► **The Records:** SDSU continues its busy pre-holiday slate as it plays host to UC Riverside Monday evening, before heading out on the road for a Wednesday outing at SMU.

The Aztecs are in the midst of a three-game in five-day stretch, having already beaten Cal State Fullerton, 69-43, last Saturday at Cox Arena to up their record to an even 3-3. SDSU's match-up with UC Riverside rounds out a three-game homestand, which is broken up by the Aztecs' final two non-conference road games of the 2004-05 campaign.

UC Riverside is coming off a 15-day break and stands at 2-4 overall, while SMU is 8-1 on the year, including a perfect 6-0 at home.

► **SDSU Head Coach Jim Tomey:** Tomey (Michigan '81) is in his third season at San Diego State after taking over the Aztec helm on April 9, 2002. His career and Aztec head coaching record is 20-41.

► **UC Riverside Head Coach John Margaritis:** Margaritis is in his first season at UCR, posting a school record of 2-4. His seven-year career record is 112-84.

► **UCR Series History:** SDSU leads 2-0 (Last: San Diego State def. UC Riverside, 94-61, on 12/28/90, in San Diego, Calif.)

► **SMU Head Coach Rhonda Rompola:** Rompola is in her 14th season at SMU. Her Mustang and career head coaching record is 243-152.

► **SMU Series History:** SMU leads 3-0 (Last: SMU def. San Diego State, 64-55, on 12/14/03, in San Diego, Calif.)

SDSU Women's Hoops Plays Host To UC Riverside Monday, Heads To SMU Wednesday

The San Diego State women's basketball team concludes its three-game homestand with its second outing in the last three days, as the Aztecs play host to UC Riverside Monday at Cox Arena. SDSU, which is coming off a 69-43 rout of Cal State Fullerton Saturday, is also slated to travel to Dallas, Texas, for a Wednesday night re-match with SMU, which won last year's contest, 64-55.

SDSU is the final non-conference game of the year for both UC Riverside and SMU before they begin conference play in the Big West and Western Athletic Conferences, respectively.

Strong Second Half Leads To SDSU's 69-43 Rout Of Cal State Fullerton

The San Diego State women's basketball team outscored Cal State Fullerton 38-15 in the second half to earn its five-straight win over the Titans, 69-43, Saturday afternoon at Cox Arena.

Aztecs Lindsey Casey (Odessa, Texas) and Ashley Cheesman (Orem, Utah) both posted career-high point totals as the forwards finished with 18 and 19 points, respectively. Cheesman fell just one rebound short of tallying her second consecutive double-double with nine rebounds, while Casey and freshman Kate Eveland (Southlake, Texas) contributed seven boards each.

The first half featured eight ties and seven lead changes. Cal State Fullerton was up by as many as seven points at 15-8 at the 12:50 mark, before SDSU forward Jordie Smith (Ft. Collins, Colo.) sparked an 11-2 run with seven points in just under three minutes.

The Titans, however, retook the lead at 21-19 and held it until Cheesman scored five straight points in the final 1:18 to put the Aztecs up, 31-28, going into the locker room.

SDSU never relinquished the lead, outscoring CS Fullerton 38-15, behind Casey's 14 second-half points. The Aztecs were up by 20 points at 62-42 with 3:22 left and ended up winning by 26 points, their biggest margin of the game, 69-43.

Other Cal State Fullerton Notes:

SDSU is 3-3 to start a year for second consecutive season and the fourth time in the last five years ... the Aztecs earned their first win of the season over a school which they also faced a year ago ... SDSU has won the turnover battle in each of its three wins this season ... the Aztecs have reached double-figures in assists in each of the last five games and in steals on three occasions ... SDSU shot a season-high 45 percent from the field (27-for-60).

Big On Offense, Defense

SDSU's 26-point margin of victory over Cal State Fullerton is its biggest in the three-year Jim Tomey era. The last time the Aztecs defeated an opponent by more than 26 points was Dec. 28, 2001, when SDSU downed Radford 89-42 (47 points) in San Diego.

The Aztecs limited an opponent to just 15-second half points in a game for the second year in a row, also doing so against Texas Pan-American on Jan. 9, 2004.

Post Feed

Entering the year, there was much concern about SDSU's lack of depth in the post, as the Aztecs had just four true front court players. With the loss of one already due to injury, the remaining three have continued to step up their game.

Senior Lindsey Casey is averaging 9.5 points and 6.2 rebounds in six games this season, after putting up only 2.3 points and 2.6 boards a year ago. The co-captain posted a career best 18 points on 7-for-10 shooting Saturday in the win over Cal State Fullerton. Last season, she reached double-figures in scoring only once and has already done so twice this year.

