AZTEC HEADLINES

San Diego State continues its homestand on Thursday, Dec. 19, when it squares off against Miami University (Ohio) at Viejas Arena. Game time is slated for 6 p.m. PT, and a live video stream featuring Chris Ello on play-by-play will be available at www. goaztecs.com.

Thursday's clash represents the inaugural meeting between the Aztecs and RedHawks, with the Scarlet and Black facing an opponent from the Mid-American Conference for just the eighth time in program history.

SDSU is coming off a narrow 56-55 loss to UCLA on Sunday, marking the fourth time this season that the Aztecs have been defeated by four points or less.

 Against the Bruins, senior Danesha Long tied her career-high with 13 points, including a personal-best three 3-pointers, while fellow classmate Cierra Warren contributed 12 points of her own to go with a season-high eight rebounds.

Warren has connected on 61.5 percent of her fieldgoal attempts (40-65), which tops the Mountain West and ranks 15th in the nation entering the week. The SDSU center is averaging a team-best 15.2 points per game and has broken the 20-point barrier on three occasions.

As a team, the Aztecs lead the MW with a 44.7 fieldgoal percentage, which ranked 43rd in the country heading into this week.

#AztecWBB Gearing Up for First-Ever Meeting with Miami Fresh off a heart-breaking defeat at home to UCLA on Sunday, San Diego State returns to the court on Thursday to take on Miami University (Ohio) in the first-ever encounter between the two squads at Viejas Arena. The Aztecs are 4-3 all-time against Mid-American Conference schools. SDSU last played a MAC team

2007, downing Western Michigan by a 77-72 count in consolation game of the San Diego Surf 'N Slam. In addition, Thursday's tilt will mark just the fourth time in program history that the Aztecs have faced a Divi-sion I opponent from the state of Ohio. SDSU dropped a home-and-away series with Toledo in 1997 and 1998, before defeating Dayton, 74-62, at the USC Women of Troy Invitational in December 2010. Conversely, Miami is 3-4 against teams from the state of California, having defeated CSU Bakersfield at home, 101 00, pp. 2010, 1020 for the Dedluwice' leat victory or an appropriate proceeding the Calden State

101-92, on Dec. 11, 2010, for the RedHawks' last victory over an opponent representing the Golden State. Miami has faced two foes in its history that were MW members at game time, claiming a 66-56 triumph at Air

Force in 2008, before posting a 62-49 victory over Nevada at the Caribbean Classic in Cancun, Mexico, in 2012.

Scouting the RedHawks

Miami (3-6) had its modest two-game winning streak snapped Tuesday night in a 76-61 loss at Long Beach State. Despite holding a 50-38 advantage in rebounds, the RedHawks were outscored by a 32-24 margin in the paint and a 28-12 spread in points off turnovers after committing 25 miscues.

Individually, senior Hannah Robertson scored a team-high 12 points against the 49ers; junior Kindsay Brandt contributed 11 points off the bench, while freshman Nicole Anderson pulled down a gamebest 15 rebounds.

For the season, Robertson is leading Miami with 12.7 points per game and has connected on a team-high 51.4 percent (18-35) of her three-point attempts, while Anderson tops the squad with 8.2 rebounds per outing.

After nine games, Miami is shooting just 38.9 percent from the floor as a team. However, the RedHawks have converted on 37.1 percent of their tries from beyond the three-point arc, which led the MAC and ranked 25th in the nation entering the week. Similarly, Miami has been solid at the free-throw line so far this season, converting 74 percent of its foul shots. Yet like San Diego State, the RedHawks have experienced ball-handling woes, commiting over six turnovers more per game than their opponents.

Miami also has a first-year head coach in Cleve Wright, who spent the previous 11 seasons at Division II Gannon University in Erie, Pa., where he transformed the Golden Knights into national power, guiding the team to NCAA tournament appearances in five of his last seven years at the school. During the 2009-10 campaign, Wright was named the NCAA Division II Coach of the Year after leading Gannon to a 37-1 record and a spot in the Final Four. In addition, the Lady Knights racked up a 31-5 mark under Wright's tutelage in 2012-13 and finished with a No. 6 national ranking.

Prior to assuming the reins at Gannon, Wright spent three seasons from 1999-2002 as the top assistant at Northwestern under June Olkowski, with whom he also coached for at Butler.

