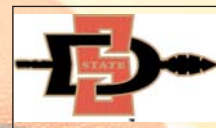
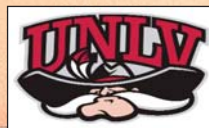

Aztecs Look To Resume Winning Ways Saturday In Home Game With UNLV

► **When & Where:** Saturday, February 11, 2012, Viejas Arena (12,414), San Diego, Calif., 2 p.m. PT.

► **Live Media:** Live webcast with Chris Ello, as well as live stats, will be available on goaztecs.com.

► **SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns:** Burns (Ohio Wesleyan, 1979) is in the seventh year of her second stint as head coach at San Diego State. She led the Aztecs for eight seasons from 1989 to 1997, before returning in 2005. She has an overall head coaching record of 341-242 in 20 seasons, while she is 260-177 in her 15 campaigns at SDSU.

► **UNLV Head Coach Kathy Olivier:** Olivier is in her fourth season at her alma mater, boasting a school record of 44-43. Overall, she is 276-251 in her 20 years as a head coach.

► **Series History:** With SDSU's overtime victory last month, the all-time series is tied at 22-22. The Aztecs have claimed 10 of the last 11 meetings and have won five in a row at Viejas Arena where they are 13-7 against the Lady Rebels.

NEWS & NOTABLES

■ The San Diego State women's basketball team looks to maintain its spot atop the Mountain West standings when it plays host to UNLV on Saturday for its lone outing this week. The contest is scheduled to get underway at 2 p.m. PT at Viejas Arena and will be the program's annual breast cancer awareness game.

■ The Aztecs lost for the first time in nearly two months this past Saturday when it fell 58-39 at TCU. The loss snapped the squad's 13-game winning streak and was its first defeat in conference action this season.

■ SDSU's 13-game win streak ties as the ninth-best in the nation this season. It is also tied as the fourth-longest in school history and is the program's longest win streak since the 1994-95 team claimed a school record 18 in a row.

■ At 7-1, the Aztecs are still off to their best start to league play since the 1997 squad also was 7-1 and went on to post a 15-1 mark en route to the regular-season Western Athletic Conference title.

■ SDSU has five more victories than it had all of last season. This is the fourth time in the last five years the Aztecs have at least 14 wins after being unable to reach that mark once in the previous 10 seasons.

■ San Diego State enters Saturday's game with a 10-1 record at home, which is five more wins than it had at Viejas Arena a year ago. This is the third time in the last four campaigns the Aztecs have at least 10 home wins.

■ SDSU recorded double-figures in steals for the second outing in a row and for the ninth time overall in 2011-12. The squad already has 22 more steals than it had in 29 contests a year ago.

■ The Aztecs have won or been even in the rebounding battle in 20 or their 22 games this season. Last Saturday's game at TCU was the fifth time the team has recorded at least 20 offensive rebounds.

■ San Diego State leads the Mountain West in nine statistical categories, including scoring defense (54.7 ppg.), scoring margin (+11.2), rebounding margin (+7.6), steals (9.3/g) and turnover margin (+2.7).

LAST TIME OUT

The San Diego State women's basketball team was limited to a season-low 39 points on just 23.4 percent shooting, as the Aztecs saw their 13-game win streak come to an end with a 58-39 loss at TCU. The defeat was the team's first in conference action, moving them to 7-1 in the league and 17-5 on the year, while the Horned Frogs improved to 12-11 and 5-3 in the MWC.

SDSU did not have a player score in double-figures with **Malia Nahinu (Hayward, Calif.)**, **Chelsea Hopkins (Las Vegas, Nev.)** and **Kalena Tutt (Long Beach, Calif.)** all finishing with eight points apiece. The conference's leading scorer, Aztec **Courtney Clements (Long Beach, Calif.)** was limited to a season-low four points on 2-of-8 shooting after missing most of the first half with foul trouble.

SDSU freshman **Chairese Culberson (Oakland, Calif.)** recorded her second double-figure rebounding effort with a team-high 10 rebounds, while Hopkins added seven to go with four assists and three steals.

After TCU scored the opening bucket, four different Aztecs accounted for the team's opening eight points. The sides combined for only 13 points through the first 10 minutes of the game as each team shot below 30 percent and had 12 turnovers between them.

SDSU held an early four-point advantage at 6-2, but the Horned Frogs regained the lead by utilizing a 6-0 run as the Aztec offense went scoreless for just over four minutes. Hopkins ended the drought with a lay-up off a steal and a pair of free throws to put the visitors back ahead 16-15 with 1:34 remaining. SDSU's **Erinna Amarikwa (Vacaville, Calif.)** and TCU's Latricia Lovings combined for the final seven points of the first half, as the Aztecs went into the locker room in front by just a pair at 20-18.

The host squad came out of the break with a three-point play and the first triple by either side for its largest margin of the afternoon at 24-20. San Diego State finally got on the scoreboard on back-to-back baskets from Nahinu to tie the game at 24.

After it was even at 28-28, the Aztecs managed just one point over the next 7:11 as TCU went in front by 10 at 39-29. The Horned Frogs led by as many as 21 points before securing the 58-39 win.

OTHER TCU POSTGAME NOTES

■ SDSU lost for the first time this season when leading at the half and having the same or more steals than its opponent. The 19-point loss is the Aztecs' biggest in 2011-12 (previous 15 at Washington State).

■ SDSU set season lows for points scored, field goals made, field-goal percentage and 3-point percentage. The Aztecs did not make a 3-pointer in a game for the first time since Jan. 26, 2011, vs. BYU.

■ SDSU has kept foes to less than 30 points in a half 18 times over the last 12 games (24 halves). TCU's 40 second-half points are the most by an opponent since the Cal Poly game and mark just the fourth time the Aztecs allowed 40 points in a half this year.

Air Force, which is in last place, is the only Mountain West squad to eclipse the 30-point mark in both halves.

■ San Diego State made over 70 percent of its free

throws for the 13th time this year and the fifth consecutive contest. The Aztecs are third in the Mountain West in season free-throw percentage in both overall (71.2) and league-only games (74.3).

A year ago, the squad made good on only 62.3 percent of its free throws and was last in conference games by a wide margin at 60.7.

RECAPPING THE WIN STREAK

San Diego State's longest win streak in 17 years spanned nearly two months and came after it had a 4-4 season record following a three-game losing skid.

The streak ties as the fourth-longest in program history. The program's previous double-figure efforts came in 1995 (18), 1983-84 (15), 1988 (14), 1994 (13), 1997 (11) and 1980-81 (10).

SDSU's 13-game win streak still accounts for more victories than six of the other seven Mountain West teams have for the entire season. It is also the longest by an MWC squad this year by seven wins.

WHAT A DIFFERENCE A YEAR MAKES

At this point last season, the Aztecs were 2-7 through their first game of the second round of conference play and were in a three-way tie for last place.

