SCENE SETTER (entering 2019 season)

- San Diego State opens its 97th season, 51st at the Division I level and ninth under the direction of head coach Rocky Long on Saturday, Aug. 31 with a contest against Big Sky Conference opponent and 2018 NCAA FCS quarterfinalist Weber State. This game is the annual KGB SkyShow with a remarkable fireworks spectacular following the contest.
- The 2019 opener features two of the most successful programs in the country. The Wildcats own a 21-6 record (77.8 percent) over the past two seasons, tied for the sixth-highest winning percentage (among the 126 FCS schools) during that span. Meanwhile, the Aztecs are 39-15 (72.2 percent) over the last four seasons to tie for 11th place among the 130 FBS schools. SDSU's win percentage during that span is second among all Pacific Time Zone schools (Stanford, 40-14, 74.1 pct.).
- The Aztecs are coming off a 7-6 season in which they defeated two nationally-ranked teams and advanced to a school-record ninth consecutive bowl game.
- SDSU's active consecutive streak of nine straight bowl games is tied for the 12th-longest streak nationally. San Diego State joins Stanford as the only football teams in the state of California - college or pro - to play in the postseason each of the last nine years.
- San Diego State is one of 14 schools and one of two Group of 5 schools in the nation to play in a bowl game following the last nine seasons.
- SDSU returns 12 starters (7 offense (including quarterback, running back, wide receiver and tight end), 5 defense and 1 kicker).
- The Aztecs are 50-41-5 all-time in season openers, including an 42-16-4 mark in home contests. SDSU, which is 22-7 in season openers played at home in the Division I era, has won its last four season openers that have been played at SDCCU Stadium.
- Ten different Aztec players received preseason accolades, with six players (junior long snapper **Turner Bernard**, senior tight end **Parker Houston**, junior center **Keith Ismael**, senior linebacker **Kyahva Tezino**, junior Warrior (safety) **Tariq Thompson** and senior running back/KOR **Juwan Washington**) on watch lists for national honors and/or named first-team all conference.
- Head coach **Rocky Long**, the all-time winningest coach in Mountain West history, has guided San Diego State to a bowl game in each of his first eight seasons as head coach. He is one of six active coaches to lead their current team to a bowl game in each of the first eight seasons (others: Mark Dantonio (Michigan State), Brian Kelly (Notre Dame), Nick Saban (Alabama), David Shaw (Stanford) and Dabo Swinney (Clemson)).

:: TICKET INFORMATION

This marks the 16th consecutive season that a San Diego State Football game has played host to the annual KGB SkyShow event.

The event is one of the most popular events in the market and always draws large crowds.

San Diego State is 12-3 with five straight victories since it began hosting the event annually in 2004. During that time, the event has averaged an attendance of 49,049.

Fans are encouraged to get their tickets in advance online anytime at GoAztecs.com or at the SDSU Ticket Office at SDCCU Stadium (M-F, 9 a.m. - 5 p.m. and game day beginning at 1 p.m.).

AZTEC FOOTBALL WITH ROCKY LONG

San Diego State football head coach Rocky Long and FOX Sports San Diego have announced a coaches show for the sixth straight season. *Aztec Football with Rocky Long* will air each Thursday following live programming on FOX Sports San Diego.

The weekly show will give unprecedented access to the SDSU program and Long, the Mountain West's all-time leader in victories and two-time MW Coach of the Year. *Aztec Football with Rocky Long*, which will be hosted by Mike Pomeranz, will consist of player and coach features, behind the scenes footage, X's and O's with Long, a preview of the upcoming game, a recap of the last game and much more.

SIX KEY STORYLINES

- Know This Name: Kyahva Tezino.** Senior linebacker Kyahva Tezino is an All-American candidate who earned first-team all-conference honors a year ago and leads the Aztecs' stellar defensive unit. He has led SDSU in tackles in 14 of his 18 career starts, posting 183 tackles and 19.5 tackles for loss in those 18 contests. Since Rocky Long became the team's defensive coordinator in 2009, only five times has an SDSU player recorded 15 tackles in a game and Tezino has three of those games.
- Washington: Take II.** Last season was suppose to be the coming out party for senior running back Juwan Washington. After serving as a backup to current Seattle Seahawks running back Rashaad Penny, Washington opened the 2018 campaign as the starter in the Aztec backfield. Washington opened the season with consecutive games of 158 yards (at No. 13 Stanford), 156 yards vs. Sacramento State and 138 yards (vs. No. 25 Arizona State) only to suffer an injury in the fourth game of the season. He joined Marshall Faulk and Rashaad Penny as the only SDSU players to open the season with consecutive 150 yard rushing games and entered the fourth game of the season as the second leading rusher in the nation. After missing 4 1/2 games, he returned and ended up rushing for 999 yards for the season. He enters his senior campaign with 2,199 yards to rank 13th on the SDSU career chart.
- The Spread.** Much has been made during the offseason about San Diego State addition of spread formation elements to the offense. Although it is not expected to dramatically change the run/pass percentages, it will likely impact position groups represented on the field. According to Pro Football Focus, the Aztecs averaged nearly as many tight ends per offensive snap (1.56) as wide receivers (1.78) per offensive snap last season. San Diego State also had a full back on the field for 73.4 percent of snaps in 2018. *All numbers are based on player's listed position and not on location player lined up for the play.*
- Kicking Is All New.** Saturday will mark the first time for San Diego State since 2015 without John Baron II as its placekicker. Baron, a two-time Lou Groza Award semifinalist, ended his career making 50 of his 60 field goal attempts (83.3 percent) and converted 135 extra points. Redshirt freshman Matt Araiza will make his debut Saturday. A native of San Diego, Araiza made a career-long 53-yard field goal as a prep player at Rancho Bernardo High (16.7 miles North of SDCCU Stadium).
- You Work For Me, I Work For You.** During the offseason, Rocky Long added former SDSU and Michigan head coach Brady Hoke to the staff as the team's defensive line coach. Hoke served as head coach of the Aztecs in 2000-01, with then defensive coordinator Rocky Long on the staff (Long took over as head coach when Hoke accepted the Michigan head coach prior to the 2011 campaign). SDSU now has four former college head coaches on the staff tight ends/passing game coordinator Ron Caragher (San Jose State), defensive line coach Brady Hoke (San Diego State, Michigan, Ball State), associate head coach/offensive coordinator/running backs coach Jeff Horton (Nevada, UNLV, Minnesota (Interim)) and on-campus recruiting coordinator/offensive quality control Kevin McGarry (San Diego).
- Turnover Margin.** San Diego State has been even or had an advantage in turnover margin eight of the last 10 games. This category has been a strong indicator in the outcome for San Diego State. The Aztecs had won 25 straight games when owning a turnover advantage before a late season loss last season to Hawai'i (30-31, overtime). Nonetheless, SDSU is 25-1 in its last 26 games when owning an advantage in the category.

