San Diego State (9-10 overall; 3-3 Mountain West Conference play) concludes the first half of conference play by opening a three-game homestand against 21st/22nd-ranked (AP/Coaches) Utah (18-3; 6-0 MWC) at Cox Arena Saturday night.

Game time for the 56th meeting between the schools is set for 7:05 p.m. PST. Channel 4 San Diego is televising the contest in the San Diego market while KJZZ-TV will broadcast the production back to Salt Lake City (no satellite availability).

Although facing nationally-ranked opposition is nothing new for San Diego State having faced Fresno State, Duke Arizona, Illinois Texas Tech and Washington in recent seasons, this will mark the first visit by a current top 25 team

to Cox Arena since No. 23/21 Texas Tech played SDSU in front of a soldout audience on Jan. 6, 2003. At No. 21 in the AP poll, Utah is the highest ranked team in the AP poll to play the Aztecs at home since top-ranked Arizona visited on Dec. 7, 2002. This also marks the first time in the Mountain West Conference era that a nationally-ranked league team in the coaches poll has played at San Diego State.

The Aztecs lost their second consecutive game on Monday night, losing 88-71 at New Mexico. The Lobos shot 57.1 percent from the field, the highest by an Aztec opponent this season and connected on 12-of-25 (48.0 percent) attempts from three-point range.

San Diego State was led by a career-high tying 14 points from freshman guard Matt Thomas and senior forward Chris Walton reached double figures for the fourth time in six games with 14 points. Sophomore forward Marcus Slaughter recorded his fourth double-double in five games, the eighth of the season and the 10th of his career with 11 points and a game-high 10 rebounds. Sophomore guard Brandon Heath chipped in 11 points.

Utah won its 13th consecutive game Monday night with a 72-58 victory at Brigham Young. The Utes have won all 13 games during the streak by double figures, own a +17.2 scoring margin in conference games, have a +11.1 rebound margin for the season and are shooting 53.9 percent from the floor. Sophomore center Andrew Bogut leads the nation in double-doubles and is averaging 20.0 points and 12.0 rebounds. Senior guard Marc Jackson is averaging 11.2 points and a team-high 3.6 assists.

Utah leads the all-time series 46-9 and has won four straight and 18 of the last 19 games in the series. The last Aztec win in the series was on Jan. 18, 2003, a 58-56 victory at Cox Arena.

## Hot-Shooting Lobos Hand Aztecs Second-Straight Loss, 88-71

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. -- New Mexico shot 57.1 percent from the field and connected on 12 three-point field goals as the Lobos defeated San Diego State, 88-71, at The Pit on Jan. 31.

The Aztecs surrendered opponent season-highs in both field goal percentage and three-point field goals.

San Diego State led 23-20 with 8:27 remaining in the first half. But the Lobos closed out the period on a 20-8 run to lead 40-31 at intermission.

The Aztecs closed to within eight points (54-46) with 11:45 to play, but New Mexico responded with a 13-3 run to put the game away.

Lobo senior forward Danny Granger, playing in just his second game since returning from an injury, scored a gamehigh 21 points and added nine rebounds. Senior forward Alfred Neale came off the bench to score 20 points on the strength of 4-of-5 shooting from behind the arc.

San Diego State was led by freshman guard Matt Thomas and senior forward Chris Walton with 14 points apiece. Thomas tied his career high for points, connecting on 5-of-8 shots from the field. Sophomore forward Marcus Slaughter posted his fourth double-double in five games with 11 points and a game-high 10 rebounds. Sophomore guard Brandon Heath added 11 points, five rebounds and three assists.

The loss left the Aztecs with a 3-3 record in league play and in a three-way tie for third place with New Mexico and Wyoming.

San Diego State returns home for three consecutive home games and its first road game in the month of February is on the 19th, at Colorado State.

## San Diego State-Utah: The Series

- ▶ San Diego State and Utah are meeting for the 56th all-time game between the schools, with Utah owning a 46-9 advantage including a 17-7 lead in games played in San Diego.
- ▶ The Aztecs' win on Jan. 18, 2003 over Utah at Cox Arena snapped a 14-game overall losing streak to the Utes. Since that game the Aztecs have dropped four straight to the Utes, giving Utah 18 wins in the last 19 encounters. Last season, Utah won 65-61 on Feb. 7 at the Huntsman Center, 66-53 victory at Cox Arena on March 6 and 75-69 on March 11 at the Pepsi Center in the quartefinal round of the Mountain West Conference Championship.
- ▶ Despite losing all three games last season, the Aztecs put up quite a fight. SDSU enjoyed leads in all three games, and actually led for 23:59 (more than half) of the contest in Salt Lake City and for 17:17 (nearly half) of the MWC tournament meeting. San Diego State appeared to be in good position to win two of the games. The Aztecs never trailed in the first half of the game in Salt Lake City last year and led by seven points with 15:41 to play and led by a four-point advantage in Denver with 3:10 remaining. ▶ Four of the last five meetings in the series have been decided by six points or less with the Utes winning three of those four games.
- ▶ Senior Chris Walton has posted some impressive numbers against the Utes. In seven games against Utah, Walton has active team-highs with 53 points and 10 assists. In addition, he has connected on 6-of-11 three-point field goal shooting (54.5 percent). Prior to this season, Walton had 13 career double-figure scoring games, with three of those coming against Utah. Walton now has 17 career double-figure scoring efforts and has reached 10 or more points in each of his last three contests against Utah.
- ► Current members of the Aztec team have combined to connect on 19-of-39 (48.7 percent) from three-point range. The breakdown by individual is Walton 6-for-11 (54.5 percent), Heath 6-for-13 (46.2 percent), Manker 4-for-10 (40.0 percent), Slaughter 1-for-1 (100.0 percent), Johnson 1-for-2 (50.0 percent) and Sharper 1-for-2 (50.0 percent).
- ▶ Current Aztec player stats vs. Utah can be found on page four.
- ▶ Steve Fisher owns a 3-10 lifetime mark against Utah, earning a pair of victories while at Michigan. Fisher's squads defeated the Utes 81-65 on Dec. 1, 1990, in Ann Arbor, Mich., and 73-69 in the third-place game of the 1994 Maui Classic in Lahaina, Hawaii. That victory over the Utes in Maui was Fisher's 125th career victory.
- ▶ The Aztecs and Steve Fisher are 2-1 lifetime against Utah coach Ray Giacoletti. San Diego State faced the first-year Utes coach three consecutive seasons while he was at Eastern Washington. The Aztecs claimed an 86-58 victory on Dec. 20, 2001, lost 75-70 on Nov. 23, 2002 and won 79-66 on Dec. 20, 2003. All three games were played at Cox Arena.

#### LAST MEETING AND LAST POSTSEASON MEETING

**Utah 75, San Diego State 69** | March 11, 2004 | Pepsi Center | MWC Quarterfinals DENVER - Aerick Sanders and San Diego State matched Utah shot for shot, but it wasn't enough as the Utes held off the Aztecs, 75-69, in the quarterfinals of the Mountain West Conference Championships.

Sanders had 18 points on 9-of-17 shooting, including 12 points in the first half, before fouling out late for San Diego State (14-16). The sixth-seeded Aztecs led 65-62 late and had plenty of chances down the stretch, but couldn not convert.

Utah (22-8) defeated San Diego State, 66-53, in the regular-season finale on March 6,

but the game was much closer this time. The third-seeded Utes had 15 turnovers, mostly due to San Diego State's pressure, and was forced to hit 7-of-8 free throws in the final 1:10 to win.

After the teams traded leads for the majority of the second half, Utah went up 68-67 on a three-point play by Justin Hawkins with 1:47 left. Chris Walton had chance to put San Diego State back up with a short jumper in the lane, but his shot rimmed out. San Diego State forced a long three-point attempt by Jacobson at the other end, but Richard Chaney sneaked in for the rebound and hit two free throws to put Utah up 72-67 with 25 seconds left. Chaney finished with 14 points and eight rebounds.