What a difference a year makes as SDSU is 7-1 despite dropping its first league game last week and is still in first place in the standings. The team's 7-0 start was the first time the Aztecs went undefeated in the first half of conference play in the 13-year history of the MWC and the first time any league squad pulled off the feat since Utah went 8-0 in 2009.

In program history that dates back to 1976-77, the Aztecs have kicked off a league schedule by winning at least its first seven outings just three times previously in 1994, 1995 and 1997. Current head coach Beth Burns has been on the sidelines in each one of those, highlighted by a 14-0 campaign in the WAC in 1995.

To put the start in perspective, the Aztecs did not compile seven league victories in any of the first eight years of the Mountain West (2000-07), even when it competed in 16 contests in both 2006 and 2007. The seven wins tie as the program's third-most in the 13-year history of the conference.

THEY'RE A STEAL

San Diego State has already surpassed its total from all of last season in steals, compiling 204 after logging a program-low 182 takeaways in 29 games a year ago. The 182 steals in 2010-11 ranked the team 298th out of 333 Division I women's hoops squads.

SDSU's 11 steals at TCU mark the ninth time it has reached double figures after doing so on only three occasions last season.

On the flip side, opponents haven't had 10 or more steals in each of the last 12 contests (5.9/g) with the Aztecs averaging 9.5 per game over that same span.

SDSU leads the league in steals per outing (9.3) and ranks second in conference-only games (10.0).

LOW ON THE TOS

One of the key factors in the team's success this year

has been keeping its turnover total at a minimum. San Diego State has had more than 20 turnovers just three times in 2011-12, with two of those outings being victories. The Aztecs continue to lead the Mountain West in turnover margin at +2.7 and are in the top 60 nationally at 15.5 giveaways a contest.

A year ago, the Aztecs were dead last in the league in turnover margin at -3.83, and reached the 20-turnover barrier 11 times.

BATTLE ON THE BOARDS

The Aztecs owned a slight 41-38 advantage on the glass against TCU, marking the 20th time in 22 contests this year that the team has not been outrebounded. SDSU is No. 1 in the MW at +7.6 and is 20th nationally in rebounding margin. The squad is also No. 1 in the league in rebounding offense (42.2/g), offensive boards (17.7/g), defensive rebounding percentage (66.5) and offensive rebounding percentage (44.4).

San Diego State has 40 or more boards 16 times in 2011-12, a mark it reached on only eight occasions in 29 outings in 2010-11. The team has outrebounded its opponent by more than 10 nine times, including a high of +25 vs. Penn and +20 at Hawai'i.

Last season, the Aztecs held an advantage on the boards 16 times, accounting for eight of the 12 wins.

PULLING DOWN DOUBLE

Nearly one quarter of San Diego State's 41 rebounds last Saturday were pulled down by freshman Chairese Culberson, who matched her career high with 10 boards.

The Aztecs have now logged seven individual double-figure rebounding performances this season, including a team-best four by point guard Chelsea Hopkins, two by Culberson and one by Courtney Clements.

CLOSING IN ON 1K

After recording four points against TCU, Aztec junior Courtney Clements needs just 27 more to reach the 1,000-point mark in her collegiate career.

Clements had 276 points in her first season while playing at Arizona and followed it up with 332 a year ago in the Red & Black. She has already exceeded her previous career high for scoring with 365 points in 2011-12.

The 6-0 guard continues to be the conference's leading scorer with her 16.6 per game average. Clements has a league-high eight 20-point scoring outings, has at least 17 points in 14 contests and has reached double-figures in all but three games.

The only Aztec to lead the Mountain West in scoring was two-time honorable mention All-American Jené Morris, who had a league-best 17.1 points per game in 2009-10.

HOPKINS HELPERS

With SDSU making just 15 baskets at TCU, Aztec point guard Chelsea Hopkins managed only four assists, her fewest in a league outing in 2012.

Hopkins still continues to lead the league by a wide margin in assists per game (6.1) and is currently 12th nationally. She has 37 more than any other conference player, including UNLV's Mia Bell, who is in second place with 98 despite playing in two more games and averaging around seven more minutes per outing.

What has been most impressive is that Hopkins boasts a 2-to-1 assist to turnover ratio, which puts her in the top 30 nationally. That figure jumps to 2.8 in the squad's eight conference games (55 assists to 20 turnovers).

An Aztec has led the league in assists or assists average each of the last three seasons and four of the last five years.

Two of the Lady Rebels' three MWC defeats have come in overtime at home against SDSU and most recently vs. Wyoming ... Last month was the first-ever overtime contest between the two sides in 44 all-time meetings ... UNLV has two players averaging in double-figure scoring including junior Kelli Thompson (12.6 ppg.) and senior Lenita Sanford (11.0 ppg.) ... Senior Jamie Smith hauls in a team-high 8.2 boards per game and is the all-time leading rebounder in MW history ... Smith is just the second player (men or women's) in Mountain West history to record over 1,000 points and 1,000 rebounds in a career ... Mia Bell has a team-high 52 steals and 98 assists, while Sanford has 53 blocks ... UNLV does not lead the conference in a single category, but ranks in the top three in 10 of them ... Lady Rebel freshman Danielle Miller hails from San Diego, attending Mount Miguel High.

RECEIVING VOTES

SDSU has received votes in the Associated Press Top 25 poll three times this season, including twice in the last three weeks.

The team had two votes back on Jan. 23, and followed that up with five on Jan. 30. The Aztecs got votes in both national top-25 polls Nov. 21-22, after opening the season with a 3-1 mark, including an upset of then No. 18 DePaul. The Aztecs had 13 votes in the AP top-25 poll, while they also received one in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll.

Prior to that, the last time San Diego State received votes in either poll was on Nov. 22, 2010, in the AP Top 25. The Aztecs were last listed in both polls in the same week during the 2010-11 preseason.

SDSU was last ranked in the top 25 in 2010, when it finished 20th in the final ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll. It marked the first time the Aztecs had been ranked in the final coaches poll in program history.

BEATING RANKED FOES

San Diego State is the only Mountain West squad to defeat a top-25 ranked team this season. The Aztecs upset then No. 18/18 DePaul on Nov. 18 for the program's first win vs. a ranked foe since 2010, when it beat No. 10 West Virginia in the NCAA Second Round.

Overall, the victory against the Blue Demons is the Aztecs' sixth against a top-25 squad over the last four

seasons. SDSU wins have come against Texas twice when the Longhorns were ranked No. 4 in 2008, and again when they were the No. 17 team on their home floor in 2010. League foes New Mexico (No. 23 - 2009) and TCU (No. 23 - 2010) have also been upset.

Prior to the win over Texas in December 2008, San Diego State had not beaten a ranked team since Dec. 28, 1994, when it handed No. 6 Alabama a 79-76 loss in a tournament held at St. John's in Jamaica, N.Y.

HOME SWEET HOME

San Diego State is 10-1 on its home court this season, which is five more victories than it had at Viejas Arena a year ago.

