► **The Records:** The San Diego State women's basketball team will put its perfect record on the line when it heads to Los Angeles for the four-team Loyola Marymount Ayres Hotel Thanksgiving Tournament. The Aztecs will play Indiana State on Friday at 2 p.m. and then will face either Jackson State or host LMU on Saturday at 2 or 4 p.m. SDSU is one of two unbeaten teams in the field, joining 2-0 Indiana State, while Jackson State is 1-1 and LMU is 2-2 in 2007-08. The Aztecs own a combined 6-2 all-time record versus the three schools.

► **SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns:** Burns (Ohio Wesleyan, 1979) is in the third year of her second stint as head coach at San Diego State. She led the Aztecs for eight seasons from 1989 to 1997, before returning in 2005. She has an overall head coaching record of 250-188 in 15 seasons, while she is 169-123 in her 10 previous campaigns at SDSU.

► **Indiana State Head Coach Jim Wiedie:** Wiedie is in his eighth season as head coach of the Sycamores and boasts a school and overall record of 129-77.

► **Jackson State Head Coach Denise Taylor:** Taylor is in her seventh campaign at Jackson State, posting a 110-72 mark. She is 152-91 in 11 seasons overall.

► **LMU Head Coach Julie Wilhoit:** Wilhoit is in her 13th year at LMU and has a 169-179 mark with the Lions. Her overall record is 289-249 in 20 seasons.

► **Series History:** San Diego State owns a 1-0 all-time record against both Indiana State and Jackson State, with both match ups coming in San Diego. The Aztecs are 4-2 versus Loyola Marymount, but the Lions have claimed the last two in the series in 1999 and 2000.

## Aztec Basketball Puts Perfect Record On The Line Friday Versus Indiana State

After a quick stop in San Diego, the Aztec women's basketball team heads back on the road this weekend, when it travels to the four-team Loyola Marymount Ayres Hotel Thanksgiving Tournament, Nov. 23-24. SDSU will face unbeaten Indiana State (2-0) in the first game on Friday at 2 p.m. at Gerston Pavilion, and then will play either Jackson State or host LMU on Saturday at 2 or 4 p.m.

The Aztecs have kicked off their 2007-08 campaign with victories in each of their first three contests, including this past Tuesday when the team routed visiting Southern Utah, 86-52. With a pair of victories this weekend, SDSU can match its best start since the 1992-93 squad also went 5-0.

### SDSU Routs Southern Utah, 86-52

The San Diego State women's basketball team forced 35 turnovers and had all 11 of its players score points, as the Aztecs cruised to an 86-52 victory over Southern Utah in their home opener Tuesday at Cox Arena. SDSU improved to 3-0 on the season, giving head coach Beth Burns her 250th career win, while the Thunderbirds fell to 1-3 overall in 2007-08.

San Diego State had three players finish in double-figure points, including leading scorer freshman center **Paris Johnson (San Diego, Calif.)**, who had 14 points and a team-best six rebounds and two blocks. Senior forward **Shanna Demus (Palmdale, Calif.)** recorded 10 of her 12 points in the first half, while freshman forward **Allison Duffy (Lakeside, Calif.)** contributed 10 points off the bench.

The Aztecs logged a season-high eight 3-pointers, 23 steals and 26 assists. Sophomore **Jené Morris (San Francisco, Calif.)** led the defensive effort with a career-tying seven steals to go with her team-high nine assists and no turnovers in just 21 minutes of action.

SDSU got off to a quick start and never looked back, jumping out to an early 12-0 lead, before Southern Utah could get on the board with a layup at the 16:21 mark. The Aztecs went on an 18-7 run over the next seven minutes to go up by 21 at 30-9, and led by 25 at the break, 43-18.

The Thunderbirds cut their deficit down to as few 17 points with 9:19 remaining at 59-42, but the Aztecs responded with a 4-0 run with back-to-back baskets from Duffy and finished on a 21-8 scoring streak to claim their fifth-straight in the series, 86-52.

#### Other Southern Utah Notes

The Aztecs' 26 assists are its most in a game since at least the 1999-2000 season ... SDSU has had four different players score 10 or more points in the first half of a game this season. Shanna Demus was the newest entrant into the club, scoring 10 points versus Southern Utah ... The Aztecs held Southern Utah without a three-point field goal. The last time SDSU turned that trick was in the 2007 MWC tournament game with Wyoming.

#### 250 And Beyond

With the team's win over Southern Utah Tuesday, Aztec head coach Beth Burns recorded her 250th career victory. Burns is now 250-188 overall in her 11 years at San Diego State and five campaigns at Ohio State. She is already the winningest head coach in Aztec history with 169 of the program's 466 all-time victories.

#### With The 'W'

With SDSU's win over Southern Utah Tuesday:

► SDSU has started its season 3-0 for the first time since the 1992-93 squad won its opening five games. In its program's history, San Diego State has begun with a 3-0 record on seven occasions, including this year. The school record for best start is 15-0 by the 1983-84 team that finished 24-6 overall and advanced to the second round of the NCAA tournament.

