

Aztecs Face Cougars in MWC Tournament Semifinals

Having claimed its 22nd victory of the season, second-ever three-game season sweep of UNLV and becoming the first team since 1999 to defeat the Rebels twice at Thomas & Mack Center in the same season, fourth-seeded San Diego State (22-8 overall; 11-5 MWC) faces 25th-ranked and top-seeded Brigham Young (25-6 overall; 12-4 MWC) in Friday's semifinal round of the 2009 Conoco Mountain West Conference Championships.

Game time at Thomas & Mack Center is set for 6 p.m. PT and the contest will be shown in high definition by both CBS College and Channel 4 San Diego. The game can also be heard on AM 600 KOGO.

San Diego State took a big step toward punching a ticket to the NCAA Tournament with a 71-57 victory at UNLV in the quarterfinals on Thursday. The Aztecs took the lead for good just 108 seconds into the contest and led by as many as 19 points before settling for the 14-point win.

Senior Lorenzo Wade posted his second double-double of the season, recording a team-high 20 points and adding a game-high 10 rebounds and four assists. Senior Kyle Spain chipped in with 10 points, seven rebounds and four assists and freshman Tim Shelton came off the bench to score 10 points, two rebounds and two assists. Ryan Amoroso also contributed 10 points to the cause as well.

San Diego State limited UNLV to 39.1 percent

field-goal shooting, marking the third time this season the Rebels have failed to shoot 40 percent from the floor against the Aztecs.

The victory was the fourth in a row for San Diego State and ninth victory in its last 12 games.

The Aztecs face Brigham Young on Friday, the only team to defeat San Diego State twice this season. BYU claimed a 77-71 decision at the Marriott Center in Provo on Jan. 24 and then rallied from a 14-point second-half deficit to record a 69-59 decision at Cox Arena on Feb. 24.

Friday will mark the 66th all-time meeting between the schools, with the Cougars owning a 44-21 series lead. Brigham Young has won three straight in the series, starting with a victory in the semifinal round of last season's MWC tournament.

This will mark the third neutral site and post-season meeting between the schools. In 2002, San Diego State defeated Brigham Young, 62-51, in the quarterfinal round en route to winning the MWC title. Last season, Brigham Young claimed a 63-54 decision in the semifinals of the championship.

Four Aztecs Earn All-Conference Recognition

Four San Diego State men's basketball players earned all-Mountain West Conference accolades, the league announced on Monday. In a vote by MWC coaches and media, Kyle Spain and Lorenzo Wade were selected to the second team, Richie Williams to the third team and Billy White was an honorable mention pick. Williams was also

named to the all-defensive team.

Spain is a first-time selection and comes following a regular season in which he led the team in scoring (14.4), rebounding (5.4), three-point field-goal percentage (.410) and free-throw percentage (.867). A senior from Newark, Calif., Spain ranked in the top 10 in the MWC in free-throw percentage (1st), steals (7th), offensive rebounds (7th), scoring (9th), rebounding (10th) and three-point field goals made (10th). Spain posted a pair of double-doubles in 2008-09 and led the team in scoring on 15 different occasions, in rebounding nine times and in assists three times.

Wade, meanwhile, becomes a three-time honoree after being an honorable mention choice as a sophomore, a first-team pick last season as a junior and a second-team member in his third and final year at SDSU. The Las Vegas, Nev., native ended the regular season ranked No. 2 on the team in scoring (13.8) and assists (54) despite missing 10 games. In 19 games, Wade led the team in scoring and assists on five occasions and scored in double figures 17 times. In MWC games only, Wade ranked among the league leaders in scoring (7th), assists (8th), minutes played (9th) and rebounding (19th).

Like Spain, Williams is a first-time all-conference selection earning a spot on the third team and the all-defensive team. A four-year starting point guard, Williams is averaging 7.2 points, 4.4 rebounds, 3.7 assists and 2.2 steals. The senior from San Diego led the league in steals (all games and conference game only) and became the MWC's all-time career leader in the category (234). Williams also owns the Mountain West's all-time record for career assists (459). At 5-10, Williams is one of the top rebounders in the league averaging 4.4 for the season (18th), 4.8 in league play (17th) and recently grabbed a career-high 11 at TCU on his way to his first career double-double. Williams has scored in double figures five times this year and has led the team in assists 19 different outings.

For the second straight season, sophomore Billy White has garnered all-conference accolades. White, who was a third-team pick and freshman of the year choice last year, was voted to the honorable mention squad. Hailing from Las Vegas, Nev., White ranks first on the team in field-goal percentage (.662) and in blocks (19) and is third on the team in steals (28). White is also averaging 8.7 points and 3.8 rebounds in 26 games. Against Wyoming, White went 12-for-12 from the field to establish school and conference records for most field goals without a miss and currently has made 20 consecutive field-goals. White is first in the league in field-goal percentage and is shooting an unbelievable 77.1 percent in MWC action.

