#### **Aztec Football Announces 2024 Early Signing Class**

SDSU receives 26 commitments in the first class of the Sean Lewis era

SAN DIEGO -- San Diego State football head coach Sean Lewis announced that 26 student-athletes have signed either National Letters of Intent or Grant-in-Aids on the first day of early signing period on Wednesday. It is the first recruiting class at SDSU for Lewis, who became the 19th head coach in program history on Nov. 29.

San Diego State's early signing class features 15 on offense and 11 on defense. The 26-player class also has 14 from the state of California, two each from Texas and Washington, and one apiece from the states of Arizona, Florida, Georgia, Indiana, Nevada, Ohio and Oklahoma. Additionally, one signee is from American Samoa. Of the 26 signees, 15 are joining the Aztecs out of high school, while 11 are college transfers, including three from Power 5 institutions and two from Group of 5 programs along with four from the FCS level and two junior college products.

Additional signees are expected in the coming days.

Of the 15 signees on offense, there are four each at wide receiver - Nate Bennett (Simi Valley, Calif./Grace Brethern High/Portland State), Will Cianfrini (Galveston, Texas/Carlsbad High (CA)), Ja'Shaun Poke (Hampton, Ga./Dutchtown High/West Virginia) and Ben Scolari (Reno, Nev./Bishop Manogue HS) - and offensive line - Brayden Bryant (Ardmore, Okla./Ardmore High/North Dakota), Saipale Fuimaono (Auto, American Samoa/Fagaitua High/Allan Hancock College), Kai Holec (Seattle/O'Dea High) and Nate Williams (Utica, Ohio/Newark Catholic High/Akron). Three are tight ends in Arthur Ban (Vancouver, Wash./Evergreen High), Gabe Garretson (Chico, Calif./Pleasant Valley High/Butte College) and Ryan Wolfer (Peoria, Ariz./Liberty High) - There are also a pair of quarterbacks in the class in AJ Duffy (Inland Empire, Calif./Rancho Verde High/Florida State) and Danny O'Neil (Indianapolis/Cathedral High), and two running backs - Anthony McMillian Jr. (Chula Vista, Calif./Mater Dei Catholic High) and Cincere Rhaney (Los Angeles/Serra High).

On the defensive side of the ball, seven of the 11 signees will be in the back five of the 4-2-5 SDSU defense, including Tayten Beyer (Corona, Calif./Centennial High), Isaiah Buxton (San Diego/Mater Dei Catholic High), Jason Mitchell II (Los Angeles/St. John Bosco High), Zach Morris (Flower Mound, Texas/Marcus High/New Mexico), William Nimmo Jr. (Corona, Calif./Mater Dei High/UCLA), Bryce Phillips (Long Beach, Calif./La Habra High/Tennessee) and Prince Williams (Westlake Village, Calif./Oaks Christian High). Three defensive linemen are joining San Diego State in Kodi Cornelius (Petaluma, Calif./Casa Grande High), Ryan Gaea (Stockton, Calif./St. Mary's High) and Marlem Louis (Venice, Fla./Venice High/Richmond), while Danny Niu (East Palo Alto, Calif./Serra High) is the lone incoming linebacker.

The NCAA approved the early signing period in 2017, which runs this year from Dec. 20-22. The mid-year 2-4 (junior college) transfer signing period also commenced today and lasts through Jan. 15, 2024, while the regular signing period is slated for Feb. 7-April 1, 2024.

At Serra, led the Cavaliers to the 2021 CIF Southern Section Open Division Finals and the 2022 CIF Southern Section Division 2 quarterfinals ... Limited by injuries, played seven games for St. John Bosco in 2023, recording 28 tackles and three pass breakups ... Comes to San Diego State from New Mexico, playing two seasons with the Lobos in 2022 and 2023 ... Started all 12 games last season, making 36 tackles with 11 pass breakups and an interception ... Had a career-high six

tackles against Tennessee Tech and at Wyoming ... Recorded three games with multiple pass breakups ... Played all 12 games with one start as a true freshman in 2022, finishing with 11 tackles, 1.5 TFLs, a forced fumble and two pass breakups ... Lettered at Marcus High School in Flower Mound, Texas ... Helped Marcus HS to three straight district titles ... Recorded 46 tackles, five PBUs, two TFLs and one interception as a senior ... Also lettered in baseball.

