Aztecs Put Eight-Game Homecourt Win Streak on the Line Saturday Night Against Western Michigan at Cox Arena

San Diego State (6-1 overall), off to its second best start in the last 23 seasons, opens a stretch of six of the next eight games at home on Saturday night against Mid-American member Western Michigan (4-3).

Game time is at 7:30 p.m. PT (a change from the original game time of 7 p.m. PT see right box). There is no live television for the contest but the game can be heard on AM 600 KOGO.

On Tuesday night, San Diego State became just the third school in the country to win five road/neutral games (joining Butler and USC), with a 78-56 victory over Loyola Marymount. Despite playing without junior forward Kyle Spain (sprained ankle), the Aztecs never trailed and posted their largest margin of victory in a road game since Nov. 29, 1988.

Junior center Ryan Amoroso led the way with season-high tying 19 points and a game-high tying seven rebounds. He connected on 7-of-12 shooting from the field. For the third time this season, junior forward Lorenzo Wade added 18 points on 8-of-12 shooting from the floor. Freshman guard D.J. Gay added a career-high 11 points.

For the fourth time in five games the Aztecs shot better than 50 percent from the field, connecting on 54.2 percent from the floor. The Aztecs have won 14 consecutive games when owning a field goal percentage of 50 percent or better.

San Diego State continues to show remarkable balance through seven games. The Aztecs have five players averaging in double figures (including freshman forward Tim Shelton who is out for the season), eight players averaging 5.3 points or more and eight players averaging 22 or more minutes per game.

Western Michigan enters the game with a 4-3 record, including a quality 83-76 victory over 25th-ranked Davidson on Nov. 21. The Broncos have won three of their last four games and return 13 letterwinners, including all five starters, off a team that handed San Diego State its first loss of the 2006-07 season.

Aztec fans are sure to remember last year's game, when SDSU entered the contest with an 8-0 record, only to fall in Kalamazoo, Mich., 84-73. The Aztecs placed five players in double figures, but couldn't overcome 22 turnovers and a 21-13 discrepancy at the free throw line.

The Aztecs are looking to extend an eight-game home court winning streak dating back to Jan. 3, 2007. The streak is tied for the 11th longest homecourt win streak in the 87 seasons of Aztec basketball. A victory on Saturday, would move the streak into a tie for ninth place on the SDSU charts.

The Aztecs will conclude the two-game homestand on Tuesday night, when San Diego State plays host to UC Riverside. Game time is set for 7 p.m. PT.

Game Time

The San Diego wildfires in late October forced the postponement of the SDSU-BYU football game until Saturday, Dec. 1. Because the football game is scheduled to begin at 3:30 p.m. PT, the SDSU-Western Michigan men's basketball game has been pushed back to a 7:30 p.m. PT start.

Please note, this start time is different than on all printed materials.

San Diego State Cruises to 78-56 Victory at Loyola Marymount

LOS ANGELES - San Diego State rebounded from its first loss of the season by defeating Loyola Marymount, 78-56, at Gersten Pavilion to record its largest winning margin on the road since 1988.

The visiting Aztecs were in control throughout as they led wire-to-wire and jumped out to a 21-4 lead. SDSU was able to maintain its 17-point advantage for the rest of the half thanks to its dominating play inside. At the break with the Aztecs ahead, 43-26, SDSU had scored 28 of its points inside the paint.

In the second half, Loyola Marymount slowly chipped away at the Aztecs' lead reducing its deficit to 12 with 12:14 left in the game. Nearly 1:30 later, Lorenzo Wade took control of the game and scored nine straight points to give SDSU a 20-point lead with 9:06 remaining.

San Diego State increased its lead to 24 and never allowed the Lions to get closer than 16 points as the Aztecs cruised to the 22-point win.

Ryan Amoroso led SDSU with 19 points and seven rebounds, while Wade had 18 points.

Billy White, who shared game-high rebounding honors with Amoroso, also had a game-high four steals to go along with eight points. Freshman classmate D.J. Gay poured in a career-best 11 points on the strength of 3-of-5 shooting from behind the arc.

