SCENE SETTER (through games of Nov. 21)

- The third time is a charm. After the original schedule had the Aztecs slated to face Hawai'i in the final regular-season game of the season on Nov. 28 and a reissue schedule had SDSU playing at Fresno State on Nov. 27, San Diego State will instead play a non-conference contest at Colorado on Saturday (Nov. 28).
- The Aztecs and Buffaloes are meeting for the second time with Colorado winning the lone contest, 34-14, on Sept. 7, 2002 at Folsom Field. At the time, the Buffaloes were ranked 14th in both national polls.
- San Diego State is 5-1 in its last six games against Pac-12 competition, including two straight victories. The Aztecs have defeated a team from the Pac-12 Conference in each of the past four seasons (2016: California, 45-40; 2017 - No. 19 Stanford, 20-17; 2018 - No. 23 Arizona State, 28-21; 2019 - at UCLA, 23-14).
- Since the start of the 2016 season, San Diego State's 5-1 record and 83.3 winning percentage against Pac-12 competition is the best in the nation. That includes Pac-12 teams (USC owns the best record among league teams at 29-10, 74.4 percent). The next best record by a non-Pac-12 team against the league is Notre Dame's 5-3 record (62.5 percent).
- The game features one of the top defensive teams in the country (San Diego State - 3rd in overall, 8th in scoring, 7th in rushing, 12th in passing) against one of the best offenses (Colorado - 17th overall, 12th in scoring, 22nd in rushing, 44th in passing).
- Last Saturday, San Diego State was unable to overcome four starters lost due to injury - including both team captains - and a first-time starter in quarterback in a 26-21 setback at undefeated Nevada. Despite the obstacles, the Aztecs had first-and-goal inside the five in the game's closing moments, but was unable to convert in suffering the loss.
- With the offense struggling in the second half, the defense held the high-powered Wolf Pack offense to 140 yards in the second half, including four three-and-outs on its final six drives. Junior cornerback **Darren Hall**, who recorded a career-high 11 tackles and added two PBUs on the day, intercepted a pass with a little over three minutes to play deep in Nevada territory.
- Despite a second narrow loss this season, the Aztecs rank 18th nationally in scoring margin (+13.4). That is second in the Mountain West, trailing only San Jose State at +14.0. All three of SDSU's victories have come by at least 24 points.
- Since the start of the 2019 season, SDSU is 6-2 in road games. That is tied for the 11th-best record nationally and tops in the state of California.

The weekly show will give unprecedented access to the SDSU program and Hoke. *Aztec Football with Brady Hoke* which will be hosted by Mike Pomeranz, will consist of player and coach features, behind the scenes footage, X's and O's with Hoke, a

preview of the upcoming game, a recap of the last game and much more.

- San Diego State has rebounded from its five losses with a victory in its next game with an average margin of victory of 12.8 points in those games.
- SDSU has held 19 straight opponents to less than 450 yards of total offense (tied for the second-longest active streak).
- San Diego State's defense allows only 4.25 yards per play to rank second nationally. Other rankings of note: 3rd in total defense (269.4), 4th third down conversion defense (25.3), 7th in rushing defense (90.0), 8th in scoring defense (15.4), 11th in rushing offense (246.0), 11th in passing efficiency rating (111.41), 12th passing yards allowed (179.4), 14th in tackles for loss (8.0) and 21st in time of possession (32:46).
- SDSU's physical play can be shown in average rushing yards for and against. The Aztecs average 246.0 yards rushing (11th nationally) and 90.0 rushing yards allowed (7th nationally). San Diego State has outrushed six of its last seven opponents.

SEASON SETUP

- San Diego State is coming off a 10-3 campaign, culminating with a dominating 48-11 win over Central Michigan in the New Mexico Bowl. Among last season's highlights were the program's first-ever victory over UCLA (23 all-time meetings), a win over Brigham Young (first since 2005) and a 6-1 record in road/neutral games. SDSU spent three weeks in the Top 25 last season and ended the campaign at No. 31 in the final AP Poll.
- SDSU returns 16 starters (seven offense, eight defense and one kicker). Nine Aztec players on the defensive side of the ball have made at least nine career starts. Senior **Tariq Thompson** has 44 career starts (every game since arriving as a true freshman in 2017).
- Seventeen different Aztec players received preseason accolades, with nine players - sophomore kicker **Matt Araiza**, junior defensive end **Keshawn Banks**, junior tight end **Daniel Bellinger**, long snapper junior **Turner Bernard**, junior running backs/returner **Jordan Byrd**, sophomore guard **William Dunkle**, junior cornerback **Darren Hall**, sophomore defensive tackle **Cameron Thomas** and senior Warrior (safety) **Tariq Thompson** - on watch lists for national honors and/or named first-team all conference.
- The Aztecs are playing their 2020 and 2021 home games at Dignity Health Sports Park in Carson, Calif., while the University builds its future stadium in Mission Valley in the footprint of SDCCU Stadium. San Diego State is scheduled to play four games this season and seven games next year at DHSP, which is located 113 miles from the University's previous home stadium.

PROGRAM-AT-A-GLANCE

- SDSU's active consecutive streak of 10 straight bowl games is tied for the 11th-longest streak nationally. San Diego State is the only football team in the state of California - college or pro - to play in the postseason each of the last 10 years.
- SDSU is one of 13 schools and one of two Group of 5 schools in the nation to play in a bowl game each of the last 10 seasons.
- Since the start of the 2015 campaign, San Diego State is 52-20 record with a 72.2 percent winning percentage (11th nationally) and the Aztecs are 51-17 (75.0 percent) in winning percentage nationally (tied for ninth nationally) since Oct. 3, 2015.
- SDSU has four double-digit victory seasons in the last five years. Only 10 schools in the nation can say that - San Diego State, Alabama, Appalachian State, Boise State, Clemson, Georgia, Notre Dame, Ohio State, Oklahoma and Wisconsin.
- Since the start of the 2019 campaign, San Diego State is 10-1 in games decided by seven or more points.
- The Aztecs' last five losses came by a combined 29 points and eight of their last 10 losses have been by 11 points or less.
- San Diego State has 10 consecutive winning seasons, which is the second-longest streak in program history and the longest since a 17-year stretch from 1961-77.
- San Diego State is 51-17 in its last 68 overall games and 34-13 in its last 47 regular-season games against Mountain West opponents (36-13 against MW opponents, including conference championship games).
- The Aztecs are 13-9 in their last 22 games decided by eight points or less.

OFFENSIVE KEYS

- San Diego State is 47-3 the last 50 times it has rushed for 200 yards.
- The Aztecs are 64-14 since 2011 when committing one turnover or less, something SDSU has done in 15 of its last 18 games.
- San Diego State's 16 turnovers since the start of the 2019 are tied for the seventh fewest in the country (Oregon State, 10).
- SDSU had an advantage in time of possession in 14 of the last 18 games. Since 2011, the Aztecs are 28-6 when possessing the football for at least 35 minutes.

DEFENSIVE KEYS

- The Aztecs are 56-3 since 2011 when holding the opposition to 17 points or less. SDSU has held 10 of its last 12 opponents to 17 points or less.
- The Aztecs are 30-6 since 2011 when allowing less than 150 passing yards.
- San Diego State is 45-5 when holding the opposition to a 33.3 percent or less mark on third down.
- Since 2009, San Diego State's record broken down by opponent passing efficiency: less than 110: 54-7; between 110-150: 38-23; greater than 150: 5-22.
- Since the start of the 2015 campaign, SDSU is 32-1 when holding its opponent to a passing efficiency rating of below 110.

