## Aztec Men's Soccer Welcomes No. 8 UCLA Saturday in its Final Regular Season Game on Senior Day

The San Diego State men's soccer team plays host to eighth-ranked UCLA Saturday in the final regular season match for both teams. Prior to the game, which is slated to begin at 1 p.m. PT, there will be a special ceremony honoring Aztec (10-6-2, 3-5-1 Pac-10) seniors Brad Byrns (Alamo, Calif.), Khadim Diouf (Dakar, Senegal), Raymundo Reza (Denver, Colo.), Michael Rocha (Pasadena, Calif.) and Falke Verwer (Delft, Netherlands).

SDSU had its four-game unbeaten streak snapped in a tough, 2-1, overtime loss at Washington on Sunday, where the Huskies scored both goals in the final 5 minutes, 15 seconds for the victory. Freshman Miles Byass (Highland, Calif.) scored the first goal of the match in the 84th minute, his fourth in four games.

On Friday, San Diego State downed Oregon State, 1-0, on a second-minute goal by sophomore Jose Altamirano (San Diego/Southwest HS) for its 10th win of the season, the first time that has happened since 1994. The win also broke a five-match losing streak for the Aztecs in Corvallis.

The Bruins (13-4-1, 7-2-0 Pac-10), meanwhile, come into the weekend ranked in the top 10 in all five polls, including eighth by *Top Drawer Soccer*, ninth by *NSCAA/HendrickCars.com* and *Soccer Times*, and 10th by *Soccer America* and *College Soccer News*.

## Noting the Aztecs

\* Heading into its final game of the regular season, San Diego State is 10-6-2 (.611), the program's best record since 2005, when it finished 9-4-6 (.632).

\* The 10 victories are the Aztecs' most since the 1994 team that went 10-9-0. The last SDSU team with more than 10 wins was the 1990 squad, which finished 11-6-3.

\* San Diego State's two draws are the fewest since the 2003 team went 9-8-3 (the 2004 team also had two ties and went 4-13-2).

\* In the *NSCAA/HendrickCars.com* Far West Region poll, the Aztecs dropped from fifth to eighth. SDSU has been as high as No. 3 in the region, the highest in head coach Lev Kirshner's 11-year tenure. Other Pac-10 teams in the top 10 include California (No. 1), UCLA (No. 3), Washington (No. 6) and San Diego State (No. 8).


\* The Aztecs have earned results in three of their six matches against nationally ranked teams this season, going 2-3-1. SDSU's wins have come against San Diego (No. 32 by *Top Drawer Soccer*) and Washington (No. 14 by *Soccer America*), while its tie came on Oct. 22 vs. California (No. 12 by *NSCAA/HendrickCars.com*, *Soccer Times* and *Top Drawer Soccer*). San Diego State's losses against ranked opponents, meanwhile, have come at the hands of Loyola Marymount (No. 28 by *Top Drawer Soccer*), UCLA (No. 8 by *Top Drawer Soccer*) and California (No. 10 by *NSCAA/HendrickCars.com*).

\* The Aztecs began the season with a seven-game (6-0-1) unbeaten streak, outscoring the opposition, 15-4. The seven-match unbeaten streak was the program's longest since an eight-game undefeated span in 2007 (Sept. 9-Oct. 14) and tied for the eighth-longest in program history.

\* SDSU is 5-0-1 in tournament games in 2010.

\* Senior Raymundo Reza (Denver, Colo.) leads the team in points (18), goals (6), penalty kick goals (3), shots (67) and shots on goal (24). Among the national leaders, Reza ranks in a tie for 94th with 1.00 points per game. Sophomore Jose Altamirano (San Diego/Southwest HS) (nine assists), meanwhile, is tied for 15th in the country with 0.50 assists per game.

\* Reza has started 54 consecutive matches, by far the most on the team. The next highest is fellow senior captain Khadim Diouf's (Dakar, Senegal) 19 straight starts.

## At the Helm

Lev Kirshner is in his 11th year as head coach at San Diego State and 14th season overall. Kirshner, just one of three coaches in the 42-year history of the program, has brought SDSU back to the national spotlight with two trips to the NCAA tournament since he helped orchestrate the program's move to the Pac-10 in 2005.