Casey has already exceeded her season total from a year ago in steals and matched it in blocks. She enters Monday's contest with UC Riverside needing just seven points to meet her 2003-04 scoring total of 64 points.

Cheesman Steps It Up

For the sixth time this year, freshman Ashley Cheesman led the Aztecs in rebounding, logging nine in the team's win over Cal State Fullerton. Cheesman also tallied a career and SDSU season game-high 19 points, scoring in double-figures in the first half for the second outing in a row.

Cheesman is also a perfect 9-for-9 at the foul line, adding one to that stat on Saturday.

Smith Shines

After entering last Saturday's game with just one point in 7.5 career minutes, redshirt freshman Jordie Smith came up big for the Aztecs against Cal State Fullerton, helping erase a 15-8 deficit

with seven points in a span of less than three minutes in the first half.

Smith made her first career field goal at the 12:26 mark and later added her first career three-pointer and another two-point basket on the Aztecs' next trip up the floor. She ended up with nine points and six rebounds in 10 minutes for the afternoon.

Another Battle Won

The Aztecs have won the battle on the boards each of the last two games, after not doing so in their first four contests of the season. SDSU entered the game with Washington State on Dec. 11, with a -4.8 rebounding margin, but has since closed that gap to -1.6.

The Aztecs outrebounded Washington State, 41-35, and Cal State Fullerton, 37-34. A year ago, San Diego State outrebounded its opponent 10 times after doing so only five times in 27 outings in 2002-03.

SDSU has been steady on the offensive glass this season, reaching double-figures in each of the six contests, including a season-best 19 versus the Cougars. Last season, the Aztecs had 10 or more offensive rebounds in a game 12 times with only one of those coming in their final 10 outings.

Second-Half Squad

The Aztecs have easily established themselves as a second-half team, so far this year. SDSU has scored more points in the second half than in the first in five of six contests, doing so by an average of 11 points. Overall, the Aztecs have scored 212 points in the second half to 159 in the first. A year ago, the point spread was just 81 points in favor of the second half in 28 games.

Depth Is The Key

Seven different Aztecs have been able to reach double-figures in points in at least one game this season. Ashley Cheesman has led the way with three double-figure outings, followed by **Michelle Elliott (Pasco, Wash.)**, **Courtney Fritz (Newberg, Ore.)** and Lindsey Casey, who have each turned the trick twice. Freshman **Kate Eveland (Southlake, Texas)**, sophomore **Jessica Huettl (Eau Claire, Wis.)** and junior **Michelle Strawberry (Corona, Calif.)** have each done so once.

To further accentuate the SDSU's depth in 2004-05, four different players have led the team in scoring in four of the last five outings. The Aztecs have also had seven different players finish with a team game-high in assists.

Three Ball Notes

San Diego State attempted just eight three-pointers in the win over Cal State Fullerton, marking the first time the school attempted less than 17 threes in a game this season ... SDSU has attempted 115 threes on the year, an average of 19.2 per outing. The school record for most three-point attempts in a season is 418, which the Aztecs tallied in 2003-04 ... nine different players have attempted and made at least one three this year ... sophomore Courtney Fritz finished the year with 69 threes in 32 career games, ranking fourth in Aztec history ... sophomore Michelle Elliott is 10th in Aztec history with 40 career threes.

In The MWC

The Aztecs remain second in the conference in steals per game (10.33) and turnover margin (+3.83) ... SDSU is third in three-point field-goal percentage defense (.305) ... Lindsey Casey is second in field-goal percentage (.581), third in blocks (1.50/g) and fourth in steals (2.00/g) ... Ashley Cheesman is second in offensive rebounds (3.67/g) and fifth in overall rebounding (8.7/g).

An SDSU victory over UC Riverside will mean: SDSU's 4-3 record is its best start since the 1996-97 squad went 5-2 through the first seven games of the season ... the Aztecs have been 3-4 each of the last four years.

UC Riverside Tid-Bits

UC Riverside is 2-4 overall this season, defeating William and Mary and Northern Arizona, but falling to Saint Mary's, Sacramento State, Oakland and USD ... the Highlanders have been out of action for the last 15 days since beating Northern Arizona on Dec. 5 ... UCR is the second consecutive Aztec opponent to have 15 days off before the game ... the Highlanders, under first-year head coach John Margaritis, have been led by San Diego native, freshman Kemie Nkele, who is averaging 14.4 points and 11.2 rebounds per game ... Agy Frankovits is also a force with her 12.5 points and 6.3 rebounds per contest ... only seven of UCR's 12 players have seen action so far this season.