Starting for an injured Kyle Spain, Kelvin Davis scored seven points and had a career-high six rebounds.

Noting the Loyola Marymount Game

▶ SDSU's 22-point margin of victory was the largest for the Aztecs this season and the largest since defeating Campbell, 119-82, on Dec. 12, 2006. It was the largest margin of victory in a road game since defeating Baylor, 83-58, on Nov. 29, 1988.

▶ The 22-point victory was the largest for San Diego State in the 25 road games played at Loyola Marymount.

▶ The 6-1 record marks San Diego State's second best record after seven games in the last 23 seasons. The only time since the 1984-85 season that the Aztecs owned a better record was last year when SDSU was 7-0 en route to opening the season with eight consecutive wins.

▶ Ryan Amoroso tied a season-high with a game-high 19 points. The junior scored in double figures for the third time this season and the 12th time in his career. This is the second time he has led the Aztecs in scoring. In addition to leading the Aztecs in scoring, Amoroso tied for game-high honors with seven rebounds and connected on 7-of-12 shooting from the field.

▶ Lorenzo Wade reached double figures for the third consecutive game, the sixth time this season and the 28th time in his career with 18 a season-high tying 18 points. The junior connected on 8-of-12 shooting from the field and added four assists and three steals in the game.

▶ The Aztecs led wire-to-wire tonight, marking the second time this season and the 23rd time in the Steve Fisher era that San Diego State has not trailed in a game. Having led the entire game at Fresno State and at Loyola Marymount, this marks the first time SDSU has not trailed in two road victories in the same season under Fisher.

▶ The Aztecs have responded from their last six losses with victories. They are also 19-4 in the game following their last 23 defeats.

▶ San Diego State has three road wins, half of its 2006-07 season total of six. The Aztecs also have five away/neutral victories this year after only having eight last season.

▶ SDSU has now won seven straight games against the West Coast Conference and three in a row this year.

▶ San Diego State shot 54.2 percent from the floor, marking the fourth time in the last five games the Aztecs have shot over 50 percent from the field. The Aztecs have won 14 consecutive games and are 53-12 in the Steve Fisher era when shooting 50 percent or better from the floor.

A Quick Look at Western Michigan

▶ Western Michigan is 4-3 this season with a 3-3 mark in away/neutral games.

▶ In their only home game, the Broncos defeated No. 25 Davidson, 83-76, for their seventh straight home opening win.

▶ WMU was ranked No. 23 in the CollegeInsider.com Preseason Mid-Major Top 25 and come to San Diego as the first team outside of the top 25.

▶ Center Joe Reitz leads the team in scoring (14.4) and rebounding (6.0) and is followed in the scoring column by sophomore guard David Kool (14.1) and junior forward Derek Drews (11.0).

▶ The Broncos are coming off a 77-65 loss at Valparaiso on Wednesday, but got 16 points from Reitz to lead a group of four players who reached double figures. Following the game, Western Michigan traveled back to Kalamazoo, Mich., and will make its second trip out west.

▶ Earlier this season, WMU played three games in three days in Eugene, Ore., at the World Vision Invitational and went 1-2 with its victory coming against Pepperdine and its two losses coming at the hands of Pacific and No. 11/13 Oregon.

San Diego State-Western Michigan: The Series

- ▶ Not much history here as Saturday's game marks just the fourth meeting between the Broncos and the Aztecs, with WMU owning a 2-1 edge in the series. Prior to its meeting last season, the teams had not played each other since Dec. 23, 1974.
- ▶ Aztec head coach Steve Fisher served as an assistant head coach at Western Michigan for three seasons. On April 19, 1979, WMU head coach Les Wothke hired Fisher as an assistant coach. It marked the first job at the Division I level for Fisher, who had been the head coach at Rich East (Ill.) High School. Fisher helped the Broncos to a 42-41 record in his three seasons and a 1981 MAC regular season championship in his final season in Kalamazoo.
- ▶ Both Fisher and assistant head coach Brian Dutcher are familiar with the Midwest and the state of Michigan. In addition to his time at Western Michigan, Fisher was an assistant coach at Michigan from 1982-89 and served as the head coach from 1989-97. Dutcher was an assistant coach at Michigan from 1988-98. The two teamed up to provide the Wolverines with their only men's basketball national title to date in 1989 and made appearances in two more national title games in 1992 and 1993. In all, Fisher compiled a 184-82 (69.1 percent) record in Ann Arbor, with seven NCAA Tournament appearances.
- ▶ San Diego State assistant coach Mark Fisher is a 2001 graduate of the University of Michigan.