► The Aztecs are 3-0 against teams it also faced last season. SDSU was 2-1 versus Nevada, Saint Mary's and Southern Utah a year ago.

► SDSU claimed its home-opener for the first time in the last three seasons, improving to 25-7 all-time in such games.

► The Aztecs are 9-1 in their last 10 games against non-conference opponents with the lone loss coming in the championship game of the Surf 'N Slam tournament against No. 17/16 George Washington.

#### Another Offensive Outburst

San Diego State continues to improve its offensive output, putting up 86 points in the win over Southern Utah. Below are a few notes about the Aztecs' latest numbers on offense:

► SDSU's 86 points are its most in a game since beating Utah Valley State, 91-45, on Feb. 10, 2005. The Aztecs have recorded two games with more than 80 points for the first time since 2001-02, when the team had 89 points against Radford and 83 versus Air Force.

► The 34-point margin of victory is the Aztecs' most since that same Utah Valley State game ... Their 43 points in the second half are its most since the 71-66 win over Utah last season.

► SDSU has shot above 40 percent from the field in each of its games thus far. The Aztecs only reached the 40 percent mark 11 times a year ago, posting an 8-3 record in those outings. The last time San Diego State had three straight games shooting over 40 percent was in the final three games of the regular season in 2004-05.

### Steals And Turnovers

Through its first three games, SDSU has forced a combined 101 turnovers and logged 58 steals. The Aztecs lead the Mountain West Conference in both turnover margin (+10.3) and steals per game (19.3), while the team's 23 steals versus Southern Utah and 18 steals against Nevada are the two best performances by an MWC school thus far in 2007-08. Individually, Jené Morris (1st), Quenesa Davis (2nd), Shanna Demus (t-5th), **Tamika Lipford** (t-10th) and Allison Duffy (t-10th) are all in the top 10 in the league in steals per game.

SDSU's 23 steals versus the Thunderbirds on Tuesday are the team's most since also posting 23 versus Long Island University on Dec. 27, 1996. The total is second all-time in the MWC since the league began, trailing only Colorado State's 24-steal effort in 2001 against Sacramento State.

A year ago, San Diego State had 10 or more steals in a game 13 times and forced 20 or more turnovers on 11 occasions. The school record for most steals in a season is 555 by the 1983-84 team.

### Young Guns

San Diego State has started two freshmen, two sophomores and one senior in its first three games of 2007-08. The Aztecs slightly altered its line up in the home opener with Southern Utah, as true freshman **Coco Davis (Sacramento, Calif.)** made her first career start in place of Allison Duffy.

The Aztecs' starting lineup in its season opener with Nevada was the program's youngest since the 1983-84 campaign, when the team had three freshmen, one sophomore and one junior among the starting five.

This year's group has just five years of experience, with only four coming at the Division I level as Shanna Demus played her first season at Div. II Cal State Los Angeles. The Aztecs' four newcomers, Coco Davis, Allison Duffy, Paris Johnson and Jené Morris, have combined for 49 percent of the team's scoring and 46 percent of its rebounding.

### Return Of The Three

After beginning the season only 4-for-12 from three-point land, the Aztecs made eight triples against Southern Utah, while attempting 22 shots from beyond the arc. Five different SDSU players had a 3-pointer, including two who made the first of their careers. The eight 3-pointers are the team's most in a game since also making eight against UC Davis on Dec. 30, 2005, while the 22 attempts are the most since trying 25 against Colorado State on Feb. 4, 2006.

SDSU senior **Kate Eveland (Southlake, Texas)** had a pair of threes versus Southern Utah. She is one shy of moving into a tie for seventh place on the Aztec career list, currently boasting 64 triples, while she is tied for sixth with 211 career attempts.

### Another Block Party?

After leading the Mountain West Conference in blocks per game in both overall and league-only outings in 2006-07, San Diego State looks like it is well on its way to doing the same again this season. In the opening three games, the Aztecs had 15 total blocks by seven different players, ranking second in the league.

True freshman Paris Johnson has provided the bulk of the work with eight to her credit, including five at Nevada, which tied for eighth in school single-game history.

San Diego State ranked 35th nationally with 4.6 blocks per game a year ago. The team's 129 blocks were the program's most since tallying 159 in 1994-95.

►SDSU has claimed its first victory on a neutral court since Nov. 29, 2003, when the Aztecs defeated Murray State in Fresno, Calif. The Aztecs have not played a regular season game on a neutral court since the 2003-04 season, when SDSU traveled to Birmingham, Ala., Dec. 29-30.

►SDSU stays perfect all-time against Indiana State with a 2-0 record. The Aztecs are 10-1 in their last 11 games against non-league foes.

►The Aztecs are 1-0 against teams it did not face last season ... SDSU improves to 3-0 in games played away from Cox Arena in 2007-08.

►SDSU advances to the championship game of a regular season tournament for the second year in a row (also last year at San Diego Surf 'N Slam).

