San Diego State Faces Saint Mary's For Second Time This Season in NIT Quarterfinals

San Diego State (25-9 overall; 11-5 Mountain West Conference) will look for redemption Wednesday night in the quarterfinals of the NIT against a Saint Mary's team it lost to earlier this season on a neutral court. The game is slated for 6 p.m. PT and will be televised by ESPN2 with Ron Franklin and Fran Fraschilla calling the action. The winner of the contest will move on to the semifinals in New York City.

The top-seeded Aztecs are coming off a dominating 70-52 victory over Kansas State in the second round last Friday at the University of San Diego's Jenny Craig Pavilion. The second-seeded Gaels (28-6; 10-4 West Coast Conference), meanwhile, make the quick turnaround to face SDSU after dismissing Davidson, 80-68, on Monday in Moraga.

Game Tidbits:

► San Diego State looks to snap a two-game losing streak against Saint Mary's. Each of the last two defeats have come in Anaheim, Calif., at the John R. Wooden Classic. In 2007, the Gaels emerged with the 69-64 victory and followed it with a 67-64 victory earlier this season at Honda Center.

► SDSU, which is making its first-ever appearance in the third round of a postseason tournament as a Division I school, will look to add to its school-record victory total of 25 wins. Prior to last Friday night, no San Diego State squad had ever won 25 games. Since 1921-22, only four teams (1939, 1941, 1967, 2006) had won 24 games in one campaign.

► San Diego State will look to secure its spot in the NIT semifinals at an arena where it boasts a 52-9 record since the 2005-06 season. This year, SDSU is 14-2 at Cox Arena with losses coming to No. 15 Arizona State (Nov. 18) and Brigham Young (Feb. 24), both 2009 NCAA Tournament participants.

SDSU and the NIT

- ▶ San Diego State is making its fifth postseason NIT appearance in school history and its third appearance in the last three years.
- ▶ This is just the third time in SDSU's Division I history that the Aztecs have made it past the first round of play. They also did it in 2003 and 2007, but this is the first time San Diego State has made it to third-round action.
- ▶ In five NIT appearances, the Aztecs are 4-4 with wins coming against UC Santa Barbara in 2003, which was SDSU's first Division I postseason tournament victory, against Missouri State in 2007 and this year vs. Weber State and Kansas State.
- ▶ The game on Wednesday represents just the fifth NIT game the Aztecs have played host to. In addition to Weber State in the first round and Kansas State last Friday, San Diego State welcomed UC Irvine to the San Diego Sports Arena in 1982 and lost, 70-69. In 2003, SDSU played host to UCSB and won in overtime, 67-62.
- ▶ Last year, San Diego State played its first-round game at two-time defending national champion Florida and were handed a 73-49 defeat in Gainesville.

SDSU and the Postseason

- ▶ San Diego State is making its 10th Division I postseason appearance and have earned a postseason berth four straight years, the longest streak in school Division I history.
- ▶ Steve Fisher has led the Aztecs to seven of their

11 Division I postseason tournaments. Fisher guided SDSU to the 2002 and 2006 NCAA Tournament and the 2003, 2007, 2008 and now 2009 NIT.

Fisher and the Postseason

San Diego State head coach Steve Fisher knows a little something about the postseason. The 1989 national championship coach, who also won the postseason NIT title in 1997, owns an overall postseason tournament record of 29-12 and an NIT record of 9-4.

Storylines and Tidbits

- ▶ At 25-9, San Diego State posted its fourth consecutive 20-win campaign, the fifth time the Aztecs have reached the 20-victory plateau under Steve Fisher, its seventh 20-win campaign in 39 Division I seasons and the 14th time in the 88-year history of the program. Fisher has guided San Diego State to four straight 20-win seasons after the Aztecs had zero 20-win campaigns in a 16-year stretch from 1985-86 through 2000-01.
- ▶ This is just the second time in school history that San Diego State has posted four straight 20-win seasons. The other occurrence was a four-year run from 1937-38 to 1940-41, when San Diego State advanced to the NAIB Tournament (now NAAIA).
- ▶ The 2008-09 team, which features six seniors (Ryan Amoroso, Kelvin Davis, Kyle Spain, Matt Thomas, Lorenzo Wade and Richie Williams), has produced the most victories in the past four seasons (91) and the past three seasons (71) in any pe-

► One reason for San Diego State's success this season has been tenacious defense. The Aztecs are allowing just 59.0 points per game. In 34 games this season, the Aztecs have held their opponent to less than 60 points on 19 occasions, posting a 17-2 record in those games. San Diego State's opponents are shooting just 40.8 percent from the field and the Aztecs have held 13 opponents to less than 40-percent field-goal shooting, winning 12 of those 13 contests. In eight straight games and 13 of the last 15 contests, San Diego State has held its opponent to 41.8-percent field-goal shooting or less from the field.

► In the last eight games, the Aztecs have held their opponents to 36.7-percent field-goal shooting and 22.1 percent three-point field-goal shooting.

Keys to the Game

- San Diego State is 21-2 this season when owning a better field-goal percentage than its opponent.
- SDSU is 17-2 when holding the opponent to less than 60 points.
- The Aztecs are 12-1 when holding opponents to less than 40-percent field goal shooting.
- SDSU has won 55 consecutive games when leading with five minutes to play in regulation.

Top-10 Ranking

Through games of March 22, San Diego State ranks 10th nationally in NCAA Division I in scoring defense, allowing 59.0 points per game.

Looking to Get Over the Hump

Saint Mary's has driven San Diego State crazy over the last two meetings. The Gaels sport a 2-0 record vs. the Aztecs and have won both games by a combined eight points on a neutral court.

SDSU played well enough to win both games, but free throws eventually doomed the Scarlet and Black. In 2007, San Diego State finished with an 8-for-18 performance from the stripe and earlier this year ended the game going 4-of-12 from the line.

School Record For Wins in a Season

With its win last Friday vs. Kansas State, San Diego State set a new school record for wins in a single season with 25. Prior to the outcome, the school record was 24 victories accomplished by the 1938-39, 1940-41, 1966-67 and 2005-06 squads.