OPENING KICK

- San Diego State owns a 50-41-5 all-time record in season-opening games, including a 25-24-1 mark during the Division I era. The Aztecs are 9-11 in opening games since joining the Mountain West in 1999.
- The Aztecs have won four consecutive season openers that have been played at home. San Diego State has outscored the opposition, 144-27, in that streak.
- That record improves when the season openers occur at home. SDSU is 42-16-4 all-time, 22-7-1 in the Division I era and 9-6 in the Mountain West era when the lidlifter occurs at home. The Aztecs have won six of their last seven season-openers played at SDCCU Stadium.
- Rocky Long owns an 9-10 record in season-opening games, including a 5-3 mark at San Diego State.

- San Diego State and Weber State are meeting for the third time in school history and the first time Nov. 25, 1967. On game day, it will be 18,907 days since the teams last met (number one song: "Incense and Peppermints" by the Strawberry Alarm Clock).
- The Aztecs have won both of the previous meetings. SDSU claimed a 38-34 road victory in 1966 and won the return game in San Diego, 58-12, in 1967.
- There is not currently a future game scheduled between the teams after Saturday.



PROGRAM-AT-A-GLANCE

- San Diego State has nine consecutive winning seasons, which is the second-longest streak in program history and the longest since a 17-year stretch from 1961-77.
- San Diego State has put together a win streak of at least six games in each of the last four seasons. Only four teams in the country have a 6-plus game win streak in 2015, 2016, 2017 and 2018 - San Diego State, Alabama, Clemson and Ohio State.
- SDSU has played in a school-record nine consecutive bowl games (including all eight seasons under Rocky Long).
- San Diego State is one of only 14 schools nationally to advance to a bowl game each of the last nine seasons.
- San Diego State is 38-12 in its last 49 overall games and 26-8 in its last 34 regular-season games against Mountain West opponents (28-8 against MW opponents, including conference championship games).
- The Aztecs are 10-5 in their last 15 games decided by eight points or less and 24-12 in one-score games in the Rocky Long era.
- The Aztecs have are 25-1 the last 26 times when owning a turnover advantage.

ROCKY LONG HITS THE CENTURY MARK



Long

Rocky Long begins his ninth season as the head coach at San Diego State having already cemented his legacy on The Mesa. Having guided the Aztecs to a bowl game in his first eight seasons with three conference championships during that span, Long ranks second in program victories (71) and tenure (106 games coached), trailing only Don Coryell.

Below are a few of the many accomplishments and notable from Long's time as head coach.

- Has compiled a 71-34 record at SDSU. The 71 victories are the second most in school history (Don Coryell, 104) and are more than double that of the previous three head coaches (Brady Hoke, Chuck Long and Tom Craft), combined (35). In the program's previous 100 games, the Aztecs were 38-62.
- Long has guided San Diego State to eight bowl games in his first eight seasons as head coach and has been part of nine straight bowl appearances for SDSU. That surpasses the total number of bowl appearances the Aztecs had in their previous 87 seasons prior (1921 through 2009).
- The Aztecs have 21 conference championships but had only two in the 37 years from 1975 until 2011. Long has guided SDSU to conference championships in three of the last seven seasons (2012, 2015 and 2016).
- San Diego State has nine victories over AP Division I nationally-ranked teams in school history. Rocky Long has been the head coach for three of them, was the defensive coordinator for one and also has a win over a team that was ranked in the coaches poll (but not the AP poll).
- San Diego State did not appear in the AP Top 25 poll for 20 years until Long guided the Aztecs into the national ranking in 2016. In school history, SDSU has spent 22 weeks in the AP poll, eight of those weeks have come under Long (four in 2016, four in 2017).
- San Diego State has recorded a six-game win streak in each of the last four seasons (2015, 2016, 2017 and 2018). San Diego State joins Alabama, Clemson and Ohio State as the only teams in the nation to accomplish that.