As an undergraduate, Wright played at Berea College, where he also competed in track and field before earning his bachelor's degree in 1989.

Stacie Terry last coached against a Mid-American Conference school while she was as an assistant at Illinois in December of 2006, when her Fighting Illini squad dropped a 69-63 decision on the road at Northern Illinois.

With a Victory...

An SDSU win over Miami on Thursday will mean:

- The Aztecs pick up their first victory at home under head coach Stacie Terry.
- SDSU raises its record to 5-3 against teams from the Mid-American Conference.
- The Aztecs improve to 32-12 in December games played since the 2006-07 campaign.

Dissecting the Slow Start

The fact that San Diego State sits at 1-6 can be at least partially attributed to the following factors:

►<u>Turnovers</u> - The Aztecs are committing nearly turnovers more per game (23.3-14.4) than their foes this season, compared to last year when they were just one of three teams in the Mountain West to finish with a positive turnover margin (+2.9), along with Fresno State and Colorado State. Opponents have capitalized on SDSU's miscues by maintaining a combined 167-86 advantage in points off turnovers.

► <u>Offensive Rebounds</u> - The Aztecs are getting outrebounded on the offensive glass by an average margin of 15.6-9.9 during the first seven games. As a result, SDSU's foes own a collective 110-55 advantage in second-chance points this year.

► <u>Three-Point Field Goals</u> - San Diego State's opponents have drained a staggering 51 three-pointers on the season for an average of 7.2 per game. The Aztecs have allowed opponents to shoot nearly 36 percent from beyond the arc, which ranks 303rd among 343 Division I teams entering the week. Conversely, the Scarlet and Black has connected on just 22 treys for the year and combined for just 14 in the ix games prior to the UCLA game.

► <u>Schedule</u> - The Aztecs have played one of the toughest schedules in the country so far this year, featuring a pair of games against AP Top 25 foes in No. 19 South Carolina and No. 23 Texas A&M. As of Dec. 18, SDSU's strength of schedule was rated fifth in the nation, according to Collegiate Basketball News, while realtimerpi.com ranked the Aztecs' slate the 11th toughest. Entering Thursday's contest, the combined record of SDSU's seven previous opponents stands at 46-18.

Experience - San Diego State's starting lineup against UCLA featured five players who have combined for just 28 starts in an Aztec uniform prior to Dec. 15. With that lack of experience, growing pains are certainly inevitable.

Despite the adversity, four of the Aztecs' six losses have come by a scant 12 points. The youthful SDSU squad has displayed much resiliency during the early part of the season, overcoming a nine-point deficit at UCSB and nearly

rallying from a pair of 19-point deficits at Sacramento State and USC. In fact, the Aztecs owned late leads at Sac State and against San Diego, only to cede go-ahead three-pointers by the opposition.

Decembers to Remember

The Aztecs are a combined 31-12 during December since 2006. Six of those losses came to teams either ranked or receiving votes in the national poll, including a defeat to No. 23 Texas A&M earlier this month and a setback to No. 14 Oklahoma State last year in the final of the San Diego Surf 'N Slam. The Aztecs have also come up short in previous years against No. 2 UConn, No. 7 Texas A&M, No. 17 George Washington and USC (rv). The other six defeats were vs. UCLA last Sunday, at Washington in 2012, at Washington State and against USD in 2011, vs. Pepperdine in overtime in 2009 and against Quinnipiac in the opener of the 2007 Surf 'N Slam. Of course, it should be noted that SDSU has played 31 of those 43 December contests at home.

The Last Time Out - SDSU vs. UCLA

San Diego State suffered its fourth nail-biting defeat of the season last Sunday, dropping a hard-fought 56-55 decision to UCLA at Viejas Arena.

The Aztecs rallied from a nine-point first-half deficit and had a chance to tie the game with five seconds left, trailing 56-54. However, junior Ahjalee Harvey's second free-throw attempt went awry after a successful make on her first shot, allowing the Bruins to escape.

With the loss, SDSU slips to 1-6 on the year, while UCLA moves to 4-5 overall.

The Aztecs were led by senior Danesha Long, who tied her career-high with 13 points on 5-of-9 shooting, including a trio of three-pointers, while fellow classmate Cierra Warren added 12 points and eight rebounds. SDSU also received key contributions from Harvey, who notched seven points, six rebounds and a season-best six assists, and sophomore Deidra Smith, who tied Warren for team-high honors with eight boards of her own.

