San Diego State proved all the doubters wrong in 2009-10 as it won three games in three days to claim its third MWC tournament title and the league's automatic berth to the NCAA Tournament. The Aztecs posted the second-most wins in school history with 25 and, in the process, recorded their school-record fifth straight 20-win campaign and advanced to its fifth consecutive postseason tournament.

Looking Back at the 2009-10 Aztecs

The 2008-09 campaign was a magical season that saw San Diego State advance to the semifinals of the NIT, play inside Madison Square Garden and win a school-record 26 games. But 4,291 career points from that squad suddenly disappeared heading into the 2009-10 campaign and the pundits were openly questioning whether the Aztecs had enough personnel to make another run at the postseason.

An NCAA Tournament berth, an MWC tournament title and 25 wins later, the answer was a resounding yes.

San Diego State enjoyed one of its finest seasons ever even with seven newcomers to the team, three of which found themselves in the starting lineup for much of the season (freshman Kawhi Leonard, freshman Chase Tapley, junior Malcolm Thomas), and two playing significant minutes (junior Brian Carlwell, sophomore Tyrone Shelley).

Even with all of the new faces, the Aztecs jelled quickly and hung their hats on defense and rebounding. San Diego State finished the season ranked 10th in rebound margin (+6.5), 36th in scoring defense (61.8), 36th in scoring margin (+8.5), and 46th in field-goal percentage defense (40.4).

Last season's effort is a testament to where the program is and where it is headed.

Below are some notes on the 2010 MWC champions.

► San Diego State finished the 2009-10

season with a 25-9 record, marking the first time in school history that an Aztec team has recorded five straight 20-win seasons. SDSU basketball dates back to the 1921-22 campaign.

► San Diego State's 25 victories ranks as the second-most in school history, behind the 2008-09 team's 26 wins. The two-year total of 51 wins is the most in program history. The Aztecs own a school-record winning percentage of .729 (51-19) over the two seasons.

► The Aztecs earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament, marking the fifth season in a row in which they participated in postseason play. In 2006,

SDSU advanced to the NCAA Tournament and played in the 2007, 2008 and 2009 NIT the following three years.

► San Diego State earned the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament after claiming its third Mountain West Conference tournament championship. The Aztecs also won tournament titles in 2002 and 2006, while advancing to the final in 2009.

► With 11 Mountain West Conference victories, San Diego State turned in its fifth straight season in which they recorded at least nine league wins for the first time in school history. It also

Four Aztecs Honored by Mountain West

Four Aztecs picked up 2010 Mountain West postseason awards. Kawhi Leonard was named the MWC's freshman of the year and voted to the all-conference first team becoming the first freshman in the 11-year history of the league to earn first-team honors. Malcolm Thomas, meanwhile, earned second-team accolades and both D.J. Gay and Billy White received honorable mention recognition.

Leonard, the league's preseason freshman of the year, earned the Mountain West's post-season version of the award after averaging a team-best 14.4 points and 9.6 rebounds. In conference games only, Leonard finished among the top 10 in offensive rebounding (1st), rebounding (2nd), defensive rebounding (3rd), scoring (5th), field-goal percentage (5th), steals (7th), blocked shots (9th), free-throw percentage (10th), and minutes played (10th).

Thomas earned his way onto the second team after averaging 11.9 points, 8.6 rebounds, 2.6 assists and a team-high 1.3 blocks, while shooting a conference-best 57.6 percent. Thomas ranked among the league leaders in seven categories (1st-field-goal percentage, 2nd-offensive boards, 3rd-rebounding, 3rd-blocked shots, 4th-defensive rebounds, 10th-assists, 13th-scoring) and started all 16 ball-games.

Gay earned his first all-conference award after starting all 16 games and playing a team-best 35.3 minutes a game. Gay averaged double figures in scoring (10.7) and the junior led the team in assists (3.5) and assist-to-turnover ratio (2.07). In Mountain West action, Gay finished second in minutes played, third in assist-to-turnover ratio, fifth in three-point field-goal percentage (.419), eighth in assists, eighth in three-point field goals made (1.9), and 18th in scoring.

A two-time all-conference performer entering this season, White, a junior, made it 3-for-3 when he earned honorable mention accolades.

Hobbled by an ankle injury suffered in the conference-opening win over New Mexico, White recovered to score in double figures six times, including in five of the final eight games of the league slate. The Las Vegas, Nev., product finished the season ranked 10th in both blocked shots and offensive rebounding.

Leonard Bursts Onto Scene

Kawhi Leonard stepped onto campus highly touted and he did not disappoint in his freshman year.

Below are some of Leonard's first-year accomplishments.

► Set the school record for double-doubles by a freshman (17), breaking the record of 10 established by Michael Cage. The 17 double-doubles are the fourth-most in a single season in SDSU history.

► Posted a team-best 24 double-figure scoring games and 19 double-digit rebounding efforts.

► Was one of four freshmen in NCAA Division I to lead their team in scoring and rebounding. Leonard was the only one to lead his squad in both categories on a postseason tournament team.

