NEWS AND NOTES

- San Diego State continues its four-game stretch away from home on Thursday when it travels west on Interstate 8 to face San Diego inside Jenny Craig Pavilion. The 49th all-time meeting between the schools will air live on FOX Sports West.
- The Aztecs finished a grueling 10-day period where they played five games, including three in four days at the Wooden Legacy in Fullerton. SDSU played its first two games at the Wooden Legacy in a span of 18 hours before competing in the championship game late Sunday night. San Diego State completed the five-games-in-10-days stretch with a 4-1 record.
- SDSU went 2-1 at the Wooden Legacy, defeating Sacramento State (89-52) and Georgia (75-68) before falling short in its bid to become the first repeat champion in the 11-year history of the event, losing to Washington State, 93-86.
- San Diego State was already without the services of junior forward Max Montana due to a hyperextended left knee suffered in the second half of the game at Arizona State and then added Malik Pope (foot) to the injury list in the first half of the Washington State contest. The senior forward, who entered the game as the team's leader in scoring and rebounding, left for the locker room, but returned in the first half. Pope ending up playing 14 minutes (4 points, 1 rebound, 1 blocked shot), but did not return after halftime.
- With two of their six returning letterwinners sidelined, the Aztecs turned to senior guard Trey Kell and junior backcourt teammate Devin Watson, who ranked second and third on the team in scoring, respectively, entering the game. The duo helped SDSU to a nine-point lead with 8:25 left in the second half, but Kell later suffered an ankle injury with the Aztecs up, 75-70 (6:38). Kell ultimately returned, but SDSU found itself trailing, 80-79 (3:58). The Aztecs got to within three points twice in the final 90 seconds, but could not complete the rally.
- Watson led San Diego State at the Wooden Legacy in scoring (17.0) and assists (4.0), and capped the tournament with a 23-point, 4-rebound, 6-assist performance vs. Washington State. For his effort, he was named to the all-tournament team along with Kell, who averaged 14.3 points, 4.7 rebounds, 3.3 assists and 1.7 steals. Kell ended up with 19 points, five rebounds, three assists and four steals against the Cougars.
- SDSU also received solid contributions vs. WSU from redshirt sophomore Nolan Narain and freshmen Jordan Schakel and Matt Mitchell. Narain played 18 minutes and put up a career-high 10 points on 5-of-6 shooting to go with a personal-best seven boards. Mitchell chipped in 12 points and a career-high nine rebounds. Schakel, meanwhile, added six points and enjoyed personal records in rebounding (7) and assists (2).
- The Aztecs will look to respond to Sunday's loss against a San Diego team that is 3-0 at home after wins over Robert Morris, Norfolk State and Little Rock. SDSU, however, is 9-8 all-time at Jenny Craig Pavilion and has won four straight meetings in Linda Vista.
- SDSU is 30-18 overall against the Toreros and has won 10 of its last 11 against USD. In games played indoors, the Aztecs are 10-0 in their last 10 series meetings. The two teams played outdoors at Petco Park, the home of Major League Baseball's San Diego Padres, in December of 2015.
- San Diego State will finally return home on Sunday afternoon when it plays host to Bradley in the Mountain West-Missouri Valley Challenge. It will mark the beginning of a three-game non-conference-ending homestand with California (Dec. 9) and Gonzaga (Dec. 21) set to visit Viejas Arena.

- San Diego State has advanced to postseason play in 11 of the last 12 seasons (2006 NCAA, 2007-09 NIT, 2010-15 NCAA, 2016 NIT).

Trends:

- SDSU is 10th nationally in winning percentage since the beginning of 2010-11, trailing Gonzaga, Kansas, Wichita State, Kentucky, Duke, Arizona, Louisville, North Carolina and Saint Mary's.
- San Diego State has won 60 straight games when shooting 50 percent or better from the field.