San Diego State vs. MAC

- ▶ San Diego State is 6-11 all-time against the current configuration of the Mid-American Conference. This marks just the third time in the Steve Fisher era that the Aztecs have faced a team from the MAC. On Dec. 29, 1999, Ball State defeated SDSU at Cox Arena, 82-65.
- ▶ Steve Fisher is 12-2 against teams from the MAC (5-0 vs. Central Michigan, 4-0 vs. Eastern Michigan, 1-0 vs. Bowling Green, 2-1 vs. Ball State, 0-1 vs. Western Michigan).

Last Aztec-Bronco Game

Western Michigan 84, San Diego State 73 | Dec. 2, 2006 | University Arena | Att.: 3,218

KALAMAZOO, Mich. - San Diego State had its 8-0 start to begin the season ruined by Western Michigan as the Broncos handed the Aztecs their first defeat of the season, 84-73, at University Arena.

SDSU had five players score in double figures, but could not overcome 22 turnovers that led to 21 WMU points.

Mohamed Abukar led the way for the Aztecs with 17 points on 6-of-11 shooting, including 3-of-4 from three-point distance. Jerome Habel added 14 points and seven rebounds, while Lorrenzo Wade contributed 12 points and a career-best eight rebounds off the bench.

The starting backcourt tandem of Brandon Heath and Richie Williams added 13 and 12 points, respectively, but combined to shoot 7-for-24 with nine turnovers.

At the start of the game, San Diego State led by as many as eight, but lost the lead on a three-pointer by David Kool with 12:42 left in the first half.

As the half came to a close, SDSU found itself up by four with 2:19 remaining, but the Broncos went on a 9-0 run to end the half and went into the locker room up 44-39.

In the second half, WMU increased its lead to seven, but the Aztecs went on a run of their own to take a seven-point lead with 7:36 left in the game.

Just as SDSU did, the Broncos went on their own 11-2 spurt to regain the lead and never looked back.

WMU's Andre Ricks was the game's high scorer with 29 points on 10-of-17 shooting. Teammate Joe Reitz added 18 points and seven rebounds, while Andrew Hershberger grabbed 10 rebounds.

Road Warriors

With San Diego State's win on Tuesday night over LMU, the Aztecs became just the third school in the country to win five road/neutral games this season. SDSU's company is an elite group as Butler is 6-0 on the year and Southern California is 5-1.

Top 25 Effort

Through games of November 28, STATS LLC has San Diego State ranked in the top 25 in the nation in both three-point field goal percentage and overall field goals made. At 44.4 percent from behind the arc, the Aztecs are ranked No. 13 in all of America. After connecting on 194 baskets, SDSU finds itself tied for 25th place nationally with UNC-Asheville. In field goal shooting percentage, San Diego State is the 38th-best team in the U.S.

Robbery Suspects

The Aztecs have been making the art of stealing a regular thing this season. In every game this year, SDSU has recorded at least seven steals including 15 at San Diego and a season-high 19 at Loyola Marymount. Of the 128 turnovers San Diego State has forced, 57.0 percent or 73 total thefts have come via the steal. As of Friday morning, the Aztecs were 24th nationally in steals. Through seven games in 2006-07, SDSU had only 57 steals.

Consistently Consistent

Prior to making his first start at LMU as an Aztec, Kelvin Davis had been a steady force off the bench for the Aztecs this season. The transfer from the College of Southern Idaho had scored in double figures in each of the previous five games, including a career-high 17 points at California. In those five games, Davis posted a field goal and three-point field goal percentage of at least 50 percent and connected on at least two three-pointers in each of those contests. For the season, he ranks third on the team in scoring and just seventh in minutes played.