San Diego State managed two-straight campaigns with at least 10 home wins with a 15-1 mark in 2008-09, followed by a 12-2 record in 2010-11. This is the 17th time in program history that the team has at least 10 home wins in the same season.

WINNING BIG

Of the Aztecs' 17 wins in 2011-12, 13 are by double-figures and five are by 25 or more points, including a pair by more than 40. Last season, SDSU had zero wins by more than 25 points and seven of its 12 victories were by single-digits.

SDSU currently ranks first by a mile in the Mountain West in scoring margin at +12.7, a category it is 30th in nationally.

OTHER SEASON NOTES

■ With its wins over UAPB and No. 18 DePaul, SDSU scored over 80 points in back-to-back outings for the first time since scoring 85 in consecutive wins over Montana State and Loyola Marymont in Dec. 2008.

The team did not surpass the 80-point barrier all of last season and that streak dates back to a 87-52 win over Air Force on March 6, 2010.

■ The Aztecs' 43-point margin of victory over Arkansas-Pine Bluff is SDSU's largest margin of victory since defeating Air Force by 51 in 2009.

■ SDSU's 86 points vs. UAPB are the most in a season-opening game since scoring 101 against McNeese State on Nov. 23, 1990 (101-55 victory). The 86 points are the most in any game since it lit up Air Force for 87 in the 2010 regular-season finale.

■ The Aztecs claimed the tournament title at the Jack In the Box Rainbow Wahine Classic in Honolulu, Nov. 18-20. It is the first time SDSU has won a non-conference event since going 2-0 at its own San Diego Surf 'N Slam in 2009.

■ Courtney Clements and Kiyana Stamps, were named to the six-player all-tournament squad at the Rainbow Wahine Classic. Clements was tabbed the tournament MVP, becoming the first Aztec so honored since 2010.

■ UNCG's 29 points marks the sixth time in program history that an SDSU opponent has failed to reach the 30-mark. It is the fewest points scored against SDSU since Air Force managed 28 on Jan. 7, 2009.

■ San Diego State won its second non-conference tournament title in as many chances by going 2-0 at the seventh annual Surf 'N Slam. Aztecs Courtney

Clements and Kiyana Stamps were both named all-tournament for the second time in 2011-12, joining MVP Chelsea Hopkins.

■ After going 5-2 this year, SDSU improved its overall record in December to 27-8 since 2006.

■ For the first time in school history, San Diego State held an opponent to less than 40 points in three consecutive games. The Aztecs gave up 37 to both Longwood and Penn after allowing only 29 vs. UNCG.

SDSU had kept a foe to under 40 points in back-to-back outings three times previously in 1981, 1980 and 1978.

■ SDSU's 10 regular-season non-conference victories are the program's most since the 1995-96 squad also won 10. With the shortened league schedule, the Aztecs played 14 non-conference outings, which are their most since the 1990-91 team competed in 15.

■ SDSU notched its first-ever overtime victory in a Mountain West Conference game on Jan. 14, at UNLV. The team had been 0-2 in that category previously.

■ Ten different Aztecs have scored at least 10 points at least once this season. That is especially notable considering there are 13 players on the active roster and only seven different student-athletes reached the 10-point barrier in 29 outings a year ago.

■ SDSU has eclipsed the 70-point mark in 10 outings this season after doing so only five times, including just once in 16 conference games, last year.

■ The 10 turnovers vs. both New Mexico and Air Force are its fewest in a game since also having 10 against Navy on Dec. 18, 2007.

■ Three Aztecs have combined to earn four Mountain West Conference player-of-the-week awards. Junior Courtney Clements has turned the trick twice on Nov. 21 and Jan. 30, while teammates Chelsea Hopkins (Jan. 16) and Malia Nahinu (Dec. 19) were also recognized with their first career honors.

PRESEASON POINTS

For the fourth straight season, the San Diego State women's basketball team has been picked to finish in the top two in the Mountain West in 2012, earning its second consecutive second-place selection and third in the last four years in a vote by the league's eight head coaches and select media members.

The preseason poll, which was released Oct. 11, at the conference's annual media day in Denver, Colo., had the Aztecs with 127 total points and seven of the 20 first-place votes.

TCU was tabbed as the preseason favorite with 136 points and 12 first-place votes. Colorado State was selected third behind the Aztecs, earning the final first place vote, and was followed by New Mexico, UNLV, Wyoming, Air Force and newcomer Boise State.

INDIVIDUAL ACCOLADES

For the second campaign in a row, San Diego State swept both the preseason newcomer and freshman of the year awards, which were released at the league's annual media day in October.

Junior guard Chelsea Hopkins was chosen as the Mountain West Newcomer of the Year, following in the

footsteps of current teammate Courtney Clements and recent graduate Jessika Bradley, who earned the honor both in the preseason and at the end of the year in 2010 and 2011.

SDSU's Chairese Culberson was chosen as the conference's top freshman, after leading Berkeley High School to a runner-up performance at the California state Division I tournament this past March. The 6-0 forward was the top ranked recruit in the Mountain West by *Hoopgurtz*, receiving a rating of 46th overall and seventh at the wing position.

NOTING THIS YEAR'S TEAM

■ San Diego State returns two starters and six other letterwinners from last year's squad. Only three Aztecs had played more than one season in the Red & Black entering 2011-12.

■ Of the 15 student-athletes on this year's roster, seven players did not compete for San Diego State a year ago. Two of the seven were on campus, but junior Chelsea Hopkins sat out after transferring from Duke and red-shirt sophomore Kiyana Stamps missed part of the campaign due to injury and the other half to concentrate on academics. Stamps competed in only two games in 2009-10 after tearing her ACL.

■ The Aztecs' roster boasts five true freshmen, including four post players in forwards Erimma Amariakwa, Chairese Culberson, **Khristina Hunter (Fairfield, Calif.)** and **Deajanae Scurry (Los Angeles, Calif.)** to go with guard **Ahjalee Harvey (Mountain View, Calif.)**. The last time SDSU had five true freshman on its roster was 2008-09, when the squad also had five.

■ Entering this season, five players accounted for 280 of the 338 total career games played (82.8 percent) in an Aztec uniform by the entire SDSU 2011-12 roster.

AZTECS SIGN PAIR TO NLIs

San Diego State women's basketball head coach Beth Burns announced the signing Nov. 9, of forward **Aleiah Brandon (Corona, Calif.)** and point guard **Tia Levi-Dixon (San Diego, Calif.)** to National Letters of Intent.

The high school seniors will join the Aztecs in 2012.

AZTECS OVERSEAS

San Diego State currently has five of its recent stand-outs playing professionally overseas. Guard Jené Morris (Girona) and forward Jessika Bradley (Arixil) both compete in Spain, while guard Quenese Davis (PAOK) plays in Greece and center Paris Johnson (Gorzow Wlkp.) is in Poland. Quenese's younger sister, Coco, also joined a team in Israel.