► Became the first Mountain West freshman to lead the league in rebounding since Andrew Bogut in 2003-04.

► Set a MWC tournament record with a career-high 21 rebounds in the championship game at UNLV. He was later named tournament MVP.

► Became the first freshman in MWC history to be named conference player of the week three times.

marked the first time in SDSU's Division I history that an Aztec team posted five consecutive winning conference efforts.

► Last season marked the sixth time a Steve Fisher-coached San Diego State team recorded 20 or more wins. The 25 wins in 2009-10 is the second-highest total SDSU has reached under Fisher in his 11 seasons on Montezuma Mesa.

► SDSU was dominant at home for the fifth year in a row as it went 14-1 inside Viejas Arena. The Aztecs posted their fifth straight season and ninth overall with at least 11 victories at Viejas Arena. San Diego State's five-year total of 67 wins is an arena record.

► The Aztecs defeated three nationally ranked opponents in one season for the first time in the school's Division I history. San Diego State defeated No. 15/14 New Mexico and No. 23/25 UNLV at home before beating No. 8/8 New Mexico in the semifinals of the MWC tournament in Las Vegas.

► San Diego State won nine road games, which was something the Aztecs had not accomplished since the 1967-68 campaign. That year, SDSU went 11-3 on the road.

► The Aztecs defeated Arizona, 63-46, for the first time since 1983. Prior to its sixth-ever win over the school, San Diego State had lost seven in a row to the Wildcats.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State overcame a sluggish first-half showing and shot nearly 65 percent from the field in the second half to defeat UC San Diego, 77-52, in the Aztecs' season opener.

Newcomer Malcolm Thomas carried San Diego State with his 20 points on 8-of-11 shooting, nine rebounds and two blocks. Fellow newcomer Chase Tapley, meanwhile, finished with 11 points and Kelvin Davis had 10 in a starting role.

Despite shooting 53.8 percent in the first half, the Aztecs were nursing a 31-28 lead at halftime mainly due to their 12 turnovers and 2-for-8 performance at the free-throw line.

In the second half, it was a significantly different story as San Diego State came out on fire, scoring the first 16 points to increase its lead to 19.

With the game comfortably in hand, the Aztecs went on another scoring binge, this time an 11-3 run, to move ahead by 23 with less than four minutes left and eventually cruised to the finish line.

For the game, SDSU shot 59.3 percent from the field, including 64.3 percent in the second half, and outrebounced the Tritons, 43-28. The Aztecs also dominated points in the paint (46-16) and fast-break points (10-0).

UCSD was led by Tyler Acevedo, who had 14 points off the bench.

MORAGA, Calif. - San Diego State dropped an 80-58 decision at Saint Mary's in what could have been the latest tip time in school history, 11 p.m. PT, as the Aztecs and Gaels participated in ESPN's College Hoops Tip-Off Marathon.

SDSU opened the game with a 1-0 lead on a free throw by Malcolm Thomas and never led again as Saint Mary's and more specifically, Mickey McConnell, came out on fire and never looked back.

McConnell went 5-for-5 from three-point range in the first half alone to lead a Gael attack that featured three players with eight points or more at halftime. McConnell finished the half with 17 points, while Matthew Dellavedova and Omar Samhan each had eight. Samhan also had 12 boards as his team enjoyed a 42-21 lead at the break.

With a steep hill to climb, San Diego State chipped away at the lead and came within 12 points with 7:34 to go after Thomas and Billy White took over the game. The duo scored all of SDSU's 14 points in a six-plus minute stretch, with White scoring 10 of the 14.

But like most of the game, the Gaels had an answer for the Aztecs and responded with a 14-3 run to increase their lead to 23 with 3:24 to go to effectively put the game away.

Thomas finished with 14 points and eight rebounds, while White and D.J. Gay each had 10. For Saint Mary's, McConnell had a game-high 24 points and seven assists.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State was a completely different team from its performance in its previous game at Saint Mary's as the Aztecs thoroughly dominated Santa Clara, 86-53, in the first game of the West Coast Classic.

Five players scored in double figures and were led by Billy White's 17. D.J. Gay, Tyrone Shelley and Chase Tapley each had 12, while Kelvin Davis had 11. Kawhi Leonard, meanwhile, narrowly posted a double-double after finishing with nine points and a career-high 13 rebounds.

The game was a tight affair with the margin never rising above four points for the first 10-and-a-half minutes. But a 17-0 Aztec run opened the game up and soon SDSU found itself ahead by 17 with six minutes to play in the first half. The Aztecs wound up going into the locker room up 38-22.

In the second period, both teams traded a pair of buckets with Gay knocking down San Diego State's second field goal. The junior's basket spurred what would be the deciding run as the Aztecs ran off 18 straight points and 23 of the next 25 to pull ahead, 61-28 with 11:34 remaining in regulation.