THOU SHALL NOT RUN

San Diego State has spent the last several seasons among the nation's elite at stopping the run. Since the beginning of the 2015 season, the Aztecs rank fourth nationally in rushing yards allowed per game (113.3) and third in rushing yards per attempt (3.2).

In 2018, San Diego State ranked seventh in FBS play in defensive rush average (3.0) and in rush defense (103.8).

In five of the 13 games last season, the opposition averaged 1.8 yards per carry or less and 2.9 yards or less in nine of 13 games.

THE NATION'S BEST LINEBACKER



Senior linebacker Kyahva Tezino has not only established himself as a leader on the defensive side of the ball, he is beginning to assert himself as one of the most impactful players in college football.

According to *Pro Football Focus*, Tezino had the highest grade for an inside linebacker in the nation last season. Against Air Force on Oct. 12, 2018, Tezino recorded his second consecutive game with nine defensive stops (defined by *Pro Football Focus* as an offensive failure). Those nine stops were tied for the most in the country that week.

In the road victory over Boise State on Oct. 6, he may have been the most dominant player on the field. Tezino was strong against the run with (according to *Pro Football Focus*) nine defensive stops, with six coming on run attempts. He performed well in coverage as well with just 21 total receiving yards allowed in coverage on three receptions. Once again, he was sensational providing pressure with one sack, four quarterback hits and two hurries.

Since being named a starter on Oct. 28, 2017 (18 games), Tezino has totaled 183 tackles and 19.5 tackles for loss.

Tezino has led the team in tackles in 14 of the 18 games since he's become starter, posting eight double-digit tackle games over that span (six last season).

Over his last final eight games, Tezino totaled 88 tackles and 10 tackles for loss.

For the season in 2018, Tezino had 127 tackles (70 solo), including 14.5 tackles for loss, 8.5 sacks and 17 quarterback hurries, all which led the team. His 127 tackles were 24 more than No. 2 on the team and a remarkable 67 more than No. 3, and were the third most among an Aztec junior in program history and the eighth most in SDSU single-season history

For his efforts, he was named a first-team all-Mountain West performer, as well as racking up three awards at SDSU's postseason banquet - MVP, defensive MVP and one of four Captain's Awards.

This season, he has been named to three watch lists - Chuck Bednarik Award (college defensive player of the year), Bronko Nagurski Award (defensive player of the year) and the Butkus Award (nation's best linebacker), and has been chosen to the College Football America Group of 5 Starting Lineup. Additionally, Tezino has been selected preseason first-team all-Mountain West by the league's media, Athlon Sports and Phil Steele Magazine, and was chosen as a captain by his teammates.

WASHINGTON BACK FOR SECOND TERM



Juwan Washington returns fully healthy for his senior season after missing 4 1/2 games last season with an injury.

After missing the four games, Washington returned to game action against New Mexico and returned to the starting lineup against UNLV. Against the Lobos (Nov. 3), he came off the bench to lead all players with 95 yards rushing on just 11 carries for an 8.6 yards per carry average. He also recorded rushing touchdowns of 34 and 50 yards.

In the 2018 regular season finale, Washington showed glimpses of what Aztec fans missed during the middle portion of the season, matching a career-high with 158 yards rushing on 31 carries. He posted a 5.1 yard-per-rush average and had two rushing touchdowns.

He then totaled 129 yards on just 19 carries (6.8 avg.) against Ohio in the DXL Frisco Bowl.

Washington, who suffered a broken clavicle late in the second quarter of the fourth game of the season against Eastern Michigan, had a pair of 150-yard rushing games to open the season. He joined Rashaad Penny and Marshall Faulk as the only Aztecs players to do that.

Among his early season highlights prior to the injury last year:

- Washington's entered the Eastern Michigan game with these national rankings: first in forced missed tackles (28, nine more than any other player in the country; *courtesy Pro Football Focus*), third in rushing yards after contact (291), fourth in rushing yards per game (150.7), fifth in all-purpose yards per game (190.0) and ninth in rushing TDs (5).
- Washington joined Marshall Faulk (1992) and Rashaad Penny (2017) as the only running backs in SDSU history to open a season with consecutive 150-yard rushing games.
- Against No. 13/13 Stanford on Aug. 31, Washington averaged 6.6 yards per carry, which is the highest by any Aztec player with at least 15 carries against an AP Top 25 opponent since Ronnie Hillman (24 carries, 191 yards) averaged 8.0 yards per carry against No. 22 Air Force on Oct. 16, 2010. By comparison, recent SDSU running backs best against top 25 foes were Donnel Pumphrey's 5.9 average at No. 21 North Carolina on Sept. 6, 2014 and Rashaad Penny's 5.5 average against No. 19 Stanford on Sept. 16, 2017.

