Aztec Basketball Looks To Rebound With Friday Evening Game At UC Riverside

The San Diego State basketball team returns to action after a six-day layoff, when it plays its fourth-straight game away from home Friday at 5 p.m. at UC Riverside's Student

Recreation Center in Riverside, Calif.

The Aztecs, who started the season with a 3-0 record, will look to rebound from an 0-3 performance at the 2009 Paradise Jam in St. Thomas in the U.S. Virgin Islands last weekend. SDSU dropped back-to-back games to a pair of top 25 teams in No. 5/6 Notre Dame (84-79) and No. 20/17 Oklahoma (87-48), before losing a close one to round out the week to South Carolina (58-55).

UC Riverside, which enters Friday's contest with a 2-4 mark, is just San Diego State's second opponent in 2009-10 that it also faced last season. Exactly one year will have passed since the Aztecs won on a buzzer beater over the Highlanders, 54-52, in San Diego, Dec. 4, 2008.

Friday's game in Riverside will feature a live audio feed with Chris Ello, as well as live stats on goaztecs.com.

SDSU Unable To Pick Up A Win At The 2009 Paradise Jam

After beginning the week with its first AP top 25 national ranking in 14 years, the Aztec basketball team was unable to keep its perfect record at the 2009 U.S. Virgin Islands Paradise Jam in St. Thomas, Nov. 26-28. SDSU dropped three straight outings for the first time since the 2007-08 campaign, falling on consecutive days to a pair of fellow top 25 foes in No. 5/6 Notre Dame and No. 20/17 Oklahoma and then concluding the tournament with a close, threepoint defeat against South Carolina.

On Thanksgiving Day, SDSU cut a 21-point, first-half deficit all the way down to two with less than 30 seconds remaining, but was unable to pull off the Thanksgiving Day upset, dropping its first game of the season to No. 5/6 Notre Dame, 84-79. The loss snapped an eight-game regular-season non-conference win streak dating back to the Aztecs' final contest of the Hawai'i tournament vs. No. 25/22 Iowa State on Nov. 30, 2008.

SDSU got off to a slow start for the second consecutive outing on Friday, but this time was unable to battle back, falling to No. 20/17 Oklahoma, 87-48, as the Sooners built a 32-point halftime edge, shooting 56.9 percent from the field for the game.

In the final game of the week, the Aztecs and South Carolina were tied 17 times and changed leads on 12 occasions, before the Gamecocks used a late 6-0 run to earn a three-point, 58-55, victory in the two schools' first-ever meeting.

Other Tournament Notes

• The last time SDSU lost three games in a row was Feb. 9-23, 2008, when the team lost five-straight during

- SDSU began the year by outrebounding each of its first four opponents before losing the battle on the boards to both Oklahoma and South Carolina.
- The Aztecs' 69 field-goal attempts vs. Notre Dame are their most in a single game since trying 70 in a win over Southern Utah on Nov. 20, 2007.
- The Gamecocks were the Aztecs' fourth opponent this season to not reach the 60-point mark.
- The Paradise Jam is the first non-conference tournament that SDSU has not won at least one game at since dropping both outings at the Lady Blazer Invitational in Birmingham, Ala., in Dec. 2003.

Morris Earns All-Tournament Honors



Despite being unable to pick up a victory in St. Thomas, Aztec senior guard **Jené Morris (San Francisco, Calif.)** still earned individual honors for her play in the team's three games.

Morris was one of six players out of the Island Division selected

to the all-tournament squad on Saturday. She was joined by South Carolina's Valerie Nainima, Oklahoma's Amanda Thompson and Danielle Robinson and Notre Dame's Melissa Lechitner and Skylar Diggins. Diggins was tabbed the division's MVP after leading the Irish to a 3-0 record.

Over the three outings, Morris averaged 17 points, bolstered by a 32-point effort against Notre Dame, which was the most points in a single game by any player at the tournament. She also had eight steals and shot a combined 47.7 percent from the field.

This is the third straight tournament that Morris has been honored, as she earned MVP accolades at last year's Surf 'N Slam and was tabbed to the all-tournament team at the 2009 MWC championships.