A year ago, Morris was in both Poland and Israel after playing for the Indiana Fever, who made her the first-ever Aztec to be selected in the WNBA Draft (first round/11th pick overall) in 2010. Davis, the Aztecs' all-time career assists leader, competed professionally in Austria and was named the *Eurobasket.com* All-Austrian AWBL Guard of the Year with the Flying Foxes.

THE NEW LEAGUE LOOK

For the first time since TCU joined the conference in 2005, the Mountain West will have a new look this sea-

Gone are BYU and Utah, who claimed the league regular-season and tournament titles a year ago, while Boise State is the newcomer after participating in the Western Athletic Conference.

The Aztecs will now have just 14 league games instead of 16, meaning the MW regular-season slate will start a week later in January and finish up three days earlier in late February. San Diego State will have additional days to prepare for the Mountain West Championships, which will be one day shorter and feature four quarterfinal games on Wednesday, before the semifinals on Friday and the finale on Saturday.

AZTECS ON TV

The Aztecs will have at least 10 of its contests televised in 2011-12, with seven regular-season outings slated for The Mtn. and two contests scheduled to be shown on CBS College Sports Network. In addition, three of The Mtn. games will also be broadcast locally on Channel 4 San Diego and the opening contests of the 2012 Mountain West Conference Championships in Las Vegas next March will be carried on The Mtn.

LISTEN/WATCH LIVE

For the 11th straight year, Aztec women's basketball fans will have an opportunity to listen to live play-by-play of nearly every regular season game (home and away) over the internet at www.goaztecs.com.

SDSU alum Chris Eilo will have the play-by-play duties both at home and on the road for the fifth straight season.

Again in 2011-12, all regular season Aztec home contests, with the exception of certain televised games, will also feature a live video feed to go along with the audio call from Viejas Arena on www.goaztecs.com.

BURNS TABBED WBCA SECRETARY

This past July, San Diego State head coach Beth Burns was appointed as the secretary of the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) Board of Directors' Executive Committee. Burns previously served as a Division I at-large representative on the organization's 23-member board the last two years.

SDSU HEAD COACH BETH BURNS

The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa in April 8, 2005, and enters the seventh season of her second stint with the Aztecs.

Most recently, Burns has taken the program to new heights, including a trip to the 2010 NCAA Sweet Sixteen, back-to-back NCAA tournament appearances (2009, 2010) and both a conference regular-season (2009) and tournament title (2010).

The Aztecs advanced to three straight Mountain West Conference championship games from 2008-10, after not winning one tournament game in the league's first eight years of existence. SDSU has scored five wins over top-25 foes, including two vs. teams in the top 10 in No. 4 Texas and No. 10 West Virginia.

Including 2010-11, SDSU has recorded at least 12

victories in five consecutive seasons with Burns at the helm, highlighted by back-to-back campaigns with at least 23 victories.

In her first stint as Aztec head coach from 1989-97, Burns took the SDSU women's basketball program full circle, going from 7-23 her first year to 23-7 in her final campaign. During her eight seasons, she compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular season titles.

A four-time conference coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02). She has a 20-year overall head coaching record of 341-242, while her school record stands at 260-177 over 14 seasons.

Last fall, Burns signed a five-year contract extension to stay as SDSU's head coach through the 2014-15 campaign.

SAN DIEGO - For the fourth time in the last five years, the San Diego State women's basketball team started the season off on the right foot, defeating visiting Arkansas-Pine Bluff 86-43 at Viejas Arena. With the victory, the Aztecs moved to 1-0 overall, while the Golden Lions dropped to 0-2, following the first-ever meeting between the two sides.

SDSU had three players finish with double-figure points, including leading scorer Courtney Clements, who notched 21 points on 7-for-13 shooting for her third career 20-point outing as an Aztec. Redshirt sophomore Kiyana Stamps added 17 points in her first contest since 2009, while junior co-captain Gabrielle Clark contributed a career-high 12 points by making four of her seven attempts.

Forward Chairese Culberson hauled in a team-high nine rebounds and point guard Ahjalee Harvey tallied seven assists in their collegiate debuts. Sophomore Melissa Sweat led the defensive effort with four of the Aztecs' 14 steals on the night.

San Diego State never trailed in the game, going up by 13 points at the 12:29 mark of the first half. The Lady Lions used a pair of triples from Markita Quarles and a jumper from Jenise Gentry to cut their deficit down to only seven at 18-11, but the Aztecs then went on a 14-1 run to build a 20-point advantage before settling for a 41-24 lead at the break.

Coming out of the locker room, the UAPB offense continued to struggle as it did not record a field goal until six and a half minutes into the second half on a 3-pointer by Lakendra Marsh at 52-28. The Aztecs would eventually lead by as many as 43 and outscored the visitors 45-19 in the final 20 minutes to secure the 86-43 season-opening win.

SDSU shot over 41 percent from the field, made nine 3-pointers and posted a phenomenal 91.3 free-throw percentage (21-for-23). On the flip side, UAPB shot just 22.2 percent for the game, converting only five second-half field goals.

HONOLULU - The San Diego State women's basketball team went on a 10-0 run with just over five minutes remaining in the game to turn a two-point contest into a 12-point advantage and went on to claim a 82-74 upset victory over 18th-ranked DePaul in the first game of the Jack In The Box Rainbow Wahine Classic. The win was the Aztecs' sixth over a top-25 team in the last four seasons and improved them to 2-0 overall in 2011-12, while the Blue Demons dropped to 2-1.

The Aztecs had four players score in double-figures, led by junior Courtney Clements, who eclipsed the 20-point mark for the second consecutive outing with 25, including 13 in the first half. Sophomore Kiyana Stamps continued to give the Aztecs an offensive punch off the bench with 17 points for the second game in a row. Sophomore Melissa Sweat and freshman Chairese Culberson both chipped in career highs with 14 and 10 points respectively.

Sweat was a perfect 3-for-3 from beyond the arc and Culberson hauled in nine boards to fall just one rebound short of a double-double. Clements tied a career high with eight rebounds, junior Chelsea Hopkins had seven assists and senior Kalena Tutt added three steals.

After the game was tied three times in the first four minutes, the Aztecs utilized a three-point play from Sweat to spark a 12-0 run at 18-6. DePaul eventually caught up with the help of three triples to knot the contest at 27 points apiece. The Blue Demons took the lead on the pair of free throws, but the Aztecs managed to even the score heading into the locker room at 33-33.

The two sides traded free throws coming out of the break, before SDSU's Culberson made a jumper and hit a pair at the line to give the team a lead they would never end up relinquishing. The Aztecs had two nine-point advantages, but saw that cut down to only a pair with 5:50 remaining in the game.

From there, San Diego State started a 10-0 run with baskets by four different players to go up by 12 and go on to secure an eight-point upset victory 82-74.

The Aztecs attempted just one free throw in the first half, but tried 29 in the second half to go 24-for-30 (80.0 percent) at the stripe. SDSU owned a 47-38 advantage on the boards and hit six 3-pointers, which was two more than a DePaul squad that had a combined 25 in its opening two contests this season.

