■ #AztecMBB is coming off its second 30-win season and NCAA Sweet 16 appearance in the last four seasons (2011, 2014).

■ #AztecMBB has reached the NCAA tournament a school-record five straight seasons and the postseason nine years in a row.

■ #AztecMBB has won at least 20 games nine consecutive seasons and has put together six straight 23-win seasons.

■ #AztecMBB has won at least 25 games in five of the last six campaigns, including last year's 31-win effort.

■ #AztecMBB is the reigning Mountain West regular-season champions and now has a league-best eight conference titles.

■ #AztecMBB finished the 2013-14 campaign ranked 13th in the final AP Top-25 Poll and 12th in the USA Today Coaches Poll.

■ #AztecMBB features a roster with 605 career Division I games under its belt, which is more than the 2010-11 roster had entering that season (523). The 2010-11 squad went 34-3 and reached the Sweet 16.

■ With 605 career Division I games played, the 2014-15 #AztecMBB roster is 2014 Mountain West Coach of the Year Steve Fisher's most experienced while at SDSU.

■ #AztecMBB is set to return 63.1 percent of its scoring from last season, 65.2 percent of its rebounding, 58.7 percent of its assists, 85.2 percent of its blocked shots, 63.9 percent of its steals and 67.8 percent of its minutes played.

■ #AztecMBB will welcome a top-15 recruiting class to its experienced roster. The group features one five-star player (Malik Pope), a pair of four-star athletes (Zylan Cheatham, Trey Kell) and a three-star signee (Kevin Zabo).

■ After sitting out a year ago, Angelo Chol and Parker U'u are eligible this season. Chol is a candidate for preseason Mountain West Newcomer of the Year after playing two years at Arizona. U'u, meanwhile, is a transfer from Hartford, who played in 29 games for the 2013 CIT participants.

# Team Notes

- San Diego State returns eight letterwinners off a squad which...
  - Finished 31-5 (16-2 MW) and advanced to the school's fifth consecutive NCAA tournament.
  - Won the program's second outright Mountain West regular-season title and eighth MW championship overall.
  - Advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 for the second time in four seasons.
  - Moved past the second round of the NCAA tournament for the third time in the last four years.
  - Held an AP national ranking for the final 16 weeks, was ranked as high as No. 5 (three straight weeks) and spent six straight weeks in the top 10 (eight overall).
  - Was ranked in the final 16 USA Today Coaches Polls, rose to as high as fifth (three straight weeks) and spent five straight weeks in the top 10 (seven overall).
  - Ended the campaign ranked 13th in the AP poll and 12th in the coaches poll.
  - Won the sixth-most games (tied) nationally with 31.
  - Won at least 23 games for the sixth consecutive season and posted at least 25 in five of the last six years.
  - Won 20-plus games for a school-record ninth straight season, reached the 20-win plateau for the 10th time during Steve Fisher's tenure and the 13th time in SDSU's Division I history.
  - Reached the postseason for a ninth straight season (6 NCAA, 3 NIT).
  - Advanced as far as any other Mountain West school for the second straight season and for the third time in the last four seasons.
  - Ranked second nationally in scoring defense, fifth in three-point field-goal percentage defense, sixth in scoring margin and eighth in field-goal percentage defense.

■ #AztecMBB is one of 13 schools nationally to have won 20 or more games nine straight seasons. The other 12 are Akron, Brigham Young, Duke, Florida, Gonzaga, Kansas, Louisville, Memphis, North Carolina, Ohio State, Pittsburgh and Syracuse.

■ #AztecMBB is the class of California having won 41 straight games vs. schools from the state (since 1996-97). It is the longest such streak vs. California teams in America and ranks ahead of second-place Duke's 10-game winning streak vs. the state.

■ #AztecMBB owns five of the Mountain West's last seven NCAA tournament victories (current members only) after reaching the Sweet 16 in 2013-14.

■ #AztecMBB is one of 17 teams in the nation to have made at least two Sweet 16 appearances in the last four seasons. The Aztecs advanced to the Round of 16 in 2010-11.