### William Nimmo Jr.

Safety 6-1, 200 Corona, Calif. (Mater Dei High/UCLA)

Comes to The Mesa with five years of collegiate experience at UCLA (2019-23) ... Played 35 games in his Bruin career, totaling 37 tackles ... In his final two seasons, played 25 games with 31 tackles ... Named to the Pac-12 Fall Academic Honor Roll twice (2020-21 and 2021-22) ... Prepped at powerhouse Mater Dei High School in Santa Ana, California ... Mater Dei were high school national champions in 2017 and 2018, according to USA Today ... Helped take his team to a No. 1 California ranking as a senior ... According to MaxPreps, recorded 62 tackles and eight tackles for loss in his junior and senior seasons ... Was a three-star recruit by 247sports, Rivals and ESPN ... Ranked No. 56 on Rivals' California Top 100 prospects list and ranked as 247's No. 66 prospect in the state ... Had offers from Florida, Iowa State, Washington State, and Oregon State before choosing UCLA.

A three-year letterwinner at Serra High School in San Mateo, California ... Helped take the Padres to three consecutive Open Division CIF State Championship finals from 2021-23 ... Helped Serra to a dominant, 63-27, victory to claim the 2023 Central Coast Section Championship ... Won two West Catholic League titles ... In his three years on varsity, Serra went a combined 36-4 overall and 20-1 in league play ... Named the 2023 West Catholic Athletic League (WCAL) Linebacker of the Year and Get Sports Focus co-Defensive Player of the Year ... A two-time WCAL firstteam selection ... Prepped at Cathedral High School in Indianapolis, starting at quarterback for three years ... In his first year as the

starting QB, led his team to a 14-1 overall record and a Class 5A state championship ... The Fighting Irish then went 18-6 across his last two seasons, winning a regional and two sectional titles in 6A ... Competed at the 2023 Elite 11 Finals showcase ... A two-time city offensive player of the year and all-city team selection ... Named an IFCA All-State Top 50 Offensive Player for the state of Indiana as both a junior and senior ... Owns the Cathedral HS passion records in yards, touchdowns, completions and attempts ... According to MaxPreps, totaled 7,786 yards through the air in his career along with 98 touchdowns with 62.6 completion percentage while running for 1,326 yards and 27 touchdowns ... Cornerback 6-1, 195

Long Beach, Calif. (La Habra High/Tennessee State)

Joins the Aztecs with two years of Division I collegiate experience, playing 2022 and 2023 at Tennessee State in Nashville, Tennessee ... Named to the 2022 Ohio Valley Conference second team at defense and also to the all-newcomer team ... Started all 22 games in his Tiger career, recording 68 tackles, six tackles for loss and 18 pass breakups ... Led team in PBUs both seasons with his 10 in 2022 ranking second in the OVC ... Logged a career-best eight tackles in a game against UT Martin ... Prior to TSU, played one season at Santa Ana College in Santa Ana, California, where he made 19 tackles, two interceptions (including a pick-six), and seven pass breakups in nine games in 2021 ... In high school, transferred to Orange Lutheran from La Habra High School ... Helped guide his La Habra team to a 10-3 record, Freeway League title, and CIF Southern Section Division 3 semifinal game in 2019 ... Chosen for the Orange County North-South All-Star Classic ... Was a three-star recruit coming out of high school according to Rivals ... Had offers from Florida Atlantic and Morgan State ... His brother, Clark Phillips III, is currently a cornerback for the Atlanta Falcons after starring for Utah in college.

Wide Receiver

5-10, 175 Hampton, Ga. (Dutchtown High/West Virginia)

Has played in 37 games over his career, spanning appearances in five seasons (2019-22 at Kent State and 2023 at West Virginia) ... Has 83 catches for 1,044 yards (12.6 avg.) with five touchdowns ... Has two career 100-yard receiving games ... Also has one rushing touchdown ... Has been dynamic in the kick return game, returning 44 attempts for 1,110 yards (25.2 avg.) ... The 25.2 kick return average ranks 11th in the country over that span (1999-23, min. 40 KR) ... Transfers to San Diego State after spending one season at West Virginia ... Only played in one game at WVU in 2022 because of injuries, making two catches for 11 yards against Duquesne ... Totaled 81 catches for 1,033 yards (12.8 avg.) with five touchdowns at Kent State from 2019-22, while adding one rushing score and averaging 25.2 yards per kick return (44 KR for 1,110 yards) ...