For the season in 2019, Washington received honorable mention all-Mountain West accolades by the league's coaches and media, rushing 199 times for 999 yards (5.0 avg.) with 10 touchdowns. Washington ranked second in the MW (13th in FBS) in rushing yards

per game (111.0, min. 190 att.), second (30th in FBS) in rush avg. (5.0, min. 190 att.), tied for fourth (T-57th in FBS) in rushing touchdowns (10), fifth (64th in FBS) in rushing yards (999) and eighth in total touchdowns (10), despite missing the 4 ½ games. According to Pro Football Focus, Washington ranked 33rd in FBS (No. 4 in MW) with 41 forced missed tackles and 34th (No. 2 in MW) in 15-yard runs (15), despite missing 4 ½ games.

BULLET NOTES - OFFENSE

- San Diego State returns seven starters on offense this season - senior quarterback Ryan Agnew, sophomore wide receiver Ethan Dedeaux, junior center Keth Ismael, senior left guard Daishawn Dixon, junior center Dominic Gudino, senior tight end Parker Houston, senior running back Juwan Washington.
- Jeff Horton is in his ninth season at San Diego State and his fifth as SDSU's offensive coordinator (served the previous four seasons as an assistant head coach and running backs coach). Among his other experience, he served as the head coach at Nevada and UNLV and interim head coach at Minnesota. In addition to being the offensive coordinator, he is also an associate head coach.
- Of all FBS schools that have played at least 100 games since 2011 (Jeff Horton era), San Diego State has the 25th fewest amount of turnovers (151).
- Last season, SDSU suffered from a rash of injuries on the offensive side of the ball. The result was a total of 26 different players making a start on the offensive side of the ball and only tight end Parker Houston started every game at the same position for the offense.
- Last season, Agnew became the 43rd different player to start at quarterback for the Aztecs in the Division I era (see page 205 of the media guide for details). Of the 42 players making their inaugural SDSU start in the Division I era, Agnew became the 20th to win their first start. The last three players making their first start Maxwell Smith (Aug. 30, 2015) and Christian Chapman (Dec. 5, 2015) were victorious.

OFFENSIVE NUMBERS

- SDSU has scored 27 or more points in 22 of the last 34 games and in 34 of the last 49 games.
- San Diego State has scored 30 or more points in 27 of their last 48 games (1,479 points total, 30.8 ppg).
- The Aztecs are 34-4 the last 38 times they have scored at least 30 points and 46-9 in the Rocky Long era when scoring 30-plus points.
- Since Oct. 3, 2015, San Diego State is 35-7 when scoring at least 20 points.
- San Diego State is 67-18 in the Rocky Long era when scoring just 20 or more points.
- SDSU is 17-3 with 13 straight wins under Rocky Long when getting at least 36 minutes of time of possession.
- Since the beginning of 2014, SDSU is 37-8 when committing one turnover or less and 9-13 when having two or more turnovers in the game. San Diego State has one turnover or less in 38 of the 54 games since the start of the 2015 campaign.
- San Diego State has one turnover or less in 17 of its last 25 games.
- SDSU is 31-5 in the last 36 games when owning an edge in time of possession.

RUSHING OFFENSE

- San Diego State is 41-2 the last 43 times it has rushed for at least 200 yards and is 39-1 in its last 40 regular-season games when rushing for 200-plus yards.
- San Diego State has at least one 100-yard rusher in 27 of its last 40 games since 2016 (35, 100-yard rushers total) and 36 of the 54 games since Jeff Horton took over as the offensive coordinator in 2015 (47, 100-yard rushers total). Since Horton arrived as the running back coach in 2011, SDSU has a 100-yard rusher in 72 of the 106 games and 87, 100-yard rushers overall.
- Juwan Washington has 25 career rushes for 20-plus yards.
- When the game is within seven points in the fourth quarter, Washington has rushed 36 times for 229 yards (6.6 avg.) with three touchdowns.
- Washington was one of just three Aztec running backs in program history to start the season with at least two straight 150-yard rushing games (Marshall Faulk, 1992 and Rashaad Penny, 2017).
- Washington became the 16th Aztec to rush for 100-plus yards in a season opener (17th occasion overall) when he rushed for 158 yards at No. 13/13 Stanford last season.
- Washington's 6.6 yards rush average was the highest by any Aztec player with at least 15 carries against an AP Top 25 opponent since Ronnie Hillman (24 carries, 191 yards) averaged 8.0 yards per carry vs. No. 22 Air Force on Oct. 16, 2010.

PASSING OFFENSE

- Since the start of the 2017 season, San Diego State has thrown 11 interceptions. That is tied for the fifth-fewest picks in the nation.
- For his young career, Ryan Agnew is 6-1 as the starting quarterback and has three second-half come-from-behind victories.
- Against No. 23/25 Arizona State, Agnew became the first quarterback from a non-Power 5 school to beat a nationally ranked team from a Power 5 school in his starting debut since USF's B.J. Daniels against No. 18 Florida State on Sept. 26, 2009.
- Agnew became the third straight Aztec starting quarterback to win his Aztec debut (also Maxwell Smith vs. San Diego on Aug. 30, 2015 and Chapman vs. Air Force on Dec. 5, 2015) (SDSU quarterbacks were just 1-13 in the previous 14 starting debuts).
- Agnew also became the first Aztec quarterback to beat a nationally ranked team in his starting debut (other quarterbacks were 0-4

when their debut was against a ranked squad).