SERIES HISTORY VS. SAN DIEGO

- The Aztecs are 30-18 all-time vs. the Toreros and have won 10 of the last 11 meetings.
- SDSU is 9-8 all-time in games played at USD and has won four straight road games vs. the Toreros.
- The Aztecs have won 10 straight games vs. San Diego in games played indoors.
- San Diego State is 21-8 vs. USD at home and has won eight in a row at Viejas Arena in the series.
- The series has produced some entertaining games as 30 of the 48 all-time meetings have been decided by 10 points or less. Four meetings have also needed overtime, most recently the 2009 get-together at Jenny Craig Pavilion.

SDSU VS. THE WEST COAST CONFERENCE

- The Aztecs have won 14 of their last 16 games vs. the West Coast Conference. This streak only includes games against teams that were in the WCC at game time.
- SDSU has won nine of its last 11 games vs. current members of the West Coast Conference.
- On Dec. 21, the Aztecs will play another WCC school, Gonzaga, at home.

QUICKER TEMPO

- San Diego State is among the top 50 in adjusted tempo, according to KenPom.com, coming in at exactly at No. 50 (through Nov. 27). That number is a huge improvement over the last several seasons when the Aztecs ranked 309th last year (2016-17) and 321st the season before (2015-16). Since 2007-08, SDSU's average ranking in adjusted tempo has been 263rd nationally.

PART OF THE LEGACY

- Devin Watson and Trey Kell etched their names in the Wooden Legacy record book with their all-tournament team appointment. Watson in three games averaged a team-best 17.0 points, while adding 3.0 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 1.3 steals. Kell, meanwhile, averaged 14.3 points, 4.7 rebounds, 3.3 assists and 1.7 steals. Combined, they were 20-for-26 from the free-throw line.
- Jalen McDaniels (7.0 ppg, 7.3 rpg), Matt Mitchell (12.0 ppg, 4.7 rpg) and Malik Pope (6.7 ppg, 4.3 rpg) were named to the Wooden Legacy honorable mention list.

QUIETING UGA

- SDSU defeated Georgia in the semifinals of the Wooden Legacy and in the process, picked up its first win over a current SEC school

since Dec. 21, 1985, when it beat Florida in Las Vegas.

- San Diego State rallied from a 12-point first-half deficit to earn the hard-fought 75-68 victory 18 hours after beating Sacramento State.
- The win marked the Aztecs' third vs. a current SEC school. They also defeated Missouri in San Diego on Dec. 21, 1978.

TOURNAMENT SUCCESS

- San Diego State, which won the 2016 Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic last season, has experienced success in 8-team tournament events. SDSU is 15-3 in those type of events since the start of the 2008-09 campaign after going 2-1 at the Wooden Legacy.
- During the current run, Aztecs have made the championship game all six times, winning the 2009 Great Alaska Shootout, the 2013 Wooden Legacy and the 2016 Diamond Head Classic. SDSU fell short in the 2012 Diamond Head Classic, the 2014 Maui Invitational and the 2017 Wooden Legacy.
- Next season, the Aztecs will be part of the 2018 Maui Invitational field that includes Arizona, Auburn, Duke, Gonzaga, Illinois, Iowa State and Xavier.

NEW TO YOU, BUT NOT TO SDSU

- Although new to head coaching at SDSU, Brian Dutcher is no stranger to the university or the program. The 19th-year Aztec coach experienced 386 victories and 10 Mountain West titles while atop Montezuma Mesa in the 18 seasons with Steve Fisher at the wheel.
- In those 18 years, Dutcher also helped the Aztecs to 13 postseason tournaments, including eight NCAA appearances and a pair of Sweet 16 berths (2011, 2014).

LOTS OF HEAD SHAKING

- SDSU has made its living on the defensive end and this season the Aztecs have left their opponents shaking their heads after shots. Through seven games, San Diego State is limiting its foes to 38.8-percent shooting. That type of effort would rank in a tie for fourth in SDSU Division I history with the 2016-17 squad.