Shelton Out

Freshman forward Tim Shelton will miss the rest of the 2007-08 season after undergoing surgery to his left knee on Tuesday, Nov. 20. The Fresno, Calif., native started the first three games of the season, missed the UCSD game due to swelling in his knee, but returned for the game at San Diego in a reserve role. In four games, Shelton was averaging 10.0 points on 55.2 percent shooting and 4.8 rebounds.

Making it Rain

The Aztecs have made at least six three-pointers in every game this year. This season's squad became the first team in Steve Fisher's tenure to knock down at least six three-pointers in the first six games of a season after it made a season-best 11 at California. The streak is currently at seven games.

Triple Threat

San Diego State has five players averaging double figures and a fifth boasting an average of 8.4 points per game so it comes as no surprise that the Aztecs have had at least three players score in double figures in every game this year, something it did not do to begin last season. It is, however, the first time SDSU accomplished the feat since doing it in Games No. 22-28 last year.

Winning By Double Digits

The Aztecs' season-opening four wins, before its five-point win at USD, were all by double-digit margins. It was the first time since the 2002-03 season SDSU had accomplished such a feat. During their NIT in 2002-03, the Aztecs won at Houston (71-61) and defeated Florida Atlantic (91-75), IPFW (74-58) and Loyola Marymount (79-79) at home. In fact, prior to its game at Houston, SDSU beat Hawai'i at home by 11 (60-49) making the win over the Lions its fifth in a row by at least 10 points.

White's House Party

Billy White, making his first appearance at Cox Arena on Nov. 17 vs. UCSD, found himself in the starting lineup and did not disappoint. The Las Vegas native connected on his first nine shots before missing with under six minutes left in the game and went on to put back his missed attempt. For the game, White was a 10 of 11 from the field for a game- and career-high 20 points, had a game-high tying nine rebounds, a game- and career-best three blocked shots and one steal in a team-best 29 minutes.

White became the first Aztec to make at least 10 field goals in a game this season. His three blocks are also a 2007 team best. The freshman's 20-point performance was the first by an Aztec freshman since the 2004-05 season when Matt Thomas scored 20 vs. Air Force on Feb. 28, 2005. White's nine rebounds were also the most by an SDSU freshman since Kyle Spain grabbed 12 in the championship game of the MWC tournament vs. Wyoming on March 11, 2006.

White's 10-11 shooting exhibition ranks in a tie for fifth place on San Diego State's individual game records list for best field goal percentage in game

A Victory Almost Guaranteed

Kyle Spain has scored in double-figures in every game this season and the Aztecs have won five of them. History says that when Spain scores at least 10 points, the Aztecs are almost guaranteed a win. As a freshman, San Diego State was 11-2 when the junior scored in double figures and 5-0 last season. For his career, Spain and the Aztecs boast a outstanding record of 21-3 when he reaches double digits in the scoring column.

Shooting the Lights Out

With the exception of the Cal game, the Aztecs have shot the ball extremely well. Overall, San Diego State is shooting 49.6 percent from the field. More impressive is the fact that six players are shooting at least 50.8 percent. Compared to last season, only two SDSU players finished the season with a field-goal percentage above 50 percent.

After seven games, San Diego State has shot over 50 percent four times and at least 46 percent from the field in six games. All six of those games resulted in wins.

Contributions from the New Guys

Five of the top eight players when looking at minutes played and points scored are newcomers. Those five include Ryan Amoroso, Kelvin Davis, D.J. Gay, Tim Shelton and Billy White. Their contributions have certainly been felt early on. Between the five of them, they put up a triple double vs. Portland and at Fresno State. The quintet is responsible for 57.6 percent of the team's points, 57.1 percent of rebounds and 44.3 percent of assists. To the right is a cumulative points, rebounds and assists chart for the first seven games.

74 is the Magic Number

Reaching the 74-point plateau seems to bring good fortune for the Aztecs as they have done so 39 times since the beginning of 2005-06, including four times this year. In those 39 games, San Diego State has a record of 36-3. The 18 times SDSU didn't hit the 74-point mark the past two seasons, it wound up losing 11 of them. Coincidentally, 10 of the 18 occurrences have happened away from Cox Arena. Of the six times San Diego State didn't reach the magic number and won, five were at home. The only time it happened away from San Diego and won was this year's opener vs. Liberty and at San Diego.