Despite draining a season-best eight three-pointers as a team and dominating the glass with a hefty 45-25 rebounding advantage, including an 18-7 spread on the offensive side, the Aztecs were plagued by a rash of ball-handling mistakes and inconsistent free-throw shooting, committing 23 turnovers while connecting on just 5-of-11 tries from the charity stripe. UCLA capitalized on SDSU's foibles, outscoring their hosts 21-12 on points off turnovers and maintained a 10-4 edge in fast-break points.

After the Aztecs scored the first two baskets of the game on a jumper by sophomore Deajanae Scurry and a triple by Harvey, the Bruins uncorked a 13-0 blitz and eventually built a pair of nine-point leads, including a 21-12 advantage following a three-pointer by Nirra Fields with 8:58 remaining in the first half

SDSU responded with a 14-7 surge of its own as Long recorded eight points during the run, while junior Desi Culberson sank one of her two trevs on the afternoon, which trimmed the margin to 28-26 at the four-minute mark of the period. However, UCLA kept the Aztecs at bay, scoring the next six points on Luiana Livulo's jumper, a triple by Madeline Brooks and an Atonye Nyingifa free throw to regain an eight-point bulge at 34-26. SDSU promptly put a halt to the Bruin outburst when freshman Ariell Bostick buried a three-pointer with 27 seconds to go, giving the contest its 34-29 score at intermission.

The Aztecs rode the momentum into the second half, fashioning a 9-2 run during the first four minutes as a layup by junior Khristina Hunter nudged the Scarlet and Black in front, 38-36. After UCLA countered with another trey by Fields and a Nyingifa basket, SDSU tallied seven straight points on Long's jumper and three-pointer, followed by junior Erimma Amarikwa's layup, to reclaim a 45-41 advantage with 12:25 remaining.

However, the Bruins seized control of the game with a 9-0 run over the ensuing six-plus minutes as a jumper by Rhema Gardner at the 6:13 mark provided the visitors a 50-45 lead they would not relinquish. Moments later, Hunter single-handedly trimmed the deficit to one on a jumper and two free throws, but the Aztecs could never regain the upper hand.

After two Livulo free throws gave UCLA a 56-51 cushion with 2:44 left, Harvey came up huge with a triple on SDSU's next foray up the court, narrowing the gap to 56-54. The two sides alternated misses on the next four possessions when Smith corralled a rebound off an errant three-point attempt by Thea Lemberger with 12 seconds to go.

Harvey was fouled by Fields bringing the ball into the frontcourt and susbsequently went to the line with five ticks on the clock. The Aztec guard nailed her first shot, but misfired on the second as Fields grabbed the loose ball. With time all but gone, SDSU was forced to foul twice in order to send the

UCLA had three players finish in double figures, including Fields, who tossed in a game-high 18 points, highlighted by four three-pointers; Nylingifa totaled 13 points and eight rebounds, while Lemberger contributed 11 points and a game-best eight assists in the victory.

Noting the UCLA Game

 SDSU connected on a season-best eight 3-point baskets, doubling the previous high of four set against USD on Nov. 18.

■ The Aztecs outshot the Bruins .404-.393, marking the fourth time this season the Scarlet and Black posted a better field-goal percentage than the opposition and lost.

SDSU matched its season-low with five free throws made.

The Aztecs grabbed 45 rebounds, their second-highest total since collecting 51 boards at Sacramento State.

• Desi Culberson sank two 3-pointers on the game to give her 100 field goals made for her career.

• Khristina Hunter finished with four rebounds, marking the 14th straight game dating back to last season in which she has posted multiple boards.

• Deidra Smith established a career-high with eight rebounds.

• Cierra Warren handed out a personal-best three assists, while Chloe Johnson's two helpers were also a season-high.

Warren Tabbed MW Player of the Week

Senior Cierra Warren (Rancho Cucamonga, Calif.) was named the Mountain West Women's Basketball Player of the Week on Dec. 2 for her dominating performance in the Aztecs' 71-67 victory at UC Santa Barbara.

With her award, the SDSU center garnered her first career weekly conference accolade and the first for an Aztec player this season.