In the Third Round for the First Time

San Diego State is making its first appearance in the third round of a national postseason tournament as a Division I institution, which dates back to 1970-71. SDSU has only made it to the third round twice as a Division II school (1957, 1967) and three times as an NAIA program (1939, 1940, 1941). The 1941 ballclub went on to win the NAIA national championship.

SDSU-Saint Mary's Series History

- SDSU and Saint Mary's are meeting for the ninth time with the Gaels owning a 5-3 series lead.
- This is the first time in the history of the series that SDSU and SMC are playing twice in one season.
- San Diego State has never lost to Saint Mary's three consecutive times. The last time SDSU had

lost two in a row to the Gaels (2003-04, 2004-05), MWC and SDSU all-time leading scorer Brandon Heath hit a halfcourt shot at the buzzer giving the Aztecs a 74-73 season-opening victory in Moraga in 2005-06.

► Head coach Steve Fisher is just 1-4 against Saint Mary's. All of his meetings have occurred as coach of the Aztecs.

► The games have been rather close recently as the last three meetings have been decided by a combined nine points and the last four have been decided by 18 points. The first four games, meanwhile, were decided by a combined 67 points.

Most Recent Meeting: Saint Mary's vs. San Diego State

► **Saint Mary's 67, SDSU 64 | Dec. 13, 2008**

ANAHEIM, Calif. - San Diego State fell to Saint Mary's at the John R. Wooden Classic for the second straight season, this time by a score of 67-64 in front of 14,163 at Honda Center.

SDSU received a 17-point, 10-rebound effort from Tim Shelton, but it wasn't enough to prevent San Diego State from dropping its second straight game.

Both teams stayed within a few points of each other for the first 10 minutes until Patrick Mills sparked a 10-0 run with the game tied at 20. The streak was broken after D.J. Gay laid the ball in to put an end to SDSU's 5:03 scoring drought. Gay's basket led to a 13-7 Aztec spurt to cut the SMC lead to 37-33 at halftime.

In the second period, Saint Mary's held a comfortable lead until SDSU scored eight unanswered points with roughly five minutes left to take a 62-61 lead with 2:26 left in regulation. Mills, however, responded for the Gaels with a jumper and his effort was followed by a Diamon Simpson layup and

an Omar Samhan 12-foot jumper as the shot clock wound down, giving SMC a five-point lead with 24 seconds left.

On the ensuing possession, Shelton was fouled in the act of shooting, made the basket, pulling SDSU to within 67-64, and went to the line where he missed the free throw. The freshman got one of his career-high 10 rebounds, missed the put back and numerous Aztec tip attempts failed after that. The ball eventually found Lorenzo Wade at the top the three-point arc and his shot rimmed off giving Saint Mary's the win.

Notes from the Kansas State Second Round NIT Game

► With its 25th victory of the season, San Diego State sets an all-time school record for most victories in a season. In 88 seasons of basketball, the Aztecs had won 24 games four times prior to this season (1938-39, 1940-41, 1996-97 and 2005-06).

► It marked the first time the Aztecs have won a second round game in any Division I postseason tournament. The last time SDSU won a second round game was the 1967 NCAA Division II championship.

► San Diego State snapped an eight-game losing streak against teams from automatic qualifying BCS conferences. Prior to tonight, the Aztecs' last win over one of the six BCS leagues was Nov. 18, 2006.

► San Diego State became the fourth non-Big 12 school to beat Kansas Sate this season, joining Kentucky, Iowa and Oregon.

► San Diego State has won seven of its last eight games and 12 of its last 16 games. The Aztecs improve to 6-1 during the month of March.

► The decision marked Kansas State's third-worst margin of defeat in its last 16 games, eclipsed only by a 73-51 loss at Nebraska and a 94-74 loss at No. 11/8 (AP/coaches) Missouri on Feb. 25.

► San Diego State never trailed in the victory, marking the seventh time this season the Aztecs have won a game in which it did not trail. The Aztecs have now won 19 games in which it never trailed after intermission.

► Richie Williams (14 points, 3 rebounds, 1 assist and 4 steals) reached double-figures for the sixth time this season and the first time since Feb. 28 (at TCU)... It was the 28th time he has scored 10 or more points in a game in his career... Williams had four steals, his second-highest figure of the season.

► Billy White (15 points, 4 rebounds, 1 assist, 3 blocked shots and 1 steal) scored in double figures for the 12th time this season and the 26th time in his career... He reached double figures in consecutive games for the first time since doing it in three straight games from (Jan. 31-Feb. 7)... White had three blocked shots, which was one off his career high, and the Aztecs improved to 12-3 this season when he has at least one block.

► Kyle Spain (16 points, 7 rebounds, 2 assist, 2 steals) reached double figures for the second consecutive game and the ninth time in his last 10 outings... Spain has record 10 or more points in 26 games this season and 60 times in his four seasons at SDSU... The senior had 16 points to lead all scorers... It was the 16th time he has led the team in scoring... Spain led the team in rebounding with seven boards... He has led the team in rebounding a team-best 10 times this year.

It Wasn't Cox, But It Was Good Enough

Due to the first and second rounds of the NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament at Cox Arena, San Diego State moved its contest with Kansas State to the University of San Diego's Jenny Craig Pavilion. Despite being just 2-2 in the building in the past, SDSU and its fans made it feel like Cox with another victory within county lines. Despite its neutral court feel, the game was considered home game, which upped the Aztecs' overall home record to 15-2.

White Starts Another Streak

Billy White, who had made 22 consecutive field goals earlier this season, started another streak against Weber State in the first round of the NIT. After missing his first three shot attempts, White made his last four against WSU and then followed that performance with a 6-for-6 effort against Kansas State, running streak streak to 10 straight made field goal attempts.