Chris Walton chipped in with 14 points, while Brandon Heath scored 13 points in 32 minutes.

#### **LAST MEETING IN SAN DIEGO**

#### Utah 66, San Diego State 53 | Mar. 6, 2004 | Cox Arena at Aztec Bowl

SAN DIEGO - Senior Aerick Sanders scored 20 points and pulled down 12 rebounds in his final game at Cox Arena, but it was not enough to beat visiting Utah as the Aztecs dropped a 66-53 decision on March 6.

The game went back and forth with nine lead changes and four ties in the first 15 minutes. However, after Sanders went to the bench with three fouls and 4:24 left in the first half, Utah took advantage, going on a 11-2 run to end the first half up 33-23.

The Utes slowly built an 18-point lead with 7:27 left to play, but Sanders led a late 10-1 run as the Aztecs chopped the lead to nine (59-50) with 4:42 left.

An offensive put-back by Tim Frost after a missed free throw put the Utes back up by double figures, and Utah led comfortably the rest of the way. Frost scored 14 of his 19 points in the second half to secure the win, while Nick Jacobson added 16 for the Utes.

With the victory, Utah (21-8, 9-5 Mountain West) clinched second place in the conference. San Diego State (14-15, 5-9) will meet Utah again Thursday in the quarterfinals of the conference tournament in Denver.

Chris Walton scored 10 points for the Aztecs, who were outscored from the free throw line 17-3. Wesley Stokes added five assists and four steals.

### LAST MEETING IN SALT LAKE CITY

#### Utah 65, San Diego State 61 | Feb. 7, 2004 | Huntsman Center

SALT LAKE CITY - Nick Jacobson scored 10 consecutive points as part of a 21-5 Utah run as the Utes defeated San Diego State, 65-61, on Saturday afternoon at Huntsman Center.

It was the 22nd consecutive victory for the Utes over the Aztecs in Salt Lake City, and 21st straight win for Utah over SDSU at Huntsman Center.

San Diego State did not trail much of the first 29 minutes of the game, and led by as many as eight points in the second half at 38-30 with 17:35 to play.

The Aztecs led 42-35 with 15:41 left, when the Utes went on the 21-5 spurt over the next 9:38 to take a nine-point lead. San Diego State battled back and trailed by just four points with 4:31 left. The Aztecs got the ball back, missed two shots and the front end of a one-and-one before the Utes pushed the advantage back to nine with 2:30 to play.

Once again the Aztecs made a run, cutting the lead to three points on two occasions in the closing minutes. SDSU missed four field goals and a free throw in the final 55 seconds.

Richard Chaney had 17 points, while Jacobson added 16 points for the Utes. San Diego State had four players in double figures, paced by Chris Walton's career-high 15 points on 6-of-8 shooting. Freshman Brandon Heath connected on four three-point field goals en route to 14 points, while Wesley Stokes scored 11 and Aerick Sanders 10.

The four-point margin of defeat marked the closest the Aztecs had played the Utes in Salt Lake City since a 93-89 over-time loss on Jan. 10, 1986.

## LAST SDSU VICTORY IN SERIES

## San Diego State 58, Utah 56 | Feb. 18, 2003 | Cox Arena at Aztec Bowl

SAN DIEGO - The Aztecs utilized an 18-4 second-half run as well as clutch free-throw shooting and baskets from Tony Bland and Mike Mackell in the waning minutes to hold on for a 58-56 victory over Utah at Cox Arena.

The victory enabled San Diego State (11-4 overall, 2-0 Mountain West) to end eight seasons of futility and a 14-game losing streak to Utah (12-4/0-1 MWC) in the process of earning their school-record 11th straight victory over non-ranked opponents.

Utah had opened up a six-point lead before the Aztecs went on their second-half run over a 7:01 span, receiving six points from Mackell and five each from Deandre Moore and Evan Burns in the run to take a 49-41 lead with 6:27 left.

Utah responded with a 9-1 run to knot the game at 50. The Aztecs then called timeout and on the ensuing possession,

Tony Bland hit a running jumper to put the Aztecs up by two.

A few free throws and a Mackell tip in made the lead four before a Nick Jacobson layup and an Aztec turnover gave the Utes the ball down by two points with 27 seconds remaining, but Johnsen's three-pointer rimmed out and SDSU's Aerick Sanders grabbed the rebound and made both free throws to give the Aztecs a four-point lead with six seconds left. Tim Frost's shot at the buzzer finalized the score at 58-56.

Mackell and Bland, who helped hold Utah leading scorer Nick Jacobson to 4-of-16 shooting, led the Aztecs with 13 points each.

## **Aztec Cliff Notes**

San Diego State (9-10 overall/3-3 Mountain West Conference) has flirted with a .500 mark while facing one of the most challenging schedules in school history all while having the senior class miss 44 games due to injury and suspension. What looked like one of the most experience teams in school history has had to rely heavily upon underclassmen due to the dismissal of Wesley Stokes (who started 28 of 30 games a year ago) and injuries to Chris Walton (groin pull/hip flexor) and Travis Hanour (tendonitis).

The result has been an exciting, and somewhat inconsistent, season with a number of first and second year players making an immediate impact.

San Diego State has played with a predominately 10-man rotation since the return of Walton. The Aztecs have started 10 different lineups, and have played 10 different starting groups in the last 13 games.

The one player to start every game is 6-8 sophomore forward <u>Marcus Slaughter</u>. Second on the team in scoring (17.5) and leader in rebounding (9.1), Slaughter has been a consistent threat for the Aztecs having scored in double figures every game this season and leading the team in scoring eight times and rebounding 14 times.

Joining Slaughter in the frontcourt are Mohamed Camara, Trimaine Davis, Chris Manker and Chris Walton. Typically the Aztecs have started three guards leaving one of the aforementioned players to join Slaughter on the front line.

Senior <u>Chris Walton</u> (7.9 ppg, 3.3 rpg) plays both the three and four positions for the Aztecs. He played the opener and then missed a month (nine games) due to a hip flexor/groin strain injury. He is still bothered by the injury, but has returned to play 23 or more minutes in each of the last nine games and recently had a couple of terrific performances. He had 12 points, six rebounds and a game-winning shot at Brigham Young followed by 11 points, four rebounds and two assists in the victory at UNLV. In SDSU's last home outing he was 10-of-11 from the field and had a career-high 23 points in the victory over Colorado State. He has scored in double figures in four of the last six games.

Junior Mohamed Camara (2.7 ppg, 4.4 rpg, 14 blks.) is the Aztecs biggest post presence at 6-10, 265. He has only been playing basketball since 1999 and is continuing to develop his offensive skills. Had his best game of the season against Providence on Dec. 31 when he matched his career best with seven points and added a career-high 13 rebounds. He has seven or more rebounds in a game five times this season.

Senior Chris Manker (8.3 ppg, 3.3 rpg, 1.2 apg) exploded out of the gate and is putting together the best season of his career. Always a threat from behind the arc, the 7-0 center has emerged as a post option. This season he has 41 two-point field goals, 23 more than he had all of last season. He also has 60 career three-point goals. Most impressive, Manker leads the Aztecs in hockey +/-, as SDSU has outscored its opposition by 77 points when he is on the floor and been outscored by 73 points when he is out of the game.

Junior <u>Trimaine Davis</u> (3.8 ppg, 1.7 rpg) is playing the best basketball of his career. An athletic 6-8 forward, Davis has felt more comfortable as his playing time increases. He has 37 points in his last 88 minutes on the court and is connecting on 52.6 percent of his field goals on the season. As has always been the case, Davis is an enthusiastic player who took over the duties of team captain in Walton's absence.