Nearly seven minutes later, SDSU enjoyed the first of its two 40-point leads after Gay connected on a jumper. The second 40-point advantage came with 3:55 left in the game when Tapley knocked down a three off a feed from Bryan Horton.

In the final minutes, Santa Clara outscored the Aztecs, 11-4, to provide the final margin.

While San Diego State had five players score in double figures, Santa Clara had three, led by Niyi Harrison's 14.

FRESNO, Calif. - SDSU stayed perfect in West Coast Classic action and earned its first road victory of the season with its 62-58 win over Fresno State.

Billy White continued his stellar play of late by connecting on 8-of-10 field goals en route to a season-high 22 points, with 18 coming in the second half. The junior also grabbed a team-best eight rebounds, including six on the offensive end. Tyrone Shelley, meanwhile, contributed 17 points and six rebounds.

In the first half, it looked as if the Aztecs would run away with the game, jumping out to an 8-0 lead. But the Bulldogs methodically chipped away and pulled even at 16 with 9:40 left in the period thanks to eight straight Fresno State points, including a pair of three-pointers by Mike Ladd.

Soon after the Bulldogs evened the score, SDSU answered with a 7-2 run to pull ahead by five, but Fresno State outscored the visitors, 11-2, to go into the half up, 29-25.

Right out of the gate in the second half, Sylvester Seay gave the Bulldogs their biggest lead of the game at 31-25. But the Aztecs hung around and took a 35-33 lead after Shelley made a three. The game was back-and-forth for the rest of the half with neither team enjoying a lead of more than five points.

With under a minute to play in regulation, the game was tied at 58, but all that changed as White continued to punish the Bulldogs on the offensive glass. After a D.J. Gay miss, White grabbed the rebound and was fouled on the putback. The junior knocked down both attempts, giving SDSU a 60-58 lead. After a Fresno State miss on the other end, the Bulldogs were forced to foul Shelley, who calmly made both free throws with under three seconds to play to give the Aztecs the win.

STOCKTON, Calif. - San Diego State fell behind late in the first half, cut the lead to three in the second half, but could not complete the comeback as it fell at Pacific, 71-63, in the third game of the West Coast Classic.

The Tigers held a lead for nearly the first 15 minutes of the first half until Billy White's layup gave the Aztecs a 22-21 lead. Both teams traded points over the next 1:24, including Tyrone Shelley's three to put SDSU up 28-27 with 4:27 to go.

The Aztec advantage was short-lived, however, as the Tigers blitzed the visitors with numerous run-outs that were converted for layups or dunks. With Pacific ahead by one on a Nyika Williams layup, Williams found himself on a fast break with Brian Carlwell trailing the play. As the SDSU center went to block the shot, he hit the backboard and was assessed a technical foul. With the basket allowed, the Tigers hit the two technical free throws and Pacific was well on its way to closing out the first half on a 15-1 run and a 42-29 lead.

In the second half, the Aztecs came out aggressive and cut the UOP lead to four, 52-48, with 8:38 to go, but gave up a 6-0 Tiger spurt. San Diego State roared back again, this time cutting its deficit to three at 61-58 with 4:29 to play, but immediately gave up a dunk and a layup within a span of 18 seconds. SDSU would not get closer than six points the rest of the way.

For the second straight game, White posted a 20-point effort, this time finishing with 20 points and knocking down his first two three-pointers of his career. D.J. Gay and Tyrone Shelley, meanwhile, contributed 11 and 10 points, respectively.

SAN DIEGO - SDSU stopped its losing streak at one and thoroughly beat Northern Arizona at home, 89-48, in the final game of the West Coast Classic.

Six players scored in double figures for the Aztecs, including Malcolm Thomas, who had his first double-double at SDSU after finishing with 21 points and 10 rebounds. Kawhi Leonard also notched his first career double-double with 10 points and 10 boards. Meanwhile, Tyrone Shelley had 17 points, Billy White added 12, and Chase Tapley and D.J. Gay each had 11.

The game was nearly over before it started as San Diego State jumped out to a 23-2 lead and never looked back. Northern Arizona, which got its two points on free throws less than 1:30 into the game, made its first field goal, a three-pointer, with 11:35 remaining in the first half. In fact, the Lumberjacks didn't reach double digits until Cameron Jones drilled a jumper with 6:23 left in the first half. At the end of one period, the Aztecs enjoyed a 45-18 lead.

After halftime, NAU trimmed its deficit to 26 points after four minutes of action, but would not get any closer. San Diego State continued to get easy looks as the game progressed and the lead eventually swelled to as many as 45 in the final minutes.

The 41-point margin of victory was the third-largest in school history and was due mostly in part to the Aztecs dominance in points in the paint (60-16), points off turnovers (28-4), second-chance points (23-10) and fastbreak points (23-0).

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State won its fourth straight in the series and second in a row on the San Diego campus as the Aztecs defeated the Toreros in overtime, 69-62.

SDSU emerged with its second consecutive decision on USD soil for the first time since claiming back-to-back road wins on Dec. 9, 1967 and Feb. 3, 1970. The four-game winning streak, meanwhile, is San Diego State's longest since the early 1980s.

