Aztec Basketball Vies For Surf 'N Slam Championship Tuesday vs. No. 4 Texas

The San Diego State women's basketball team will try to claim its first San Diego Surf 'N Slam title Tuesday when

the Aztecs take on the fourth-ranked team in the nation, undefeated Texas, at 7 p.m. PT at Cox Arena. SDSU will put its perfect 5-0 home record and current four-game win streak on the line for its final regular season non-conference contest of the 2008-09 campaign. The Aztecs are 8-3 on the year and will take on their third ranked opponent of the season in the No. 4/4 Longhorns, who enter this week as one of just eight teams in the nation without a loss.

San Diego State advanced to the championship of the Surf 'N Slam for just the second time in the tournament's four-year history by defeating Sacramento State on Sunday, 75-47. Texas, meanwhile, shutdown in-state foe UTEP later in the afternoon, 79-40.

UTEP and Sacramento State will square off in the consolation game at 5 p.m. PT on Tuesday, followed by the championship game between the Aztecs and Longhorns. The title contest will feature a live audio call by Chris Ello, while a live video feed and live stats will be available for both games on the Aztecs' official website, goaztecs.com.

Aztecs Roll Past Sacramento State In Tourney Opener

Behind sophomore Paris Johnson's 27 points and 13 rebounds, the San Diego State women's basketball team cruised to a 75-47 victory Sunday afternoon over Sacramento State (2-10) in the first game of the San Diego Surf 'N Slam at Cox Arena. With the victory, the Aztecs, who improved to 8-3, advanced to the tournament finale against fourth-ranked Texas, who downed UTEP 79-40.

Johnson (San Diego, Calif.) made 11 of her 12 shots from the field for her fourth 20-point scoring effort of the season. She also matched a career high with 13 rebounds for her fifth double-double of 2008-09, and had three steals in only 29 minutes of action.

Aztec guards Jené Morris (San Francisco, Calif.) and Quenese Davis (Sacramento, Calif.) both scored in double-figures with 12 and 10 points respectively, while adding four steals apiece. Davis

back baskets by Layton-Bailes. The Hornets didn't get on the board until the 15:54 mark and the Aztecs quickly moved their lead into double-figures at 13-3.

SDSU was up by 12 points at the 11:40 mark, but Sacramento State cut its deficit down to eight on three occasions, before the Aztecs reeled off five straight points to go up by 13 at 26-13.

The Hornets made it interesting, closing to within six points, before San Diego State went into the break on an 8-0 run for the 37-23 advantage.

The Aztecs continued to find the basket coming out of the locker room, outscoring the visitors 16-2 within the first six and a half minutes to go up by 28 points. SDSU would eventually lead by as many as 37 points with 7:14 left before securing the 75-47 win.

Other Sacramento State Game Notes

- SDSU's 28-point margin of victory is its largest this season and biggest overall since beating Air Force by 30 points on March 8, 2008.

- The Hornets' 16 field goals were the fewest by an Aztec opponent, while their 47 points tied a low with Northwestern State.

- SDSU has not trailed at any point in four of its eight victories.

- Thirteen Aztecs saw action during a game for the third time this season.

- SDSU has committed fewer than 20 turnovers in each of its last five contests and in six of its last seven outings. The Aztecs began the year with 20 or more in four straight games.

Johnson Tabbed For MWC POW Award



For the second consecutive week, an Aztec basketball player has been named Mountain West Conference Player of the Week, as sophomore center Paris Johnson was honored for her performance in the team's win over Sacramento State on Sunday.

This is Johnson's second career weekly honor and she follows in the footsteps of SDSU guard Jené Morris, who was tabbed for the same award last Monday.

Johnson led the Aztecs to a spot in the championship game of the annual San Diego Surf 'N Slam Classic, with a 75-47 victory over Sacramento State at Cox Arena. She made 11 of her 12 shots from the field, including a perfect 6-for-6 mark in the second half, for a game-high 27 points, her fourth outing with 20 or more points this season. Johnson also matched her career best with 13 rebounds for her fifth double-double of 2008-09.

She added three steals, two assists and a blocked shot in just 29 minutes of action against the Hornets. Johnson's shooting percentage of 91.7 ranks fourth in Mountain West Conference game history and is the best by a league player (min. 10 field goals made) since November 2006.

For the year, Johnson leads the Aztecs in both scoring (16.7 ppg.) and rebounding (8.5 rpg.), while ranking first in the league in blocked shots with 30.