BULLET NOTES - DEFENSE

- For just the third season since arriving at San Diego State prior to the 2009 campaign, Rocky Long will not serve as the team's defensive coordinator (although he will continue to call the defense).
- Zach Arnett is in his second year as defensive coordinator and enters his ninth season as the linebackers coach.
- San Diego State returns five starters off last season's squad which was one of the top units nationally. Returning in 2019 are senior LB Kyahva Tezino, senior LB Troy Cassidy, senior CB (now Aztec (safety)) Kyree Woods, junior Warrior (safety) Tariq Thompson and junior Warrior (safety) Trenton Thompson.

DEFENSIVE NUMBERS

- Since Nov. 14, 2015 (includes 45 SDSU games), San Diego State ranks eighth nationally in total defense (315.5) and 12th in points allowed per game (19.9).
- Since the beginning of 2009, when Rocky Long took over as defensive coordinator, the Aztecs rank eighth nationally in yards per rush allowed (3.6), 15th rushing yards per game (135.0), 16th in yards per touch (6.3), 19th in yards allowed per game (345.7), 24th in points allowed per game (23.1) and 38th in turnovers forced (228).
- SDSU has returned six interceptions for touchdowns since the beginning of the 2016 season (tied for 11th nationally).
- Kyahva Tezino was named the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Week for the first time of his career for his play against Air Force last season, posting a game- and season-high 15 tackles, including 10 solo stops, while adding a pass breakup and a quarterback hurry.
- Tezino won the MW Defensive Player of the Week once again for his play at New Mexico in 2018, when he had 12 tackles, 2.5 sacks and 3.5 tackles for loss.
- Tezino played a team-high 884 defensive snaps last season.
- Tezino's numbers over his last 18 games (all starts) - 183 tackles and 19.5 tackles for loss; numbers over his first 17 games (no starts) - eight tackles and 1.5 tackle for loss.
- Tezino had six double-digit tackle games last season in 12 games and eight for his career.
- Tezino has had two different three-game streaks in his career with at least 10 tackles.
- Tezino has led the team or tied for the team lead in tackles 14 times for his career (all over the last 17 games).

RUSHING DEFENSE

- Last season, SDSU ranked seventh in FBS play in defensive rush average (3.0) and in rush defense (103.8).

PASSING DEFENSE

- Under head coach Rocky Long, San Diego State is 42-6 in games in which the opponent has a passing efficiency rating of 116.50 or less.
- Since the beginning of the 2015 campaign, San Diego State's 73 interceptions are tied for the most in the country, while its 10 interception returns for touchdowns are fourth in the country.

BULLET NOTES - SPECIAL TEAMS

- ESPN Team Efficiencies ranked San Diego State's special teams unit as the 23rd best in the country in 2015, 13th in 2016 and 28th in 2017.
- Former SDSU captain Doug Deakin is in his ninth season with the program and his second as special teams coordinator. He also coaches the tight ends.

- Brandon Heicklen had gone 18 games and 86 punts without a touchback prior to having one on the second punt of the game at Fresno State (last touchback was his final punt at UNLV on Oct. 7, 2017).

OFFENSE SHINES AT FOOTBALL'S FAN FEST SCRIMMAGE

In a reversal of the last couple of Fan Fest scrimmages, the San Diego State offense was the star of the game at the program's annual preseason scrimmage at SDCCU Stadium on Aug. 17.

The offense totaled 478 yards, 230 of which came on the ground from eight rushers. Freshmen Zidane Thomas and Justin Dinka led the team with 72 and 71 yards, respectively.

"You want as many (running backs) out here getting reps as possible," said quarterback Ryan Agnew, who was under center for three possessions in the first half. "I think there were a lot of great performances on offense but you know the saying that it is never as good as you think or as bad as you think. When we watch it on film there will be a lot of things we can work on but it was awesome to

get in this environment and see everyone do well."

Following the conclusion of the first two possessions, an 11-play drive followed by a 12-play effort, freshman Matt Araiza hit field goals of 43 yards and 33 yards. The main contributor in the second drive, which covered 60 yards in just over six minutes, was sophomore running back Chance Bell. Bell ran for a total of 52 yards on the drive, 40 on the ground and 12 through the air.

With six points on the board, junior quarterback Jordan Brookshire (13-for-21, 123 yards) took over early in the second quarter and guided the offense on a 12-play, 62-yard drive which resulted in the scrimmage's first touchdown. Kaegun Williams punched the ball in from 2-yards out and was responsible for the final 36 yards of the drive, which included a 22-yard run and a 12-yard reception before his scoring scamper.

After a 3-and-out on the next drive, Brookshire returned to the field and in 3:22, drove the team to its second touchdown. The drive looked like it was going to stall, but Brookshire found Chaz Collins for 18 yards and, after a 15-yard face mask penalty was tacked on, the offense struck. Brookshire found Isaiah Richardson on a fade route in the corner of the end zone.

In the final drive of the half, Brookshire took the offense on a 13-play drive which culminated in Araiza's third field goal, a 39-yard boot. For the half, the offense scored 23 points.

On the opening drive of the second half, the defense got into the action and on the scoreboard. Senior safety Kyree Woods forced a fumble, recovered the ball and scampered 45 yards for the defense's lone score on the day.

The next drive of the half would be the most exciting of the game. Freshman running back Justin Dinka had a 1-yard run up the gut on the opening play and then went around the left end on the next play for 74 yards and a touchdown, which would be the final points of the scrimmage.