D.J. Gay improved his personal record to 3-0 vs. San Diego and enjoyed a career day as he finished with a career-high 22 points. Gay, who played 41 minutes, also connected on a season-high four three-pointers and a career-best six free throws.

Joining Gay with double figures was Tyrone Shelley, who finished with 10 points, six rebounds, three assists, three blocks, and three steals.

The game had a promising start for the Aztecs as they opened the contest with a 6-0 lead that eventually swelled to 15-7 mid-way through the period. USD, however, answered with a 21-12 run to end the half to go into the locker room up, 28-27.

After regrouping, SDSU scored the first 13 points of the second half to open up a 12-point lead. But the Toreros stormed back and responded with a 21-8 run to take a 49-48 lead, which eventually turned into a 52-all draw at the end of regulation.

In the extra session, it was all Aztecs early again as they scored the first eight points. USD never got closer than five points and Gay made five of six free throws to seal the game for SDSU.

SAN DIEGO - Despite allowing Cal State Fullerton to shoot a higher percentage from the field and from three-point distance, San Diego State still managed to defeat the Titans, 82-68, to record its fourth straight victory.

The Aztecs outrebounded the Titans 41-25, and Kawhi Leonard almost single-handedly outrebounded their entire squad. The freshman enjoyed a fantastic game grabbing a game-high 18 rebounds, scoring a career-high 23 points and adding a personal-best five assists. The double-double was his second of his career and second in his last four games.

In the second half, the Aztecs continued its offensive assault and extended their lead to 22 points at 58-36 with 12:39 left in the game. A 10-4 Titan run brought the visitors to within 13 with just under seven minutes to play, but that would be as close as Fullerton would get the rest of the way.

In addition to Leonard, three other Aztecs scored in double figures. Billy White had 14 points, while Chase Tapley and Brian Carlwell each had 10. Carlwell's 10 marked a career high.

For the game, Cal State Fullerton shot 51.1 percent from the field and 52.9 from three. On the flip side, SDSU shot 50.8 from the floor and 50.0 from behind the arc.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State had lost seven straight to Arizona and had not beaten the school since 1983, but all of that changed when the Aztecs beat the Wildcats in convincing fashion, 63-46, in front of a sellout crowd of 12,414 at Viejas Arena.

Freshman Kawhi Leonard led all players with 13 points and 12 rebounds, his second straight double-double, and D.J. Gay added 12 points for the Aztecs.

San Diego State scored the first five points of the game and never looked back. In the first nine minutes of the game, Arizona managed to tie the score on two different occasions, but the Aztecs had an answer each time. With the score knotted at 14, SDSU scored nine unanswered points and closed the half on a 17-6 run to enter the locker room ahead, 33-20.

The Aztecs enjoyed a double-figure lead thanks in large part to the effort of Leonard, who had nine rebounds, including seven on the offensive side. In contrast, the Wildcats only had 15 total rebounds to their credit and just five off the offensive glass.

In the second half, it was all San Diego State as the Aztecs never allowed their lead to shrink to single digits. Arizona got to within 11 with 18:12 left in regulation, but that was all the visitors had left in the tank as SDSU cruised to the 17-point victory.

The win was San Diego State's fifth in a row and 10 straight at home. The Aztecs never trailed and it extended their streak to 153 minutes, 3 seconds without facing a deficit at home.

Arizona's 46 points, meanwhile, was its lowest scoring output since netting 41 on March 15, 1985, a streak which covered 801 games.

TEMPE, Ariz. - San Diego State had its season-long five-game winning streak snapped at Arizona State as the Sun Devils hung on for the 55-52 victory at Wells Fargo Arena.

The Aztecs held a lead for much of the first half, but turnovers prevented them from blowing the game open. SDSU had 12 miscues in the first 20 minutes of play, which kept ASU in the game, and only Chase Tapley had more than five points (10 points) for the Aztecs. All of the above allowed the Sun Devils to hang around until the final three minutes when they blitzed San Diego State with a 10-2 run to go into halftime ahead, 28-22.

Arizona State's match-up zone defense gave SDSU fits all afternoon, including the first 6:30 of the second half. The Sun Devils stopped nearly every Aztec offensive possession en route to a 14-4 run to increase their lead to 42-26.

San Diego State finally found its offensive rhythm shortly after its deficit grew to 18 as it went on an 11-0 spurt in large part to Billy White, who had six of the 11 points, to come within 46-39. Arizona State, however, answered with a Derek Glasser jumper and a Jamelle McMillan three to get their lead back to 12 with 5:44 left.

The Aztecs were not done by any means as Chase Tapley and D.J. Gay scored 12 straight points to get SDSU to within one point, 53-52, with 13 seconds remaining in regulation. Following a San Diego State foul and two ASU free throws, the Aztecs called timeout to set up a final play, but Gay's game-tying three-point attempt was off the mark as the Aztecs fell for the first time in six games.