The Century Mark

With her first basket of the South Carolina game, senior co-captain **Jené Morris** became just the 17th player in Aztec basketball history to reach the 1,000-career point mark. Morris is the first SDSU player to reach the milestone since Jamey Cox in 2002-03, doing so in her 67th outing in the Red & Black.

She enters this week's UC Riverside game with 1,009 points, and when combined with her 236 points at Cal in 2005-06, she has 1,245 points in her collegiate career.

Morris' classmate and fellow guard **Quenese Davis** (Sacramento, Calif.) could be the second of three Aztecs to reach the 1,000-point plateau in 2009-10. Davis has 973 points in 97 games and junior center **Paris Johnson (San Diego, Calif.)** has 868 points in 69 contests.

Dual Threat

Senior co-captains Jené Morris and Quennie Davis combined to score 57 of the team's 79 points in the close loss to No. 5/6 Notre Dame last Thursday.

Morris, who had 26 of her 32 points in the second half, tallied her fifth career 30-point scoring outing and her 15th contest with 20 or more points.

Davis, meanwhile, matched her career-best for points in game with 25, including 15 in the first half. Davis also

had 25 last year vs. New Mexico and boasts seven career 20-point scoring outings.

A year ago, the Aztecs had two games where at least two players reached the 20-point barrier in the same outing, including versus Montana State when Davis and Jennifer Layton-Bailes both had 20 points and Paris Johnson added 22 in the 85-70 win.

Opponents Not Hitting The Three Ball

In the six games this season, SDSU opponents have combined to make just 15 of their 62 shots from beyond the arc for a 24.2 percentage. That mark ranks the Aztecs' 28th nationally in three-point percentage defense.

No team has been able to make more than 30 percent of their attempts from three-point land. Only Oklahoma made was able to make four triples, although the Sooners also tried an SDSU opponent season-high 15 attempts from that distance.

Conversely, the Aztecs are shooting 35.8 percent from beyond the arc, including a season-high 72.7 percentage against USD.

Forcing Tosk

Despite losing its last three games, San Diego State has continued to force opponent turnovers. Oklahoma is the only Aztec foe to not reach the 20-turnover mark in 2009-10, recording 19. SDSU opponents are averaging 23.0 giveaways a game, including a season-high 27 by Arizona.

A year ago, Aztec opponents had 20 or more turnovers in 21 of 32 contests.

Improved At The Line

Through six games, San Diego State has made 70.7 percent of its free throws to rank fourth in the Mountain West Conference and 96th nationally.

After six games in 2008-09, the Aztecs were only shooting 54.4 percent and ended the year with a 61.2 mark to rank 314th out of 328 Division I schools.

The most improved award by far goes to center Paris Johnson, who is converting 60 percent after making only 46 percent last season.

Lucky December

For the first time in four years, SDSU will not play all of its December games in the city of San Diego, as the Aztecs play at UC Riverside (Friday) and LMU (Dec. 21).

The home court advantage has certainly helped. San Diego State is 14-3 during the month of December in the last three years, including a 5-0 mark in 2008-09. Its last loss during the year's final month came against Quinnipiac on Dec. 28, 2007.

Notes With A 'W'

An SDSU victory over the UC Riverside will mean:

- ► SDSU has won its last seven games, spanning three seasons, during the month of December.
- ►SDSU is 2-0 against teams it also faced a year ago and also improves to 2-0 in 2009-10 vs. teams out of the Big West Conference. The Aztecs have won their last eight meetings with Big West foes, dating back to 2005.
- ►SDSU improves to 4-2 all-time against the Highlanders, defeats UC Riverside for the second straight year and wins in Riverside for the first time since

the two schools' first-ever meeting in 1983.

►SDSU is 2-0 in games played on opponent's home courts this season and won six straight overall.

