San Diego State Aztecs (4-3, 0-0 MWC) vs. Saint Mary's Gaels (2-5, 0-0 WCC)

► **When & Where:** Sunday, Dec. 10, 2006, at Cox Arena (12,414), San Diego, Calif., 2 p.m. (PST)
► **Webcast/Live Video:** Bill Earley (play-by-play) and Tammy Blackburn (analysis) will have the live audio broadcast on www.goaztecs.com. A live video feed will also be available via the Aztecs' official website for the match-up with the Gaels.

► **The Records:** The San Diego State women's basketball team will look for its first four-game winning streak since the 2000-01 season, as the Aztecs play host to Saint Mary's in a Sunday afternoon game at Cox Arena. SDSU has won each of its last two outings in overtime, with the most recent being a 70-68 victory over Cal Poly on Thursday. In that contest, the Aztecs rallied from a 10-point deficit and overcame 28 turnovers and a 52.2 percent performance at the line to surpass their win total from last season. The team is playing its final contest Sunday afternoon before taking an 11-day break for final exams.

Saint Mary's meanwhile, comes to San Diego with a 2-5 record, including wins over Cal State Northridge and Miami (Fla.). The Gaels will be a week removed from their most recent game, a 75-67 loss to Pacific.

► **SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns:** Burns (Ohio Wesleyan, 1979) is in the second year of her second stint as head coach at San Diego State. She led the Aztecs for eight seasons from 1989 to 1997, before returning in 2005. She has an overall head coaching record of 239-175 in 15 seasons, while she is 158-110 in 10 campaigns at SDSU.

► **Saint Mary's Head Coach Paul Thomas:** Paul Thomas is in his first season as the head coach at Saint Mary's. Thomas has a school and Division I head coaching record of 2-5. He spent the last 12 seasons as head coach at Cal Poly Pomona, where he was 235-108.

► **Saint Mary's Series History:** Saint Mary's and San Diego St. meet for the fourth time with the Gaels owning a perfect 3-0 record in the series. This is the second consecutive match-up between the two schools in San Diego. (Last: Saint Mary's def. SDSU, 52-47, on Nov. 21, 2003, in San Diego, Calif.)

San Diego State Looks For Fourth-Straight Victory Sunday Versus Saint Mary's

With a pair of overtime victories in each of its last two outings, San Diego State is looking to claim its fourth straight overall in a Sunday afternoon game against visiting Saint Mary's beginning at 2 p.m. at Cox Arena. The Aztecs overcame a 10-point, second-half deficit Thursday evening versus Cal Poly, rallying to beat the Mustangs behind the play of junior forward Jennifer Layton (18 pts., 11 reb.) and senior center Desiree Johnson (13 pts., 13 reb.).

San Diego State is 0-3 all-time against Saint Mary's with the two schools' most recent meeting coming in 2003. SDSU, which afterwards will take an 11-day break for final exams, is playing the third of six straight home contests and the second consecutive versus in-state foes.

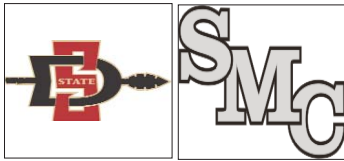

Last Time Out: Aztecs Rally For Second Straight Overtime Victory 70-68 Versus Cal Poly

The San Diego State women's basketball team recorded its third-straight victory with its second overtime win in as many games, rallying for a 70-68 victory over Cal Poly Thursday at Cox Arena. The Aztecs came back from a 10-point second-half deficit to improve to 4-3 overall, while the Mustangs dropped to 4-4 in 2006-07.

SDSU was led by junior **Jennifer Layton (Sacramento, Calif.)**, who had 18 points and 11 rebounds for her second double-double, while adding a career-best four blocks. Senior center **Desiree Johnson (Kahuku, Hawaii)** recorded a double-double for the second straight game with 13 points and a career-high 13 rebounds.

Freshman point guard **Quenese Davis (Sacramento, Calif.)** added 13 points and junior guard **Kate Eveland (Southlake, Texas)**, who hit the game-winning basket with 1:47 left in overtime, had 11 points.

The Aztecs trailed by 10 at 53-43 with 8:11 remaining in the second half, but outscored the Mustangs 12-2 over the next four minutes, tying the game at 55 points apiece on sophomore **LaSandra Dixon's (Azusa, Calif.)** second of two free throws.

