Aztec Men's Golf Heads North This Week to Compete in USC Invitational

The San Diego State men's golf team returns to the fairways this week when it travels north for the USC Invitational, Feb. 23-24, in Westlake Village, Calif. USC will serve as host for the 54-hole tournament, which gets underway Monday with a shotgun start at 7:30 a.m. PST. The 12-team field will play at the par-71, 6,869 yard North Ranch C.C. A link to Golfstat's live scoring will be available on the home page of GoAztecs.com.

The two-day event features a field of 12 teams, including seven schools which currently rank in the top 50 according to the Golfweek/Sagarin performance index. The field is led by fourth-ranked host USC, No. 6 Stanford, ninth-ranked Washington and No. 19 UCLA. The Aztecs will also meet Brigham Young (84th), California (30th), Fresno State (105th), Loyola Marymount (123rd), Oregon (70th), Oregon State (73rd), Pacific (93rd), Pepperdine (40th) and UC Irvine (52nd). San Diego State enters the week at the 29th spot, according to the latest Golfweek/Sagarin rankings released Feb. 18.

USC is the defending team champion while USC's own Tim Sluiter is the defending individual champion.

Following the USC Invitational, SDSU will have a one-week hiatus before returning to action March 9-10 at the Fresno State Lexus Classic in Fresno, Calif. San Diego State looks to defend its team championship as it has won the event in 2007 and 2008. In last season's event, then-freshman Matt Hoffenberg completed regu-

lation in a tie atop the individual leaderboard, but lost on the third sudden-death playoff hole to Texas' Charlie Holland.

This Week's Lineup

Head coach Ryan Donovan will employ a youthful lineup this week as the Aztecs head north to the Los Angeles area. Leading the way are sophomores Johan Carlsson and Matt Hoffenberg. The lineup also includes a trio of freshman with Andrew Cooley, Alex Kang and J.J. Spaun making the trip for the Scarlet and Black. Senior Ryan Citarella will also represent SDSU and play as an individual.

This tournament marks the spring debut for Spaun, who competed in three events during the fall campaign. Carlsson, Cooley, Hoffenberg and Kang were all part of the squad that finished as runner-up at the Arizona Invitational earlier in the month.

Hoffenberg is currently first on the squad this year with a 71.67 stroke average, carding a season-best 4-under-par 67 in the third round of the Arizona Intercollegiate en route to a second place finish with a 9-under-par 204 overall. Carlsson is not far behind, currently holding a 72.40 stroke average while having 90.0 percent of his rounds count towards the team score. Cooley, meanwhile, has a 72.46 average and is tied with Spaun (73.33 stroke average) for the lowest 18-hole score this season (66). Citarella, meanwhile, fired a 1-over-par 217 (71-73-73) at the Sycuan Collegiate Invitational during the fall to tie for 46th position on the final individual leaderboard.

This will mark the third time that this lineup has competed for the Aztecs. The five some previously led the Aztecs to a third place showing at the 2008-09 season-opening Washington Husky Invitational (Sept. 29-30) and a runner-up finish at the Turtle Bay Resort Invitational (Nov. 10-12).

On Deck

Following the USC Invitational, SDSU will have a one-week hiatus before returning to action March 9-10 at the Fresno State Lexus Classic in Fresno, Calif. San Diego State is the defending team champion and have won the event the last two years. In last season's event, then-freshman Matt Hoffenberg completed regulation in a tie atop the individual leaderboard, but lost on the third sudden-death playoff hole to Texas' Charlie Holland.

Carlsson Named Mountain West Conference Golfer of the Month

Sophomore Johan Carlsson was named the Mountain West Conference men's golfer of the month as announced by the league office on Nov. 19. The award is the first of his career.

Carlsson, a product of Gothenburg, Sweden, helped the Aztecs to a third-place finish at the Rees Jones Intercollegiate on Daufuski Island, S.C. in early November, followed by a second-place team finish at the Turtle Bay Resort Intercollegiate in Kuhuku, Hawaii.

Carlsson recorded five rounds below 70 during the fall campaign, including two during the month of November.

Freshmen Fantastic

San Diego State's freshman class is among America's best. The class currently rank fifth on the Golfstat Top 25 Freshman Class Impact Ranking. As a class, the SDSU freshmen hold a 73.15 stroke average, according to Golfstat. Only Alabama, Akron, Mississippi and Oregon rank ahead of the Aztecs.