UC Riverside Tid-Bits

UC Riverside enters Friday's game with a 2-4 overall record ... The Highlanders lost in their most recent outing last Friday to Purdue at home, 65-53 ... UCR has wins over Northern Arizona and Pepperdine, while its other losses are to Miami, Hawaii and at Vanderbilt ... The Highlanders have three players averaging in double-figure scoring, including junior Rhaya Neabors and senior Marissa Rivera, who both score 13.0 points an outing ... Alyssa Morris is her teams leading rebounder with seven a game, while Rhaya's twin sister, Rheya, has 30 assists ... UCR finished last season with a 19-12 record and placed second in the Big West with a 14-2 mark ... Riverside has three players from the San Diego area in Rivera and former Eastlake High players Brittany Palmer and Jessie Schmuckal ... Aztec freshman guard Kiyana Stamps, who will miss the rest of the year with a knee injury, attended Perris High School with UCR's Natasha Hadley and Leah Washington.

2008 Riverside Rewind

- ▶Jené Morris hit the game-winning basket at the buzzer to help the Aztec basketball team defeat the visiting UC Riverside Highlanders, 54-52, at Cox Arena in front of a crowd of 1,681 fans.
- ▶The Aztecs trailed by as many as eight points in the first half and failed to score for over five and a half minutes mid-way through the second half, but outscored the Highlanders 9-3 in the final 2:43 to pull out the win.
- ► Morris hit her first four three-point field goals of the evening and finished 5-for-6 from beyond the arc for a team-best 19 points to go with three steals and three assists. Point guard Quenese Davis led the team in rebounding (7) and assists (7) in 37 minutes of action.
- ▶UCR tied the game at 52 points apiece with just 21 seconds left, but the Aztecs, coming out a timeout, got the game-winner from Morris on a jumpshot from the right elbow to win 54-52 at the buzzer.
- ►The Highlanders were led by Kemie Nekele's 17 points, while Tainoisouti Lott had 10 points and 15 boards.

Eight More To Go

With her 292nd victory in her 501st game as a head coach, Beth Burns still needs eight more wins to meet the 300-victory plateau for her career.

Burns is already SDSU's all-time winningest head coach with 211 of her career victories coming on Montezuma Mesa. She is in her 18th season overall as a head coach with all but six of those campaigns not with the Aztecs.

Aztecs Achieve No. 23 AP National Ranking

The San Diego State women's basketball team achieved its first top-25 national ranking in 14 years last week, as the Aztecs were rated No. 23 in the Associated Press Top 25 poll released Monday, Nov. 23. SDSU, which garnered 112 points, last appeared in the AP top 25 in March of 1995, when the team ended up 22nd following a 24-6 campaign. Overall, it is SDSU's 41st all-time appearance in the Associated Press Top 25.

The Aztecs received votes in the AP poll six times a year ago, a first since March of 1997, when it had 15 votes before playing its NCAA tournament game against Oregon.

In 2009-10, SDSU received votes in the Associated Press and ESPN/USA Today Coaches polls in both the preseason and first regular-season editions.

Last Tuesday, the Aztecs were also rated No. 24 in the coaches poll, getting 74 points.

After an 0-3 performance at the Paradise Jam, however, SDSU is now just receiving votes in both national poll this week.

Other 2009-10 Highlights So Far

- SDSU senior point guard Quenese Davis recorded her 500th career assist in the team's season-opening win over UC Irvine. She is now first in Aztec history and third in the MWC record book in career assists with 527.
- Aztec junior center Paris Johnson has five blocks in each of the team's last three season-openers, including five versus the Anteaters in 2009-10.
- SDSU junior **Jessika Bradley (Sacramento, Calif.)** opened her Aztec career with 10 rebounds in her first three games. She is one of two SDSU players to have a double-double this season.

Home Court Advantage

The Aztecs extended their home, regular-season win streak to 18 games with the victory over Arizona on Nov. 21. SDSU has not lost on its home court during the regular season since falling to Wyoming back on Feb. 20,

Overall, the Aztecs have won 19 of their last 20 contests at Vieias Arena, which includes an NCAA firstround victory over DePaul and the second round loss to No. 2 Stanford. SDSU went 15-0 at home in 2008-09, before the Stanford game. It was just the second unbeaten home regular season in program history.