OPTIONS GALORE

- The SDSU roster features versatility and it has given Brian Dutcher options when it comes to his starting lineup. Including the exhibition game, Dutcher used three different lineups in as many outings to begin his coaching career. The constants have been Trey Kell, Malik Pope, Kameron Rooks and Devin Watson. For the fourth slot, Dutcher went with Max Montana (UC San Diego - exhibition), Matt Mitchell (San Diego Christian) and Jeremy Hemsley (at Arizona State).
- With Montana out with an injury, Dutcher repeated a starting unit for the first time, in the third game of the regular season, when he went with Kell, Pope, Rooks, Watson and Mitchell, which was the same lineup he used in the opener vs. San Diego Christian. It was also the lineup he went with vs. Eastern Illinois and all three games at the Wooden Legacy.
- With Kell and Pope's status in the air due to injury, Dutcher may have to use yet another lineup.

ALL-AROUND PERFORMANCE

- Jeremy Hemsley turned in 10 points, six assists and three steals, while committing just one turnover in 22 minutes vs. San Diego Christian. He is the 11th Aztec to have at least that stat line in a game since at least 1996-97, and the first to do so since Chase Tapley vs. Bryant on Nov. 11, 2011.
- He is the second Aztec to accomplish the feat while playing less than 30 minutes, joining Chad Nelson, who did it on Jan. 25, 1997, in 25 minutes vs. Hawai'i.

STAR-STUDED COMPANY

- Matt Mitchell received the starting nod for Brian Dutcher, making him the first true freshman since Jeremy Hemsley to start in their debut. Hemsley was later named Mountain West Freshman of the Year and is a two-time all-conference selection. Prior to Hemsley, Trey Kell earned the nod in his first game at SDSU and has become a two-time all-MW performer.
- Mitchell is just the 15th freshman to start a season-opening game with Dutcher on the bench, dating back to the 1988-89 campaign, and the 10th while Dutcher has been at SDSU. The others are Juwan Howard, Jalen Rose, Chris Webber, Jerod Ward, Albert White, Bradley Jackson, Steve Sir, Brandon Heath, Richie Williams, D.J. Gay, Tim Shelton, Kawhi Leonard, Kell and Hemsley.

BACKCOURT DUO CLOSING IN ON A GRAND

- Jeremy Hemsley is quickly closing in on 1,000 points for his career. In 76 career games, the junior has scored 905 points. Once he hits the milestone, he will be the 32nd member of the Aztecs' 1,000-point club and the first since Trey Kell accomplished the feat on Feb. 12, 2017.
- Devin Watson is just ahead of Hemsley in the race for 1,000 career points. The guard has 966 points after totaling 869 in 61 games at San Francisco.

HIGH-END EXPERIENCE

- The Aztecs welcome six new players to the roster, but two come loaded with high-level experience in Devin Watson and Kameron Rooks. The childhood friends from North San Diego County are eligible after transferring from a pair of Bay Area schools (Watson - San Francisco; Rooks - California).
- Watson brought 61 career games, including 47 starts, with him to the table, while Rooks saw action in 83 games (20 starts) and played in the NCAA tournament (2016) and the NIT (2017).

KEEPIN' IT (ALMOST) 100

- San Diego State scored 98 points in the exhibition vs. UC San Diego. The Aztecs scored more than that just once last season (100 vs. Savannah State on Nov. 28). Outside of that, SDSU scored more than 80 points just three other times (San Diego Christian, vs. Tulsa, vs. Boise State) in 2016-17.
- In the opener vs. San Diego Christian, the Aztecs closed in on 100, but fell nine points short.

- Against McNeese, SDSU turned in 83 points on 49.3 percent shooting, but then followed it with 94 points vs. Eastern Illinois and an 89-point performance vs. Sacramento State.
- More recently, the Aztecs put up 86 vs. Washington State.
- The last three seasons, the Aztecs have averaged 61.8 points per game in 2014-15, 68.6 in 2015-16, and 68.5 in 2016-17.
- The school record for points per game for an entire season is 86.9, which occurred in SDSU's first season as a Division I member (1970-71). San Diego State is currently averaging 83.7 points.