Freshmen in Starting Lineup

With junior point guard Richie Williams serving a team suspension earlier this year, true freshman D.J. Gay earned the starting nod in the season-opening game against Liberty. Tim Shelton, another true freshman, also found himself in the starting five as well vs. the Flames. Gay and Shelton became just the 10th and 11th freshmen to start a season opener under Steve Fisher. Only four times before had a freshman started a season opener under Fisher at SDSU and that oddly was Williams in 2005 at Alaska Fairbanks. Gay and Shelton joined elite company as only Juwan Howard, Jalen Rose, Chris Webber, Jerod Ward, Albert White, Bradley Jackson, Steve Sir, Brandon Heath and Williams have received the starting nod from Fisher as freshman to open a season.

Locking Down

San Diego State has used a stifling defense for the better part of 40 minutes in each game this year. Dating back to last season, the Aztecs have held 21 of their last 23 opponents to 74 points or less and have held 15 of their last 22 opponents to less than 45 percent from the field.

In SDSU's last 21 games, San Diego State's foes are a combined 523 of 1,228 (42.5 percent).

Just this year alone, the Aztecs have held six of seven opponents to 74 points or fewer and four to under 42.2 percent shooting. SDSU opponents are also averaging 18.3 turnovers a game.

As you might imagine, holding opponents to less than 40 percent from the floor has been a good sign for the Aztecs. San Diego State is 54-9 in the Steve Fisher era when the opponent is held below that field goal percentage.

Increasing the Margin

In its three wins at the World Vision Classic, the Aztecs increased their margin of victory in each game. Against Liberty,

SDSU won by 12 and then followed it with a 14-point victory over Portland. In the finale, the Aztecs dominated Fresno State and defeated the Bulldogs by 17. The feat marked the first time since the 1984-85 season that the Aztecs have increased their margin of victory in three consecutive non-conference wins. In '84-85, SDSU beat Long Beach State on the road by two, 62-60, and followed it with neutral-site wins over McNeese State by six (91-85) and Southwest Louisiana by 13 (86-73).

Aztecs Win World Vision Classic

The Aztecs won their sixth in-season event victory of the Division I era last weekend in Fresno Calif., with three wins in three days. Aztecs Picked to Finish in Tie for Fourth

San Diego State has been picked to finish in a tie for fourth place in the Mountain West Conference's 2007-08 pre-season men's basketball media poll released Oct. 17, at the league's media day being held at The Mtn. studios in Littleton, Colo.

The Aztecs, 2007 NIT participants, earned 128 points along with New Mexico (two first-place votes) and also received one first-place vote. Brigham Young was picked to win the league with 181 points and 15 first-place votes, followed by UNLV (146 pts; 2 first-place votes) and Utah (142; 2).

After SDSU and New Mexico in sixth place was Wyoming (120), with TCU (7th, 58), Air Force (8th, 54) and Colorado State (9th, 33) rounding out the poll.

San Diego State junior forward Ryan Amoroso was the lone Aztec to garner individual accolades as he was voted as the league's top newcomer. Amoroso, a transfer from Marquette who sat out last season, becomes the second SDSU player in the last three years to earn that distinction. Recently departed senior Mohamed Abukar earned the same recognition heading into the 2005-06 campaign.

Not So Newcomers

Even though they are classified as "newcomers," Ryan Amoroso and Kelvin Davis are anything but that. The pair make up for 33 percent of the team's newcomers, but it is their experience prior to arriving on Montezuma Mesa that would dispute their classification.

Amoroso played in 57 games, while making eight starts in his two-year stint at Marquette. During his time there, the Golden Eagles went 39-23 and advanced to the 2005 National Invitation Tournament and the 2006 NCAA Tournament. Davis, meanwhile, played in 24 games his freshman season at UTEP and was a part of a Miner team that 27-8 and earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament. And although he redshirted the following season, Davis was a part of a UTEP squad that ended the season at 21-10 and advanced to the second round of the NIT.