Preseason Points

For the first time in the league's 11-year history, San

Diego State was picked to Conclude The MWC Poll win the Mountain West Conference title in 2010 in a vote by the nine head coaches and select media members released Oct. 7. at the conference's annual media day in Denver,

The Aztecs received 25 of the 28 first-place votes and 240 points overall. SDSU had nearly 25 more

points than second place TCU, which received the three other first-place votes. Utah was picked third, followed by New Mexico, Wyoming, Brigham Young, UNLV, Colorado State and Air Force.

San Diego State had never finished higher than fifth place in the league before tying for the regular-season crown with a 13-3 mark in 2008-09.

More Preseason Team Tid-Bits

In addition to being picked No. 1 in the league, San Diego State has also started to earn a share of the national spotlight.

As a team, the Aztecs were tabbed No. 22 by two national preseason publications, Lindy's College Basketball and Sporting News College Basketball Magazine.

This week, ESPN.com and writer Graham Hays lists SDSU No. 3 among "mid-majors" and earlier this season, picked the Aztecs as one of the "teams to watch as 2009-10 unfolds". Hays also tabbed SDSU's 2010 MWC opener at New Mexico, as the No. 2 game to watch in the nation in the month of January.

Another ESPN.com writer, Charlie Crème, chose SDSU No. 23 among his 64 teams to watch in 2009-10.

Jené Morris Up For National Player of the Year

Entering her third and final season at San Diego State, senior Jené Morris is already one of the most heavilydecorated players in program history and will be looking to add more to her trophy case in 2009-10.

Back in July, the 5-9 guard was one of only 25 players named to the preseason "Wade Watch" list for the State Farm Wade Trophy Division I Player of the Year award by the WBCA. The Wade Trophy is now in its 33rd year and is considered to be the "Heisman of Women's Basketball.

Morris is also up for the other college player of the

year honor, the John R. Wooden Award, which has been given out annually since 2004. She is one of only 31 student-athletes to make this year's list and is also a preseason candidate for the Wooden Award All-America

She is just the second player in Mountain West Conference history to be named to either watch list, joining Utah's Kim Smith, who was nominated for the Wade Trophy three times and the Wooden Award on two occa-

Morris was selected to the annual Naismith Trophy Watch List last week as one of only 50 women's college basketball players. The Naismith Trophy has been given out annually since 1983 to the women's player of the year.

More On Morris

Aztec senior Jené Morris was named the Mountain West Conference's Preseason Player of the Year in a vote of the league's coaches and select media members. She is the first SDSU player so honored and also was tabbed to the five-member preseason all-conference for the second year in a row.

Last season, Morris, a 2008-09 honorable mention State Farm Coaches' All-American, averaged a teambest 16.1 points per game, scoring 20 or more points eight times and eclipsing the 30-point barrier on three occasions, including a 35-point performance vs. DePaul in the Aztecs' first round NCAA tournament game.

Morris led the league in steals in both overall (3.33/g) and conference-only (2.94/g) outings, ranking seventh nationally and becoming the first Aztec to record 100 steals in a season since Falisha Wright in 1993-94. Morris had three or more steals in 20 of her 30 games, including a league-high eight on two occasions, which are the most by an Aztec since 2002.

Her other honors included being named the 2009 MWC Defensive Player of the Year, first-team all-MWC, MWC all-defensive team, MWC Championship all-tournament team and four-time MWC player of the week.

Morris' other 2009-10 preseason honors include being named a third-team All-American by the Sporting News and being tabbed one of 30 candidates for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award.

Awards Aplenty

Jené Morris isn't the only Aztec to have already earned honors this season.

Junior Paris Johnson, a two-year returning starter at center, was named to the MWC preseason all-conference team for the second year in a row. Johnson has been singled out as a possible national "breakout star" by ESPN.com's Charlie Creme, after earning first-team all-league honors as a sophomore when she led the Aztecs in rebounding (8.3/g), blocked shots (94) and field-goal percentage (53.1).