50-50

For the second consecutive game, San Diego State shot above 50 percent from the field as a team, recording a

season-best 50.9 mark in the win over Sacramento State.

The Aztecs also made exactly half their field goals in the win over Loyola Marymount. The last time SDSU posted consecutive 50 percent field-goal shooting performances was a year ago in wins over Colorado State (53.8) and Air Force (50.0).

San Diego State is third in the Mountain West Conference with a 43.1 field-goal percentage.

Topping 20

With Paris Johnson's 27 points vs. Sacramento State, San Diego State has had five different players score 20 or more points in a game nine times in 2008-09.

In all, six players on this year's roster have at least one 20-point scoring game in their career. The career totals in that category are: Paris Johnson (8, including 4 in 2008-09), Jené Morris (8), Quenese Davis (3), Jennifer Layton-Bailes (2), Allison Duffy (1) and Jerica Williams (1).

Five Is For Her

For the fifth time this season and the eighth time in her career, Aztec sophomore center Paris Johnson reached double-figures in points and rebounds in the same contest.

Johnson matched her career best with 13 boards in the win over Sacramento State and scored a team-high 27 points. All but one of her double-doubles have come in SDSU wins and every time she has reached doublefigures in rebounds, she has also done so in points.

Johnson ranks second in the MWC in that category this season, trailing only UNLV's Shamela Hampton (6). On the year, the Aztecs have already combined for six double-doubles after posting seven in 2007-08.

Forcing Some TOs

Sacramento State had 29 turnovers in Tuesday's game, the ninth time and fourth consecutive outing that an SDSU opponent has had more than 20 giveaways this season.

The Aztecs leads the Mountain West Conference in turnover margin with a +4.27 mark, averaging only 19.3 turnovers to their opponents' 23.5 per game.

A year ago, San Diego State forced 20 or more opponent turnovers in 25 of 31 games and easily set a league record for best-ever turnover margin of +5.81.

Steals Are All Around



With its 16 steals against the Hornets, San Diego State has tallied 50 in its last three games. The Aztecs have 10 or more steals in seven contests, after compiling double-figures in that category 22 times in 2007-08.

On the year, SDSU continues

to lead the MWC with 11.55 per outing. The Aztecs were ranked 39th nationally in that category entering last week. Individually, Jené Morris is first in the league with 3.33 per game, while classmate Quenese Davis is second in the MWC with 2.73 a contest.

season can be attributed to point guard Quenese Davis.

Davis has six or more assists in eight of the 11 contests, including in six of the last seven games. She had a season-best nine assists against Loyola Marymount and continues to lead

the league in that category by a healthy margin with 6.0 an outing. Davis entered last week ranked 11th nationally in assists per game.

She now has 378 for her career, which leaves her in third place in the Aztec record book. Only two SDSU players have ever reached the 400 mark, All-American Falisha Wright (448) and Crystal Lee (413).

5-0 At Home

San Diego State will looking to stay perfect at home this season when the team takes on No. 4 Texas on Tuesday. The Aztecs are 5-0 at Cox Arena following their win over Sacramento State, winning their first five home games in a season for the first time since the 1995-96 team was a perfect 13-0 at Peterson Gym.

A Big December

With a 4-0 start, San Diego State has continued to find great success during the winter month of December. The Aztecs are 13-3 over the last three campaigns with two of those losses coming against ranked opponents in No. 2 UConn and No. 17 George Washington.

In the Beth Burns' first year of her second stint in 2005-06, all three of SDSU's season wins came in the month of December when the Aztecs were 3-4.

Fast Facts: SDSU in Regular Season Home Tourneys

► This year marks the fourth straight season that SDSU has played host to a tournament. Prior to 2005, the last time the Aztecs had a home tournament was in November 2000, when SDSU went 1-1 at the Pacific Bell Classic.

SDSU did not play host to a regular-season tournament in Beth Burns' first stint as head coach from 1989-97.

►SDSU women's hoops has played host to 18 home tournaments in its previous 32 years of existence. SDSU is 17-2 in the first game of a home tournament and has won the team title nine times, including each of the first four.

► SDSU has split each of its last six home tournaments. The team won the first game and lost the second in 1998, 1999, 2000 and 2006, and did the opposite in 2005 and 2007.

► The Aztecs are participating in two non-conference tournaments in the same season for the second year in a row, but just the second time since 2000.