When compared to last year's five newcomers, only Lorenzo Wade had prior Division I college experience. Wade saw action in 35 games at Louisville as a freshman and helped lead the Cardinals to a 33-5 record and a spot in the NCAA Final Four.

Experience Counts

With only one senior on the roster some may think the Aztecs are young. Although there is some truth to that, the players San Diego State has returning are definitely battle tested. The seven returners, along with the additions of Ryan Amoroso and Kelvin Davis, have all been a part of winning teams that have won at least 20 games and squads that have advanced to postseason play. Of the nine to advance to the postseason, seven have been to an NCAA Tournament and eight have been on teams to win at least one game in the postseason. Last year, SDSU only had eight players who had tasted the postseason and were part of 20-win ballclubs. Of the eight, only Lorenzo Wade experienced winning a postseason game.



Steve Fisher

17th-Full Season • 9th Season at SDSU • Illinois State, 1967

Steve Fisher has guided the Aztec basketball program to unparalleled heights. In eight seasons, he has taken a program that regularly missed out on the conference postseason tournament, to one which has become of the best programs on the West Coast and has the Aztecs knocking on the door of the elite teams in the country.

The best news for SDSU fans is that Fisher signed a new five-year contract prior to the start of the 2006-07 season that will keep him in San Diego for the foreseeable future.

When Fisher arrived on the scene in March of 1999, he found a basketball program that wasn't good enough to be called average. The Aztecs had suffered through 13 losing seasons in 14 years. Members of the school's last NCAA team were in the early stages of middle age. The expectations were set. The Aztecs were expected to lose. The year before Fisher's arrival on campus, San Diego State won just four games.

Now those days are a distant memory. Fisher guided San Diego State to the NCAA Tournament in 2002, the postseason NIT in 2003, the 2006 NCAA Tournament and the NIT last season. In addition, the Aztecs have a solid core returning and an exciting incoming class, both freshmen and newcomers, that will keep SDSU competitive this season and seasons ahead.

On March 26, 1999, San Diego State announced its arrival on the basketball scene in the form of a news conference to introduce its new coach, Steve Fisher. Fresh from a stint with the Sacramento Kings and with three appearances in the Final Four and a national championship in his pocket, he rolled up his sleeves and went to work. And work was needed. It looked to be a daunting challenge and yet the man with one of the highest winning percentages in NCAA Tournament history had no reservations.

No head-coaching career, at any level, started quicker than that of Steve Fisher. Six games into his head-coaching

career he was undefeated and sporting a national championship ring. And the success didn't stop with the national title.

Fisher's eight-plus seasons at Michigan produced a 184-82 (.692) record, nine postseason tournament berths and three trips to the NCAA championship game, including the magical run to the 1989 national title.

Under Fisher, the Wolverines also claimed an NIT championship, won at least 20 games four times and finished among the top three in the powerful Big Ten Conference five times. In 1995, Michigan set a league record by holding opponents to just 39.4 percent shooting from the floor.

Fisher and Co., raised the bar even higher in the postseason. His seven NCAA Tournament teams at Michigan combined for a 20-6 record, ranking him fourth among active coaches and ninth in NCAA history with a winning percentage of .769 in the national bracket. Only 13 coaches have taken more teams to the Final Four, including just five that are still active. He is one of three coaches to take three squads to the Final Four in the first five years of a head-coaching career, and one of just six coaches to lead a team to the championship of the NIT as well as the NCAA.

His accomplishments may be even greater at San Diego State. In 2001-02 he led the Aztecs to the postseason for the first time since 1985 and for just the fourth time ever. The 21 wins were second most for the school as a Division I program and the most since 1985. The fact that those numbers came after just three seasons signifies what is one of the great recent turnarounds in college basketball.

He followed that up with a third consecutive season with a .500 or better record in 2002-03 and led SDSU back to the postseason for the second consecutive season for only the second time in the school's Division I history. In addition, SDSU claimed its first Division I postseason victory with a win in the NIT.



FRESNO, Calif. - San Diego State defeated Liberty, 62-50, in the opening game of the World Vision Classic.