AZTEC STAPLE: DEFENSE

- The Aztecs have been one of the elite defensive teams in the nation over the last few seasons and this year they returned six letter-winners off a team that finished eighth in the nation in field-goal percentage defense and 15th in scoring defense. Both were tops in the MW.
- According to KenPom.com, SDSU last season ranked eighth nationally in effective field-goal percentage defense, ninth in two-point field-goal percentage defense and 20th in blocked shot percentage.
- 2013-14 ranks: 2nd in scoring defense, 6th in scoring margin, 8th in field-goal percentage defense.
- 2014-15 ranks: 2nd in scoring defense, 7th in field-goal percentage defense, 24th in blocked shots.
- 2015-16 ranks: 1st in field-goal percentage defense, 3rd in scoring defense, 10th in blocked shots.
- 2016-17 ranks: 8th in field-goal percentage defense, 15th in scoring defense, 34th in blocked shots.

TOUGH OUT AT HOME

- SDSU has been one of the hardest teams to beat at home since the start of the 2005-06 campaign.

- Included in that stretch are victories at Kansas, at Arizona, at Gonzaga, at New Mexico (four times), at UNLV (nine times), at California, at Utah State (twice), at Utah and at USC. Also included are neutral court victories over UCLA, California (twice), Marquette, Creighton, Georgia, New Mexico, BYU (twice), Oklahoma, Pittsburgh and St. John's.

STREAKING THROUGH CALIFORNIA

- SDSU had won 47 straight games vs. teams from the state of California, a streak that dated to Dec. 2, 2009, before falling at Fresno State, 59-57, on Jan. 3, 2015.
- The Aztecs are now 64-6 in their last 70 vs. California schools and 52-1 in their last 53 vs. non-league California teams (52-0 in last 52 in games played indoors).
- San Diego State has also beaten seven Pac-12 schools during this remarkable run.
- The 47-game winning streak vs. California schools was the longest active streak in the country ahead of second-place BYU (22 straight vs. Colorado teams) and Pittsburgh (22 straight vs. Pennsylvania teams).

NICE RUN

- San Diego State is a member of the California State University system and it had won 22 straight home games against CSU schools dating to the 2000-01 campaign. The streak ended on Feb. 22, 2017, when Fresno State earned a 63-55 victory. Prior to the defeat, the Aztecs' last loss to a Cal State school at home happened back on Jan. 5, 2000, against Cal State Fullerton.
- SDSU has also won 22 consecutive non-conference games vs. its fellow CSU institutions. The Aztecs have not suffered a loss since Nov. 27, 2000, at Fresno State (WAC).

AZTECS PICKED SECOND IN MW PRESEASON POLL

■ SDSU was picked to finish second in the Mountain West media poll. It marked the 13th consecutive year in which San Diego State was picked to finish in the top four of the MW preseason poll and the fourth year in a row that it has been selected either first or second.

■ SDSU earned 229 points and two first-place votes and trailed only Nevada (257 points; 19 first-place votes). The Aztecs, however, were ahead of third-place Boise State (211; 2), fourth-place Fresno State (188) and fifth-place Colorado State (154). The remaining first-place tally went to UNLV, which was predicted to finish sixth (138). The rest of the poll: Wyoming (7th; 133), Utah State (8th; 102), New Mexico (9th; 93), San José State (10th; 41), Air Force (11th; 38).

KELL NAMED PRESEASON ALL-MW

■ Trey Kell was named a preseason all-Mountain West selection at the conference's media summit in Las Vegas in October. With the recognition, he became just the third Aztec to be named to the preseason team multiple times in MW history, joining Brandon Heath (2005-06, 2006-07) and Winston Shepard (2014-15, 2015-16).

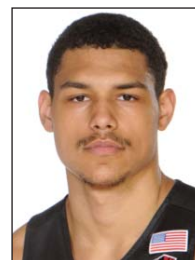

BRIAN DUTCHER

Head Coach

1st Season • 19th Season Overall at SDSU • Minnesota, 1982

Brian Dutcher, a long-time San Diego State men's basketball assistant coach, is entering his first season as head coach following Steve Fisher's retirement announcement on April 11, 2017. Dutcher, who was on Montezuma Mesa for all of Fisher's 18 seasons, held the title of associate head coach/head coach in waiting the previous six years and is the program's 15th head coach.