The Wahine would go on a slight run to get to within as few as 21 points on two occasions with the final one being with the score at 61-40.

Over the final 2:49, the Aztecs ended the game on a 10-4 run to secure its third victory in as many tries this season at 71-44.

SDSU dominated the boards with a plus-20 advantage and shot 47.8 percent from the field, including over 50 percent in the opening 15 minutes. Hawai'i, meanwhile, only made 10 field goals over the entire game and scored 23 of its 44 points at the charity stripe, while make only one 3-pointer.

HONOLULU - Portland's Natalie Day hit the game-winning free throws with just 2.4 seconds remaining as the San Diego State women's basketball team suffered its first loss of the season 59-58 in the final game of the Jack In The Box Rainbow Wahine Classic. SDSU dropped to 3-1 on the year, while the Pilots, improved to 3-2 in 2011-12.

Against Portland, the Aztecs trailed by as many as nine points with 12:27 remaining in the game and were down by seven with just 4:30 left. SDSU, however, got two free throws, a three-pointer and a three-point play by senior Kalena Tutt to tie the contest at 52 apiece with 3:30 remaining.

San Diego State was behind by three at the 1:43 mark, but took the lead on a lay-up from Kiyana Stamps and a leaning jumper from Chelsea Hopkins at 58-57 with only eight seconds remaining. Portland did not take a timeout and quickly got the ball up the court, missing on its first shot, but Day got the rebound and was fouled. Day then made both free throws to secure the 59-58 victory as the Aztecs' full-court baseball pass was intercepted to end the game.

Despite the loss, SDSU got another standout offensive performance from junior Courtney Clements, who surpassed the 20-point mark for the third time in four outings this season. Clements was 5-for-6 from beyond the arc and 8-for-13 from the field to end up with 21 of the team's 58 points. She was the only Aztec in double-figures as Stamps had eight points and Tutt contributed seven to go with her SDSU-best seven rebounds.

The match-up was tied twice within the first three minutes before Portland notched three consecutive lay-ups over a span of just over a minute to take a six-point lead at 10-4. San Diego State responded with three baskets by Clements, including a lay-up, a jumper and a 3-pointer out of the left corner to put the team up by one at 11-10.

After three lead changes and another tie, the Aztec offense went scoreless for nearly five and a half minutes as the Pilots built a 21-14 lead. A Hopkins basket ended the draught and SDSU ended up catching up by the break at 27-27.

Coming out of the locker room, San Diego State fell behind by three points on three occasions within the first four minutes and that deficit grew to nine at 45-36 on a 3-pointer and a last-second lay-up by Pilot Cassandra Brown. A basket by Sajoyia Griffin at the 11:35 mark started a brief 4-0 run as the Aztecs were within five points three times before being behind by eight heading into the final five minutes of the contest.

SDSU shot just 36.2 percent from the field, while committing 17 turnovers. Portland shot just slightly better and made 18-of-23 free throws, while owning just a slight plus-one advantage on the boards.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team had three players notch career highs in scoring to stay perfect at home with a 63-51 victory over visiting Washington at Viejas Arena. The Aztecs, who are receiving votes in both national top-25 polls, improved to 4-1 overall, while the Huskies dropped to 3-2 on the year following the first-ever meeting between the two sides.

Four of the five SDSU starters scored in double-figures including three with career-high point totals. Freshman Chairese Culberson notched a team-high 14 points, including her first career 3-pointer, to go with four of the team's 13 steals. Senior Kalena Tutt had a career-high 13 points and six rebounds, while junior Chelsea Hopkins posted career bests in both points (12) and rebounds (7) and also recorded five assists and three steals in 27 minutes of action. Junior Courtney Clements was the fourth Aztec with at least 10 points, contributing 11 for her fifth consecutive double-figure scoring outing in as many games this season.

San Diego State trailed just twice, giving up the opening basket to UW's Regina Rogers and falling behind by one point on a lay-up at the 17:32 mark of the first half at 4-3. The Aztecs took the lead on a pair of Tutt free throws and had a two possession advantage until going on a 13-5 run to jump ahead by double figures for the first time at 26-16. Following a timeout, the Huskies trimmed their deficit to eight three times, including at the break with the score 32-24.

Coming out of the locker room, the two sides traded baskets before Tutt sparked a 6-0 Aztec run with a jumper and a basket following a UW turnover to give her team a 14-point advantage at 40-26. The San Diego State lead would grow out to as many as 16 points at the 8:17 mark until Washington made a final push in the final four minutes on four lay-ups in the paint from Rogers to close to within eight at 57-49.

Sophomore Kiyana Stamps restored the SDSU lead into double figures just 21 seconds later and both Clements and Hopkins hit a pair of free throws each to close out the 63-51 victory.

LOS ANGELES - The San Diego State women's basketball team rallied from a 16-point deficit to take a three-point second-half lead, but wasn't able to come out with a victory, as the Aztecs fell 78-71 to host UCLA at the John Wooden Center. With the loss, SDSU dropped to 4-2, while the Bruins improved to 4-2 after defeating the visitors for the second year in a row.

Aztec junior Courtney Clements led the team in scoring with 19 points, but made just seven of her 24 field-goal attempts. Sophomore Melissa Sweat matched her career high with 14 points, highlighted by 12 in the second half, while freshman Erimma Amarikwa and junior Chelsea Hopkins both finished with eight points apiece. Hopkins had six of the team's nine assists and she, along with Clements and senior Kalena Tutt all added six rebounds.

The Aztecs got off to a quick start with a 6-0 lead on baskets from three different players, but the Bruins finally got on the board at the 17:35 mark and took their first lead of the night at 9-8. UCLA then utilized some hot shooting and got a number of second-chance buckets, putting together what would later amount to be a 22-0 run to go up by 16 points with the score at 24-8.

San Diego State, however, would battle back, as a jumper from junior Malia Nahinu ended a near seven-minute. Clements then notched 10 of SDSU's next 12 points and received help from three of the squad's freshmen, who contributed a basket apiece to cut the deficit all the way to just four points at 35-31. The Bruins converted on a 3-point play in the final eight seconds by Rhema Gardner to extend the lead back out to 38-31 heading into the locker room.

Coming out of the break, the Aztecs quickly made a dent in their deficit, getting a bucket from Clements and two lay-ups from Hopkins in under a minute. SDSU successfully completed the come back on a 3-point play from Amarikwa to take its first lead since the first half at 40-39 with 17:48 remaining.

The two sides were tied twice and traded advantages three times before UCLA outscored the Aztecs 15-4 to push it once again to a double-figure Bruin lead at 59-49. The home squad reached the double bonus by the 9:45 mark and made good on four of six free throws while adding a wide-open triple from Thea Lemberger to open the gap to 14 points on two occasions.

The Aztecs cut that deficit in half with under 30 seconds remaining before ultimately falling by that same seven-point margin, 78-71.

