## 2005 Outlook

The plans were in place, the team was put together. All that was missing was that special place for the student-athletes to play. Now it is all here...all put together; the 2005 San Diego State softball team and the brand new SDSU Softball Stadium.

"We are excited not only about our new stadium, but about the returning team," head coach

Meagan Hartung

Kathy Van Wyk said. "This squad has a chance to be really special and stand out at SDSU. The mix of veterans and new-comers presents a great opportunity for our team and our fans."

The Aztecs return 10 letterwinners and six starters, including the top two pitchers and top hitter from last season's 37-23 squad, which finished in second place in the Mountain West with a 14-6 record.

A blending of youth and experience are the keys to this season's squad as nearly half of the team is in the guise of eight extremely talented newcomers.



The 2005 pitching staff returns the two-time MWC Pitcher of the Year and six-time MWC Pitcher of the Week Celena Velasquez, along with two-time MWC Pitcher of the Week Cori Janelli to lead one of the nation's best rotations. Janelli was ranked first in ERA in the MWC, while Velasquez was ranked second to make it a clean sweep for the SDSU pitching staff.

"Our expectations are to get to the NCAA regionals and the Women's College World Series, and this pitching staff is crucial to that effort," Van Wyk said. "They are as strong a staff as we have had here at any time, and they will lead us to many victories."

Janelli and Velasquez accounted for 72 percent of SDSU's wins, 67 percent of the team's starts, along with a combined 1.33 ERA, 186 strikeouts and just 31 walks in 262.4 innings of work. The 2004 pitching staff ERA was 23rd in the nation last year.

Velasquez, a junior right-hander, had a paltry 0.85 ERA in conference games, earning her a record of 6-1 in MWC play. Velasquez's play on the year earned her a spot on the 2004 NFCA allwest region team.

Janelli came on strong at the end of the 2004 season, winning five of her last six starts and allowing just six total runs in the five wins. She finished the season with a team-low 10 walks and 99 hits, good for a 0.89 WHIP.

The team also welcomes a pair of highly regarded new arms in sophomore transfer Katie Cochran and freshman Tamani Wells

Cochran comes from San Jose Community College as the reigning Central Coast Conference pitcher of the year, while also earning all-state honors.

Wells is a speedy, versatile performer who will see action not only in the circle, but in the field and as a pinch runner. She comes from Holy Names High School in Concord, Calif., where she was a two-time all-league performer.

### **CATCHERS**

SDSU opens 2005 with an embarrassment of riches behind the plate as three Aztecs could see action at catcher. Senior Danielle Touhey, junior

Jamie Burton, and freshman Megan McDonald all saw extensive playing time this fall and figure into SDSU's plans this spring.

"Having the veteran Touhey back there, along with the competitors Burton and McDonald, make catcher a strong position for us," Van Wyk said. "We have the ability to put any one of them back there and get strong performances."

Touhey, having started 127 career games in 140 appear-

ances, is among the most experienced catchers to ever play at SDSU. The Fresno, Calif., native is a defensive stalwart who has gotten better each year with the bat. She is the Aztec's leading returning power hitter after tying for second on the club in home runs last season.

Burton earned 20 starts last season and has seen action in 60 games in her career. She plays mostly as a defensive replacement and pinch runner, but has seen her role with the team become more and more important with every game.

McDonald is a decorated prepster from the Arizona high school ranks, where she earned two all-state honors and three all-region plaudits.

#### **INFIELDERS**

The infield returns three Aztecs with playing experience, Meagan Hartung, Lacey Craft and Brittany Green. Behind the three veterans though, are a group of three hungry and eager newcomers.

"We have a lot of competition for spots in the infield this year," Van Wyk said. "The ability of the new players will push the veterans and make for some very tough decisions for us as a coaching staff. However, this is a challenge that we love to have."

Hartung, a junior shortstop, was the Aztecs' leading hitter in 2004 and an all-MWC selection. She figures to once again be among the best in the Mountain West and in the nation. Last season, Hartung

paced the Aztecs in batting average, hits, walks, doubles, triples, on-base percentage and slugging percentage.

Craft, the infield's lone senior, started 38 games in 2004, where she played excellent defense at first base. She led the team in fielding of 100 or more chances, nabbing a .984 fielding percentage.

Green saw spot duty behind a pair of seniors

last season for the Aztecs. This season their work-load looks to increase. Green picked up 19 starts for SDSU, seeing significant action at second base.

Freshmen Allison Smith, Chrissie Markham and Taryin Casillas provide depth and competition at all the infield positions. Smith was named all-county and all-conference her senior year at Burlingame High School. Markham hails from Mountain Ridge High School in Phoenix, Ariz., where she holds the team's record for RBI, home runs, doubles, hits and batting average. Casillas comes to SDSU following a strong career at Grossmont High School in San Diego, where she earned 2004 east county player-of-the-year accolades.

#### **OUTFIELDERS**

The outfield, like the infield, is one that is short on experience, but not on talent. Veteran players Erin Mahoney and Bree Boyer collected a combined 109 starts last season and they return to anchor an extremely talented outfield corps.

"I think the outfield is one that will get better and better as the season progresses," Van Wyk said. "We have two of our most experienced players on the team ready to go out and lead this young group."

Mahoney, a senior, is a 2003 all-MWC honoree and one of the top fielders in the MWC. She is SDSU's top returning base stealer and is the second-leading returning run scorer from 2004.

Boyer is a junior who started 55 games last year for SDSU. She is the second-leading returning hitter and tied for the team lead with Mahoney with 16 sacrifice bunts.

The newcomers in freshmen Kristen Carranza, Dani Sidoti and Wells will battle for the third starting spot in the outfield. Carranza, among the top hitters from the California prep ranks, led her high school team with a .546 batting average in 2004. A two-time all-state selection from Arizona, Sidoti participated with the USA Softball junior national team.

## SCHEDULE

Twenty-eight home games at the brand new SDSU Softball Stadium, including contests against 13 of the 2004 NCAA participants and a game against 2004 national champion UCLA in the Campbell-Cartier Tournament, highlight the 2005 schedule.

"This is one of the strongest schedules we have ever faced," Van Wyk said. "It will provide us the challenge and learning experiences needed to be suc-

cessful in conference and postseason play."

SDSU opens the Mountain West season April 1, at Colorado State and this year's MWC tournament takes place May 12-14 at the SDSU Softball Stadium.