Over the course of his time at San Diego State, Dutcher helped the Aztecs reach the postseason 13 times, including eight trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 10 Mountain West titles and record 12 seasons of at least 20 victories.

Since 2008-09, Dutcher and SDSU twice advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 (2011, 2014) and NIT semifinal round (2009, 2016), won at least 25 games seven times and captured seven MW championships (five regular season, two tournament).

Dutcher arrived at SDSU shortly after Fisher was hired on March 26, 1999. In his first year in "America's Finest City," the Aztecs won only five games, but improved upon their win total from the season before. After that, San Diego State posted a 14-14 record in 2000-01, before winning the 2002 MW Championship, earning a NCAA tournament bid and finishing with a 21-12 record. The 2002-03 campaign saw SDSU receive an NIT invitation, which culminated in the program's first Division I postseason victory.

After helping attract the first McDonald's All-American to the 2002-03 squad, Dutcher assisted in securing the signatures of future starters and all-league performers Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter. The duo started their first two seasons on The Mesa, leading to the 2005-06 season that produced the school's first Mountain West regular-season and tournament title sweep.

The Aztecs advanced to the NCAA tournament and ultimately won a then-school-record 24 games. That appearance led to a string of 10 consecutive postseason berths.

From the 2006-07 campaign through 2008-09, San Diego State registered 20 or more wins and went to three straight NITs. In 2009, the Aztecs advanced to the NIT semifinals and broke the previous school record with 26 victories.

The run to the NIT semifinals was a springboard to the most successful run in SDSU basketball history. Led by future NBA first-round draft pick and NBA champion Kawhi Leonard, the 2009-10 Aztecs won the MW Championship, advanced to the NCAA tournament and fell four points shy of moving on to the second round before finishing with a 25-9 record.

The NCAA experience from the 2009-10 squad proved fruitful in 2010-11 when it returned all five starters, including Leonard, and a freshman named Jamaal Franklin, who would turn out to be a future MW Player of the Year and NBA draft selection. With Dutcher on staff, SDSU won its first 20 games of the year, shared the MW regular-season title and captured the MW tournament crown. The Aztecs moved on to the NCAA tournament as a No. 2 seed and won the program's first Division I NCAA tournament game. San Diego State, which was ranked as high as No. 4 and received first-place votes at one point in the season, advanced to the Sweet 16 and fell to the eventual national champion, finishing with a school-record 34 wins, a mark that still stands today. The Aztecs' also found themselves in the final top-25 polls, ranking sixth in the AP and 11th in the USA Today Coaches Poll.

Five months after SDSU's record-setting 2010-11 campaign, the University elevated Dutcher from associate head coach to associate head coach/head coach in waiting.

In his first season with his new title, Dutcher and the Aztecs advanced to the 2011-12 NCAA tournament as an at-large team and recorded 26 wins. The next season, SDSU was again an at-large selection to the 2013 NCAA tournament, moved on to the round of 32 for the second time in three years and finished with 23 victories.

Another NCAA Sweet 16 run was in the cards in Dutcher's third season as the head coach in waiting. The Aztecs opened the season by winning 21 of their first 22 games, including 20 in a row at one point, and were led by seniors Xavier Thames, who would become an NBA draft pick, and Josh Davis. SDSU won the program's second outright Mountain West regular-season title and later swept through two games in Spokane, Washington, to secure its second Sweet 16 appearance in four seasons. San Diego State compiled 31 wins and finished the season ranked 13th in the AP and 12th in the Coaches after rising to as high as fifth nationally in both polls.

The 2014-15 campaign saw the Aztecs spend their fifth straight season in the top 25. In the process of winning 27 games, San Diego State grabbed its second straight MW regular-season crown and earned an at-large invitation to the NCAA tournament where they defeated St. John's in the round of 64. One season later, the Aztecs found themselves in the NIT after winning the MW by three games with a 16-2 record. Nevertheless, San Diego State won three games and qualified for the NIT national semifinals, eventually logging 28 victories.