### Indiana State Tid-Bits

Indiana State enters the tournament with a 2-0 record, claiming wins over Arkansas-Pine Bluff (89-55) and upsetting Vanderbilt in overtime (77-72) ... The Sycamores have played both their first games at home and have had a nine-day break since their win over Vandy ... ISU is led by Laura Rudolphi, who averages 18 points a game, while Kelsey Luna (17.0) and Maria Olsthoorn (13.5) also chip in over 10 points an outing ... Kara Schilli is the team's leading rebounder, while Luna is its top three-point threat ... Indiana State has combined to shoot 86.6 percent from the free-throw line and has already gotten 14 triples in two outings.

### Jackson State Tid-Bits

Jackson State is 1-1 on the year with a win over McNeese State and a loss at Arkansas ... The Tigers advanced to the WNIT last season with a 22-11 overall record and won the Southwestern Athletic Conference regular season title ... Jackson State is led by LaSharee Chirstan, who averages 20.5 points and 7.0 rebounds per game ... She is also tops in assists and is tied for the lead in steals.

### Loyola Marymount Tid-Bits

The host Lions have played the most games thus far of the four-team field, posting a 2-2 record heading into the weekend ... LMU is 2-2 with victories over UNLV and Long Beach State and losses to Boise State and UC Santa Barbara ... Three players average in double-figure points, while the team averages almost 45 rebounds per outing ... Amanda Decoud is the team's leader in scoring, assists and steals.

### Back On The Road

San Diego State is opening its season with five of its first six games away from home. The Aztecs will return to Cox Arena on Dec. 2, when they play their entire December schedule at home for the second straight season.

Beginning with the Saint Mary's contest last Saturday, SDSU will spend 58 consecutive days in the state of California before departing for its 2008 MWC opener at TCU on Jan. 8.

### Aztecs Ink Four In Front Court

San Diego State women's basketball head coach Beth Burns announced the signing Wednesday of four prep standouts to National Letters of Intent. **Candace Chambers (Seattle, Wash.), Gabrielle Clark (Los Angeles, Calif.), Lindsay Leo (San Jose, Calif.)** and **Kalena Tutt (Long Beach, Calif.)** will join the Aztecs in 2008.

SDSU's fall recruiting class includes three California natives and one signee from the state of Washington. All four are at least 6-1, giving the Aztecs six players who are six-feet or taller in the freshman and sophomore classes alone in 2008-09.

### Preseason Points

SDSU women's basketball center Paris Johnson was picked as the Mountain West Conference's top freshman for the upcoming season in a vote by the league's nine head coaches and select media members released Oct. 17, at the conference's annual media day in Littleton, Colo.

Johnson earned San Diego County player-of-the-year honors her final two seasons as a prep at San Diego High School, averaging 21.4 points and 10.7 rebounds as a senior. She was listed as the No. 42 prospect in the country and the No. 15 ranked forward by *HoopGurlz.com* and twice garnered second team all-state accolades by *CalHiSports.com*.

As a team, the Aztecs were tabbed to finish seventh for the third year in a row in the MWC preseason poll. SDSU, which ended up seventh during the 2006-07 regular season, earned 93 points from the panel. Wyoming was tabbed as the preseason favorite for the first time in MWC history after winning the WNIT championship a year ago, receiving 24 of 30 first-place votes and 203 total points.

## Burns Gets New Contract

Beth Burns, the winningest head coach in Aztec women's basketball history, signed a new five-year contract, San Diego State Director of Athletics Jeff Schemmel announced Sept. 12. The contract is effective immediately and runs through the 2011-12 campaign.

## Pair Added To Aztec Coaching Staff

San Diego State head coach Beth Burns added a pair to her staff this past summer. Heidi VanDerveer, who has over 20 years of experience on both the collegiate and professional levels, was named associate head coach on Aug. 29. VanDerveer comes to San Diego State from the Seattle Storm, where she recently completed her second season as an assistant coach. Tara Morrison joined the staff as the team's head manager after two seasons as an assistant coach at Binghamton University in New York and four at the University of Maine.

## Last Year's Team Milestones

► SDSU finished as the 11th most-improved team in NCAA Division I, going from three to 12 victories in 2006-07.

► The Aztecs posted the biggest turnaround in back-to-back seasons in league history, claiming five Mountain West Conference victories after going winless in 2005-06.

► SDSU's 12 wins are the program's most since 2000-01 ... The team's 11 victories at home are the most since 1996-97 ... The five conference victories are the most since 2000-01 ... The Aztecs' six-game win streak is the team's longest since 2000-01 ... Its seven non-conference wins are its most since 2001-01.

► SDSU led the Mountain West Conference in blocks in both overall and conference only contests, ranking 35th nationally.

## SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns

The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa in April 8, 2005. In just two short seasons, she already has the program headed in the right direction, as the Aztecs' were the 11th-most improved team in the nation in 2007 and recorded the school's most wins since 2000-01.

In her first stint as head coach from 1989-97, Burns took the SDSU women's basketball program full circle, going from 7-23 her first year to 23-7 in her final campaign. During her eight seasons, she compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular-season titles.

A three-time WAC coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02). She has a 15-year overall head coaching record of 250-188, while her mark school record stands at 169-123 over 10 seasons.