SDSU is playing a ranked team in the San Diego Surf N Slam championship game for the second time in two chances (also vs. No. 17/16 George Washington in 2006).

Notes With A 'W'

An SDSU victory over the Texas will mean:

SDSU claims its first-ever San Diego Surf 'N Slam title and improves to 5-3 overall in the four-year history of the event.

SDSU wins its first non-conference tournament since 1993, when the team west 2-0 at the Santa Clara Diet Pepsi Shoot-Out in Santa Clara, Calif.

► SDSU improves to 9-13 all-time against teams out of the Big 12, and beats its first Big 12 opponent since defeating Kansas State in December 1997. The Aztecs even the series with Texas at one game apiece.

► SDSU is 6-0 at home in 2008-09, winning its first six home games in a year for the first time since 1995-96.

► Is 9-1 against teams it did not face a year ago.

 \blacktriangleright SDSU logs its fifth straight victory, matching its two, five-game win streaks from last season.

► Ends its 2008-09 non-conference slate with a 9-3 record. The Aztecs have won its final non-conference regular season game of a season for the ninth time in the last 10 years (all but 2006-07).

► Improves to 14-3 during the month of December over the last three seasons.

Texas enters Tuesday's contest ranked fourth in the nation with a perfect 11-0 record ... Aztecs Earn Vote In AP Poll

For the first time in over 10 years, the SDSU women's basketball team received a vote in the Associated Press Top 25 poll, released Monday, Dec. 22.

The last time the Aztecs garnered votes during the regular season was back in March 1997, when SDSU had 15 votes before playing its NCAA tournament game against Oregon in Knoxville, Tenn.

Overall, the Aztecs have appeared in the Associated Press poll 40 times with their last actual ranking coming in 1995, when the team ended up 22nd following a 24-6 campaign.

Paris' Party

Of SDSU's 71 blocks in the 11 outings, 30 have been credited to sophomore Paris Johnson. Johnson had five in the opener with Northwestern State and turned the trick again against Montana State to tie for 10th on the SDSU single-game list. The five trail her career-best of six vs. TCU in the 2008 MWC tournament.

Johnson now has 84 for her career in just two short seasons. She ranks seventh in school history and needs 11 more to tie for the sixth spot with Brooke Meadows (95). Only five Aztecs have reached the century mark in SDSU history.

In 2008-09, Johnson is first in the league and was 12th nationally in blocked shots last week. Her 30 blocks are 12 more than any other MWC player.

The 6-4 center led the conference in blocks per game with 1.74 in 2007-08, following in the footsteps of her sister, Desiree, who ranked first in the MWC in both 2005-06 and 2006-07.

Also In The Rankings

Besides the categories already mentioned, SDSU also continues to lead the Mountain West in blocked shots (6.45/g), offensive rebounds (15.00/g) and assists (15.91/g).

Paris Johnson ranks second in the league in scoring per game (16.7 ppg.) and is first in offensive rebounds (3.36/g). Her 55.3 season field-goal percentage is third.

Other 2008-09 Notes

- The Aztecs' 50 rebounds against Northwestern State are program's most since 2000, when they also had 50 against Northern Arizona.

- Jerica Williams' 14 boards vs. Northwestern State are the most in Beth Burns' second stint as head coach and most overall since Ashlee Dunlap had 17 at Washington State on Dec. 22, 2003.

- SDSU rejected a record 15 shots against Northwestern State, the most ever by a Mountain West Conference team in the league's 10-year history. The Aztecs beat the previous mark of 14 held by New Mexico.

- Sophomore center Paris Johnson was selected to the six-player all-tournament squad at the Waikiki Beach Marriott Classic in Honolulu, Hawaii. She averaged 22.7 points and 8.3 rebounds in the three games, shooting 78.9 percent from the field and recording a career-best 31 points vs. the host Wahine.

- SDSU has had two different players reach the 30-point barrier this season in Paris Johnson (31 pts. vs. Hawai'i) and Jené Morris (34 pts. vs. Iowa State). Morris' 34 points are the most by a player in the MWC this season, while Johnson's 31 tie for second. - With the help of the U.S. Marine Corps, the Aztecs posted a season-high for home attendance with 1,681 fans against UC Riverside. The figure ranks third in the 12-year history of Cox Arena.

- SDSU has had four different starting line-ups this year, after having only three a year ago. Eight different Aztecs have started at least one game in 2008-09.