Three Aztecs - junior safety Dwayne Johnson Jr., freshman safety Allan Mwata and freshman linebacker Michael Shawcroft - led the defense with eight tackles apiece. Woods had six tackles, including one for a loss of three yards, his fumble recovery and touchdown. On the final play of the scrimmage, freshman defensive lineman Shawn Nielson had an interception on a ball which was deflected at the line of scrimmage.

AZTECS NAME TEAM CAPTAINS

San Diego State football has named seniors Ryan Agnew, Parker Houston and Kyahva Tezino as its captains for the 2019 campaign.

Agnew went 6-1 as the starting quarterback last season, passing for 1,651 yards and 10 touchdowns. Agnew, who played in 12 of the team's 13 games, was chosen as the team's Byron H. Chase Memorial Trophy winner for the team's offensive player of the year. Agnew's .857 winning percentage is the sixth highest among active FBS quarterbacks entering the 2019 campaign (min. 7 games started). Agnew led the MW and ranked 10th in FBS last year in passing yards per completion (14.36).

Houston is coming off a junior season in 2018 when he started all 13 games at tight end, recording 16 passes for 178 yards (11.1 avg.), two touchdowns and a 2-point conversion. Houston, who last month was named to the Mackey Award Watch List (outstanding collegiate tight end) and the Wuerffel Trophy Watch List (community service, athletic and academic achievement), has played in 36 straight games (second-longest streak on the team) and has started 24 for his career.

Tezino is coming off a fantastic 2018 season when he had 127 tackles (70 solo), including 14.5 tackles for loss, 8.5 sacks and 17 quarterback hurries, en route to earning first-team all-Mountain West honors. Tezino, who won the John Simcox Memorial Trophy Most Valuable Player, the Byron H. Chase Memorial Trophy Defensive Player of the Year and the Dr. R. Hardy/C.E. Peterson Memorial Trophy Captain Award at the team's postseason banquet, led the Mountain West and ranked 29th in FBS play in solo tackles per game, and was third in the league (35th in FBS) in sacks per game (0.65) and fourth (26th in FBS) in tackles per game (9.77). He is on three preseason watch lists in 2019, including the Bednarik Award (college defensive player of the year), Nagurski Award (defensive player of the year) and the Butkus Award (nation's best linebacker).

The Aztecs finished 2018 with a 7-6 record, including wins over No. 23/25 Arizona State and rv/No. 24 Boise State. SDSU is one of 14 teams to make a bowl game in nine consecutive seasons. San Diego State returns its leading passer (Agnew), rusher (Juwon Washington) and tackler (Tezino) from a year ago.

SDSU's Mountain West home schedule features the two teams that finished atop the West Division standings last year (Fresno State and Nevada), and two cross-division opponents with the best league record (Utah State) and the third-best mark on the Mountain Division (Wyoming). Overall, San Diego State's four Mountain West home games come against teams that went a combined 23-9 in league competition, while its four conference road contests are against teams that went 10-22 in league play.

The Aztecs kick off their 2019 season at home on Saturday, Aug. 31 against Weber State at 6 p.m. PT, followed by the KGB SkyShow.

SDSU LANDS FOUR PLAYERS ON 2019 MW PRESEASON TEAM

Four San Diego State football players were named to the 2019 Mountain West Preseason All-Conference Team, the league announced in July at the Mountain West Football Media Summit in Las Vegas. The four preseason selections - offensive lineman Keith Ismael, linebacker Kyahva Tezino, Warrior (safety) Tariq Thompson and running back Juwon Washington - are the third most in the league.

The all-conference team and preseason poll are voted on by media representatives who cover the conference.

Ismael is a two-time all-Mountain West selection, including a first-team pick last year as a sophomore and a second-team selection in 2017 as a freshman. Last season, Ismael started all 12 games he appeared in, including six games at center, five at right guard and once at left guard. He was also named the team's offensive lineman of the year and was on the Pro Football Focus Mountain West Offensive Team of the Year.

Tezino is coming off a fantastic junior season in 2018 when he had 127 tackles (70 solo), including 14.5 tackles for loss, 8.5 sacks and 17 quarterback hurries, en route to earning first-team all-Mountain West honors. Tezino, who won the John Simcox Memorial Trophy

Most Valuable Player, the Byron H. Chase Memorial Trophy Defensive Player of the Year and the Dr. R. Hardy/C.E. Peterson Memorial Trophy Captain Award at the team's postseason banquet, had 24 more tackles than No. 2 on the team and a remarkable 67 more than No. 3. His 127 tackles were the third most by an Aztec junior in program history and the eighth most in SDSU single-season history.

Tezino led the Mountain West and ranked 29th in FBS play in solo tackles per game, and was third in the league (35th in FBS) in sacks per game (0.65) and fourth (26th in FBS) in tackles per game (9.77). Tezino, who was the only San Diego State player to play every snap last season, put together two different three-game streaks with at least 10 tackles a year ago.

Thompson recorded 60 tackles (38 solo) a year ago, including five tackles for loss, two interceptions for 41 yards, eight pass breakups, two forced fumbles and a fumble recovery. Thompson, who has started all 26 games since arriving to campus as a true freshman in 2017 at one of the Warrior positions (safety) in Rocky Long's 3-3-5 defense, was a second-team all-MW pick for a second straight year in 2018 and also a member of the Pro Football Focus Mountain West Defensive Team of the Year for the second consecutive season.