This is the eighth straight season in which SDSU has had at least three players recognized by the league's coaches and media and the ninth consecutive campaign in which an Aztec has been honored at season's end. This is also just the fourth time that four San Diego State players have earned all-conference recognition, joining the 2003, 2004 and 2007 squads.

Making Our Case

San Diego State can make a pretty compelling case for an at-large selection in the NCAA Tournament. Among the factors worth considering:

San Diego State (22-8 overall; 11-5 MWC; 39 RPI)

The Graphic: ▶ 3rd best overall RPI in the Mountain West Conference (Utah 13, Brigham Young 25).
The Point: The RPI is 17 spots better than the 4th-best conference RPI (New Mexico 56).

The Graphic: ▶ 30th-best conference RPI in the nation.

The Point: An indication of how well the Aztecs have played in the second-half of the season after Lorenzo Wade was reintegrated into the lineup after missing the first eight games and first month of practices.

The Graphic: ▶ 37 missed games this season due to injury and illness, including Lorenzo Wade in a four-point loss at Wyoming and Billy White vs. Brigham Young.

The Point: SDSU played most of the conference season with significant injuries and still was just one win away from tying for the league title. The total games missed figure above doesn't count other instances like at New Mexico, when Billy White was injured in the opening minute of the game and did not return.

The Graphic: ▶ In nine of its last 15 games, San Diego State was missing due to injury or illness at least one of the following players: Lorenzo Wade (shoulder, flu), Billy White (knee), Tim Shelton (knee), Ryan Amoroso (back, flu). The Aztecs went 6-3 in those nine games and now have all those players back.

The Point: The committee is supposed to take this into account and you have to wonder if SDSU would have lost at Wyoming if Lorenzo Wade would have played or if the Aztecs would have been able to hold on to a 14-point second-half lead at home against Brigham Young if Billy White could have played. The most important thing is San Diego State is healthy now.

The Graphic: ▶ Went 16-0 against teams ranked lower than 107 in the RPI showing the Aztecs have no "bad" losses.

The Point: Not many teams can say they have no "bad" losses and you can certainly make the case that SDSU avoided being upset this year.

The Graphic: ▶ Seven of SDSU's eight losses came to teams ranked 59 or better in the RPI and six of those came on the road.

The Point: SDSU has quality close losses to teams that are going to be in the postseason - for example: Arizona State and Saint Mary's (with Patrick Mills)

The Graphic: ▶ Four of SDSU's eight losses came by seven points or less.

The Point: This is really important when you consider the injuries. Also, keep in mind SDSU led Arizona State for nearly 33 minutes of that game.

The Graphic: ▶ Went 9-6 away from home this season, the second-best road/neutral record in the MWC.

The Point: The Aztecs were successful away from Cox Arena, claiming the Great Alaska Shootout title, snapping UNLV's 27-game homecourt win streak against conference teams and then defeating the Rebels in the quarterfinals of the MWC tournament.

Storylines and Tidbits

► At 22-8, San Diego State posted its fourth consecutive 20-win campaign, the fifth time the Aztecs have reached the 20-victory plateau under Steve Fisher, its seventh 20-win campaign in 39 Division I seasons and the 14th time in the 88-year history of the program. Fisher has guided San Diego State to four straight 20-win seasons after the Aztecs had zero 20-win campaigns in a 16-year stretch from 1985-86 through 2000-01.

► This is just the second time in school history that San Diego State has posted four straight 20-win season. The other occurrence was a four-year run from 1937-38 to 1940-41, when San Diego State advanced to the NAIB Tournament (now NAIA).

► The 2008-09 team, which features six seniors (Ryan Amoroso, Kelvin Davis, Kyle Spain, Matt Thomas, Lorenzo Wade and Richie Williams), has produced the most victories in the past four seasons (88) and the past three seasons (68) in any period in the school's Division I history.

► One reason for San Diego State's success this season has been tenacious defense. The Aztecs are allowing just 59.7 points per game. In 30 games this season, the Aztecs have held their opponent to less than 60 points on 16 occasions, posting a 15-1 record in those games. San Diego State's opponents are shooting just 41.4 percent from the field and the Aztecs have held 10 opponents to less than 40-percent field-goal shooting, winning all 10 of those contests. In four straight games and nine of the last 11 contests, San Diego State has held its opponent to 41.8-percent field-goal shooting or less from the field.

► During San Diego State's current four-game winning streak, the Aztecs have held their opponents to 37.3-percent field-goal shooting and 26.9 percent three-point field-goal shooting.