Johnson's former club teammate, Aztec Jessika Bradley, also garnered the program's first-ever Mountain West Conference preseason top newcomer award.

Bradley redshirted a year ago, after spending two seasons at nationally-ranked Baylor. She played in 65 contests for the Bears and averaged 4.8 points, 4.5 rebounds and 1.1 blocks per game as a sophomore, posting a pair of double-doubles, including a 10-point, 10-rebound performance vs. then No. 10 Oklahoma.

Other Things To Watch For In 2009-10

With the build up of what could be the most successful season in Aztec women's basketball history, here are a few things interesting things to look at in 2009-10:

. Three Aztecs are on pace to easily reach the 1,000-career point mark this season. Senior Jené Morris did so in the team's six game of the year vs. South Carolina and currently boasts 1,009 points at SDSU. Classmate Quenese Davis, who has 973 points, and junior Paris Johnson, who has 868 points, are up

SDSU has only had 16 players in its history reach the 1,000-point barrier entering this season with the last being Jamev Cox in 2002-03.

- SDSU has won 10 straight home MWC contests dating back to 2008, after going a perfect 8-0 in 2009. The Aztecs have won 18 straight home regular-season games and are 37-12 on their home court in the last three years.
- The Aztecs have 24 Mountain West Conference wins in the last three seasons after having only 19 in the league's first seven years.
- · Aztec head coach Beth Burns needs eight more victories to reach the 300-win milestone in her career.
- · With her school-record 94 blocked shots in 2008-09, SDSU junior Paris Johnson had more blocks than four teams in the MWC and more than 159 of 328 NCAA Division I schools. Johnson is second in Aztec career history in blocked shots with 159.
- · SDSU will have a pair of sisters on the floor this season with Coco and Quenese Davis and Allison and Ashley Duffy. Paris Johnson's sister Desiree also played for the Aztecs from 2005-07.

Strength Of Schedule

The Aztecs have already had two games against ranked foes in then No. 5/6 Notre Dame and No. 17/20 Oklahoma. SDSU also played two other contests versus foes receiving votes in either national preseason poll with Arizona and South Carolina. Other future Aztec opponents to have been receiving votes so far this season include Auburn, TCU and Wyoming.

TV Time

The Aztecs will have a record seven regular-season televised games. SDSU's game with Arizona on Saturday was carried live on The Mtn., while six of its' MWC regular-season games on TV, including three straight in mid-February. In all, the Aztecs will have five games on The Mtn. and two on CBS College Sports.

The Arena Formerly Known As Cox Arena

The home of the Aztecs underwent a change this past summer, as the facility is now named the Viejas Arena at Aztec Bowl, after being Cox Arena at Aztec Bowl since its inception in 1997.

The change over happened this past July and is part of a 10-year deal. The arena also sports a brand new 26-feet-high-by-15-feet-wide, four-LED video scoreboard. The new center-hung unit features the latest

Pair Sign National Letters Of Intent

San Diego State women's basketball head coach Beth Burns announced the signing Nov. 11, of 6-3 forward Jasmine Porter (Layton, Utah) and 5-10 combo guard Melissa Sweat (Bakersfield, Calif.) to National Letters of Intent. The pair, who are each ranked among the top 100 recruits in the nation, will join the Aztecs in 2010.

Clements. Nahinu Join The Aztecs

San Diego State head coach Beth Burns announced this past May the addition of guard Courtney Clements and center Malia Nahinu to the Aztec basketball roster. The pair of sophomores transferred after playing one season at Arizona and will have three years of eligibility remaining at SDSU starting with the 2010-11 campaign.

2008-09 Rewind

The San Diego State women's basketball team made a remarkable run in 2008-09, highlighted by its first NCAA appearance in 12 seasons, its first postseason victory in 14 years, a share of the regular-season league title and a return to the national spotlight.