Notes With A 'W'

An SDSU victory over SMU will mean: SDSU has claimed its first road win of the season and its first victory in the four-game all-time series with SMU. With an SDSU win against UC Riverside Monday and a victory at SMU, the Aztecs are 5-3 on the season, their best start since the 1996-97 team also went 5-3.

SMU Tid-Bits

SMU is 8-1 on the year, winning the Wells Fargo Classic title this past weekend with victories over Texas San-Antonio (66-46) and host Denver (60-42) ... the Mustangs are a perfect 6-0 at home with their lone loss at TCU (85-65) on Dec. 2 ... Janielle Dodds is SMU's leading scorer with 13 points per game ... Sarah Davis also averages in double-figures with 10.1 points per game and a team-best 9.3 rebounds per contest ... Wednesday's game with the Aztecs is SMU's final non-conference contest of the season ... SDSU's Lindsey Casey (Odessa) and Kate Eveland (Southlake) are both making their first career trips to their home state of Texas.

Flashback: Versus SMU, 2003

Southern Methodist broke a 52-52 tie with nine straight points in the game's final three minutes to hand San Diego State a 64-55 loss at Cox Arena on Dec. 14, 2003.

ers. Michelle Elliott and Michelle Strawberry, making her first career start, both contributed 10 points apiece.

The two sides battled for control in the first half with six ties and seven lead changes. SMU led 32-31 at the half, but SDSU regained the lead in the first minutes of the second, going up 35-32.

The Mustangs would later surge ahead by as many as six points, before the Aztecs put together a 6-0 run to knot the score at 52 with 2:51 left.

SMU guard Andrea Cossey then took over the game, hitting a long distance three-pointer and two straight jumpers to give her team a seven-point advantage at 59-52, which was later extended to nine points. Fritz hit a late three-pointer to cut the deficit to six with 23 seconds remaining, but three SMU free throws closed out the game, 64-55.

Fritz, Jackson To Miss Rest Of Season Due To Injury

San Diego State women's basketball players **Courtney Fritz** and **Erin Jackson (Sparks, Nev.)** will miss the remainder of the 2004-05 season due to injury, Aztec head coach Jim Tomey announced Friday, Dec. 10. In addition, sophomore guard/forward **Michelle Elliott** is expected to be out the next two to three weeks with an injury to her right knee.

Both in their sophomore campaigns, Fritz tore her anterior cruciate ligament in her right knee in the second half of the Aztecs' game at Nevada on Dec. 7, while Jackson will have ankle reconstruction surgery to repair a subluxing peroneal tendon in her left ankle, which she suffered during warm-ups versus Northern Colorado on Dec. 4.

Elliott is expected to miss two to three weeks with a contusion and a non-displaced lateral tibial plateau fracture in her right knee. She suffered the injury in the team's win over Cal State Stanislaus on Nov. 30.

With the injuries, SDSU is down to just nine eligible players on its 2004-05 roster. Of the nine, five are in their first seasons playing at the NCAA Division I level.

Other 2004-05 SDSU Highlights So Far

► The Aztecs' 80 points against Cal State Stanislaus are the team's most in 61 contests since scoring 83 in a win over Air Force on Feb. 21, 2002.

► SDSU had 16 steals in its victory over Cal State Stanislaus, the Aztecs most in a game since tallying 17 on two occasions during the 2002-03 season.

► SDSU trailed Cal State Stanislaus by 11 points, its biggest deficit in a victory since beating Air Force, 73-55, on Feb. 1, 2003. In that game, the Aztecs fell behind 14-2 to the Falcons at the 15:01 mark of the first half, but later went on to lead by as many as 23 points.

► SDSU went 13-for-15 from the free-throw line (86.7 percent) against Northern Colorado, the team's best performance since making 88.9 (8-for-9) percent from the stripe on Nov. 25, 2000, versus Tennessee-Chattanooga.

This year's 13-player roster includes players from 10 states/provinces with the most coming from California. Other states/provinces represented include: Alberta (Canada), Arizona, Colorado, Nevada, Oregon, Texas, Utah, Washington and Wisconsin.

San Diego State head coach Jim Tomey is in his third season with the Aztecs, carrying a 20-41 overall record. Tomey spent three years as an men's assistant coach at SDSU from 1999-2002, helping the Aztecs to the Mountain West Conference title and an NCAA tournament berth in 2001-02.

Before entering the collegiate arena, Tomey was the head boys' coach at the University of San Diego High School (USDHS), compiling a 212-71 record (.749) in 10 seasons, including a state title and seven CIF section crowns.