- SDSU had three players score 20 points or more in the same game vs. Montana State. The last time the Aztecs accomplished that feat was in 1992 against Colorado State.

- Jené Morris recorded a career-high eight steals in a win over LMU, which are the most by a player in the Mountain West Conference since 2007. The eight tie her for fourth in the league's single-game record book and are the most by an Aztec since Veronica Shaw also had eight in a win over Sacramento State in 2002.

- San Diego State scored 85 points in consecutive 85-70 wins over LMU and Montana State. The last time the Aztecs scored at least 85 points in consecutive games was in 1999, when SDSU defeated San Jose State, 89-51, on Jan. 28, and Fresno State, 89-68, on Jan. 30.

- The Aztecs have won their last 45 games when scoring 80 or more points with the last defeat coming in 1992 against Fresno State (L, 84-86).

- Jené Morris was named the Mountain West Conference Basketball Player of the Week on Dec. 22. Morris helped the Aztecs erase a five-point halftime deficit by scoring a game-high 26 points in a win over Loyola Marymount.

- Jené Morris and Paris Johnson are the first Aztecs to win more than one MWC weekly honor in their careers since the league formed in 1999-2000. Overall, only eight Aztecs have been named MWC player of the week.

- The Aztecs have six or more blocked shots in seven of their 11 contests, leading to a perfect 7-0 record.

Strength Of Schedule

SDSU's current 2008-09 schedule includes four teams ranked or receiving votes in the AP top 25 in No. 1 UConn, No. 4 Texas, New Mexico (25) and TCU (rv).

San Diego State also has 13 games scheduled versus schools who advanced to either the NCAA tournament or WNIT in 2008.

Preseason Points

The San Diego State women's basketball team, which

advanced to last season's league championship game, was picked to finish second in the Mountain West Conference in 2009 in a vote by the MWC's nine head coaches and select media members released Oct. 14, at the conference's annual media day in Las Vegas, Nev.

In addition, two Aztecs, Jené Morris and Paris Johnson were selected to the five-player preseason all-Mountain West Conference team.

Aztecs Sign Two Guards TO NLIs

Head coach Beth Burns announced the signing of two, 5-9 guards, Ashley Duffy (Lakeside, Calif.) and Kiyana Stamps (Moreno Valley, Calif.), to National Letters of Intent. The pair will join the Aztecs in 2009.

2007-08 Rewind

The San Diego State women's basketball team posted its best season in over a decade in 2007-08, compiling an 18-13 record and advancing to the championship game of the Mountain West Conference tournament.

Below are a few of last year's team accomplishments:

• Posted the program's first winning season and most victories since 1996-97.

 Advanced to its first MWC championship game and became the highest seed to do so in conference tournament history.

• Logged its first-ever MWC championship victories and its first conference tournament wins since 1997.

• Recorded the program's most-ever MWC wins (7) and highest-ever MWC regular-season finish (t-5th).

• Beat BYU for the first time since 2001, won in Las Vegas for the first time since 1997, won at Colorado State for the first time since 2000 and defeated TCU for the first time since it joined the MWC in 2006.

Tournament Town

San Diego State University and Cox Arena at Aztec Bowl will play host to the 2009 NCAA Women's Basketball First & Second Rounds, March 21 & 23.

SDSU was one of eight additional venues selected last February for 2009 by the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Committee, which voted to expand from eight to 16 first- and second-round sites.

This year's event in San Diego will feature four schools vying to advance to the NCAA regionals.

Cox Arena has served as the host site for three other NCAA championship events, including the 2001 and 2006 Men's Basketball First & Second Rounds and the 2001 Women's Volleyball Final Four, since the facility opened in the fall of 1997.

SDSU has played host to NCAA women's basketball games three times previously in Peterson Gym in 1984, 1994 and most recently in 1995.

TV Time

The Aztecs will have a record seven regular-season games televised either live or shown via tape delay in 2008-09. SDSU's game with UConn was shown on a tape delay basis on The Mtn., while the USD contest was picked up by Channel 4 San Diego.

The Aztecs will kick-off MWC play at home against Air Force on CBS College Sports. SDSU has three more conference outings live on The Mtn., followed by the contest at BYU, which will be rebroadcast on the The Mtn. at 7 p.m. PT on Feb. 26.

SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns



The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa in April 8, 2005.

In just four short years, she already has the program headed in the right direction, as the Aztecs' posted their best season

in over a decade in 2007-08, going 18-13 overall and advancing to their first-ever MWC championship game.