During his 22 consecutive field goals made streak, White made his last five vs. Air Force, both of his attempts at Utah, all 12 vs. Wyoming, did not have an attempt at New Mexico, a game where he hurt his knee and missed the next three games, went 1-for-1 at UNLV and then made his first two attempts against the Runnin' Rebels in the MWC Tournament quarterfinals before missing his third attempt in the second half.

Wade Bringing It

Lorenzo Wade has been bringing it in his last five games as he has turned in three 20-point performances and two double-doubles. In the five-game span, Wade is averaging 16.8 points, 6.8 rebounds, 2.8 assists and 2.0 steals. He is also shooting 46.2 percent from the floor and has made all 19 free throws. In total, Wade has made a career-best 23 straight free tosses.

Wade Impressive in Las Vegas

Lorenzo Wade had an impressive showing in his return to his hometown of Las Vegas at last week's MWC Championships. Wade helped the Aztecs advance to the championship by leading the team in scoring (18.7), rebounding (6.7) and steals (2.3) over the course of three games. In the quarterfinals against host UNLV, Wade finished with 20 points and 10 rebounds before torching No. 25 BYU in the semifinals with 24 points and seven boards. In the final against Utah, Wade struggled shooting the ball, but still led the team in scoring with 12 points. Following the tournament, Wade was named to the all-tournament team.

Amoroso Produces in Sin City

After scoring in double figures just eight times this season and having zero double-digit rebounding efforts, Ryan Amoroso arguably had his best three-game stretch of the season at the MWC Championships in Las Vegas.

Against UNLV in the quarters, Amoroso finished with 10 points and he just missed the 10-point plateau vs. BYU in the semifinals with nine points. Then in the final vs. Utah, Amoroso set a new career high for rebounds with 15 and added 11 points.

In the three games, Amoroso averaged 10.0

points (54.2 FG) and ranked second on the team in rebounding with 6.3. His MWC tournament numbers are 2.7 points and 2.8 rebounds better than his season averages.

Four Aztecs Earn All-Conference Recognition

Four San Diego State men's basketball players earned all-Mountain West Conference accolades, the league announced on Monday. In a vote by MWC coaches and media, Kyle Spain and Lorenzo Wade were selected to the second team, Richie Williams to the third team and Billy White was an honorable mention pick. Williams was also named to the all-defensive team.

Spain is a first-time selection and comes following a regular season in which he led the team in scoring (14.4), rebounding (5.4), three-point field-goal percentage (.410) and free-throw percentage (.867). A senior from Newark, Calif., Spain ranked in the top 10 in the MWC in free-throw percentage (1st), steals (7th), offensive rebounds (7th), scoring (9th), rebounding (10th) and three-point field goals made (10th). Spain posted a pair of double-doubles in 2008-09 and led the team in scoring on 15 different occasions, in rebounding nine times and in assists three times.

Wade, meanwhile, becomes a three-time honoree after being an honorable mention choice as a sophomore, a first-team pick last season as a junior and a second-team member in his third and final year at SDSU. The Las Vegas, Nev., native ended the regular season ranked No. 2 on the team in scoring (13.8) and assists (54) despite missing 10 games. In 19 games, Wade led the team in scoring and assists on five occasions and scored in double figures 17 times. In MWC games only, Wade ranked among the league leaders in scoring (7th), assists (8th), minutes played (9th) and rebounding (19th).

Like Spain, Williams is a first-time all-conference selection earning a spot on the third team and the all-defensive team. A four-year starting point guard, Williams is averaging 7.2 points, 4.4 rebounds, 3.7 assists and 2.2 steals. The senior from San Diego led the league in steals (all games and conference game only) and became the MWC's all-time career leader in the category (234). Williams also owns the Mountain West's all-time record for career assists (459). At 5-10, Williams is one of the top rebounders in the league averaging 4.4 for the season (18th), 4.8 in league play (17th) and recently grabbed a career-high 11 at TCU on his way to his first career double-double. Williams has scored in double figures five times this year and has led the team in assists 19 different outings.

For the second straight season, sophomore Billy White has garnered all-conference accolades. White, who was a third-team pick and freshman of the year choice last year, was voted to the honorable mention squad. Hailing from Las Vegas, Nev., White ranks first on the team in field-goal percentage (.662) and in blocks (19) and is third on the team in steals (28). White is also averaging 8.7 points and 3.8 rebounds in 26 games. Against Wyoming, White went 12-for-12 from the field to establish school and conference records for most field goals without a miss and currently has made 20 consecutive field-goals. White is first in the league in field-goal percentage and is shooting an

unbelievable 77.1 percent in MWC action.

This is the eighth straight season in which SDSU has had at least three players recognized by the league's coaches and media and the ninth consecutive campaign in which an Aztec has been honored at season's end. This is also just the fourth time that four San Diego State players have earned all-conference recognition, joining the 2003, 2004 and 2007 squads.

Seniors Go Out In Style

The San Diego State seniors went out in style in their final home game at Cox Arena as they guided SDSU to an 11-point victory over UNLV. The senior fivesome of Ryan Amoroso, Kyle Spain, Matt Thomas, Lorenzo Wade and Richie Williams combined to score 48 of the team's 57 points (84.2 percent). They also accounted for all six steals, nine of the team's 10 assists and 20 of the Aztecs' 39 rebounds. They led San Diego State to its second-ever regular-season sweep of UNLV.

Spain and Wade Named to NABC All-District 17 First Team

Seniors Kyle Spain and Lorenzo Wade have been named to the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Division I All-District 17 First Team, the NABC announced this week.

SDSU was the only school to have a pair of representatives on the first team and the Aztec duo was joined by UNLV's Wink Adams, Utah's Luke Nevill and Brigham Young's Lee Cummond.

Spain, from Newark, Calif., earns his first career honor after leading the team in scoring (14.4 points) and rebounding (5.4). The senior, who has made 25 starts while playing in all 28 games, also leads SDSU in three-point field goals (54) and free-throw percentage (.871). This season, Spain has two double-doubles and has scored in double figures a team-best 21 times.