Turning to the backcourt, the other staple in the Aztec lineup is sophomore guard <u>Brandon Heath</u> (leading scorer at 18.2 ppg, team-high 4.0 apg, 3.6 rpg). Heath has started 18-of-19 games this season, has 18 double-digit scoring games this season and has connected on a three-point field goal in 18 of his last 20 games. A graduate of Westchester High, Heath scored nine of San Diego State's last 11 points against the Cougars and followed that up with a career-high 37 points in the victory at UNLV. He has 109 points in his last five games (21.8 ppg).

The rest of the backcourt consists of Tommy Johnson, John Sharper, Tyler Smith and Matt Thomas.

Junior John Sharper (6.2 ppg, 1.3 rpg) is once again flirting with shooting 40 percent from three-point range. Third on the school's career three-point field goal percentage charts, he has started 14 games this season and played at least 13 minutes in all 19 games and played 30 or more minutes in four of his last five games. He has just five turnovers in his last 263 minutes of action.

Walk-on true freshman Tyler Smith (2.2 ppg, 1.9 rpg, 1.4 apg) has been the surprise of the year for San Diego State. Smith has started seven of the last 10 games and is second on the Aztec team in hockey +/-. This season, when he is on the court the Aztecs have outscored their opposition by 22 points. When he is off the court, SDSU has been outscored by 18 points. He has made nine of his last 15 three-point field goal attempts and had a career-best six assists at Brigham Young and a career-high nine points at New Mexico.

True freshman Matt Thomas (4.9 ppg, 2.3 rpg, 1.3 apg) plays the point position for the Aztecs when he is on the floor. He has made three starts this season in and has seen action in all 19 games. An explosive player, Thomas has the ability to get around defenders and has double-digit scoring performances at Washington (14 points), vs. Saint Mary's (10 points) and at New Mexico (14 points).

Senior <u>Tommy Johnson</u> (1.3 ppg, 0.9 rpg) has played in 16 of the 19 games for SDSU so far. Typically a reserve, he has played as many as 24 minutes this season and has posted outings of seven points and six rebounds this season.

## **The Brandon Heath Experience**



Sophomore guard Brandon Heath has enjoyed an impressive sophomore season, leading the team in scoring (18.2) and assists (4.0), but he has been sensational of late.

Since taking over the game at Brigham Young by scoring nine of SDSU's last 11 points, Heath has produced consecutive scoring efforts of 37 at UNLV, 29 vs. Wyoming, 15 vs. Colorado State, 17 at Air Force and 11 at New Mexico. The 37-point effort was a career high, Steve Fisher era high, the most by an Aztec player in an MWC game, the 10th highest scoring output in school history and fifth highest scoring game in school history.

Since exploding down the stretch at Brigham Young, Heath has produced 118 points, on 41-of-82 (50.0 percent) from the field, 28-of-36 (77.8 percent) from the free throw line in his last 195 minutes on the court. That means in his last 195 minutes on the court, Heath is averaging 24.2 points per 40 minutes.

In MWC games entering the weekend, Heath ranked first in scoring (21.8, by a 13-point margin), second in steals (2.20), sixth in assists (4.20), sixth in three-point field goals made (1.60), 13th in field goal percentage (47.6) and 15th in free throw percentage (69.7). Heath has a 13-point advantage in the conference scoring race over Utah's Andrew Bogut who is currently in second place.

The scoring output Heath has produced in the two games against UNLV and Wyoming was the fifth highest total in consecutive games in school history and the highest since Anthony Watson scored 72 points (school-record 54 vs. U.S. International and 18 at Texas-El Paso) during the 1985-86 season. Below is a look at the most points scored in consecutive games during the Division I era. All four efforts that rank in front of Heath were produced by seniors and read like a who's who of Aztec basketball - school two-year scoring leader and 1979 all-WAC first-team Kim Goetz, 1984 All-American Michael Cage (twice) and 1986 WAC Player of the Year Anthony Watson.

After missing nine games and a month of the season, Chris Walton's senior season appeared to be in serious jeopardy. Even after returning from a hip fexor/groin injury that continues to nag him today, the forward had scored all of 10 points, on 3-of-14 field goal attempts in his four games of the season.

But since scoring 12 points and hitting the game-winning shot against Brigham Young, Walton has been on quite a roll. In his last six games Walton is averaging 11.5 points, 3.7 rebounds and has connected on 29-of-47 shots from the field (61.7 percent).

Walton's comeback story is nothing short of amazing. Before the Aztecs left for the conference opener at Brigham Young, Walton scheudled an appointment with a specialist in Philadelphia to evaluate his injury. The senior carried his x-rays and MRI on the plane to Provo and was questionable for the game against the Cougars. Despite missing the previous four practices and not taking part in pregame walk through, he informed Coach Fisher that he would able to play a couple of minutes in the game.

He responded by playing 30 minutes, scoring 12 points including the game-winner on a fadeaway seven-footer as time expired. The next day he flew to Philadelphia and was told playing with the injury would cause no more damage. With that knowledge, Walton has played 23 or more minutes every game since and 30 minutes in all but one game.

Last Saturday he became the 14th Aztec player in the Division I era to log 100 career games.

## A 3-3 Start Never Looked So Good

For the third consecutive season, San Diego State is 3-3 after six conference games. What sets this season's team apart is that the Aztecs have victories at Brigham Young and UNLV and difficult road trips to New Mexico and Air Force out of the way...

Below is a look at some of the accomplishments of the 2004-05 Aztecs through six league games.

- ▶ San Diego State opened a league campaign with at least three victories in its first four games since the 1996-97 team opened WAC play with a 3-2 mark (def. UTEP, lost at UNLV, won at Air Force, def. Wyoming, lost to Colorado State). In the last 19 seasons, this is just the fourth time SDSU has owned a winning league record after five games.
- San Diego State posted a conference record above .500 (when SDSU was 3-2) this late in the league season (at least four games), since the 1996-97 team was 3-2 after five WAC games. SDSU has gotten to .500 late in league campaigns (finishing 7-7 in 2001-02 and 6-6 late in the 2002-03 season), but has never been above .500 after at least four games in the Mountain West Conference era.
- ▶ SDSU won its first two road games of the league season for just the second time in 35 Division I seasons (the previous time was in 1984-85 when the Aztecs went 23-8 won the Western Athletic Conference tournament and advanced to the NCAA Tournament).
- ▶ SDSU won at Brigham Young and UNLV in the same season for the first time in school history.
- ▶ SDSU won at Brigham Young for just the third time in 26 visits to Provo (3-23) and snapped a 17-game conference losing streak to the Cougars in Provo. BYU fell to 30-2 in its last 32 league home games.
- ▶ SDSU claimed its first regular-season victory at the Thomas & Mack Center, second win over UNLV in the building and third victory over the Rebels in Sin City in 19 games (3-16). UNLV dropped to 27-9 in MWC home games, and the last five MWC teams to defeat UNLV at home have gone on to finish third or better in the final conference standings.
- SDSU became the eighth MWC team (Utah became the ninth last Monday) to win its first two road games of the league campaign. Of the previous seven teams, five went on to win or share the league title, one team finished second and one team finished third.
- ▶ SDSU joined the 2003 Utah team as the only teams in Mountain West Conference teams in league history to win at UNLV and at Brigham Young in the same season.

## **A Strong Opening Rotation**

San Diego State will reach the halfway point in the conference season following Saturday night's game looking for just its second winning Mountain West Conference rotation record in the six year history of the league. The Aztecs already matched a school record by winning two road games in a single rotation.

## We Know Drama

San Diego State may have exercised of the ghosts left from last season. In 2003-04, the Aztecs finished 4-10 in league play, but lost five conference games that were a one possession game with 2:03 or less remaining in regulation, including four games that were a one possession game with 25 seconds or less in regulation.

The Aztecs took a big step toward putting the past behind them by rallying from 13 points down at Brigham Young to claim a 59-57 victory on Chris Walton's put-back seven-footer at the buzzer to defeat Brigham Young in the conference opener.