Since the men's soccer team earned its full allotment of scholarships (2005), the Aztecs have gone 47-37-25 (.545), including an 20-22-17 (.483) mark in the competitive Pac-10.

Over his 10 seasons, Kirshner has coached two All-America selections, three Academic All-America picks, nine professional players, seven all-Far West selections and 50 all-conference picks.

## A Glance at the Bruins

UCLA is having a good season once again, owning a 13-4-1 overall record, including a 7-2-0 mark in the Pac-10. The Bruins sit in second place in the conference standings with 21 points, one behind California, which hosts Stanford on Thursday.

Victor Chavez (eight goals, four assists) and Kelyn Rowe (six goals, eight assists) each are tied for third in the Pac-10 with 20 points apiece. Goalkeeper Brian Rowe leads the league with eight shutouts and is second with a 0.87 goals against average.

**\* THE SERIES:** UCLA owns a commanding lead in the series, 29-4-12 (.778 win percentage) ... In SDSU's Pac-10 era (since 2005), the Bruins lead, 4-1-6 ... San Diego State is 1-3-1 against UCLA since 2005, after winning, 1-0, on Oct. 6, 2007 ... The Bruins have gone 2-0-4 in the series since that game ... Only one game of the 11 meetings in the Pac-10 era have been decided by more than one goal ... Ironically, that match came on the Aztecs' last Senior Day meeting with UCLA, a 6-1 setback on Nov. 15, 2008 ... Six of the 11 games in the series have gone into overtime ... SDSU is 0-4-3 against the Bruins when UCLA is nationally ranked (NSCAA/HendrickCars.com).

## A Look at the Pac-10 Season So Far

San Diego State currently sits in fifth place in the Pac-10 standings with 10 points and a 3-5-1 league record. The Aztecs, however, are playing much better than their record indicates. SDSU has outshot the opposition, 131-93, in conference games, or an average of 14.56 shots per game to 10.33. San Diego State has outshot the opposing teams in seven of its nine matches, tied the opposition once and been outshot once (Sunday at Washington).

Rarely does a visiting team outshoot the home team and even more rarely does that happen in losses. In the Aztecs' five road games, where they are 1-4-0, SDSU has outshot the home teams, 67-51.

San Diego State has also had five more shots on goal (47-42) than its opponents in league action.

Another good indicator of how the Aztecs are playing is corner kicks, where SDSU has the slight edge, 39-38.

## SDSU Drops Out of National Polls

San Diego State is no longer receiving national recognition in either of the five polls, the first time that has happened since the Oct. 19 edition. The Aztecs were receiving votes in both the NSCAA/HendrickCars.com and Soccer Times national polls for each of the past two weeks.

A week ago, SDSU had 16 votes in the NSCAA/HendrickCars.com poll (30th most in the nation) and three (35th in the nation) in the Soccer Times poll (35th in the country).

On Sept. 28, San Diego State was tied for 22nd, its highest ranking in the NSCAA/HendrickCars.com poll since Oct. 31, 2006.

On Oct. 5., San Diego State was ranked in all five polls for the first time since Oct. 11, 2005 (only four polls, Top Drawer Soccer was unavailable). SDSU has been as high as No. 21 in the Oct. 5 edition of the Soccer America poll.

## San Diego State and the RPI

The Aztecs moved up 11 spots in the latest RPI, which was released Nov. 8, and are now at No. 50. The rating, a mathematical formula that objectively compares results, strength of schedule and opponents' strength of schedule, is out of 204 Division I programs.

SDSU debuted at No. 65 in the initial release (Oct. 11), then dropped to 79th a week later. San Diego State was at No. 62 two weeks ago, then moved to No. 61 and are now at its highest spot all season.

## Double-Digit Victories for the Aztecs

San Diego State has 10 victories, matching the team's most since 1994. It is the third time the Aztecs have had nine or more wins in the six years of their Pac-10 era (since 2005). The previous two times the feat happened - 2006 (9-5-4) and 2005 (9-4-6) - SDSU made the NCAA tournament.