Below are a few of the accomplishments of last year's team:

- Posted the program's first 20-win season in 12 years, finishing with a 24-8 overall record and a 13-3 mark in Mountain West Conference play.
- Earned an at-large bid to the 2009 NCAA tournament, defeating DePaul in the first round for the program's first NCAA victory in 14 years (1994).
- Won a share of its first-ever Mountain West Conference regular season title. The Aztecs' previous best finish in the 10-year history of the MWC was tied for fifth in 2007-08.
- Tallied its first win over an AP ranked team in 14 years by defeating then No. 4 and unbeaten Texas, 60-55, to win the San Diego Surf 'N Slam tournament title.
- Earned votes in the Associated Press Top 25 poll six times, a program first since 1997. SDSU ended with five votes in the final ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll.
- Advanced to its second consecutive MWC championship game, after failing to even win a game in the event's first eight seasons.
- · Posted an unbeaten home regular season for just the second time in school history, going 14-0. The record jumped to 15-0 with the NCAA victory over DePaul, before ending against No. 2 Stanford.

Last Year's Numbers

The Aztecs' success also translated into big numbers in the stat columns. Here are some of the 2008-09 team's statistical highlights:

• SDSU led the MWC in assists (15.16/g), steals (11.25/g), blocks (6.09/g) and turnover margin (+4.38), while ranking second in field-goal percentage (.422) and offensive rebounds (13.66/g). The Aztecs' 195 blocks were easily a conference record, beating the old mark of 166 by New Mexico.

- SDSU ended the year ranked sixth nationally in blocks per game, 15th in steals and 19th in turnover margin.
- The Aztecs had 10 or more steals in 21 of 32 games, had five blocked shots in 22 of 32 games, shot above 40 percent in 19 outings and eclipsed the 20-assist barrier in seven contests.
- SDSU set school season records for most threepointers (155; prev. 140 in 2004-05) and most blocks (195; prev. 162 in 1988-89).

More Awards

The awards were aplenty for this past year's Aztec squad, as several individuals were singled out for their achievement.

Guard Jené Morris' was named an honorable mention State Farm Coaches' All-American, becoming just the third SDSU player so honored and the program's first since Falisha Wright in 1994. Morris was also tabbed the 2009 MWC Defensive Player of the Year and was selected first-team all-conference, MWC all-defensive team, MWC championship all-tournament team and four-time MWC player of the week.

Morris and center Paris Johnson became the first Aztecs to ever be named first-team all-Mountain West Conference in the league's 10-year history. Johnson also was a four-time league player of the week, WBCA honorable mention national player of the month and earned a nod on two non-conference all-tournament teams.

Johnson and Morris were joined on the MWC all-defensive squad by guard Quenese Davis, who was a second-team all-league choice and one-time player of the week.

Head coach Beth Burns was also acknowledged for the team's performance by being voted MWC coach of the year, the fourth time she has won such an award in her career.

Ticket To Thrive

San Diego State University was one of 18 institutions or conferences that were selected by the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) to receive a women's basketball grant as part of the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Grant Program, which is in its second year.

The 2009-10 NCAA grant program dedicated approximately \$750,000 nationally to increase awareness, exposure and attendance of women's basketball. San Diego State doubled the grant money it received from the first year of the program and is one of only three schools or conferences to receive a grant for the second straight season.

The San Diego State Department of Athletics' Ticket to Thrive program is in its second year of a five-year community outreach program created with the goal of increasing attendance at Aztec women's basketball games. The program's main objective is to establish a connection between members of the community and the San Diego State women's basketball program and is being partially funded by an NCAA grant.

Burns Named To WBCA Board

This past June, San Diego State head coach Beth Burns was named to the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) Board of Directors. Burns will serve as an at-large representative on the 23-member board until August 2010, as she finishes the current term of Arizona State's Charli Turner-Thorne, who was named the organization's vice president.

This is Burns' first stint on the WBCA Board of Directors, however, she has been an active member of the organization in the past.

The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa in April 8, 2005, and enters the fifth season of her second stint with the Aztecs.

The 2008-09 campaign was the culmination of many years of hard

work by Burns and her staff, as San Diego State posted its first 20-win campaign in 12 years, finishing 24-8 overall and 13-3 in conference action. The Aztecs won a share of their first-ever Mountain West regular season title, advanced to the MWC tournament championship game for the second consecutive year and garnered SDSU's first NCAA bid since 1997. For her efforts, Burns was named the league's coach of the year.

