Directions To Viejas Arena

Take I-8 East to the College Avenue exit. Take College Avenue south towards SDSU. Turn right on Montezuma Road. Turn right on 55th Street. Viejas Arena is on the right-hand side.

Practice And Interviews

Media wishing to attend practice should contact the Aztec media relations department at least one day in advance.

Head coach Beth Burns and the players are generally available to meet with the media following each workout, as requested. Coaches and players are also available to conduct television and radio interviews, which must be set up through the media relations office at 619-594-2576.

Please request all interviews with a minimum of 24 hours notice. San Diego State players and coaches will not be available for interviews on game days until postgame.

SDSU BASKETBALL NETWORK



For the 10th straight year, Aztec women's basketball fans will have an opportunity to listen to live play-by-play of regular season and conference tournament games over the internet at **www.goaztecs.com**.

SDSU graduate Chris Ello (play-by-play) begins his fourth season with the team and is a familiar voice in the San Diego area. He currently plays host to a daily sports talk radio show, "The World of Sports According to Chris & Ben", on the all-sports station, XTRA Sports 1360 AM.

Ello started his career in sports talk in San Diego on XTRA Sports 690 in the summer of 1994. He has experience doing play-by-play for a variety of different sports at every level, including stints with the Aztec football (1985), baseball (1998-99) and men's basketball (2006-07) squads. The last three years, Ello has served as the color analyst for the SDSU football broadcasts.

From 1996-2006, he was the voice of the San Diego Gulls hockey team and has called the action for the San Diego Sockers (indoor soccer), San Diego Spirit (outdoor soccer), San Diego Wildcards (CBA) and San Diego Riptide (arena football). Ello also has experience broadcasting high school CIF football and basketball games since 2000.

Ello is a 1985 graduate of San Diego State with a bachelor's degree in journalism, where he spent two seasons with the baseball team from 1980-81 as a left-handed pitcher. A former sports editor at the *Daily Aztec*, he resides in Rancho San Diego with his wife, Lori.

For the fifth consecutive year, all regular season Aztec home contests, with the exception of the televised games, will also feature a live video feed to go along with the audio call from Viejas Arena on **www.goaztecs.com**.

MWC TELEVISION PACKAGE

The Mountain West Conference continues to receive unprecedented national television exposure through a combination of telecasts on The Mtn., CBS College Sports Network (formerly CSTV) and VERSUS. In 2009-10, 46 football, 94 men's basketball and 34 women's basketball Conference-controlled contests were broadcast nationally.

On Aug. 26, 2004, CBS College Sports Network (formerly CSTV) and the Mountain West Conference announced a visionary partnership that revolutionized the college sports landscape. The landmark agreement was the first NCAA Division I football and men's basketball conference-wide deal for CSTV and provided the network exclusive rights to all Conference events, including cable and satellite television coverage, national over-the-air and satellite radio, video-on-demand and online broadcast rights.

A succession of events since the fall of 2004 has improved the television model, including CSTV's joint venture with Comcast SportsNet to create The Mtn., and CBS Corporation's purchase of CSTV. CBS acquired CSTV in January 2006, and on Feb. 12, 2008, incorporated CSTV's cable, broadcast and online activities into its world-famous brand as the CBS College Sports Network (CBS C). The Mtn. is co-owned by CBS College Sports Network and Comcast SportNet.

The relationship with Comcast SportNet also delivered a new national broadcast partner in VERSUS. The MWC was the first exclusive college programming provider for the Comcast-owned entity, with football and both men's and women's basketball games. The CBS C/MWC partnership has guaranteed greater levels of television exposure for all league sports and has resoundingly met the fundamental goals of more exposure and preferred start times and dates.

In the summer of 2006, the centerpiece of this historic relationship was realized with the launch of The Mtn. – MountainWest Sports Network – the first sports network dedicated to serving a single collegiate athletic conference. Nearly 25,000 hours of MWC programming have aired on The Mtn. since the network's launch on Sept. 1, 2006, and over 260 MWC events are shown live annually through a combination of telecasts on The Mtn., CBS College Sports Network is currently in 38 million homes,



and available in 89 million nationwide. VERSUS is in 79 million households across the U.S.