SPECIAL TEAMS / OVERALL TRENDS

- The Aztecs have are 34-2 the last 36 times when owning a turnover advantage.
- San Diego State is 13-1 the last 14 times it has an advantage in field position.
- Since the start of the 2015 season, San Diego State is tied (Kansas State and Memphis) for the most kickoff returns for touchdowns with 11.

SERIES NOTES

- Saturday marks the second meeting between the Aztecs and the Buffaloes with Colorado winning the lone meeting - 34-14 - on Sept. 7, 2002.
- The Aztecs have yet to play Colorado at home. This will be the second meeting with the Buffaloes in Boulder.
- Colorado was nationally ranked in the last meeting between the two schools at No. 14 in both national polls.
- Although the Aztecs lost, 34-14, in the only meeting between the two schools, the stats indicated a much closer game. Each team had 401 yards of offense with SDSU throwing for 359 and rushing for 42, while CU threw for 136 and ran for 265. SDSU also had more first downs (24-20), less penalties (3-7), most time of possession (31:20-28:40) and a better third-down conversion percentage (41.2 pct.-40.0 pct.). San Diego State, however, lost the turnover battle (2-1) and was 0-for-3 on fourth-down attempts.

SDSU-COLORADO CONNECTIONS

- Colorado head coach Karl Dorrell was head coach at UCLA from 2003-07 and crossed paths with SDSU offensive analyst Gary Bernardi, who worked with the offensive lines, tight ends and as the recruiting coordinator at UCLA from 1994-03.
- SDSU cornerbacks coach Demetrius Sumler played at Colorado from 2007-09, earning a bachelor's degree at CU in 2011. Colorado running backs coach Darian Hagan coached Sumler all three seasons.
- Colorado director of player personnel Bob Lopez was the director of operations at San Diego State from 2009-10 under Aztec head coach Brady Hoke and then at Michigan from 2011-14.
- SDSU graduate assistant coach Colin Lockett (cornerbacks) was an assistant coach at St. John Bosco High School while Colorado defensive tackle Na'im Rodman and long snapper Derek Bedell were on the team.
- CU director of quality control on defense Bryan Cook was a quality control specialist at Georgia Tech in 2018 while current Aztec quarterback Lucas Johnson was also at GTU (2017-19).
- SDSU defensive tackle Jonah Tavai and Colorado inside linebacker Quinn Perry both went to El Camino College prior to playing Division I.
- San Diego State defensive end Jalil Lecky and Buffalo cornerback Mekhi Blackmon each attended College of San Mateo.

BOULDER, Colo. (AP) -- Colorado lost concussion-plagued quarterback Craig Ochs but found an able replacement Saturday.

Robert Hodge, who logged only 10 offensive plays last season, subbed for Ochs in the second half and helped lead the 17th-ranked Buffaloes past San Diego State 34-14.

Ochs left at halftime with his third concussion in 14 months, but Hodge didn't miss a beat, guiding Colorado (1-1) to a pair of second-half scores - both by Chris Brown, who ran for 185 yards.

Adam Hall had a career night throwing the ball for San Diego State, completing 39 of 59 passes for 359 yards. But the Aztecs (0-2) came up empty on all five of their trips into Colorado territory in the second half. One possession ended with a missed field goal, while another was stopped by a sack on fourth down.

Rebounding from last week's loss to Colorado State, the Buffaloes extended their lead to 28-14 late in the third quarter after Jeremy Bloom returned a punt 31 yards to the San Diego State 44-yard line. Bobby Purify promptly broke off the left side on a 43-yard run, and Brown went the final yard on the next play.

With 51 seconds left, Brown bolted 38 yards up the middle for another score.

Ochs threw two touchdown passes as Colorado took a 21-14 halftime lead. The Buffs scored on their first two possessions for a 14-7 first-quarter advantage.

Brown carried five times for 46 yards, and Ochs hit wide-open tight end Beau Williams on a 22-yard touchdown pass for the game's first score.

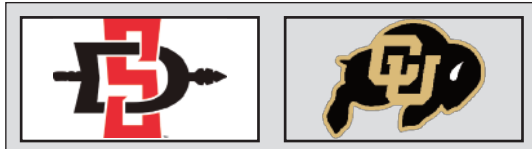
Making liberal use of the no-huddle offense, San Diego State countered with an 80-yard, 15-play scoring drive. Hall converted four third-down plays, including a 17-yard pass to Kassim Osgood on third-and-16, and Garric Simmons ran the final 4 yards for a 7-7 tie.

Colorado needed just three plays to reclaim the lead. Ochs avoided a sack and hit Derek McCoy down the left sideline at the 50. With blocking by receiver Jeremy Bloom, McCoy finished the 75-yard scoring play.

The Aztecs got a tying touchdown early in the second quarter after Heath Farwell downed a punt at the Colorado 1 and the Buffs couldn't get a first down. Freshman Michael Franklin ran 31 yards off the left side for the TD.

Midway through the period, Colorado scored on a fumble recovery. Franklin, who had never before returned punts, retreated under Mark Mariscal's 66-yard punt and grabbed the ball as it bounced into the end zone. Instead of downing it for a touchback, he picked it up and returned to the 8-yard line, where he was hit by Marcus Moore and fumbled. Akarika Dawn picked up the ball and scored with 7:43 left in the half.

After missed field goals by each team early in the third quarter, Bloom - whose 75-yard punt return for a touchdown ignited a second-half surge against Colorado State last week - had a 31-yarder to set up Brown's first score with 3:34 left in the period.

BULLET NOTES - OFFENSE

- San Diego State returns seven starters on offense this season - junior tight end Daniel Bellinger, junior running back Jordan Byrd, sophomore right guard William Dunkle, sophomore wide receiver Jesse Matthews, junior wide receiver Kobe Smith, senior left tackle Kyle Spalding and senior right tackle Zachary Thomas.
- Jeff Hecklinski is in his first season as offensive coordinator at San Diego State. Hecklinski was on Hoke's original SDSU staff in 2009 and 2010 as the assistant head coach, running backs coach and recruiting coordinator. He was also with Hoke at Michigan (2011-14) and Ball State (2004-08). He replaces Jeff Horton, who now serves as the associate head coach and running backs coach.
- Of all FBS schools that have played at least 40 games since 2015, San Diego State is third in fewest turnovers with 74 (LSU is first with 68).
- Since the beginning of last season, San Diego State's offense has run 1,283 plays and is responsible for just 11 turnovers and only two fumbles (one turnover every 116.6 offensive snaps).

OFFENSIVE NUMBERS

- The Aztecs are 39-4 the last 43 times they have scored at least 30 points.
- Since Oct. 3, 2015, San Diego State is 45-8 when scoring at least 20 points.
- SDSU is 22-5 since 2011 when getting at least 36 minutes of time of possession.
- Since the beginning of 2014, SDSU is 48-12 when committing one turnover or less and 11-14 when having two or more turnovers in the game. San Diego State had one turnover or less in 15 of 18 games.
- San Diego State has one turnover or less in 32 of its last 43 games.
- SDSU is 42-7 in the last 48 games when owning an edge in time of possession.
- RB Greg Bell ranks third in the Mountain West in total touchdowns (7, T-44th in FBS), tied for fourth in total points (42) and tied for sixth in points per game (8.40, T-50th in FBS).