The victory snapped a couple of annoying trends:

- ▶ The two-point win over Brigham Young victory snapped a five-game conference losing streak in contests that were decided by three points or less or in overtime dating back to a 58-56 victory over Utah on Jan. 18, 2003.
- ▶ The last time SDSU won a road league games decided by three points or less or in overtime was at Rice on Jan. 24, 1998, while a member of the Western Athletic Conference.
- ▶ The Aztecs had dropped seven straight road league games that were decided by three points or less or in overtime. Against Wyoming, SDSU felt the flip side as the Aztecs were unable to hold an 11-point advatange and lost in overtime. Since the 2004 conference season, the Aztecs are 7-13 in league play, with six of those losses coming in games that were a one possession game with 2:05 remaining in regulation.

### **Aztec Trends**

Here are a couple of trends to look for on Saturday.

- ▶ In every Aztec game this season and in 21 straight games dating back to last season, the team that has had a higher field goal percentage has won the game.
- ▶ The Aztecs are 9-0 this season and 63-19 in the Fisher era when shooting better than their opponent. SDSU is 0-10 this season and 14-69, with 13 consecutive losses, when it has a lower field goal percentage.
- ▶ San Diego State is 9-4 this season when shooting at least 40 percent from the field (losses at nationally-ranked Washington, in overtime to Wyoming, at Air Force and at New Mexico) and 0-6 when connecting on less than 40 percent of its shots.
- ▶ San Diego State is 8-3 when scoring more points than its opponent in the paint and 1-7 when scoring the same or fewer points in the paint.
- San Diego State is 5-0 this season when the senior class (Chris Manker, Chris Walton, Tommy Johnson, Travis Hanour and Jared Ines) contribute at least 20 points. In wins, the seniors average 17.7 points, while in losses their production drops to 10.9 points. The class scored 28 in the victory over Colorado State.
- ▶ Mohamed Camara: San Diego State is 4-1 this season when he shoots 50 percent or better from the floor.
- ▶ <u>Brandon Heath</u>: San Diego State is 3-1 this season and 8-2 in his career when Heath shoots 50 percent or better from the field... The Aztecs are 5-1 this season and 11-3 in his career when he posts an efficiency rating of +16 or better... SDSU is 6-4 this season when he has more assists than turnovers... Aztecs are 7-0 this season when he posts five assists or more in a game.
- ▶ <u>Chris Manker</u>: San Diego State is 4-2 this season and 11-3 in Manker's career when he blocks a shot... Dating back to his days at Oregon State, Manker's teams are 14-4 when he blocks a shot... SDSU is 6-4 this season and 15-9 in his career when Manker shoots 50 percent or better from the field... Aztecs are 5-1 this season when Manker records five or more rebounds.
- ▶ <u>Iohn Sharper</u>: San Diego State is 5-3 this season and 12-7 since the beginning of the 2003-04 season when Sharper connects on multiple three-point field goals... Aztecs are 9-6 this season when he has two turnovers or less in a game.
- ▶ Marcus Slaughter: San Diego State is 3-2 this season when Slaughter shoots better than 50 percent from the field.
- ▶ <u>Tyler Smith</u>: San Diego State is 6-2 when he scores a point... The Aztecs are 4-0 when he has three or more assists... SDSU is 5-1 when he has more assists than turnovers.
- ▶ <u>Chris Walton</u>: San Diego State has won eight of its last nine games and was 5-0 last season when Walton attempted at least four free throws... SDSU is 3-1 this season and 11-6 in his career when Walton scores in double figures.

#### Like Us Now? You'll Love Us in 2005-06

One thing Aztec fans know is that of the top seven players based on minutes played this season, six are slated to return next season (all but Manker). Included in that group of seven are one senior (Chris Manker), three juniors (Mohamed Camara, Trimaine Davis, John Sharper), two sophomores (Brandon Heath, Marcus Slaughter) and two true freshmen (Tyler Smith and Matt Thomas).

Joining that group is a recruiting class quickly earning accolades as one of the best nationally.

The Aztecs' early signees included Brett Hoerner, Kyle Spain, Kashif Watson and Jabbar Young. All four players, three from the high school ranks, and one from junior college, have been ranked among the top 125 players nationally in their respective class-

With the addition of Florida transfer Mohamed Abukar who started practicing with the Aztecs on Thursday and will be eligible mid-December next season, HoopScoop Online has the Aztec 2005 class ranked 19th nationally.

Below is a look at the 2005 Aztec class.

Hoerner, a 6-11, 200-pound forward, is a senior at Fullerton High in Fullerton, Calif. He averaged 16.0 points, 9.8 rebounds and recorded 112 block shots for a team that went 20-7 last season. Hoerner is ranked among the top 100 recruits in his class by six different scouting services, including Hoop Alliance, which ranks him 51st. He is ranked as the 20th best power forward in the country by ScoutHoops.com and is a member of Street & Smith's High Honorable Mention All-America team.

Spain, a 6-6, 205-pound forward, is a senior at Newark Memorial High in Newark, Calif. He averaged 16.5 points, 8.0 rebounds and shot 70.4 percent from the free throw line as a junior. His team went 29-5 and played for the CIF Division I championship in 2003-04. Spain recorded three 30-point scoring games and posted eight double-doubles as a junior. He is one of just five players named to the Street & Smith's San Francisco-Oakland all-Metro team. He was rated as the 42nd best player nationally by Hoop Scoop's Clark Francis and was selected as the fourth best prospect in the state by the same service.

Watson, a 6-3, 180-pound guard, is a senior at Bishop Gorman High in Las Vegas. He averaged 17 points, six rebounds, four assists and three steals for a playoff team that went 21-7 last season. This season, his prep team is ranked among the top 25 nationally by two publications. He is ranked as the second best shooting guard on the west coast and among the top 35 players at the two-guard position nationally by Rivals.com. He was named to Street & Smith's High Honorable Mention All-America team. His brother, C.J., is a starting guard at Tennessee.

Young, a 6-11, 285-pound center, is in his second season at San Bernardino College. He will have two seasons remaining when he joins the Aztecs in 2005-06. Young was listed as the 20th-best center in the class of 2002 by ESPN.com. He was also listed as one of 20 players to watch in the state of Maryland by USA Today while he was at National Christian Academy (Md.). Young attended classes at San Diego State in the Spring of 2003.

Abukar, a 6-10, 210-pound forward, will be a junior when he begins playing for the Aztecs next December. He played in 30 games as a freshman and saw action in seven games this season for Florida. Earlier this season, he scored a careerhigh 22 points in just 12 minutes of action against Florida A&M.

### Winning vs. Losing

If you look at San Diego State statistics in victories and losses, it is hard to believe the same team that has won nine games, four by 15 or more points, is the same team that has lost 10 games, five of which were a one possession game with less than three minutes remaining.

sons when facing a disadvantage on the glass.

## Can We Catch A Break?

Last season San Diego State finished 14-16 but were just a couple of key possessions away from not only posting a fourth consecutive .500 or better record, but also making an a appearance in a third straight postseason.

In 2003-04, San Diego State lost three games they led with 59 seconds to go in regulation, lost six games that were a one possession contest with 25 seconds or less remaining and lost seven games that SDSU led with 13:48 to go in regulation.

Spliting the six games that were a one possession contest with 25 seconds or less remaining that SDSU lost, would have given the Aztecs a 17-13 record.

Unfortunately, that trend has continued into the beginning portion of the 2004-05 season. Of the Aztecs eight losses this season, five were a one possession game with under three minutes to play.

- ▶ vs. Saint Mary's, L, 64-73. Stop us if you have heard this before. San Diego State, which trailed by 11 points at one time, rallies to take a one-point lead with 3:04 to play, but can't hold on to the lead.
- ▶ at Loyola Marymount, L, 68-72. Aztecs lead for 23:44 of the game and enjoyed a seven-point lead in the first half and a six-point lead in the second half. SDSU led with seven minutes remaining and trailed by two points with the ball with just over two minutes to play.
- ▶ vs. Providence, L, 67-76. San Diego State leads for more than 21 minutes of the game, leads by as many as sevn points and a five-point second-half lead. SDSU has more rebounds, more free throw attempts and fewer turnovers but can not overcome 34.9 percent shooting.
- ▶ vs. Wyoming, ot-L, 81-88. Aztecs led by as many as 11 points, had a three-point lead with 2:58 to play, a two-point lead with 1:03 to play, a one-point lead with 45 seconds leftand had two two point leads in overtime before losing.