Wade, meanwhile, joins Spain on the first team after being a second-team choice a year ago. The Las Vegas, Nev., native is second on the team in scoring (13.8), but is San Diego State's top scoring threat in conference games only, averaging a team-best 15.2 points. During MWC action, Wade is shooting 48.3 percent from the field and is second on the team in assists (3.2).

This is the fourth straight year in which an Aztec has garnered NABC all-district honors and is the first season since 2006 that San Diego State has had more than one player recognized (Brandon Heath, Marcus Slaughter).

Free-Throw Machine

SDSU senior Kyle Spain has been nearly automatic at the free-throw line this year shooting at a team-leading 83.3 percent clip. In his last three outings to close the regular season, Spain went 10-for-10 at TCU, followed it with a 6-for-6 performance vs. Colorado State and finished the UNLV game by making 7-of-8. Before his miss on his second attempt vs. the Rebels, Spain had made a season-high 19 straight free throws. So far this year, Spain has had streaks of 19, 18 twice, 17 and 12 in a row. His career best is 20 straight.

Davis Honored by USBWA

Kelvin Davis was selected as the 2009 recipient

of the U.S. Basketball Writers Association's "Most Courageous Award" on Wednesday, March 4. Davis will be honored at the USBWA's Awards Breakfast Monday, April 6, at the Renaissance Marriott in downtown Detroit. In addition, he will be the recipient of a \$1,000 check, which he will donate to the charity or scholarship fund of his choice.

The Most Courageous Award was established in 1978 and has been given annually to a player, coach, official or administrator who has demonstrated extraordinary courage reflecting honor in the sport of amateur basketball.

Among the more notable recipients over the years have been Jacksonville coach Bob Wenzel, Arizona guard Steve Kerr, Indiana forward Landon Turner, referee Pete Pavia, North Carolina State coach Jim Valvano, Arkansas coach Nolan Richardson, the 2001 Oklahoma State basketball team and the 2007 Duquesne basketball team.

Davis Also Honored by V Foundation

Davis was also recognized as one of 12 finalists for the V Foundation Comeback Award, it was announced on Tuesday, March 3. The award is presented in conjunction with ESPN and the recipient will be announced during ESPN's basketball Final Four/NIT weekend coverage.

The annual award is open to men and women collegiate basketball student-athletes in all divisions. It is awarded to an individual or a team who has accomplished a personal triumph in the face of true adversity, be it in health, life or moral dilemma. Student-athletes are nominated by their athletics department representative.

The 2009 recipient will be selected by an eight-member sub-committee of The V Foundation Board of Directors.

Williams Claims Another Record

At TCU, senior point guard Richie Williams reached the conference pinnacle for career assists. The San Diego native entered the TCU game with 450 career helpers and was just three shy of tying Wyoming's Jay Straight (453) for the all-time conference lead. When the dust settled, Williams finished the game with four assists to situate himself atop the all-time conference chart. Earlier this season, Williams became San Diego State's and the MWC's all-time leader in steals.

Little Big Man

In addition, setting the Mountain West career assists record, Richie Williams, 5-10, posted his first career double-double with 14 points and a personal-best 11 rebounds, nine of which on the defensive glass at TCU. It marked the second straight game in which he led the team in rebounding. Williams also entered the MWC Championships ranked No. 2 on the team in rebounding for conference games only at 4.8 per game.

Senior Trio Solid

The San Diego State senior trio of Kyle Spain, Lorenzo Wade and Richie Williams has been a source of consistency throughout their final season on Montezuma Mesa.

Between Spain and Williams, the two have played in all 34 games and have started all but six games this season. Spain has led the team in scor-

ing 16 times and reached double figures 26 times. Additionally, Spain has led the squad in rebounding 10 times. Williams, meanwhile, has played an average of 30.2 minutes (No. 2 on team) and ranks first on the team in assists and steals. For the year, Williams has led the Aztecs in assists in 21 of their 34 games and has been the team's top rebounder four times this year.

Since coming back from suspension, Wade is showing why he was picked as a preseason all-conference selection back in October. In his last 17 games played, the Las Vegas native is averaging 16.1 points per game with a season-high 25 coming at Colorado State, 20 at UNLV in the MWC quarters, 24 vs. BYU in the MWC semifinals and 20 vs. Weber State in the first round of the NIT. Wade, who scored in double figures in a career-high 10 straight outings, had his streak snapped at New Mexico after scoring just eight points, but has rebounded with double-figure scoring games in eight of his last nine games.

White's Streak Snapped

Billy White, who came into the quarterfinal game with UNLV having made his last 20 field goals, had his streak snapped in the second half against the Rebels. White made his first two field goal attempts to run his streak to 22, but missed early after halftime to end his shooting run. The Las Vegas native was three baskets short of tying the NCAA record of 25 consecutive field goals set by American's Ray Voelkel in 1978 (covering nine games).

White set a school record for most field goals without a miss in the game vs. Wyoming at home after he went 12-for-12 from the floor. The Las Vegas native broke Aeric Sanders' 11-for-11 performance set in 2003 against Eastern Washington. Prior to the Wyoming game, White made both of his attempts at Utah and scored on his last five attempts vs. Air Force. In his those three games, White was 20 for his last 21.

In addition to setting a new school record, White's effort vs. the Cowboys broke the Mountain West Conference record most field goals without a miss in all games and MWC games and established the sophomore record for all games and league games as well.

With his perfect shooting performance vs. Wyoming, Billy White also became the 44th player in NCAA Division I history to finish a game going at least 12-for-12 from the field. White also became the second player this season to accomplish the feat, joining Boston College's Corey Raji, who went 12-for-12 from the floor on Dec. 23. The NCAA record holder is Clifford Rozier of Louisville, who hit all 15 of his shot attempts in 1993.

Coming Up Big In OT

For the second time this season, Kyle Spain came up big in overtime to help propel the Aztecs to victory. Earlier this season at UNLV, Spain

scored eight of his 17 points in the extra session to lead SDSU to a 68-66 win. And then at TCU, Spain connected on all six free throws and scored six of the Aztecs' 10 overtime points to guide SDSU to a 79-77 victory.