San Diego State has improved by at least six wins every year after her first season back, when the team went 3-24 overall and 0-16 in league play.

In her first stint as head coach from 1989-97, Burns took the SDSU women's basketball program full circle, going from 7-23 her first year to 23-7 in her final campaign. During her eight seasons, she compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular-season titles.

A three-time WAC coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02). She has a 18-year overall head coaching record of 292-212, while her school record stands at 211-147 over 13 seasons.

The game with USD was Burns' 500th as a head coach, while she needs just eight more victories to get to the 300-win plateau.

San Diego State 64, UC Irvine 42

Game 1 ■ Nov. 13 ■ Bren Events Center ■ Irvine, Calif.

IRVINE, Calif. - The San Diego State women's basketball team used a 12-0 second-half run to come out victorious, 64-42, over host UC Irvine in the first game of the 2009-10 season at the Bren Events Center. With the win, the Aztecs claimed their third-straight season-opener to move to 1-0, while the Anteaters dropped to 0-1 following the two schools' first meeting in six years.

SDSU had three players finish in double-figure points, including leading scorer junior Paris Johnson, who notched 11 of her game-high 18 points in the first half. Senior Jené Morris finished with 13 points and junior Allison Duffy contributed 11 points off the bench.

Aztec senior co-captain Quenese Davis had six of the team's 13 assists including the 500th of her career, which came at the 16:18 mark of the first half on a three-pointer by Morris. Johnson had five blocks and eight boards, Morris contributed four steals and forward Jessika Bradley logged a team-high 10 rebounds in her official Aztec debut.

San Diego State got off to a bit of a slow start, as UC Irvine scored the first basket of the game, before the Aztecs' first field-goal at the 17:26 mark by Johnson. The team then reeled off two more baskets to lead by five points, but the Anteaters, using a small line-up, tied the score at seven apiece and were within single digits for a majority of the first half, as SDSU led by only 10 at the half, 32-22.

Coming out the break, the two sides continued to trade baskets, until a three-point play by Allison Duffy at the 17:43 mark sparked an 8-0 run for a more comfortable 18-point advantage at 42-24, heading into the first media timeout. The Aztecs extended their scoring spurt to 12 unanswered on a layup and a pair of free throws, until UC Irvine finally broke through with a three-pointer and another basket to trail by 17 at 46-29.

The SDSU lead rose once again to 22 points with 5:37 left in the contest and never got lower than 16 points, before capturing the 22-point win at 64-42.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team jumped out to a 10-point lead early in the first half and never looked back, limiting visiting University of San Diego to only 19 points through the first 25 minutes of the game and going on to claim a 79-52 victory Tuesday evening at Viejas Arena. With the win, the Aztecs (2-0) won their first two games of a season for the third straight year, while the Toreros fell to 1-1 overall.

San Diego State had four players finish in double-figure points, as senior Jené Morris and junior Jessika Bradley both scored 14, and juniors Jerica Williams, who was a perfect 3-for-3 from beyond the arc, and Allison Duffy contributed 13 points apiece. Bradley added 10 rebounds for her first double-double in an Aztec uniform and junior guard Coco Davis had six of the team's 20 assists on the night.

SDSU senior point guard Quenese Davis recorded five assists and, along with Morris, had four steals on the night to lead the defensive effort.

The Aztecs never trailed, scoring the first point on a free throw by Coco Davis and logging the first field goal on a Morris triple. The Toreros countered with a jumper by Nya Mason and a bucket by Morgan Henderson, but the home team-scored four lay-ups in the paint for an eight-point lead at 12-4.

A Quenese Davis jumper at the 13-minute mark sparked a 7-0 run to put the host up by 13 and would move all the way out to 26 at the half, as San Diego State headed into the locker room on a 15-2 run to make the score 45-19.