RUSHING OFFENSE

- San Diego State is 47-2 the last 49 times it has rushed for at least 200 yards and is 44-1 in its last 45 regular-season games when rushing for 200-plus yards.
- San Diego State has a 100-yard rusher in 33 of its last 58 games since 2016 (42, 100-yard rushers total) and 42 of the last 72 games since 2015 (54, 100-yard rushers total). Since Jeff Horton arrived as the running back coach in 2011, SDSU has a 100-yard rusher in 78 of the 124 games and 94, 100-yard rushers overall.
- San Diego State had two rushers at New Mexico State (Jordan Byrd - 118 and Chance Bell - 116) on Sept. 14, 2019 for the 30th time in program history. The Aztecs are 29-1 in those occasions, including a 19-game win streak. SDSU has multiple 100-yard rushers nine times in the last 53 games.
- RB Greg Bell ranks 13th in FBS in rushing yards per game (113.00, 2nd in MW), 28th in rush yards per carry (6.01, 2nd in MW), tied for 38th in rushing touchdowns (6, 3rd in MW), 42nd in rushing yards (565, 1st in MW) and 44th in all-purpose yards per game (127.40, 5th in MW).
- G. Bell became SDSU's 80th different 100-yard rusher with 111 yards vs. UNLV in the 2020 opener on Oct. 24. He then followed with 157 yards at Utah State, 109 yards vs. San Jose State and a career-high 160 yards vs. Hawai'i.
- G. Bell's 160 yards against Hawai'i on Nov. 14 were the most by an Aztec since Rashaad Penny had 221 vs. Army West Point in the 2017 Armed Forces Bowl (Dec. 23).
- G. Bell is the first Aztec in program history to start his Aztec career with three straight 100-yard rushing games (ended up with four straight).
- G. Bell is one of 10 Aztecs in program history with four consecutive 100-yard rushing games.
- G. Bell has five 100-yard rushing games in nine career Division I games.
- RB Chance Bell is tied for fifth in the Mountain West in rushing touchdowns (3).
- RB Jordan Byrd's 9.6 yard rush average ranks third in FBS play this season (min. 19 attempts).
- Byrd had a 73-yard touchdown at Utah State on Oct. 31, the longest by an Aztec since Rashaad Penny's 81-yard touchdown run against Army West Point in the 2017 Armed Forces Bowl (Dec. 23).
- QB Lucas Johnson's 10.0 YPC average ranks third in the country among quarterbacks (min. 8 att.).
- If you take away the two times Johnson has been sacked (for 13 yards) this year, he has rushed six times for 93 yards (15.5 avg.).
- Johnson had a 35-yard run at Nevada on Nov. 21, which was the longest by an Aztec quarterback since Ryan Katz had a 67-yarder at Fresno State on Sept. 29, 2012 and the third longest by a SDSU QB since at least 1996.
- If you take away the seven times QB Carson Baker has been sacked (for 53 yards) this year, he has rushed 17 times for 58 yards (3.4 avg.).

PASSING OFFENSE

- Since the start of the 2017 season, San Diego State has thrown 20 interceptions. That is tied for the third-fewest picks in the nation over that span (min. 35 GP). In contrast, Temple has thrown 58 interceptions over that span, which is the most since 2017.
- QB Carson Baker picked up the win in his first career start (and appearance) against Brigham Young on Nov. 30, 2019, going 19-for-24 for 172 yards and a touchdown without throwing an interception. Baker became just the second quarterback in the Aztecs' Division I history (since 1969) to win in his starting debut having never previously thrown a collegiate pass (also Joe Davis vs.

Arkansas State on Sept. 12, 1976) and the first SDSU quarterback to start in a game having never previously thrown a pass since Ryan Lindley started on Aug. 30, 2008 vs. Cal Poly. Baker also became the fourth straight San Diego State quarterback to win in his starting debut, joining Maxwell Smith (Aug. 30, 2015 vs. San Diego), Christian Chapman (Dec. 5, 2015 vs. Air Force in the Mountain West Championship game) and Ryan Agnew (Sept. 15, 2018 vs. No. 23/25 Arizona State). Aztec quarterbacks were 1-13 in the previous 14 debuts prior to this stretch. He finished with the most completions (19) by an Aztec quarterback in his starting debut since Lindley's 27 completions in the Cal Poly game on Aug. 30, 2018 and most completions in a SDSU win in his debut since Tim Gutierrez had 32 in a 48-17 win over Minnesota on Sept. 25, 1993.

- Baker went 103 passes to start his career without throwing an interception (threw one on his 104th attempt).
- Baker ranks seventh in the Mountain West in passing yards (591), completion percentage (57.89), pass efficiency rating (114.26) and yards per attempt (6.22), eighth in yards per completion (10.75) and ninth in passing yards per game (118.20).
- WR Kobe Smith had back-to-back 100-yard receiving games last year, the first Aztec to do so since Ezell Ruffin had three straight in 2013.
- WR Jesse Matthews ranks ninth in the Mountain West in yards per reception (16.9).
- Matthews had six catches for a career-high 139 yards against San Jose State, his third 100-yard game (all over a seven-game stretch). For his efforts, Matthews was named to the Pro Football Focus National Team of the Week.
- Smith and Matthews are two of 41 players in program history with at least three 100-yard receiving games.
- Matthews finished with 19 catches and 340 yards (85.0 ypg) over his final four games of 2019.
- Among freshmen in SDSU single-season history, Matthews ranked second in receptions (48) and third in receiving yards (633) last year.
- Matthews had the fifth-most catches (48) in the country without a dropped pass last year (according to Pro Football Focus).

BULLET NOTES - DEFENSE

- Kurt Mattix is in his first season as defensive coordinator at San Diego State. He previously served as defensive coordinator at Eastern Kentucky and worked with Hoke at Michigan.
- San Diego State's returns nine starters off a team that finished second in the nation in scoring defense and fifth in the national in total defense a year ago. Starters that are back for the Aztecs are senior linebacker Andrew Aleki, junior defensive end Keshawn Banks, junior cornerback Darren Hall, senior cornerback Tyler Hawkins (played safety last year), senior Aztec Dwayne Johnson Jr., junior linebacker Caden McDonald, sophomore defensive tackle Cameron Thomas, senior warrior Tariq Thompson and senior warrior Trenton Thompson.

DEFENSIVE NUMBERS

- The Aztecs went five straight games of holding their opponent under 300 yards of total offense prior to last week at Nevada. It was the longest active streak in FBS at the time.
- SDSU has gone 19 straight games keeping its opponents under 450 yards of total offense, tied with Buffalo for the second-longest active streak in FBS behind Utah (20).
- SDSU went 41 straight quarters without allowing more than one score from Oct. 12, 2019 until Nov. 6, 2020. It was the longest streak in FBS play since Alabama had a 46-quarter streak from 2011-12.
- The Aztecs have allowed just 171 points over the last 50 quarters (3.42 points per quarter).
- Last year SDSU allowed 165 points (12.7 ppg) and 3,741 yards (288.7 ypg). In the last year before Brady Hoke and Rocky Long took over the program (2008), San Diego State allowed 446 points (37.2 ppg) and 5,529 yards (460.8 ypg).
- The Aztecs allowed just 165 points last season in 13 games (12.7 ppg), their fewest allowed in a season since yielding 165 in 1977 in 11 games (15.0 ppg). The 12.7 points allowed per game were their fewest allowed since giving up 11.4 points per game in 1976 and the fourth fewest allowed in SDSU's Division I history (since 1969).
- SDSU has allowed just 242 points over the last 18 games (13.4 ppg).
- SDSU has held an opponent scoreless on its opening drive 54 times since 2015 (72 games).
- Opponents last year had 149 drives where they tried to score on SDSU's defense (excludes kneel downs to end half/game). The Aztecs forced three-and-outs (or better) in 65 of those drives (43.6 pct.). SDSU averaged 5.00 three-and-outs per game).
- This year there have been 63 drives where opponents have tried to score on SDSU's defense. The Aztecs have forced three-and-outs (or better) in 32 of those drives (50.8 pct.). SDSU is averaging 6.40 three-and-outs per game.
- Of the last 67 fourth-down chances against the Aztec defense dating back to 2016, opponents have converted just 25 times (37.3 pct.).
- WAR Tariq Thompson has played in 44 straight games, the longest streak on the defense and tied for the longest streak on the team.
- Ta. Thompson has the most consecutive starts among any offense or defense player on the team (44).
- Ta. Thompson's 44 career games are also the most among any Aztec on the defensive side of the ball.
- Ta. Thompson is tied for fifth all-time at SDSU in fumble recoveries (5) and tied for sixth in forced fumbles (6) (also tied for 11th among active FBS players).
- Ta. Thompson tied for sixth in SDSU single-season history last year in fumble recoveries (3).
- LB Caden McDonald was named for 10th in the Mountain West in tackles for loss per game (1.30, T-54th in FBS).
- McDonald was the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 26 for his play against UNLV (Oct. 24), when he posted career highs of eight tackles, three tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks after entering the season with 36 tackles, 5.5 tackles for