It is also worth noting that Lorenzo Wade was a solid performer in OT as he made his last three free throws and came up with a huge blocked shot on a three-point attempt with the Aztecs up by one with nine seconds left in the game.

Like Clockwork

When D.J. Gay scores in double figures, the Aztecs win. Period. The sophomore guard has reached the double-figure scoring plateau 10 times this season and each of those times San Diego State hung one in the win column.

After being held to single digits in four straight games, a streak where SDSU when 1-3, Gay broke out with 13 points and made a career-high tying five free throws on Saturday at TCU.

The set of circumstances do not only apply to this season, they apply to Gay's Aztec career as SDSU is 17-2 when he scores in double figures.

Creating Extra Opportunities

Leading the league and ranking in the top 20 nationally in scoring defense helps win games, but giving yourself extra opportunities to score does as well and that is something San Diego State has done well this season. At season's end (all games), the Aztecs are first in the league in steals (8.17) and offensive rebounds (12.21). And the same can be said for MWC games only as SDSU is No. 1 offensive rebounds (11.25) and No. 2 in steals (7.56).

The Defense Never Rests

San Diego State hangs its hat on defense and is the top team in the Mountain West Conference in scoring defense as it allows just 59.0 points a game (as of March 21).

Prior to Northern Colorado scoring 62 on Dec. 3, SDSU held six straight opponents to 59 or less to open the season, something that had not been done since the 1949-50 campaign.

70 and Above is a Good Thing

SDSU has had tremendous success when scoring at least 70 points in a game. Dating back to the 2006-07 season, SDSU had won 22 straight games when reaching 70 points until Wyoming snapped that streak on Jan. 14. Since the beginning of that year, the Aztecs have won 43 of 47 when scoring at least 70. This season, the Scarlet and Black is 13-2 when hitting the 70-point mark.

Williams is the New Steals King

In the second game of the season series vs. Air Force, senior Richie Williams became San Diego State's and the MWC's all-time leader in steals. The San Diego native needed two steals to break the 217 set by former Aztec Brandon Heath and he accomplished the feat right before the half against Air Force. Williams ended the game with a game-high four and currently has 237 steals.

Streak Stoppers

San Diego State put an end to a pair of UNLV homecourt winning streaks earlier this year. With

the 68-66 overtime decision, the Aztecs stopped the Runnin' Rebels 27-game home winning streak against MWC opponents and snapped their 21-game home winning streak against MWC foes in games played during the regular season. Then five weeks later, SDSU went into Thomas & Mack Center and beat UNLV again in the quarterfinals of the MWC Championships. San Diego State became the first school since SMU in 1999 to win twice at TMC in one season.

Thomas First to Win Four at TMC

San Diego State fifth-year senior Matt Thomas became the first player in school history to be a part of an Aztec team to beat UNLV inside Thomas & Mack Center four times. Thomas helped SDSU leave Las Vegas with wins in 2005, 2006 and two in 2009. Additionally, Kyle Spain and Richie Williams became the second and third players in school history to escape Thomas & Mack with a win three times in their careers.

Wade Reaches 1,000 in SDSU Uniform

Lorenzo Wade needed 12 points at UNLV to reach 1,000 career points while at SDSU and 12 is what he got. The senior became the 24th player in school history to reach the 1,000-point plateau and the second this season. Earlier this year in the game vs. TCU, Kyle Spain hit the mark on a pair of free throws. The duo are the sixth and seventh players to accomplish the feat while playing for 10th-year head coach Steve Fisher.

Filling Up the Stat Sheet

Richie Williams has always filled up the stat sheet, but none more so than against BYU and TCU in the first half of league play. At BYU, the senior went for nine points, a team-high six rebounds and a game-high tying six assists, not to mention a season-best five steals. Then vs. TCU, the San Diego native recorded 13 points, a career- and game-high nine rebounds, a game-high six assists, a career-high one blocked shot and two steals. The blocked shot against TCU was his first since March 8, 2007, vs. Colorado State at the MWC Tournament.

Spain Hits 30-Point Mark

Senior Kyle Spain scored a career-high 30 points on the strength of 8-for-12 shooting, 3-for-6 from beyond the arc and 11-for-14 from the charity stripe against New Mexico. The senior became the 27th player in SDSU history to record a 30-point game and was the first Aztec since Brandon Heath to reach 30 points in a game (30 vs. BYU, Feb. 24, 2007). Spain's performance was the 55th 30-point game in the history of the program.

20/20 Vision

Against New Mexico at Cox Arena, Kyle Spain (30 points) and Lorenzo Wade (21 points) eclipsed the 20-point plateau, marking the second time this season an Aztec doing has accomplished the feat.

Earlier this year in San Diego State's non-conference tilt vs. CS Northridge, Spain and D.J. Gay poured in 22 and 20 points, respectively. The duo's effort was the first time two Aztecs scored at least 20 points in a game since Feb. 22, 2007, vs. No. 21/22 Brigham Young inside Cox Arena. That night, Brandon Heath scored 30 points and a Mo-

hamed Abukar checked in with 27.

Butler-Hancock Brings Out Best in Shelton

It may have been below 20 degrees outside of Butler-Hancock Sports Pavilion on the campus of Northern Colorado, but Tim Shelton's shooting certainly wasn't. The freshman was perfect in all aspects when it came to shooting as he finished with a stat line that read: 6-6 FG, 2-2 3FG, 3-3 FT.

All of that led to a career-high 17 points, 12 of which came in the first half to help the Aztecs to a 34-30 lead at the half. Besides establishing a new personal best in scoring, Shelton set new career highs in field goals and three-pointers.

Shelton also played a season-high tying 26 minutes and added two rebounds, an assist and five charges drawn.

Great Alaska Shootout Honorees

Three Aztecs, Kyle Spain, Ryan Amoroso and D.J. Gay, were named to the Great Alaska Shootout All-Tournament team.

Spain was named the tourney's most outstanding player after averaging 18.0 points and 6.3 rebounds in 25.0 minutes in the three games.