In San Diego State's seven losses this season:

- ▶ The Aztecs have led in the final 10 minutes of the game: 5 times
- ▶ San Diego State led for more than 20 minutes of the game: 3 times

## **Relying on the Underclassmen**

Most people expected big things from San Diego State's senior class in 2004-05. With six players entering their final season on the Mesa, SDSU looked to be loaded with experience.

But due to injuries and other circumstances, the six seniors on the Aztec squad - Travis Hanour, Jared Ines, Tommy Johnson, Chris Manker, Wesley Stokes and Chris Walton - have played a total of 53 games, made 15 starts, scored 268 points, pulled down 113 rebounds and have 49 assists through 19 games.

Right now, the Aztec senior class is accounting for 21.8 percent of the minutes played, 20.3 percent of the scoring, 19.8 percent of the rebounding and 20.1 percent of the assists. That means the Aztecs are on pace to return players responsible for about 80 percent of those major statistical categories next season.

Despite having six members in its class, the senior trail both the junior class (with three members) and sophomore class (with two members) in starts, minutes played and rebounds per game. The senior class just moved in front of the junior class in points per game following double-digit efforts from Manker and Walton at UNLV.

There may be hope on the horizon for the class, with Chris Walton returning from injuries to play recently. In addition, don't underestimate the importance of the senior class as SDSU is 5-0 when the group scores at least 20 points in a game.

## **Slaughter House Rules**



Sophomore forward Marcus Slaughter has gotten off to an explosive start this season. An honorable mention all-conference selection as a freshman, Slaughter is averaging 17.5 ppg and a team-high 9.1 rebounds. Entering Saturday's game, he ranked among the league leaders in rebounding (2nd), scoring (4th), blocked shots (7th) and steals (8th).

Other notes on Slaughter's great jump out of the gate.

- ▶ He has produced double-digit scoring games in all 19 games this season marking the first time in his career the sophomore has scored 10 or more points in as many as three consecutive games. He had eight double-figure scoring games all of last season.
- ▶ He (along with Heath) is en route to post one of the best individual single-season scoring average in school history. The last time an Aztec player averaged more than 18.3 points per game was in in 1985-86 season Michael Watson led the Western Athletic Conference with a 22.5 scoring average. That was also the last time an Aztec player led the league in scoring, something Slaughter has a chance to do this season. His current scoring average of 17.5 would place him among the leaders all-time.
- ▶ With 333 total points this season, he has surpassed his freshman point total of 237 points.
- ▶ He led the Aztecs in scoring just once last season but has already led SDSU in scoring in eight of the first 19 games this season.
- ▶ He also has already connected on nine three-point field goals after making just eight last season.
- ▶ He has attempted 148 free throws through 19 games and is on pace to attempt 218 attempts in a 28-game season. That would be within shouting distance of the school record currently held by Michael Cage, who attempted 251 during his senior campaign in 1983-84.

## Heath Among League Leaders... In Everything

Already with two Mountain West Conference Player of the Week honors to his credit, Brandon Heath continues to progress into one of the top guards in the Mountain West Conference.

A native of Los Angeles, Heath is averaging 18.2 points this season. He led the Aztecs in scoring during the months

of Decembe and January.

Other notes on Heath's sophomore campaign

- ▶ Scored in double figures in 16 consecutive games and 19 straight against Division I teams.
- ▶ Made a three-point field goal in 18 of his last 20 games dating back to last season.
- ▶ Made 74-of-91 free throws this season.

He has 759career points in just 49 collegiate games for a 15.5 scoring average.

## **Heath Earns Second Player of the Week Honor**

San Diego State sophomore Brandon Heath has been named Mountain West Conference Player of the Week for the period ending January 16. It is his second honor of the season and he joins Josh Davis, Marcus Bailey and Andrew Bogut as the only league players to win the award multiple times in the same season as an underclassmen.

Heath recorded a career-high with 37 points, on 12-of-18 shooting from the field and 12-of-12 free-throw shooting, as the Aztecs recorded an 81-73 victory over Mountain West Conference preseason favorite UNLV on Saturday night. The 37 points were the most for an Aztec player during the Steve Fisher era and the most by an SDSU player in a Mountain West Conference game. It also tied for the 10th highest scoring output in school history and the fifth highest output in a conference game. The last time an Aztec player scored more than 37 points in a game was Anthony Watson's school-record performance of 54 points against U.S. International on Feb. 20, 1986.

Heath added a team-high five assists, two steals and played 39 minutes in the contest. He scored 11 consecutive Aztec points in the first half, helping SDSU erase a six-point deficit. In the second half, when UNLV cut the Aztec advantage to one point, he scored eight straight SDSU points. During a 12-4 run when the Aztecs clinched the victory (run started with SDSU up 61-60 with 6:48 left and ended at SDSU up 73-64 with 2:20 left), Heath scored 10 points and had an assist on the other SDSU basket.

With his second MWC honor, Heath joins Aerick Sanders and Randy Holcomb as the only SDSU players to earn the honor multiple times. He is the first Aztec player, since player of the week records have been kept beginning in 1978-79, to win multiple honors as an underclassman.

## Four-Game Win Streak Most Impressive Since 1984

Although the Aztecs four-game win streak was snapped at Washington, the dominance SDSU displayed during the streak is worth reflecting on.

Although the Aztecs have had longer win streaks, you have to go back 20 years to find a more dominating four-game win streak than what SDSU has put together during the last four games.

San Diego State posted four victories by a combined score of 311-234, or by 77 total points. That makes an average victory total of 19.3 points during the four-game streak.

The last time the Aztecs put together a more dominating four game run was when the 1984-85 NCAA Tournament team outscored its opponents by 81 points in four consecutive games during December, 1984. The four-game streak was part of an 8-0 record that squad posted to begin the 1984-85 season and marks the last time San Diego State got off to a better start than this season's 4-1 record.

Below is a look at the most dominating four-game winning streaks based on point differential since the beginning of the 1984-85 season.

During the four-game winning streak, San Diego State put together some impressive numbers:

- ▶ San Diego State has shot 54.2 percent from the field during the four-game stretch, shooting above 50.0 percent from the floor in each of the last three games. That is the longest stretch since posting a 50 percent or better field goal percentage in five straight games from Feb. 22-Mar. 8, 2003. Since that time, SDSU shot 50 percent or better from the floor just twice in the 37 games prior to the beginning of the current three-game streak.
- ▶ The Aztecs have held their opponent to 40.1 percent field goal shooting, Since Steve Fisher's arrival at San Diego State, the Aztecs are 33-6 when their opponent shoots 40 percent or less from the field.
- ▶ A staple of the Aztec program has been strong rebounding. San Diego State has outrebounded four of five opponents this season and has a +8.2 rebound margin during the four-game winning streak.

As you might expect, four-game winning streak typically means good things for the rest of the season. The last two times SDSU has had at least a four-game winning streak in a season they have advanced to postseason play (2001-02 NCAA Tournament, 2002-03 NIT) and every season under Steve Fisher's direction that the Aztecs have a had four-game

winning streak, SDSU has gone to finish .500 or better.

## Postseason Play, Guaranteed

Given Steve Fisher's track record, San Diego State's prospects of returning to the postseason for a third time in four seasons appears to be good. In his 12 full seasons, Steve Fisher has returned at least three starters off a squad he coached the previous season eight times. He has guided all eight of those teams to postseason play, including six of those squads to the NCAA Tournament. Those eight teams have combined to post a 20-5 record in postseason play, including two appearances in the NCAA Tournament championship game (1991 and 1992) and a championship in the NIT (1996).