- LB Michael Shawcroft is tied for the Mountain West lead in fumble recoveries (2, T-4th in FBS).
- LB Andrew Alves and DE Keshawn Banks rank in a tie for fourth in the Mountain West (T-49th in FBS) with one fumble recovery.

RUSHING DEFENSE

- Opponents rushed 356 times against the Aztecs last year and only five attempts were longer than 20 yards (1.4 pct.). This year opponents have rushed 147 times with three attempts longer than 20 yards (2.0 pct).
- LB Seyddrick Lakalaka leads the Aztecs with 16 tackles on rushing plays.

PASSING DEFENSE

- Since the beginning of the 2015 campaign, San Diego State's 96 interceptions are the second most in the country, while its 11 interception returns for touchdowns are tied for ninth in the country.
- WAR Tariq Thompson is second among active FBS players in interceptions (12), third in SDSU's Division I history (since 1969) and tied for fifth overall in program history.
- CB Darren Hall tied for second in SDSU single-season history with 16 pass breakups a year ago, six behind Marlon Andrews (22 in 1990).
- LB Caden McDonald is seventh in the Mountain West in sacks per game (0.90, T-29th in FBS).
- LB Segun Olubi ranks in a tie for seventh in the Mountain West in interceptions per game (0.25).
- Hall lead the Aztecs with 21 tackles on pass plays.

BULLET NOTES - SPECIAL TEAMS

- ESPN Team Efficiencies ranked San Diego State's special teams unit as the 23rd best in the country in 2015, 13th in 2016, 28th in 2017, 55th in 2018 and 10th in 2019.
- Former SDSU captain Doug Deakin is in his 10th season with the program and his third as special teams coordinator.
- Since the start of the 2015 season, San Diego State has 11 kickoff returns for touchdowns, tied for the most in FBS play over that time (tied with Kansas State and Memphis). To put that stat into perspective, 28 other teams have played at least 60 games over that span and do not have a single kick return touchdown.
- K Matt Araiza set a school single-season record with 22 field goals in 2019, surpassing John Baron II's 21 in 2016, and tied for fifth in field goal percentage (84.62).
- For his career, Araiza ranks third at SDSU in field goal percentage (.824) (min. 25 att.) and 13th among active FBS kickers.
- Araiza has made the third-most PATs (46) without a miss in program history, only trailing Donny Hageman (94 from 2014-15) and Marco Morales (50 from 1982-83).
- Araiza made a field goal in 17 straight games before not attempting one at Nevada on Nov. 21. The 17 straight games with a field goal was the second-longest active streak.
- Araiza has multiple field goals in 10 of his 18 career games.
- Araiza leads the Mountain West in PAT percentage (1.000, T-1st in FBS), kickoff average (64.79, T-7th in FBS), kickoff touchback percentage (71.43, T-11th in FBS), kickoff touchbacks (20, T-29th in FBS), kickoff yards (1,814, 51st in FBS) and kickoffs (28, T-57th). Araiza also ranks tied for second in field goals (6, T-53rd in FBS), sixth in field goal percentage (75.00, T-38th in FBS), seventh in field goals per game (1.20, T-47th in FBS) and tied for eighth in points (36).
- Among freshmen kickers in the country last year, Araiza ranked first in field goals (22), and was third in field goal percentage (84.62) and eighth in points by kickers (94).
- Araiza was one of only five kickers in FBS play last year to make at least one field goal in every game (min. 12 games).
- P Tanner Kuljian leads the Mountain West in punt average (48.44, 3rd in FBS), and ranks third in total punt yards (872), tied for fourth in punts inside the 20-yard line (6, T-73rd in FBS), tied for sixth in total punts (18), seventh in net punt average (39.67, 45th in FBS), eighth in punt yards per game (174.40) and ninth in punts per game (3.60).
- Kuljian had a 70-yard punt against San Jose State on Nov. 6, 2020, which is the longest by an Aztec since Brian Stahovich's school-record 89-yard punt at Wyoming on Oct. 30, 2010, tied for the 10th longest in program history and tied for the 11th longest in FBS play this season.
- Kuljian averaged 52.5 yards per punt (eight punts for 420 yards) at Nevada on Nov. 21, tied for the fourth-best mark in SDSU single-game history.
- PR Jesse Matthews ranks second in the Mountain West in punt return average (10.71, 14th in FBS).
- KR/PR Jordan Byrd ranks fourth in the Mountain West in kick return average (23.75, T-25th in FBS), and seventh in both punt return average (4.86, 38th in FBS) and combined kick return yards (224, 50th in FBS).
- KR Kaegun Williams returned a kickoff 95 yards for a touchdown at San Jose State on Oct. 19, 2019, SDSU's first kick return for a touchdown since Juwan Washington had one vs. Army West Point in the 2017 Armed Forces Bowl (Dec. 23).
- Trenton Thompson ranks in a tie for fourth in program history in blocked kicks (2).

LAST TIME OUT

Nevada 26, San Diego State 21
Nov. 21, 2020 | Mackay Stadium | Reno, Nev.

RENO, Nev. -- San Diego State was unable to convert on fourth-and-goal from the Nevada 5-yard line in the late moments and had to settle for a 26-21 loss Saturday in Reno, Nev.

With the Aztec (3-2, 3-2 MW) offense sputtering in the second half, SDSU caught a break when Darren Hall picked off Wolf Pack (5-0, 5-0 MW) quarterback Carson Strong on the UN 26-yard line with 3:23 remaining in the game.

San Diego State picked up two first downs on runs by Chance Bell to get to the Nevada 4-yard line. On first down, Aztec quarterback Lucas Johnson's pass attempt to Jesse Matthews in the left-corner of the end zone was batted down by Wolf Pack cornerback Berdale Robins. On second down, UN stopped Chance Bell for a 1-yard loss. On third-and-goal from the 5, Johnson's throw to a crossing Matthews was just behind him, setting up the fourth-and-goal situation. Following a timeout, Johnson's pass attempt to the left side of the end zone sailed over Kobe Smith's head, setting up a Nevada kneel down.

SDSU appeared in control in the first half, where it racked up 252 yards on 28 plays (9.0 yards per play) and 13 first downs, while punting once.

The Wolf Pack stuck first on a 31-yard field goal by Brandon Talton with 8:37 left in the first quarter.

San Diego State answered with a 35-yard run by Johnson. The first career rushing touchdown for Johnson came right after a 35-yard pass to a diving Jesse Matthews on third-and-5.

After another field goal by Talton (33 yards), the Aztecs marched 75 yards on seven plays, ending on a 7-yard pass from Johnson to Smith.

Talton's third field goal (22 yards) brought UN to within five at 14-9 with 9:55 remaining in the second quarter.

