Postgame Football Notes — San Diego State vs. San José State

October 20, 2018
SDCCU Stadium | San Diego, Calif.

Streaks Extended

- San Diego State is bowl eligible for a ninth consecutive season. The Aztecs have played in a bowl game in a school-record eight straight years.
- SDSU won its sixth consecutive game, which is tied for the eighth-longest active streak in FBS play.
- San Diego State has at least a six-game winning streak in each of the last four seasons (2015-18). Only the Aztecs, Alabama, Clemson and Ohio State have recorded at least a six-game winning streak in every season since 2015.
- San Diego State is now 41-1 the last 42 times it has rushed for at least 200 yards and is 39-0 in its last 39 regular-season games when rushing for 200-plus yards. The Aztecs gained 207 yards on the ground tonight.
- SDSU won its seventh straight Mountain West game, tied for the fifth-longest active win streak in conference games.
- San Diego State won its seventh straight home game.
- The Aztecs defeated San José State for the sixth consecutive time. SDSU now has a two-game advantage in the series (21-19-2) for the first time in its series history with the Spartans.

Rocky Long Notes

• This marked Rocky Long's 100th game as the head coach at San Diego State. He is 70-30 (.700) since taking over the program in 2011 and amazingly 45-13 (.776) in conference play (47-13 (.783)) if you count the conference championship games).

Team Notes

- SDSU has won 18 of its last 22 games (18-4), 24 of its last 30 games (24-6), 37 of its last 44 games (37-7) and 38 since the 2015 season (38-10).
- The Aztecs improved to 25-4 in their last 29 regular-season Mountain West games and 27-4 in their last 31 against Mountain West opponents (includes MW championship games).
- SDSU improved to 16-1 in its last 17 games against Mountain West, West Division teams.
- SDSU outrushed its opponent for the sixth time in seven games this season.

Series Notes

- SDSU improved to 21-19-2 all-time against San Jose State.
- SDSU now has a two-game advantage in the series (21-19-2) for the first time in its series history with the Spartans.
- The Aztecs defeated San José State for the sixth consecutive time.
- SDSU trailed, 3-0, to the Spartans 6:04 into the game, marking the first time the Aztecs trailed the Spartans since there was 3:32 left in the 2013 game. San Diego State had led the Spartans for the previous 249 minutes, 36 seconds (249:36) of game time.

- SDSU has outscored the Spartans, 212-67, over the six-game winning streak and 178-37 over the last five games.
- The Aztecs allowed San José State to reach double-digits in points for the first time since the 2013 game. The Spartans had scored 7, 7, 3 and 7 over theirs last four games vs. SDSU.

Trends

- SDSU started with the ball for the 78th time in the last 91 games.
- The Aztecs have now gone 150 games without suffering a shutout (Nov. 18, 2006 at TCU), which is the second-longest streak among current Mountain West schools (Boise State at 272).
- SDSU allowed its opponent to score on its opening drive for just the 11th time since 2015 (48 games).
- The Aztecs won their 14th straight game when leading at the half, and improved to 5-0 this year and 50-9 in the Rocky Long era when leading at the half.
- San Diego State improved to 5-0 on the season and 22-9 in the Rocky Long era in games decided by seven or less points.
- The Aztecs improved to 2-0 on the season and 10-4 in the Rocky Long era in games decided by three or less points.
- The Aztecs won their 35th consecutive game when holding their opponent to 24 or less points (58-4 in the Rocky Long era) and 29th straight game when holding their opponent to 17 or less points (44-1 in the Rocky Long era).
- SDSU is now 34-4 since the start of the 2015 season when holding an opponent below 400 yards. SJSU had 295 yards of offense.
- San Diego State improved to 30-4 the last 34 times it has committed one turnover or less.
- The Aztecs have one turnover or less in 15 of their last 19 games.

Player Notes

* John Baron, Sr., K (3-for-3 FG, 1-for-1 PAT | 5 KO, 322 yds., 3 TB)

- Was 3-for-3 on field goal attempts and 1-for-1 on PATs.
- Is 4-for-4 from 50-plus yards this season and 5-for-7 for his career.
- Is now 13-for-15 (.867) on field goal attempts this season and 46-for-53 (.868) for his career.
- Made multiple field goals for the 16th time of his career (fifth time this season).

* Chase Jasmin, So., RB (19 att., 79 yds., 1 TD | 2 rec., 34 yds.)

- Rushed for 79 yards and one touchdown on 19 carries.
- Recorded his fourth rushing touchdown of the season and sixth of his career.
- Has a touchdown in three straight games for the first time of his career.
- Had a career-long 23-yard catch.
- Tied his career high with two receptions.
- Set a career high with 34 yards receiving. His previous best was four yards at Boise State earlier this season.

* Kyahva Tezino, Jr., LB (12 tackles, 0.5 TFL)

- Had a game-high 12 tackles, including eight solo stops.
- Recorded his third double-digit tackle game of the season and fifth of his career (all over his last nine games played).
- Led the team in tackles for the ninth time of his career, all of which have come over his last 12 outings.
- Has 6.0 tackles for loss on the season, which ties his single-season career mark, which was also accomplished in 2017 (11 games).
- Has 122 tackles and 12 tackles for loss over his last 12 games (first career 12 starts).

* Ryan Agnew, Jr., QB (7-for-11, 86 yds. | 5 att., 16 yds.)

- Threw for 86 yards on 7-for-11 passing.
- Improved to 5-0 as the starting quarterback.

- * Chance Bell, RS-Fr., RB (15 att., 81 yds.)
 - In his first career game, rushed for a team-high 81 yards on 15 carries.

* Tariq Thompson, So., S (2 tackles, 1 INT)

• Recorded his second interception of the season and the seventh of his career.

Other Notes

- CB Ron Smith started for the 26th consecutive game, the longest streak on the team (offense/defense).
- AZ Parker Baldwin played in his 48th straight game, the longest streak on the team.
- SDSU's captains tonight were AZ Parker Baldwin (third time this year), K John Baron (sixth time this year), RT Ryan Pope (third time this year) and LB Kyahva Tezino (second time this year).
- RB Kaegun Williams (RS-Fr.) and WR Kobe Smith (TR-Fr.) each started for the first time of their career.
- Players who logged their first career snaps were Chance Bell and Alama Uluave.
- Tonight's temperature was 70 degrees.
- Tonight's attendance was 30,451.
- Tonight's Honor Warrior was Marshall Faulk (1991-93).