■ #AztecMBB is one of 11 teams, and the only team from California, to have advanced to five straight NCAA tournaments.

■ #AztecMBB is one of seven teams in the country to have advanced to five straight NCAA tournaments and win at least 23 games in each of those seasons.

■ #AztecMBB has won 12 of its last 15 games (.800) vs. the current Pac-12 Conference alignment.

■ #AztecMBB has won its last 120 games when leading with five minutes to play.

■ #AztecMBB has won 48 straight non-conference games vs. unranked foes.

■ #AztecMBB loses two top contributors from an NCAA Sweet 16 team in All-American and Mountain West Player of the Year Xavier Thames and MW Newcomer of the Year and all-league third-team performer Josh Davis. Thames led the team in scoring and assists, while Davis was one of the top rebounders in the nation. Despite the losses, SDSU is poised to be just as dangerous in 2014-15 with the return of three starters (**JJ O'Brien**, **Winston Shepard**, **Skylar Spencer**), the MW Sixth Man of the Year (**Dwayne Polee II**), an experienced bench (**Dakarai Allen**, **Aqeel Quinn**, **Matt Shrigley**, **D'Erryl Williams**), a pair of Division I transfers (**Angelo Chol**, **Parker U'u**) and a top-15 recruiting class (**Zylan Cheatham**, **Trey Kell**, **Malik Pope**, **Kevin Zabo**).

■ **Shepard** enjoyed a breakout sophomore campaign in 2013-14, posting career highs in every category. A native of Houston, Texas, the 6-8 forward enters his junior season as the team's leading returning scorer (11.6), rebounder (4.9) and distributor (2.1 apg). The returning starter, who averaged 12.2 points and 5.4 boards in Mountain West action, is one of the most versatile players in the nation. Shepard, an Honorable Mention all-MW performer, can legitimately play four positions and if his sophomore to junior improvement is near what it was from his freshman to sophomore season, he will be that much more of a load for opponents in 2014-15.

■ **O'Brien** enters his senior season as a cornerstone in the #AztecMBB starting lineup having played in 69 games in an SDSU uniform, starting 68 times. The Rancho Cucamonga, Calif., product averaged a career-high

7.8 points and an Aztec career-high 4.7 rebounds last year despite playing with a right shooting-hand injury for a good portion of the season. Prior to injuring his hand in the fifth game of the season vs. Creighton, O'Brien was averaging a team-best 13.5 points on 67.7 percent shooting and 5.5 rebounds, which was the second most on the team. Even after finishing with 15 points vs. Creighton, O'Brien averaged 7.1 points (42.3 FG) and 4.5 rebounds the rest of the season. The honorable mention all-MW pick is poised to enter 2014-15 with a clean bill of health.

■ **Spencer** was the last line of defense for an #AztecMBB defensive unit that ranked nationally in scoring defense and his blocked shot total reflected it. The junior-to-be swatted a San Diego State single-season high 89 shots to give him 140 for his career, which ranks second all-time in school history and is the highest two-year total for any Aztec to wear the Scarlet and Black. Hailing from Inglewood, Calif., Spencer also averaged career highs in scoring (4.8), rebounding (4.3), assists, free-throw percentage and steals. He also shot 56.9 percent from the floor and enters 2014-15 as a career 60.0-percent shooter. One can expect Spencer to continue to evolve offensively as the numbers have shown and still be a menace on the defensive end.

■ **Polee II** came on strong in the second half of last season and the senior looks to continue that trend in 2014-15. Over the final 16 games of the season, the Los Angeles native averaged 10.8 points in 22.4 minutes off the bench with nine double-figure scoring efforts (12 games with nine points or more). In the final five games of the year, he averaged 15.0 points and ended up making 28 of his last 58 three-point field-goal attempts (48.3 percent). His instant offense helped him turn into the upcoming season's second-leading returning scorer at 8.5 per game. Overall, Polee II shot 47.2 percent from the floor, which is the second-best among this season's returners, and a team-best 39.1 percent from three-point distance. He also added 36 steals, which makes him the top returner in the category. Look for his numbers to improve in 2014-15 as he figures to be a centerpiece both offensively and defensively.