More recently, San Diego State completed the 2016-17 slate with a 19-14 record despite experiencing a rash of injuries. The 2016 Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic champions will enter 2017-18 as one of 12 teams to have won at least 19 games in 12 consecutive seasons.

Before Dutcher arrived at San Diego State, he served as assistant coach and later associate head coach at Michigan under Fisher. He spent 10 seasons on the Wolverine staff, establishing himself as one of the nation's top assistant coaches. His first year in Ann Arbor was 1989 and resulted in a national title for Michigan as he assisted then-interim head coach Fisher on the bench.

The Bloomington, Minn., native led UM's recruiting efforts in 1990-91 when the Wolverines inked Juwan Howard, Ray Jackson, Jimmy King, Jalen Rose and Chris Webber. The "Fab Five" is considered perhaps the best recruiting class in NCAA history. Dutcher helped lead that group to nearly 100 wins, two berths in the NCAA championship game and a regional final over a four-year period. He was also on the Michigan staff for an NIT championship (1997).

Dutcher's recruiting prowess, however, was demonstrated by more than just the "Fab Five" haul. Michigan had the nation's top-ranked recruiting class in 1993-94 and in 1994-95, with a group that included Maurice Taylor and Jerod Ward. The accomplishment marked the first time that a university had the nation's top class in consecutive years, according to recruiting analyst Bob Gibbons.

Dutcher was born Oct. 30, 1959, in Alpena, Mich. He attended Jefferson High School in Bloomington, Minn., and went on to earn a bachelor's degree in physical education from Minnesota in 1982. While an undergraduate, he worked for his father, then-Gopher head coach Jim Dutcher. He then spent one season in the prep ranks at Apple Valley (Minn.) High School before becoming a graduate assistant at Illinois, where he earned his master's degree in physical education and athletic administration.

While in Champaign, Dutcher helped Lou Henson lead the Illini to a Big Ten championship, two appearances in the Sweet 16 and one regional final.

Dutcher's first full-time coaching job came at South Dakota State, where he spent three seasons helping turn around the Division II program before departing in 1988 for Michigan.

His final season in Ann Arbor ended with the Wolverines claiming the first-ever Big Ten Tournament championship.

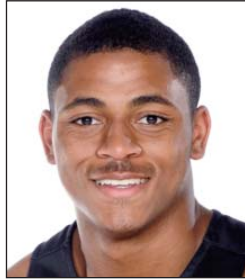

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State opened the Brian Dutcher Era with a 91-52 victory over San Diego Christian at Viejas Arena. The game marked the first of Dutcher's head coaching career after serving as an assistant under Steve Fisher for 18 seasons.

The Dutcher-led Aztecs opened the night by scoring 14 unanswered points and were never threatened the rest of the night. SDSU kept the Hawks from reaching double digits for almost 10 minutes. A basket by Derrick Novsek gave San Diego Christian its ninth and 10th points with 10:43 left in the first half to make it a 27-10 game.

The Aztecs led at halftime, 46-24, thanks to 56.7-percent shooting. On two-point attempts alone, SDSU was connecting at a 76.2-percent clip (16-21).

The second half was more of the same from San Diego State as it made 55.6 percent from the floor and made 11 of 13 attempts from the charity stripe. Defensively, SDSU did not allow the Hawks to get to the free-throw line. For the game, San Diego Christian was 3-for-4 from the charity stripe.

SDSU had two players reach double figures in scoring, but had six others score at least six points. Malik Pope made nine of his 11 shot attempts for a game-high 20 points. Jeremy Hemsley chipped in 10 points to go with a game-high six assists.

Pope received the starting assignment and was joined by three players who had never suited up for the Aztecs in graduate transfer Kameron Rooks, junior transfer Devin Watson and true freshman Matt Mitchell. Senior Trey Kell filled out the group.