The two sides traded leads three more times with SDSU appearing to secure the victory in regulation on Layton's layup with 19 seconds left and the score 62-59. Coming out of a timeout, Cal Poly, however, sent the game to overtime when Megan Harrison's three pointer from the right angle went in to knot the game at 62 points apiece.

The Aztecs took the early lead in overtime on a Davis layup the first time down the floor, but the Mustangs tied the contest at 64 points apiece and again at 68. Eveland's jumper from just inside the three-point line with 1:47 left proved to be the winner, as Cal Poly had three costly turnovers in the final 1:18, giving SDSU its sixth straight win in the series, 70-68.

The victory is the Aztecs' third straight, giving SDSU its first three-game win streak since the 2003-04 campaign.

Other Cal Poly Notes

- SDSU had four players score in double-figures in the same game for the second consecutive outing.
- Aztec junior **Shannon Clay (Inglewood, Calif.)** made her Aztec debut in the first half, recording a block and a rebound in four minutes of action.
- Six different Aztecs recorded a block against the Mustangs, while eight had at least one steal.

Our Time In Overtime

San Diego State went to overtime in its second consecutive outing Thursday night against Cal Poly. It is the first time the Aztecs have played back-to-back overtime games in program history. The team's two overtime games are the most in one season since the 2002-03 campaign when SDSU played three, going 1-2 overall. In Beth Burns' first stint on The Mesa, the Aztecs were 2-2 when going into the extra period. Interestingly, all four overtime games came in her second season in 1990-91.

Double-Figure Block Party

The Aztecs logged a season-high 10 blocked shots against Cal Poly, the team's most in a single game since also tallying 10 on Dec. 22, 2002 against Creighton. The 10 blocks gives SDSU 43 on the season by eight different players. The 43 blocks equal a 6.14 per game average and is already over 45 percent of the team's 27-game total of 95 from a year ago. The school's team season record for blocks is 162 by the 1987-88 squad in 31 outings.

The Aztec currently lead the Mountain West Conference (through game of Dec. 8) by a large margin, as second place New Mexico has averaged 4.75 blocks per game in its first eight contests.

They're A Steal

With 14 steals against Cal Poly, the Aztecs have combined for 34 in their last two outings. SDSU has now tallied double-figures in steals on three occasions in 2006-07 and rank second in the Mountain West Conference in that category with a 10.86 per game average. A year ago, SDSU had 10 or more steals eight times, including in each of its first four games to open the year.

In 2006-07, four different SDSU players have recorded three or more steals in a game seven times. Sophomore **Tamika Lipford (Oceanside, Calif.)** tied her career-high with six steals against Wichita State and had four versus Southern Utah. Freshman Quenese Davis had three at USD, five against the Shockers and four versus Cal Poly. Juniors **Shanna Demus (Palmdale, Calif.)** and Kate Eveland have each turned in one game with three steals or more this year.

Even More Double-Double Trouble

With two more in the game with Cal Poly, four different Aztecs have combined to record seven double-doubles this season. Three players have two apiece, including newcomers Jennifer Layton and **Lauren Hoisington (Las Vegas, Nev.)**, along with senior Desiree Johnson. Freshman Quenese Davis is the fourth player with her 11 points and 10 assists in the opener with Nevada. The double-doubles are the first career efforts for each of the four, while SDSU has had two players turn the trick in the same game on two occasions.

The last time SDSU had four separate players record a double-double in the same season was in 2001-02, when five Aztecs combined for five double-doubles.

On The Boards

With two more performances vs. Cal Poly, SDSU has had a player reach double-figures in rebounds in a game on eight occasions this season. In 2005-06, the Aztecs to only managed to meet the 10-rebound mark in a game five times, with three going to Michelle Strawberry and two by Desiree Johnson.

The last time San Diego State had three different players record 10 or more rebounds in a game in the same season was in 2002-03.

Injury Update

After having only eight players available in the first two games of 2006-07, another injured Aztec returned to action last Thursday against Cal Poly. Junior transfer Shannon Clay made her Scarlet and Black debut, after sitting out both exhibition games and the first six regular-season outings with a stress reaction in her foot. Clay had one block and one rebound in four minutes of action.

