San Diego State Travels to Northern Arizona for Final Dual-Meet of the Season on Saturday

• San Diego State (5-7, 1-6 MWC) travels to Flagstaff, Ariz., for its final dual-meet of the season against Northern Arizona (4-2). The meet is scheduled to begin at 1 p.m. PST at the Wall Aquatic Center.

Saturday's contest concludes a five-meet stretch in which the Aztecs have had to travel. In those meets, SDSU lost to UNLV, came in sixth at the UNLV Invite, finished sixth, third and fifth in the three meets at the UCI Invite, lost to Hawai'i and defeated LMU and Pepperdine last Friday.

After the NAU meet, the Aztecs will return home and have two and a half weeks to prepare for the Mountain West Conference Championships in Oklahoma City on Feb. 23-26.

Weekly Recap

• Last Friday, the San Diego State swimming and team defeated Loyola Marymount and Pepperdine at Burns Aquatic Center on the campus of Loyola Marymount. The Aztecs posted a 107-98 win over the Lions and cruised to a 144-96 victory over the Waves.

Emily Parker and Emily Schmied established season-highs in 1000-yard freestyle and 100-yard butterfly. Parker finished first with a time of 10:27.68, 34 seconds faster than the Kady Skora of Pepperdine, in the 1000 freestyle. Schmied's time of 58.88 in the 100 fly was just enough to edge out the Lions' Angela Samuels who finished with a time of 59.03.

In the 200-yard free relay, the team of Tamarah Binek, Adrienne Conte, Parker and Samantha Peters swam to a first-place finish with a season-best time of 1:39.27. SDSU's Katie Smith, Lindsay Hnyda, Schmied and Caitlin Friedhoff finished the 400-yard medley relay in second, but established a season-high time of 3:58.09 in the process.

With the pair of wins, the Aztecs improve to 8-0 against LMU and 6-0 versus Pepperdine dating back to the 1999-00 season.

Arizona Homecoming

• The trip to Arizona will be a homecoming of sorts for freshman Lindsay Hnyda. Despite being from Tucson, approximately four hours away, Hnyda will be making her first appearance in her home state as a member of the Aztecs.

Hnyda prepped at Sabino High School, where she earned four varsity letters and was named Scholastic All-American.

In 2003, as the team's captain, she was a member of the 200 medley relay team that earned All-America honors.

Different Places, Familiar Faces

• When the two schools hook up this weekend, there will be some familiar faces staring each other down. Sophomore diver Shannon Colvin, a 2003-04 Aztec, now dives for NAU.

SDSU sophomore Sarah Davis and Lumberjack freshman Danielle Borth both graduated from Issaquah High School in Washington.

And for the second time in as many meets, fresh-

man Tamarah Binek will face an old high school teammate in sophomore Cassie Lyons. Both prepped at Waiakea High School in Hawai'i.

Late Season Push

• With two consecutive wins, the Aztecs are making their annual late season push. A win on Saturday would mark the fourth straight year that SDSU has closed the regular season with three or more wins.

The 2001-02 squad finished the year with a three-meet winning streak, while both the '02-'03 and '03-'04 teams were victorious in four straight.

Last Time vs. Northern Arizona

• San Diego State got out to a quick start and defeated Northern Arizona, 165-123, in a dual meet at the Kroc Community Center. The Aztecs evened their record to 4-4 while the Lumberjacks fell to 2-2.

SDSU led early as it won the first four events of the day. The foursome of Adriana Quirke, Jennifer Graham, Emily Schmied and Caitlin Friedhoff won the 200 medley relay with a time of 1:50.72.

Megan Storey then took first in the 1,000 freestyle (10:20.97) and was followed by first-place finishes by Hannah Ryan in the 200 freestyle (1:52.34) and Quirke in the 100 backstroke (1:00.16).

After NAU won the 100 breaststroke, SDSU swept the top three spots in the 200 butterfly. Storey took first in that event (2:09.39) with Schmied (2:09.65) and Stella Karoly (2:10.75) finishing second and third. That was followed by a one-two placing in the 50 freestyle by Friedhoff (24.92) and Ryan (25.08)

In addition to Storey, Ryan was also a double winner for SDSU in the individual events, taking the 500 free with a mark of 5:02.45.

The Aztecs completed their afternoon by winning the 400 freestyle relay with the foursome of Ryan, Stephanie Chambers, Quirke and Friedhoff turning in a season team-best time of 3:34.80.

Series History vs. Northern Arizona

• In the last five seasons, SDSU has faced NAU five times, with each team winning every other year. SDSU holds a 3-2 advantage over NAU dating back to the 1999-00 season. Two of the three Aztec victories have come in San Diego. In meets held in Flagstaff, SDSU is 0-1.