■ The bench play was a huge reason #AztecMBB was one of the elite teams in America last season and it returns nearly intact. **Quinn**, a senior, averaged 17.8 minutes in Mountain West action and finished the season with a scoring average of 5.0 points. His 31 assists and 28 three-pointers are both the third-most among this year's returners. **Shrigley**, meanwhile, enjoyed a solid redshirt freshman campaign in 2013-14, averaging 5.2 points in 15.8 minutes. The San Diego native knocked down 35.4 percent of his three-point field-goal attempts and his 40 three-point makes is tops among returners. SDSU also welcomes back the Sacramento, Calif., sophomore duo of **Allen** and **Williams**. Allen, a high-motor player, saw action in 29 games and started once, while Williams, a strong ball-handler, played in 10 of the final 14 games after seeing action in just 10 of the first 22 outings.

■ New to the active roster in 2014-15 will be Arizona transfer **Chol** and **U'u**, a transfer from Hartford. Chol spent his first two seasons with the Wildcats and helped them to a pair of postseason berths, including 2013's run to the Sweet 16. The San Diego native saw action in 63 games and averaged 2.4 points on 51.7-percent shooting and 2.2 rebounds. During his redshirt season a year ago, Chol added muscle to his 6-9 frame and worked relentless on his post moves and mid-range jumper. U'u, meanwhile, spent his true freshman year at Hartford where he helped them to a CIT berth, which marked the program's first postseason appearance. The Sacramento product averaged 1.4 points with 30 of his 41 points coming from behind the arc. The sophomore will provide outside shooting and depth at the wing position.

■ Joining #AztecMBB's experience will be a highly regarded freshman quartet. **Pope** is a five-star forward (Rivals.com) that was rated as high as No. 17 on the Rivals 150 at the time of his signing in November 2013. He ended his career at Laguna Creek High at No. 55 on the ESPN 100. **Cheatham** is also a Rivals 150 player, checking in at No. 78 and with four stars (No. 88 on ESPN 100). San Diego native **Kell** is a four-star player by multiple recruiting sites and finished his prep career at No. 81 on the ESPN 100 and No. 118 on the Rivals 150. **Zabo**, meanwhile, was the first freshman on campus and has worked out with the team since his arrival. The point guard is a three-star signee out of Canada and Brewster Academy in New Hampshire.

- 11.6 ppg, 4.9 rpg, 2.1 apg, 1.0 spg
- Is #AztecMBB's leading returner in scoring, rebounding, assists and free-throws made (128). Is the second-leading returner in steals.
- Returns as the sixth-leading rebounder in the Mountain West (conference games only) after pulling down 5.4 boards in 18 league games.
- Recorded 24 double-figure scoring games and had one double-double last season.
- Led the team in scoring seven times, rebounding three times and assists nine times.
- Committed one turnover or less 10 times in 2013-14, with the Aztecs posting a 9-1 record.

## Skylar Spencer

\*\*\* MW Defensive Player of the Year, All-MW, All-Region Candidate \*\*\*

Junior, Forward, 6-10, 235, Inglewood, Calif. (Price HS)



- 4.8 ppg, 4.3 rpg, 2.5 bpg, 56.9 FG pct.
- Returns as SDSU's and the Mountain West's leading shot blocker, and is the team's third-leading returner in rebounding and steals (25). Is the leading returner in field-goal percentage.
- Ranked in the top 30 nationally in total blocked shots (28th) and blocked shots per game (34th) last season.
- Blocked multiple shots 25 times and had at least one rejection in 33 of #AztecMBB's 36 games.
- Blocked four or more shots 11 times a season ago.
- Posted a personal-best five double-figure scoring efforts and had one double-digit rebounding performance.
- Has played in every game during his two-year career at San Diego State (70).