Against UCSB on Nov. 30, Warren scored a teamhigh 21 points on 9-of-10 (.900) shooting from the floor and a 2-for-2 effort at the free-throw line. She also added one assist, one block and a steal to help SDSU notch its first win of the season.

In the second half, Warren tallied 11 straight points, including the first three-point basket of her career, during a 22-9 run that overturned a 42-33 deficit and catapulted SDSU into the lead for good at 55-51. She also secured the game-clinching rebound after the Gauchos missed a potential game-tying three-pointer with nine seconds remaining in the contest.

AztecWBB Inks Pair to NLIs

San Diego State head coach Stacie Terry inked her first pair of recruits last week with the signing of Cheyenne Greenhouse (Riverside, Calif.) and Lexy Thorderson (Castle Rock, Colo.) to National Letters of Intent. The two high school seniors are set to join the Aztecs for the 2014-15 season.

Greenhouse signs with SDSU out of Canyon Springs High School, where she captured CIF Division 1A co-player of the year honors as a junior last season after leading the Cougars to the Southern Section championship and a berth in the semifinals of the CIF regional tournament.

A 5-11 guard, Greenhouse averaged 18.4 points,

5.5 rebounds, 2.4 assists and 2.1 steals during the 2012-13 campaign, earning first-team all-state CIF Division 1A recognition while landing a spot on Max-Preps all-state first team.

"Cheyenne is going to be very important to us because she has can play multiple positions," Terry said. She will add tremendous athleticism to our program with her great leaping ability. Cheyenne is also a very intelligent player and her basketball IQ is off the charts."

Greenhouse makes her signing official as a threestar recruit, according to ESPN HoopGurlz. A threetime all-Inland Valley League selection for head coach Gail Hale at Canyon Springs, Greenhouse also brings three years of club experience with her to The Mesa, having played for Cal Swish in 2011, followed by a two-year stint with the West Coast Premier program. She intends to study biology or pre-medicine at San Diego State.

Thorderson, meanwhile, garnered first-team all-Continental Leagues accolades as a junior last year at Rock Canyon High School after averaging a teambest 16.1 points to go along with 5.7 rebounds, 2.6 assists and 1.3 steals. Under the tutelage of head coach Robbie Ballard, the 6-0 guard/forward received Colorado 5A honorable mention all-state distinction on two occasions in 2011 and 2013.

In a game against eventual state champion Regis Jesuit last February, Thorderson scored 32 points to earn player of the game honors by MaxPreps. Earlier in the season, she also gained recognition as the Denver Post's female student-athlete of the week. "Lexy's addition will enable us to extend our offense because she is deadly from three-point range," Terry said. "Her ability to knock down that jumper will also help open up the game for our post players."

Thorderson, who also competed at the USA Basketball U16 national team trials in 2011, has a basketball pedigree in her family. Her father Eric Thorderson played collegiately at Wayne State (Mich.) from 1980-85, while two of her sisters, Ali and Abby, earned varsity letters at Weber State. She is undecided on a major at San Diego State, but is considering a career in physical therapy and physical education.

Noting the Newcomers

Of the 12 student-athletes on the current roster, five players will be wearing an Aztec uniform for the first time this season. Cierra Warren practiced with the squad last year but did not compete after transferring from Louisville, while Deidra Smith utilized her redshirt campaign as well, following her transfer from Boston College. In addition, sophomore Deajanae Scurry missed the latter half of the 2012-13 campaign to concentrate on academics.

With San Diego State losing nearly 67 percent of its scoring offense from a year ago, three true freshmen look to gain significant experience this season. Guard Ariell Bostick (Oakland, Calif.) led Bishop O'Dowd High School to a pair of CIF titles, while forward Alyssa Lawrence (New Rochelle, N.Y.) was an all-league and all-section honoree during her prep career. Not to be outdone, Chloe Johnson (Phoenix, Ariz.), who was named the Mountain West preseason freshman of the year, brings strong credentials with her to The Mesa after earning all-state honors for prep powerhouse St. Mary's High, which finished with a No. 1 national ranking in 2011-12.

Meet the New Staff

The talent at Viejas Arena is not just limited to the playing court as head coach Stacie Terry has assembled a prolific staff in her first season on The Mesa. Assistant coaches Jesse Clark, Aisha Veasley and Ciara Carl bring a vast array of experience with them to "America's Finest City", while Mike Bynum returns for his fourth season as the Aztecs' director of player development.

