A good 1-v-1 player, both on offense and defense ... Is looking to rebound from an injury-riddled 2008 season that saw him appear in just four games with one start ... A fifth-year senior with 27 career starts who will provide leadership to the underclassmen.

2008 SEASON

Battled injuries most of the season ... Made appearances in four contests, including one start ... The start came in the team's season-opener against Michigan ...



Finished the season with two shots (one at home against Washington on Oct. 19 and one at Oregon State on Oct. 24) ... Shot against the Huskies was on goal ... Logged 143 minutes over the four games, including a season-high 64 minutes against the Wolverines in the opener.

2007 SEASON

Started 16 of the 18 games he played in, including all 10 conference contests ... Had 19 shots on the season, the fifth-most on the team ... 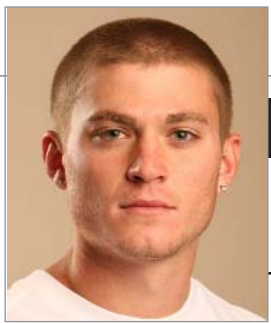

2008 SEASON

Earned second-team all-Pac-10 honors for the second consecutive season ... Appeared in 17 games with 15 games started ... Led the team in assists (six) and shots (40) ... Was second on the squad with 12 points ... Ranked among the Pac-10 leaders in numerous categories, including assists per game (tied-fourth, 0.35), shots per game (fifth, 2.35), assists (tied-fifth, six), shots (seventh, 40), points (10th, 12) and points per game (T-10th, 0.71) ... Had helpers in back-to-back key victories by SDSU over Stanford (Oct. 31) and California (Nov. 2) ... Also had a season-high five shots against the Bears ... SDSU was 4-2-2 when he recorded a point and 4-1-1 when he had an assist.



2007 SEASON

Earned second-team all-Pac-10 honors ... Named to The Soccer Post/Aztec Classic all-tournament team ... Tied for fourth in the Pac-10 with five assists ... Had three helpers in conference games, which tied him with three others for second in the Pac-10 ... His five points tied Matt McManus for fifth on the team ... and added a shot attempt in SDSU's 2-2, double-overtime tie at nationally ranked Creighton on Aug. 31 ... Picked up a helper in a 2-0 Aztec victory over Fairleigh Dickinson on Sept. 9 ... Had three shots in San Diego State's 1-0 shutout over Missouri State (Sept. 21) and a season-high four attempts in a 0-0, double-overtime tie versus UC Irvine (Sept. 29) ... Assisted on Khadim Diouf's game-winning goal in the Aztecs' 1-0 victory over UCLA on Oct. 6 ... Also had three shots in the game ... Had both assists in SDSU's 2-0 win against Stanford (Oct. 14) ... It was his first multi-assist performance of his career ... Had three shot attempts against Oregon State (Oct. 28) and a season-high two shots on goal at UCLA on Nov. 14 ... Despite playing in the midfield, he still played every minute in three games, including back-to-back double-overtime games against Drake (Sept. 22) and UC Irvine ... 2006 SEASON