## Dwayne Polee II

\*\*\* All-MW, All-Region Candidate \*\*\*

Senior, Forward, 6-7, 195, Los Angeles, Calif. (St. John's)



- 8.5 ppg, 3.3 rpg, 1.1 spg, 47.2 FG pct., 75.0 FT pct., 39.1 3FG pct.
- Returns as #AztecMBB's leader in steals, three-point field-goal percentage and free-throw percentage. Is SDSU's second-leading returner in field-goal percentage, three-point field goals (36) and blocked shots (17).
- Is the second-leading returner in the Mountain West in steals per game at 1.3 (conference games only).
- Was strong down the stretch in conference and postseason play as he produced nine double-digit scoring efforts compared to three in non-league action.
- In the final 16 games of the season, he averaged 10.8 points on 50.0-percent shooting and 45.1 percent from three-point

range. During that time, he led the team in three-pointers (12) and shared the lead in steals (23).

- Posted 13 double-figure scoring games, which led all SDSU reserves, and one double-double.
- Led the team in scoring three times and in rebounding twice.

## Angelo Chol

Junior, Forward, 6-9, 225, San Diego, Calif. (Arizona)



- 1.9 ppg, 2.0 rpg, 44.7 FG pct., 63.2 FT pct. (2012-13 at Arizona)
- Eligible this season after sitting out the 2013-14 campaign following his transfer from Arizona.
- Played 8.5 minutes and averaged 1.9 points and 2.0 rebounds as a sophomore for the NCAA Sweet 16-bound Wildcats.
- During his sophomore season, 42.8 percent of his rebounds came off the offensive glass. For his career, 39.7 percent of his rebounds are of the offensive variety.
- As a true freshman, he shot 56.3 percent from the floor and averaged 2.8 points and 2.3 rebounds.
- Is a career 51.7-percent shooter and has connected on 66.0-percent of his free-throw attempts, while standing at 6-9.

## JJ O'Brien

Senior, Forward, 6-7, 220, Rancho Cucamonga, Calif. (Utah)



- 7.8 ppg, 4.7 rpg, 1.1 apg
- Returns as #AztecMBB's second-leading rebounder and distributor, and third-leading scorer.
- Is the third-leading returner in the Mountain West in offensive rebounds in league games only (2.3).
- Recorded eight double-figure scoring games, two games with at least 10 rebounds and one double-double.
- Led the team in scoring and rebounding four times apiece, and in assists three times.
- Has started 68 of his 69 games played at San Diego State. His only did-not-start came on Senior Day in 2012-13. Overall, he has started 89 of his 91 career games.

# STEVE FISHER

24th-Full Season • 16th Season at SDSU • Illinois State, 1967

Steve Fisher has guided the Aztec basketball program to unparalleled heights. In 15 seasons, he has taken a program that regularly missed out on the conference postseason tournament, to one which has become one of the best programs in the country.

When Fisher arrived on the scene in March of 1999, he found a basketball program that wasn't good enough to be called average. The Aztecs had suffered through 13 losing seasons in 14 years. Members of the school's last NCAA team were in the early stages of middle age. The expectations were set. The Aztecs were expected to lose. The year before Fisher's arrival on campus, San Diego State won just four games.

Now those days are a distant memory. Fisher has guided San Diego State to the NCAA Tournament seven times, including five straight with at least one victory in three of the last four years. In 2011, he led SDSU to a 34-3 record and a berth in the Sweet 16. In 2014, the Aztecs nearly matched the 2011 squad by going 31-5 and also reaching the Sweet 16. Fisher has also taken the Aztecs to the NIT four times, including their run to the national semifinals in 2009. San Diego State has currently been to the postseason nine straight years.

On March 26, 1999, San Diego State announced its arrival on the basketball scene when it introduced Fisher as its new coach. Fresh from a stint with the Sacramento Kings and with three appearances in the Final Four and a national championship in his pocket, he rolled up his sleeves and went to work. And work was needed. It looked to be a daunting challenge and yet the man with one of the highest winning percentages in NCAA Tournament history had no reservations.