Tapley led SDSU with a career-high 17 points, while Gay added 10.

DES MOINES, Iowa - San Diego State let a five-point halftime lead slip away and then rallied from eight down in the second half as the Aztecs defeated Drake on the road, 76-73, in overtime in the inaugural Mountain West-Missouri Valley Challenge.

The victory marked SDSU's ninth straight overtime decision, which extended the nation's longest such streak.

Much like the Aztecs' overtime win at San Diego earlier in the season, D.J. Gay made his mark in the extra session. With San Diego State up, 75-73, Drake's Craig Stanley drove to the hoop and the 6-0 Gay notched his first blocked shot of the season with two seconds left to preserve SDSU's lead. After a Bulldog foul, Tyrone Shelley, who earlier in overtime knocked down two free throws, made one of two attempts to provide the final margin.

In the first half, it looked as if the Aztecs were going to have no trouble earning their ninth victory of the season after Gay and Kelvin Davis enjoyed perfect halves. Gay had eight points on a perfect 3-for-3 shooting (2-2 3FG), while Davis came off the bench to contribute 10 points after connecting on all three of his three-point attempts.

In the second half, however, Drake used a 12-0 run to move ahead by eight points with 6:08 left. But SDSU responded with a 12-4 spurt to end the half and the Bulldogs went 2-for-7 from the charity stripe as regulation ended in a 66 tie.

Gay led all scorers with 18 points, while Davis and Billy White each scored 16. Kawhi Leonard added 14 points and a game-high 11 boards.

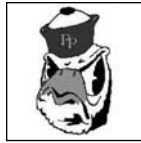
With the Aztecs nursing a three-point lead and eight seconds left in the game, UCR attempted to tie the score with a three, but Malcolm Thomas blocked his career-high sixth shot. Then with two seconds left, Leonard made two more free throws to provide the contest's final margin.

San Diego State also won its 13th straight home game, which tied the fifth-longest streak in school history, and improved to 12-3, matching the program's best start in the last 25 seasons.

Despite the win, the Aztecs suffered a huge loss when Billy White went down with an ankle injury with 5:45 left in the first half. SDSU promptly went on a 10-3 run to move ahead by five with 2:03 remaining. The Lobos, however, closed the half with a Roman Martinez three at the buzzer to trim the Aztec lead to 38-36.

In the second half, both teams were engaged in a heated affair, but that all changed with less than 13 minutes to play and SDSU ahead 48-47. The Aztecs slowly took control of the game by going on a 10-3 run to open up a nine-point lead.

UNM got to within six points with 4:12 left in regulation, but Malcolm Thomas fueled a 9-3 spurt with four points to extend the SDSU lead to 70-58 with 1:25 to go as the home team cruised to the win.

Thomas posted his second double-double of the season with a game-high 18 points and a season-best 15 rebounds. D.J. Gay, meanwhile, poured in 12 points and finished with a game-high five assists.

Kelvin Davis and Tim Shelton provided a much-needed spark off the bench by scoring nine and eight points, respectively. White had eight points on 4-of-5 shooting before exiting the contest.

LARAMIE, Wyo. - San Diego State let a 17-point first-half lead and a 14-point halftime advantage slip away as Wyoming rallied to defeat the Aztecs, 85-83, at Arena-Auditorium.

After the Cowboys fouled D.J. Gay, the junior made his first free throw and missed the second intentionally, but the Aztecs could not convert the tip-in to force overtime as Wyoming earned the win.

Following a handful of back-and-forth moments, the Runnin' Rebels went on a 9-0 run to take a 59-50 lead just before the eight-minute media timeout to take control of the contest. Prior to and during UNLV's scoring spree, Tre'Von Willis scored 12 of the Rebels' 15 points, including the eighth and ninth points during their 9-0 spurt.

Despite its scoring drought, SDSU remained within striking distance and cut its deficit to 65-62 with 3:17 left, but UNLV answered with a pair of jumpers to put the game out of reach for the Aztecs.

SDSU was led by Kawhi Leonard's 13 points and 10 rebounds and was joined in double figures by Malcolm Thomas and Tyrone Shelley, who each scored 12 points apiece. Billy White, meanwhile, returned to action and contributed five points and three rebounds after missing the Wyoming game with a high right ankle sprain suffered in the New Mexico game.

SAN DIEGO - In a game that got out of control after a series of physical plays, San Diego State rallied from 14 down to beat visiting TCU, 67-62.

The 14-point comeback matched the second-largest come-from-behind victory during Steve Fisher's tenure on Montezuma Mesa and the decision was the Aztecs' 14th consecutive at home.

With 13:49 left in the second half, things got ugly when Chase Tapley stole the ball and kicked it out to a streaking Malcolm Thomas. When the junior went up for a layup, Ronnie Moss fouled Thomas up high and Thomas fell to the floor. The hard foul resulted in some tense moments, but order was restored soon thereafter.

With both sides separated, thanks to the help of both head coaches, the officials looked at the video and issued an intentional foul and a technical foul on Moss and a technical on Thomas.

