Kathy Van Wyk -Head Coach

Coach Van Wyk is going in to her 13th year as a Head Coach at SDSU. Van Wyk, the school's all-time winningest coach, has guided SDSU to four MWC titles and five NCAA appearances



Accomplishments with SDSU Softball:

- *Three-time Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year (2002, 2006, 2008)
- * Five NCAA tournament appearances (2001, 2003, 2006, 2008, 2009)
- * Four MWC regular season championships (2002, 2003, 2006, 2008)
- * Two All-America selections
- * 17 NFCA all-West Region selections
- * 43 all-conference honorees
- * Six MWC Pitcher of the Year awards
- * Four Freshman of the Year awards
- * 77 Player of the Week winners

As a player, Van Wyk established herself as one of the top pitchers in the history of collegiate softball, enjoying a phenomenal 1982 season with a 35-1 mark and a 0.18 ERA. Her ERA is still eighth-best in Division I history and her 33 -game winning streak remains a record for consecutive victories. Her phenomenal season included four no-hitters, six one-hitters, back-to-back perfect games, 27 shutouts (sixth most in NCAA history in a single season) and 270 strikeouts. Throughout her career, she won numerous awards, including All-America honors and the Broderick Award, which is given annually to the nation's top collegiate player. She was also named the WCAA Player of the Year, Orange County Athlete of the Month and won an NCAA postgraduate scholarship with a 3.43 grade-point average. Van Wyk was a member of the U.S. softball team in 1985 and 1989 and is a five-time Amateur Softball Association All-American.

<u> Stacey Nuveman - Assistant Coach</u>

Coach Nuveman enters her second season as an assistant coach with San Diego State.

Coach Nuveman is the recruiting coordinator and work with the hitters.

Nuveman, a three-time U.S. Olympian and a standout at UCLA, finishing her four-year career with four NCAA records - 90 home runs, .945 slugging percentage, 240 walks and 81 intentional walks. She was a four-time first-team NFCA All-American (1997, 1999, 2001-02) and a three-time Pac-10 Player of the Year (1999, 2001-02). Nuveman is also ranked first in school history in games played (264), total bases (653) and on-base percentage (.600).

<u> Mia Longfellow – Assistant Coach</u>

This will be Coach Longfellow's first season as an assistant coach with San Diego State. Coach Longfellow will primarily work with the o utfielders and will assist in all aspects of recruiting.



Longfellow, earned all-Pac-10 conference accolades all four seasons. Longfellow broke five program records, including four career marks - at-bats (775), hits (242), singles (192) and stolen bases (57) - and one single-season mark - stolen bases (18 in 2005). Overall, she appears 26 times in the Beaver record book with single-game tying bests in hits (four), runs (four) and home runs (two).

<u> Steve Miner - Volunteer Coach</u>

Coach Miner enters her second season as an assistant coach with San Diego State. Coach Miner will primarly work with the infielders and slappers.



Miner, played fast-pitch softball at the national level for 23 years and has been a part of three national runner-up teams (1979, 1991-92), as well as two third-place squads (1991 and 1994).

At the national level, Miner was a four-time All-American (1979, 1988-90), a seven-time Western Softball Congress all-league selection (1975-81) and the 1975 AAA San Diego Player of the Year. In addition, he set the WSC batting average record in 1979 and hit a national tournament record .793 in 1988.