TEMPE, Ariz. - San Diego State rallied from a 10-point first-half deficit to lead at halftime, but could not hold its advantage as Arizona State stormed back in the second half to defeat the Aztecs, 90-68, at Wells Fargo Arena.

SDSU scored the first five points of the game and enjoyed a three-point lead through the first media timeout. The tide began to turn with a De'Quon Lake layup, which led to another by Kodi Justice, but Devin Watson and Malik Pope connected for an alley-oop to help the Aztecs regain the lead at 11-10 with 13:41 left.

The Pope dunk, however, would be a blip on ASU's radar as the hosts responded by scoring nine straight points. Max Montana briefly stopped the run with a three-pointer only to have the Sun Devils score five additional points to go up, 24-14.

San Diego State then made its next nine field goal attempts to move in front, 38-32. Of those nine buckets, three were Montana treys, giving him four in four tries. The Aztecs ultimately led at halftime, 40-34.

Things started well for SDSU out of the break as Pope banked in a three-pointer to move its advantage to nine. ASU scored seven unanswered points to get within two, but Pope answered with a dunk.

With the Aztecs up, 47-45, the Sun Devils outscored the Aztecs, 31-5, over the next 10:11, to take a 76-52 lead with 6:56 left in the game. SDSU never got closer than 18 points the rest of the way.

Trey Kell led the Aztecs with 16 points and 10 rebounds with Pope adding 14 points and eight boards. Montana finished with 15 points.

Tra Holder had 24 points for an ASU side that featured five double-figures scorers.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State bounced back from its first loss of the season and handled McNeese, 83-52, at Viejas Arena.

The Aztecs scored the first nine points of the game and never looked back, leading from wire-to-wire. The Cowboys, however, made it somewhat of a game shortly after SDSU's ninth point, rallying to get within 13-11. From there, San Diego State put up seven unanswered points to lead by nine again.

The 7-0 run was a glimpse of what was to come the rest of the first half as it was a part of an opening-period-ending 26-8 blitz of McNeese, which trailed at halftime, 46-19. SAN DIEGO - Freshman Matt Mitchell totaled 31 points on 10-14 shooting, including a 7-11 mark from three-point range as SDSU defeated Eastern Illinois, 94-63, at Viejas Arena on Monday night.

The Aztecs never trailed in the contest, and jumped out to an 18-point lead (26-8) just 9:54 into the first half. SDSU went into halftime with a 40-25 lead.

After Malik Pope nearly had a double double in the first half alone with 13 points and seven rebounds, Mitchell stole the show in the second half, recording 26 of SDSU's 54 second-half points in just 16 minutes of action.

SDSU used a 20-4 run in the second half to build a 76-45 lead with 8:25 left. During the run, Mitchell erupted for 16 points in only four and a half minutes, while the Aztecs as a team converted on seven of its eight shot attempts.

Pope finished with his first double double of the year and eighth of his career, tallying 17 points and 11 rebounds. Trey Kell and Devin Watson reached double figures with 14 and 10 points, respectively, while Kell tied his career-high with seven assists.

Mitchell's 31 points were the most by a freshman since Evan Burns scored 31 vs. New Mexico in 2003. With seven three-pointers on the night, Mitchell set a new freshman record, while his 31 points were the fourth most by any freshman in the nation this season. The seven converted three-pointers were also tied for second most nationally and the fourth most by an Aztec since 1996-97.

Eastern Illinois was led by Jajuan Starks' 17 points and seven rebounds.

FULLERTON, Calif. - San Diego State led Sacramento State, 12-0, before the game was three minutes old and cruised to victory in the quarterfinal round of the Wooden Legacy, 89-52, at Titan Gym on the campus of Cal State Fullerton.

The Hornets committed three turnovers and missed both of their shots, each of which were three-point attempts, and the Aztecs made five of their first six shots to race out to the 12-0 lead.

Both teams went scoreless for the next 1:42 before Sacramento State snapped its scoreless streak with a Izayah Mauriohoo-Le'afa free throw with 15:24 left. SDSU ended up closing the half on a 37-13 run to take a 49-14 lead at halftime.