San Diego State trailed 46-41 at this point and Thomas missed both free throws. But after the two misses, the Aztecs retained possession and Kelvin Davis knocked down a three. TCU responded with a three of its own, but Davis answered with another three to get SDSU to within two at 49-47.

Davis' effort spurred a 12-3 run, giving the Aztecs a 56-52 lead with 6:19 to go. Despite the momentum being clearly with the home team, the Horned Frogs got within one with 28 seconds left. San Diego State, however, knocked down their final six free throws to secure the five-point win.

Billy White led the Aztecs with 16 points, while Thomas had 11 points, nine rebounds and a career-high six assists. Davis, meanwhile, scored all 10 of his points in the second half.

SALT LAKE CITY - San Diego State matched its best start in the last 25 seasons and won for just the third-time ever at Utah with its 70-68 victory over the Utes at the Huntsman Center.

The Aztecs received a pair of double-doubles from its starting frontcourt of Malcolm Thomas and Kawhi Leonard. Thomas scored a career-high 23 points and grabbed a game-high 13 rebounds, while Leonard finished with 16 points and 11 boards.

San Diego State used a 13-0 run late in the first half to pull ahead, 24-15 with 4:15 left before half-time. Following a Carlon Brown three-pointer to snap SDSU's streak, the Aztecs responded with a 7-2 spurt to make the score, 31-20, before finishing the half up, 37-29.

In the opening minutes of the second half, the Utes scored 10 unanswered points to get within 45-43 with more than 12 minutes remaining. The Aztecs, however, used a 11-3 scoring run to get their lead back up to 10 with 5:38 to go.

SDSU maintained its advantage late into the game, leading by as many as eight with 41 seconds left, but Utah made one last push at the end.

Within a span of 21 seconds, the Utes outscored SDSU 6-1, which cut the Aztecs' lead to 69-66. With under 10 seconds to go, Brown brought the Utes to within a point before having to foul D.J. Gay.

The SDSU junior made one of two from the stripe and Brown's 40 footer at the buzzer was off the mark to send the Aztecs away with the win.

Not only was it SDSU's fifth victory in a row at CSU, but it was the Aztecs' fifth straight in the series and improved their record to 10-1 in their last 11 vs. the Rams.

D.J. Gay scored a game-high 17 points, on a career-best eight free throws, and added a personal-record five steals, while Kawhi Leonard contributed 14 points and 12 rebounds. With his 10th double-double, Leonard tied Michael Cage's freshman double-double school record set in 1981.

Chase Tapley, meanwhile, scored 12 points and Malcolm Thomas pulled down a game-high 13 rebounds.

San Diego State led from the outset until CSU rallied from as many as nine to take a 23-20 lead with 3:19 left in the first half. The Aztecs, however, answered with 12-1 run, including seven straight points by Tapley, to take a 32-24 lead into the half.

In the second half, the Aztecs continued where they left off in the first half and enjoyed a double-digit lead for nearly 19 minutes of the half. The Rams cut their deficit to nine points with 1:10 left in the game, but would get no closer.

On that afternoon, the San Diego State defense was stellar in handing CSU only its second home loss of the season. The Aztecs limited the Rams to its lowest home scoring output of the year and to 36.7 percent shooting. SDSU's 12-point margin was also CSU's worst home defeat of 2009-10.

The Aztecs, however, responded with an 8-0 run thanks to a pair of three-pointers by D.J. Gay and two free throws by Leonard to increase its advantage to 42-27. From that point, Air Force would get no closer than 12 points the rest of the way as SDSU won its 15th home game in its last 16 outings.

The Aztecs forced the Falcons into committing 43.4 percent from the field and into committing 15 turnovers. From the line, San Diego State, which entered the game shooting 59.2 percent, made 17 of its 22 attempts (77.3 percent).

SAN DIEGO - Five players scored in double figures, led by Kawhi Leonard's career-high 26 points, and San Diego State rallied from a first-half deficit to defeat Wyoming, 88-57, at Viejas Arena.

The Aztecs led by as many as 37 points, but settled for the 31-point decision, which matched the school's largest margin of victory in the history of the Mountain West Conference.

Despite trailing in the early going, Leonard and D.J. Gay kept SDSU in the game and helped the Aztecs take a 39-31 lead at halftime. After 20 minutes, Leonard had 17 points and seven rebounds, while Gay added eight points and two steals to set the tone.

Immediately out of the break, Wyoming's Djibril Thiam knocked down a three to cut the San Diego State lead to five, but the Aztecs responded with a 10-0 run to increase their lead to 49-34.

Later, SDSU used a 20-5 run to go up by 30 and the Aztecs cruised to the win and avenged an earlier loss to the Cowboys in Laramie.

Joining Leonard in the double-figure scoring column was freshman classmate Chase Tapley, who scored 14 points, and Tyrone Shelley and Kelvin Davis, who scored 12 points apiece off the bench. Billy White was the fifth member of the bunch after he finished with 10 points for the second consecutive game.