► Two key members of the Aztec team call Las Vegas home. Senior Lorenzo Wade attended Cheyenne High and sophomore Billy White who attended Green Valley High. White, who was born in Las Vegas, and Wade have known each other since grade school.

Keys to the Game

► San Diego State is 19-1 this season when owning a better field-goal percentage than its opponent.

► SDSU is 15-1 when holding the opponent to less than 60 points.

► The Aztecs are 10-0 when holding opponents to less than 40-percent field goal shooting.

► San Diego State has won 52 consecutive games when leading with five minutes to play in regulation.

Conference Tournament Tidbits

Quick hits on San Diego State and the conference tournament ...

► San Diego State, which has two MWC postseason tournament titles, is looking to tie the league record for most Mountain West Conference tournament championships. UNLV is the current record holder with three.

► SDSU comes into the tournament as the No. 4 seed for the second consecutive year. Last season, the Aztecs defeated fifth-seeded Air Force in the quarterfinals before falling to top-seeded Brigham Young in the semifinal round.

► The history of the No. 4 seed is pretty good. In 10

conference tournaments, the four seed has an 10-7 record, including a 7-3 mark in quarterfinal round games. The seed has advanced to the tournament final on three occasions, but has yet to win the trophy, dropping the three games by a total of eight points.

A Look at the Cougars

► BYU is 25-6 (12-4 MWC) on the year and is coming off an 80-69 quarterfinal victory over Air Force on Thursday. Overall, the Cougars have won five straight and 10 of their last 11.

► Head coach Dave Rose is in his fourth season and has compiled a record of 97-32. Rose has helped BYU to consecutive MWC regular season championships and two straight NCAA Tournament appearances.

► BYU is led by its two MWC all-conference first-team selections Lee Cummard and Jimmer Fredette. Cummard is averaging a team-best 17.0 points, while Fredette comes in to the game scoring at a 16.2 clip. Jonathan Tavernari, who is also an all-conference pick, is averaging 16.2 points and a team-high 7.4 rebounds.

SDSU-BYU Series History

► This is the 66th meeting between the two schools with BYU owning a 44-21 series advantage.

► The Aztecs, who have lost each of the first two meetings this year, will look to avoid losing three straight to BYU in one season in school history. The two schools have met three times in one year on two different occasions (2002 and 2008).

► San Diego State is 17-16 against Brigham Young in games played in San Diego and 6-5 inside Cox Arena. However, in games in Provo, BYU is 26-3 vs. the Aztecs. The schools have split both neutral site meetings.

► Brigham Young won eight straight meetings in the series from Nov. 14, 1997 to Jan. 12, 2002, but the Aztecs have won eight of the last 17 games between the teams.

► Sixteen of the last 19 games in the series have been decided by 11 points or less or in overtime with nine of the 19 most recent meetings being decided by four points or less or in overtime.

► The team that has committed fewer turnovers has won 16 of the last 20 games in the series. The exception came in 2005-06 at BYU, in 2006-07 when both teams had 21 turnovers in Provo, last year in the conference tournament (SDSU 11, BYU 14) and on Jan. 24 in Provo when BYU 17 to SDSU's nine and still won.

Most Recent Series Meeting: Brigham Young at San Diego State

► **BYU 69, SDSU 59 | Feb. 24, 2009**

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State failed to preserve a 13-point halftime lead as it lost its second consecutive Mountain West Conference game, this time to Brigham Young at Cox Arena, 69-59. The loss also snapped SDSU's 10-game home winning streak.

The contest began with both teams trading baskets, resulting in five ties in the opening eight minutes. It wasn't until a three-pointer by BYU's Jonathan Tavernari that gave the Cougars a six-point lead with 10:19 remaining in the first half.

With the Aztecs trailing 18-12, San Diego State answered with a jumper by Tim Shelton, which

sparked a 13-0 run.

The Cougars halted their scoreless streak with a layup by Jimmer Fredette at the 3:01 mark. However, on the next SDSU possession, Lorrenzo Wade responded with a jump shot that ignited an 8-0 spurt, giving the Aztecs a 13-point lead entering the half.

SDSU was able to keep Brigham Young at bay with a double-digit lead for nearly the first eight minutes of the second half. With BYU down 47-35, Noah Hartsock connected on a field goal in the paint to cut the lead to 10 and started what would end up a 21-8 run over the next 7:30, resulting in a 56-55 Cougar lead.

San Diego State continued to struggle in all facets of the game and allowed its one-point deficit to increase to nine thanks to five straight points from Fredette and a three that was banked in from Jackson Emery. All told, BYU closed the final 12:44 on a 34-12 run to emerge with the 10-point win.

The Aztecs were led by Wade's 19 points, while Fredette led all scorers with 28 points.