Following a SDSU punt, Nevada went 86 yards on eight plays, culminating with a 2-yard pass by Strong to Cole Turner. The Wolf Pack was helped by three San Diego State penalties on the drive, including a roughing the passer on third-and-10 from the UN 14, a face mask call inside the Aztec 10 and a pass interference call in the end zone.

Unfazed, SDSU drove 64 yards on just six plays thanks to a returning Greg Bell. Greg Bell, who entered the game with four straight 100-yard rushing games, injured his ankle on the third play of the game and was questionable to return. On the drive, Bell rushed for 35 yards on five attempts, including a 2-yard score to give San Diego State a 21-16 lead at intermission.

The Aztecs, however, struggled offensively in the second half, gaining just 41 yards on 32 plays (1.3 yards per play) and three first downs, punting seven times.

Nevada took the lead for good on its first drive of the second half on Strong's 50-yard pass to Romeo Doubs. The Wolf Pack later added a fourth field goal by Talton (27 yards) to finish up the scoring in the game.

SDSU went three-and-out on five straight drives to start the second half before a 13-yard pass by Johnson to Smith gave San Diego State a first down. The drive stalled, however, and the Aztecs had to punt once again.

Hall's interception late in the fourth quarter gave SDSU some hope, but San Diego State was unable to get into the end zone.

Johnson was 14-for-24 in the game for 184 yards and a touchdown, including five passes for 80 yards to Matthews.

Hall led the Aztec defense with a career-high 11 tackles (10 solo), an interception and two pass breakups, while sophomores Michael Shawcroft (eight tackles) and Patrick McMorris (seven tackles) each set career highs in tackles.

SDSU held Nevada to its fewest points (26) and total yards (376) for the season

FOUR AZTECS NAMED TO MW PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE TEAM

Four San Diego State football players were named to the 2020 Mountain West Preseason All-Conference Team, the league announced in July. All four selections - sophomore Cameron Thomas (Carlsbad, Calif./Carlsbad High), junior Keshawn Banks (Rio Rancho, N.M./Rio Rancho High), senior Tariq Thompson (San Diego/St. Augustine High) and junior Darren Hall (Pasadena, Calif./Rancho Cucamonga High) - were on the defensive side of the ball, SDSU's most on defense in the history of the league (since 1999).

The four preseason all-MW picks are four of the eight starters returning for an Aztec defensive unit that led the conference and ranked second in FBS in scoring (12.7) and rushing (75.4), fifth in total (287.8) and sixth in pass efficiency (110.25). San Diego State finished 10-3 in 2019, the program's fourth double-digit win campaign over the last five years.

The all-conference team and preseason poll are voted on by media representatives who cover the conference. Yesterday, SDSU was picked to win the West Division of the MW, garnering 19 of the 21 first-place votes. The last three times the Aztecs were picked to win the West Division (2015-17) they won at least 10 games and captured a pair of league titles (2015-16).

Thomas, who is on the preseason watch list for the Chuck Bednarik Award (defensive player of the year) and the Bronko Nagurski Trophy (national defensive player of the year), totaled 49 tackles a year ago as a redshirt freshman, including 9.0 tackles for loss, 5.5 sacks, two pass breakups and 13 quarterback hurries. Thomas racked up numerous postseason awards in 2019, including freshman second-team All-America accolades from The Athletic and first-team all-MW honors. Thomas, who was the only freshman on the all-MW first team (offense or defense), also was chosen as San Diego State's defensive lineman of the year and shared outstanding freshman accolades with wide receiver Jesse Matthews.

Thomas also has been named a preseason all-MW first-team selection by Athlon Sports, Phil Steele Magazine and College Football News. He's also been rated as the second-best player in the MW and SDSU's best defensive player by CFN, and one of San Diego State's five-best returning players by ESPN.

Playing alongside Thomas in the front three, Banks, meanwhile, had 43 tackles last year as a true sophomore, including a team-

high 13.5 tackles for loss for 50 yards, 4.5 sacks for 26 yards, a pass breakup and nine quarterback hurries. For his efforts, he was named a second-team all-MW selection.

This preseason Banks has also been named a preseason all-MW first-team pick by Athlon Sports, Phil Steele Magazine and College Football News. He's also the 16th-rated player in the MW and SDSU's fourth-best defensive player by CFN, and one of San Diego State's five-best returning players by ESPN.

Thompson continued to rack up the preseason accolades, a year after registering 55 tackles (44 solo) to go along with three tackles for loss, a sack, four interceptions, eight pass breakups, two forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries (tied for sixth in Aztec single-season history). Thompson earned second-team all-Mountain West accolades for a third consecutive season.

So far this preseason, Thompson has landed on the watch lists for the Bednarik Award and Jim Thorpe Award (best defensive back), and preseason first-team all-MW picks by Athlon Sports, Phil Steele Magazine and College Football News. Additionally, Thompson has been deemed the sixth-rated player in the MW and SDSU's second-best defensive player by CFN, and one of San Diego State's five-best returning players by ESPN.

Finally, Hall joined Thomas, Banks and Thompson on the preseason all-MW team after 49 tackles (34 solo) last year, as well as 3.5 tackles for loss, 1.5 sacks, two forced fumbles, a fumble recovery returned for a touchdown, an interception and a team-high-tying 16 pass breakups. His 16 pass breakups tied for the most in the country, and he also ranked in a tie for sixth in pass deflections (INT + PBU) per game (1.42) and tied for 10th in total passes defended (17). Additionally, his 16 PBUs tied Barcoo (2019) and Ron Smith (2017) for the second most in San Diego State single-season history.

Hall, who landed on the Jim Thorpe Award Watch List with Thompson, also has been selected as a preseason first-team all-MW picks by Athlon Sports, Phil Steele Magazine and College Football News. He's also been deemed SDSU's fifth-best defensive player by CFN and one of San Diego State's five-best returning players by ESPN.

Notes: San Diego State's four preseason all-MW selections tied for the second most in the league ... The Aztecs' four all-league selections matched their most since the 2016 season ... SDSU has at least three all-MW picks in six straight years after doing so just four times over the previous 10 years (2005-14) ... San Diego State's defensive selections are their most in league history (since 1999) ... The Aztecs have at least one defensive player on the preseason all-MW team in nine of the last 10 seasons ... SDSU did not have a preseason offensive player for the first time since 2008 after having multiple players the previous five seasons ... WAR Tariq Thompson (three-time second-team all-MW pick) is on the preseason all-MW team for a third straight season, the first Aztec in league history to make a preseason team three different seasons ... DT Cameron Thomas is just the second Aztec sophomore on defense to make a preseason all-MW team (also Thompson in 2018) ... Thomas and Banks are the first SDSU defensive linemen on the preseason all-MW team since Alex Barrett in 2016, just the third and fourth since 2006 (Antwan Applewhite), and the fourth and fifth in league history (Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila in 1999) ... SDSU has two defensive linemen on the preseason team for the first time in MW history ... CB Darren Hall is the first Aztec cornerback on the preseason all-MW team since two-time MW Defensive Player of the Year Damontae Kazee made the teams in 2015 and 2016

FOOTBALL RELEASES START TIMES, TV DETAILS FOR 2020

The San Diego State football team and the Mountain West announced start times and national television details. The Aztecs are set to play five times on CBS Sports Network, once on FS1, once on ESPN Networks (ABC, ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU or ESPN3) and once on Spectrum Sports.

Additionally, six of the team's eight regular-season games are set for Saturday with the two exceptions being Friday contests. SDSU's five games on CBS Sports Network all have start times, including home contests vs. UNLV on Oct. 24 (7:30 p.m. PT), San José State on Friday, Nov. 6 (6 p.m. PT) and Colorado State on Dec. 5 (7:30 p.m. PT). San Diego State will also play road games on the network on Oct. 31 at Utah State (7:30 p.m. MT) and Nov. 21 at Nevada (12:30 p.m. PT).