Gay and Amoroso were all-tournament selections after averaging 9.7 and 8.0 points, respectively. Gay tied the tournament record for most three-pointers made with six in the title game vs. Hampton.

Amoroso: A Great Alaska Shootout Trivia Question Answer

Question: Who is the only player in the 31-year history of the Great Alaska Shootout to win two tournament titles?

Answer: Ryan Amoroso.

With the Aztecs winning the Great Alaska Shootout, Amoroso became the first player to have won two GAS championships after already winning the 2005 title while at Marquette.

In six Great Alaska Shootout games (3 with Marquette, 3 with SDSU), Ryan Amoroso scored 67 points and averaged 11.2 points in those contests. He finished his GAS career just outside the all-time scoring average leaders top-20 list for those players who have played in at least two Shootouts.

More from the Shootout

► Steve Fisher became one of 10 coaches in the history of the Great Alaska Shootout to have won a national championship and win a Shootout title.

► The Aztecs won their first tournament-style event under Steve Fisher. Prior to the win, SDSU had been 0-for-3 in such tournaments, finishing in third place at the 2005 BP Top of the World Classic and the 2003 EA Sports Maui Invitational and in second at the 2001 Ford Red Raider Classic.

► San Diego State gave up just 161 points in the three games and that total places them third all-time in fewest points allowed behind Kansas' 1984 total of 155 and the 1984 Maryland team (159).

► SDSU set a tournament record for fewest points allowed in a championship first half when it gave up 16 Hampton points. The 16 points also ranks third for the fewest points allowed in the first half of any game.

Multiple-Game In-Season Events Good for SDSU

With the Great Alaska Shootout win, SDSU ran its winning streak in multiple-game in-season events to 10. Prior to going 3-for-3 in Anchorage, the Aztecs swept the three games at the World Vision Classic (2007-08) and Shamrock Invitational (2006-07). The first game of the streak actually occurred in Alaska, when the Scarlet and Black defeated Southern Miss in the third-place game of the BP Top of the World Classic in Fairbanks.

During the Steve Fisher era, the Aztecs have fared well in multiple-game in-season events as Fisher's team have gone a combined 14-3.

Aztec Signing Class of 2009 Ranked No. 15; Tops Among Non-BCS Schools

San Diego State's recruiting class of 2009 has been ranked No. 15 in the nation and No. 1 among non-BCS schools by The HOOP SCOOP Online in their exclusive rankings. Rivals.com, meanwhile, ranked SDSU's class No. 1 among mid-majors ahead of MWC institutions UNLV (No. 2), BYU (No. 11), Utah (No. 13) and New Mexico (No. 18).

The Aztecs signed five players, which included Eric Lawton, Kawhi Leonard, Chase Tapley, Malcolm Thomas and Alec Williams, during the early signing period.

Additionally, Paul Biancardi of ESPN.com said that SDSU was one of the non-BCS schools that made the most noise in the early signing period.

"Consistently and quietly, Steve Fisher keeps bringing talent to the Aztecs," Biancardi said. "His four-man class is led by wing Kawhi Leonard, who is a tough player and gifted scorer."

Also included in the 2009 incoming class are a pair of Division I transfers in Tyrone Shelley (Pepperdine) and Brian Carlwell (Illinois), who are currently sitting out the 2008-09 campaign due to NCAA transfer guidelines. If HOOP SCOOP were to include transfers in their rankings, which would then include 6-10 Carlwell and 6-5 Shelley, the Aztecs would have had a top-five nationally ranked recruiting class.

Four or More Starters Returning for Fisher Equals Postseason

In his coaching history, Steve Fisher plus four or more returning starters has resulted in tremendous success. Eight previous times Fisher has returned four or more starters from a team coached, with those clubs advancing to the NCAA Tournament on six occasions and winning the postseason NIT championship once. Below is a look at those clubs.

Steve Fisher has guided the Aztec basketball program to unparalleled heights. In eight seasons, he has taken a program that regularly missed out on the conference postseason tournament, to one which has become of the best programs on the West Coast and has the Aztecs knocking on the door of the elite teams in the country.

The best news for SDSU fans is that Fisher signed a new five-year contract prior to the start of the 2006-07 season that will keep him in San Diego for the foreseeable future.

When Fisher arrived on the scene in March of 1999, he found a basketball program that wasn't good enough to be called average. The Aztecs had suffered through 13 losing seasons in 14 years. Members of the school's last NCAA team were in the early stages of middle age. The expectations were set. The Aztecs were expected to lose. The year before Fisher's arrival on campus, San Diego State won just four games.

Now those days are a distant memory. Fisher guided San Diego State to the NCAA Tournament in 2002, the postseason NIT in 2003, the 2006 NCAA Tournament and the NIT the last two seasons. In addition, the Aztecs have a solid core returning and a nationally ranked recruiting class, that will keep SDSU competitive this season and seasons ahead.

On March 26, 1999, San Diego State announced its arrival on the basketball scene in the form of a news conference to introduce its new coach, Steve Fisher. Fresh from a stint with the Sacramento Kings and with three appearances in the Final Four and a national championship in his pocket, he rolled up his sleeves and went to work. And work was needed. It looked to be a daunting challenge and yet the man with one of the highest winning percentages in NCAA Tournament history had no reservations.

No head-coaching career, at any level, started quicker than that of Steve Fisher. Six games into his head-coaching career he was undefeated and sporting a national championship ring. And the success didn't stop with the national title.

Fisher's eight-plus seasons at Michigan produced a 184-82 (.692) record, nine postseason tournament berths and three trips to the NCAA championship game, including the magical run to the 1989 national title.

Under Fisher, the Wolverines also claimed an NIT championship, won at least 20 games four times and finished among the top three in the powerful Big Ten Conference five times. In 1995, Michigan set a league record by holding opponents to just 39.4 percent shooting from the floor.