The MWC has remained steadfast in its mission to promote the league's athletic events to national and regional television audiences and will continue to grow its new TV model. Previously, ESPN served as the league's inaugural official television partner, while in-house productions guaranteed coverage for several MWC Olympic sports. Through the league's first 10 years, excluding institutional local packages,

more than 1,350 football, volleyball, men's basketball and women's basketball events have aired on television, with 225 football games and over 260 men's basketball contests broadcast nationally.

In 2006-07, the Mountain West Conference had 32 women's basketball games on regional and national television, while in 2007-08, The Mtn. televised 25 live women's basketball games. The network also produces halftime and post-game shows during the season.

Two years ago, 33 games involving Mountain West Conference teams were televised nationally with 26 games shown on The Mtn., six

games live on CBS C, while the MWC tournament championship game, between the Aztecs and Utes, was seen live on VERSUS.

The 2009-10 women's basketball broadcast schedule featured 34 games on national television, including seven involving the Aztecs. This season, the slate involves 40



contests on national television, with 20 broadcasts on The Mtn., six on CBS College Sports Network and the league's tournament championship game on VERSUS.

San Diego State will have the MWC's first televised game of 2010-11 for the second consecutive campaign when it plays host to UCLA on Friday, Nov. 12, against UCLA at 7 p.m. PT on The Mtn., which is carried nationally by DIRECTV (Channel 616) and numerous cable



operators representing over 200 municipalities in nine states. CBS College Sports Network is widely available on cable systems across the country and via satellite on DIRECTV (Channel 613) and Dish Network (Channel 152).

SEASON PREVIEW NOTES

PRESEASON HONORS

Coming off a Mountain West Conference championship and a trip to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen, the Aztec women's basketball program received a number of preseason accolades.

As a team, San Diego State received votes in both national preseason top-25 polls for the second campaign in a row. The Aztecs garnered the 34th-most votes (22 total) in the USA Today/ESPN coaches edition, while they had the 37th-most votes (8 total) in the Associated Press Top 25.

In conference action, SDSU has been tabbed to finish second in the league in 2011 in a vote by the nine head coaches and select media members, receiving three first-place votes and 147 points overall to trail only TCU, which had 16 first-place votes (174 points).

SDSU, which has been picked first or second each of the last three years, just edged out Brigham Young for second place, as the Cougars had 145 points and garnered the other two first-place votes. Utah was picked fourth, followed by Wyoming, New Mexico, UNLV, Colorado State and Air Force.

San Diego State has posted its two highest finishes in conference history the last two seasons, tying with Utah for first place in 2009, and for third place in 2010.

INDIVIDUAL ACCOLADES

Aztec senior center Paris Johnson was tabbed to the fivemember preseason all-league squad for the third straight year at the MWC's annual media day. In addition, sophomore guard Courtney Clements, who redshirted a year ago after transferring from Arizona, was picked as the MWC's newcomer of the year and guard Melissa Sweat was chosen preseason freshman of the year.

Clements is the second SDSU player in a row to pick up the MWC's preseason newcomer of the year distinction, as senior Jessika Bradley was honored and went on to win the award last March.

Sweat, meanwhile, is the second Aztec on the current roster to earn the league's preseason freshman-of-the-year award, joining Johnson, who was honored in 2007.

2009-10 REWIND

The San Diego State women's basketball team made a remarkable run in 2009-10. Below are a few of the accomplishments of last year's team:

• Earned its first-ever final top 25 ranking in the *ESPN/USA Today* Coaches poll (No. 20), becoming the first MWC school to do so since 2006. The No. 20 spot ties as the program's highest-ever final ranking in a national poll (No. 20 in AP in 1985)

• Earned the program's first AP top 25 regular-season ranking since 1995 (Nov. 23 - No. 23)

• Posted back-to-back seasons with at least 23 wins for the first time since 1994-95 (24) and 1993-94 (26) ... Logged the program's 13th, 20-win campaign with six of those coming under coach Beth Burns ... Had an eight-game win streak, the team's longest since 1996-97

• Recorded three wins over AP top-25 teams (No. 10 West Virginia, No. 17 Texas, No. 23 TCU) ... Eight of 11 losses were to teams advancing to the NCAAs, including three vs. teams advancing to the Sweet 16

• Earned the program's first NCAA Sweet 16 appearance (64-team bracket) and won two NCAA games in the same season for the first time in school history.