### SDSU Scoring in Bunches

On Oct. 30, San Diego State downed Cal State Fullerton, 4-1, where it scored all four of its goals in the second half. It's the fifth time this season that the Aztecs have scored at least three goals, all which led to SDSU wins. In fact, San Diego State has won its last eight games when scoring three or more goals.

The five games with three or more goals matches the program's most since the 1996 season and is the most since the Aztecs accomplished the feat seven times in 1995.

### SDSU's Scoreless Streak Stopped

The San Diego State men's soccer team yielded a late goal in a 1-0 loss to No. 8 UCLA on Oct. 9 in Los Angeles. It was the first time the Aztecs were held scoreless since Nov. 6, 2009, breaking the team's 12-game scoring streak. It was the longest scoring streak by the program since a 13-match stretch from Oct. 19, 1990-Sept. 29, 1991. In fact, the 12 consecutive games with at least one goal is tied for the 10th-longest in the history of the program. Over the course of the 1986 and 1987 seasons, the Aztecs scored at least one goal in a school-record 46 consecutive games.

### Start Me Up

The Aztecs got off to a 6-1-1 start (.813), the program's best eight-game start to a season since 2005 when they were 6-0-2 (.875). The 6-1-1 start was tied for the eighth-longest in school history with five other teams. Four of the seven teams - 2005, 1982, 1981 and 1969 - with better eight-match starts made the NCAA tournament.

### SDSU Posts Eighth-Longest Unbeaten Streak

SDSU recently had its seven-game unbeaten streak snapped with a 2-1 loss to Oregon State on Oct. 1. Over the seven matches, San Diego State outscored the opposition, 15-4.

The seven games without a loss was tied for the eighth-longest unbeaten in the history of the program. Four of the teams - 2005, 1989, 1988 and 1969 - with the same or longer unbeaten streaks in a season ended up making the NCAA tournament.

### The Young...

Coming into the season the big question was, "Who is going to replace the departed seven seniors?" Of those seven seniors (six who finished the season), three were drafted by Major League Soccer and five were named to the 2009 all-Pac-10 team (one first team selection, four honorable mention picks).

Eighteen games into the season, 11 (of 17) newcomers have seen action with eight earning a combined 69 starts. True freshman Casey Meuser (Granite Bay, Calif.) has started all 18 matches, while redshirt freshman Robbie Freise (Canyon Country, Calif.) (17 starts) and true freshman Tyrone Martin (Indianapolis) (14 starts) have also been regular starters. Other newcomers to earn starts in 2010 include true freshman Sean Zaher (Las Vegas, Nev.) (9), redshirt freshman Jordan Ongaro (Edmonton, Alberta) (5), true freshman Miles Byass (Highland, Calif.) (5), graduate student Falke Verwer (Delft, Netherlands) (1) and true freshman Brett Helm (Frisco, Texas) (1).

Biles has been on an offensive tear, scoring four times over the past four games. Other newcomers to contribute offensively include Verwer (two goals), Meuser (two assists), Ongaro (two assists), Zaher (one goal) and true freshman Kody Duff (Roseville, Calif.) (one assist). Redshirt freshman Daniel Kohen (Los Angeles, Calif.) has played 191 minutes over eight games, while redshirt freshman Blake Hysten (San Diego/Torrey Pines HS) has logged 5:15 in net without facing a shot attempt.

In the opener at Loyola Marymount on Sept. 1, four freshmen (all true) started. The four freshmen was the most in a season-opener in head coach Lev Kirshner's 11-year tenure and five later started in the 4-3 overtime win against No. 23 Washington on Oct. 3. An amazing six started the second half at San Diego (Sept. 5) and at home versus Air Force (Sept. 10) (both wins).

### ...and the "Rustless"

Maybe a bit overlooked because of the 17 newcomers are the four Aztec seniors Brad Byrns (Alamo, Calif.), Khadim Diouf (Dakar, Senegal), Raymundo Reza (Denver, Colo.) and Michael Rocha (Pasadena, Calif.). The four, however, have been rocks in the program since their arrival on The Mesa and this year is no different.