Notes from the UNLV Game

► San Diego State won all three games with UNLV this season for the second time in school history and the first time since 2006. That season SDSU won the MWC Tournament championship in Denver making this the first time an SDSU squad has won twice at UNLV in the same season.

► SDSU became the first team to defeat UNLV twice inside Thomas & Mack Center in the same season since SMU did it back in 1999. SMU emerged with the 80-78 win at TMC on Feb. 20, 1999, and then defeated the Runnin' Rebels in the first round of the WAC Tournament, 71-70, on March 4, 1999.

► Earlier this season, San Diego State snapped UNLV's 27-game home winning streak vs. MWC

opponents. Prior to that, SDSU was the last MWC team to win inside Thomas & Mack Center. UNLV is 33-0 against non-SDSU Mountain West Conference teams at The Thomas & Mack Center since Jan. 28, 2006. The Aztecs are 3-2 at UNLV during that same span.

► Overall, the Rebels are 54-8 in their last 62 home games, with three of those losses during that span coming to San Diego State (Feb. 16, 2006, Feb. 3, 2009 and March 12, 2009).

► The Aztecs post two victories at UNLV in one season for the first time in school history and marks the first time SDSU has won two straight at UNLV since the 2005 and 2006 campaigns.

► San Diego State improved to 6-18 all-time at UNLV with five of those wins coming under head coach Steve Fisher. The Aztecs also improved to 15-31 all-time vs. the Runnin' Rebels with 11 of the victories coming under Fisher.

► SDSU evened its MWC quarterfinal record to 5-5 and has won two straight and four of the last five quarterfinal matchups.

► San Diego State improved to 3-2 vs. the Runnin' Rebels in MWC Championships action. UNLV drops to 17-6 in MWC tournament games with three of its losses coming to the Aztecs. SDSU also hands UNLV its first-ever quarterfinal loss.

► The Aztecs recorded their 22nd victory of the season, matching the 2006-07 team for the second-most victories in the school's Division I history. The 2005-06 team owns the record with 24 wins.

► This marked the 11th consecutive game in which San Diego State has started a different lineup than the previous game.

► Lorenzo Wade (20 points, 10 rebounds, 4 assists, 2 steals) reached double figures in scoring for the 18th time this season and for the 15th time in his last 16 games. ... Wade recorded his sixth game with multiple three-point makes. ... The senior set a new career high for three-point field goals with his four. ... Wade hit the 20-point plateau for the third time this season and for the 11th time in his career. ... Wade led the team in scoring for the sixth time this season. ... The Las Vegas native produced his sixth double-double of his career.

► Kyle Spain (10 points, 7 rebounds, 4 assists, 1 steal) reached double figures in scoring for the 23rd time this year. ... He has scored in double figures in six straight games. ... Spain connected on at least a trio of three-pointers for the ninth time this season.

► Billy White (6 points, 4 rebounds, 2 assists, 2 blocked shots) missed his third shot attempt of the game snapping his 22 consecutive field goals made streak. White came into the game having made 20 straight field goals and then connected on his first two of the game before missing in the second half. ... White had two blocks and the Aztecs improved to 10-2 this season when he blocks a shot.

► Ryan Amoroso (10 points, 2 rebounds, 1 steal) reached double figures in scoring for the ninth time this season. ... The Aztecs improve to 8-1 this season when the senior scores at least 10 points.

► Tim Shelton (10 points, 2 rebounds, 2 assists, 1 blocked shot) tallied 10 points to record his ninth double-figure scoring game of the season.

22 Wins and Looking for More

On Thursday, San Diego State, which has posted four straight 20-win seasons, won its 22nd game of

the year. The win ties for the second-most wins in SDSU's Division I history.

San Diego State's 20-win campaign marks the first time in school Division I history that the Aztecs have posted four straight 20-win seasons. San Diego State also notched its fourth consecutive 20-win season since the Aztecs accomplished the feat in 1937-38, 1938-39, 1939-40 and 1940-41.

Seniors Go Out In Style

The San Diego State seniors went out in style last Saturday in their final home game at Cox Arena as they guided SDSU to an 11-point victory over UNLV. The senior fivesome of Ryan Amoroso, Kyle Spain, Matt Thomas, Lorenzo Wade and Richie Williams combined to score 48 of the team's 57 points (84.2 percent). They also accounted for all six steals, nine of the team's 10 assists and 20 of the Aztecs' 39 rebounds. They led San Diego State to its second-ever regular-season sweep of UNLV.

Spain and Wade Named to NABC All-District 17 First Team

Seniors Kyle Spain and Lorenzo Wade have been named to the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Division I All-District 17 First Team, the NABC announced this week.

SDSU was the only school to have a pair of representatives on the first team and the Aztec duo was joined by UNLV's Wink Adams, Utah's Luke Nevill and Brigham Young's Lee Cummond.