Washington, meanwhile, rushed 199 times for 999 yards (5.0 avg.) with 10 touchdowns last year, despite missing 4 1/2 games with an injury. An honorable mention MW selection in 2018, Washington ranked second in the MW and 13th in FBS in rushing yards per game (111.0, min. 190 att.), second (30th in FBS) in rush avg. (5.0, min. 190 att.), tied for fourth (T-57th in FBS) in rushing touchdowns (10), fifth (64th in FBS) in rushing yards (999) and eighth in total touchdowns (10). According to Pro Football Focus, Washington ranked 33rd in FBS (No. 4 in MW) with 41 forced missed tackles and 34th (No. 2 in MW) in 15-yard runs (15), despite the missed games.

Additionally, San Diego State was picked to finish second in the West Division with 106 points and seven first-place votes, just 16 points behind defending champion Fresno State's 122 (and 17 first-place votes). The Aztecs have been picked to either finish first or second in the West Division all seven years of division play.

SDSU, which averaged a predicted finish of 6.5 from 2005-12, has ended up at or better than its predicted finish in eight of the last 10 seasons and 11 times over the past 14 years. San Diego State has won two of the last four Mountain West titles (2015 and 2016) and three of the past seven (also 2012).

Following Fresno State (122) and San Diego State (106) in the West Division was Nevada (74), Hawai'i (67 and the other first-place vote), UNLV (51) and San José State (21).

Boise State has been picked to win the Mountain Division for the seventh consecutive season after making the MW championship game last year for just the second time since 2014. The Broncos lost to Fresno State, 19-16, in the 2018 MW Championship game at Albertsons Stadium in Boise, Idaho. BS picked up 15 first-place votes in the Mountain Division and 120 total, followed by Utah State (108 and six first-place votes), Air Force (73), Wyoming (66), Colorado State (52) and New Mexico (22).

Notes: SDSU has 66 of the 100 first-place votes in the West Division (66.0 pct.) over the last four seasons (since 2016) and 93 of the 130 votes (71.5 pct.) over the last five seasons (since 2015) ... In the last six seasons (since 2014), SDSU has 108 first-place votes after picking up just seven first-place votes combined over the first 15 years in the league ... San Diego State placed multiple players on both the preseason offensive and defensive teams for the first time since 2016 (the Aztecs won the league that season) and for just the second time over the last 15 seasons ... SDSU placed multiple players on the offensive all-conference team for a fifth consecutive season ... San Diego State has a defensive player on the preseason all-MW team for the eighth time in the last nine seasons ... WAR Tariq Thompson and OL Keith Ismael are the first Aztec juniors to be selected on the all-conference team since PK John Baron II (2017), and the first offensive or defensive junior since Damontae Kazee and Donnel Pumphrey in 2015 ... Thompson (two-time second-team all-MW pick) and Ismael are each on the preseason all-MW team for a second straight season.

DID YOU KNOW?

- Was one of four NCAA players who visited U.S. servicemen in Vietnam in the summer of 1971, spending two weeks visiting different U.S. bases
- Bobby Knight paid Long a home visit and recruited the two-sport athlete to play basketball at Army
- Left New Mexico as the all-time leading rusher (2,071 yards) and threw just 23 interceptions in 30 career games

COACHING HIGHLIGHTS

- Has the most all-time victories in the Mountain West with 133 (three of his previous 136 wins came in the WAC).
- Was named the Mountain West Coach of the Year in 2002, 2012 and 2015.
- In his 20th season as a head coaching experience and has spent 20-plus seasons as a defensive coordinator.

AT SAN DIEGO STATE

- Became San Diego State's 18th head football coach on Jan. 12, 2011.
- Was the defensive coordinator at SDSU from 2009-10.
- In 2012, led the Aztecs to a share of the Mountain West title at 7-1. It was San Diego State's first Mountain West championship and first league title since 1998. The Aztecs then won the MW title in 2015, defeating Air Force, 27-24, in the MW Championship game and again in 2016 in a 27-24 win at Wyoming.

COACHING PRIOR TO SAN DIEGO STATE

- Compiled a school-record 65 victories and led the Lobos to five bowl game appearances in his final seven seasons. His teams were bowl eligible in seven of his last eight campaigns.
- In his final nine seasons in Albuquerque, Long's defensive units ranked among the top 30 in fewest yards allowed six times and among the top 40 against the rush every year. In both 2001 and 2003, New Mexico's defense ranked fifth nationally in fewest rushing yards allowed per game.
- While at New Mexico, he coached 13 players selected in the NFL Draft, 10 players who earned All-America honors and had a MW-high 34 first-team all-conference selections since 2003.
- Prior to accepting the head coaching position at New Mexico, Long served as defensive coordinator for 12 seasons at three different schools. He was the defensive coordinator for two years under Bob Toledo at UCLA in 1996-97, for five seasons at Oregon State from 1991-95, and for five campaigns at Wyoming from 1981-85.
- Also served as an assistant coach at TCU, with the CFL's British Columbia team and started his career at New Mexico as a graduate assistant coach in 1972.