The Aztecs also have a start time for their home game against Hawai'i on Nov. 14, which will be begin at 1 p.m. PT on Spectrum Sports.

SDSU's Friday game at Fresno State on Nov. 27 will be broadcast on FS1 at 6 p.m. PT. Additionally, San Diego State's regular-season finale at Brigham Young on Dec. 12 will air on either ABC, ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU or ESPN3 at a time still to be determined.

The Mountain West Championship game will be played on Dec. 19 and will be broadcast on either FOX or FS1.

AZTECS NAME TEAM CAPTAINS

The San Diego State football program has named seniors Dominic Gudino (Chula Vista, Calif.) and Dwayne Johnson Jr. (Murrieta, Calif.) as its captains for the 2020 campaign.

The Aztecs' projected starting center this season, Gudino has played in 24 games during his career, highlighted by 16 starts. As a junior in 2019, the Olympian High School alumnus was expected to redshirt after logging his minimum of four game appearances but was forced into the starting lineup at left guard for an injured Daishawn Dixon at Hawai'i. Ultimately, he saw action in six of 13 games last year, making his other start at right guard in SDSU's victory at New Mexico State.

In 2017, Gudino earned his first career start at right guard in a win vs. Northern Illinois, becoming the first Aztec true freshman to start on offense since future fullback Nick Bawden started at quarterback at Fresno State on Oct. 3, 2013.

Johnson, meanwhile, enters his second year as a starter at the Aztec position (safety) in SDSU's 3-3-5 defense, garnering preseason second-team all-Mountain West accolades by Athlon Sports to go with third-team distinction by Phil Steele Magazine. Despite logging just 14 starts in 38 games, the Vista Murrieta High product has led the team or tied for the team lead in tackles six times during his career.

As a junior in 2019, Johnson started all 13 games, receiving honorable mention all-MW recognition after posting 92 tackles (54 solo, 1.5 TFL) one forced fumble, two fumble recoveries, one interception and five pass breakups. His 92 tackles last year ranked second on the squad and were 37 more than the Aztecs' No. 3 finisher, while his two fumble recoveries were tied for fourth in the conference.

In addition, Johnson was named to the Pro Football Focus Mountain West Team of the Week three times last season, including an exceptional performance in the home opener vs. Weber State when he recorded a game-high 12 tackles and 1.5 tackles for loss.

SDSU HOLDS GROUNDBREAKING CEREMONY FOR AZTEC STADIUM

San Diego State University held a groundbreaking ceremony on Aug. 7 to celebrate the university officially assuming ownership of the Mission Valley stadium site and commemorate the launch of a new era for the greater San Diego region.

Anchored by Aztec Stadium, the new home for the San Diego State football program, SDSU Mission Valley will deliver immense benefits to the community for generations to come. Upon breaking ground, one of the first major construction projects to undergo development, in addition to the River Park, will be the highly anticipated stadium, which is scheduled for completion in the fall of 2022.

"We are building a stadium for Aztec football, international and professional soccer, concerts, and any other event you can think of," said SDSU Athletic Director John David Wicker. "A world-class 35,000-capacity stadium designed to offer the amenities fans expect today. This is the most important sports and entertainment venue in San Diego since Petco Park and will be available 365 days a year for our campus and community."

In addition to the significant land development, the project will be transformational for the community. SDSU Mission Valley is projected to expand the university's economic impact in the region by \$3 billion annually. Along with football, Aztec Stadium will have the capability to host select SDSU men's and women's soccer matches, as well as women's lacrosse games.

"What happens on the ground right here, beneath our feet will elevate San Diego State and elevate San Diego in ways that we can't possibly imagine," said San Diego Mayor Kevin Faulconer. "San Diegans should take great satisfaction in knowing that the future of this land is finally set as a place where education, athletics, and the community will thrive side by side for generations to come."

Collectively, SDSU Mission Valley will create new educational experiences, foster research, advance technology, facilitate internships, and provide new educational opportunities. The outcome of this expansion will allow the university to gradually increase enrollment by up to 15,000 students.

"Today marks a milestone moment for San Diego State University and the City of San Diego," said SDSU President Adela de la Torre. "With today's groundbreaking, we begin the work to expand SDSU's educational, research, and entrepreneurial missions. SDSU Mission Valley also addresses the realities of the past few months and the need for new streams of revenue to support higher education opportunities for all."

As a result of the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, and as the stadium site is now an active construction site, the event was not open to the general public as initially intended. Instead, the number of in-person speakers and invited guests was restricted to maintain full compliance with the county's public health guidelines. Prior to the groundbreaking event, SDSU organizers consulted closely with the San Diego County Health and Human Services Agency to ensure said guidelines were observed.

Tom McCarron, San Diego State's senior vice president for SDSU Mission Valley, kicked off the event expressing his gratitude. He acknowledged the collective years-long efforts of all those involved in the project, from conception to realization for their critical and steadfast support.

"This is truly a momentous day in the history of our university and the City of San Diego," McCarron said. "Today we celebrate the commencement of construction of SDSU Mission Valley, Aztec Stadium, and the River Park."

Additional remarks were made both in-person or via video by California State University (CSU) Board of Trustees members Adam Day and Jack McGrory; San Diego City Council members Georgette Gómez and Barbara Bry; interim vice president for research Hala Madanat; Aztec Stadium donor, Dianne Bashor; chair of The Campanile Foundation, Jerry Sanders; SDSU Associated Students president Christian Holt; and alumni and long-time SDSU supporter, Nikki Clay.

The groundbreaking ceremony concluded with the participants taking part in a ceremonial first "shovel in the ground."

Construction will begin in earnest by Clark Construction with grading and infrastructure work, paving the way for the stadium and River Park construction. Clark Construction is expected to employ an estimated 3,500 to 5,550 workers through both the stadium and site development.

The San Diego State football program has made 10 straight bowl game appearances and is one of 10 schools nationally to win at least 10 games in four of the last five seasons. The Aztecs have called SDCCU Stadium home since 1967 and have compiled a 221-113-6 (.659) record at the facility in that span.

Big Notes

- SDSU has gone 34 straight quarters without allowing more than one score. The last time San Diego State allowed multiple scores in a quarter was the second quarter vs. Wyoming on Oct. 12, 2019. The Aztecs have allowed just 100 points over the last 34 quarters (2.94 points per quarter).
- The six points allowed by the Aztecs were their fewest given up in a conference game since shutting out Hawai'i, 52-0, on Nov. 5, 2016.
- UNLV was just 1-for-15 on third down against SDSU. The 6.7 third-down conversion percentage was the lowest since Sept. 24, 2005 against San José State (0-for-17).
- SDSU improved to 45-2 over its last 47 games when rushing for at least 200 yards.

- The Aztecs scored 27 points in the first half, their most in a first half since scoring 35 at San José State on Nov. 4, 2017.
- The Aztecs outgained the Rebels, 313-25, at the half, including an 100-0 advantage in the air and a 213-25 edge on the ground.
- San Diego State's 14 tackles for loss were its most since at least the 2012 season.
- SDSU's five sacks were its most since recording six at New Mexico State on Sept. 14, 2019.

Aztecs Dominate UNLV, 34-6, in 2020 Opener

CARSON, Calif. -- San Diego State used a dominating first half in all three phases of the game and held steady in the second half in a 34-6 victory over UNLV at Dignity Health Sports Park in Carson, Calif.