The Toreros' offense continued to struggle out of the break, as it failed to score a point until the 14:43 mark with the Aztecs now up by 34 points. The SDSU lead stayed in the upper 20's to low 30's most of the rest of the way until the final buzzer sounded for the team's 79-52 win.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team limited visiting Arizona to only 19 points in each half, as the Aztecs claimed a hard-fought 57-38 victory at the first-ever JHG Jam at Viejas Arena. With the win, SDSU improved to a perfect 3-0 and won its 18th straight regular-season contest on its home floor, while the Wildcats fell to 2-1 following the first meeting between the two sides in 11 years.

The Aztecs were led by junior center Paris Johnson, who logged her 13th career double-double with 18 points and a season-best 10 rebounds to go with four blocked shots and three steals in only 25 minutes of action. Classmate Jessika Bradley matched Johnson's rebounding effort with 10 of her own for her third-straight game in double-figures and also had three blocked shots.

Senior guard Jené Morris was the only other SDSU player in double-figure points with 12, bolstered by a pair of three-pointers. Morris and junior Allison Duffy each recorded four of the team's 14 steals on the night, and junior Coco Davis posted seven points and a game-high seven assists.

The contest proved to be a physical battle from the outset, as both teams guarded each other closely up the floor and contested most every shot. There were four tie scores in the first half, before San Diego State could put some distance between themselves and the Wildcats in the final two minutes until the break. Leading by only two points 21-19, Johnson hit a lay-up in the paint, Morris converted a three-pointer and Bradley made the first of two free throws to send the host into the locker room up 27-19.

The Aztecs used that momentum coming out of the break, going on a 13-2 run in the first five minutes to move out to a 40-23 lead with 14:51 remaining. That advantage grew to as many as 23 points at 50-27 on an Allison Duffy jumper. The SDSU lead dipped below 20 points in the final three minutes, but never fell further than 17, before claiming the 57-38 victory.

ST. THOMAS, UVI - The San Diego State women's basketball team cut a 21-point, first-half deficit all the way down to two with less than 30 seconds remaining, but was unable to pull off the Thanksgiving Day upset, dropping its first game of the season to No. 5/6 Notre Dame, 84-79, in day one action of the 2009 Paradise Jam in St. Thomas, U.S. Virgin Islands. With the loss, the Aztecs fell to 3-1 on the year, while the Irish improved to 4-0.

The senior guard tandem of Jené Morris and Quenese Davis carried the team offensively, as the Aztec front court was saddled with foul trouble most of the day. Morris notched her fifth career 30-point scoring outing, recording 26 of her game-high 32 points in the second half. Morris also tallied all four of the team's three-pointers, came away with six steals and added five rebounds.

Quenese Davis, meanwhile, kept SDSU in the game in the first 20 minutes of play, making six of her 10 shots for 15 of her 25 points, which matched a careerbest. The senior co-captain was a rebound off of a double-double with a team game-high nine and tied for the lead in assists with five in playing all 40 minutes.

Besides Morris and Davis, junior forward Jessika Bradley also scored 12 points to go with eight rebounds, three assists, three steals and two blocks.

The game turned out to be the tale of two halves, as the Aztecs fell behind early, missing six of their first seven shots to trail by eight. Notre Dame, meanwhile, couldn't miss, going up by 10 points at 16-6 and then more than doubling that lead in a matter of just over three minutes, capped by a three-point play by Erica Solomon at 30-9. The deficit hung at around 20 until the 5:49 mark, when SDSU went on a 13-8 run to head into the locker room down by 15 at 44-29.

The Aztecs continued to chip away at the Irish lead coming out of the break, but didn't get to within single-digits until there was just under six minutes left to play on a Bradley lay-up at 69-60. Notre Dame edged their advantage back up to 13 and then 11, before Morris found her touch from outside, nailing three triples on SDSU's next five trips up the floor, including her final one from well beyond the top of the arc to get to within four at 79-75.

San Diego State was within a single basket following two Quenese Davis free throws with 29 seconds remaining, but the Irish made three of their four shots from the charity stripe to preserve the 84-79 victory.