Spain, from Newark, Calif., earns his first career honor after leading the team in scoring (14.4 points) and rebounding (5.4). The senior, who has made 25 starts while playing in all 28 games, also leads SDSU in three-point field goals (54) and free-throw percentage (.871). This season, Spain has two double-doubles and has scored in double figures a team-best 21 times.

Wade, meanwhile, joins Spain on the first team after being a second-team choice a year ago. The Las Vegas, Nev., native is second on the team in scoring (13.8), but is San Diego State's top scoring threat in conference games only, averaging a team-best 15.2 points. During MWC action, Wade is shooting 48.3 percent from the field and is second on the team in assists (3.2).

This is the fourth straight year in which an Aztec has garnered NABC all-district honors and is the first season since 2006 that San Diego State has had more than one player recognized (Brandon Heath, Marcus Slaughter).

Free-Throw Machine

SDSU senior Kyle Spain has been nearly automatic at the free-throw line this year shooting at a Mountain West Conference-leading 86.2 percent clip. In his last three outings to close the regular season, Spain went 10-for-10 at TCU, followed it with a 6-for-6 performance vs. Colorado State and finished the UNLV game by making 7-of-8. Before his miss on his second attempt vs. the Rebels, Spain had made a season-high 19 straight free throws. So far this year, Spain has had streaks of 19, 18 twice, 17 and 12 in a row. His career best is 20 straight.

Doing a Little Bit of Everything

Lorenzo Wade has been a jack of all trades in SDSU's last three games at TCU, vs. Colorado State

and at UNLV. In Fort Worth, Wade contributed 12 points, seven rebounds, five assists and three blocks in 37 minutes and then followed it with 10 points, five rebounds, six assists and three steals in 35 minutes vs. the Rams at home. On Senior Night vs. the Runnin' Rebels, Wade posted 15 points, six rebounds, three assists and two steals. Then in the quarterfinals of the MWC tournament, Wade went for 20 points, 10 rebounds and four assists against the Rebels. During the four-game span, the senior is averaging 14.3 points, 7.0 rebounds, 4.5 assists and 1.7 steals in a team-best 36.2 minutes.

Davis Honored by USBWA

Kelvin Davis was selected as the 2009 recipient of the U.S. Basketball Writers Association's "Most Courageous Award" on Wednesday, March 4. Davis will be honored at the USBWA's Awards Breakfast Monday, April 6, at the Renaissance Marriott in downtown Detroit. In addition, he will be the recipient of a \$1,000 check, which he will donate to the charity or scholarship fund of his choice.

The Most Courageous Award was established in 1978 and has been given annually to a player, coach, official or administrator who has demonstrated extraordinary courage reflecting honor in the sport of amateur basketball.

Among the more notable recipients over the years have been Jacksonville coach Bob Wenzel, Arizona guard Steve Kerr, Indiana forward Landon Turner, referee Pete Pavia, North Carolina State coach Jim Valvano, Arkansas coach Nolan Richardson, the 2001 Oklahoma State basketball team and the 2007 Duquesne basketball team.

Davis Also Honored by V Foundation

Davis was also recognized as one of 12 finalists for the V Foundation Comeback Award, it was announced on Tuesday, March 3. The award is presented in conjunction with ESPN and the recipient will be announced during ESPN's basketball Final Four/NIT weekend coverage.

The annual award is open to men and women collegiate basketball student-athletes in all divisions. It is awarded to an individual or a team who has accomplished a personal triumph in the face of true adversity, be it in health, life or moral dilemma. Student-athletes are nominated by their athletics department representative.

The 2009 recipient will be selected by an eight-member sub-committee of The V Foundation Board of Directors.

Williams Claims Another Record

At TCU, senior point guard Richie Williams reached the conference pinnacle for career assists. The San Diego native entered the TCU game with 450 career helpers and was just three shy of tying Wyoming's Jay Straight (453) for the all-time conference lead. When the dust settled, Williams finished the game with four assists to situate himself atop the all-time conference chart. Earlier this season, Williams became San Diego State's and the MWC's all-time leader in steals.

Little Big Man

In addition, setting the Mountain West career assists record, Richie Williams, 5-10, posted his first career double-double with 14 points and a per-

sonal-best 11 rebounds, nine of which on the defensive glass. It marked the second straight game in which he led the team in rebounding. Williams also entered the MWC Championships ranked No. 2 on the team in rebounding for conference games only at 4.8 per game.

Senior Trio Solid

The San Diego State senior trio of Kyle Spain, Lorenzo Wade and Richie Williams has been a source of consistency throughout their final season on Montezuma Mesa.