Fisher and Co., raised the bar even higher in the postseason. His seven NCAA Tournament teams at Michigan combined for a 20-6 record, ranking him fourth among active coaches and ninth in NCAA history with a winning percentage of .769 in the national bracket. Only 13 coaches have taken more teams to the Final Four, including just five that are still active. He is one of three coaches to take three squads to the Final Four in the first five years of a head-coaching career, and one of just six coaches to lead a team to the championship of the NIT as well as the NCAA.

His accomplishments may be even greater at San Diego State. In 2001-02 he led the Aztecs to the postseason for the first time since 1985 and for just the fourth time ever. The 21 wins were second most for the school as a Division I program and the most since 1985. The fact that those numbers came after just three seasons signifies what is one of the great recent turnarounds in college basketball.

He followed that up with a third consecutive season with a .500 or better record in 2002-03 and led SDSU back to the postseason for the second consecutive season for only the second time in the school's Division I history. In addition, SDSU claimed its first Division I postseason victory with a win in the NIT.

In 2006-07, he led SDSU to the MWC regular season and tournament crowns and a berth in the NCAA Tournament. That team finished with a Division I school-record 24 wins. And the last two seasons, Fisher has led the Aztecs to two additional 20-win seasons and postseason appearances and he doesn't look like he is stopping anytime soon.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State fell short in a hard-fought loss to 15th-ranked Arizona State, 52-59, at Cox Arena despite leading for most of the game.

The Aztecs came out strong, starting the game on a 15-2 run, but the Sun Devils made a run of their own. A couple of fastbreak buckets by Arizona State's James Harden and Jeff Pendergraph changed the momentum as the Sun Devils went on an 11-0 run to tie the game at 19 with 3:42 remaining in the first period.

From there, the teams traded baskets before the Aztecs went ahead 24-23 right before halftime.

In the second period, San Diego State got off to another strong start with an 8-0 run. But a three-pointer by the Sun Devils' Taylor Rhode halted the spurt and cut the ASU deficit to five.

The Aztecs and the Sun Devils continued to go back and forth until SDSU's lead was cut to just three points with 6:27 left in the game. On the ensuing play, Harden stole the ball away from Aztec point guard Richie Williams that led to another three by Kuksiks that gave the Sun Devils a six-point lead with 3:21 to play.

SDSU struggled to get back in the game from that point forward. The situation forced the Aztecs to foul numerous times, sending ASU to the free-throw line and SDSU would not overcome the deficit.

Senior Kyle Spain led the Aztecs with 17 points and Billy White added 12. Ryan Amoroso, Richie Williams and D.J. Gay each had seven points.

TUCSON, Ariz. - Arizona outscored San Diego State 48-30 in the second half to overcome the Aztecs' five-point halftime lead in beating visiting SDSU, 69-56, at McKale Center.

San Diego State dropped its second game of the year despite owning an advantage in rebounds (39-35) and bench scoring (28-0).

All of that went for naught thanks in large part to UA's Jordan Hill, who tallied 25 points, 14 rebounds, four assists and six blocked shots. A 55-percent free-throw shooter coming into the game, Hill connected on 9-of-12 from the charity stripe.

The Aztecs stayed close throughout the first half, never allowing the Wildcats to enjoy a lead of more than five points. With 5:30 left in the half, SDSU made its push and went on a 13-5 run to close out the period and head into the locker room ahead, 26-21.

Unfortunately for SDSU, the Aztecs would go on to score only two more points the rest of the way behind a pair of Gay free throws. Arizona, meanwhile, tallied 15 points during that same span to come away with the victory.

Tim Shelton led the Aztecs with 13 points and eight rebounds, while Lorenzo Wade had 11 points in his first game of the season. Billy White added 10 points and six rebounds in a losing effort.

LARAMIE, Wyo. - San Diego State had its five-game winning streak snapped after it fell to Wyoming, 83-79. Four Aztecs scored in double figures, but SDSU committed 16 turnovers and allowed the Cowboys to shoot 56.0 percent from the field in the loss.

The game was tight from the outset as the largest lead of the first half was the Aztecs' five-point advantage early in the game. In the opening period alone, there were 12 ties and 10 lead changes. The last of the lead changes came off a Tim Shelton put-back after Richie Williams missed the second of two free throws. Shelton's bucket at the end of the half gave San Diego State a 38-37 lead.

The second half featured more back-and-forth action with Wyoming finally taking a six-point lead with 16:11 to go in the game. SDSU managed to keep it close over the course of the next eight minutes and enjoyed a 69-67 lead with 7:42 left in regulation.

The Cowboys responded with eight straight points and went on a 14-6 run to move ahead, 81-75, with 1:43 to go in the game.

Kyle Spain knocked down a three to cut the SDSU deficit in half and later connected on one of two free throws to bring the Aztecs to within two at 81-79. A layup by Tyson Johnson, however, sealed San Diego State's fate and provided the final four-point margin.

Spain and Billy White led the Aztecs with 16 points apiece, while Richie Williams and Matt Thomas had 12 and 11 points, respectively. White added a team-best eight rebounds and Williams dished out a game-high nine assists.

Brandon Ewing led Wyoming with 24 points and six assists and Johnson added 22 points and 10 boards.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State extended its home winning streak to seven games with its 81-76 victory over New Mexico.

Despite a slow start and shaky ending, the Aztecs were propelled to victory thanks in large part to the starting senior tandem of Kyle Spain and Lorenzo Wade.

Spain finished the first half with 14 points and completed his evening with a career-high 30 points behind the strength of 8-for-12 shooting (3-6 3FG) and an 11-for-14 effort from the free-throw line. Wade, meanwhile, had a season-best 21 points after going 12-for-15 from the charity stripe.

New Mexico enjoyed an early 16-5 lead nearly seven minutes into the game. The Aztecs, however, went on to close the opening period by outscoring the Lobos, 32-18, to rally from an 11-point deficit and take a 37-32 lead into the locker room.

With both teams in the double bonus, New Mexico fouled Wade twice in the final 33 seconds and the senior calmly knocked down all four free throws to seal the victory and provide the five-point winning margin.