Greg Bell rushed for 111 yards and a touchdown in his Aztec (1-0, 1-0 MW) debut, Kaegun Williams ran for a career-high 89 yards on 11 carries (8.1 avg.), and Chance Bell (two touchdowns) and Jordan Byrd each added 40 yards apiece on seven and three rushing attempts, respectively.

SDSU jumped out to a 27-0 lead, thanks to four consecutive scores as part of a 20-point second quarter. The four successive scores all came in the final 10 minutes, 36 seconds of the half on touchdown runs by Chance Bell (five yards) and Greg Bell (three yards), and a pair of field goals by Matt Araiza (27 and 22 yards).

UNLV, meanwhile, only got onto the SDSU side of the field once in the first half and missed a 42-yard field goal. The stout San Diego State defense forced six Rebel punts and forced six 3-and-outs (or better) over the seven drives in the first two quarters.

After 30 minutes, the Aztecs held a 313-25 advantage in total yards, including a 100-0 edge in passing yards and 213-25 lead on the ground. Additionally, SDSU had 17 first downs compared to just one for UNLV.

The Rebels, however, used a 13-play, 81-yard drive to begin the second half, culminating with a 4-yard pass from Max Gilliam to Steve Jenkins.

After each team traded punts for the rest of third quarter, UNLV tried to cut the 27-6 deficit (the Rebels missed a PAT after their touchdown) with another long drive. UNLV went 73 yards on 18 plays over 6:28, twice converting on fourth down. With a fourth-and-goal from the San Diego State 4-yard line, the Aztec defense snuffed out a screen pass into a 11-yard loss to stop any momentum left for the Rebels.

SDSU quickly raced 85 yards in five plays, thanks in part to a 40-yard rush by Greg Bell and a 33-yard pass from Carson Baker to Elijah Kothe. Chance Bell then took a counter almost untouched from 19 yards out for the final points of the game.

San Diego State outgained the Rebels, 424-186, for the game with a commanding 207-yard advantage on the ground (287-80). The Aztecs improved to 45-2 over their last 47 games when rushing for at least 200 yards.

Defensively, the Aztecs totaled 14 tackles for loss (SDSU's most since at least 2011), five sacks and five pass breakups, allowing their fewest points (6) in a conference game since shutting out Hawai'i, 52-0, on Nov. 5, 2016. UNLV was just 1-for-15 on third down, the lowest percentage (6.7 pct.) against San Diego State since Sept. 24, 2005 against San José State (0-for-17).

Dwayne Johnson Jr. had a game-high 10 tackles, while Tariq Thompson pitched in with nine stops. Caden McDonald, meanwhile, had career highs of eight tackles, three tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks.

Baker threw for 137 yards in his second career start, including a 4-yard touchdown pass to Ethan Dedeaux to get the Aztecs on the scoreboard in the first quarter.

Aztecs Dominate Aggies to Remain Unbeaten

LOGAN, Utah -- San Diego State pulled away in the second half with the final 28 points of the game in a 38-7 win over Utah State in Logan, Utah.

Greg Bell ran for a career-high 157 yards and a touchdown and added a 29-yard touchdown reception for the Aztecs (2-0 2-0 MW), which racked up 407 yards on the ground.

Up 10-7 at the half after an Aggies' (0-2, 0-2 MW) 37-yard touchdown pass with no time left in the second quarter, SDSU dominated the rest of the way, scoring on four consecutive drives and outgaining USU, 345-81, over the final 30 minutes, including a 199-6 advantage in the third quarter.

San Diego State took its opening drive of the second half 75 yards on 10 plays before Greg Bell muscled his way for a 6-yard score.

After forcing a three-and-out, the Aztecs went 68 yards in just six plays, culminating with a Chance Bell sweep right on a fourth-and-1 situation for a 27-yard score to open up a 24-7 lead.

Forcing another three-and-out, SDSU methodically drove 82 yards on 15 plays, ending with a Greg Bell catch and run from Carson Baker for 29 yards and his first career touchdown reception.

On SDSU's next possession, Jordan Byrd broke free for a 73-yard touchdown run to cap the scoring with 5:14 left in the fourth quarter.

Baker hit Kobe Smith for a 15-yard touchdown to get San Diego State on the scoreboard late in the first quarter. Matt Araiza, who missed two field goals earlier in the first half, made it 10-0 Aztecs with a 28-yard field goal with 1:10 left in the first half.

Utah State, however, went 73 yards in just 1:01, ending with a 37-yard touchdown pass from Jason Shelley to Deven Thompkins with no time left in the second quarter. It was one of only three times in the game the Aggies would get into SDSU territory.

The 31-point loss was the Aggies' worst home loss to an unranked team since a 38-point setback to Hawai'i on Oct. 23, 2010.

San Diego State's 304-yard rushing margin (407-103) was the fifth-largest margin in program history. Additionally, the Aztecs improved to 46-2 the last 48 time they rushed for at least 200 yards.

Chance Bell added 98 yards on the ground in just 10 carries, while Byrd got all 73 yards on his only rushing attempt.

Baker completed 18 of 27 passes for 163 yards and two touchdowns, improving to 3-0 for his career as the team's starting quarterback.

Smith's six catches and 64 yards led SDSU, which improved to 2-0 for the fourth time in the last five seasons (2016, 2017, 2019 and 2020).

Andrew Aleki, Darren Hall and Tayler Hawkins led a balanced San Diego State defense with five tackles apiece. For the game, San Diego State limited USU to just 215 yards and forced three turnovers, including interceptions by Seydrick Lakalaka and Rashad Scott, and a forced and recovered fumble by Michael Shawcraft.

Aztecs Fall to Spartans, 28-17

CARSON, Calif. -- In a battle of two unbeaten teams, San Diego State dropped its first game of the 2020 campaign after suffering a 28-17 setback to San José State at Dignity Health Sports Park.

The Aztecs (2-1) committed three costly turnovers in the fourth quarter, as the Spartans (3-0) erased a 17-14 deficit with two touchdowns over the final 11:10 to defeat the Scarlet and Black for the first time in the last eight meetings.

Despite dominating the time of possession (36:08-23:52) and maintaining the upper hand in total yards (362-298), San Diego State was outgained on the ground (116-101), netting minus-two yards for the entire fourth quarter.

Individually, Greg Bell rushed for 109 yards and one touchdown on 25 carries, becoming the first player in program history to record three straight 100-yard performances to begin his Aztec career.

In addition, Jesse Matthews aided the SDSU cause with a career-high 139 receiving yards on six catches, including a season-long 51-yarder in the first quarter to help set up a field goal, while Carson Baker also finished with a personal-best 261 passing yards after completing 21 of 30 attempts.

Bell scored on a five-yard burst up the middle early in the fourth quarter, culminating a seven-play, 69-yard march, which put the Aztecs back on top 17-14.

San Diego State looked to increase its advantage on its next series after holding the Spartans to a three-and-out. However, disaster struck on the second play when Baker fumbled trying to elude a heavy rush and SJSU's Vilemi Fekoko alertly pounced on the loose ball at the Aztec 17.

Two plays later, Tyler Nevens scored on a 3-yard run to give the Spartans a 21-17 lead with 11:10 remaining. Unfazed, San Diego State wasted little time advancing on its next possession, converting a fourth-and-1 situation from the SJSU 41 on Bell's 6-yard jaunt, while Matthews followed with a 24-yard reception down to the 11.

However, the Spartans stood their ground at this juncture, sacking Baker for a 4-yard loss on second down, before Tre Jenkins made a juggling interception in the end zone to snuff out the Aztec threat.

After yielding a first down following the turnover, SDSU ultimately forced another punt with 3:47 left on the clock. Unfortunately, Jordan Byrd could not field the kick cleanly after an instantaneous hit by Tre Walker, while Rico Tolefree corralled the loose ball at the Aztec 27.