Three other SDSU players have missed games this year due to injury, with two of them since returning. Sophomore guard LaSandra Dixon missed the first four games after having surgery to repair a torn meniscus, while classmate Tamika Lipford sat out the first two contests recovering from offseason ACL surgery.

Freshman guard **Chelsea Williamson (Boulder, Colo.)**, who is battling stress reactions in both of her feet, is the only Aztec yet to return from injury.

Hoisington Honored

Freshman Lauren Hoisington was named the Mountain West Conference co-basketball player of the week, the league office announced Monday. Hoisington led the Aztecs to a 74-73 overtime victory against Wichita State on Sunday, posting her second double-double in the last three games with a career-high 18 points and 11 rebounds. She shared her first career player-of-the-week award with TCU's Ashley Davis.

Hoisington helped the Aztecs rally from a six-point deficit with less than three minutes remaining in regulation. The 6-2 forward scored eight of the team's final 10 points of the second half, including the game-tying bucket with 38 seconds left, to send the game into overtime. She shot 60 percent from the field (6-for-10), logged a season-best 85.7 percent (6-for-7) free-throw percentage and collected a career-best two steals.

Hoisington becomes the sixth SDSU player in the league's eight-year history to be named player of the week.

Interesting Notes

- San Diego State has trailed in each of its four victories this season, including three times in the second half. SDSU bounced back from a five-point, first-half deficit and was behind by four with 9:45 remaining in the win at Southern Utah. The Aztecs trailed by as many as eight in the second half versus Wichita State and was down by 10 against Cal Poly, which is the largest deficit in an SDSU win since Jan. 7, 2005, when the team was behind by 14 in the second half in a 63-59 victory against Eastern Washington.

- Aztec opponents went to the free-throw line exactly 23 times in each of the first three outings. The next two games, they attempted 22 free-throws each, while Wichita State tried 21 last Sunday. Cal Poly went to the charity stripe an SDSU opponent high 25 times. SDSU has cut into its free-throw attempt deficit in the last three games with 27 trips vs. Southern Utah, 26 against the Shockers and 23 in the win over Cal Poly. -SDSU shot exactly 45.3 percent from the field in both of its first two games of the season, with one being

a win and the other a loss. In 2005-06, the Aztecs shot above 45 percent from the field just once in a victory over Portland State, when SDSU logged a 53.1 field-goal percentage. San Diego State has broken the 40 percent mark four times in seven games this season, after turning the trick just six times in 27 outings a year ago.

-SDSU has outrebounded its opponent in four games this season, after doing so on only eight occasions in 27 games in 2005-06.

Notes With A 'W'

An SDSU victory over the Saint Mary's will mean:

- SDSU has won four straight games for the first time since 2000-01, when the Aztecs claimed six in a row from Dec. 18 through Jan. 11.
►SDSU improves to 6-2 in home games played in the month of December since Beth Burns' return as head coach.
►SDSU improves to 3-2 against teams it did not face last season.
►SDSU has exceeded its home win total by one from last season.
►SDSU has won its first game against Saint Mary's in four tries.
►SDSU head coach Beth Burns is 1-1 all-time against Saint Mary's.

Saint Mary's Tidbits

Saint Mary's enters the afternoon with a 2-5 overall record ... The Gaels are led by junior forward Monica Mertle, who is averaging 10.9 points per game ... Not far behind are junior Maija Lahde (10.6 ppg.) and Jontelle Smith (10.4), while Egohsa Obaiza leads the team in rebounds with a 7.0 per game mark ... Lauren Shaughnessy has a team-leading 34 assists and 18 steals ... The two sides have yet to play a common opponent in 2006-07 ... In the two schools' last meeting in 2003, four Gaels saw action, including Mertle (11 pts.), Obaiza (4 pts.), Shaughnessy (7 reb., 3 assists) and Serena Benavente (7 pts.).