Burns helped the Aztecs to a 7-9 mark in MWC play in 2008, to finish in a tie for fifth with Brigham Young. The Aztecs' seven league wins and fifth-place showing is their best-ever in the history of the MWC.

In her first stint as head coach from 1989-97, Burns took the SDSU women's basketball program full circle, going from 7-23 her first year to 23-7 in her final campaign. During her eight seasons, she compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular-season titles.

A three-time WAC coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02). She has a 17-year overall head coaching record of 273-204, while her mark school record stands at 192-139 over 12 seasons.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team won its seasonopener for the second consecutive year, defeating visiting Northwestern State, 67-47, at Cox Arena. With the victory, the Aztecs improved to 1-0 on the year, while the Lady Demons dropped to 0-1 following the two schools' first-ever meeting.

SDSU had four players finish in double-figure scoring and combined for 15 blocked shots, the most ever by a Mountain West Conference team in the league's 10-year history.

Aztec sophomore center Paris Johnson posted her fourth career double-double with a game-high 14 points and 12 rebounds to go with five blocked shots, which tie for 10th in the SDSU single-game record book. Sophomore Jerica Williams, playing in her first game in the Red & Black, posted nine points and 14 rebounds, 11 of which came in the first half. Williams' 14 boards are the most by an Aztec since December 2003.

Junior guard Quenese Davis added 13 points and eight assists. Sophomore Coco Davis had 11 points and senior Jennifer Layton-Bailes, playing in her first game since 2007, tallied 10 points and three blocks.

San Diego State never trailed in the game, going up by four points on three occasions, including at 12-8 with just over minutes left in the first half. The Aztecs increased that lead to six on a layup by Layton-Bailes, but the two sides failed to record a point over the next four minutes. Lady Demon Britany Kinlaw broke the stalemate with a jumper to put her team down by just four points at 14-10. Two Johnson free throws sparked an 8-0 SDSU run and the home team went into the locker room up by 13 at 28-15.

Northwestern State got to within 10 on three occasions coming out of the break, but the Aztecs matched the Lady Demons bucket for bucket, pulling away with a 20-point advantage at 49-29. SDSU never looked back, coasting to an eventual 20-point, 67-47, victory.

The Aztecs forced 30 Lady Demon turnovers and had 50 rebounds, the team's most in a single outing since 2000.

The Aztecs got a spark off the bench from true freshman Kalena Tutt, as the center scored the first five points of her career to keep the team close. A Quenese Davis three-pointer cut the Torero lead to just two at 28-26, and then Coco Davis followed that effort up with a jumper and two straight steals and three-point plays to put SDSU ahead by four points, 34-30, heading in to the locker room.

Out of the break, USD rode the hot shooting of forward Kiva Herman, who finished the game 9-for-11 from the field, to not only erase the deficit, but also go up by as many as nine points at 51-42 with 7:55 remaining.

The SDSU offense, which managed just six points in the first 11:45 of the second half, finally woke up as a Jennifer Layton-Bailes' jumper kick started a 14-4 run that put the Aztecs back ahead 56-55 with just over three minutes left.

HONOLULU - Sophomore center Paris Johnson had a career-high 31 points to help the San Diego State women's basketball team defeat Hawaii, 71-48, in the first day of the Waikiki Marriott Beach Classic at the Stan Sheriff Center in Honolulu, Hawaii. With the win, the Aztecs ended a two-game losing skid to move to 3-2 on the year, while the Rainbow Wahines dropped to 0-4 after the two schools' first meeting since 1999.

Johnson made her first five shots and ended up with a career-high 31 points on 15-for-19 shooting, beating her previous best of 27 points last year against Indiana State. Johnson is the first Aztec to reach the 30-point barrier this season, while her 15 field goals tie for ninth in the SDSU single-game record book. The 6-4 center also led SDSU with seven rebounds and a pair of blocked shots.

Senior forward Jennifer Layton-Bailes, who made her first start since January 2007, added a season-best 13 points and Quenese Davis had nine points and six assists.

The Aztecs got off to a quick start, going inside to Johnson, who hit each of her first four shots from the field for eight points by the first media timeout to put SDSU ahead, 11-5. Johnson also made her fifth-straight field-goal attempt, but the Rainbow Wahine used almost 60 percent shooting from the field to draw even at 18-18 with just over 10 minutes left in the half.