As a team, San Diego State shot 52.4 percent from the field and outrebounded Wyoming, 43-28. SDSU's free-throw shooting, which has been a sore subject for the Aztecs this year, was a respectable 62.1 percent.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State tied the school record with its second victory of the season over a nationally ranked team after it defeated No. 23/25 UNLV, 68-58, inside Viejas Arena.

Earlier this year, SDSU defeated No. 15/14 New Mexico, and the victory over UNLV marked the fourth time SDSU has defeated a pair of nationally ranked squads in one season in school history.

The Aztecs trailed in the early going, but after the first three minutes, they slowly took control of the game. SDSU led by as many as 14 points and settled for the 33-25 lead at halftime. Both teams connected on 10 field goals, but the difference was San Diego State's four three-pointers to UNLV's one and the Aztecs' 9-of-12 performance from the line, compared to the Runnin' Rebel's 4-for-5 effort.

UNLV looked poised to make a run at the Aztecs in the first few minutes of the second half, cutting SDSU's lead to three on three different occasions. San Diego State, however, used a handful of little scoring spurts while keeping the Rebels off the scoreboard to open up a double-digit lead with under seven minutes to go and the Aztecs handed UNLV its third-worst loss of the season.

Billy White enjoyed his best game since injuring his ankle as he finished with a game-high 19 points and five rebounds. Frontcourt teammate Kawhi Leonard added 13 points and a game-high 14 rebounds, while D.J. Gay and Chase Tapley each scored 11. Malcolm Thomas, meanwhile, had a nice all-around game with four points, five rebounds, four assists, four blocks, four steals and zero turnovers.

FORT WORTH, Texas - San Diego State used a stifling defense and shot a season-high 60.9 percent from the field to post a 68-51 victory over TCU at Daniel-Meyer Coliseum.

The decision was SDSU's seventh road win of the season, its most since 2005-06 when that team won seven, claimed the Mountain West Conference regular season and tournament titles, and advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

Down by two points early in the first half, the Aztecs went on a 13-0 run and held the Horned Frogs to without a point for nearly eight minutes. By the time Ronnie Moss hit a jumper to put an end to the San Diego State run, the Aztecs were already up, 17-8, and on their way to a 29-19 halftime lead.

In the first half alone, SDSU shot 61.9 percent from the floor, while limiting TCU to just 31.0 percent field-goal shooting.

Things got even better for San Diego State in the opening 2:10 of the second half as it scored seven straight points to open up a 17-point lead, which forced the Frogs into calling a pair of timeouts.

TCU showed some life midway through the second period, cutting the lead to single digits on two occasions. The Horned Frogs never got closer than eight points and San Diego State was well on its way to its 19th victory of the season.

Kawhi Leonard led all players with 18 points and was followed by Billy White's 17 points and game-high nine rebounds.

It was an overall balanced attack for the Aztecs as they received nine points from Brian Carlwell, eight points apiece from Chase Tapley and Malcolm Thomas, and six from Tyrone Shelley.

Unfortunately for SDSU, Utah stormed back with 10 unanswered points, which included two layups by Carlon Brown and a pair of threes by Marshall Henderson, to get within 45-43.

Nearly seven minutes later, Utah took a 56-55 lead with 4:35 to go, but San Diego State used a 13-4 run, despite missing seven free throws in the final 1:39, to seal the game.

The Utes, and their many comebacks, were led by Brown's 13 points off the bench and Henderson's 12 points, all of which came off three-pointers.

USAFA, Colo. - San Diego State ended the regular season on a high note by defeating Air Force, 61-42, inside Clune Arena. With the victory, the Aztecs enter the Conoco Mountain West Conference Championships riding a two-game winning streak.

SDSU never trailed in the contest despite being very short handed. Tyrone Shelley suited up after undergoing thumb surgery eight days earlier, but was only available in case of an emergency. Chase Tapley, meanwhile, missed his first game of the season with a broken bone in his off hand. The situation left the Aztecs with just eight healthy players, seven of which were scholarship athletes.

San Diego State scored the first five points of the game and 12 of the game's first 15 and were content with methodically increasing its lead. When the Falcons got within six points with 12:05 left in the first half, the Aztecs slowly pulled away, eventually leading 27-14 at the half.

In the first five minutes of the second half, SDSU led by 16 on two occasions, but Air Force would not go down without a fight on its Senior Night.

The Falcons cut the Aztec lead to nine after a 9-2 run with 11:35 left in the game and actually trailed by nine with 8:53 to go. But from that point on, San Diego State closed the game on an 18-7 run to post the 19-point victory.

LAS VEGAS - San Diego State overcame a physical Colorado State side and defeated the Rams for the seventh consecutive time. With the 72-71 win, the Aztecs advanced to the semifinals of the MWC Championships.

On two separate occasions SDSU players showed restraint after being on the receiving end of a pair of punches, the last of which resulted in Ram star Andy Ogide being ejected.