No head-coaching career, at any level, started quicker than that of Fisher. Six games into his head-coaching career he was undefeated and sporting a national championship ring. And the success didn't stop with the national title.

Fisher's eight-plus seasons at Michigan produced a 184-82 (.692) record, nine postseason tournament berths and three trips to the NCAA championship game, including the magical run to the 1989 national title.

Under Fisher, the Wolverines also claimed an NIT championship, won at least 20 games four times and finished among the top three in the powerful Big Ten Conference

five times. In 1995, Michigan set a league record by holding opponents to just 39.4 percent shooting from the floor.

Fisher and Co., raised the bar even higher in the postseason. His seven NCAA Tournament teams at Michigan combined for a 20-6 record, which put him fourth among active coaches and ninth in NCAA history with a winning percentage of .769 in the national bracket after his stint in Ann Arbor. Only 13 coaches have taken more teams to the Final Four, including just six that are still active. He is one of three coaches to take three squads to the Final Four in the first five years of a head-coaching career, and one of just six coaches to lead a team to a NIT title as well as the NCAA.

His accomplishments may be even greater at San Diego State. In 2001-02 he led the Aztecs to the postseason for the first time since 1985 and for just the fourth time ever. The 21 wins were second most for the school as a Division I program and the most since 1985. The fact that those numbers came after just three seasons signifies what is one of the great turnarounds in college basketball.

He followed that up with a third consecutive season with a .500 or better record in 2002-03 and led SDSU back to the postseason for the second consecutive season for only the second time in the school's Division I history. In addition, SDSU claimed its first Division I postseason victory with a win in the NIT.

In 2006-07, he led SDSU to the MW regular season and tournament crowns and a berth in the NCAA Tournament. That team finished with a Division I then-school-record 24 wins. And the last eight seasons, Fisher has led the Aztecs to eight additional 20-win seasons, including six straight 23-win campaigns, and eight consecutive postseason appearances. In 2011-12, in what was perceived as a rebuilding year, Fisher led SDSU to a 26-8 record, a spot in the NCAA Tournament and its second straight Mountain West regular-season title. Then in 2012-13, Fisher and the Aztecs advanced to the third round of the NAAs for the second time in three years with their third-ever NCAA tournament win. And then in 2013-14, in what also called a rebuilding season, SDSU won the Mountain West and reached the Sweet 16 before finishing 31-5.

**Brian Dutcher**

Associate Head Coach/Head Coach in Waiting  
16th Season at SDSU  
Minnesota '82

One of Steve Fisher's first moves as head coach at San Diego State was to hire Brian Dutcher as his top assistant. Dutcher, 54, was a regional scout for the Sacramento Kings before assuming the role of assistant head coach at SDSU.

When Fisher decides to retire, Dutcher will assume head coaching duties as he was anointed "head coach in waiting" in August of 2011.

Dutcher served as assistant coach and later associate head coach at Michigan under Fisher. He spent 10 seasons on the Wolverine staff, establishing himself as one of the nation's top assistant coaches. His first year in Ann Arbor was 1989 and resulted in a national title for Michigan as he assisted then-interim head coach Steve Fisher on the bench.

Dutcher headed up UM's recruiting efforts in 1990-91 when the Wolverines inked Jwan Howard, Ray Jackson, Jimmy King, Jalen Rose and Chris Webber. The "Fab Five" is considered perhaps the best recruiting class in NCAA history. Dutcher helped lead that group to nearly 100 wins, two berths in the NCAA championship game and a regional final over a four-year period. He was also on the Michigan staff for an NIT championship and a Big Ten tournament title (1998).

Dutcher's recruiting prowess, however, was demonstrated by more than just the "Fab Five" haul. Michigan had the nation's top-ranked recruiting class in 1993-94 and in 1994-95, with a group that included Maurice Taylor and Jerod Ward. The accomplishment marked the first time that a university had the nation's top class in consecutive years.