Recapping 2006-07 So Far

- Against Nevada, Jennifer Layton and Queenese Davis became the first Aztecs to record double-doubles in the same game since 2002, when Nicolette McCartny and Ashlee Dunlap did so against American University. It was also the first double-double by an Aztec since Michelle Strawberry had 22 points and 11 rebounds in a win over Portland State on Dec. 16, 2005.
- An Aztec true freshman has recorded 10 or more assists in a game in each of the last two seasons. Queenese Davis did so in her first career outing against Nevada, logging assists, while Tamika Lipford had 11 versus Portland State in 2005-06.
- A true freshman has started at the point guard position in a season-opener in each of SDSU's last four campaigns. Davis is joined by Lipford (2005), current junior Kate Eveland (2004) and Courtney Fritz (2003).
- Jennifer Layton went 10-for-10 from the field in the second half of the UC Davis game, finishing the night with 20 points. She averaged a double-double in her first three career outings (15.7 ppg., 10.0 rpg.).
- The Aztecs' 20 assists versus UC Davis are the most by SDSU in a single-game since the team had 23 in a 91-45 victory against Utah Valley State in Feb. 2005.
- San Diego State logged a season-best 20 steals against Wichita State. The 20 steals are the team's most in a single outing since Jan. 27, 2005, when the Aztecs logged 21 in a 48-44 loss to Air Force at Cox Arena.

Pick Seven

The San Diego State women's basketball team has been picked to finish seventh in the Mountain West Conference in a preseason poll released Thursday at the league's basketball media day in Las Vegas, Nev. The voting panel consisted of the MWC's nine head coaches, as well as selected media.

The Aztecs, who ended up ninth in the 2005-06 regular season, earned 41 points from the panel, beating out eighth place Air Force by two points. New Mexico was picked to win the conference title, garnering eight of the 19 first-place votes. The Lobos edged BYU by just one first-place nod and three overall points. The Cougars are followed by TCU (126 pts.), Utah (102), Wyoming (96) and UNLV (71). Colorado State rounded out the poll with a ninth-place point total of 36.

Key Points For The Aztecs In 2006-07

Offense - Scoring offense has been one of the major hurdles in the SDSU women's basketball program in recent years. The Aztecs ranked last in the MWC in that category with 53.1 points per game and averaged less than 50 points a contest in league action in 2005-06. SDSU lost its top two scorers from a year ago in Michelle Strawberry (13.5 ppg.) and Veronica Shaw (8.7 ppg.), but returns its next three in Desiree Johnson (7.5 ppg.), Shanna Demus (6.1 ppg.) and Erin Jackson (5.0 ppg.).

Expect more of a balanced, but still faced-paced offense from the Aztecs in 2006-07. The coaching staff worked hard to recruit more offensive weapons.

Defense - Pressure defense has been the trademark of coach Beth Burns' squads and this season should be no different. The team returns the conference's top shot blocker in senior Desiree Johnson, who also led SDSU in rebounding. Fellow returnees Shanna Demus and Tamika Lipford combined for 65 steals - almost 30 percent of the team's total a year ago.

One of the key areas will be keeping opponents off the glass, as the Aztecs averaged just over 20 defensive rebounds per game in 2005-06.

The Schedule: This year will mark the second time in the last three seasons that the Aztecs have played 16 home contests, also doing so in 2004-05 ... Just four of the team's 12 possible non-conference foes appeared on last season's schedule ... SDSU plays host to the San Diego Surf 'N Slam for the second straight season, Dec. 28 and 30, at Cox Arena ... The field includes potential first-time opponent and 2006 NCAA tournament team George Washington, Brown University and perennial powerhouse University of Georgia ... The Mountain West Conference portion of the schedule runs from Jan. 4 through March 3 ... SDSU will play league games on four possible days of the week as opposed to last year's Wednesday/Thursday and Saturday format ... The Aztecs have five games each on Thursdays and Saturdays and three contests on both Wednesdays and Sundays ... Six Mountain West Conference teams are coming off postseason bids, with four of those advancing to the NCAA tournament second round or further ... The MWC championships returns to Las Vegas, Nev., in 2007, after a three-year stint in Denver, Colo.

SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns

The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa on April 8, 2005. In her first stint as head coach from 1989-97, Burns took the SDSU women's basketball program full circle, going from 7-23 her first year to 23-7 in her final campaign. During her eight seasons, she compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular-season titles.

A three-time WAC coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02). She has a 15-year overall head coaching record of 239-175, while her mark school record stands at 158-110 over 10 seasons.