The score was tied at 19 and 21 and also at the break, as San Diego State erased a five-point deficit with under a minute and a half remaining to go into the locker room all square at 28 points apiece.

USD scored the first point of the second half on a free throw, but the Aztecs bounced back ahead on a jumper from Clements at the 17:52 mark at 30-29. SDSU then went scoreless over nearly a 10-minute span, missing its next 13 shots. Luckily for the home team, the Toreros also had their own streak of cold shooting, as San Diego State finally broke the drought on a triple from sophomore Melissa Sweat to put them down by only five with 8:02 left to play.

The Aztecs cut it to as little as a two-point margin at 39-37 and trailed by just three with 4:55 remaining, but never got any closer as San Diego went to the free-throw line 14 more times, hitting 10 of them to secure the 56-45 victory.

Nahinu, however, got SDSU going and was effective early and often as she scored six of San Diego State's first 10 points. The Aztecs found their rhythm offensively midway through the first half and opened up a 10-point lead as they went on an 8-2 run. The aforementioned run was a part of an overall 14-4 spurt, which gave San Diego State its largest lead of the game, 14 points, with 7:32 left in the half.

The Aztecs carried their double-figure lead deep into the first half until UC Irvine's Cheyenne Cathey knocked down a three to trim SDSU's lead to nine points. Cathey's bucket was the beginning of an 8-0 spurt to end the half as San Diego State went into the locker room with a 34-30 lead.

SDSU started the second half as hot as the Anteaters ended the first and used a 14-3 run along with a stifling defense to extend its lead to 48-33 before the first media timeout. During the run, the Aztecs received five points apiece from Stamps and Clements and four from Kalena Tutt.

The scoring spree from Stamps and Clements was just a glimpse of what was to come later in the half. Stamps went on to score all of her 15 points in the second half, including nine off three-pointers. Clements, meanwhile, scored 13 of her 17 points in the final 20 minutes. The defense continued to be strong throughout the half especially in the final six minutes as the Aztecs limited UC Irvine to just six points to end the game. During that final six-minute stretch, San Diego State scored 13 points to provide the final margin.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State junior Chelsea Hopkins came up with a critical steal with just three seconds left in the game to preserve a 79-78 come-from-behind victory over visiting Cal Poly at Viejas Arena. The Aztecs rallied from an eight-point second-half deficit to improve to 6-4 on the season, while the Mustangs dropped their second consecutive one-point decision to fall to 3-9 on the year.

After trailing by eight with 11:05 remaining in the game, San Diego State got to within three on five occasions before reeling off eight-straight points to take the lead at 74-70 on two lay-ups apiece by Hopkins and freshman forward Kristina Hunter. The Aztecs had a six-point advantage with 2:05 left to play, however, the Mustangs cut it down to only one point at 79-78 on a jumper from Jonae Ervin. Hopkins missed a pair of lay-ups on the team's next possession, but got it back on the other end of the floor by stealing the ball away from Ervin to force a turnover and secure the loose ball before she was fouled.

The junior missed both of her free-throw opportunities which would have made it a three-point game, but Aztec Courtney Clements secured the rebound on the final shot and ran out the remaining two seconds to preserve the 79-78 victory.

San Diego State came out in the end despite a monster effort by Cal Poly red-shirt senior Kristina Santiago, who went 16-for-23 from the field and 11-for-14 from the line to score 44 points, while also adding eight boards and four steals before fouling out with 59 seconds left and her team trailing by only two.

Clements led the SDSU offensive effort with her fourth 20-point scoring outing of the year, hitting nine of her 15 shots, including three from beyond the arc, for 24 points to go with eight rebounds. Stamps matched her career high with 17 points, while Hunter posted her first contest in double-figures with 12 on 5-for-7 shooting. Stamps also had a four steals and Hopkins tallied nine assists.

The first half featured seven tie scores and eight lead changes with Cal Poly jumping out by as many as five points at 28-23 with 7:38 left until the break. San Diego State caught up before the end of the half, jumping ahead by as many as three points before heading into the locker room trailing by one at 41-40.

After the game was tied at 48 in the second half, the Mustangs scored seven in a row and ended up putting together an 12-4 run capped by a 3-pointer from Ariana Delgado at 60-52 for the largest lead by either team on the afternoon.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team cruised to an easy 57-29 victory over visiting UNCG in the opening game of the San Diego Surf 'N Slam Classic at Viejas Arena. The win was Beth Burns' 250th in her 15 overall seasons as head coach at SDSU and improved the squad to 7-4 this year. The Spartans, meanwhile, dropped to 2-9 after failing to reach the 30-point barrier for the first time in 2011-12.

San Diego State had three starters tally double-figure points, including sophomore Kiyana Stamps, who made a career-high four 3-pointers and finished with 16 points to go with five offensive rebounds in only 25 minutes.

Junior point guard Chelsea Hopkins also had a solid outing with a team season-high 10 rebounds as well as nine assists and three steals.

San Diego State never trailed in the game, jumping ahead 8-0 with points by four different players. UNCG finally got on the scoreboard at the 16:13 mark on a jumper from Janae Stevenson, but the Aztecs responded with a 7-1 run to increase the advantage out to 12. The host went up by as many as 18 points before heading into the break in front 26-11, as the Spartans finally crossed into double-figures with just under two minutes remaining.

Stamps, who notched only three first-half points, found her shooting rhythm coming out of the locker room with a pair of triples and two free throws in less than three minutes. Neither side had a field goal for the next four minutes until Nahinu broke through with a jumper at the 13:01 mark. After a brief 3-0 run by the Spartans, Stamps hit another triple to spark a 12-2 run to put the host squad in front by 20 at 49-20. The Aztecs led by as many as 30 points before coming out with the 57-29 victory.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State used a plus-24 margin on the glass to propel it to the championship of the San Diego Surf 'N Slam with a 51-37 victory over visiting Penn at Viejas Arena. The Aztecs claimed their third Surf 'N Slam title in the last four seasons by winning their fourth game in a row to improve to 8-4. The Quakers, meanwhile, saw their three-game win streak snapped to fall to 7-3.

The Aztecs accounted for three of the six players on the all-tournament squad, including the MVP in junior point guard Chelsea Hopkins. Hopkins had a career high in rebounding for the second outing a row with 12 to go with seven assists and seven points in 34 minutes. Hopkins totaled 22 rebounds and 16 assists over the Surf 'N Slam's two contests.

Hopkins was joined by junior Courtney Clements, who had a game-high 17 points on 7-of-18 shooting against the Quakers, and redshirt sophomore Kiyana Stamps, who contributed eight points, three assists and two steals. Aztec junior center Malia Nahinu was the second SDSU player in double-figure points with 12 as well as three blocked shots.

For the second outing in a row, San Diego State never trailed building a 6-0 advantage out of the gate with baskets by three different players. Penn got on the board at the 16:25 mark on a jumper from Jourdan Banks and moved to within three points on a lay-up from Jess Knap at 7-4.