San Diego State came out of the 18-18 tie with a 6-0 run and held Hawai'i to just five points the rest of the way, heading into the locker room up by 15 points, 38-22.

The Aztecs continued to put points on the board coming out of the break, jumping ahead by 21 points at 46-25 with 16:26 left. Hawai'i drew to within 13 point with just over five minutes remaining, but two straight Johnson lay-ups started a 11-0 scoring run and SDSU went on to win by 23 points 71-48.

San Diego State shot a season-best 49.2 percent from the field, tallied 14 steals and forced 27 Hawai'i turnovers, including 20 in the first half alone.

HONOLULU - The San Diego State women's basketball team had three, 13point leads early in the game, but had to hold off several charges by Prairie View A&M to earn the 58-53 victory in the second day of the Waikiki Marriott Beach Classic at the Stan Sheriff Center in Honolulu, Hawaii. With the win, the Aztecs improved to 4-2, while the Lady Panthers dropped to 1-5.

Sophomore center Paris Johnson, who had a career-high 31 points on Friday, came back for the second day in a row with 23 points on 9-for-15 shooting and also tallied eight rebounds and three blocked shots. Senior forward Jennifer Layton-Bailes posted her first double-double of the year and the third of her career with 15 points and 10 boards in her second start of 2008-09.

Junior Quenese Davis tallied six assists for the second straight outing, while also hauling in six rebounds and notching three steals and two blocked shots in 38 minutes of action. Her sister Coco Davis had a career-high seven rebounds and came away with three steals, giving the sophomore 12 steals in her last three games.

San Diego State got off to a solid start with an early 5-0 lead. After a Lady Panther basket at the 17:30 mark, the Aztecs added to their advantage with another two buckets and at 9-4, went on an eight-point run to go up by 13 at 17-4. The Aztecs led by as many as 13 again at 29-16, but carried a 10-point half-time lead at 35-25.

The Aztecs continued their momentum coming out of the break with another 13-point lead at 38-25. After the initial offensive burst of the second half, the SDSU offense stalled and the Lady Panthers crept all the way back to within just three points following a 10-0 run at 38-35 at the 13:16 mark. Prairie View A&M tied the score at 41 points, but Jerica Williams tallied her second three-pointer in the half and the Aztecs were once again in the lead at 44-41.

The game continued to be a battle with the Lady Panthers down by just one at 52-51 with 4:57 remaining. The Aztec tandem of Johnson and Layton-Bailes struck again with back-to-back baskets for a five-point advantage. From there, the SDSU defense took over, limiting the Lady Panthers to just two points in the final 4:57 to come away with the 58-53 win.

HONOLULU - Playing its fourth game of the week and third in the last three days, the San Diego State women's basketball team made 10 three-pointers, but could not hold off a hot shooting lowa State team, as the Aztecs fell to the No. 25/22 Cyclones, 87-71, in the final day of the Waikiki Marriott Beach Classic at the Stan Sheriff Center in Honolulu, Hawaii. With the loss, the Aztecs dropped to 4-3, while the Cyclones improved to 5-1.

Aztec junior guard Jené Morris had a season-best 34 points, one off her career high of 35. Morris was 5-for-10 from beyond the arc and 12-for-24 overall and also had four assists, three steals and four rebounds. Sophomore center Paris Johnson recorded her third double-double of the

season with 14 points and 10 rebounds and tied a career-best with three steals. For the tournament, Johnson averaged 22.7 points and 8.3 boards an outing. Junior guard Quenese Davis was the third Aztec in double-figures with 13

points, including three triples. She had seven assists to only one turnover and ended up with 19 helpers over the three-game stay in Hawaii.

The first three field goals of the game were all three pointers, as the Aztecs hit two and ISU knocked down one.

SDSU took its first four-point advantage of the first half at 10-6 on a Johnson lay-up. The Aztecs were also up by four on four other occasions with the last one coming at 20-16. Iowa State came back to tie the score at 20 apiece and took its first lead of the game on a three-pointer by Heather Ezell at 23-22. The Cyclones added two more triples in a row and were up by seven at 29-22 with 6:48 left in the half.

ISU added to their lead with a jumper from the foul line to go up by nine at 31-22. A Johnson free throw finally broke the streak at the 5:33 mark, but Cyclones again answered with their fourth straight three-pointer to go up by 11 points.