Last Time Out

Despite a runner-up individual finish by Hoffenberg, San Diego State fell short of a third round comeback and had to settle for second place at the Arizona Invitational in Tucson, Ariz. The Aztecs shot a 6-over-par 858 at the par-71, 6,793 yard course, competing the 54-hole event just three shots behind tournament champion Pepperdine (+3). Rounding out the top five team finishers was Tennessee (+10), UNLV (+14) and East Tennessee State (+14).

Matt Hoffenberg drained six birdies during the final round to finish the tournament at 9-under-par (69-68-67 – 204) to take the runner-up spot on the individual leaderboard and match his career-best 54-hole score in relation to par. He finished just three strokes back of Tennessee's Chris Paisley (-12), who claimed medalist honors.

Andrew Cooley concluded tournament play with a 9-over-par 222 to place in a tie for 31st position. Johan Carlsson rebounded from a second-round 81 by shooting a 1-under-par 70 in the final round. He moved up 31 spots on the individual leaderboard on the final day to finish in a tie for 44th.

Completing final round scoring for SDSU were freshman Alex Kang and senior David Palm. Kang couldn't duplicate his second-round 1-under-par performance, and finished with a 12-over 225 (t-51st). Palm rebounded from a second-round 81 by shooting a 75 in the final round. He finished the tournament with a 13-over-par (t-54th).

Two Former Aztecs Named to MWC 10th Anniversary Team

Former San Diego State men's golf standouts Aaron Goldberg and Mark Warman were named to the Mountain West Conference 10th Anniversary Men's Golf Team, as selected by a combined panel of media, institutional and conference personnel and online fan poll. In order to be eligible for consideration, candidates must have been a first-team all-MWC selection at least once in their careers.

A native of Encinitas, Calif., Goldberg earned first-team all-MWC accolades three times (2006-08) and was named the league's player of the year in 2008. Goldberg was named the MWC golfer of the month five times in his Aztec career, joining Ryan Moore of UNLV as the only two players to be recognized on a least five occasions since the league's formation in 1999-2000. A two-time All-American, Goldberg became the first SDSU golfer to gain All-America status in consecutive seasons since Kris Moe accomplished the feat in 1983-84. Goldberg ended his Aztec career with two individual tournament titles and currently owns the top 54-hole individual score in the SDSU record books (68-66-67-201 at the 2006 District 7 Shootout).

Warman, meanwhile, earned first-team all-MWC honors each of the three years he played for the Aztecs (2002-04). The San Clemente, Calif., product claimed medalist honors at the 2003 U.S. Intercollegiate, a tournament in which he shot a 62 which stands as the lowest individual 18-hole score in the SDSU record books. The MWC player of the month in March 2002, Warman was also an All-American candidate his senior season and was named one of Golf World's top 50 "Players to Watch" in 2004.

Head Coach Ryan Donovan

Coming off San Diego State's best season since 1982 and the Aztecs' best showing during his tenure, San Diego State alumnus Ryan Donovan is now in his sixth season as the leader of the Aztec men's golf program. With Donovan at the helm, SDSU placed in the top 14 in all 15 outings with the 15th tournament being a 14th-place finish at the NCAA Championships. Overall, the Aztecs compiled a 266-21 head-to-head record and finished 20th in Golfstat's final collegiate poll.

Individually, Donovan helped a pair of athletes in senior Aaron Goldberg and junior David Palm earn All-America accolades. Additionally, both were all-Mountain West Conference and all-Southwest Region selections. Other players to earn season-ending honors under Donovan were matt Hoffenberg (MWC freshman of the year, all-MWC, all-Southwest Region) and Johan Carlsson (all-Southwest Region). Donovan himself was named the Eaton Golf Pride Division I Coach of the Year for the southwest region given

out annually by the Golf Coaches Association of America.

In 2006-07, SDSU secured three team tournament titles and reached the NCAA Regionals for the team's ninth straight appearance. Aaron Goldberg had one the program's finest campaigns, finishing with a scoring average of 70.71, while recording seven top-five finishes and capturing medalist honors at the District 7 Fall Shootout on his way to being named an honorable mention PING All-America honors, the program's first such honor since 2001.

The 2005-06 season was equally impressive as Donovan guided SDSU to three team tournament victories and its eighth consecutive NCAA regional appearance. Three Aztec golfers - seniors Andrew Scott and Josh Warthen and sophomore David Palm - all claimed individual titles during the season, while Scott and Goldberg garnered all-Mountain West Conference accolades.

Donovan was a four-year competitor for the SDSU golf squad from 1997- 2001. His most successful season came as a junior when he posted five top-30 finishes.