Clements then scored the game's next five points on a triple and a lay-up in the paint for an eight-point advantage. After the Quakers trimmed the deficit to six on two occasions, neither side scored for the next five minutes until back-to-back baskets by SDSU freshman Erimma Amarikwa finally broke the stalemate for an 18-8 advantage.

The Aztecs lead was also 10 points at the break at 25-15, and moved out to 12 points twice early in the second half. Penn kept it to just a two possession game until a Nahinu jumper sparked a 12-2 run for a 16-point lead at 43-27. The Quakers would get as close as nine points with 3:43 remaining before SDSU eventually secured the 14-point win at 51-37.

BAKERSFIELD, Calif. - Behind a career-high 21 points from junior Chelsea Hopkins, the San Diego State women's basketball team finished out its 2011-12 non-conference schedule by defeating host CSU Bakersfield 74-60 Saturday afternoon at the Icardo Center. The win is the Aztecs' sixth in a row and improved the squad to 10-4 on the year, while the Roadrunners dropped to 3-16 overall.

The Aztec lead dipped below double-figures at nine on a triple from CSUB's Brooklynn Hinkens, but the Aztecs reeled off a 9-0 run to go up by 18 before heading into the break in front 37-23.

The Roadrunners managed just three free throws through the first four and a half minutes coming out of the locker room to help the visitors jump ahead by 19 on two occasions. CSUB's first field goal of the second half, a 3-pointer by Kristine Herman, sparked 12-5 run cutting the Aztec advantage down to 50-38 with 11:08 left in the game.

San Diego State immediately countered with a jumper by Nahinu and Stamps and a triple from Hopkins to restore the team's 19-point lead. The Aztecs led by as many as 24 points with 2:54 remaining before CSU Bakersfield ended the afternoon on a 10-0 run to close out the game at 74-60.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team used an 18-0 run in the second half to turn a one-point deficit into a 17-point lead as the Aztecs went on to claim a 61-46 victory over TCU in both sides 2012 Mountain West Conference openers at Viejas Arena. SDSU improved to 11-4 overall and 1-0 in league action by earning its seventh consecutive win, while the Horned Frogs dropped their third in a row to fall to 7-9 and 0-1.

In her first career Mountain West game, Aztec point guard Chelsea Hopkins posted her second career double-double with 17 points and a career-high 13 rebounds. She also notched six of the squad's 12 assists and came away with three steals in 33 minutes of action. Classmate Kiyana Stamps notched all but one of her 16 points in the second half, while freshman Chairese Culberson came off the bench to record eight points and eight rebounds.

Neither side shot the ball well in the first half, as the squads didn't notch the first field goal of the game until the 16:01 mark on a triple by TCU's Whitney Williams. The two sides were tied five times and traded leads on eight occasions until San Diego State put together a 6-0 run on three consecutive baskets in the paint by Hopkins for an 18-13 advantage. The Horned Frogs got that deficit down to only one with 4:51 remaining until the break, but the Aztecs finished on an 8-3 run to go into the locker room in front, 26-20.

TCU scored the first seven points of the second half to jump ahead 27-26 and also enjoyed a one-point advantage at 29-28. From there, the Aztecs utilized a jumper from the right block by senior Kalena Tutt to kick start what would be an 18-0 run and a 46-29 lead as the Horned Frogs went scoreless for just over six minutes. SDSU led by as many as 19 points, before eventually settling for a 15-point victory at 61-46 over the league's preseason favorite.

LAS VEGAS - In a contest featuring the top two squads in the conference, the San Diego State women's basketball team outlasted host UNLV 66-62 in overtime at Cox Pavilion. With the victory, the Aztecs claimed their eighth win in a row and started the conference campaign 2-0 for just the second time in the Mountain West's 13-year history, improving to 12-4 overall. The Lady Rebels, meanwhile, dropped to 13-5 and 1-1 in league action.

Junior Courtney Clements notched her fifth 20-point scoring out of the year, finishing with exactly 20 points on 9-of-18 shooting to go with a team-best eight rebounds for the Aztecs. Sophomore Kiyana Stamps had 14 points, six rebounds and three steals in playing nearly the entire game, while junior Chelsea Hopkins added 11 points, including nine in the second half and overtime, seven assists and three steals.

San Diego State had a four-point advantage at 54-50 with under a minute left in regulation and could have iced the game at the free throw line. Three different Aztecs, however, each missed the front end of a 1-and-1 in the final 39 seconds as UNLV made both of its free throws and got the game-tying basket from guard Mia Bell with six seconds remaining to send it to overtime.

In the extra five minutes, the Lady Rebels struck first with a pair of free throws, but Stamps answered the next time down the court with her only triple of the game to put SDSU in front by one. The Aztecs also led by only one with under two minutes left, before getting three consecutive points from senior Kalena Tutt for their biggest advantage of overtime at 64-60.

UNLV battled to get to within a pair, but Hopkins converted both of her free throws with 10 ticks left on the clock to preserve the 66-62 win.

The game featured 13 lead changes and 10 tie scores with the Aztecs going up by as many as seven points in the second half at 41-34, after the Lady Rebels were in front by six at the 8:14 mark of the first 20 minutes of action.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team rolled to a 77-47 victory over visiting New Mexico to improve to 3-0 in league action and remain the only unbeaten squad in Mountain West play. The win was also the Aztecs' ninth in a row to give the program its' longest such streak since 1997, and allowed them to surpass last season's victory total with a 13-4 overall record. The Lobos started the evening off with a 5-0 run on a jumper off the glass from Caroline Durbin and a 3-pointer from the right angle by Porche Torrance. San Diego State answered with a 5-0 run of its own to tie the game and the squads were also knotted at 7-7 at the 16:31 mark of the first half.

From there, the Aztecs scored seven unanswered points, including five by Clements, to move into a lead that they would never end up relinquishing. New Mexico cut it to as few as four points at 18-14 on a triple from Lauren Taylor, but SDSU took advantage of the visitors' 13 first-half turnovers and went into the break up by 17 at 40-23.

The Aztecs came out of the locker room with the hot hand shooting, draining five of their first six shots to jump ahead by 24 points at 51-27. The Lobos would get that down to as few as 18 points with 8:05 left in the game, but San Diego State outscored them 17-6 over the final six minutes to secure the 77-47 victory.

USAF ACADEMY, Colo. - The San Diego State women's basketball team posted its 10th consecutive victory by rallying from a four-point second-half deficit to knock off host Air Force 75-62 at Clune Arena. With the win, the first-place Aztecs have started their MWC schedule at 4-0 for the first time in the league's 13-year history and improved their overall record to 14-4. The Falcons, meanwhile, dropped to 5-14 and 0-4 in MWC play.