A native of Tacoma, Wash., Clark spent seven years as an assistant at Saint Mary's College, where he helped the Gaels to four straight WNIT berths, including a quarterfinal appearance in 2012-13. He also had stints at Stanford, San Francisco, CSU Bakersfield and Pacific Union.

Veasley, who enjoyed a successful playing career at UCLA, returns to her Southern California roots after two productive stops as an assistant at Tulsa and Colorado. While at CU, Veasley played a pivotal role as the team's recruiting coordinator, helping to land three top-40 classes.

Carl also has ties to the area, having graduated from Point Loma Nazarene and coaching with San Diego club teams. Most recently, she served an assistant at Metro State in Denver, Colo., following a two-year run at Division II power Cal Poly Pomona.

Aztecs Garner MW Preseason Honors

San Diego State received three preseason Mountain West individual honors on Oct. 15, as forward Erimma Amarikwa was named to the all-conference team, center Cierra Warren was selected newcomer of the year, while guard Chloe Johnson was tabbed the MW preseason freshman of the year.

As a team, the Aztecs were picked to finish third in the MW preseason poll, which was conducted in a combined panel of the league's 11 head coaches and select conference media members. SDSU collected 196 points and picked up two first-place votes, trailing second-place Wyoming, which received 212 points and four first-place votes, while preseason favorite Fresno State garnered 238 points and 17 first-place votes.

Basketball Performance Center On the Docket

San Diego State Director of Athletics Jim Sterk announced on Nov. 12 that a proposed 23,500-square-foot basketball performance center is under design, with a plan to break ground on the project in late spring 2014.

The \$14.5 million facility, which will be located just south of the Fowler Athletics Center and east of the football practice fields, will include two full-length courts, eight baskets, locker rooms, film rooms, team lounges, athletic training room and coaches locker rooms to help support the Aztec men's and women's championship basketball programs.

Although a majority of the funds have been pledged, fundraising continues for the project which is tentatively scheduled to be completed in 2015.

"This is an exciting day to be able to announce this project is moving forward," Sterk said. "It is a project that will greatly benefit our already successful men's and women's basketball programs. It is also an important day because we are going public with our drive to raise funds for the project and hope that the community that has enjoyed San Diego State basketball will get behind this project."

"The basketball performance center is more than just a building, it is our classroom," SDSU women's basketball head coach Stacie Terry said. "The facility will provide an opportunity for our student-athletes to enhance their individual games, which will in turn benefit our program. It also keeps San Diego State competing at the highest level not only in basketball, but in recruiting as well."

Two For The Show

Former SDSU All-Americans Courtney Clements and Chelsea Hopkins both earned roster spots with the WNBA this past season after completing their illustrious careers for the Scarlet and Black following the 2012-13 campaign. Clements joined the Atlanta Dream as a free-agent rookie last May, while Hopkins was signed by the San Antonio Silver Stars in September.

Clements appeared in 30 games for Atlanta in 2013, becoming the first former Aztec to compete for a WNBA title after the Dream advanced to finals against the eventual champion Minnesota Lynx. The Long Beach native totaled 59 points (2.2/gm) on the year to go with 26 rebounds, eight assists and five steals. Against the Seattle Storm on July 14, Clements recorded a season-best 12 points before logging season highs of five rebounds and 29 minutes played vs. San Antonio on Sept. 15.

Hopkins, meanwhile, averaged 14.3 minutes in three games during a late-season tour of duty with the Silver Stars, finishing with six points, six rebounds and five assists.

Up Next

Following Thursday's clash, SDSU will break for the Christmas holiday before playing host to the ninth annual San Diego Surf 'N Slam at the end of the month. The Aztecs will battle UC Riverside on Saturday, Dec. 28, beginning at 2 p.m. PT, while the other opening day matchup featuring Kansas State and North Carolina State immediately follows at 4:30 p.m. After an off-day, the consolation game and championship final will be held on Monday, Dec. 30, starting at 3:30 p.m. and 6 p.m. PT, respectively.