His efforts at SDSU have gained accolades as well. The first full-year recruiting effort by Fisher, Dutcher and Co., resulted in a consensus top-40 group. Their second resulted in a top-25 class without counting a pair of high-profile transfers. Eleven seasons ago, Dutcher helped attract SDSU's first McDonald's All-American. In 2004, freshmen Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter earned starting spots and all-league recognition. Dutcher was a key figure in bringing in classes that produced three NBA draft picks the last four seasons, the No. 24 class in 2012 and a top-15 group in 2014. He also helped land Tulane transfer Josh Davis, who ended up being the MW Newcomer of the Year, and Arizona transfer Angelo Chol at the start of summer 2013.

Dutcher is firmly entrenched as one of the nation's top recruiters after showing that his rapport is as strong with potential student-athletes on the West Coast as it was in the vaunted Big Ten.

Dutcher was born Oct. 30, 1959, in Alpena, Mich. He attended Bloomington (Minn.) Jefferson High School and went on to earn a bachelor's degree in physical education from Minnesota in 1982. While an undergraduate, he worked for his father, then-Minnesota head coach Jim Dutcher. He then spent one season in the prep ranks at Apple Valley (Minn.) High School before becoming a graduate assistant at Illinois, where he earned his master's degree in physical education and athletic administration.

While in Champaign, Dutcher helped Lou Henson lead the Illini to a Big Ten title, two appearances in the Sweet 16 and one regional final.

Dutcher's first full-time coaching job came at South Dakota State, where he spent three seasons helping turn around the Division II program before departing in 1988 for Michigan.

His final season in Ann Arbor ended with the Wolverines claiming the first-ever Big Ten Tournament championship.



**Justin Hutson**

Assistant Coach  
7th Season at SDSU  
CSU Bakersfield '94

Justin Hutson enters his second season of his second stint at San Diego State after returning to Montezuma Mesa following a two-year stay at UNLV where he was the associate head coach. This year is his seventh overall at SDSU (2006-11, 2013-present).

When Hutson returned to America's Finest City in April of 2013, he became reunited with Fisher, Brian Dutcher, Mark Fisher, David Velasquez and Matt Soria, a group with which he spent five seasons. During their tenure, the Aztecs went to the postseason five times and averaged 25.4 wins per year, which includes six postseason victories. In 2009, SDSU advanced to the NIT semifinals and in 2011, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 en route to a 34-3 record and a No. 6/11 (AP/Coaches) final ranking. At the Mountain West level, the Aztecs won the 2010 and 2011 tournament titles and the 2011 regular-season crown.

Hutson was part of a staff that set numerous school records and in the last three years of his first tenure with the Aztecs, Hutson took on the role of defensive coordinator and helped SDSU lead the Mountain West in scoring defense in 2009, 2010 and 2011.

Upon his return, Hutson helped the 2013-14 team to a 31-5 record, an MW regular-season title, an appearance in the Sweet 16 and a final national ranking of No. 13/12. Defensively, the Aztecs ranked first in the MW in scoring defense (2nd nationally), field-goal percentage defense (8th), three-point field-goal percentage defense (5th), steals (35th) and turnover margin (13th).

In both of his stints, Hutson has played a pivotal part in San Diego State's recruiting efforts as the team's recruiting coordinator. He was instrumental in securing a pair of nationally recognized recruiting classes, including the No. 15 class leading into the 2009-10 campaign, which included 2011 NBA first-round draft pick Kawhi Leonard and the recently departed four-year starter Chase Tapley. That class was also rated the top group among non-automatic qualifying BCS schools by a pair of recruiting sites. Hutson also recruited Jamaal Franklin, a two-time All-American, and 2013 second-round NBA draft pick of the Memphis Grizzlies, and 2014 NBA draft pick Xavier Thames. The 2014-15 incoming class, his first of his second stint at SDSU, meanwhile, is regarded as a top-15 class nationally.