SDSU shot 46.7 percent from the field and held Liberty to 34.0 percent shooting. The Aztecs out-rebounded Liberty, 32-28, thanks to a game-high seven rebounds from Billy White.

Kyle Spain led the Aztecs with 14 points, while White had 13 points and Lorenzo Wade had 12.

The game was close early as Liberty led 10-9 with 8:55 left in the first half following a layup by Rell Porter. SDSU then scored six straight points to take a 15-10 lead following a dunk by White with 5:59 until halftime.

San Diego State outscored Liberty 8-2 in the final two minutes to lead 27-19 at halftime. To open the second half, the Aztecs went on a 16-3 run to lead 43-22 with 12:50 left in the game. Ryan Amoroso, playing in his first game as an Aztec, contributed nine points and five rebounds in a starting role.

San Diego State maintained the double digit lead the rest of the game.

With freshmen D.J. Gay and Tim Shelton earning the starting nod, the duo became the 10th and 11th freshmen to start a season-opening game under Steve Fisher and the fifth and sixth under Fisher while at SDSU.

The win improves the Aztecs' record in season-opening games to 7-2 under Fisher and SDSU has now won three consecutive season openers for the first time since doing it in 1999-00, '00-01 and '01-02.

FRESNO, Calif. - San Diego State used a swarming defense and had six players score in double figures as the Aztecs defeated Fresno State in the championship game of the World Vision Classic.

Ryan Amoroso scored a team- and Aztec career-high 19 points and was followed by Lorenzo Wade's second straight game with 18 points.

Kelvin Davis had his best game at SDSU with 15 points on 6 of 8 shooting from the field in a reserve role, while Kyle Spain added 12. True freshmen Tim Shelton and D.J. Gay rounded out the double-figure scorers with 11 and 10 points, respectively. Shelton also had a game- and career-high eight rebounds.

The Aztecs' six double-figure scorers marked the first time they accomplished the feat since the 2006-07 season when they did it against Campbell.

San Diego State shot 55 percent and hit on nine of 15 three-pointers while limiting the Bulldogs to 47 percent from the floor.

SDSU led from the opening tip and jumped out to a 25-8 lead nine minutes into the game. The Bulldogs went on a run to come within 10 at 27-17 with 8:14 to play in half.

San Diego State then extended its lead to 38-21 and led 48-33 at halftime. Fresno State got no closer than 12 points in the second half.

With the win, the Aztecs snapped a 12-game losing streak to Fresno State in Fresno and delivered the Bulldogs' worst defeat in the history of their five-year old arena, Save Mart Center. It was also Fresno State's largest margin of defeat in a regular-season home game since Dec. 3, 1994.

The Aztecs' third in win in as many days marked the first time in the school's Division I history in which they started consecutive seasons at 3-0.

LOS ANGELES - San Diego State rebounded from its first loss of the season by defeating Loyola Marymount, 78-56, at Gersten Pavilion to record its largest winning margin on the road since 1988.

The visiting Aztecs were in control throughout as they led wire-to-wire and jumped out to a 21-4 lead. SDSU was able to maintain its 17-point advantage for the rest of the half thanks to its dominating play inside. At the break with the Aztecs ahead, 43-26, SDSU had scored 28 of its points inside the paint.

In the second half, Loyola Marymount slowly chipped away at the Aztecs' lead reducing its deficit to 12 with 12:14 left in the game. Nearly 1:30 later, Lorenzo Wade took control of the game and scored nine straight points to give SDSU a 20-point lead with 9:06 remaining.

San Diego State increased its lead to 24 and never allowed the Lions to get closer than 16 points as the Aztecs cruised to the 22-point win.

Ryan Amoroso led SDSU with 19 points and seven rebounds, while Wade had 18 points.

Billy White, who shared game-high rebounding honors with Amoroso, also had a game-high four steals to go along with eight points. Freshman class-mate D.J. Gay poured in a career-best 11 points on the strength of 3-of-5 shooting from behind the arc.

Starting for an injured Kyle Spain, Kelvin Davis scored seven points and had a career-high six rebounds.