SDSU had a golden opportunity to regain possession after quarterback Nick Nash's fumble on the first play of the ensuing series but could not make the recovery. Four plays later, the Spartan backup made the Aztecs pay with a clinching 14-yard touchdown run, which provided the visitors an insurmountable 28-17 advantage with 2:08 to go.

San Diego State forged a 10-0 advantage on Matt Araiza's 34-yard field goal past the midway point of the first quarter and Baker's 1-yard plunge at the 8:53 mark of the second period.

SJSU, which punted on its first five possessions of the evening, finally hit paydirt with 35 seconds left in the half when Nash hit Deese on a 4-yard touchdown pass over the middle to cap a 10-play, 89-yard drive.

The Aztecs quashed the Spartans' first foray of the second half after Tariq Thompson intercepted Nash at the SDSU 28. However, San Diego State was unable to overcome a holding penalty on its next series and was forced to punt, as SJSU took over at its own 38. Eight plays later, Nash hooked up with Bailey Gaitner on a 3-yard touchdown pass to give the visitors their first lead of the night at 14-10.

Making his first career start, Michael Shawcroft led the Aztec defense with a personal-best seven tackles, including five solo stops, while Thompson finished with six tackles, one pass breakup and the aforementioned interception.

Aztecs Run Past Hawai'i, 34-10

CARSON, Calif. -- San Diego State struck for two long touchdown runs and converted three turnovers into 17 additional points in a 34-10 triumph over Hawai'i on Saturday at Dignity Health Sports Park.

Buoyed by Greg Bell's career-high 160 yards rushing on 19 carries, the Aztecs maintained a 326-66 advantage on the ground, while an opportunistic defense recorded seven sacks, two fumble recoveries and one interception.

With the victory, SDSU snapped a two-game losing streak to the Rainbow Warriors, raising its record to 3-1.

The teams exchanged punts on the first six possessions of the game before SDSU registered two quick scores to build a 14-0 lead late in the first quarter.

Jordan Byrd provided a spark, breaking free for a 51-yard touchdown run down the left sideline, which gave the hosts a 7-0 advantage at the 3:26 mark of the opening period.

The Rainbow Warriors punted deep into SDSU territory on their ensuing series, but Jesse Matthews got the Scarlet and Black out of a hole with a 29-yard return to the Aztec 38. On the very first snap, Bell jumped left before cutting back inside through a gaping hole, outracing the UH defense to the end zone on a 62-yard scamper.

With nearly three minutes elapsed in the second quarter, SDSU caught another break when Kyrion White forced a fumble on Melquise Stovall's punt return deep in Rainbow territory, while Andrew Alves pounced on the loose ball at the Hawai'i 13. Three plays later, Bell plowed his way up the middle for his second touchdown to up the Aztecs up, 21-0.

SDSU crossed the midfield stripe on its next possession, but Michael Washington intercepted Carson Baker's deep pass at the 16.

Following the turnover, Hawai'i engineered its most productive drive of the half, marching 49 yards in 10 plays while consuming 4:17 on the clock. However, on third-and-10 from the Aztec 35, Segun Olubi stepped in front of a Chevan Cordeiro pass over the middle intended for Miles Reed and sprinted 71 yards down the left sideline untouched to give the Scarlet and Black a commanding 28-0 lead by intermission.

The Rainbows finally dented the scoreboard at the 5:13 mark of the third quarter when Matthew Shipley connected on a 27-yard field goal, atoning for a miss from 42 yards out earlier in the period.

SDSU answered with a 27-yard field goal of its own by Matt Araiza early in the fourth quarter after pouncing on a loose football deep in Hawai'i territory. Caden McDonald forced a fumble after sacking Cordeiro, while Keshawn Banks made the recovery at the Rainbow 17. The Aztecs were stymied after the turnover before settling for the three points.

Hawai'i scored its lone touchdown on the second play of the following series, with Calvin Turner busting loose for 75-yard score after catching a short pass from Cordeiro, which narrowed the gap to 31-10.

Lucas Johnson took over for Carson Baker at this juncture and directed a lengthy 16-play, 57-drive that chewed up over nine minutes on the clock, punctuated by Araiza's 36-yard field goal with 2:59 left to play. Johnson showed off his mobility with 47 rushing yards during the series.

San Diego State's seven sacks equaled its highest total in a game since its victory over Houston in the 2016 Las Vegas Bowl, as McDonald and Jonah Tavai recorded two apiece.

McDonald shared the team lead with seven tackles, including three for a loss, joining Seydricck Lakalaka and Tariq Thompson. Thompson posted five solo stops along with Andrew Aleki.

Aztecs Edged to Nevada in Reno

RENO, Nev. -- San Diego State was unable to convert on fourth-and-goal from the Nevada 5-yard line in the late moments and had to settle for a 26-21 loss in Reno, Nev.

With the Aztec (3-2, 3-2 MW) offense sputtering in the second half, SDSU caught a break when Darren Hall picked off Wolf Pack (5-0, 5-0 MW) quarterback Carson Strong on the UN 26-yard line with 3:23 remaining in the game.

San Diego State picked up two first downs on runs by Chance Bell to get to the Nevada 4-yard line. On first down, Aztec quarterback Lucas Johnson's pass attempt to Jesse Matthews in the left-corner of the end zone was batted down by Wolf Pack cornerback Berdale Robins. On second down, UN stopped Chance Bell for a 1-yard loss. On third-and-goal from the 5, Johnson's throw to a crossing Matthews was just behind him, setting up the fourth-and-goal situation. Following a timeout, Johnson's pass attempt to the left side of the end zone sailed over Kobe Smith's head, setting up a Nevada kneel down.

SDSU appeared in control in the first half, where it racked up 252 yards on 28 plays (9.0 yards per play) and 13 first downs, while punting once.

The Wolf Pack stuck first on a 31-yard field goal by Brandon Talton with 8:37 left in the first quarter.

San Diego State answered with a 35-yard run by Johnson. The first career rushing touchdown for Johnson came right after a 35-yard pass to a diving Jesse Matthews on third-and-5.

After another field goal by Talton (33 yards), the Aztecs marched 75 yards on seven plays, ending on a 7-yard pass from Johnson to Smith.

Talton's third field goal (22 yards) brought UN to within five at 14-9 with 9:55 remaining in the second quarter.

Following a SDSU punt, Nevada went 86 yards on eight plays, culminating with a 2-yard pass by Strong to Cole Turner.

Unfazed, SDSU drove 64 yards on just six plays thanks to a returning Greg Bell. Greg Bell, who entered the game with four straight 100-yard rushing games, injured his ankle on the third play of the game and was questionable to return. On the drive, Bell rushed for 35 yards on five attempts, including a 2-yard score to give San Diego State a 21-16 lead at intermission.

The Aztecs, however, struggled offensively in the second half, gaining just 41 yards on 32 plays (1.3 yards per play) and three first downs, punting seven times.

Nevada took the lead for good on its first drive of the second half on Strong's 50-yard pass to Romeo Doubs. The Wolf Pack later added a fourth field goal by Talton (27 yards) to finish up the scoring in the game.

Hall's interception late in the fourth quarter gave SDSU some hope, but San Diego State was unable to get into the end zone.

Johnson was 14-for-24 in the game for 184 yards and a touchdown, including five passes for 80 yards to Matthews. Hall led the Aztec defense with a career-high 11 tackles (10 solo), an interception and two pass breakups, while sophomores Michael Shawcroft (eight tackles) and Patrick McMorris (seven tackles) each set career highs in tackles.

SDSU held Nevada to its fewest points (26) and total yards (376) for the season.