Again answered with their bornt straight three-pointer to go by T points. Quenese Davis responded with her own set of three pointers and the Aztecs trailed by seven at 36-29. The lowa State lead was 43-35 heading into the lock-er room with the help of a 50 percent mark from beyond the arc (6-for-12). The Cyclones continued their hot shooting in the second half, scoring the first 10 points, including two more three-pointers, until Morris ended the drought with a triple from the left baseline with 16:55 left. SDEL but tegether its own scoring run of pipe unapproved to get the lead to

SDSU put together its own scoring run of nine unanswered to cut the lead to single-digits at 53-44. The rest of the contest was a battle on both sides of the ball as cut the deficit down to 75-65 with 3:11 left. ISU, however, made all 10 of its free throws in the final 2:10 to claim the 87-71 victory.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State's Jené Morris hit the game-winning basket at the buzzer to help the Aztec basketball team defeat the visiting UC Riverside Highlanders, 54-52, Thursday evening at Cox Arena in front of a crowd of 1,681 fans. The Aztecs trailed by as many as eight points in the first half and failed to score for over five and a half minutes mid-way through the second half, but outscored the Highlanders 9-3 in the final 2:43 to pull out the win. With the victory, SDSU improved to 5-3 on the season, while UCR dropped to 2-4 overall.

Morris hit her first four three-point field goals of the evening and finished 5-for-6 from beyond the arc for a team-best 19 points to go with three steals and three assists. Morris was the only Aztec in double-figure scoring as senior Jennifer Layton-Bailes had nine points on 4-for-6 shooting. Junior point guard Quenese Davis led the team in rebounding (7) and assists (7) in 37 minutes of action

SDSU opened the game with a 3-0 lead on a Morris three-pointer, but the Highlanders quickly matched her effort with a triple of their own to tie the score at 3-3. UCR took the lead on a free-throw at the 18:21 mark and held the advantage until a 7-0 Aztec run put the home team in front 12-10. A Kemie Nekele

A Kemie Nekele three-pointer restored order in the visitor's favor and UC Riverside led by a game-high eight points at the half, 29-21, behind a 54.5 shooting percentage. The Aztecs, meanwhile, shot just 29 percent from the field in the first half, but came out of the locker room with two Morris three-pointers in the first minute and a half to get to within four at 31-27. The Highlanders led by six points at 39-33 and by five at 41-26, but a Davis three-pointer and a jumper inside from Paris Johnson helped SDSU even the score at 41 points. Following the game's sixth tie score at 45-45, neither side could get its offense going as the teams went without a point for the next three minutes when

offense going as the teams went without a point for the next three minutes when the Highlanders made back-to-back buckets in the paint to once again lead by four. 49-45.

Morris' final three-pointer of the game broke the Aztecs' scoring drought at 49-48, and Layton-Bailes converted a long distance two-pointer from straightaway for a one-point lead at 50-49. UCR was not done, however, erasing a threepoint Aztec advantage and knotting the game at 52-52 with just 21 seconds remaining

Coming out of a timeout, Morris hit the winning basket from the right elbow just before the buzzer sounded for the 54-52 victory.

SAN DIEGO - Three Aztec basketball players reached the 20-point barrier to help the team remain perfect at home, as San Diego State downed the visiting Montana State Bobcats, 85-70, Thursday evening at Cox Arena. With the win, the Aztecs improved to 6-3 on the year, while the Bobcats fell to 4-4 overall.

Aztec sophomore center Paris Johnson had the best all-around game of her career, posting a game-high 22 points to go with 13 rebounds, six assists, five blocks and three steals in 35 minutes for her fourth double-double of the season. Johnson's six assists were a career-best, while her 13 rebounds and three steals matched a career-high.

Johnson was helped offensively by Quenese Davis' 20 points and Jennifer Layton-Bailes' 20 points, which matched her career-best. Davis also had six assists and junior Jené Morris and sophomore Jerica Williams each had four of the team's season-high 16 steals.

SDSU never trailed in the game, coming out of the gate on a 9-0 run off backto-back baskets by Johnson, a jumper by Davis and a three-pointer from Layton-Bailes. The Bobcats scored their first points of the game at the 16:34 mark on a three-point field goal by Nubia Garcia. San Diego State's lead grew to double-figures on a Layton-Bailes jumper at 15-5, but MSU put up a scoring run of its own, tallying nine straight to get back to within one.