Named to the *Top Drawer Soccer* All-Rookie Team as a second-team selection ... One of only six Aztecs to see action in all 19 games, despite being just a freshman ... Started 15 of his 19 appearances ... Had four assists, tied with Kraig Chiles and Andrew DiCicco for the most on the team ... Added two goals ... His eight points were the fourth-most on the squad and second among freshmen (Nick Cardenas, 12) ... Registered his first point, an assist, in SDSU's 2-1 overtime win over Long Island on Sept. 17 ... Followed that game up with his first career goal at Stanford (Sept. 22) ... Added helpers against UCLA (Oct. 8 and Nov. 3) and Stanford (Oct. 29) ... Also scored in the Aztecs' 2-2, double-overtime tie at Oregon State on Oct. 22 ... Had two or more shots six times ... Had five shot attempts against UNLV (Sept. 9) and another four in his next game versus Rider (Sept. 15) ... 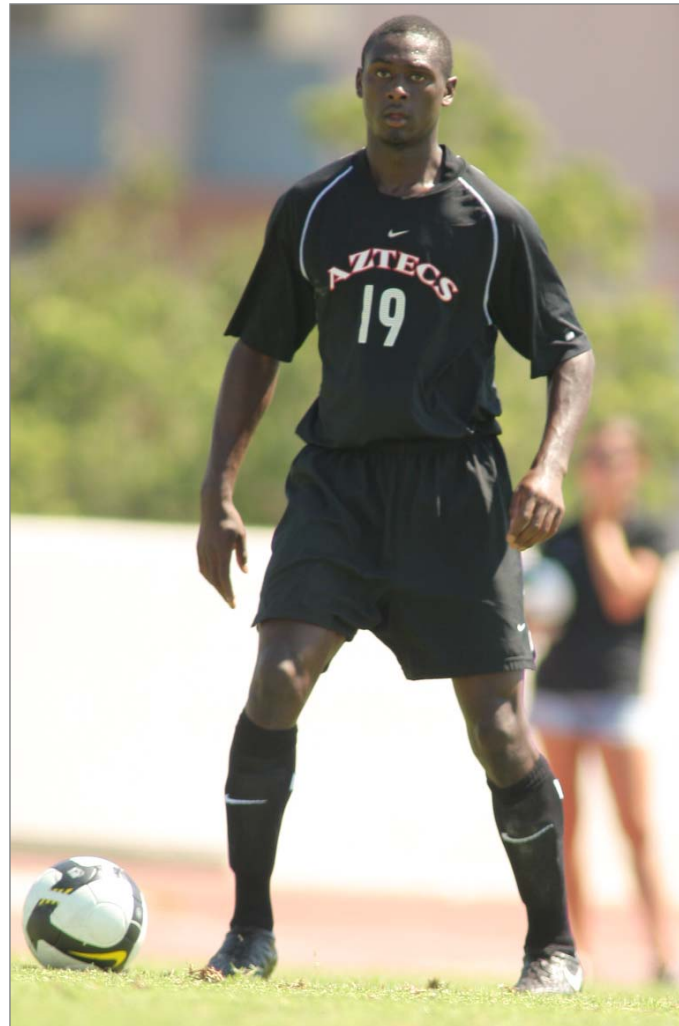

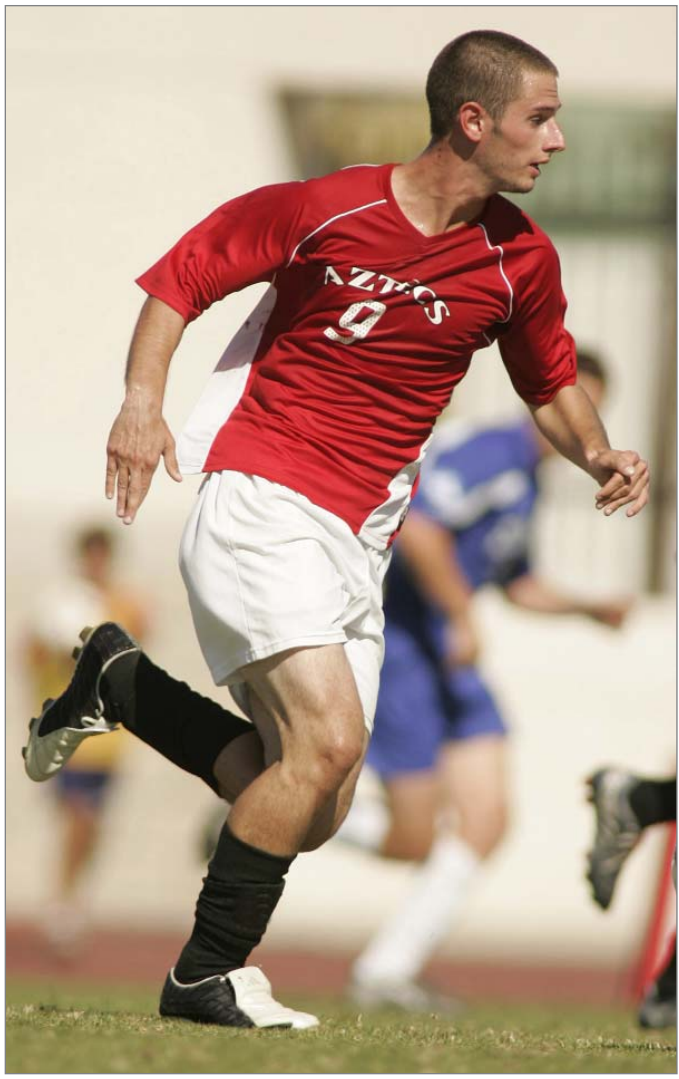