Between Spain and Williams, the two have played in all 30 games and have started all but five games this season. Spain has led the team in scoring 14 times and reached double figures 23 times. Additionally, Spain has led the squad in rebounding nine times. Williams, meanwhile, has played an average of 30.5 minutes (No. 1 on team) and ranks first on the team in assists and steals and is fourth in rebounds. For the year, Williams has led the Aztecs in assists in 20 of their 30 games and has been the team's top rebounder four times this year.

Since coming back from suspension, Wade is showing why he was picked as a preseason all-conference selection back in October. In his last 13 games played, the Las Vegas native is averaging 16.2 points per game with a season-high 25 coming at Colorado State and 20 at UNLV. Wade, who scored in double figures in a career-high 10 straight outings, had his streak snapped at New Mexico after scoring just eight points, but has rebounded with five straight double-figure scoring games.

White's Streak Snapped

Billy White, who came into the quarterfinal game with UNLV having made his last 20 field goals, had his streak snapped in the second half against the Rebels. White made his first two field goal attempts to run his streak to 22, but missed early after halftime to end his shooting run. The Las Vegas native was three baskets short of tying the NCAA record of 25 consecutive field goals set by American's Ray Voelkel in 1978 (covering nine games).

White set a school record for most field goals without a miss in the game vs. Wyoming at home after he went 12-for-12 from the floor. The Las Vegas native broke Aerick Sanders' 11-for-11 performance set in 2003 against Eastern Washington. Prior to the Wyoming game, White made both of his attempts at Utah and scored on his last five attempts vs. Air Force. In his last three games, White is 20 for his last 21.

In addition to setting a new school record, White's effort vs. the Cowboys broke the Mountain West Conference record most field goals without a miss in all games and MWC games and established the sophomore record for all games and league games as well.

One of 44

With his perfect shooting performance vs. Wyoming, Billy White also became the 44th player

in NCAA Division I history to finish a game going at least 12-for-12 from the field. White also became the second player this season to accomplish the feat, joining Boston College's Corey Raji, who went 12-for-12 from the floor on Dec. 23. The NCAA record holder is Clifford Rozier of Louisville, who hit all 15 of his shot attempts in 1993.

Shelton Returning to Form

Tim Shelton, who scored in double figures in four straight games earlier this season and then followed it with just one such performance in the next 13 games, two of which he missed due to injury, has played well in his last seven outings.

In his second game back from injury vs. Wyoming, Shelton filled the stat sheet with 11 points (5-8 FG), five rebounds, two assists, one block, one steal and zero turnovers. Then at New Mexico, the freshman had six points in 22 minutes, but responded with a 13-point performance vs. BYU at home. At TCU, Shelton drew two early charges on Kevin Langford in the opening 25 seconds and grabbed nine rebounds, which was his most since his 11-rebound game at Air Force on Jan. 3. In the final two games of the regular season, Shelton tied for the team lead in scoring with 14 and collected five rebounds in a winning effort over Colorado State and followed that with a career-high 12-rebound effort against UNLV. In the quarterfinals of the MWC tournament, Shelton scored 10 points to help the Aztecs win.

During the seven-game span, Shelton is averaging 9.1 points, 5.1 rebounds and 1.6 assists in 26.3 minutes.

Vegas Homecoming

It will be a homecoming for SDSU's two Las Vegas natives, Lorenzo Wade and Billy White.

Wade played his high school ball at Cheyenne High where he helped the Desert Shields to a 30-5 record and a spot in the 2001-02 final by averaging 14.0 points and 4.0 rebounds. He later helped the school to its first-ever state championship en route to being named the 2003 state tournament MVP. That season, Wade averaged 17.2 points and 6.8 boards in helping Cheyenne to a record of 31-1.

White, meanwhile, prepped at Green Valley High where he was the Southeast League's Sunrise Region MVP his senior year. That year, White averaged 20.7 points, 14.0 rebounds, 3.4 assists and 2.3 blocks and was named to the Nevada Class 4A All-State First Team.

Coming Up Big In OT

For the second time this season, Kyle Spain came up big in overtime to help propel the Aztecs to victory. Earlier this season at UNLV, Spain scored eight of his 17 points in the extra session to lead SDSU to a 68-66 win. And then at TCU, Spain connected on all six free throws and scored six of the Aztecs' 10 overtime points to guide SDSU to a 79-77 victory.

It is also worth noting that Lorenzo Wade was a solid performer in OT as he made his last three free throws and came up with a huge blocked shot on a three-point attempt with the Aztecs up by one with nine seconds left in the game.

Nearly Unbeatable

San Diego State has been nearly unbeatable at

home the last three-plus seasons during MWC play. The Aztecs boast an impressive 27-5 record in MWC home games after going 7-1 in conference home games this year and going 6-2 in 2007-08 and 7-1 in both 2006-07 and 2005-06.