Williams, who along with Layton-Bailes hit her first four shots of the game, stopped the Bobcat run with the first of three straight three-pointers over a span of just a little over a minute and a half to go back up by nine. The Aztecs continued to make plays, increasing their advantage to as many as 24 points, before heading into the locker room up 21 at 48-27, their highest first-half scoring output of the season.

Coming out of the break, Montana State began to get hot offensively, cutting the Aztec lead down to just 12 points on two occasions behind nearly 60 percent shooting from the field. The Bobcats never got any closer, though, as the Aztecs pushed their lead to 18 with 6:44 left and went on to win by 15 points, 85-70, to improve to 3-0 at home this season.

SDSU had a season-best 24 assists and its 85 points were also a seasonhigh after scoring 71 against both Hawai'i and No. 25 Iowa State last month.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team outscored Loyola Marymount by 20 points in the second half to rally to its second consecutive 85-70 victory Sunday afternoon at Cox Arena. The Aztecs, who trailed at the break by five points, improved to 7-3 on the season and a perfect 4-0 at home, while the Lions lost their second straight, dropping to 8-3 in 2008-09.

Junior Jené Morris had a spectacular all-around game, leading the charge in the second half by scoring 19 of her game-high 26 points. The guard added a career-high eight steals, seven rebounds and two blocks to go with a season-best eight assists compared to just two turnovers.

She was helped offensively by sophomore Paris Johnson's 16 points, eight rebounds and three blocks and junior Quenese Davis' 16 points, nine assists and four steals in 37 minutes of action. Sophomore guard Jerica Williams was the fourth Aztec in double-figures with 12 points, five rebounds and four assists.

The Aztecs got off to a shake start, as the visiting Lions made five or their first six shots of the game to surge to a 10-2 lead. LMU was also up by eight at 12-4, before SDSU logged a 7-0 run capped by a Morris three pointer to get to within just one point at 12-11. The Aztec eventually tied the score at 16 points apiece and took their first lead of the afternoon on a free throw by LaSandra Dixon at 17-16 with 12:13 left.

The two sides traded leads three more times with LMU heading into the half up by five points at 42-37, following a phenomenal heave from beyond half court at the buzzer by Cassady Moore.

Johnson scored the first bucket coming out of the locker room to put the Aztecs down by just three points at 42-39. After two Lion free throws, Morris began to take over the game, scoring eight straight points in a stretch of just 1:13 to put the hosts ahead by three at 47-44.

Davis took over where Morris left off in the scoring column, notching the next five points of the game to help SDSU to a 15-0 run in a two-minute span for the 10-point advantage at 54-44.

San Diego State would widen the gap to 13 points at 64-51, but did not allow LMU to get closer than eight points, as the Aztecs turned in the hard-fought 85-70 victory.

SAN DIEGO - Behind sophomore Paris Johnson's 27 points and 13 rebounds, the San Diego State women's basketball team cruised to a 75-47 victory Sunday afternoon over Sacramento State (2-10) in the first game of the San Diego Surf 'N Slam at Cox Arena. With the victory, the Aztecs improved to 8-3 on the season and advanced to the tournament finale.

Johnson made 11 of her 12 shots from the field for her fourth 20-point scoring effort of the season. She also matched a career high with 13 rebounds for her fifth double-double of 2008-09, and had three steals in only 29 minutes of action.

Aztec guards Jené Morris and Quenese Davis both scored in double-figures with 12 and 10 points respectively, while adding four steals apiece. Davis contributed a game-high five assists and senior Jennifer Layton-Bailes tallied eight points and five boards.

San Diego State led the entire contest, opening with a quick 5-0 advantage on a Davis free throw and back-to-back baskets by Layton-Bailes. The Hornets didn't get on the board until the 15:54 mark and the Aztecs quickly moved their lead into double-figures at 13-3.

SDSU was up by 12 points at the 11:40 mark, but Sacramento State cut its deficit down to eight on three occasions, before the Aztecs reeled off five straight points to go up by 13 at 26-13.

The Hornets made it interesting, closing to within six points, before San Diego State went into the break on an 8-0 run for the 37-23 advantage.

The Aztecs continued to find the basket coming out of the locker room, outscoring the visitors 16-2 within the first six and a half minutes to go up by 28 points. SDSU would eventually lead by as many as 37 points with 7:14 left before securing the 75-47 win.

The Aztecs shot above 50 percent from the field for the second consecutive outing to garner their fourth straight win. SDSU, which is a perfect 4-0 in the month of December, forced 29 Hornet turnovers and posted 16 steals.