San Diego State opened the game on a 12-2 run and never looked back during a first half in which the Aztecs held the Falcons to just 14 points. Leading the way for SDSU was Richie Williams, who had nine points in the period and broke the school and conference record for career steals with his second of the game right before the Aztecs went into the locker room ahead, 33-14.

SDSU continued to apply the pressure on the Academy and used an 18-6 run to begin the second half to move ahead by 31 at 51-20 with 12:06 remaining. San Diego State would later increase its lead to 33 points with 2:31 left in the game before settling for the 31-point win.

The Aztecs were led by Billy White's game-high 15 points and career-high four assists. Williams finished his evening with 12 points, three rebounds, game-high five assists and four steals, while D.J. Gay added 10 points for a third straight game.

Spain led the Aztecs with 18 points, while Wade scored 15 after missing the previous game due to an illness. Green, meanwhile, led Utah with 21 points and 10 rebounds.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. - San Diego State failed in its bid to become just the second school to own a four-game winning streak at The Pit after it was defeated 75-49 by New Mexico in a key MWC game.

The 26-point loss was the Aztecs' worst since losing at No. 16/21 Washington, 98-69, back on Dec. 7, 2004.

The beginning of the game was a shooting exhibition by the Lobos' Roman Martinez, who scored New Mexico's first eight points after knocking his first three shots, two of which were behind the arc. In addition to Martinez, Tony Danridge followed suit by scoring UNM's next seven points. But despite the hot Lobo shooting, San Diego State never trailed by more than six points during that span thanks to Richie Williams and Kyle Spain's combined 12 points. However, New Mexico blitzed San Diego State with a 12-3 run in the final 2:52 of the first half to open up a 40-29 halftime lead.

It didn't get much better for SDSU in the second half as it found itself down 13 after Danridge connected on a three-pointer on New Mexico's first possession. The Aztecs responded with a 9-3 run to cut the deficit to seven at 45-38 with 14:29 left in the game, but the Lobos answered with eight straight points and enjoyed a lead of 13 or greater the rest of the way as they cruised to victory.

Spain finished with team-high numbers of 18 points and six rebounds, while Danridge and Martinez led New Mexico with 25 and 17 points, respectively.

The Aztecs were led by Wade's 19 points, while Fredette led all scorers with 28 points.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State returned to Cox Arena and swept the season series from Colorado State for the fourth straight season after the Aztecs emerged with a 68-59 victory. With the win, SDSU recorded its fourth straight 20-win campaign and its fifth in the last eight seasons.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State closed its regular-season slate with a 57-46 victory over UNLV on Senior Night at Cox Arena. The decision gave the Aztecs their second regular-season sweep over the Runnin' Rebels in school history and their first since the 2006 campaign.

SDSU honored six seniors prior to the game and gave the starting nod to seniors Ryan Amoroso, Kyle Spain, Matt Thomas, Lorenzo Wade and Richie Williams. Kelvin Davis, the sixth senior on the team, sat out the game as he was recovering from Hodgkin's lymphoma.

The first half was a hard-fought battle as neither team enjoyed a lead larger than four points. UNLV, which held its second four-point lead of the half with 1:13 remaining, allowed SDSU to score three unanswered points at the end of the half to go into the locker room ahead, 25-24.

In the second half, UNLV took a two-point lead on a three by Oscar Bellfield at the 14:20 mark, but the Aztecs answered with a 6-3 spurt, which eventually led to consecutive three-pointers from Thomas and two from Spain. The trio of threes capped a 15-4 run over the course of 7:18, giving SDSU a 10-point cushion with 6:24 left in the game.


In the end, San Diego State's lead proved to be insurmountable as the Aztecs cruised to the 11-point victory.

Spain led all scorers with 16 points, while Wade finished with 15. Both also had six rebounds apiece. Tim Shelton, meanwhile, grabbed a game- and career-high 12 rebounds for San Diego State in a reserve role.

LAS VEGAS - Fourth-seeded San Diego State went into Thomas & Mack Center and defeated fifth-seeded UNLV on its homecourt, 71-57, in the quarterfinals of the Conoco Mountain West Conference Championships.

The Aztecs swept all three meetings with the Runnin' Rebels for just the second time in school history and the first time since 2006. It also marked the first time UNLV had been beaten twice in the same season inside Thomas & Mack since SMU accomplished the feat in 1999.

SDSU trailed 2-0 early in the game and went ahead for good at 4-2 on a layup by Ryan Amoroso with 18:12 left in the half. Amoroso's bucket was part of an 8-0 run, which gave San Diego State an 8-2 lead.

The Aztecs later opened up a 13-point lead thanks to a 12-2 run and finished the half by outscoring the Rebels 11-5 behind a pair of three-pointers from Lorenzo Wade. At the first-half horn, SDSU enjoyed a 42-27 lead.

After four points from Wade and a three from Kyle Spain, the Aztecs found themselves up, 49-30, in the opening minutes of the second half. UNLV chipped away at the lead and cut the SDSU advantage to nine with 5:06 to play, but never got any closer the rest of the way as the Aztecs emerged with the 14-point lead.

Wade finished with his second double-double of the season and sixth of his career with 20 points and 10 rebounds. Amoroso, Spain and Tim Shelton each had 10 points.

UNLV was led by Wink Adams' game-high 26 points and Tre'Von Willis' 11 points and 10 rebounds.

LAS VEGAS - San Diego State edged out Brigham Young to win their fifth straight game, advancing to the Mountain West Conference finals by defeating the Cougars, 64-62.

The game started off close as both teams traded baskets, resulting in five ties in the opening 8:20. A jumper by San Diego State's Lorenzo Wade broke the tie and sparked a 7-0 run, proving to be their biggest lead of the half. BYU's Jonathan Tavernari stopped the run with a three-point shot that led to a run of their own, tying the game yet again, this time at 25 apiece with 4:54 left in the first. The Aztecs were able to regain their lead as they led 31-28 at halftime.

The first half was sloppy as both teams struggled from the field.
