Big Notes

- San Diego State improves to 24-3 in its last 27 games immediately following a loss, and wins its 31st consecutive game when a loss is immediately followed by a home game.
- The Aztecs win their 15th straight home game and have gone 368 days since their last home loss (76-67 vs. New Mexico on Jan. 14, 2023).
- SDSU has won 31 of its last 32 home games.
- San Diego State ends the game on a 18-6 run over the final 7:37 after Nevada tied it at 53-53 with 8:03 remaining.
- F Jaedon LeDee records his ninth double-double of the season with 22 points and 12 rebounds.
- **LeDee** now has three career games with at least 20 points, 10 rebounds and 3 steals, which is tied with Jamaal Franklin for the most by an Aztec since the 2005-06 season.

- **LeDee** becomes the fifth player in the country this year with at least 20 points, 10 rebounds and 3 steals, while attempting nine or less field goals.

Team Notes

- SDSU is now 148-20 under Brian Dutcher at Viejas Arena.
- San Diego State has won 47 of its last 49 home games (47-2).
- SDSU wins its 20th straight game when leading at the half, and improves to 14-0 this season and 149-16 under Brian Dutcher when leading after 20 minutes.
- San Diego State wins its 20th consecutive game when leading with five minutes to go. The Aztecs have won 402 of their last 416 games when leading with five minutes left, and are now 149-10 under Brian Dutcher when leading with five minutes remaining.
- SDSU is 121-12 under Brian Dutcher when it outrebounds the opponent and has won 22 straight.
- The Aztecs win their 32nd straight game when attempting more free throws, and have won 83 of its last 86 games when attempting more free throws. SDSU improves to 112-8 under Brian Dutcher when attempting more free throws.
- Under Brian Dutcher, the Aztecs move to 38-15 in games in January and as a program has won 82 of its last 108 (82-26) games in the first month of the year.
- SDSU improves to 253-140 (.644) all-time in Mountain West games.
- The Aztecs are now a league leading 83-11 (.883) in conference home games since the start of the 2013-14 season.
- SDSU stands at 111-24 under Brian Dutcher and 237-49 in its last 286 games when outscoring the opponent's bench.
- The Aztecs move to 28-7 (.800) on Wednesdays under Brian Dutcher and as a program is 73-19 (.793) in its last 92 games on the day.
- SDSU played only eight players, tied for its fewest in a game this season (also at UC San Diego on Dec. 1).
- Seven of the eight players logged at least 20 minutes in the game tonight (lone exception was 5:31 for Miles Heide).
- SDSU outscored Nevada in the following situations:
 - 15-2 in fast break chances
 - 56-49 from its starting five
 - 19-12 off turnovers
 - 15-10 off the bench
 - 18-15 in second-chance opportunities
 - 30-28 in the paint

Series Notes

- San Diego State improves to 26-7 in the all-time series against Nevada.
- Moves to 12-1 all-time versus Nevada in Viejas Arena and, 14-1 all-time at home against the Wolf Pack.
- Head coach Brian Dutcher' record against Nevada is now 13-3, including an 8-0 mark at Viejas Arena.
- Since Nevada entered the Mountain West, this is the seventh time the Aztecs have defeated Nevada by double digits, with five of those seven games coming at Steve Fisher Court.

Game Flow

- Nevada won the tip.
- Nevada's Jarod Lucas scored the first points of the game on a jumper at 19:38.
- San Diego State's first point came at the free throw line at the 19:06 mark.
- Trailing 0-2, SDSU went on a 10-0 run from 19:06 to 14:19 (4:53) to take a 10-2 lead.
- The teams combined to go 1-of-14 from the bonus distance through the 13:48 of the first half.
- San Diego State missed eight of its first 12 free throws in the first half.
- At halftime Nevada had six players with two fouls each.
- Through the first 8:25 of the second half, Nevada shot 9-of-12 from the field, including 4-of-6 from distance to reduce the Aztecs lead to two points, 48-46.
- With the game tied 53-53 with 7:37 to play, San Diego State went on a 18-6 run to close the game.
- SDSU led for 36:22 of the game and by as much as 16 points with 42 seconds left in the first half.
- Nevada led for just 1:57 with its largest lead being two points at 2-0 some 22 seconds into the game.

Player Notes

Jaedon LeDee – 22 points, 7-9 FG, 12 rebounds, 3 steals, 1 block

Picked up his ninth double-double of the season and 11th of his career (all as an Aztec)...Scored in double figures for the 17th time this season in 17 appearances... Now has 36 career double-figure scoring games, 28 of which have come in the 56 games he has played as an Aztec... Led the Aztecs in scoring for the 13th time of the season... Logged his ninth game of the year with at least 10 rebounds and 13th of his career... Led SDSU in rebounding for the 13th time this season and 32nd time of his career... Matched a career and season high with three steals... Now has three games with at least 20 points, 10 rebounds and 3 steals, which is tied with Jamaal Franklin for the most by an Aztec since the 2005-06 season. Reese Waters — 14 points, 7 rebounds, 1 assist, +17 plus/minus ratio

Scored in double figures for the 12th time this season and 28th time of his career... Reached double figures in scoring for the first time since the Gonzaga game on Dec. 29, 2023... His +17 plus/minus ratio was the highest in the game.

Lamont Butler – 10 points, 4 rebounds, 3 assists, 2 steals

Scored in double figures for fourth time in the last seven games, the seventh time this season and 33rd time as an Aztec... Tied a season high with four rebounds... Had multiple steals for the third time this season and 38th time of his career (SDSU is 34-4).

Jay Pal – 8 points, 10 rebounds

Reached the 700-point career plateau with his free throw at the 10:29 mark in the first half... Had a season-high 10 rebounds (most as an Aztec)... Logged his ninth career double-digit rebounding game.
