Hawaii Bowl in its latest appearance.
- There are 29 players on Houston's current roster who have played in a bowl game with seven playing in the 2014 BBVA Compass Bowl, 16 in the 2015 Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl and 25 in the 2015 Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl.
- Only 14 players in Houston's history have played in four different bowl games and six more can join the list with action in the Las Vegas Bowl - LB Tyus Bowser, DE Cameron Malveaux, TE Tyler McCloskey, DL B.J. Singleton, LB Steven Taylor and QB Greg Ward Jr. .
- There have been 230 players in Houston history to play in multiple bowl games during their career: 14 in four bowls, 76 in three bowls and 140 in two bowls.
- Houston is looking to win a bowl game for the third straight season and first time in program history. The Cougars have won bowl games in back-to-back seasons in only two previous occasions - 1979-80 and 2014-15.

- Aug. 4, 2016 - Houston opens training camp for its 70th season football.
- Sept. 3, 2016 - Houston opens the year with its biggest win in program history, defeating No. 3 Oklahoma, 33-23, in the Advocare Texas Kickoff at NRG Stadium. The Cougars recover two fumbles and return a missed field goal for a touchdown as the Cougars cruise over the defending Big 12 champions.
- Sept. 10, 2016 - The Cougars open the third home season in TDECU Stadium with a 42-0 shutout of Lamar despite offensive leaders Greg Ward Jr. and Duke Catalon missing the game with injuries sustained against Oklahoma.
- Sept. 15, 2016 - On a Thursday night in its road opener, Houston falls behind Cincinnati, 16-12, with 14:57 left in the game, but outscores the Bearcats 28-0 over the remainder of the game for resounding 40-16 win.
- Sept. 29, 2016 - Houston grabs a 42-14 win over UConn to move to 5-0 for the first time in back-to-back seasons.
- Oct. 8, 2016 - In a heavy rain in Annapolis, Md., the Cougars drop their first game of the 2016 season, falling to the triple-option attack of Navy, 46-40.
- Oct. 22, 2016 - The Cougars fall out of the American Championship race after suffering their second defeat of the season, a 38-16 loss at SMU.
- Oct. 29, 2016 - After falling behind 24-3 in the second half, and in danger of losing its third game in four tries, Houston rallies with 28 straight for a 31-24 win over UCF.
- Nov. 17, 2016 - In front of a record crowd at TDECU Stadium, the Houston defense sacks Heisman hopeful Lamar Jackson 11 times and picks up its second win of the season over a top-5 opponent with a 36-10 takedown of No. 3 Louisville.
- Nov. 25, 2016 - Houston closes its regular season with a 48-44 loss in a shootout at Memphis. The Cougars total 624 yards of total offense behind the 487 passing yards of Greg Ward Jr. and 235 receiving yards of Linell Bonner.
- Nov. 26, 2016 - Todd Orlando is named Houston interim head coach after Tom Herman informs Houston team he is taking the same position at the University of Texas.
- Dec. 4, 2016 - Houston receives bowl invitation to the 2016 Las Vegas Bowl presented by GEICO to face San Diego State.