In the first half, San Diego State limited Sacramento State to 23.1-percent shooting, including an 0-for-13 effort from behind the three-point arc. The Aztecs, meanwhile, knocked down seven three-pointers and were 12-of-15 from the charity stripe.

When action resumed, SDSU grew its lead to 47 points, leading 65-18, with 15:12 to play. Soon thereafter, all of the Aztecs' starters were out of the game.

The Hornets nearly outscored San Diego State in the second half, putting up 40 points and allowing 38 to the Aztecs. Despite the nearly equal half, SDSU never let the Hornets get closer than 37 points.

Devin Watson led the Aztecs with 12 points and Jalen McDaniels grabbed a career-high 13 rebounds. Kell and Matt Mitchell each had 11 points and Jeremy Hemsley added 10.

FULLERTON, Calif. - San Diego State rallied from a 12-point first-half deficit and defeated Georgia, 75-68, in the semifinals of the Wooden Legacy.

The Aztecs won by doing the little things, such as outrebounding the Bulldogs, 48-44, taking and making more free throws, and committing a season-low five turnovers. All of that, however, was not present during an opening-game run that saw Georgia jump out to a 16-4 lead nearly eight minutes into the game.

The Bulldogs led 6-0 before Trey Kell ended SDSU's 0-for-8 start from the field to begin the contest. On the Aztecs' second possession following the Kell bucket, Malik Pope was issued a foul and then a technical, giving him three personal fouls with 15:11 left. He did not return until the second half.

SDSU, meanwhile, plugged away without its leading scorer and rebounder, and went on a 7-0 run to get within five points. Georgia, however, answered with back-to-back threes to push its lead back to double figures.

The Aztecs later went on an 18-3 run to take a 31-27 lead with four minutes to go and eventually went into halftime down, 34-33.

The second half was a back-and-forth affair and the score was tied at 61 with 5:12 remaining after Matt Mitchell made two free throws. Georgia moved ahead, 64-63, on a trey by William Jackson II, but the Aztecs responded with a Pope tip-in and a Mitchell three. The four points were part of a larger 13-3 run that put SDSU ahead by eight in a game it won by seven.

Devin Watson had a team-high 16 points, Kell turned in 13 points and a game-high nine rebounds, and Mitchell finished with 13 points. Jalen McDaniels added a career-high 11 points and eight rebounds.

FULLERTON, Calif. - San Diego State fell short in its bid for a second Wooden Legacy championship, dropping a 93-86 decision in the title game to Washington State.

The Aztecs took a 73-64 lead after Matt Mitchell knocked down a three-pointer with 8:25 left in the second half, but the advantage soon evaporated. An 11-2 Cougar run buoyed by a trio of three-pointers, including a pair from Viont'e Daniels, leveled the score at 75.

The game was tied twice more, but only briefly, as Malachi Flynn made his first free throw to make it 79-79 and then converted the second with 3:58 to play. From there, Washington State scored five straight points to move ahead by six.

The Aztecs got to within three points on two different occasions in the final 1:23 only to have WSU answer with two points of its own each time to end the threat.

The first-half was a see-saw battle with Washington State taking threes on every other shot. Of WSU's 30 field-goal attempts, 16 were from behind the arc. Its effort, however, helped it take a 46-43 lead at halftime after it connected on eight treys.

As for the Aztecs, they struggled to shoot the three, making eight for the game, with six coming in the first half. Half of their threes came from SDSU's starting backcourt of Devin Watson and Trey Kell as both made a pair en route to 23 and 19 points, respectively. Watson added six assists and Kell had four steals.

San Diego State, however, suffered a pair of big blows, losing leading scorer and rebounder Malik Pope, and Kell to ankle injuries. Pope played 14 first-half minutes and was unavailable in the second. Kell, meanwhile, suffered his injury with 6:38 left in the game before returning with 3:58 to go. The Aztecs were up by five when Kell left the game and were down one when he returned.