Like Clockwork

When D.J. Gay scores in double figures, the Aztecs win. Period. The sophomore guard has reached the double-figure scoring plateau 10 times this season and each of those times San Diego State hung one in the win column.

After being held to single digits in four straight games, a streak where SDSU when 1-3, Gay broke out with 13 points and made a career-high tying five free throws on Saturday at TCU.

The set of circumstances do not only apply to this season, they apply to Gay's Aztec career as SDSU is 17-2 when he scores in double figures.

Creating Extra Opportunities

Leading the league and ranking in the top 20 nationally in scoring defense helps win games, but giving yourself extra opportunities to score does as well and that is something San Diego State has done well this season. At season's end (all games), the Aztecs are first in the league in steals (8.17) and offensive rebounds (12.21). And the same can be said for MWC games only as SDSU is No. 1 offensive rebounds (11.25) and No. 2 in steals (7.56).

The Defense Never Rests

San Diego State hangs its hat on defense and is the top team in the Mountain West Conference in scoring defense as it allows just 59.7 points a game (as of March 12).

Prior to Northern Colorado scoring 62 on Dec. 3, SDSU held six straight opponents to 59 or less to open the season, something that had not been done since the 1949-50 campaign.

70 and Above is a Good Thing

SDSU has had tremendous success when scoring at least 70 points in a game. Dating back to the 2006-07 season, SDSU had won 22 straight games when reaching 70 points until Wyoming snapped that streak on Jan. 14. Since the beginning of that year, the Aztecs have won 42 of 46 when scoring at least 70. This season, the Scarlet and Black is 12-2 when hitting the 70-point mark.

Williams is the New Steals King

In the second game of the season series vs. Air Force, senior Richie Williams became San Diego State's and the MWC's all-time leader in steals. The San Diego native needed two steals to break the 217 set by former Aztec Brandon Heath and he accomplished the feat right before the half against Air Force. Williams ended the game with a game-high four and currently has 236 steals.

Streak Stoppers

San Diego State put an end to a pair of UNLV homecourt winning streaks earlier this year. With the 68-66 overtime decision, the Aztecs stopped the Runnin' Rebels 27-game home winning streak against MWC opponents and snapped their 21-game home winning streak against MWC foes in games played during the regular season.

Thomas First to Win Four at TMC

San Diego State fifth-year senior Matt Thomas became the first player in school history to be a part of an Aztec team to beat UNLV inside Thomas & Mack Center four times. Thomas helped SDSU leave Las Vegas with wins in 2005, 2006 and two in 2009. Additionally, Kyle Spain and Richie Williams became the second and third players in school history to escape Thomas & Mack with a win three times in their careers.

Wade Reaches 1,000 in SDSU Uniform

Lorrenzo Wade needed 12 points at UNLV to reach 1,000 career points while at SDSU and 12 is what he got. The senior became the 24th player in school history to reach the 1,000-point plateau and the second this season. Earlier this year in the game vs. TCU, Kyle Spain hit the mark on a pair of free throws. The duo are the sixth and seventh players to accomplish the feat while playing for 10th-year head coach Steve Fisher.

Filling Up the Stat Sheet

Richie Williams has always filled up the stat sheet, but none more so than against BYU and TCU in the first half of league play. At BYU, the senior went for nine points, a team-high six rebounds and a game-high tying six assists, not to mention a season-best five steals. Then vs. TCU, the San Diego native recorded 13 points, a career- and game-high nine rebounds, a game-high six assists, a career-high one blocked shot and two steals. The blocked shot against TCU was his first since March 8, 2007, vs. Colorado State at the MWC Tournament.

Spain Hits 30-Point Mark

Senior Kyle Spain scored a career-high 30 points on the strength of 8-for-12 shooting, 3-for-6 from beyond the arc and 11-for-14 from the charity stripe against New Mexico. The senior became the 27th player in SDSU history to record a 30-point game and was the first Aztec since Brandon Heath to reach 30 points in a game (30 vs. BYU, Feb. 24, 2007). Spain's performance was the 55th 30-point game in the history of the program.

20/20 Vision

Against New Mexico at Cox Arena, Kyle Spain (30 points) and Lorrenzo Wade (21 points) eclipsed the 20-point plateau, marking the second time this season an Aztec doing has accomplished the feat.

Earlier this year in San Diego State's non-conference tilt vs. CS Northridge, Spain and D.J. Gay poured in 22 and 20 points, respectively. The duo's effort was the first time two Aztecs scored at least 20 points in a game since Feb. 22, 2007, vs. No. 21/22 Brigham Young inside Cox Arena. That night, Brandon Heath scored 30 points and a Mohamed Abukar checked in with 27.