Some additional notes on Steve Fisher's success when returning at least three starters off a team he has coached.

- ▶ Is 8-for-8 in leading his team to the postseason. Six times he has guided a team to the NCAA Tournament.
- ▶ Has won at least one postseason game in six of those eight seasons and at least two games in five of those eight postseasons.
- ▶ Averaged 22.6 wins in those eight seasons. In six of the eight years his teams have won at least 21 games. Below is a look at Fisher's magic when returning at least three starters from his previous squad.

## **Preseason Magazines Gives Aztecs Little Love**

Most of the preseason magazines have picked the Aztecs to finish in the lower half of the Mountain West Conference standings and the MWC poll was no exception, picking the Aztecs to finish seventh; however, a pretty strong case can be made that San Diego State will have a successful 2004-05 season.

- ▶ San Diego State returns three starters and eight letterwinners (includes Travis Hanour who sat out last season due to injuries) from the 2003-04 season. The Aztecs return seven of their top nine scorers from last season.
- ▶ Steve Fisher is 8-for-8 in his career in taking teams to the postseason when returning at least three starters off a team he coached the previous season. Included in those eight postseason trips are six NCAA Tournament berths and an average total of 22.6 wins. The last time a Steve Fisher-coached team returned four starters was 2001-02, when Fisher guided the Aztecs to their first NCAA Tournament appearance since 1985. Twice in his career, Fisher has returned at least three starters and at least nine letterwinners off a team he coached, both seasons he has led his team to the NCAA Tournament, posting a collective 56-14 record.
- ▶ San Diego State returns 77.0 percent of points, 74.2 percent of field goals, 99.4 percent of three-point field goals, 78.0 percent of free throws, 68.6 percent of rebounds, 91.3 percent of assists, 54.9 percent of blocked shots, 85.8 percent of steals and 81.9 percent of minutes from the 2003-04 season.
- ▶ The 2004-05 SDSU roster has played 538 games and made 161 starts. Nine players on the Aztec roster have played in at least 30 college games and five players have made at least 18 college starts. Last season, the Aztec roster (not counting Travis Hanour's total because he missed the season due to injury) entered the campaign with a total of 407 games and 72 starts. In 2002-03 when San Diego State advanced to the second round of the postseason NIT, the Aztecs entered the campaign with 413 games and 152 starts of experience. In 2001-02 when the Aztecs claimed the Mountain West Conference championship and advanced to the NCAA Tournament, San Diego State entered the season with 370 games and 194 starts.
- ▶ San Diego State was not that far away last season from making their third consecutive postseason appearance. Although the Aztecs finished 14-16 overall, they lost three games when they led with 59 seconds left, lost six games that were a one possession game with 25 seconds or less remaining and lost seven games when they led with 13:48 or less remaining in regulation. Part of that can be explained by the fact that SDSU had just one scholarship senior (Aerick Sanders).
- ► San Diego State returns two players that earned all-Mountain West Conference recognition last season. Sophomore guard Brandon Heath and sophomore forward Marcus Slaughter are back for SDSU this season. This marks the first time in school history that two all-league performers return from an Aztec team. In fact, in the Mountain West Conference era, San Diego State has never returned two all-MWC performers the following season (2000-01 (0); 2001-02 (0); 2002-03 (1) Tony Bland; 2003-04 (0); 2004-05 (2) Brandon Heath, Marcus Slaughter).
- San Diego State has two of the best underclassmen not only in the league, but also in the country in Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter. The duo was two of only four freshmen to earn all-league recognition last season. Heath and Slaughter combined to score 650 points and pull down 284 rebounds in their inaugural season.
- ▶ Another example of the stability of the Aztec program can be found by the number of players that have signed with San Diego State out of the prep ranks. Of San Diego State's 15-player roster, two are Division I transfers (Travis Hanour, and Chris Manker), two junior college players (Mohamed Camara and walk-on Jared Ines) and 11 players who signed with SDSU directly out of high school. Of the five newcomers, four signed with the Aztecs out of high school.



## **Steve Fisher**

## 14th-Full Season • 6th Season at SDSU • Illinois State, 1967

ne of the nation's most distinguished coaches, Steve Fisher has guided San Diego State's transformation from a college basketball afterthought to one one of the most visible programs in the country.

In five short seasons, Steve Fisher has changed the outlook, fortunes and expectations of San Diego State basketball. The Aztecs have been transformed from the ugly duckling that muddled through the first-ever Mountain West Conference campaign with an 0-14 record into a program that has produced three .500 or better campaings in the last four seasons, advanced to postseason play twice in the last three years, claimed a conference championship and the first Division I postseason victory in school history.

It is a school that now regularly goes toe-to-toe with the west's best basketball programs on the court and in the recruiting wars. It may be the new program on the block but seniority rarely matters in the changing world of college athletics.

When Fisher arrived on the scene, he found a basketball program that wasn't good enough to be called average. The Aztecs had suffered through 13 losing seasons in 14 years. Members of the school's last NCAA team were in the early stages of middle age. The expectations were in place all right. The Aztecs were expected and expecting to lose. The year before his arrival San Diego State won just four games.

The hiring only dates back to March of 1999, so referring to the "Steve Fisher Era" at San Diego State might be considered a bit premature. But with the Aztec banner now flying over the Mountain West Conference, there is little doubt that San Diego State basketball has reached a new level.

On March 26, 1999, San Diego State announced its arrival on the basketball scene in the form of a news conference to introduce its new coach, Steve Fisher. Fresh from a stint with the Sacramento Kings and with three appearances in the Final Four and a national championship in his pocket, he rolled up his sleeves and went to work. And work was needed. It looked to be a daunting challenge and yet the man with one of the highest winning percentages in NCAA Tournament history had no reservations.

No head-coaching career, at any level, started quicker than that of Steve Fisher. Six games into his head-coaching career he was undefeated and sporting a national championship ring. And the success didn't stop with the national title.

Fisher's eight-plus seasons at the University of Michigan produced a 184-82 (692) record, nine postseason tournament berths and three trips to the NCAA championship game, including the magical run to the 1989 national title.

Under Fisher, the Wolverines also claimed an NIT championship, won at least 20 games four times and finished among the top three in the powerful Big Ten Conference five times. In 1995, Michigan set a league record by holding opponents to just 39.4 percent shooting from the floor.

Fisher and Company raised the bar even higher in the postseason. His seven NCAA Tournament teams at Michigan combined for a 20-6 record, ranking him fourth among active coaches and ninth in NCAA history with a winning percentage of .769 in the national bracket. Only 13 coaches have taken more teams to the Final Four, including just five that are still active. He is one of three coaches to take three squads to the Final Four in the first five years of a head-coaching career, and one of just six coaches to lead a team to the championship of the NIT as well as the NCAA.

His accomplishments may be even greater at San Diego State. In 2001-02 he led the Aztecs to the postseason for the first time since 1985 and for just the fourth time ever. The 21 wins were second most for the school as a Division I program and the most since 1985. The fact that those numbers came after just three seasons signifies what is one of the great recent turnarounds in college basketball.

He followed that up with a third consecutive season with a .500 or better record in 2002-03 and led San Diego State back to the postseason for the second consecutive season for only the second time in the school's Division I history. In addition, SDSU daimed its first Division I postseason victory with a win in the NIT.

The Aztecs survived the loss of four starters and arguably the most difficult schedule in school history to post a 14-16 record in 2003-04. Highlights during the campaign included a third-place finish at the EA Sports Maui Invitational and home victories over Brigham Young and Utah.

The future looks even brighter. The Aztecs return three starters to go along with another nationally-ranked recruiting class have SDSU fans looking forward to the 2004-05 campaign.

SAN DIEGO - Freshman Alex Harris scored eight points in overtime, including consecutive 3-pointers, as UC Santa Barbara beat San Diego State 80-72 in a sloppy opener for both teams on Friday night.