 Garnered the program's eighth NCAA tournament bid and made back-to-back NCAA appearances for the first time since 1994-95

• Was the lowest seed to advance to the Sweet 16 since 2007, was the first No. 11 seed to advance to the Sweet 16 since 2004, and the first MWC team to advance to the Sweet 16 since 2006 ... Was the 12th double-digit seed all-time to advance to the Sweet 16

 Won its first MWC championship title and advanced to its third consecutive MWC championship game

THE YEAR IN NUMBERS

The Aztecs' success also translated into big numbers in the stat columns. Here are some of the 2009-10 team's statistical highlights:

• SDSU led the MWC in field-goal percentage (44.5), three-point field-goal defense (27.0), blocked shots (5.4), of fensive rebound percentage (40.7) and victories (23 - tied).

• SDSU ended the year ranked eighth nationally in threepoint field goal percentage defense, 18th in blocks per game, 22nd in field goal percentage and 25th in assists per game.

• The Aztecs limited 18 of its 34 opponents to under 60 points a game, including a 55-spot by No. 10 West Virginia. Eight foes scored 50 or fewer points and three didn't reach the 40-point barrier.

• Twelve of the Aztecs' 23 wins were by 19 or more points, after posting only six such victories in 2008-09.

• SDSU held opponents to three or fewer 3-pointers in a game 20 times last season, including a combined 3-for-22 mark in the NCAA First & Second Rounds.

• The Aztecs shot at least 40 percent from the field in 26 of 34 outings, topping the 45 mark on 14 occasions. The team's final season field-goal percentage of 44.5 is its best

since the 1995-96 squad shot 45.6 percent.

• SDSU posted a school-record 155 three-pointers for the second season in a row and improved its team free-throw percentage from 61.2 in 2008-09 to 69.9 in 2009-10.

INTERESTING FACTS ABOUT 2010-11

Coming off one of the most successful seasons in Aztec basketball history, here are a few other things to look for in 2010-11:

• SDSU finished its regular-season home campaign with a 12-2 record in 2009-10. Combined with the 2008-09 squad that went 15-1, the Aztecs recorded back-to-back campaigns with double-digit wins at home for the first time since the 1996-97 squad went 11-2 and the 1995-96 team was 13-0.

Overall, the Aztecs have claimed 27 of their last 30 home games, entering the season.

• SDSU is scheduled to play the program's 1,000th game on Nov. 26, when the Aztecs take on Minnesota in Reno, Nev. San Diego State has an all-time record of 528-468.

• The Aztecs have 34 Mountain West Conference wins in the last four seasons after having only 19 in the league's first seven years.

• SDSU has advanced to the final of the Mountain West Conference Championships three years in a row, after not winning a single game in the MWC tournament's first eight years of existence.

THE 2010-11 AZTECS

Back Again: San Diego State returns three starters, including senior center Paris Johnson, senior forward Jessika Bradley and senior guard Coco Davis. Three other letterwinners also are back in juniors Candace Chambers and Kalena Tutt and sophomore Gabrielle Clark, who redshirted a year ago after lettering in 2008-09.

Noting The Newcomers: Of the 13 student-athletes on this year's roster, eight players did not compete for a full season with the Aztecs in 2009-10.

Four of the eight were on campus, but sophomores Courtney Clements and Malia Nahinu both had to sit out a year after transferring from Arizona. Gabrielle Clark and Kiyana Stamps, meanwhile, each tore an ACL either before the season began (Clark) or less than two games into the campaign (Stamps), and utilized their medical redshirt year.

Two players, guards Chelsea Hopkins and Sajoyia Griffin, came from Duke and South Plains College, respectively, while guard Melissa Sweat and forward Jasmine Porter are true freshmen.

Overall, five players account for 341 of the 366 total career games played (93.2 percent) in an Aztec uniform by the entire SDSU 2010-11 roster.

The Schedule: Seven nationally-televised games, three non-conference tournaments and the season-opener against UCLA highlight the 2010-11 San Diego State schedule.

SDSU is slated to have as many as five non-conference outings against schools advancing to the postseason a year ago, including three teams who earned trips to the second round of the NCAA tournament in UCLA, Dayton and Texas A&M. Combined with their Mountain West Conference opponents, the Aztecs could have as many as 15 regular-season contests vs. teams that earned either NCAA or WNIT bids in 2010.