A 2007 honorable mention all-Pac-10 pick, Byrns returned from an injury-plagued 2008 season to start 16 of SDSU's 18 games a year ago, leading the league in saves per game (4.50). Over his career, San Diego State is

24-13-8 (.622) when he earns the start. Among the all-time program leaders, Byrns ranks fifth in saves (171) and shutouts (15), and seventh in goals against average (1.10). This year, Byrns is 10-6-2 with a 1.08 goals against average, a mark which ranks 83rd in the nation.

An all-Pac-10 selection all three years (second team in 2009, honorable mention in 2007-08), Diouf tied for third on the team in 2009 with nine points on three goals and three assists. Over his career, the tri-captain has five career game-winning goals (14 total). This year, Diouf has eight points on three goals and two assists.

A two-time all-conference honoree (second team in 2009, honorable mention in 2008), Reza is a two-time team MVP after leading the squad in scoring each of the past two seasons. Reza had 16 points (six goals, four assists) last year after recording the top SDSU offensive season in a decade in 2008 (20 points - eight goals, four assists). The tri-captain has 18 points (six goals, six assists) in 18 games in 2010. The 1.00 points per game ranks in a tie for 94th in the nation.

Rocha, meanwhile, has come back strong after missing all of 2009 with a wrist injury. Rocha scored his first career goal on Sept. 12 in the team's 4-1 win over Oakland and added another on Sept. 24 vs. Houston Baptist. Rocha has seven career points on two goals and three helpers.

## Reza Moves to No. 23 in Top Drawer Soccer's Upperclassmen Top 100

Senior Raymundo Reza (Denver, Colo.) is ranked No. 23 in the latest *Top Drawer Soccer* Upperclassmen Top 100 list, released Oct. 8. Reza improved 44 places from the initial release (Sept. 15). According to the website, the list, which will be updated weekly, "is meant to reflect overall quality of players. This means it is far more than a ranking of statistics. As soccer in many ways is not a statistical game, it is important to understand the qualities that players can bring to defense, attack, central midfield and wing play, along with goalkeeping. So many of the things that make players desirable to have on teams are not reflected in statistics."

Reza leads the team in points (18), goals (6), shots (67), shots on goal (24) and penalty kick goals (3).

Reza also improved from No. 3 to No. 2 in the *Top Drawer Soccer* College Players to Watch Men's Top 20 list for the Pac-10. Sophomore Jose Altamirano (San Diego/Southwest HS) moved up a spot to 15th in the latest rankings, released Nov. 10), while senior Khadim Diouf (Dakar, Senegal) has been as high as No. 13.

## SDSU's Martin, Meuser Make College Freshmen Top 100

San Diego State's Tyrone Martin (Indianapolis, Calif.) and Casey Meuser (Granite Bay, Calif.) are ranked the same in the *Top Drawer Soccer* College Freshmen National Top 100 list, the website announced Oct. 8. Like the initial list (Sept. 22), Martin is rated No. 34, while Meuser is at No. 85 in the rankings.

The duo has played an important part in leading the Aztecs to a 10-6-2 record. Meuser has started all 18 games, while Martin has 14 starts for his credit.

Martin has played 1,282 minutes this season, all in the back. Martin was named to the Courtyard Marriott San Diego Central all-tournament team last month.

Meuser, meanwhile, has logged an impressive 1,517 minutes this season. Meuser, who has mainly seen action in the back, but also some time in the midfield, has two assists in his first year. He has 10 shots, including two on net.

## Byass Named One of 100 Freshmen to Keep an Eye On

San Diego State men's soccer forward Miles Byass (Highland, Calif./Redlands HS) has been picked by *College Soccer News* as one of the 100 Freshmen From Coast To Coast To Keep An Eye On during the 2010 season. Current Aztecs who have previously been named to the preseason list include redshirt junior Gemechu Abraham (Beaverton, Ore./Beaverton HS) and sophomore Jose Altamirano (San Diego/Southwest HS).