San Diego State's Marcus Slaughter brought the Aztecs back all by himself, scoring their final 16 points of regulation and forcing overtime with a put-back at the buzzer to tie it at 63-all.

The Aztecs then missed their first four shots of overtime, including one by Slaughter.

Slaughter, a sophomore forward who led all scorers with a career-high 28 points, didn't score in overtime before fouling out with 17.2 seconds left.

The Gauchos, missing two starters due to injuries, took control in OT with a 3-pointer by Chrismen Oliver and two by Harris. They made eight straight free throws in the final minute.

Josh Davis led the Gauchos with 18 points, Oliver had 17, and Harris and Casey Cook tallied 15 apiece. Brandon Heath and Chris Manker had 17 each

for San Diego State.

UCSB went on a 9-0 run to take a 55-47 lead with 6:09 left in regulation. Slaughter converted a threepoint play with 5:43 left to start his run.

Slaughter made a layup with 45.8 seconds left to pull the Aztecs to 63-61. Oliver missed an off-balance shot and Slaughter got the rebound with 7.5 seconds left. After a time-out, Heath missed a layup but Slaughter grabbed the rebound and put up a buzzer-beater.

SAN DIEGO - Brandon Heath hit a short jump shot with 46 seconds left to put San Diego State ahead for the first time in the second half, then made four free throws for the Aztecs in the final seconds for a 69-65 victory over Monmouth Monday night.

Down 51-37 seven minutes into the second half, the Aztecs (1-1) recorded the largest secondhalf comeback in five-plus seasons under coach Steve Fisher.

Heath finished with 16 points and nine rebounds, while Marcus Slaughter led the Aztecs with 18 points.

SAN DIEGO - Aztec senior Chris Manker and sophomore Marcus Slaughter combined for 43 points as San Diego State defeated UC San Diego 86-51 on Nov. 27 at Cox Arena.

The victory improved SDSU's all-time record against the Tritons to 7-0.

UC San Diego played well throughout, connecting on 6-of-10 three-point field goals in the first half and trailed by just six points at intermission

The Aztecs took control early in the second half, pushing a six-point halftime lead to double digits at the 17:55 mark. San Diego State outscored UCSD 44-16 over the final 17:13 to record its widest margin of victory in three sea-

San Diego State forced 27 turnovers in the game, recorded 15 steals and connected on 32-of-53 shots from the floor for 60.4 percent. It was the highest field goal percentage for an SDSU squad, since connecting on 61.4 percent against Air Force on Feb. 22, 2003.

SAN DIEGO - Sophomore guard Brandon Heath scored a season-high 26 points and added a game-high five assists as San Diego State defeated San Diego 83-63 at Cox Arena

The victory was the third in a row for the Aztecs and the third straight over the Toreros. The 20-point margin of victory was the largest in the series for SDSU since a 23point victory on Feb. 25, 1975. The Aztecs led for the final 28:04.

With the 20-point margin of victory, San Diego State won by a wider margin than the previous four meetings, combined (17).

Senior forward Chris Manker continued his impressive play of late with 22 points, six rebounds and a career-best three blocked shots in the game. Junior guard John Sharper posted a career-high with 13 points and sophomore forward Marcus Slaughter had his second double-double of the season with 12 points and a game-high 12 rebounds.

San Diego was led by Brett Melton's 16 points and Brice Vounang's 15 points and a team-high six rebounds.

The Aztecs enjoyed advantages in nearly every statistical category, including field goal percentage (53.6-41.9 percent), free throws attempted (18-5) and rebounding (38-24).

San Diego State 73, UCSB 55 Dec. 4, 2004 • Santa Barbara, Calif. Marriott Center • Att.: 1,518

SANTA BARBARA, Calif. - San Diego State connected on 60.0 percent field goal shooting, including 12-of-20 three-point field goal attempts, to avenge its only loss of the season with a 73-55 victory at UC Santa Barbara.

The Aztecs' 18-point win was their widest margin of victory on the road since an 83-58 victory at Baylor on Nov. 29, 1989 and snapped a 10game road losing streak.

San Diego State, which led for 37:12 of the game and enjoyed a double-digit lead for 24:10, used a 17-0 run early in the second half and led 67-31 with 8:48 to play.

Sophomore forward Marcus Slaughter connected on 8-of-13 shots, including 3-of-4 from behind the arc en route to 24 points and seven rebounds. Sophomore guard Brandon Heath added 20 points, his second consecutive and 11th career game with at least 20 points, making 8-of-10 shots, including 4-of-6 from three-point range, while adding seven assists. Junior guard John Sharper added a career-best 15 points and was 3of-5 from bonus distance.

The offense was only half of the story, as the Aztecs completely shut down the Gaucho attack. UC Santa Barbara shot just 34.6 percent from the field, and had 31 points in the first 31:12 of the game. The Gaucho starting five connected on a mere 11-of-35 from the floor (31.4 percent).

SEATTLE - Nate Robinson scored 24 points and Tre Simmons added 23 points as 16th-ranked Washington snapped San Diego State's fourgame winning streak with a 98-69 victory on Dec. 7 at Bank of America Arena.

Washington forced 26 turnovers and enjoyed a 45-31 rebound advantage in claiming its second victory in as many seasons over the Aztecs.

San Diego State, which had shot 50 percent or better from the field in three straight games, was held to 41.9 percent shooting from the field. Meanwhile, the Aztecs, which had limited opponents to 40.1 percent shooting during the winning streak, yielded 50.7 percent shooting to the Huskies.

Washington jumped out to leads of 8-0, 26-8 and 37-12, en route to a 56-34 halftime advantage. The Aztecs were unable to get closer than 22 points in the second half.

Through six games, SDSU set or tied season lows for field goals, three-point field goals and assists and set a season-high for turnovers.

San Diego State sophomore forward Marcus Slaughter recorded his fourth 20-point effort of the season and reached double-figures for the sixth straight game, with 21 points. Sophomore guard Brandon Heath added 18 points and four

LOS ANGELES - Loyola Marymount used a 24-12 second-half rebound advantage to help rally from a seven-point deficit and defeat San Diego State 72-68 on Dec. 18 at Gersten Pavilion.

The Aztecs were held below 36.0 percent field goal shooting for the third consecutive game, connecting on just 19-of-54 field goals (35.2 percent) and were outrebounded for the fifth straight time (45-34) in dropping their fourth game in a row.

San Diego State used a strong defensive effort to build a first half advantage. The Aztecs limited the Lions to 10-of-30 shooting in the first half and led by as many as seven points before settling for a 26-24 halftime advantage. San Diego State built the lead to 34-28 with 17:47 to play, before Lovola Marymount used a 20-10 run to take the lead. The Aztecs battled back and led 55-52 with 7:22 remaining, but the Lions answered with a 10-1 run to take the lead for good.

Sophomore forward Marcus Slaughter narrowly missed his third double-double of the season, settling for his Mountain West Conference best fifth 20-point scoring game with 21 points and nine rebounds. Sophomore guard Brandon Heath recorded his ninth consecutive doubledigit scoring effort against Division I opponents with 12 points - all in the second half - and a team-high four assists. Senior forward Chris Manker posted his fourth double-digit scoring game of the campaign and first on the road with 10 points. Junior forward Trimaine Davis made his first start in his 50th career game and responded with a career-high 10 points.

AMES, Iowa -- San Diego State rallied from a 13-point deficit to take a lead with less than 10 minutes remaining but was unable to hold on to the lead as Iowa State won for the 24th time in its last 25 home games with a 69-59 victory at Hilton Coliseum on Dec. 28.

The Aztecs shot just 38.3 percent from the field, but utilized a 7-0 run capped by a Marcus Slaughter three-pointer to take a 47-44 lead with 9:29 to play. The Cyclones responded with a 13-0 run to seize control of the game.

San Diego State outscored Iowa State from the field, 55-54, but the Cyclones held a 15-4 advantage from the free throw line. It marked just the third time this season that an Aztec opponent has shot more free throws than San Diego State.