Prior to his decision to return to San Diego State, Hutson helped UNLV to a pair of 25-plus-win seasons and two NCAA tournament appearances. He played a key role in helping the Rebels bring in a highly regarded recruiting class in 2012-13, which included the 2013 No. 1 overall NBA draft selection, Anthony Bennett, a player he recruited.

Before arriving at SDSU in July 2006, Hutson served as an assistant coach at Cal Poly.

The Mustangs went 10-19 in 2005-06, doubling their previous season's win total. He was responsible for recruiting the 2006 Big West Freshman of the Year and landing two freshmen on the Big West all-freshmen team, along with bringing two first-team all-Big West selections and the defensive player of the year to San Luis Obispo in 2006-07.

Prior to his stint at Cal Poly, Hutson served as the head varsity coach at Bakersfield High School where he led the Drillers to a CIF Central Section Championship and four appearances in the playoffs in four seasons. His 2004 team was ranked as high as No. 22 in the nation and fourth in California, while his 2003 squad finished the season with a 25-5 record and won the section title. Prior to entering the high school ranks, he was an assistant coach at his alma mater CSU Bakersfield for two seasons (1999-00).

As a collegiate player, Hutson enjoyed a storied career, winning two NCAA Division II championships at CSU Bakersfield. In the 1993 championship season, the Roadrunners were undefeated with a 33-0 record and followed that up with a 27-6 record during the 1994 season.

David Velasquez enters his 13th season at San Diego State and second as an assistant coach. Prior to his appointment as an assistant coach, he spent six seasons as the program's director of player development.

Velasquez's responsibilities include recruiting, on-court coaching, skill development and academics.

As an assistant, Velasquez is heavily involved in player development. In his previous role, he spent countless hours with former and current Aztecs analyzing their performance in games and in practice on video. Now, he applies those sessions on the practice floor.

Velasquez also plays a huge role in the performance of Aztecs in the classroom. The Bay Area native works directly with San Diego State's academic advisors, tutors and mentors to ensure standards are met.

What may go unnoticed is his relationship with players. As a former SDSU men's basketball student-athlete and recruit host, Velasquez understands all of the virtues that an Aztec basketball player possesses, which allows him to relate to the entire roster.

In his first season as an assistant, Velasquez helped ink a consensus top-15 recruiting class, while helping the Aztecs enjoy one of their finest seasons ever, which culminated in 31 wins, a Mountain West regular-season title and an NCAA Sweet 16 berth.

As San Diego State's director of player development, Velasquez assisted the basketball coaching staff with video breakdown, film exchange, travel, community service and handled many of the day-to-day office duties.

Prior to his current position, Velasquez was a student manager for the 2002-03 season before serving as head manager from 2003-07.

In 2002-03, San Diego State earned a berth to postseason NIT, where the Aztecs picked up their first Division I postseason tournament victory en route to an appearance in the second round.

Then in 2005-06, San Diego State won the Mountain West with a 13-3 league record before winning the MW tournament. As a result, the Aztecs advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the second time under head coach Steve Fisher and won a then school-record 24 games.

Fisher awarded Velasquez a scholarship in December 2006 and was added to the active roster in January 2007.

As an official playing member of the team, Velasquez played in four games and recorded a steal. He was a member of a team that finished with a 22-11 record and advanced to the second round of the postseason NIT.

In Velasquez's five seasons as manager, the Aztecs went to the postseason three times and won 22 or more games twice.

Following his graduation from San Diego State in May 2007, Velasquez was hired at the University of the Pacific later that month. As the Tigers' graduate manager, he assisted with UOP's camps, created highlight tapes and coordinated film exchange before returning to his alma mater.

Since his return, SDSU has recorded seven more 20-win seasons, including six with at least 23 victories, and reached the postseason in each of the last seven years. More recently, Velasquez has helped the Aztecs earn an NCAA tournament berth five years in a row, win the first five NCAA Tournament games in program history and reach at least the third round of the Big Dance in three of the last four seasons, including two Sweet 16 appearances.