Byass (6-0, 155) brings instant credibility to this year's class after playing for the United States Under-18 National Team for each of the past two years. A Parade All-American in 2009, Byass was ranked as the 16th-best recruit in the nation, according to *Top Drawer Soccer.com*. Byass scored 17 goals in 25 games for the U-18 Arsenal during the 2008-09 U.S. Academy season and participated in the USSF Academy 2008-09 West Conference U-17/U-18 Starting XI. A Highland, Calif., native, Byass scored 30 times for Redlands High School in the 2009-10 campaign, garnering player of the year honors by "High School Game Time" and the San Bernardino County Sun.

Byass scored his first career goal in SDSU's 1-0 victory over Stanford on Oct. 24, then scored twice more the next game at Cal State Fullerton (W, 4-0). On Sunday, Byass scored the game's first goal in a 2-1, overtime loss at Washington. This season, Byass has appeared in 13 matches, starting five, and has eight points on four goals. Byass leads the team in shot percentage (.125, min. 13 attempts), and is tied for second with four goals and tied for fourth with eight points.

Oct. 13. Despite playing a man down the final 19 minutes, 30 seconds, the Aztecs prevailed with a second minute overtime goal. Playing shorthanded soccer and doing it well is nothing new to SDSU.

Since 2006, the program has had nine red cards over eight matches. Over those eight games, San Diego State has played a combined 360:49 a man down and 12:02 two men down. While playing shorthanded in those games (more than four complete regulation matches), the Aztecs have outscored the opposition, 5-4. One of those four goals allowed was a penalty kick directly after a SDSU red card. What's even more impressive is San Diego State's 3-1-4 (.625) record while playing a man down.

### SDSU Men's Soccer's 2010 Recruiting Class Ranked No. 29 Nationally

San Diego State's 2010 men's soccer recruiting class has received a No. 29 national ranking from *College Soccer News*. It is the fourth year in a row that the Aztecs have had a top-30 recruiting class, and the fifth time in the last six seasons that they've been ranked in the top 40.

The 2010 recruiting class, consisting of 12 players, is the largest of head coach Lev Kirshner's 10-year tenure. Ten high school prospects and two college transfers will be asked to replace seven seniors, three of whom were Major League Soccer draft picks.

The individual accolades of Kirshner's class include an under-18 U.S. National Team starter, two U-17 and U-20 Canadian National Team members, a high school All-American, an adidas ESP participant, multiple starters on regional ODP teams and two top-100 nationally-ranked players.

The Aztecs are one of four Pac-10 squads to receive top-40 rankings. Perennial powerhouse UCLA picked up the top rated class, with California (No. 15) and Stanford (No. 31) also included. The Aztecs' No. 29 class ranked ahead of Big Ten schools Michigan State (No. 30) and Wisconsin (No. 35), as well as a pair of Big West squads in UC Irvine (No. 32) and Cal Poly (No. 38).

### Aztec Men's Soccer Tie for Fourth in 2010 Pac-10 Preseason Poll

The San Diego State men's soccer team has been picked in a tie for fourth place in the 2010 Pac-10 preseason poll, the league announced Aug. 18.

SDSU picked up 10 points, tied with Oregon State, six behind third-place California. UCLA has been chosen to win the regular season title with 25 points, including five first-place votes, while Stanford grabbed the other first-place tally and is picked second with 20 points. Washington's nine points rounded out the preseason poll.

The fourth-place prediction is tied for the Aztecs' best ever (2006). San Diego State, however, has finished the season better than each of its predicted finishes. In its inaugural Pac-10 campaign in 2005, SDSU was picked sixth, yet managed a fourth-place finish. The Aztecs finished second in each of their next two seasons despite being picked fourth and fifth, respectively, in the preseason poll. In 2008, San Diego State was picked fifth but finished third in league play, while last year's squad (T-4th) bettered its prediction of fifth.

SDSU's 19-match (regular season) schedule, which includes 10 games away from SDSU Sports Deck, the program's most since 2004, kicks off Sept. 1 at Loyola Marymount at 4 p.m. PT. Six of the Aztecs' 19 games are against teams who made the 2009 NCAA Tournament, while three are versus squads who earned national seeds in last year's tourney (No. 6 UCLA, which San Diego State will play twice, and No. 11 San Diego).