STACIE TERRY Head Coach First Season Texas-Arlington (1999)

Stacie Terry was named the eighth head coach in the history of the San Diego State women's basketball program on May 15, 2013. A native of San Diego, Terry gained a wealth of experience as an assistant coach at the Division I level over the past 14 years, including the last five under head coach Nikki Caldwell, who transformed UCLA into a powerhouse before restoring LSU to national prominence.

During Terry's two seasons at LSU, the Lady Tigers compiled a 45-23 overall record and earned two NCAA tournament bids, including a Sweet 16 appearance during the 2012-13 campaign. This past season, the Lady Tigers also posted six victories against ranked opponents and finished with their second-highest scoring average (69.0) in the last seven years. Under Terry's guidance, forward LaShondra Barrett garnered first-team all-Southeastern Conference accolades and received honorable mention All-America distinction in 2012 before becoming a first-round draft choice of the WNBA's Washington Mystics.

"I am honored and humbled to be the next head coach at San Diego State University," Terry said. "I want to thank Jim (Sterk) and his staff for this amazing opportunity. This is such a special place for me. Not only is this my dream job, but it is home. SDSU is a first class university that has all the resources in place to be successful. I am so eager to get started and confident that we can continue the winning tradition that Aztec supporters have become accustomed to both on and off the court."

Prior to her arrival at LSU, Terry served as an assistant under Caldwell at UCLA from 2008-11, helping the Bruins gain national acclaim with a pair of NCAA tournament appearances. During Terry's tenure, UCLA posted 72 overall victories, as the 2010-11 squad finished with a 28-5 record, setting a school record for fewest losses in a single season to go with a No. 7 national ranking. In addition, the Bruins signed the fourth-ranked recruiting class that season, according to ESPN HoopGurlz, while Terry helped mentor first-team all-Pac-10 performers in Doreena Campbell, Darxia Morris and Jasmine Dixon, a 2012 honorable mention AP All-America selection, as well as all-conference freshman honorees Atonye Nyingifa and Markel Walker.

Terry spent the 2007-08 campaign at Southern Mississippi, as the Golden Eagles posted a 21-14 record and earned a postseason berth in the Women's National Invitation Tournament (WNIT). While at Southern Miss, Terry spearheaded the development and coordination of the Lady Eagle recruiting campaign. Her responsibilities also included working with the perimeter players, scouting opponents and film breakdown, as well as coordinating all of the team's community service events.

Terry also coached for three seasons from 2004-07 as an assistant under Hall of Fame head coach Theresa Grentz at Illinois, where the Fighting Illini had three straight recruiting classes ranked among the top 25 in the nation, according to Blue Star Basketball, and made three consecutive trips to the WNIT. Her primary duties included defensive instruction and working with the perimeter players.

In addition, Terry coached at Dayton during the 2003-04 season following a three-year stint at Louisville from 2000-03. With the Cardinals, Terry's responsibilities encompassed recruiting, scouting, player development, summer camps and serving as a liaison for the program's community service outreach. Louisville captured the Conference USA regular-season title and earned a trip to the NCAA tournament in 2001 before making a WNIT appearance in 2002. She also assisted in signing the nation's 21st-ranked recruiting class in 2002-03, according to All-Star Girls Report. Terry recruited and coached all-Conference USA honoree Lori Nero, a draft choice of the WNBA's Houston Comets, as well as Sara Nord, who finished her collegiate career as the Cardinals' all-time assist leader and ranks among the top 15 scorers in school history.

Terry enjoyed a successful collegiate playing careerat Texas-Arlington, winning four varsity letters from 1994-98 under head coach Mike Dean. She earned firstteam all-Southland Conference honors after leading the Mavericks in scoring with 17.4 points per game as a senior in 1997-98. Terry scored 1,169 points during her career at UTA and still ranks among the school's top 10 in three-point field goals made (third), assists (sixth), steals (seventh) and free-throw percentage (10th). She is just one of 17 players in Maverick history to surpass the 1,000-point plateau, while her .335 career threepoint field-goal percentage is also a school and Southland Conference career record.

Terry played one season of professional basketball in Warsaw, Poland, averaging 12.0 points and 6.0 assists with the Polonia Phoenix, before returning to Texas-Arlington to begin her coaching career as a graduate assistant in 1999.

Terry, who graduated from El Capitan High, stills holds the Vaqueros' career scoring record and was inducted into the school's athletic hall of fame in 2008.