Senior forward Chris Walton returned to the lineup after being sidelined with a hip flexor and groin strain since the opener, and contributed six points and four rebounds.

Curtis Stinson paced the Cyclones with 17 points, while Jared Homan and Will Blalock added 16 and 15 points, respectively.

SAN DIEGO -- San Diego State used a smothering defense, forcing 23 turnovers and holding South Dakota State to 30.8 percent field goal shooting as the Aztecs ended non-conference play with a 64-49 victory over Jackrabbits at Cox Arena on Jan. 3.

Starting the same five players for the second consecutive game, the Aztecs led for more than 37 minutes to improve to 6-7 on the season and snap a two-game losing streak. Claiming victory in the final non-conference test has been a good omen recently for San Diego State as the last three times SDSU has won the final pre-conference test, the Aztecs have finished .500 or better and have advanced to postseason play twice.

PROVO, Utah -- He missed four straight practices prior to the game and after the game he took a flight to Philadelphia to see a specialist for his ongoing injury to his hip flexor/groin, but on Saturday night Chris Walton put in a performance that will be recounted by Aztec fans for years to come.

The fifth-year senior scored a season-high 12 points (two more than he had scored the rest of the season combined) and added six rebounds including a put-back seven-foot jumper as time expired to give San Diego State a 59-57 victory over Brigham Young in the conference opener for both teams.

The Aztecs won for just the third time in 26 lifetime appearances at the Marriott Center despite trailing by 13 points in the first half, 11 points in the second half and by four points with 48 seconds remaining.

San Diego State limited the Cougars to 35.1 percent shooting from the field and forced 17 turnovers, including 10 after intermission.

The Aztecs trailed by 11 early in the second half, but used a 25-8 run to take a six-point lead with 9:25 to play. The Cougars responded with a 9-0 run and led 51-48 with 4:18 remaining.

Brigham Young led by four points with 48 seconds to play, but Heath connected on a driving layup off the glass to cut the Aztecs deficit to two. Following a Cougar turnover, Heath converted another driving layup to tie the game at 57. After a BYU missed free throw, the Aztecs melted the clock setting the stage for Walton's follow off a Heath miss.

LAS VEGAS -- In a city of bright lights and starstudded shows, San Diego State brought a young star of its own.

Sophomore Brandon Heath scored a career-high 37 points, converting 12-of-18 field goals and all 12 of his free throws as the Aztecs defeated preseason Mountain West Conference favorite UNLV, 81-73.

The Aztecs recorded their first regular-season victory at the Thomas & Mack Center, their second victory in 12 games in the building and third victory over the Rebels in Las Vegas in 19 tries.

San Diego State trailed 22-16, but used a 20-5 run midway through the first half to take the lead for good. The Aztecs led the final 26:35 of the contest by shooting 49.1 percent from the field, their highest percentage in the last 10 games.

Heath's 37 points were the most by Aztec player in a Mountain West Conference game, the most in the Steve Fisher era, the 10th highest single-game total in school history and the fifth highest total in an SDSU conference game.

Sophomore forward Marcus Slaughter recorded his fifth double-double of the season and the seventh of his career with 17 points and a game-high 12 rebounds. Senior forward Chris Manker connected on three treys and added 13 points and six rebounds.

Coupled with the victory the previous week at Brigham Young, the Aztecs posted road wins over the Cougars and Rebels in the same season for the first itme in school history and joined the 2002-03 Utah team as the only Mountain West Conference teams to do it in league history.

### Wyoming 88, San Diego State 81 (ot) Jan. 22, 2005 • San Diego, Calif. Cox Arena + Att.: 7,144

SAN DIEGO -- San Diego State had its threegame winning streak snapped by Wyoming, in an 88-81 overtime loss at Cox Arena on Jan. 22.

Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter, who both scored in double figures, led SDSU. Heath scored a game-high 29 points on 12 of 23 shooting (4-8 3FG). Slaughther recorded his sixth doubledouble (18 pts, 10 rebs.) of the season.

SDSU led by as many as 11 points in the first half, but could not extend its lead over the Cowboys. Behind the play of Kevin Lewis (12 points) and Justin Williams (10 points), who combined to shoot 7-for-8 (3-3 3FG) from the field in the first half, Wyoming was able to chip away at the lead and get within one point, 41-40, at halftime.

The second half was a see-saw battle, as the Aztecs jumped out to a seven point lead in the first 3:15. But a few minutes later, Wyoming took the lead from the Aztecs and led by as many as eight, with 5:14 to play in regulation.

After a steal by Chris Manker and a put-back layup by Slaughter, SDSU reclaimed the lead with 3:37 remaining. SDSU increased its advantage to three, but following two Heath miscues, the Cowboys took a one-point lead. Seconds later, Heath connected on a basket and made 1 of 2 free-throws to lead by two, but Dion Sherrell made both of his free-throws to tie the game and force it into overtime.

In the extra period, the teams exchanged baskets until the 1:59 mark, when Jerry Webb converted a three-point play to put the Cowboys up by one. The Cowboys went on to hit all six of their free-throw shots after Webb's three-point play.

### San Diego State 84, Colorado State 77 Jan. 24, 2005 • San Diego, Calif. Cox Arena + Att.: 7,295

SAN DIEGO -- Senior forward Chris Walton scored a career-high 23 points, connecting on 10of-11 attempts from the field, as San Diego State won for the fourth time in five outings with an 84-77 victory over Colorado State at Cox Arena on Jan. 24.

San Diego State never trailed, leading a conference game wire-to-wire for the first time since defeating Wyoming, 86-73, on March 1, 2003. The victory also improved SDSU to 3-1 in league play, marking the first time the Aztecs have been above .500 this late in a season since the 1998 WAC campaign.

Although still missing practice time during the week do to a hip flexor injury, Walton played the best game of his career, connecting on 10-of-11 field goal atempts, including 3-for-3 from behind the arc. He added four rebounds and two assists in 30 minutes of action.

Sophomore guard Brandon Heath added 15 points, a game-high seven assists and a teamhigh five rebounds. Sophomore forward Marcus Slaughter reached double figures for the 17th straight game and scored 15 or more points for the 13th straight outing with 18 points. Junior guard John Sharper connected on three threepoint field goals en route to 11 points.

San Diego State shot 52.8 percent from the field, marking the first time in 12 games SDSU has cleared the 50 percent plateau and commited a season-low seven turnovers. The seven turnovers tied a Cox Arena record for fewest miscues and also tied a school-record for fewest turnovers in a Mountain West Conference game.

USAFA, Colo. -- Jacob Burtschi scored 16 points to lead Air Force to a 62-50 win over San Diego State at Clune Arena on Jan. 29.

With the win, Air Force (13-7, 4-1 Mountain West) moved into sole possession of second place in the conference and gained its 23rd consecutive win at home, the nation's secondlongest home winning streak.

The Falcons started cold from three-point range and trailed by a point at the half.

Air Force's Nick Welch made a layup with 13:48 left in the game to start a 10-1 run for the Falcons early in the second half. Welch finished with 10 points.

A three-pointer by Tim Keller put Air Force up 41-30 with 10:10 left to play. The Falcons made 4-of-15 shots from three-point range in the first half but in the second half made 6-of-11.

A three-pointer by the Falcon's Marc Holum with 9:14 to play started another run that ended with a 3-pointer by Matt McCraw at 2:41 that put Air Force up 54-37. Keller finished with 12 points, while McCraw finished with 11. Burtschi also contributed on defense with five defensive rebounds and four steals.

Hitting shots from the low post and midrange, San Diego State shot 64 percent from the field in the first half, with Marcus Slaughter going 4-for-4 for eight points, while Brandon Heath went 3-for-5 for eight points in the half.

San Diego State (9-9, 3-2) led 25-24 at the break and could have led by more had it made more than 1-of-8 free-throw attempts in the first half.