Butler-Hancock Brings Out Best in Shelton

It may have been below 20 degrees outside of Butler-Hancock Sports Pavilion on the campus of Northern Colorado, but Tim Shelton's shooting certainly wasn't. The freshman was perfect in all aspects when it came to shooting as he finished with a stat line that read: 6-6 FG, 2-2 3FG, 3-3 FT.

All of that led to a career-high 17 points, 12 of

which came in the first half to help the Aztecs to a 34-30 lead at the half. Besides establishing a new personal best in scoring, Shelton set new career highs in field goals and three-pointers.

Shelton also played a season-high tying 26 minutes and added two rebounds, an assist and five charges drawn.

Great Alaska Shootout Honorees

Three Aztecs, Kyle Spain, Ryan Amoroso and D.J. Gay, were named to the Great Alaska Shootout All-Tournament team.

Spain was named the tourney's most outstanding player after averaging 18.0 points and 6.3 rebounds in 25.0 minutes in the three games.

Gay and Amoroso were all-tournament selections after averaging 9.7 and 8.0 points, respectively. Gay tied the tournament record for most three-pointers made with six in the title game vs. Hampton.

Amoroso: A Great Alaska Shootout Trivia Question Answer

Question: Who is the only player in the 31-year history of the Great Alaska Shootout to win two tournament titles?

Answer: Ryan Amoroso.

With the Aztecs winning the Great Alaska Shootout, Amoroso became the first player to have won two GAS championships after already winning the 2005 title while at Marquette.

In six Great Alaska Shootout games (3 with Marquette, 3 with SDSU), Ryan Amoroso scored 67 points and averaged 11.2 points in those contests. He finished his GAS career just outside the all-time scoring average leaders top-20 list for those players who have played in at least two Shootouts.

More from the Shootout

► Steve Fisher became one of 10 coaches in the history of the Great Alaska Shootout to have won a national championship and win a Shootout title.

► The Aztecs won their first tournament-style event under Steve Fisher. Prior to the win, SDSU had been 0-for-3 in such tournaments, finishing in third place at the 2005 BP Top of the World Classic and the 2003 EA Sports Maui Invitational and in second at the 2001 Ford Red Raider Classic.

► San Diego State gave up just 161 points in the three games and that total places them third all-time in fewest points allowed behind Kansas' 1984 total of 155 and the 1984 Maryland team (159).

► SDSU set a tournament record for fewest points allowed in a championship first half when it gave up 16 Hampton points. The 16 points also ranks third for the fewest points allowed in the first half of any game.

Multiple-Game In-Season Events Good for SDSU

With the Great Alaska Shootout win, SDSU ran its winning streak in multiple-game in-season events to 10. Prior to going 3-for-3 in Anchorage, the Aztecs swept the three games at the World Vision Classic (2007-08) and Shamrock Invitational (2006-07). The first game of the streak actually occurred in Alaska, when the Scarlet and Black defeated Southern Miss in the third-place game of the BP Top of the World Classic in Fairbanks.

During the Steve Fisher era, the Aztecs have fared well in multiple-game in-season events as Fisher's team have gone a combined 14-3.

Aztec Signing Class of 2009 Ranked No. 15; Tops Among Non-BCS Schools

San Diego State's recruiting class of 2009 has been ranked No. 15 in the nation and No. 1 among non-BCS schools by The HOOP SCOOP Online in their exclusive rankings. Rivals.com, meanwhile, ranked SDSU's class No. 1 among mid-majors ahead of MWC institutions UNLV (No. 2), BYU (No. 11), Utah (No. 13) and New Mexico (No. 18).

The Aztecs signed five players, which included Eric Lawton, Kawhi Leonard, Chase Tapley, Malcolm Thomas and Alec Williams, during the early signing period.

Additionally, Paul Biancardi of ESPN.com said that SDSU was one of the non-BCS schools that made the most noise in the early signing period.

"Consistently and quietly, Steve Fisher keeps bringing talent to the Aztecs," Biancardi said. "His four-man class is led by wing Kawhi Leonard, who is a tough player and gifted scorer."

Also included in the 2009 incoming class are a pair of Division I transfers in Tyrone Shelley (Pepperdine) and Brian Carlwell (Illinois), who are currently sitting out the 2008-09 campaign due to NCAA transfer guidelines. If HOOP SCOOP were to include transfers in their rankings, which would then include 6-10 Carlwell and 6-5 Shelley, the Aztecs would have had a top-five nationally ranked recruiting class.

Four or More Starters Returning for Fisher Equals Postseason

In his coaching history, Steve Fisher plus four or more returning starters has resulted in tremendous success. Eight previous times Fisher has returned four or more starters from a team coached, with those clubs advancing to the NCAA Tournament on six occasions and winning the postseason NIT championship once. Below is a look at those clubs.