Chase Tapley returned from a one-game absence due to a left hand injury and led the team in scoring with 15 points. The freshman shared game-high honors with Billy White and Malcolm Thomas.

Colorado State started the first half with a 7-0 lead and held it for most of the period until Tapley connected a three-point shot with 7:47 remaining to give the Aztecs a 23-20 lead. Tapley's bucket spurred a 12-5 SDSU run and the Aztecs went into halftime with a 41-33 lead.

SDSU started the second half with a basket and pulled away by 10 points, but Colorado State inched its way back into the game and tied it at 49 with 14:04 left. The Rams continued to battle and the lead exchanged hands multiple times.

The outcome came down to the final seconds. Colorado State was ahead 71-70 when D.J. Gay sank two free throws with 23 seconds left. The Rams had two opportunities to win the game, but Dorian Green threw the ball out of bounds and a last-second shot was off the mark as the Aztecs advanced.

LAS VEGAS - San Diego State upset top-seeded and No. 8/8 New Mexico in the semifinals of the MWC Championships, 72-69. The win was SDSU's third of the season against a team ranked in the Associated Press Top 25.

Billy White led the Aztecs with a career-best 28 points, while Kawhi Leonard added 15 points and 13 rebounds as San Diego State advanced to the title game for the second straight year.

San Diego State could not have started the game better, jumping out to an 11-0 lead thanks to a pair of threes from Leonard and one from distance from White. The Lobos did not get on the scoreboard until Phillip McDonald drained a jumper with 16:58 left in the half.

New Mexico would not go down easily and stormed back with a 19-6 run to tie the game at 26. San Diego State took the lead back and almost went into the locker room up by two, but Dairese Gary hit a three with under 10 seconds left to give UNM a 39-38 advantage at halftime.

The second half was a see-saw battle, despite a seven-point Aztec lead with 7:39 left in the game. In fact, New Mexico owned a 64-62 lead with under three minutes to play.

The Lobos trailed, 67-66, in the final two minutes, when D.J. Gay nailed a three to provide a little breathing room for San Diego State. Gary, however, had a chance to win the game for New Mexico, which was down 70-69, and had the ball tipped away, only to recover it, but he missed a layup. As a result, the Lobos were forced to foul Leonard.

With 0.7 seconds left, Leonard calmly made both free-throw attempts to provide the winning margin.

LAS VEGAS - San Diego State won its third Mountain West Conference tournament title and earned the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament with its 55-45 victory at UNLV.

Kawhi Leonard was named the tournament's MVP and led the team with 16 points and a career-high 21 rebounds, earning his 16th double-double of the season. The 21 boards set a new MWC tournament record, which was previously owned by former Aztec Marcus Slaughter (19; 2006).

The first half was abysmal as neither team scored for the first 4:08. Despite all the shooting woes, UNLV owned a 10-4 lead more than halfway through the first period, but SDSU answered by taking its own six-point cushion into the final 10 seconds. Unfortunately for the Aztecs, Justin Hawkins cut their lead in half as he hit a three as time expired. All told, the teams shot a combined 18-for-53 from the floor in the first 20 minutes.

Kelvin Davis started the second half off strong with a three-point shot providing San Diego State with its second six-point lead of the game. The battle for the lead continued for the rest of the half with Tre'Von Willis bringing UNLV to within four with 2:54 left in regulation.

After an SDSU turnover and a missed three by Willis, UNLV fouled Leonard three consecutive times and the MWC freshman of the year knocked down all six free throws and eight overall in the final 1:54 to secure the title.

San Diego State won its 25th game of the season, the second most victories by any Aztec squad in 89 seasons of SDSU basketball.

PROVIDENCE, R.I. - San Diego State had its second-half rally fall short as the 11th-seeded Aztecs dropped a 62-59 decision to sixth-seeded and No. 15/14 Tennessee in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

SDSU found itself down 34-26 at halftime after shooting 32.1 percent from the field, including a 2-for-12 effort from three-point range. Despite the poor shooting, the Aztecs were in the game until a 12-7 Volunteer run to end the half propelled the SEC school to its advantage at intermission.

Coming out of the break, San Diego State methodically chipped away at its deficit and put together a 19-10 scoring run to give the Aztecs a 45-44 lead with 9:20 to go in regulation. The lead was short-lived after Tennessee scored six unanswered points and took a five-point lead.

Over the course of the final 5:13, SDSU stayed within striking distance and cut the Volunteer lead to one point on three different occasions, the last of which saw D.J. Gay connect on three free throws with nine seconds left after Melvin Goins fouled the Aztec guard on a three-point attempt.

Down by one with nine seconds to go, SDSU fouled Wayne Chism, who knocked down both attempts, and gave the Vols a three-point lead. After the successful attempts, San Diego State raced the ball down the court and Kawhi Leonard's three-point attempt was off the mark giving UT the win.

Gay scored a game-high 16, while Leonard notched 12 points and 10 rebounds. Kelvin Davis, meanwhile, scored 11 in his final game as an Aztec.