SDSU junior Courtney Clements recorded her first career double-double with a game-high 21 points and 10 rebounds in shooting nearly 54 percent from the field (7-of-13) and 60 percent (3-of-5) from beyond the arc. Junior point guard Chelsea Hopkins notched 10 of her 19 points at the free-throw line, while adding seven assists, six boards and five of the team's 12 steals. After being limited to only two points in the first half, redshirt sophomore Kiyana Stamps ended up with 15 and was a perfect 6-for-6 from the charity stripe.

The afternoon got underway with the Aztecs missing their first four shots and Air Force turning the ball over on each of its first two possessions. SDSU started the scoring with a basket by Clements which was matched by a jumper from Falcon Alicia Leipprandt. A pair of Clements free throws began a 5-0 Aztec run for a 7-2 lead and the visitors jumped ahead by as many as nine at the 11:30 mark with the help of a pair of triples from freshman Ahjalee Harvey.

From there, Air Force began to get red hot shooting, taking the lead for the first time at the 7:02 mark at 24-23. The schools traded advantages five more times as the Falcons were up 32-30 at the break with the help of a 59.1 first-half field-goal percentage and SDSU being unable to make a bucket for the final 6:01.

San Diego State moved back ahead on a 3-pointer by Stamps coming out the locker room, but Air Force immediately stormed back with two straight baskets from Dymond James and a triple out of the right corner for its largest lead of the afternoon at 39-35.

The Aztecs did not let the deficit get any larger as a Clements jumper put them up by one with 13:51 left and back-to-back scores from Hopkins swung the game back in SDSU's favor at 47-43.

Just as the rest of the afternoon had gone, Air Force responded and it was just a one-point game at 52-51 with less than six minutes remaining in the game. SDSU made good on six consecutive trips to the free-throw line in less than a minute and a half to kick off an 11-0 run and a 63-53 advantage. The Aztecs went up by as many as 15 points before settling for the 75-62 victory.

San Diego State added to its lead early in the second half, jumping up by double-figures at 34-23. The Cowgirls would cut it to seven at 37-30, but the Aztecs nailed a pair of 3-pointers by Clements and Harvey to move out to a 13-point advantage with 10:21 left to play.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team used a 13-4 run to start the second half en route to a 66-57 victory over Colorado State at Viejas Arena. It was the 12th consecutive win for the Aztecs, which is the program's longest such streak in 17 years, and improved them to 16-4 overall and 6-0 in the Mountain West. The Rams, who were tied for second place in the league standings entering the day, dropped to 8-13 and 4-2 in conference action.

On Saturday, the Aztecs were led once again by junior Courtney Clements, who finished just shy of the 20-point mark, notching 13 of her 19 points in the first half, while tying her career high in 3-pointers with five on just eight attempts (62.5 percent). The Aztecs went up 17-9 with 10:10 left on a 3-pointer by freshman Ahjalee Harvey, but CSU answered with five straight points to get within three at 17-14. SDSU, however, responded by going on a 9-0 run to open up a 26-14 advantage until Colorado State closed to within 33-25 at the break.

Hopkins had six points and three assists over the Aztecs' 13-4 opening second-half run that put the home team up, 46-29, with 15:04 left. San Diego State led by as many as 17, but with two minutes remaining the Rams trailed by only seven on a jumper from LaDeyah Forte.

Stamps then nailed a basket in the paint to make it a nine-point advantage and Hopkins converted on three of four free-throw attempts in the final 32 seconds to preserve the 66-57 victory.

BOISE, Idaho - The San Diego State women's basketball team claimed its 13th consecutive victory and finished the first round of league play unbeaten by downing host Boise State 69-59 at Taco Bell Arena. The Aztecs improved to 17-4 overall and now own a two-game lead in the Mountain West Conference standings at 7-0. Boise State, which committed 26 turnovers, dropped to 11-11 on the year and 2-5 in league action.

SDSU had three players in double-figure scoring with junior Courtney Clements leading the way with 20 points, despite shooting just 30 percent from the field. Clements now has eight 20-point scoring outings this season and also added a team-high seven boards in 37 minutes. Classmate Chelsea Hopkins contributed 13 points and seven assists, while center Malia Nahinu added 12 points on 5-of-7 shooting. Nahinu and Kiyana Stamps also both had four steals apiece.

The Broncos had a pair of two-point advantages to start the evening, but the two sides would trade leads five times within the first five minutes before the Aztecs went on a 6-0 run for a 14-9 lead. SDSU was also ahead by seven at 21-14, but the host squad retook the lead at 24-23 after three consecutive points from center Lauren Lenhardt.

The Aztecs did not make a field goal in the final 4:31 of the first half, but made good on seven trips to the free-throw line, converting six of them to head into the locker room up 31-26 after a Boise State jumper at the buzzer.

SDSU opened the second half on a 7-2 run and led by 10 points twice at 38-28 and again at 42-32. Boise State got to within four on a 3-pointer by Katie Isham with 14:30 to play. The visitors answered with three points in a row from freshman Erimma AmariKwa and seven points from Clements over a span of less than two minutes to build its largest advantage at 56-42.

Boise State cut it to eight points with under five minutes left, but the Aztecs made seven of 10 free throws in the final 1:38 to secure the 69-59 win.

FT. WORTH, TEXAS - The SDSU women's basketball team was limited to a season-low 39 points on just 23.4 percent shooting, as the Aztecs saw their 13-game win streak come to an end with a 58-39 loss at TCU. The defeat was the team's first in conference action, moving them to 7-1 in the league and 17-5 on the year, while the Horned Frogs improved to 12-11 and 5-3 in the MWC.

SDSU did not have a player score in double-figures with Malia Nahinu, Chelsea Hopkins and Kalena Tutt all finishing with eight points apiece. The conference's leading scorer, Aztec Courtney Clements was limited to a season-low four points on 2-of-8 shooting after missing most of the first half with foul trouble.

SDSU freshman Chairese Culberson recorded her second career double-figure rebounding effort with a team-high 10 rebounds, while Hopkins added seven to go with four assists and three steals.

After TCU scored the opening bucket, four different Aztecs accounted for the team's opening eight points. The sides combined for only 13 points through the first 10 minutes of the game as each team shot below 30 percent and had 12 turnovers between them.

SDSU held an early four-point advantage at 6-2, but the Horned Frogs regained the lead by utilizing a 6-0 run as the Aztec offense went scoreless for just over four minutes. Hopkins ended the drought with a lay-up off a steal and a pair of free throws to put the visitors back ahead 16-15 with 1:34 remaining. SDSU's Erimma AmariKwa and TCU's Latricia Lovings combined for the final seven points of the half, as the Aztecs went into the locker room in front 20-18.

The host squad came out of the break with a three-point play and the first triple by either side for its largest margin to that point at 24-20. SDSU finally got on the scoreboard on back-to-back baskets from Nahinu to tie the game at 24.

After it was even at 28-28, the Aztecs managed just one point over the next 7:11 as TCU went in front by 10 at 39-29. The Horned Frogs would eventually lead by as many as 21 points before securing the 58-39 win.