PLAYING EXPERIENCE:

- Originally a defensive back, Long became a three-year starter at quarterback for the Lobos from 1969-71. He earned team most valuable player honors and was the Western Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year as a senior.
- Long played professionally in the CFL with British Columbia in 1972-73 and 1975-76. He also competed in the World Football League with the Detroit Wheels in 1974.
- Attended Alta Loma High School in Alta Loma, Calif.

PERSONAL:

- Both of Long's daughters are head coaches at the university level. Roxanne was hired in July of 2012 as the head women's basketball coach at Rogers State University (NAIA) in Claremore, Okla., after four years in the same position at Texas Lutheran (NCAA Division III). Hannah, meanwhile, is the head volleyball coach at Southwestern University, an NCAA Division III school in Georgetown, Texas. She is a four-time conference coach of the year, having compiled a 306-79 (.795) record in 10 years, including a pair of regional finals appearances in 2008 and 2009.

- **At San Diego State:** Athletic, mobile quarterback with an accurate arm ... Can throw on the run and in the pocket ... Is 6-1 as a starting quarterback over his career ... Is listed as the starting quarterback heading into his senior season.
- **2019 (Senior):** Has been chosen as a team captain by his teammates.
- **2018 (Junior):** Received the team's Byron H. Chase Memorial Trophy after being chosen the team's offensive player of the year ... Played in 12 of the team's 13 games, starting seven times ... Was 115-for-223 (51.6 pct.) for 1,651 yards and 10 touchdowns with six interceptions, owning a 123.18 pass efficiency rating ... Was 6-1 as the team's starting quarterback ... Also rushed 62 times for 141 yards (2.3 avg.) with a long run of 32 yards ... If you take away the 23 times he was sacked (for 146 yards), he rushed 39 times for 287 yards (7.4 avg.) ... Ranked 10th in FBS play (1st in MW) in passing yards per completion (14.36) ... Earned his first career start the following week against No. 23/25 Arizona State, completing 12 of 24 passes for 129 yards and a touchdown without throwing an interception ... Also rushed nine times for 36 yards (4.0 avg.) with a long of 13 yards ... Became the first quarterback from a non-Power 5 school to beat a nationally ranked team from a Power 5 school in his starting debut since USF's B.J. Daniels against No. 18 Florida State on Sept. 26, 2009 ... Became the third straight Aztec starting quarterback to win his Aztec debut (also Maxwell Smith vs. San Diego on Aug. 30, 2015 and Chapman vs. Air Force on Dec. 5, 2015) (SDSU quarterbacks were just 1-13 in the previous 14 starting debuts) ... Also became the first Aztec quarterback to beat a nationally ranked team in his debut (other quarterbacks were 0-4 when their debut was against a ranked squad) ... Threw his first touchdown pass late in the second quarter to Tim Wilson Jr. ... On the drive, Agnew was 6-for-9 for 77 yards and a touchdown with a 175.20 pass efficiency rating, while adding an 8-yard rush ... Started out the game 4-for-13, but completed 8 of his final 11 attempts in the game ... Set then career highs in completions (12), attempts (24), carries (9) and rushing yards (36) ... Picked up his second straight win against Eastern Michigan, going 12-for-22 for 176 yards and two touchdowns with one interception, while rushing eight times for 18 yards (2.2 avg.) with a long of 22 yards ... Recorded his first career second-half comeback win, leading the Aztecs to a game-tying field goal with 1:16 left in the fourth quarter and then leading SDSU to a field goal in overtime ... The 176 yards were a then career high, while the 12 completions tied a career best ... Threw multiple touchdown passes for the first time of his career ... Was 8-for-15 for 113 yards in a third straight start and first time as a captain at rv/No. 24 Boise State ... Also rushed nine times for zero yards with a long of eight, getting sacked four times ... Threw for a then career-high 213 yards and passed for a touchdown with one interception in a fourth straight start against Air Force, completing 9 of 25 passes ... Also had a then career-long 55-yard pass to Fred Trevillion and a career-long 32-yard run ... Recorded his third second-half comeback win of the season ... Threw for 86 yards, completing 7 of 11 passes, in a fifth straight start against San José State ... Threw for a career-high 283 yards and a career-best three touchdown passes in a start at Nevada ... The 283 passing yards were the most by an Aztec since Quinn Kaehler threw for 326 against Air Force on Nov. 21, 2014, while the three touchdowns were the most by an Aztec since Christian Chapman threw three vs. Hawai'i on Nov. 5, 2016 ... Also set career highs in completions (20) and passing attempts (41) ... Threw for multiple touchdown passes for the second time of his career ... Threw to a season-high nine different receivers ... Was 4-for-6 for 58 yards in a seventh straight start at New Mexico as a team captain, playing two drives before giving way to Christian Chapman ... Improved to 6-1 as the starting quarterback ... Threw for 187 yards with a touchdown and an interception off the bench against UNLV, going 14-for-26 ... For his efforts, was named to the *Pro Football Focus* Mountain West Team of the Week and was an *Earl Campbell Tyler Rose* Honorable Mention Player of the Week ... Ran for 138 yards and one touchdown on 27 carries, while adding 26 receiving yards on two catches against No. 23/25 Arizona State ... Also added a 14-yard kick return ... Was named to the *Paul Hornung Award* weekly Honor Roll and to the *Pro Football Focus* Mountain West Team of the Week for his performance ...
